36-year-old piloted Mount St. Mary's to 101 wins and a 67-39 (.632) record in the Northeast Conference in six seasons leading his alma mater

Guided the Mount to a pair of NEC Tournament Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2014 and 2017, highlighted by a First Four victory over New Orleans in 2017

Tabbed both the 2016-17 Jim Phelan Coach of the Year - named after his legendary predecessor whom he played for at the Mount - and CollegeInsider.com's Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year, presented annually to the top Division I minority coach

The Mount achieved a stellar 60-19 (.759) overall home record at Knott Arena during his tenure, and was the only NEC program to post a winning conference record in each of Christian's six seasons in Emmitsburg

Previously served as an assistant coach at VCU (2011-12), William & Mary (2008-11), and Division III Emory & Henry (2004-06), and as director of basketball operations at Bucknell (2006-08)

Three-time team captain at Mount St. Mary's under Phelan and Milan Brown amassed 581 points in 90 career games, including 56 starts

Quinton, Virginia native was married to his wife, Allie, who played softball at Mount St. Mary's, just three days after his hiring at Siena, and is the proud father of a six-year-old son, Jacoy

Siena returns to the Capital Region this afternoon to tip off its December schedule

The Saints played five of their seven games during the month of November away from home

Siena is looking to snap a five-game losing streak at Times Union Center

The Saints' last home victory was an 82-78 overtime triumph over eventual MAAC Tournament Champion Iona on Feb. 12

Head coach **Jamion Christian** achieved a 60-19 (.759) home record the past six seasons leading Mount St. Mary's

Freshman guard **Jalen Pickett** leads the MAAC in assists (7.0 - seventh nationally), steals (2.4 - 26th nationally) and assist-to-turnover ratio (3.77 - 33rd nationally)

The freshman phenom also ranks third in the MAAC in scoring (17.0), tied for third in threes (18), fourth in blocks (1.0), and tied for fifth in field goal percentage (.500)

Pickett was named the MAAC Rookie of the Week for the first time in his career Monday

Pickett is averaging 24.3 points, 9.7 assists, 5.3 rebounds, and 4.0 steals while shooting 60% from the field the past three games

Pickett is one of just nine players nationally - and the only freshman - averaging 15.0 points, 5.0 assists, and 2.0 steals

Pickett posted 27 points and 13 assists Wednesday at Hofstra

He is the only player nationally to reach both marks in a game so far this season per sports-reference.com

Pickett registered seven steals vs. Colgate last Saturday, the most by a Siena player since **Clarence Jackson** also swiped seven on Jan. 4, 2010 at Loyola (MD)

Senior forward **Evan Fisher** is averaging 20.0 points and 6.7 rebounds while shooting 62% from the field the past three games

Fisher ranks third in the MAAC in field goal percentage (.554), sixth in rebounding (5.9), and eighth in scoring (15.1)

Fisher was named to the Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off All-Tournament Team in November

Albeit Siena's most experienced returnee, he had averaged 3.6 points and 2.4 rebounds in 104 games (36 starts) prior to this year

The Saints enter the month of December ranked in the top-10 nationally in both fewest fouls per game and fewest turnovers per game

Siena ranks fifth nationally, committing just 13.7 fouls per contest

The Saints ranked 304th nationally in fouls last season, averaging 20.0 per game

Siena and Holy Cross combined to go 0-3 from the free throw line on Nov. 18

Per stats.com, it was the first game in which neither team made a free throw dating back to at least the start of 1996-97

Robert Morris (2) and Central Connecticut (0) combined to attempt just two free throws on Feb. 14, 2015

It marked the first time in 18 years that the Saints failed to make a free throw in a game

Siena ranks ninth nationally, averaging only 9.4 turnovers per game

The Saints ranked 325th out of 351 Division I teams last season, averaging 15.1 turnovers per contest

Siena also leads the MAAC and ranks 34th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.41

The Saints were 12th worst nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio last season (0.73)

Siena ranks third in the MAAC averaging 9.0 made threes per game

The Saints averaged just 6.9 threes per game last season

Siena made 10 or more threes in each of their first three games to open the season

It marked the first time that the Saints made 10 or more threes in three consecutive games since accomplishing the feat in

four straight contests from Jan. 15-25, 2001 vs. Iona (14), at Saint Peter's (10), vs. Canisius (14), and vs. Manhattan (11)

Siena averaged 12.0 threes while shooting 39.1% (36-92) from distance over their first three games

