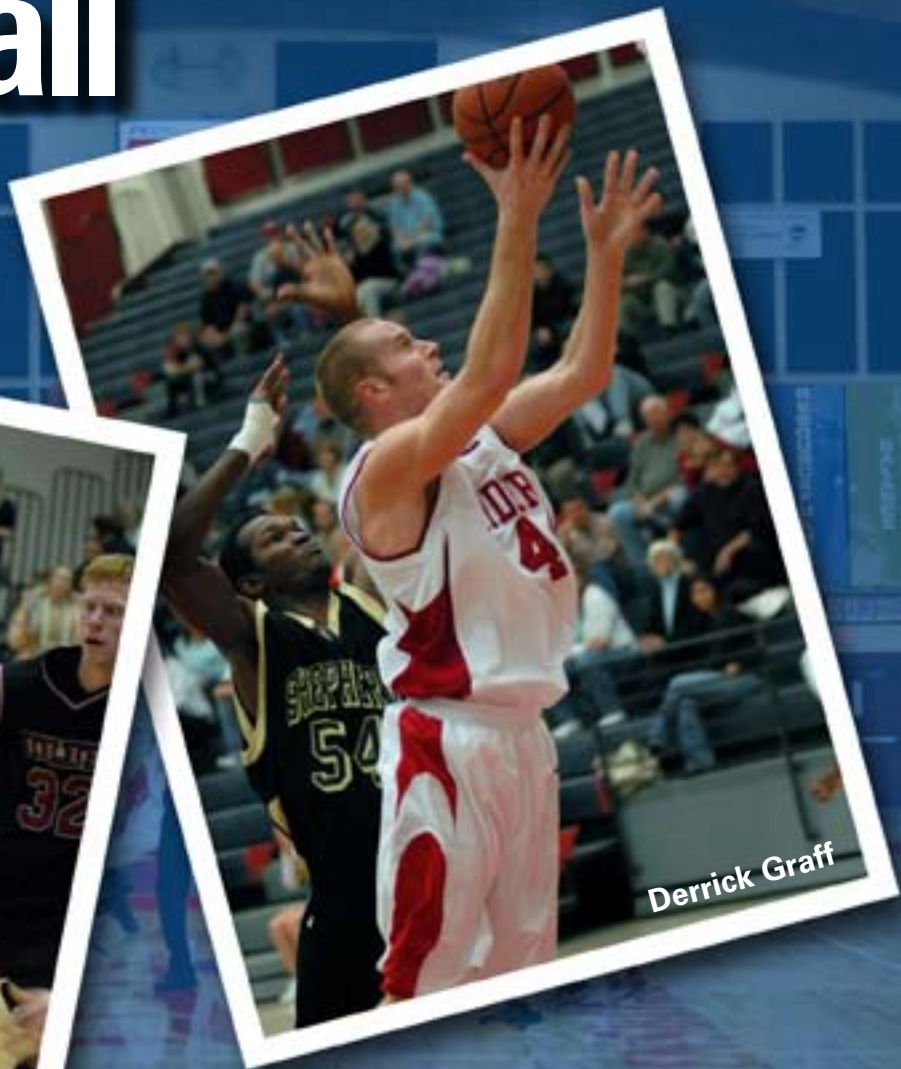

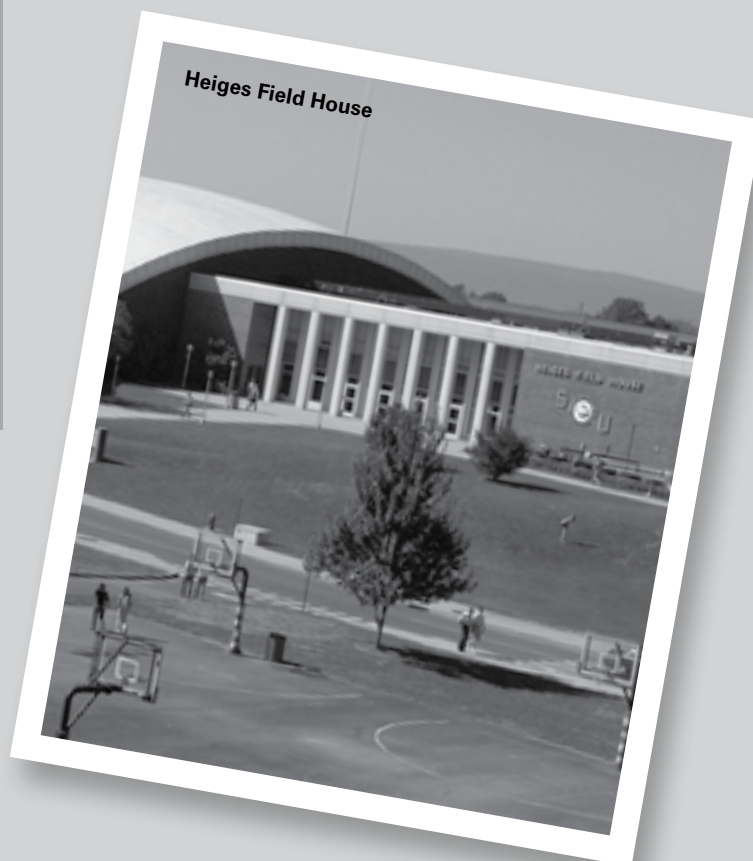

Admission to SU

- Prospective students must provide: a completed application form, a \$30 processing fee, official high school transcript*, recommendations*, and aptitude test results (SAT or ACT)*. The new SAT essay score or writing sample will not be used in the admission decision, but will be used for English placement.
*(*These must be sent by the high school, the College Board, or ACT.)*
- Transfer students must submit college transcripts.
- The Admissions Office operates on a rolling basis.
- The average applicant has a grade average of B or better and SAT score of 1070, for regularly admitted students.
- Successful applications display a student's leadership ability, special talents and interests and a high school record of college preparatory courses.
- 75% of applying students are admitted.

Academics and Athletics

Shippensburg University shapes its athletic program to fit within the overall academic goals of the university—maintaining a balance between athletics and academics.

Since 1984, the university's Office of Institutional Research has monitored the progress of our athletes in the classroom. The original study found that Shippensburg was ahead of many institutions in meeting the standards of Propositions 48 and 64—two NCAA resolutions designed to set minimum educational levels in collegiate athletes.

Proposition 64 of the NCAA established a minimum score of 700 in the SAT and a 2.0 grade point average in 11 core curriculum courses in high school. Proposition 48 carries these minimums even further and outlines availability of scholarships to freshmen athletes based on their school performance.

Incoming freshmen athletes show preparation levels comparable to those of all incoming students. In 2006, the average SAT score for incoming freshmen athletes was 1006, only slightly below the SAT average for new incoming students of 1015. Both groups average in the upper two-fifths of their graduating high school classes.

Today Shippensburg University athletes continue to uphold the study's findings. The quality point average (QPA) for all athletic teams in 2006-07 was 2.67 on a 4.0 scale. The 10 women's teams had a 2.93 overall average while the eight men's teams averaged 2.82. This can be compared to the fall 2006 figures: the total student body QPA averaged 2.82, females were slightly higher at 2.98, and males were slightly lower at 2.66.

Shippensburg's athletes continue to show high six-year graduation rates. Seventy-one percent of those receiving athletically related financial aid graduate within six years of enrolling. The 2005 NCAA Graduation Rate Report found that nationally, among public Division II schools, the graduation rate was 45 percent with athletes graduating at 54 percent. Retention studies by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning show male athletes at Shippensburg graduated at 55 percent and those receiving athletically related financial aid graduated at 54 percent. In addition, female athletes graduated at 79 percent and those receiving athletically related financial aid graduated at a rate of 81 percent.



Since 1975, 43 athletes have earned Academic All-America honors and three athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate scholarships. Many more of Shippensburg's fine athletes have been nominated for these and other regional and national honors.

Although the academic standards are stringent at Shippensburg, the 20 athletic teams have won about 60 percent of all their contests since 1975. Twelve university teams have won 53 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) championships in the same period.

Academic Support Services for Student Athletes

Shippensburg University established the Office of Academic Support Services for Student-Athletes to provide the best possible resources for enhancing the academic experiences of student-athletes. Through the coordinator, a variety of academic assistance services are available, including academic advising support, academic progress monitoring, academic counseling and referral, and assisting graduating student-athletes in researching and pursuing employment and/or opportunities for graduate education.

The Office of Academic Support Services for Student-Athletes has strong links with the Learning Center and other campus-wide programs to support the academic well being of student-athletes.

