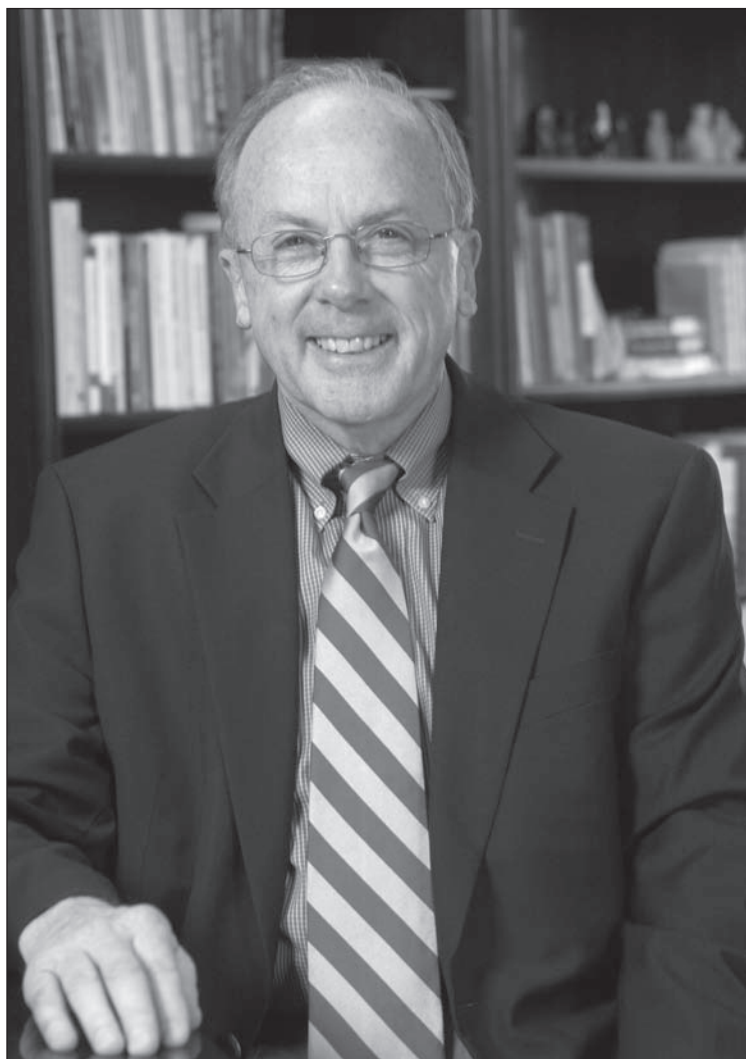
Ben Brady Field, located behind the Robert H. Ledbetter Baseball Complex and adjacent to the Bass Village Apartments, utilizes the latest synthetic turf technology from Deluxe Athletics in Marietta with gorgeous landscaping and location to provide an unmatched surface for athletic competition.

The field was built with the help of the generous support of the Benjamin F. Brady Charitable Foundation, and the Shorter University Board of Trustees approved naming the facility in honor of Mr. Brady, a philanthropist who supported religious causes, including those in the area of higher education.





PRESIDENT, DR. HAROLD E. NEWMAN



Dr. Harold E. Newman became Shorter University's 18th President on January 26, 2006. Along with an incredible vision for the institution which he serves, Dr. Newman has brought extensive knowledge of and a deep love for Shorter University to his presidency.

Under the leadership of Dr. Newman, Shorter University continues to receive significant academic recognition. During the 2009-10 academic year, Shorter was ranked for the ninth consecutive year among the South's best comprehensive colleges focusing on Bachelor's degrees.

Shorter was ranked for the fourth consecutive year as a "Best Southeastern College" and "Best Value College" by the Princeton Review. Shorter was one of 300 colleges nationwide selected for the Colleges of Distinction guidebook.

Dr. Newman served the University as Provost for 20 years under the direction of four different presidents. He served as interim President from January 1, 2005 until his official promotion just over one year later.

