YEAR #2 FOR LINDA CIMINO

Head Coach Linda Cimino looks to repeat what she started during her inaugural season on Remsen Street. A record breaking season in conference play with 12 victories, and the most overall victories for a Terrier head coach in his/her first season. The most home victories since the 2013-14 season with 10. Cimino will have to reshuffle the cards as a plethora of new players will be on the hardwood including highly touted Serbian point-guard Nevena Dimitrijevic. Returning for their senior and junior years respectively are Jade Johnson, Ally Lassen, and Abby Anderson, who are the three holdovers from a season-ago. Following a third-place finish within the Northeast Conference, Cimino's squad was picked to finish fifth (tied with Bryant) by her fellow coaches within the NEC. A tough non-conference schedule awaits.

TERRIERS AT A GLANCE:

Nevena Dimitrijevic- Guard- Freshman

- Averaged 15.8 points-per-game, 4.3 rebounds, and 5 assists at the Spanish championship.
- Won a silver medal as a member of the Serbian national team in the U18 Euro Championship in Hungary.
- Averaged 20.3 PPG and 4.3 APG last season in high school.

Alyssa Fisher- Guard- Freshman

- Averaged 20.9 Points-Per-Game, 4.9 Assists-Per-Game, and 4.3 Steals Per Game. . . Achieved 1st Team All-District.
- Named USA Today All-USA Louisiana Girls Basketball 2nd Team.

Jade Johnson- Guard - Senior- Captain

- Became the 18th player to score 1,000 points in program history last season. Named to 2019-20 NEC All-Preseason Team.
- Finished 2018-19 campaign among the top in select NCAA rankings that included free-throw percentage (6th), three-point field-goal percentage (15th).

Ally Lassen - Forward - Junior - Captain

- Finished #1 on NEC field-goal percentage chart at 56.9.
- Named NEC Prime Performer twice during the 2018-19 campaign. Started in final 11 games of her sophomore season.
- Currently sits atop program's history book for field-goal percentage

Abby Anderson- Forward - Junior - Captain

- Averaged 10.2 minutes per game. Finished the season with 3.4 points per game, 2.4 rebounds per game, and 0.6 assists per game. Registered points in 23 of her 31 appearances. Tied a career high in points with 10, twice against Chicago State and Loyola (MD).

Jenna Jordan - Forward - Freshman

- Scored 1,100 points and grabbed 1,300 rebounds. . . Earned spot on First-Team All-County three-times. Was named Second-Team All-State.
- Named First-Team All-North Jersey.
- Former commit of LIU Brooklyn in 2018-19.

Cayln Richardson - Guard - Freshman

- Combined 1,548 points between private school, and high school.
- Nominated for McDonald's All-American Game
- Lettered in Track and Field during freshman year in high school.

BROADCASTER TIPS

- Three returning players this season includes conference-star and senior guard Jade Johnson. Junior forwards Ally Lassen and Abby Anderson.
- This will be the sixth overall meeting between the Terriers and the Seawolves, with the latter leading the series three games opposed to two.
- Jade Johnson and Bryant's Sydney Holloway are the lone returning top-five scorers from a year ago within the NEC.
- Last season, Mia Ehling and then-Junior guard Jade Johnson led the Northeast Conference in three-point field-goal percentage with 45.5, and 42.6 respectively.



SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION:

- The Seawolves have lost a pair of high-powered student-athletes and starters due to graduation, in Shania Johnson and Jerrell Matthews.
- Stony Brook was picked to finish second in the America East Coaches Poll for the 2019-20 campaign.
- Johnson led the team in scoring a season ago (496 ; 16.5 points-per-game) and was named to the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association's Second Team during the 2018-19 season.
- Assistant Coach Gabe Lazo has been added to Caroline McComb's staff for the 2019-20 season. Lazo hails from Florida International, where he was an assistant with the Panthers for two seasons.
- Up to date, Caroline McComb's is 87-67 overall as she begins her sixth season at the helm of the Seawolves women's basketball program.
- Forward Oksana Gouchie-Provencher was the team's leader in blocks during the 2018-19 season, with 42.
- Junior forward India Pagan was selected to the Preseason All-Conference Team.
- The aforementioned Pagan finished last season at #11 in the conference's scoring chart (12.1 PPG). Her former teammates in Matthews and Johnson finished 2 and 3 respectively.
- As a team, scored 84 points against fellow America East foe, New Hampshire on January 12, 2019. The highest point total of their respective season.