However, the Saints are averaging just 6.8 threes while shooting only 26.2% (27-103) over the past four games

Siena's roster ranks sixth nationally with an average height of nearly 6-5, according to kenpom.com

The Saints have started the same lineup in all seven games so far this season, which features an average height of over 6-7

Siena snapped an 11-game road losing streak with their victory over A-10 foe George Washington on Nov. 8 in the nation's capital

The victory was the Saints' first on the road since Dec. 17 of last season at Bryant

The Saints are looking to improve upon last year's 8-24 overall record in which they finished tied for 10th in the MAAC at 4-14

Siena played the 36th toughest non-conference schedule nationally

The Saints played six games vs. teams ranked in the top-100 of the final RPI report

Fourteen of Siena's 32 games were decided by five points or fewer (5-9), including eight by one possession (4-4)

The Saints lost three games by one point

Siena set a program record with five overtime contests, including a pair of triple overtime affairs

The Saints used 19 different starting lineup combinations

Twelve of the 15 players who saw game action each made at least one start, although no player started every game

Siena enters the 2018-19 season without its top-six scorers from a year ago

Three of the Saints' top-six scorers transferred, two more left the program, and rising junior guard **Khalil Richard** suffered a

season-ending significant partial tear of the quadriceps tendon in his right knee during a preseason scrimmage at UMass Oct. 20

Richard was the team's top returning scorer after averaging 9.2 points last season

Siena returns just 28% of its total points, 30% of its assists, 35% of its minutes, and 38% of its rebounding

Fisher is the Saints' top returnee after averaging 7.8 points and 4.9 rebounds in a team-high 28 starts

Siena welcomes eight newcomers to its 17-man roster

Syracuse transfer **Braedon Bayer** becomes the first graduate transfer in program history

Don Carey (Mount St. Mary's), **Jimmy Ratliff** (North Alabama), and **Denzel Tchougang** (Cypress College) all join the program as

transfers, with Ratliff and Tchougang both eligible to play immediately

The newcomers are highlighted by four true freshmen including **Sloan Seymour**, who's father, Steve, was an assistant coach at

Siena from 2001-04, and was previously the head coach at Drexel (1999-01)

The Saints were projected to finish 11th (last) according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

Siena's coaching staff is the seventh youngest in Division I, with an average age of 35 years, 174 days as of the season opener

Christian and each of his three assistant coaches are all 40 years of age or younger

The 36-year old Christian enters his seventh season as a head coach, after first

entering the head coaching ranks at his alma mater Mount St. Mary's at just 30

Christian was recently named one of 30 up-and-coming coaches to keep an eye on

by The Athletic

Christian is the architect of "Mayhem"

The style features a pressure defense predicated on limiting threes and an offense

fueled by three-point shooting

Last season Christian's Mount St. Mary's squad led the NEC and ranked 19th

nationally in threes (10.1), 34th in turnover margin (+2.7), and 49th in three-point field

goal percentage (.379)

Last season Siena ranked 250th in threes (6.9), and 342nd out of 351 teams in

turnover margin (-4.2), albeit ranked 89th in three-point field goal percentage (.367)

Last Time Out: Hofstra 94, Siena 86 (Nov. 28 - Hempstead, NY)

Siena shaved a 20-point deficit with 7:15 left to as little as five with 1:10 remaining

Both teams shot 54% from the field in the barn burner

Hofstra shot 25-29 (86.2%) from the free throw line, including 11-12 over the final 2:09

Pickett posted his first collegiate double-double with season-highs of 27 points and 13 assists

Fisher set a new career-high in scoring for the second straight game with 25 points on 12-17 shooting

Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena enters its 29th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 22nd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 21 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,968 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools such

as Boston College, Oregon State, Pittsburgh, Rutgers, Stanford, USC, and Washington State,

and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,807 by more than 1,100 fans

Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,385,123 fans (an average of 6,517) over 366 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions

Siena boasts a 240-126 (.656) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a 225-104 (.684) mark since making the full-time move to the facility in 1997-98

In 2009-10, Siena established a new program record with 133,505 fans (an average of 7,853) for 17 home games, which ranked 66th nationally in tying for its highest national ranking ever (2002-03)

The Saints are scheduled to host the 2018-19 MAAC Basketball Championships at the Times Union Center for the 19th time in 29 seasons, and final time during a five-year agreement from 2015-19
