36-year-old piloted Mount St. Mary's to 101 wins and a 67-39 (.632) record in the Northeast Conference in six seasons leading his alma mater

Guided the Mount to a pair of NEC Tournament Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2014 and 2017, highlighted by a First Four victory over New Orleans in 2017

Tabbed both the 2016-17 Jim Phelan Coach of the Year - named after his legendary predecessor whom he played for at the Mount - and CollegeInsider.com's Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year, presented annually to the top Division I minority coach

The Mount achieved a stellar 60–19 (.759) overall home record at Knott Arena during his tenure, and was the only NEC program to post a winning conference record in each of Christian's six seasons in Emmitsburg

Previously served as an assistant coach at VCU (2011-12), William & Mary (2008-11), and Division III Emory & Henry (2004-06), and as director of basketball operations at Bucknell (2006-08)

Three-time team captain at Mount St. Mary's under Phelan and Milan Brown amassed 581 points in 90 career games, including 56 starts

Quinton, Virginia native was married to his wife, Allie, who played softball at Mount St. Mary's, just three days after his hiring at Siena, and is the proud father of a six-year-old son, Jacoy

Siena returns to the road for its lone game away from home during a four-game stretch

The Saints have already won three games away from home this season, including a pair of true road victories
Siena had lost 11 consecutive road games prior to a 68-61 triumph at George Washington on Nov. 8

The Saints are looking to snap an 11-game conference road losing streak dating back to an 84-77 win at Marist on Feb. 11, 2017
Siena tipped off the program's milestone 30th season of Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference competition last week
The Saints have won at least a share of seven MAAC Regular Season Championships, and captured five tournament titles
Siena was predicted to finish 11th (last) according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll
New head coach Jamion Christian achieved a stellar 67-39 (.632) conference record over the past six seasons at Mount St. Mary's
Including postseason play, Christian guided the Mount to a 76-43 (.639) record and NEC Tournament titles in 2014 and 2017
Mount St. Mary's was the only NEC team to post a winning conference record over the past six seasons
He posted a 41-12 (.774) record in regular season home NEC contests
Christian only once previously coached a MAAC game prior to this year, losing vs. former league member Loyola (MD) in 2012-13
Christian was 3-0 vs. current MAAC schools, with wins over Monmouth (two) and Quinnipiac when both were NEC members
The Saints wrapped up the non-conference portion of their schedule with a 5-8 record
The five non-conference victories marked the program's most in three years, since going 7-4 in 2015-16
The seven non-conference opponents that Siena lost to currently possess a combined 70-38 (.648) overall record
Six of the seven teams currently possess winning records
Siena and Holy Cross met twice in non-conference action

It was the first time that the Saints played the same non-conference team twice in the same season since 2013-14 (Purdue)
Freshman phenom Jalen Pickett was named the MAAC Rookie of the Week for a conference-leading fourth time on Monday
Pickett is tied with Evan Hymes (2011-12) for the most MAAC Rookie of the Week awards by a Siena freshman since Edwin
Ubiles won the award five times during the 2006-07 season
Pickett previously swept both MAAC Player and Rookie of the Week honors Dec. 3
He became one of just four MAAC freshmen in the past 32 years to earn the conference's Player of the Week honors, joining
Schadrac Casimir (Iona - Dec. 15, 2014), Darrell Barley (Canisius - Jan. 24, 1994), and Lionel Simmons (La Salle - Dec. 21, 1986)
The Saints rank in the top-10 nationally in both fewest fouls and turnovers
Siena stands fifth nationally, averaging just 13.7 fouls per contest

Siena stands fifth nationally, averaging just 13.7 fouls per contest

The Saints ranked 304th nationally in fouls last season, averaging 20.0

Siena and Holy Cross combined to go 0-3 from the foul line on Nov. 18

Per stats.com, it was the first game in which neither team

made a free throw dating back to at least the start of 1996-97

Robert Morris (2) and Central Connecticut (0) combined to attempt just two free throws on Feb. 14, 2015

Siena ranks eighth nationally averaging only 10.0 turnovers per game

The Saints have committed 15 turnovers or fewer in every game so far this season

Conversely, Siena forces just 9.8 turnovers per game which ranks second to last nationally

The Saints ranked 325th out of 351 Division I teams last season, averaging 15.1 turnovers per contest

Siena also leads the MAAC and ranks 58th nationally in assist to-turnover ratio at 1.28

The Saints boast two of the MAAC's top-eight scorers in **Evan Fisher** (16.7 - sixth) and Pickett (15.1 - eighth)

Fisher also ranks second in the MAAC in field goal percentage (.543) and fourth in rebounding (7.2)

Fisher is averaging 19.8 points and 8.3 rebounds while shooting 58% from the floor over his past eight games

Pickett leads the MAAC in both assists (7.3 - fifth nationally) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.97 - 36th)