RECORD BOOK AT A GLANCE

- Senior guard Jade Johnson became the 18th player in program history to register 1,000 career points a season ago, on February 16, 2019 vs. LIU Brooklyn.
- Jade Johnson set the program record for most points scored in a single season with 598 during the NEC Quarterfinals contest vs. Mount St. Mary's (MD). She surpassed program hall-of-famer Karen Erving Schiera, who previously held the respective record at 596.
- Junior forward Ally Lassen set the program record with a 56.9% field-goal percentage a season ago. Lassen also was the Northeast Conference's leader at year's end following a breakout sophomore campaign.
- Johnson needs seven triples to meet the 200 mark for her career.
- Senior guard Jade Johnson is also 13 points away from tying Christine Taps (1,156) for 10th place on the all-time scoring list.

NEWS & NOTES

2018-19 IN REVIEW

When St. Francis head coach Linda Cimino took over the helm of the program in the Spring of 2018, she promised an exciting, up-tempo brand of basketball on Remsen Street. The Terriers provided their fans with just that in 2018-19 as the senior-laden group bought in almost immediately and they were off to the races. Before 2018-19, the Brooklyn Heights program had never racked up 100 points in a game. But, under coach Cimino, the Terriers put up 100 points in three of their first five contests. Two of those 100-plus outings came on the road in the Vinewood Farms Classic against Morehead State and Chicago State respectively. St. Francis started the season by winning four of its first five games, before finishing the non-conference portion of their schedule at 6-7. The Terriers then won 12 of 18 NEC contests, while finishing again in third-place and hosting a conference quarterfinal home game at the Pope Physical Education Center for the first time in program history. Despite coming into that game on a three-game winning streak, the Terriers fell to Mount St. Mary's by six points, ending what must be viewed as a successful year. One of the most impressive wins by St. Francis in this or any season had to be a seven-point victory over a talented Morehead State team, which hosted the Vinewood Farms Classic. The Eagles finished second in a very competitive Ohio Valley Conference, concluding their year with a postseason invitation to the prestigious WNIT and a 24-11 record. The 18 wins St. Francis posted this past season were the most victories since the Terriers' 19 wins back in 2013-14. The 12 Conference wins were also the highest NEC total ever recorded by the St. Francis women's program. Coach Cimino's squad won the most home games (10) since the 12 wins were captured at the Pope in 2013-14. In addition, St. Francis qualified for the NEC playoffs for the third season in a row. There were also plenty of individual achievements by this Terrier team for which they received well-deserved recognition, both during the season and in the postseason. However, few players have had a more memorable year than Amy O'Neill, who many regard as one of the finest point guards to ever wear a St. Francis uniform. During the season, she recorded a rare statistical triple-double not once, but twice. O'Neill made her mark nationally as well, leading the entire NCAA in 2018-19 in Assists Per Game (8.6 per game) and finishing third in Total Assists (268). Her incredible assist total broke both the NEC and the school record for Assists in a single-season. She accomplished all this by playing almost 38 minutes a game. The team MVP was named to the All-Conference First Team as a result of her history-making season. Fellow Aussie Jade Johnson, who hails from Adelaide, had her own note-worthy season. One of the premier scorers in the Conference, she made the All-NEC Second Team for her second year in a row, earned the Battle of Brooklyn MVP honor. Johnson led the Terrier squad in Scoring, while putting her name into the St. Francis record books by scoring her 1,000th point during 2018-19 and setting a new St. Francis standard for most points scored in a single-season (598). Her 100 three-pointers this year also shattered the existing Terrier record and she's listed among the best players in St. Francis history for both Field Goals and Free-Throws Made in a Season, as well as Career Three-Point Field Goals Made.

ADDITIONS TO THE SQUAD

The Terriers made eight new additions to the roster as numerous student-athletes have moved on via graduation. Serbian freshman guard Nevena Dimitrijevic leads the pack, as she looks to fill the shoes left behind by Australian guard Amy O'Neill following her graduation from college. Valley Cottage, NY native and freshman forward Jenna Jordan looks to use her 6'1" frame to her and the team's advantage as she comes off of a historical high school career in her hometown. Collegiate experience comes from the same pipeline as Linda Cimino, as UMBC transfer Melody Van Ness looks to embark on her final two years of eligibility on Remsen Street. Both Cimino and Van Ness have America East Conference ties dating back to 2014 and 2017 respectively. Once nominated for the prestigious and honorable McDonald's All-American Game, freshman guard Cayln Richardson joins the Terriers by way of Orlando, Florida. Finally, named to Louisiana's First-Team All State as a high-school senior is current freshman Alyssa Fisher, who averaged 20.9 points during her tenure.