All student-athletes have the opportunity to participate in the CHAMPS/Life Skills program. This program is committed to promoting excellence in academics, athletics, career and personal development, and community service. In addition, all incoming first-year student-athletes have the opportunity to voluntarily participate in the PACES program. PACES (Personal, Academic, and Career Exploration Seminar) is open to all incoming undeclared first-year student-athletes who want to gain greater insight into campus majors, possible careers paths, campus resources, technology, scheduling concerns, and wellness issues.

The office provides advisement and a variety of programming options for all student-athletes to assist with balancing the demands of academic achievement and athletics success.

2008 SPRING SEMESTER STUDENT-ATHLETE ACADEMIC SUMMARY

The information listed below is based on 18 intercollegiate athletics teams. Shippensburg University had a total of 398 student-athletes during the 2008 spring semester.

- The semester QPA for all student-athletes was a 2.82.
- The semester QPA for men's athletics was a 2.57.
- The semester QPA for women's athletics was a 3.13.
- Women's swimming compiled the highest semester QPA by achieving a 3.45. Seven additional teams earned a QPA of 3.0 or higher: Tennis (3.32), Volleyball (3.29), Women's Cross Country (3.22), Women's Basketball (3.21), Field Hockey (3.19), Women's Soccer (3.16), and Women's Track and Field (3.12).
- Fourteen student-athletes earned a 4.0 QPA.
- Twenty-two percent (88) of student-athletes earned a 3.5 or higher QPA.
- Forty-three percent (172) of student-athletes earned a 3.0 or higher QPA.
- Thirty-six percent (142) of student-athletes have achieved a 3.0 or higher cumulative QPA.

Athletics Administration

Dr. Roberta Page

Director of Athletics

Dr. Roberta Page was appointed director of athletics in June 2003. She joined Shippensburg athletics in January 2000 as associate director of athletics and then served as interim director of athletics from December 2001 until June 2003.

Since coming on board, she has helped maintain Shippensburg's winning traditions. Shippensburg earned the 2005 Dixon Trophy, which is awarded by the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference to the member institution that has the best overall athletic program. It was the fifth time in the 10-year history of the award Shippensburg captured the honor.

A native of Greensburg, Pa., Page played basketball and softball at Slippery Rock University where she graduated in 1988. She majored in physical education with a minor in sports management.

Following graduation she taught health and physical education and served as assistant track coach (1989-95) and assistant varsity and head junior varsity basketball coach (1989-94) at Chambersburg High School. She also was head volleyball coach at Wilson College (1992-94).

Page earned two master's degrees from Western Maryland College — in athletic administration and educational administration with a concentration on higher education. She earned a doctoral degree in educational leadership from Duquesne University.



Jeff Michaels

Associate Director of Athletics

Jeff Michaels, associate director of athletics since July 2005, is responsible for organizing and implementing all aspects of NCAA rules compliance and education for the Shippensburg University Athletics Department.

Michaels is the chair of the NCAA Division II Field Hockey committee and is also a member of the Division II women's lacrosse regional advisory committee. In addition, he has served as a facilitator for the NCAA Division II Leadership Academy for the past two years.

Prior to coming to Shippensburg, Michaels served five years as an assistant to the athletics director at Slippery Rock University where he worked with rules compliance and facilities.

Previous to his position Slippery Rock, Michaels spent five years as the sports information director at Lycoming College, a Division III school in Williamsport, Pa. Prior to Lycoming, Michaels served six months as Slippery Rock's interim sports promotion and information director and one year as a graduate assistant in the same capacity.

Michaels earned his bachelor of arts in mass communication and political science from Lycoming in 1992 and his master's degree in athletics administration from Slippery Rock in 1993. He in Shippensburg with his wife Carrie and is the father of two sons, Douglas and Drew.

Assistant Director of Athletics

On Sept. 2, 2008, the Raider athletic department announced the hiring of Carrie Michaels as the assistant athletic director and senior woman administrator at Shippensburg University. Michaels had been serving as the interim coordinator of Academic Support Services for Student-Athletes since September of 2006.

"I am extremely excited about the opportunity to work directly in athletics," Michaels said.

Before coming to Shippensburg, Michaels served as the assistant to the Athletics Director at Slippery Rock University where she coordinated all academic support services for student-athletes, in addition to directing athletic fund-raising and camps and conferences.

Prior to that position, Michaels served as the Athletics Academic Coordinator and Assistant Women's Basketball Coach. After her time in Slippery Rock, Michaels served as Commissioner of the Atlantic Women's Colleges Conference (AWCC).

Michaels earned her bachelor of arts in psychology and criminal justice in 1995 at Duquesne where she also competed as a student-athlete in the sport of basketball. She earned her master's degree in sport management at Slippery Rock in 2001. She resides in Shippensburg with her husband, Jeff.

Heiges Field House

Fitness Center

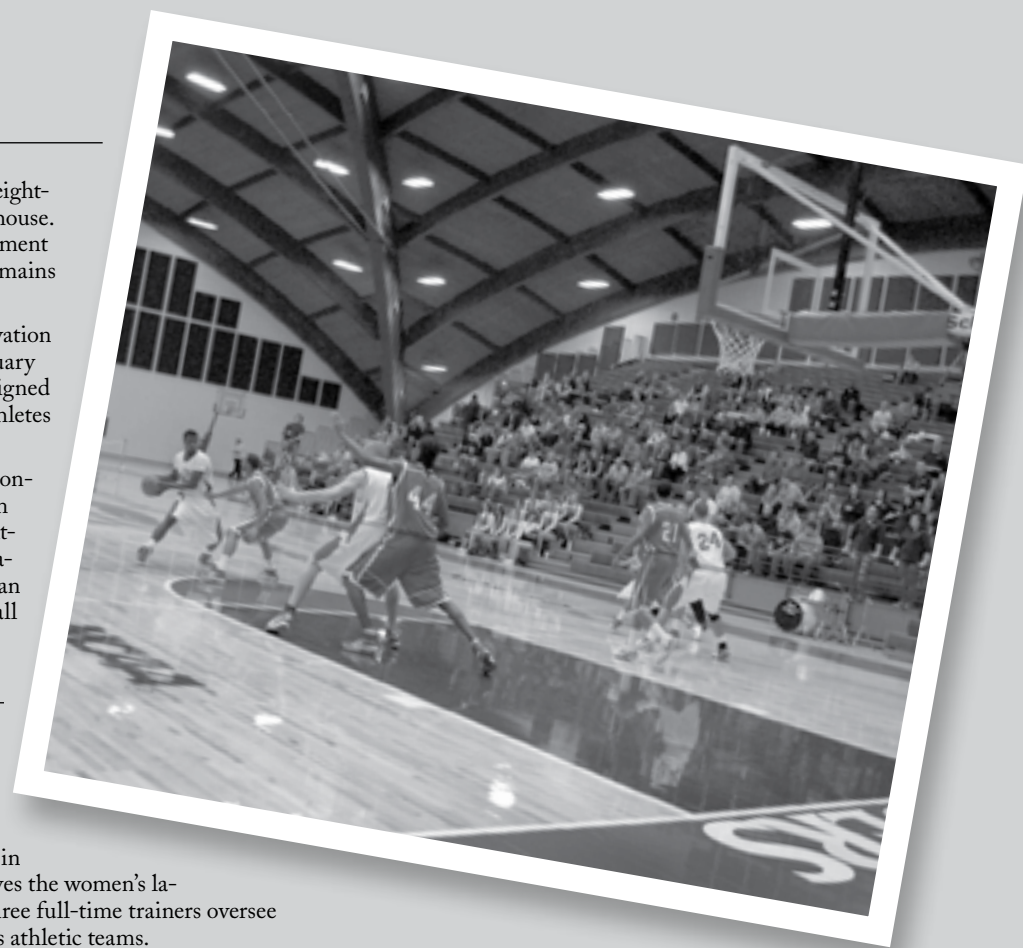
In addition to the rehabilitation center, Shippensburg University has a complete weight-training and fitness center inside the field house. The facility contains state-of-the-art equipment that benefits the athletes on campus and remains open more than 80 hours per week.

The facility is undergoing a complete renovation this winter and will be operational in February with brand new equipment specifically designed to enhance the well being of the student athletes on campus.

The cornerstone of Shippensburg's recent construction is a brand new Student Recreation Center - an 8,000 square foot, two-level, fitness center with free weights and cardio machines. It houses a four-court gymnasium, an elevated running track, racquet and handball courts, and exercise and dance spaces.