Pickett also ranks second in the MAAC in steals (1.9), tied for sixth in threes (32), and tied for seventh in blocks (0.7)

Pickett posted career-highs and his first collegiate double-double with 27 points and 13 assists at Hofstra (Nov. 28)

He was the first player nationally to reach both marks in a game this season per sports-reference.com

Siena also possesses three of the top-seven players in the MAAC in three-point makes

Sloan Seymour ranks second in makes (44), while Kevin Degnan and Pickett are both tied for sixth (32)

The Saints rank third in the MAAC and 46th nationally averaging 9.4 made threes per game, after averaging just 6.9 last season

Siena made 10 or more threes in each of their first three games to open the season

It marked the first time that the Saints made 10 or more threes in three consecutive games since accomplishing the feat in four straight contests from Jan. 15-25, 2001 vs. Iona (14), at Saint Peter's (10), vs. Canisius (14), and vs. Manhattan (11)

Siena's coster ranks sixth nationally with an average age of 35 years, 174 days as of th

Christian and each of his three assistant coaches are all 40 years of age or younger The 36-year old Christian enters his seventh season as a head coach, after first entering the head coaching ranks at his alma mater Mount St. Mary's at just 30 Christian was one of 30 up-and-coming coaches to keep an eye on by The Athletic Christian is the architect of "Mayhem"

The style features a pressure defense predicated on limiting threes and an offense

fueled by three-point shooting Last season Christian's Mount St. Mary's squad led the NEC and ranked 19th nationally in threes (10.1), 34th in turnover margin (+2.7), and 49th in three-point field

Last season Siena ranked 250th in threes (6.9), and 342nd out of 351 teams in turnover margin (-4.2), albeit ranked 89th in three-point field goal percentage (.367)

The Saints are playing without their top-six scorers from last year's team which was 8-24 and tied for 10th in the MAAC at 4-14

Three of the top-six scorers transferred, two more left the program, and rising junior guard **Khalil Richard** suffered a season-ending significant partial tear of the quadriceps tendon in his right knee during a preseason scrimmage at UMass Oct. 20

Richard was to be the team's top returning scorer after averaging 9.2 points last season

Siena returned just 28% of its total points, 30% of its assists, 35% of its minutes, and 38% of its rebounding from last season Fisher is the Saints' top returnee after averaging 7.8 points and 4.9 rebounds in a team-high 28 starts in 2017-18

Siena welcomes nine newcomers to its 18-man roster

Canisius overcame a 15-point first half deficit
Fisher (21 points, career-high 17 rebounds) and Pickett (14 points, 11 assists) both posted double-doubles for Siena Seymour tied a season-high with 15 points on 5-12 shooting from three
The Saints shot 13-35 from distance, while the Golden Griffins were just 3-15
Canisius was 17-22 from the free throw line, while Siena was only 5-9
The Golden Griffins held a 42-20 advantage in points in the paint







Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena is in its 29th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 22nd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 21 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,968 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools such

as Boston College, Oregon State, Pittsburgh, Rutgers, Stanford, USC, and Washington State, and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,807 by more than 1,100 fans Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,407,587 fans (an average of 6,507) over 370 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions Siena boasts a 242–128 (.654) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a 227-106 (.682) mark since making the full-time move to the facility in 1997-98

The Saints are scheduled to host the 2018–19 MAAC Basketball Championships at the Times Union Center for the 19th time in 29 seasons, and final time during a five-year agreement from 2015-19

F - #32 Evan Fisher

Senior earned first career MAAC Player of the Week honor Dec. 31

Ranks second in the MAAC in field goal percentage (.543), fourth in rebounding (7.2) and sixth in scoring (16.7)

Air Force Reserve Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off presented by Citi All-Tournament Team selection

Averaging 19.8 points and 8.3 rebounds while shooting 58% from the floor over his past eight games

Scored career-high 26 points while adding eight rebounds vs. Cal Poly (Dec. 29)

Posted first collegiate double-double with 21 points and career-high 17 rebounds vs. Canisius (Jan. 5)

Tallied eleven double-digit scoring efforts including five 20+ point performances

Has led Siena a team-high seven times in both scoring and rebounding

Team's top active returner averaged 7.8 points, 4.9 rebounds, and a team-high 23 blocks spanning 28.0 minutes last season

Was one of only two Saints to play in all 32 games last year, and led team with 28 starts

Traveled to Croatia in summer of 2016 with college all-star team which included former teammate Brett Bisping

Fifth-year Fairfield transfer is in his second and final season of competition with the Saints

Saw action in 18 contests in first season with Siena last winter, averaging 1.4 points and 1.1 rebounds in 4.9 minutes Two-year reserve for the Stags averaged 2.8 points and 1.8 rebounds in 8.9 minutes of action over 45 games

Scored 21 of his 22 points this season over the past five games, which has included his first four collegiate starts Member of Romania's National Team