DIAL LONG DISTANCE

Senior guard and captain Jade Johnson returns as the Terriers all-time leading three-point getter in a single season, as she obtained an even 100 during her junior season. Johnson also has been "working on taking the ball off the bounce more, and improve her leadership where she has done an amazing job with that." Aside from the new improvements from the Australian native, she is primed to be in the top five in almost every category from a season ago, where she placed in. Johnson is on pace to land in the top-10 in three-pointers attempted, three-point field goal percentage, and free-throw percentage in the program's history book. And of course, on the NCAA's listings throughout the season.

LET THE DOG FIGHT COMMENCE

Both the Terriers and Seawolves have met a total of five times as a DI team dating back to 2009, and most recently on December 30, 2018. The Terriers trail the overall series 3-2. The last time these two teams met on Long Island, the Seawolves were victorious on their home floor by a score of 74-67. The home teams have won their respective matches in all five meetings. Two in Brooklyn Heights, and three on Long Island. The last meeting at the Pope, the Terriers squeezed by with a two-point thriller by a score of 57-55 on 12/03/14.

LINDA CIMINO REWRITES PROGRAM HISTORY BOOK

In her first year at the helm of the Terriers, head coach Linda Cimino got her team the most conference wins the program has ever seen with 12. The program record for most conference prior to this season, was set back in 2013-14, when John Thurston's Terriers set a school record with 10 victories. His squad went on to fall to #4 Bryant University 58-53 in Smithfield in the NEC Tournament. Her squad also has won 10 contests at the Pope Physical Education Center, which is the most since the 2013-14 season.

Linda Cimino was named the 13th head women's basketball coach in program history by Director of Athletics Irma Garcia on May 21, 2018.

Cimino enters her second season at the helm of St. Francis Brooklyn. During Cimino's first season on Remsen Street, she led the Terriers to a historic finish with 18 total victories including 12 in NEC play, which are a program record. Cimino guided the Terriers to the No. 3 seed in the 2019 NEC Tournament and hosted Mount St. Mary's in the NEC Quarterfinals.

While in Brooklyn Heights, Cimino coached one of the conference's greats in Australian point guard Amy O'Neill. She would go on to achieve a plethora of accolades that included being named an NCAA Stat Champion in Assists Per Game, All-Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Second Team honoree, and All-NEC First Team selection under Cimino. O'Neill became the first Terrier in program history to record a triple-double, and she accomplished the feat twice during her senior season.

The Terriers set a number of team records in 2018-19, which included most points on offense in a single-season (2,329), and most free-throws made (456). She also coached Jade Johnson, who is the returning leading scorer in the NEC. During Cimino's first season in Brooklyn Heights, Johnson tallied a career-high 598 points during her junior campaign, and set the record for most points in a single-season.

Prior to being named the Terriers' 13th head coach, Cimino spent four seasons as Binghamton's head coach in the America East. Cimino's positive energy and relentless work ethic changed the culture at Binghamton University over her four seasons, both on and off the court. Known for her passion and enthusiasm, Cimino considers player development, strong recruiting and building relationships key ingredients in constructing a winner. Her leadership style reignited a sense of energy and pride at Binghamton.

From 2015-18, at Binghamton, the Bearcats averaged 15+ wins and played at or above .500 in conference play each year. In 2017-18, the Bearcats received a bid to the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI), marking the first time that the program reached a national postseason tournament since Binghamton moved up to NCAA Division I prior to the 2001-02 season. Playing in its first-ever Division I national postseason game, Binghamton won, 70-59, at Youngstown State in the opening round of the WBI. It was a historic win for the Bearcats in more ways than one. Binghamton finished with 20 wins for the first time since the 2000-01 season, the year before it moved up to the NCAA Division I level. Binghamton also boasted the America East Player of the Year, Imani Watkins, who set the program's all-time scoring record. Watkins was also named to the All-America East First Team and finished up her career with 2,125 points. Alyssa Ewing James was an anchor for Cimino on the defensive end of the floor. James joined the 1,000-point and 1,000-rebound club in 2017-18 and set the America East and Binghamton blocks record for a career with 270. James also became just the second three-time America East Defensive Player of the Year in conference history.

In 2017-18, Binghamton was included among the top 50 teams in the nation in several categories. As a team, Binghamton was ranked ninth in the nation with 5.9 blocks per game. It was also 24th in field goal percentage defense (.362), 34th in scoring defense (57.4 ppg.), and 47th in steals (9.9 spg.).