Training Facilities

The scope and importance of sports medicine at Shippensburg University has shown rapid growth in recent years. In addition to upgraded facilities in Heiges Field House, the university completed the renovation of a sports medicine facility in Henderson Gymnasium that primarily serves the women's lacrosse, field hockey, and softball teams. Three full-time trainers oversee the training needs of 20 men's and women's athletic teams.



Rehabilitation Center

The Etter Health Center provides essential health-care services for Shippensburg's student athletes. Orthopaedic Associates of Chambersburg serve as the team orthopedic consultants. Wes Mallicone, director of sports medicine, supervises the first-aid, prevention, treatment, evaluation, and rehabilitation of injuries to approximately 600 student athletes. The sports medicine staff operates three coed training rooms on campus.

Student athletes to seek out the new techniques and care now available to them in the area of sports medicine. They continue to be surprisingly sophisticated in their knowledge of today's sports medicine methods. The coaches are very supportive of Ship's sports medicine program since strong and healthy athletes are at a premium.

According to Orthopaedic Associates of Chambersburg, "The speciality of sports medicine is now as deeply involved in the prevention of sports injuries as in their treatment. This requires the active participation and input of coaches, trainers, and physicians in the use of highly specialized equipment during the pre-season conditioning programs."

Shippensburg's evaluation and rehabilitation capabilities in Heiges Field House were relocated to the west end of the field house arena in 1991 for easier accessibility. Constantly upgrading, the rehabilitation center offers state-of-the-art Cybex evaluation and rehabilitation equipment. The equipment includes a computerized treadmill that can operate at speeds up to 10 miles per hour and can be elevated to heights up to 25 degrees; four Fitron bicycle ergometers; an Upper Body Ergometer; an Orthotron for knee rehabilitation; and a multi-axle ankle rehabilitation machine. The most dynamic piece of equipment is the Cybex II isokinetic dynamometer, which produces a computerized readout on muscle strength and weakness for every muscle group and joint in the body. This equipment gives Shippensburg an evaluation and rehabilitation center that is unique in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.

Dave Springer

Eighth Year

Dave Springer enters his eighth year as head coach of the Shippensburg University men's basketball team. Over the course of seven seasons, Springer has recruited and graduated the winningest senior class in school history and revitalized the program into a perennial PSAC Championship contender.

Including one season in which he was the interim head coach at Millersville University, Springer has compiled a 105-119 record, but is 67-51 over the past four seasons. In 2005-06, Springer produced his most successful team, as it won a Shippensburg record 24 games, captured the PSAC Western Division with an 11-1 conference mark and was a runner-up in the PSAC Championship.

It was Shippensburg's first PSAC West crown since 1989, and at season's end the Red Raiders nabbed the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Division II East Region—the school's second appearance in the NCAA Tournament and its first since 1991.

Springer's teams have also built a reputation for playing tough, aggressive defense. In the 2005 and 2006 campaigns, his teams finished in the nation's top 10 in scoring defense, and were ranked fourth in 2005-06 after allowing just 59.1 points per game.

Shippensburg has also built a winning tradition at Heiges Field House under Springer. Entering the 2008-09 season his teams have won 44 of its last 55 games at home, including the opening round game of the PSAC Tournament in 2006.

Springer's success did not go unnoticed, as he was tabbed PSAC Western Division Coach of the Year for the 2006 season. He was recently selected to serve as a member of the 2007-08 East regional advisory committee (RAC) for the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Committee. Among his duties were to rank the top teams in the region as well as aid with the selection process for the NCAA tournament.

Springer, who was an assistant coach at California University (Pa.) in 2001, has coached in the PSAC for 15 years at three different universities.

Prior to taking the assistant's job at California he was an assistant coach at Shippensburg for 11 years, coaching from 1989 to 1996 and again from 1998 to 2000. He guided Millersville to an 11-15 record as the team's head coach during the 1996-97 season.

Springer began his coaching career in 1985 as an assistant at Bridgton Academy in Bridgton, Maine. He became the head coach in 1986 and served two years before moving on to Shippensburg to pursue a master's degree. During his three years at Bridgton, his teams compiled a record of 38-30.

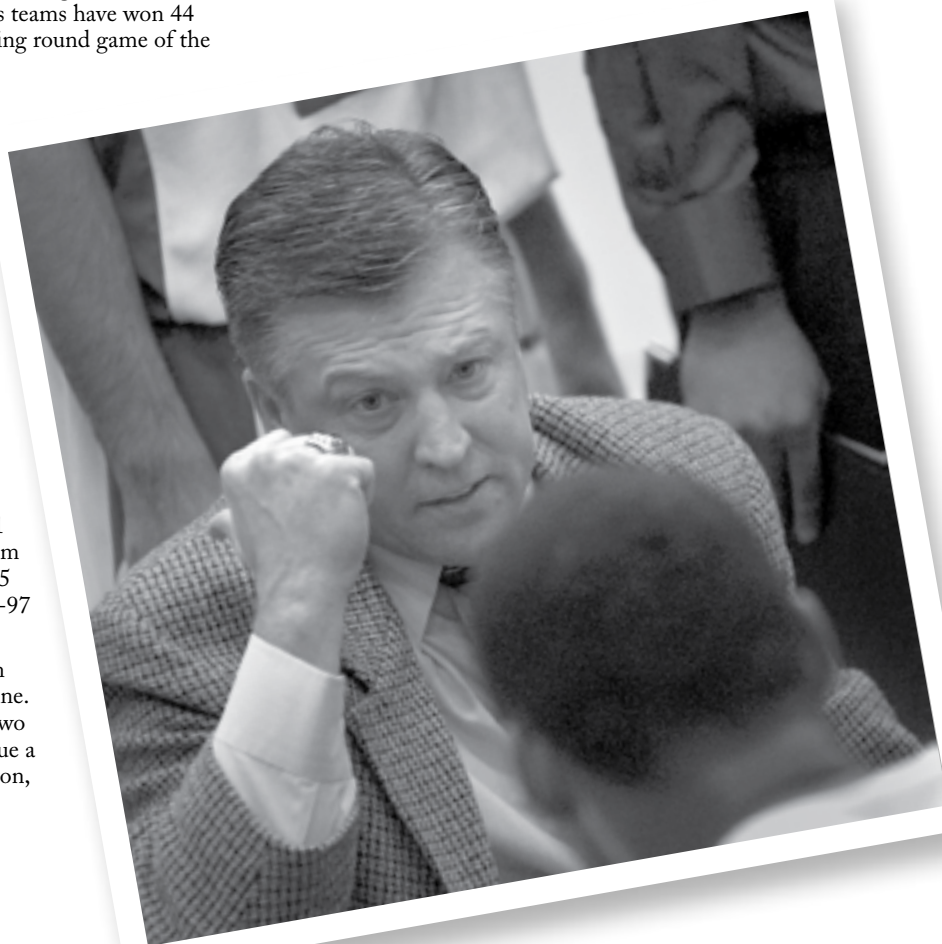


Springer joined the Shippensburg coaching staff as a graduate assistant at the start of the 1988-89 academic year and he was promoted to full-time assistant coach the following year. He was on the staff in 1991 when Shippensburg won the PSAC championship and he assisted in the team's drive to the PSAC West title in 1989.

While at Shippensburg, Springer built a reputation for hard work. He was an energetic teacher and a tireless recruiter. He also helped the team establish a support system for academics. That effort has paid dividends through the years, helping Shippensburg maintain high retention and graduation rates. Five players made the dean's list in the spring of 2002.

Springer went to Millersville just before the start of the 1996-97 season to be the interim head coach. Among his accomplishments with the Mounties was the work he devoted to the Millersville department of athletics in its effort to organize an academic support program for the team. On the court, Millersville was in the hunt for a PSAC playoff berth until the last week of the season, winning eight of their last 13 games. One of the highlights of the year was an upset of PSAC champion Mansfield. It was the only conference loss of the season for the Mounties.

Springer spent seven summers coaching with Planet Basketball and The Hoop Camp. He has taken eight teams to Venezuela, Spain, Sweden, Trinidad-Tobago and Canada. In the summer of 1999 he took a senior team which included Shippensburg star Wayne Morris and six other All-PSAC players to Sweden. In the summer of 2000, before joining the staff at California, he helped organize the Shippensburg basketball team's tour in Canada. The summer of 2003 saw Springer taking Marcus Hudson and Chuck Davis on a six-game tour to Toronto and Montreal.