A classically trained musician, Dr. Newman holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from Furman University, a Master of Church Music in Piano Performance from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and a Doctor of Education from the University of Tennessee at Knoxville. At Tennessee, Dr. Newman majored in curriculum and instruction with collaterals in Higher Education and Educational Administration and Supervision.

Dr. Newman and his wife, Brenda, have two grown daughters: Cindy and Kathy.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS, BILL PETERSON



Bill Peterson is in his fourth year as Shorter University's Director of Athletics, having set a clear course for making Shorter one of the top athletic programs in the country.

Peterson has made the desire for overall excellence the cornerstone of Hawks' Athletics. His decisions and expertise have produced a wave of firsts in a number of programs while also allowing Shorter University to achieve several banner finishes in the National Association of Collegiate Director's of Athletics (NACDA) Director's Cup, including a program-best 11th-place finish following the 2009-10 academic year. Peterson was named the Southern States Athletic Conference Athletic Director of the Year for 2009-10.

Numerous sports have reached unprecedented levels of success under the direction of Peterson's leadership. Since 2007-08, Shorter has captured 17 conference championships and won seven national titles, two team and five individual.

Volleyball won its first Southern States Athletic Conference title in 2007. Men's cross country captured back-to-back SSAC championships in 2007 and 2008 and in 2009, both the men's and women's cross country teams qualified for the NAIA Championships in Vancouver, Wash., the first time both teams made the trip to nationals in the same year.

Softball has made four straight appearances in the NAIA Softball National Championship, winning three straight SSAC crowns from 2007-2009 before turning in a program-best fifth-place finish at the 2010 National Championship. Football captured its first-ever Mid-South Conference title in 2008, subsequently making its first trip to the NAIA Football Championship Series.

Men's and women's track and field have combined to win five Mid-South championships in the last three years while each team has also posted consecutive top 10 finishes in the country. Women's basketball completed a third straight 20-win season in 2009-10 - the first time that has happened in program history - and advanced to the NAIA Women's Basketball National Championship for the first time since 2001.

Shorter has burst onto the national scene over the last four years, capturing a number of individual and team national championships. Montagious Brown won the school's first-ever individual national championship in 2008 by taking first in the high jump at the NAIA Indoor Track and Field National Championships. Justyna Mudy followed with the school's first-ever female national crown in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2009 NAIA Outdoor Track Championships. Mudy then won three individual national championships in 2009-10, bringing home the 2009 NAIA Cross Country title before repeating as the 3,000-meter steeplechase champion in addition to winning the 5,000-meter run at the 2010 NAIA Outdoor Championships.

Shorter Cheerleading enters the 2010-11 academic year as back-to-back national champions having brought the school its first-ever team national championships by winning the All-Girl II Intermediate title at the NCA Cheer Nationals in 2009 and 2010.

Peterson continues to push Shorter into the national spotlight. In January 2008, the NAIA announced that Peterson, Shorter University and Rome-Floyd County had been awarded the bid for the 2008 and 2009 NAIA Football National Championship to be held at the Hawks' home football facility, Barron Stadium. Because of the rampant success of the 2008 and 2009



championship games, Barron Stadium will once again serve as the host site for the 2010 NAIA Football National Championship.

Not only does Peterson expect excellence on the field and court, but he does so in the classroom as well. In 2009-10, Shorter placed 111 athletes on their respective Academic All-Conference teams while also boasting 23 NAIA Scholar-Athletes, a list that included the 2009-10 Southern States Athletic Conference Female Honor Student-Athlete in Whitney Tucker, the second straight year that a Shorter athlete has garnered that award after Becca Thomas won the honor in 2008-09.

Prior to taking the helm of the Hawks' athletic program, Peterson served three years in the position of recruiting coordinator for the Shorter University football team.