COACHING STAFF

Peers have taken notice of Cimino as she was named the 2016 America East Coach of the Year. Binghamton was picked to finish last in the America East Conference in 2015-16, but under Cimino's guidance, it finished in a three-way tie for third place. The Bearcats won their most games (14) and most conference games (eight) since the 2010-11 season, putting Binghamton amongst the most improved teams in the NCAA. At the America East Tournament, Binghamton advanced to the conference semifinals for the first time since 2011.

As a coach who focuses on player development, Cimino takes great pride in working with her players to reach their full potential. Most notably, Kim Albrecht had two breakout seasons under Cimino's guidance, capping her career as a NCAA statistical champion in which she led the country in free throw percentage (91.4). This was the first statistical champion in Binghamton basketball history.

Her first year with the Bearcats saw a program best two players named to the America East All-Rookie Team, including the America East Rookie of the Year. The team's ability to shoot the ball significantly improved under her guidance as the team finished first in the America East in free-throw percentage (.720) after finishing last the season prior to her arrival. The team also finished third in the conference in three-point field goal percentage after finishing sixth the previous season.

Cimino arrived at Binghamton after a successful eight-year run as the head coach at Caldwell University. Her strong ability to connect with and motivate her players played a significant role in her rebuilding the Cougars' program. She is the program's all-time leader in wins with a 128-100 (.561) overall record. This includes a 90-52 (.633) mark in her final five years at the helm, averaging 18 wins a season after Caldwell went 39-71 in the four years prior to her tenure. In only her second year with Caldwell, her team was recognized as one of the most improved teams in the country.

In 2010-11, Cimino led the Cougars to their most successful season in the program's history. She guided the program to the most wins in their history (21), broke the mark for win percentage (.778), made the program's first appearance in the national rankings and won the Central Athletic Collegiate Conference (CACC) Regular Season Championship.

In addition to the 2010-11 championship, Caldwell shared the CACC title in 2012-13 while also going 15-4 in conference play and rattling off a school record 15 consecutive wins. In both 2012-13 and 2013-14, Caldwell advanced to the CACC Tournament championship game. Furthermore, Caldwell earned a bid to the ECAC Division II Tournament twice during her career.

Cimino was able to attract high caliber student-athletes to Caldwell that paid off for both her team and the student-athletes. She recruited and coached three CACC and two ECAC Rookie of the Year players, as well as two CACC Players of the Year and two Division II All-Americans. Under Cimino's watch, Caldwell was just as successful in the classroom. Thirteen different players were selected to the CACC's All-Academic Team, and during the 2013-14 season, the overall team GPA was a 3.4.

Away from the court, Cimino has had an equally impactful career as an athletics administrator. In addition to her success as Caldwell's head coach, Cimino was the Associate Director of Athletics and Senior Woman Administrator all eight years. She oversaw facilities, game-day operations and scheduling for all Caldwell programs, in addition to serving as the sport administrator for all of the women's teams. Cimino was also heavily involved in Caldwell's Cougar Pride Booster Club, oversaw the Student Athlete Advisory Club (SAAC) and coordinated the athletic department's community outreach program. In 2011, she was selected to participate in the NCAA's Women and Minorities Mentor Program.

Among her committee work, she was appointed the Chair of the NCAA Women's Basketball Rules Committee prior to the 2018-19 season. She has served on the NCAA Women's Basketball Regional Advisory Committee (East Region), in which she was also a NCAA site representative for two regional tournaments. She also served on the NCAA Division II USA Today Coaches Poll Committee and WBCA National Coach of the Year Award Committee. At Binghamton, Cimino was selected to take part in the pilot WBCA Mentoring Program.

Prior to arriving at Caldwell, Cimino was a health education teacher in the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District for five years. During that span she was as an assistant coach at her alma mater, Adelphi University after previously serving as the head girls' varsity basketball coach at Calhoun High School for three seasons. She began her college coaching career at the age of 22 as the head coach at Queensborough Community College, where she led the team to the CUNY championship game in 2002.

A member of Adelphi's basketball program from 1997-00. She graduated from Adelphi in 2001 with a Bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education and her Master's degree in Health Education from Adelphi in 2004. A native of Lincoln, RI, Cimino was All-State in both basketball and softball at North Smithfield High School.