Springer serves on the International Basketball Coaches Committee for the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). He is Vice-President on the Advisory Board of the Boys and Girls Clubhouse in Shippensburg. He worked with the Boys and Girls Club of Central Pennsylvania to open a Shippensburg Clubhouse in March of 2004. Under his direction, many Red Raider players have worked as counselors at the Boys and Girls Club.

Springer also began working to hold an annual "Food for the Hungry Game," in which students receive free admission to the game with the donation of a canned good. All proceeds were donated to the local food bank, The King's Kettle.

A 1984 graduate of Ohio University, Springer holds a degree in business. He grew up in Dayton, Ohio, and played basketball at Northridge High School, graduating in 1978. Springer earned his master's degree from Shippensburg in communications studies in the fall of 1991. Springer, along with his wife Jackie and son Austin, live in Shippensburg.

Ninth Year

Mike Nestor is entering his ninth year as an assistant on the men's basketball coaching staff. He is a 2000 graduate of Shippensburg University and played basketball for the Red Raiders from the 1995-96 season to the 1999-2000 season.

During his athletic career at Shippensburg, Nestor lettered four years and was captain of the team for two years. He scored a total of 631 points. In addition he had 263 rebounds and 218 assists. Primarily a guard, Nestor also saw action at forward. He was the starting point guard in 1997-98 and 1998-99. Nestor is from Collingdale and a 1995 graduate of Monsignor Bonner High School.

He played for Shippensburg in 1995-96 and then led the team in three-pointers with 27 the following season. In 1999, he led Shippensburg in assists with 92 and in 2000 he was second on the team in assists with 45. As an assistant Nestor coordinates the high school recruiting and the advanced scouting of all opponents.

He has also played a major role in the development of Shippensburg's guards, which have produced tremendous results during his watch. With the coaching of Nestor, Marcus Hudson became Shippensburg's career steals leader in 2006 and Chuck Davis was named PSAC Western Division Player of the Year and has quickly moved into 10th place on Shippensburg's career scoring list.

His guards have also become known for their aggressive defensive play, which has been instrumental in the Red Raiders' success the last two seasons. Nestor guided the post players for one season but has since moved back to tutoring the guards, as fellow assistant Todd Johnson is in his second year mentoring the forwards and centers.

Nestor is also responsible for monitoring the academic support of the student-athletes in the men's basketball program.

Second Year

The second-newest member of Shippensburg's 1,000-point club, Todd Johnson is back for his second season as a mentor from the sidelines. Johnson joined the coaching staff for the 2007-08 season as the replacement for Marcus Hudson.

A native of Philadelphia and a graduate of St. John Neumann High School, Johnson thrived in the post for Shippensburg over his four-year career. In his junior season, Johnson ranked second on the team in scoring with an average of 8.4 points per contest. He scored in double figures on 11 occasions and shot a team-best .536 percent from the floor.

As a senior, Johnson delivered an average of 10.5 points per game and virtually matched his excellent shooting percentage with a .537 mark from the field. He concluded his career with 57 blocks, 110 steals and 111 assists.

Johnson works primarily with the post players, and has worked extensively with current Red Raider Derrick Graff. Last season, Graff was Shippensburg's lone selection to the All-PSAC Western Division squad, earning second-team honors after averaging 13.1 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.

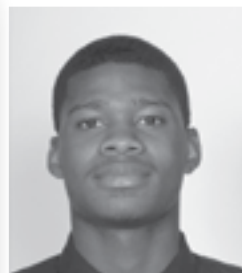

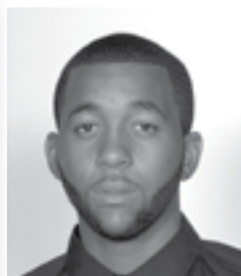

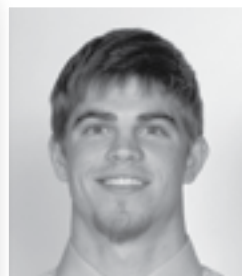

Season Outlook

The Shippensburg men's basketball team admittedly hit a stumbling block in the 2007-08 season. Yet it takes a lot of work to make up for the departure of solid players like Chuck Davis, Todd Johnson, Jamal Williams and Greg Wojdowski to name a few, but the transition period took a little bit longer than expected for Red Raider supporters.

It is painstakingly difficult for any team to recover from the loss of eight letterwinners, including four starters and seven of the team's eight leaders in minutes from one season to the next. That transition, in combination with the loss of the team's two leading scorers just a third of the way through last season, resulted in the Red Raiders finishing with their first losing record since 2003-04.

But with the bad news comes the good. The Red Raiders will maintain some consistency heading into the 2008-09 campaign by returning four of their five starters while also bringing back six letterwinners from last year's squad. The group is united by a strong determination to win, along with excellent conditioning.

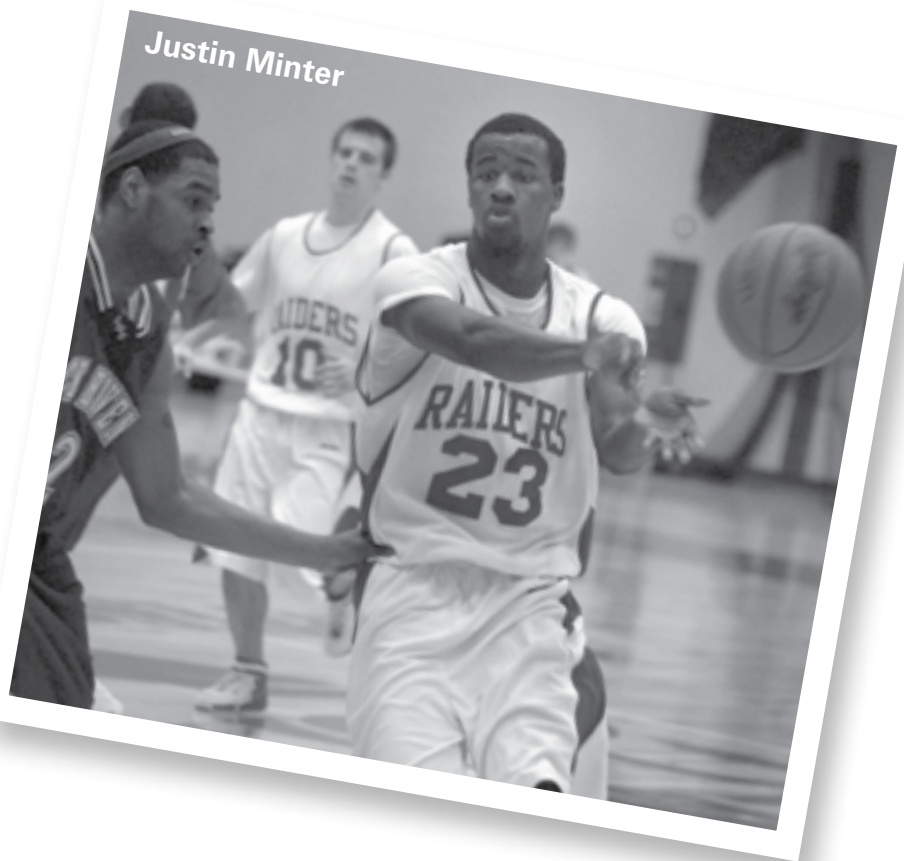
The preservation of that Red Raider work ethic, along with a renewed defensive presence, can help bring back shades of a Shippensburg program that is just three years removed from a school-record 24 victories and the second PSAC Western Division title in school history.

Under the guidance of eighth-year head coach Dave Springer, Shippensburg has long maintained one of the best defenses in the PSAC and the East Region. Last season, however, the Red Raiders ranked 10th in the conference in scoring defense and allowed opponents to connect for 202 three-pointers, the most in the PSAC. With the players now having a full year of the system under their belt, one can expect a more tenacious defensive effort from Shippensburg this season.

The team will no longer be able to count upon the production of Alex Jones, who graduated following the 2007-08 season. Jones capped off his senior season at Shippensburg by tying the school record for 3-pointers in a season, finishing the year 71-of-209 from behind the three-point line. He finished his two-year career at Shippensburg with 603 points in two seasons with the Red Raiders and 1,159 points.

Possessing an undergraduate degree will not stop guard Ryan Kraft from completing his final season of athletic eligibility. After a red-shirt season in 2006-07, Kraft concludes his career while playing as a graduate student. He will be counted upon to mirror his scoring production of a season ago while helping to mentor what is still a very young nucleus of players.

