Was introduced as the 17th head coach in Siena Basketball history on May 2

36-year-old piloted Mount St. Mary's to 101 wins and a 67-39 (.632) record in the Northeast Conference in six seasons leading his alma mater

Guided the Mount to a pair of NEC Tournament Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2014 and 2017, highlighted by a First Four victory over New Orleans in 2017

Tabbed both the 2016-17 Jim Phelan Coach of the Year - named after his legendary predecessor whom he played for at the Mount - and CollegeInsider.com's Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year, presented annually to the top Division I minority coach

The Mount achieved a stellar 60-19 (.759) overall home record at Knott Arena during his tenure, and was the only NEC program to post a winning conference record in each of Christian's six seasons in Emmitsburg

Previously served as an assistant coach at VCU (2011-12), William & Mary (2008-11), and Division III Emory & Henry (2004-06), and as director of basketball operations at Bucknell (2006-08)

Three-time team captain at Mount St. Mary's under Phelan and Milan Brown amassed 581 points in 90 career games, including 56 starts

Quinton, Virginia native was married to his wife, Allie, who played softball at Mount St. Mary's, just three days after his hiring at Siena, and is the proud father of a six-year-old son, Jacoy

# QUICK HITS



Siena concludes both the 2018 calendar year and its non-conference slate this afternoon

The Saints are in search of their fifth non-conference win, which would be the program's most since going 7-4 in 2015-16

Siena ranks in the top-10 nationally in both fewest fouls per game and fewest turnovers per game

The Saints stand fourth nationally, committing an average of just 14.2 fouls per contest

Siena ranked 304th nationally in fouls last season, averaging 20.0 per game

The Saints and Holy Cross combined to go 0-3 from the free throw line on Nov. 18

Per stats.com, it was the first game in which neither team made a free throw dating back to at least the start of 1996-97

Robert Morris (2) and Central Connecticut (0) combined to attempt just two free throws on Feb. 14, 2015

It marked the first time in 18 years that Siena failed to make a free throw in a game

The Saints rank eighth nationally averaging only 10.0 turnovers per game

Conversely, Siena forces just 9.6 turnovers per game which is second fewest nationally

The Saints ranked 325th out of 351 Division I teams last season, averaging 15.1 turnovers per contest

Siena also leads the MAAC and rank 61st nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.26

The Saints were 12th worst nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio last season (0.73)

Siena boasts two of the MAAC's top-six scorers in **Jalen Pickett** (fifth - 15.0) and **Evan Fisher** (sixth - 14.7)

The freshman Pickett also leads the MAAC in both assists (6.7 - 13th nationally) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.76)

He also ranks third in the MAAC in steals (2.0), sixth in threes (24), and tied for eighth in blocks (0.6)

A two-time MAAC Rookie of the Week, he swept both Player and Rookie of the Week honors Dec. 3

He is one of just four MAAC freshmen in the past 32 years to earn the conference's Player of the Week honors, joining

**Schadrac Casimir** (Iona - Dec. 15, 2014), **Darrell Barley** (Canisius - Jan. 24, 1994), and **Lionel Simmons** (La Salle - Dec. 21, 1986)

Pickett posted career-highs and his first collegiate double-double with 27 points and 13 assists at Hofstra (Nov. 28)

He was the first player nationally to reach both marks in a game this season per sports-reference.com

Fisher stands second in the MAAC in field goal percentage (.538) and fourth in rebounding (6.3)

Fisher is averaging 17.6 points and 7.0 rebounds while shooting an even 60% from the field over his past five games

The Saints also possess three of the top-six players in the MAAC in three-point makes

**Sloan Seymour** ranks third in makes (31), while **Kevin Degnan** is fourth (27), and Pickett stands sixth (24)

Siena ranks third in the MAAC averaging 8.9 made threes per game, after averaging just 6.9 last season

The Saints made 10 or more threes in each of their first three games to open the season

It marked the first time that Siena made 10 or more threes in three consecutive games since accomplishing the feat in four

straight contests from Jan. 15-25, 2001 vs. Iona (14), at Saint Peter's (10), vs. Canisius (14), and vs. Manhattan (11)

The Saints are shooting 61.6% (117-190) on two-point field goal attempts over the past seven games

Conversely, Siena is shooting just 30.2% (58-192) from three and 57.6% (53-92) from the free throw line over that time

The combined overall record of the seven teams that the Saints have lost to is 59-27 (.686)

Six of the seven currently possess winning records

Three of Siena's four wins this season have been by three points

The Saints' four victories have come by an average of just 4.3 points

Three of Siena's four wins to date have come away from home, including a pair of true road victories

The Saints had lost 11 consecutive road games prior to a 68-61 triumph at George Washington on Nov. 8

Siena and Holy Cross met twice in non-conference action this season

It was the first time that the Saints have played the same non-conference team twice in the same season since 2013-14 (Purdue)

Siena announced the addition of Notre Dame graduate transfer and Troy native **Elijah Burns** on Dec. 17

The Saints have submitted a request with the NCAA for a waiver which would allow Burns to begin playing as soon as this season

The 6-8, 238-pound forward averaged 2.2 points and 2.1 rebounds spanning 9.0 minutes in 44 career games with the Irish

Burns averaged 5.3 points and 3.8 rebounds over 11.3 minutes of action in four games earlier this season for Notre Dame

Siena mourns the loss of former athletic director, head coach, and player **Bill Kirsch** '56, HOF '76 who passed away Dec. 9

Kirsch served as athletic director from 1972-92, and played an instrumental role in bringing the College into Division I in 1976