With 54 seconds remaining in the first half, none other than Horton grabs two points to knot the game at 35 heading into the locker room. An eight-point lead was not difficult to come back from after Harrison sank in two free throws after drawing a foul against Horton. A steal from Ally Lassen sent Palarino to the house for a pair to narrow the lead at four with 58 ticks on the clock. WEST HARTFORD, CT - Sophomore F India Pagan led the way with 16 points, seven rebounds and five assists. Senior G Shania Johnson and sophomore G/F Hailey Zeise backed her up with point totals of 12 and 11, respectively. "I thought it was a very competitive game. It was back and forth throughout the entire game. It was the kind of game that you want as everyone's competing for a championship and I think Hartford was able to persevere and wear us down a bit with the press as they do and have done throughout the course of the season. We needed to do a better job of handling the ball and get better shots within our offense. But, credit to Hartford, they're a great team. They do what they do and they did it tonight." (McCombs). Stony Brook, who had the lead since 4:03 left in the 1st quarter, saw Hartford steal back the advantage towards the end of the third quarter as the Hawks cashed in on two-consecutive takeaways. The Seawolves didn't back down, taking the lead on 3 separate occasions to open up the 4th quarter until Hartford pulled away with a 19-12 run in the game's final 8 minutes. Johnson opened up the final frame with a 3 to give Stony Brook its lead back and to break the program's single-season 3's record with 96 made baskets from behind the arc during the 2018-19 year. Johnson held the previous standard with 95 made three-point field goals during her junior season. The host team responded to Zeise's shot with a 3 of its own, but senior Jerrell Matthews went the other way and splashed through a 3 to preserve the advantage. Zeise tied her career highs in both points and rebounds. Pagan also matched a career's best with 5 assists and Matthews notched a new career high with 10 rebounds.

FIRST PAIR OF RETIRED NUMBERS IN HISTORY

During the 2018-19 season, St. Francis College Brooklyn rose a pair of alumnae to the rafters of the Pope Physical Education Center to honor a pair of the best to ever play on Remsen Street. Jeanne Zatorski '79, and Karen Erving-Schiera '91 had their respective numbers retired on December 15, and February 9, respectively. Zatorski became the first woman inducted into the Athletics Hall of Fame in 1987, and became the first woman to have her number retired. She is the Terriers' third all-time leading scorer with 1,704 career points and ranks third in career rebounds with 878. Zatorski has converted the second-most field goals in women's basketball history (765) and is 11th in career field goal percentage (45.4%). Erving was inducted into the Athletics Hall of Fame in 1997 just six years after her graduation. She is the all-time leading scorer with 1,929 career points. Erving holds the Terriers' women's basketball records for career rebounds (1,049), points in a single-season (591, '88-'89), career field goals made (798), and field goals made in a single-season (241, '88-'89).



MARIA PALARINO BECOMES 17TH TERRIER TO 1,000!

St. Francis Brooklyn welcomed the 17th student-athlete in program history to the 1,000-point club as Irwin, PA native and former guard Maria Palarino accomplished the feat on Monday, January 28, 2019 at Mount St. Mary's (MD). Palarino would accomplish points number 1,000 and 1,001 on a right-handed lay-up just seven minutes into the second quarter of the contest. Maria concluded her Terrier career atop the record books in 13th place on the program's scoring list.



JADE JOHNSON BECOMES 18TH TERRIER TO 1,000!

Australian native Jade Johnson was welcomed into the 1,000-point club on Saturday, February 16 against the Blackbirds of LIU Brooklyn. The then-junior guard tallied 31 points against the down the block rivals. Following her former teammate garnering the same title, Johnson looks to climb into the top 10 on the Terrier scoring list during her senior season in the 2019-20 campaign, as she concluded her junior year with 1,143 points. The now-senior guard will now chase Christine Taps, who sits with 1,156 points for 12th all-time in program history. She also became the program's all-time leading single season scorer by tallying 598 points during the 2018-19 historical season, and averaging 19.9 points-per-game. She surpassed hall of famer Karen Erving Schiera who previously held the record with 591 points, set during the 1988-89 season.



AMY O'NEILL LANDS ATOP NCAA HONORS CHART

Former guard Amy O'Neill was named head coach Linda Cimino's floor general throughout the Australian's respective senior season. During her 2018-19 campaign, O'Neill ranked atop to conference's leaderboard with the most assists-per-game average, and never looked back. She would ride off into the sunset with the Northeast Conference's record of 268 in a single-season. Previously held by Erika Norman (229) during the 2013-14 season. In addition to breaking the program's historic mark, O'Neill was given the assists-per-game (8.6) title by the NCAA as she finished the season ahead of her fellow country-woman, Tiana Mangakahia (8.4) from Syracuse.