Two twin brothers from Philadelphia highlight the recruiting class for Shippensburg this season. Wes and Will Kirkland of Roman Catholic High School combined to average 25 points and 11 rebounds last season and will vie for playing time at the forward position. Will is expected to red-shirt this season.



Meanwhile, junior-transfer Stephon Draper is expected to be an immediate contributor from the guard position after two successful seasons at Lackawanna College. Draper will look to fill the void left by the graduation of Jones.

Yet as the season progresses, the product will improve with more experience and most importantly, more time on the floor. With the exception of Kraft, no player on the roster had recorded a start before last season, so the old saying will truly be the difference in that practice will make perfect.

GUARD

Sophomore Justin Minter emerged as a significant contributor to the Red Raider offensive attack after a stellar rookie season. The three-time PSAC Western Division Rookie of the Week finished the season by scoring at least nine points in 14 of his last 15 games and averaging 15.6 points over the final five games of the season. He totaled 222 points, 43 assists and shot 44.6 percent from the field.

Joining Minter will be Draper, who is expected to start and fulfill the point guard spot this season. At Lackawanna, he scored 494 points and tallied 172 assists to go along with 127 rebounds and 96 steals. Draper can also help the Red Raiders at the charity stripe, as he shot 77 percent from the foul line along with 46 percent from the field, and 40 percent from the 3-point line.

One could successfully argue that junior Brian Oleksiak is the most well-rounded player on the team. A tenacious defender with an unparalleled work ethic and hustle, Oleksiak finished the 2007-08 campaign with appearances in all 27 games while averaging over 20 minutes per contest. He upped his scoring while finishing third on the team in assists and steals.

Impressive sophomore Dane Lauber is also back and will look to make an even bigger impact this season. With a unique ability to slash to the basket, Lauber made 10 starts in his debut season and averaged four points per game. He was fourth on the team with 17 steals and will seek even more playing time after averaging nearly 18 minutes per contest last year.

Greencastle-Antrim native Jaren Gembe is back for his second season with the Red Raiders having already gained collegiate experience in running the point. Gembe appeared in 24 of the team's 27 games last season and averaged nearly 21 minutes per game while totaling 32 assists and seven steals as a freshman.

After completing a red-shirt season, talented freshman Lamar Drayton will get a chance to showcase his talents this season. He will also be given a chance to earn a starting spot as a guard this season. Drayton was 2007 Harrisburg-Patriot Big 15 selection and helped the Cougars of Harrisburg High School reach the PIAA AAAA semi-finals game as a senior.

Freshman Craig Van Scyoc, the all-time leading scorer at Shippensburg Area Senior High School, will also be a key rookie contributor for the Red Raiders. Van Scyoc is expected to compete for playing time at either of the guard positions while making the transition to the college game.

Red-shirt freshman John Vanderzell joins the team out of Living Word Academy, but the hidden jewel of this year's incoming class could very well be freshman Lamar Jackson. Hailing from Archbishop Carroll, Jackson was a stand-out point guard who regularly played among the best in the Catholic League. He earned All-Catholic League honorable mention and averaged 12 points, six assists and 1.5 steals per game as a senior.

FORWARD

After missing the 2006-07 season due to injury, Kraft returned last year and was a solid leader on a very young team, averaging 11.7 points and 5.2 rebounds per game as a red-shirt junior. He connected for 63 3-pointers and finished third on the team in points while ranking second in blocks, steals and assists.

At 6-feet 5-inches, his size makes him a tricky matchup for opposing guards. Kraft will likely play the '2', '3' and '4' at various points throughout the season.

The Kirkland twins also slot into forward roles, but Wes will see time this season while Will is expected to red-shirt. Wes will be given a full opportunity to earn a lot of playing time as a freshman while adjusting to the college game and learning the offense.

Junior Daziah Miller is expected to join the team for the Spring semester after improving his academic standing. Through nine games last season, Miller led the team with 16.1 points per game and 8.4 rebounds per contest. He is a tremendous asset in the post and will be counted upon later in the year.

Shippensburg's only senior besides Kraft, Brett Malikowski, returns after joining the club last season as a walk-on. He will add depth to the roster at forward.

CENTER

Returning to solidify the '5' is red-shirt junior center Derrick Graff, who was named to the All-PSAC Western Division Second Team following the 2007-08 season. He was the lone Red Raider chosen. Graff finished the season fourth on the team in scoring at 13.1 points per game and third in rebounding at 7.5 rebounds per game.

However, over the team's final 18 games, he led the team in scoring and rebounding, averaging 16.3 points and 7.6 rebounds. He totaled a career-high 32 points at Slippery Rock on February 2 to go along with nine rebounds. He has grown increasingly comfortable with the offense and will be counted upon for big production once again this season.

COACHING STAFF

Dave Springer (Ohio '84) enters his eighth year as head coach of the Shippensburg University men's basketball team. Over the course of seven seasons, Springer has recruited and graduated the winningest senior class in school history and revitalized the program into a perennial PSAC Championship contender. Including one season in which he was the interim head coach at Millersville University, Springer has compiled a 105-119 record, but is 67-51 over the past four seasons.

Assisting Springer will be Mike Nestor '00, who returns for his ninth season as a Red Raider coach. As the team's primary assistant, Nestor coordinates the high school recruiting and the advanced scouting of all opponents. He has also played a major role in the development of Shippensburg's guards, which have produced tremendous results during his watch.

Meanwhile, Todd Johnson '07 is back for his second season to work with the post players, while Herb Bowers will once again be a volunteer assistant.

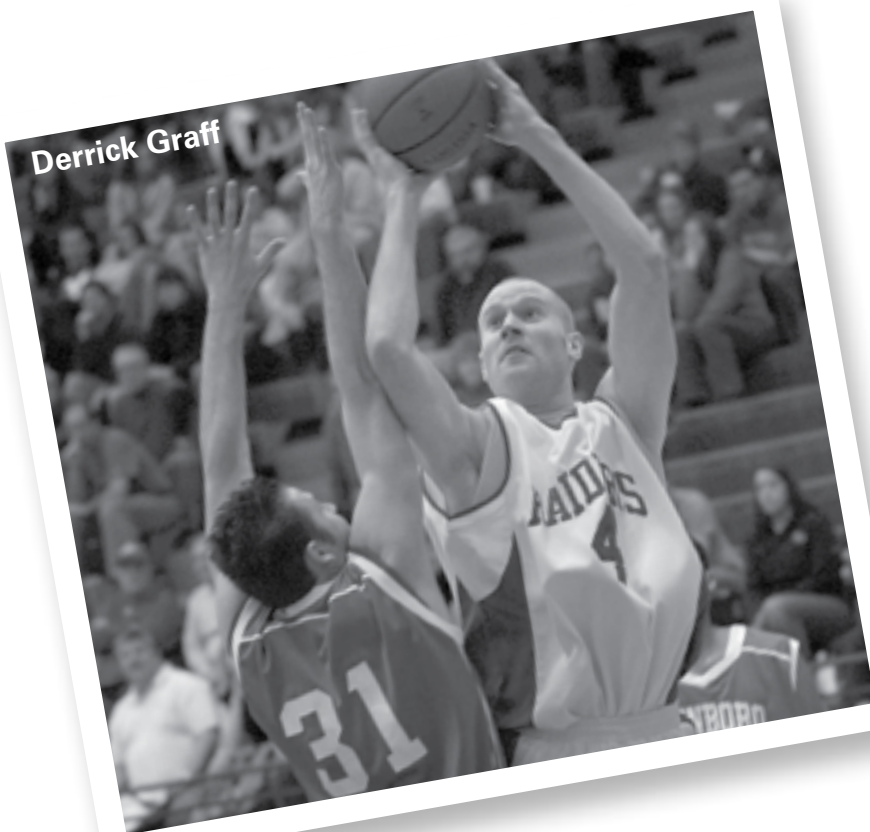
SCHEDULE

Shippensburg shifts back to the PSAC Eastern Division this season but the Red Raiders will open their schedule with a home game against Lock Haven on November 17. Despite opening at home, the Red Raiders will only be home one other time before the New Year, hosting UPJ on December 1.

Shippensburg will compete in two tournaments in the second month of the season, including the prestigious 35th Annual Porrecco Cup at Gannon University on December 29 and 30. The Red Raiders will also combat Chestnut Hill and Queens at the East Stroudsburg Classic on December 5 and 6.

