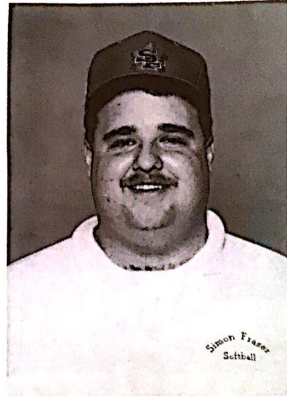

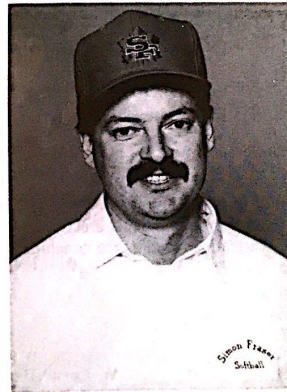
Russ Boris

It has been a productive off-season for Coach Boris with training, recruiting and preparation taking up much of the Coach's time. Originally from Regina, Saskatchewan, Boris played softball for ten seasons with a number of teams in the Province of Saskatchewan before graduating with a B.A. degree in Physical Education from Jamestown College in North Dakota.

In 1990 Boris was head coach of the Jamestown College softball team after four years as an assistant coach. Russ Boris guided his team to winning the District XII Championship. That feat also earned him the District XII Coach of the Year Award for 1990.

In 1991 Boris took on the task of recruiting and developing Simon Fraser's first women's softball team. Despite playing in the toughest District (I) in the NAIA, the Clan held their own with a 16-27 record. Coach Boris has used the 1991 season as a learning experience and added recruits for the 1992 season. With six top recruits and the majority of last year's team returning, the Clan will definitely be looking to make 1992 a year for Coach Boris' scrapbook.

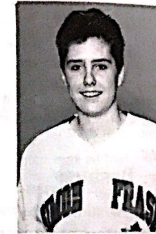
Jennifer Gregg