Kirsch is the third winningest coach in program history, having amassed 142 victories from 1972-82

As a player, Kirsch hit the longest shot ever made at the old Madison Square Garden - a 60-foot winner to defeat Iona in 1953

Siena's roster ranks sixth nationally with an average height of nearly 6-5, according to kenpom.com

The Saints are looking to improve upon last year's 8-24 overall record in which they finished tied for 10th in the MAAC at 4-14

Siena played the 36th toughest non-conference schedule nationally

The Saints played six games vs. teams ranked in the top-100 of the final RPI report

Fourteen of Siena's 32 games were decided by five points or fewer (5-9), including eight by one possession (4-4)

The Saints lost three games by one point

Siena set a program record with five overtime contests, including a pair of triple overtime affairs

The Saints used 19 different starting lineup combinations

Twelve of the 15 players who saw game action each made at least one start, although no player started every game

Siena enters the 2018-19 season without its top-six scorers from a year ago

Three of the Saints' top-six scorers transferred, two more left the program, and rising junior guard **Khalil Richard** suffered a

season-ending significant partial tear of the quadriceps tendon in his right knee during a preseason scrimmage at UMass Oct. 20

Richard was the team's top returning scorer after averaging 9.2 points last season

Siena returns just 28% of its total points, 30% of its assists, 35% of its minutes, and 38% of its rebounding

Fisher is the Saints' top returnee after averaging 7.8 points and 4.9 rebounds in a team-high 28 starts

Siena welcomes eight newcomers to its 17-man roster

Syracuse transfer **Braedon Bayer** becomes the first graduate transfer in program history

**Don Carey** (Mount St. Mary's), **Jimmy Ratliff** (North Alabama), and **Denzel Tchougang** (Cypress College) all join the program as

transfers, with Ratliff and Tchougang both eligible to play immediately

The newcomers are highlighted by four true freshmen including Seymour, who's father, Steve, was an assistant coach at Siena

from 2001-04, and was previously the head coach at Drexel (1999-01)

The Saints were projected to finish 11th (last) according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

Siena's coaching staff is the seventh youngest in Division I, with an average age of 35 years, 174 days as of the season opener

Christian and each of his three assistant coaches are all 40 years of age or younger

The 36-year old Christian enters his seventh season as a head coach, after first

entering the head coaching ranks at his alma mater Mount St. Mary's at just 30

Christian was recently named one of 30 up-and-coming coaches to keep an eye on

by The Athletic

Christian is the architect of "Mayhem"

The style features a pressure defense predicated on limiting threes and an offense

fueled by three-point shooting

Last season Christian's Mount St. Mary's squad led the NEC and ranked 19th

nationally in threes (10.1), 34th in turnover margin (+2.7), and 49th in three-point field

goal percentage (.379)

Last season Siena ranked 250th in threes (6.9), and 342nd out of 351 teams in

turnover margin (-4.2), albeit ranked 89th in three-point field goal percentage (.367)

**Last Time Out: Holy Cross 60, Siena 57 (Dec. 22 - Worcester, MA)**

Siena took a 10-point lead with 11:48 to play

Fisher led the Saints with 17 points and nine rebounds

Pickett added 14 points and eight assists

## Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena enters its 29th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 22nd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 21 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,968 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools such

as Boston College, Oregon State, Pittsburgh, Rutgers, Stanford, USC, and Washington State,

and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,807 by more than 1,100 fans

Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,395,387 fans (an average of 6,509) over 368 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions

Siena boasts a 241-127 (.655) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a 226-105 (.683) mark since making the full-time move to the facility in 1997-98

In 2009-10, Siena established a new program record with 133,505 fans (an average of 7,853) for 17 home games, which ranked 66th nationally in tying for its highest national ranking ever (2002-03)

The Saints are scheduled to host the 2018-19 MAAC Basketball Championships at the Times Union Center for the 19th time in 29 seasons, and final time during a five-year agreement from 2015-19

### F - #32 Evan Fisher

Ranks second in the MAAC in field goal percentage (.538), fourth in rebounding (6.3), and fourth in scoring (14.7)

Air Force Reserve Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off presented by Citi All-Tournament Team selection

Averaging 17.6 points and 7.0 rebounds while shooting exactly 60% from the field over his last five games

Scored career-high 25 points on 12-17 shooting at Hofstra (Nov. 28)

Team's top active returner averaged 7.8 points, 4.9 rebounds, and a team-high 23 blocks spanning 28.0 minutes last season

One of only two Saints to play in all 32 games last year, and led team with 28 starts

Recorded first 11 career double digit scoring performances during breakthrough junior season

Led Siena in rebounding a team-high 11 times last season

Averaged 11.0 points over nine games during the month of January

Tied season-highs with 21 points and nine rebounds in OT win over eventual MAAC Tournament Champion Iona (Feb. 12)

Named MAAC Male Student Athlete of the Week Jan. 22, and Siena's Leo Dufort Male Student Athlete for December 2017

Appeared in a combined 65 games (one start) over his first two seasons, averaging 1.5 points and 1.2 rebounds in 8.2 minutes

Traveled to Croatia in summer of 2016 with college all-star team which included former teammate **Brett Bisping**

### F - #34 Kevin Degnan

Ranks fourth in the MAAC in both threes (27) and blocks (0.8) and eighth in three-point field goal percentage (.415)

Posted career-high 19 points, and hit game-winning three with 2.0 seconds remaining in win at Robert Morris (Dec. 8)

Fifth-year Fairfield transfer set for second season of competition with the Saints