The PSAC Crossover schedule features home games with Mercyhurst and Slippery Rock, but the next week the Red Raiders will dip into its storied PSAC Western Division history by renewing its series with California (Pa.) and IUP on January 10 and 11.

Conference play begins on January 14, when the team travels to Mansfield. The first home game in conference play will be Saturday, January 17 against East Stroudsburg. The key stretch will be a run of four home games out of five overall contests from February 4-18.

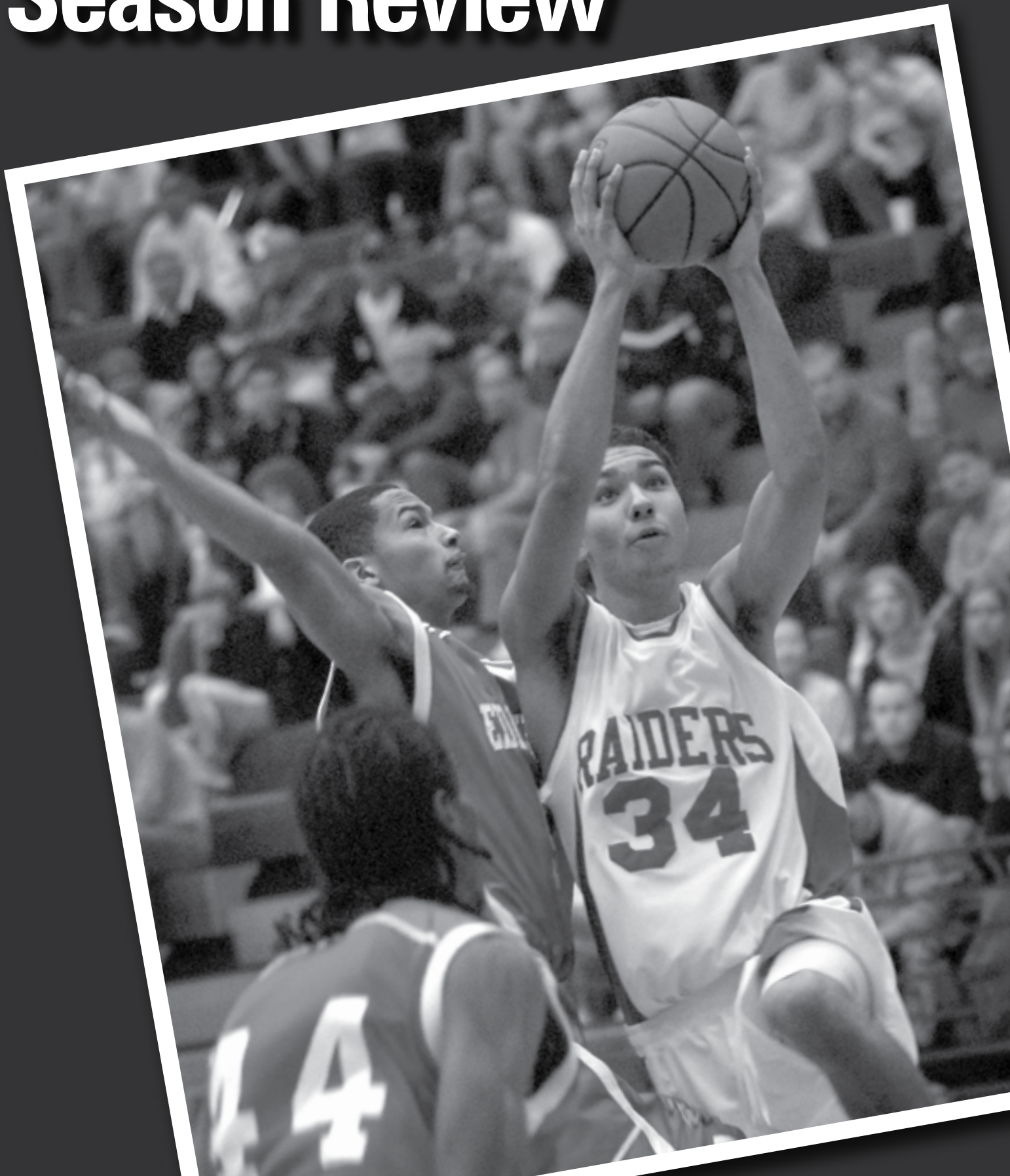

Jones Ties School Record For Three-Pointers in 72-62 Win Over IUP

Senior guard Alex Jones drained five three-pointers in his final collegiate game to tie the school record for three-pointers in a season and propel the Red Raiders to a season-ending 72-62 victory over Indiana (Pa.) inside Heiges Field House.

Jones tied the mark set by Matt Markle '88-92, finishing the season 71-of-209 from behind the three-point line. Markle finished the 1990-91 season making 71-of-136 three-point attempts. Shippensburg (8-19, 2-10 PSAC West) closed its season on a two-game winning streak by maintaining a lead through the entire second half and draining clutch three-pointers down the stretch. Minter's final three-pointer iced the victory by giving the Red Raiders a seven-point lead with 1:13 to play.

Wednesday night's contest quickly evolved into a distance-shooting gallery, as the two teams combined for 25 three-pointers and 56 three-point attempts. The two teams entered the game with a combined average of 35.7 percent but finished Wednesday making 45 percent of their three-point attempts

In addition to the eight combined three-pointers from Kraft and Minter, red-shirt junior guard Ryan Kraft maintained his hot scoring touch by draining four three-pointers en route to 13 points.

Jones, who finished with 17 points, eight assists and four steals, concludes his two-year career at Shippensburg with 603 points in two seasons with the Red Raiders and 1,159 points over his career. The senior guard led Shippensburg with 358 points this season and delivered a career-high 106 assists in his final season with Shippensburg.

Men's Basketball Snaps 11-Game Losing Streak With Win Over The Rock

The Shippensburg men's basketball team opened its contest against Slippery Rock with a 10-0 run and never trailed en route to a decisive 69-48 victory over The Rock that snapped the worst losing streak for the Red Raiders since the 1999-2000 season.

Shippensburg (7-19, 1-10 PSAC West) had lost 11 consecutive games entering the contest, but the team's best defensive effort of the season allowed the Red Raiders to earn their first conference victory since a 72-51 victory at IUP on February 21, 2007, a span of 367 days.

Shippensburg also came through at the free-throw line, making 24-of-31 from the charity stripe and recording its most free-throw attempts since the season opener with Alderson-Broadbuss. The Red Raiders also maintained a 42-34 rebounding advantage over The Rock.

Before the game, Shippensburg recognized Jones in a ceremony honoring him for becoming the 27th player in school history to achieve 1,000 career points. Student assistant coach Steve Novosel was also recognized for his four years of service to Red Raider basketball.

Red Raiders Put Scare Into #21 California (Pa.), But Fall Short, 71-60

The Shippensburg men's basketball team was tied with the #21-ranked Vulcans of California University (Pa.) with four minutes to play, but the Red Raiders were held scoreless down the stretch and dropped a 71-60 decision inside Hamer Hall.

Shippensburg (6-19, 0-10 PSAC West) received a strong effort from freshman Justin Minter, who erupted for a career-high 20 points and has now scored at least nine points in 12 of his last 13 games.

Shippensburg maintained the pace with the Vulcans for the first 12 minutes of the game, as a lay-up from freshman Dane Lauber gave the Red Raiders a 19-17 lead with 8:51 left in the first half.

With the loss, the Red Raiders are currently enduring their worst losing streak since the 1999-2000 season, when Shippensburg lost 11 straight games including nine in PSAC Western Division play. Wednesday's loss marks the first time the Red Raiders have lost 10 consecutive PSAC Western Division games since the 1994-95 season, when Shippensburg finished 9-17 and 2-10 in the PSAC West.