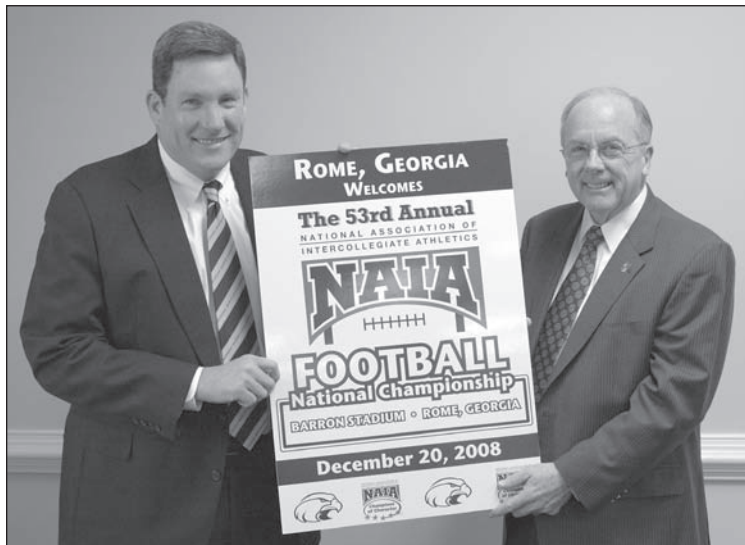
He came to Shorter from Mount Paran Christian School in Kennesaw, Ga., where he served as head baseball coach. In 2005, Peterson led Mount Paran to a school record 24 wins and a berth in the state finals while being named the *Atlanta-Journal Constitution* Coach of the Year.

Prior to coaching, Peterson was President and Co-Founder of Horizon Medical Products (HMP), a publicly traded corporation headquartered in Atlanta.

Peterson played collegiate football at Texas Lutheran College where he was a member of the 1974 NAIA national championship team coached by the legendary Jim Wacker. He finished college at Florida State University where he graduated in 1978 with a degree in Accounting.

Peterson's father, Bill Sr., is credited with bringing the professional passing game to college football. Bill Sr. coached at Florida State from 1960-70, at Rice University in 1971 and for the Houston Oilers of the National Football League (NFL) from 1972-73.

Peterson and his wife, Joanna, have four children: Will, Molly, Ben and Sam. Will was a senior tight end for the 2008 Mid-South Western Division champion Shorter football team and Ben is a freshman offensive lineman on the 2010 squad.

Rookie coach Jen Colley leads Lady Hawks into anticipated 2010

DEVELOPING TEAMWORK IS essential for teams to achieve success.

That theory is especially true this fall for the Shorter University women's soccer program as the Lady Hawks, under the direction of first-year head coach Jennifer Colley, begin a new season knowing that the team concept is more important than ever.

"We have to build team chemistry," Colley said, noting that the Lady Hawks will be without last year's top three offensive weapons. "We need to focus on doing the little things right and playing with pride.

"We're not going to stress over things we don't have control of. We have to focus on what we're in control of and let things fall into place."

The Lady Hawks could not control the departure of a trio of players who wound up carving their names in the school's record book - Pauline Van Der Henst, Candace Edwards and Mallory Barnes, all who earned All-Southern States Athletic Conference honors in 2009.

Van Der Henst closed out her career as the program's all-time goal scorer; Edwards scored a Shorter single-season record 16 goals last year and combined with Van Der Henst to account for 24 of the team's 33 goals; and Barnes departed as the program's all-time leader in assists.

"We don't have the firepower we had last year," said Colley. "Now it has to be a total team effort. This has to be a team thing."

13 players return from the 2009 squad that finished the season with an 8-9-2 record. Those players coupled with the addition of a recruiting class Colley feels is one of the best the program has ever had, could mean that the Lady Hawks are on the right path.

On the defensive side of the field, Shorter boasts a solid foundation of experienced veterans on which to build.

Back to anchor the team in goal is sophomore keeper Taylor Hays of Jacksonville Beach, Fla., who as a freshman in 2009 gained a wealth of experience. She posted some strong statistics, including 71 saves, which were good enough for the second-best single-season total in school history.

"Taylor understands she is now expected to play like a junior or a senior," Colley said. "That is the result of her playing so much last year."

In front of her are six defenders who have been major contributors during their careers: seniors Megan White of Fayetteville and Brittany Kossow of Cartersville; juniors Mary Kate Lollar of Appling, Adrian Hicks of Cartersville and Kacie Farrer of Rome; and sophomore Samantha Stephens of Powder Springs.