Red Raiders' Bid For Victory Spoiled By Late Three-Pointer From The Rock

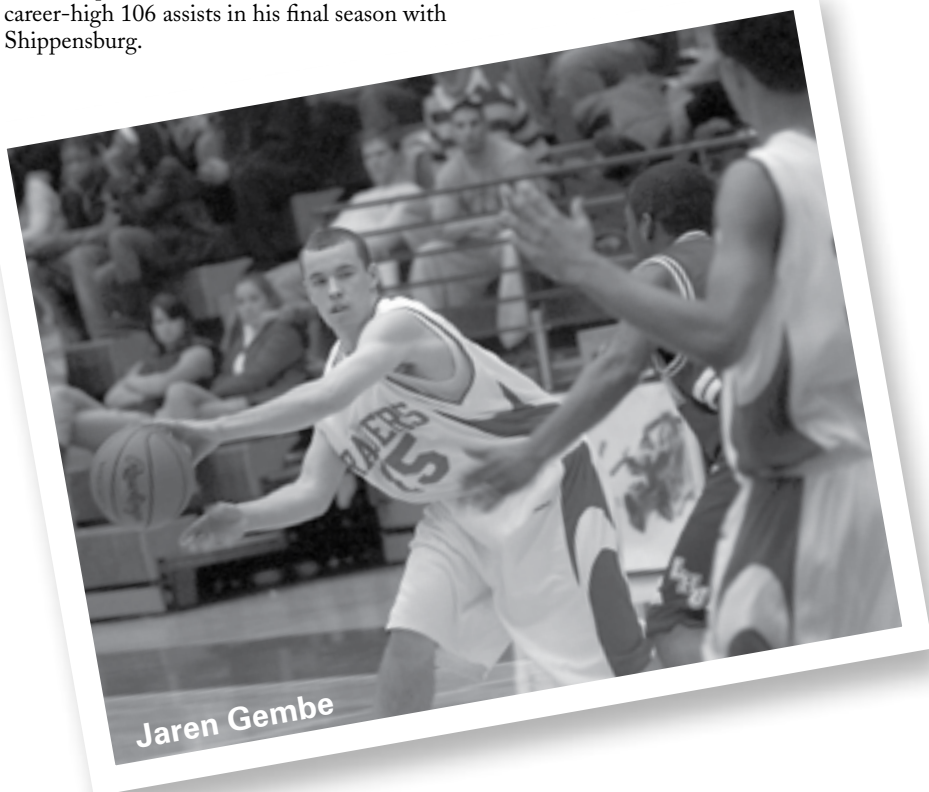
Red-shirt sophomore center Derrick Graff recorded his second consecutive game of at least 30 points, but the Shippensburg University men's basketball team was doomed by a late three-pointer from Slippery Rock's Itay Levy that resulted in a 74-72 victory for The Rock at Morrow Field House.

Shippensburg (6-16, 0-6 PSAC West) led by seven points with 3:02 remaining, but The Rock put forth a furious comeback by closing the game on a 9-0 run that was capped off by Levy's three-pointer with 13 seconds remaining.

Senior guard Alex Jones missed a jumper in the final 10 seconds, and following a foul with 1.5 seconds left, red-shirt junior guard Ryan Kraft could not convert a desperation three-pointer at the buzzer.

Freshman Justin Minter was the third player in double figures for Shippensburg with 12 points and added defensive help with two blocks. Freshmen guards David Reisinger and Jaren Gembe both hit clutch three-pointers down the stretch to keep the Red Raiders in the game.

Shippensburg shot 53.8 percent from the field for the contest, including 63 percent in the first half, to mark the sixth time this season the Red Raiders have shot over 50 percent from the field and the first time in conference play.

Red Raiders Prevail With 71-64 Victory Over Bloomsburg

Red-shirt sophomore center Derrick Graff returned to the starting lineup with a bang, totaling a career-high 16 points and 14 rebounds to earn his first career double-double and help guide the Shippensburg men's basketball team to a 71-66 victory over the Bloomsburg Huskies in a frenetic contest from Nelson Field House.

En route to their third victory in four games, several Red Raiders recorded season and career highs Tuesday as Shippensburg made changes to its lineup. Parker, who made his first start of the season and delivered a season-high six assists to go along with eight points and two steals. Along with Jones, the guards combined for 23 points, 10 assists and six steals.

Late Run Propels Red Raiders to 67-57 Victory Over Neumann On Alumni Day

Leading by just four points with 3:35 remaining in regulation, the Shippensburg men's basketball team limited the visiting Neumann Knights to 0-of-7 shooting from the field while converting seven consecutive free throw attempts to clinch a 67-57 victory inside Heiges Field House.

Shippensburg (4-5) held double-digit leads in both halves but had to hold off Neumann on two separate occasions. In the first half, the Red Raiders led by 15 points with 7:09 remaining in the half before the Knights closed on a 19-7 run to trail at halftime by just three points, 31-28.

Shippensburg's three-point shooting caught fire at the beginning of the second half after scoring 20 of its 31 first-half points in the paint. Three-pointers from senior guard Alex Jones and red-shirt junior guard Ryan Kraft in a 30-second span helped guide the Red Raiders on a 14-3 run over the opening six minutes of the second half to a 14-point lead, 45-31, at 13:55.

Miller's Double-Double, Kraft's Six Three-Pointers Highlight 82-66 Victory

Sophomore Daziah Miller recorded his second double-double of the season and red-shirt junior Ryan Kraft tied a career-high set last week with six three-pointers as the Shippensburg men's basketball team outlasted Chestnut Hill, 82-66 at Heiges Field House.

The Red Raiders never trailed in the contest and built a lead of 25 points midway through the second half. Chestnut Hill trailed by just six points after draining a three-pointer to begin the second half, but Shippensburg responded with a 22-3 run over the next seven minutes to clinch the victory.

Shippensburg (3-4) totaled its largest offensive output in its last 25 games, since the Red Raiders totaled 95 points in a victory over Mansfield on December 20, 2006. Three Red Raiders totaled double figures in scoring on Tuesday night, led by 23 points and 10 rebounds from Miller in just 22 minutes of action. It is the sixth time in seven games this season that Miller has scored in double figures.

The PSAC





The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, with 57 years of organized competition, has evolved into one of the NCAA's largest and most heralded intercollegiate athletic conferences.

The 2008-09 academic year will be a groundbreaking one for the PSAC, as the league will expand beyond its original 14 members for the first time since its official formation in 1951. New full-time members Gannon University and Mercyhurst College, along with associate member Long Island University – C.W. Post, expect to complement the PSAC's already solid foundation.

With 16 full-time institutions, the PSAC shares distinction with the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference as the NCAA Division II's largest in terms of membership. League expansion has brought acclaim through postseason opportunities, as well. In 2008-09, the Conference will sponsor 23 championships, the most for leagues in Division II.

Highly competitive on a regional and national level, PSAC schools annually combine to send nearly one-third of its teams into NCAA postseason play. Ultimately, the membership's success has yielded 40 NCAA team and 218 individual title winners.

While proud of its athletic accomplishments, the league also has evolved into one of Division II's finest from an academic standpoint. Today, well over a quarter of the PSAC's estimated 5,300 participants are honored each year as "Scholar-Athletes" for maintaining a grade-point average of 3.25 or better – a total that has nearly doubled since PSAC Scholar-Athletes were first recognized in the mid-1990s.

The PSAC was organized in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering men's athletic programs within the 14 state teachers colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In 1977, due to the interest and growth of women's athletics, the conference was restructured to provide for women's programs.

Upon its formation, the league did not have a standard competitive division. However, in 1980, the league voted to reclassify the entire conference to NCAA Division II. Although all 16 current institutions are members of Division II, eight schools also compete at the Division I level in select sports. PSAC schools enroll over 117,000 students and claim over 661,000 alumni, including 430,000 who reside in Pennsylvania.

The PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 16 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, two assistant commissioners and a director of media relations at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

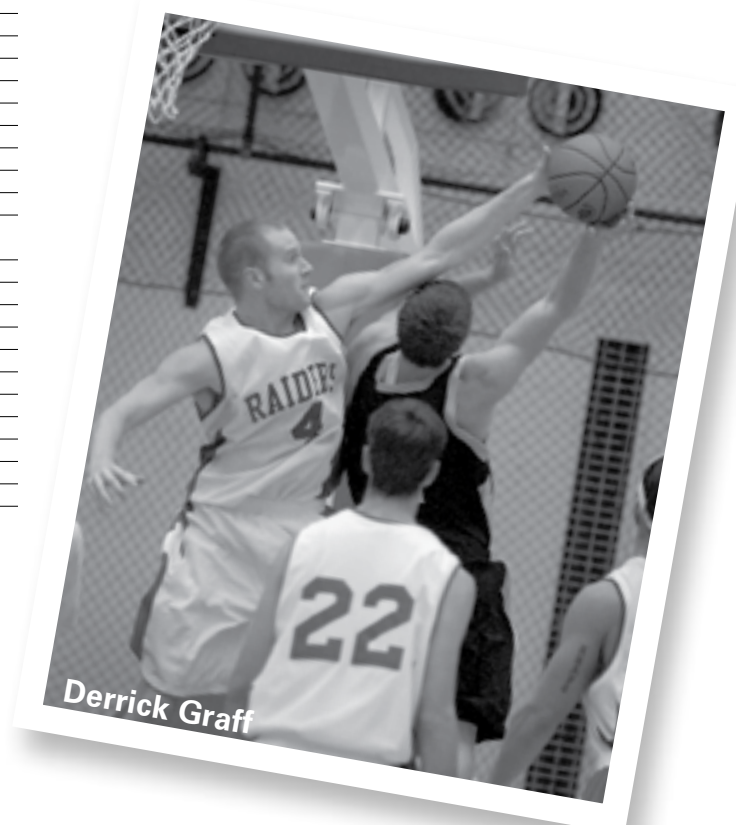

Coccagna Receives PSAC Heaslip Award



Tony Coccagna, sports editor at The Indiana Gazette in Indiana, Pa. has been named the recipient of the 2008 George Heaslip Media Award. The award was presented to him August 4 at the annual Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Football Preseason Luncheon, held this year on Lock Haven University's campus.

The Heaslip Media Award is presented annually by the league's sports information directors to a media professional for meritorious service in covering the conference's student-athletes, coaches and teams. The award is named after former Cheyney SID George Heaslip, an admirable ambassador of his institution and the PSAC.

Coccagna is in his 24th year at The Indiana Gazette and his 15th year as the sports editor there. He started as an intern with the newspaper in 1984, was moved into a sports writers position and was later promoted to sports editor in 1993, a position he continues to hold.

He becomes the second member of his family to have the Heaslip Award bestowed upon him as his brother, Tom, a longtime sports editor of the Chambersburg Public Opinion, received the honor in 1998. Tom, who has since retired, gave his younger brother his start in the journalism business back in 1976 while Tony was a sophomore in high school as a member of the Public Opinion's staff in his hometown on Chambersburg.

The younger Coccagna has been following PSAC sports for 30 years, having covered his first PSAC event, a basketball game between Kutztown and Shippensburg, in 1978. He has since covered hundreds of PSAC basketball games as well as many other PSAC events and subjects. He currently heads a staff at The Indiana Gazette that provides comprehensive coverage of IUP athletics.

Twice during the mid-1990s, he wrote the Division II national basketball preview for the The Sporting News. He has also provided

extensive IUP coverage during four NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Elite Eights, in 1994 in Springfield, Mass., in both 1995 and 2000 in Louisville, Ky., and in 2002 in Evansville, Ind. In addition to the wide range of coverage he has provided IUP and PSAC athletics during his career, he has also covered sports on a variety of levels, ranging from youth to high school to college and the professional ranks.

In 2007, Coccagna and his staff played an instrumental role in helping the Gazette earn Newspaper of the Year honors in the Pennsylvania Newspaper Association's Keystone Press Awards.

Coccagna resides in Derry with his wife, Suzanne.

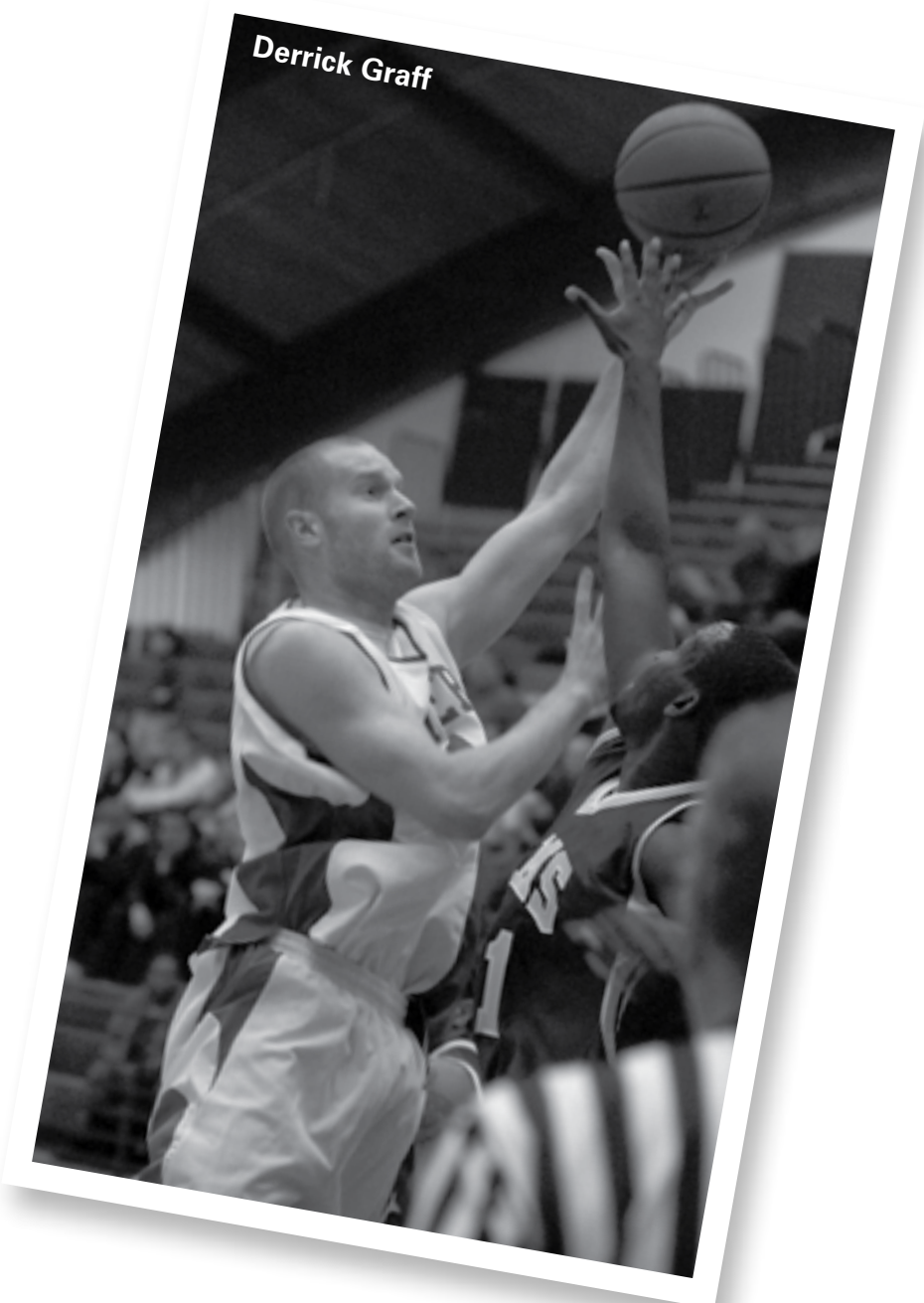

Red Raiders in the Community

During Dave Springer's tenure, his Red Raiders have become active members in the Shippensburg community. Springer is the Vice-President on the Advisory Board of the Boys and Girls Clubhouse in Shippensburg and has worked with the Boys and Girls Club of Central Pennsylvania to open a Shippensburg Clubhouse in March of 2004. Under his direction, many Red Raider players have worked as summer camp counselors and after-school counselors at the Boys and Girls Club.

In March of 2006, the Red Raiders hosted "Slamfest," a three-on-three basketball tournament to raise money for the Boys and Girls Club. That success has carried over to hosting the annual statewide Boys and Girls Club Basketball Tournament in 2007 and 2008 that featured 16 teams representing 11 organizations from across the entire state of Pennsylvania. Boys and Girls Clubs from Philadelphia, Reading, Scranton, Lancaster, Harrisburg, Erie, Pittsburgh, Chambersburg and Shippensburg were among the representatives.

The Red Raider basketball team oversees the entire event, as the coaches are not allowed to be in the gym to help with the tournament's coordination. The players have helped make the tournament a success for the past three years that Shippensburg has hosted.

The Shippensburg team has also participated in a program titled "Gear it Up," which involved Harrisburg inner-city youth visiting the Shippensburg campus to interact with students, staff and faculty. The Red Raider team spoke with the youth about the importance of goals, academic preparation and life in college athletics.



Also, the Red Raiders have conducted the National Association of Basketball Coaches Reading Program in Shippensburg area elementary schools. The Red Raider players read to fourth and fifth grade students and facilitated discussion about the books.

Additionally, Springer has coordinated an annual "Food for the Hungry Game." The game is typically held the Tuesday before Thanksgiving, and fans can receive free admission to the game with the donation of a canned good. All goods collected are donated to the local food bank, The King's Kettle. The players also donate time stocking shelves and working at The King's Kettle.