Lollar, one of three team captains this fall, and Hicks were named to the SSAC All-Academic team in 2009.

The Lady Hawks also have a strong nucleus at midfield in the presence of seniors and captains Lynde Pas of Rome and Rachel Wood of England, and sophomore Emily Hanson of Blue Ridge.

Wood proved she has offensive ability having scored a pair of goals and assists last year - she reeled off 31 shots with 15 of those on goal - while Pas was an NAIA Scholar-Athlete and an SSAC All-Academic pick.

Up front, a new trio of veteran forwards will have to pick up the offensive void left by graduation. Kayla Bell of Rome, an SSAC All-Academic team selection, and sophomores Alex Yancey of Acworth and Camilla Hellstrom of Sweden all saw limited action last season for the Lady Hawks, but are capable of stepping up according to Colley.

"Having these players gives me confidence," Colley said about the returning players. "We talked a lot during the spring about building our core. They became more comfortable with each other and I saw people step into leadership roles."

Included during that important spring session was the arrival of



transfer Brandi Greenwald of Kingston, who joined the team prior to the 2009 season.

A product of Darlington School, the junior forward is a proven goal-scorer and valuable playmaker having started at SSAC member Brewton-Parker College in 2008 where she led the team with 15 goals, added three assists and was named to the All-SSAC second team as a freshman.

Colley is excited to welcome the entrance of 10 freshmen to the 2010 roster.

Eager to break into the lineup at forward will be Kelli Davis of Peachtree City, who played on Starr's Mill High's state championship squad this past season, and former Darlington standout Constanza Ospina of Rome, who attended Kennesaw State University last year but did not play.

Adding to the team's midfield group are three players who combine versatility with a tireless work ethic: Carleigh Butcher of Loganville, Brehisy Zungia of Duluth and Jessica Wright of Kennesaw.

Shorter's already stingy defense will become even tougher with the addition of newcomers Kylie Janusek of Cartersville, Kelly Crawford of Marietta, Blair Fine of Lawrenceville and Samantha Mercer of Marietta. Ready to help Hays in goal is former Calhoun High stand-out Jacy Jobe.

"The entire team is versatile, which gives us a lot of options depending on our formations," said Colley. "Every position is up for grabs."

The primary goal of the preseason for the Lady Hawks will be finding the correct combinations. Shorter holds its first team practice on August 6 and will host two scrimmages, Aug. 14 at home against Gordon College and Aug. 24 at the University of the South.

"We've got eight days to shake things out and see who is successful," Colley pointed out. The Lady Hawks open the season by visiting SSAC West power Auburn-Montgomery on Aug. 28.

Joining Colley's coaching staff this year is assistant coach Danielle dos Santos, who played at Central Florida and was the team's leading scorer in 2008, and former Lady Hawks' captains Shelly Ringer and Renee Glenfield, who will serve as the team chaplains and help on the sidelines as well.

Colley said that the Lady Hawks, who are aligned in the new SSAC East Division along with perennial favorite and two-time defending national champion Lee University, will once again seek to reach a goal it has yet to accomplish. 10 wins.

"We saw that as a challenge but a realistic goal last year," the coach said. "We just came up short. That is still a good benchmark and it's doable. It still gets back to doing the little things right.

"I'm very excited. It's been a long year, but I'm excited to see how they'll do."

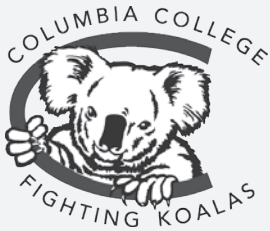

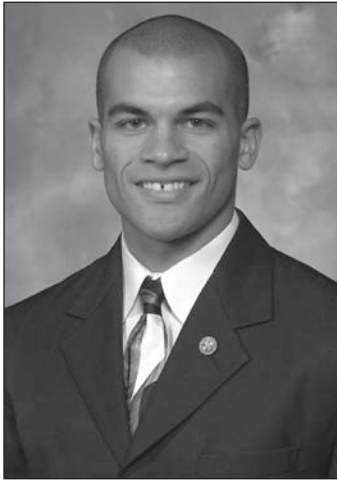
