The Series With Bucknell Sixth Meeting: Siena leads, 4-1

Of Note

The programs are meeting for the fifth time in six years, albeit just the sixth time ever. Siena has averaged 80.4 points over the first five meetings.

The Saints' last three victories in the series have been by a combined seven points.

Nathan Davis is 1-2 vs. Siena.

Last Meeting

The 207 combined points scored marked the most in a Siena game in 17 years. Bucknell shot 61% from the field including 10-20 from three and made 39-45 (87%) free throws.

Nico Clareth led Siena with 21 points and six assists, while reserve **Roman Penn** added 14.

Zach Thomas led five in double figures for the Bison with 25 points on 19-22 free throws.

Siena vs. the Patriot League

Siena is an impressive 96-52 (.649) against the 10 current league members.

Four of the Saints' nine non-conference games this season are against Patriot League programs.

(defeated American 96-80, lost at Colgate 72-62, and host Holy Cross Dec. 29).

Siena has achieved a .500 or better record vs. nine of the 10 schools (8-9 vs. Boston University).

The Saints are 39-20 vs. former MAAC foe Loyola (MD).

Siena Basketball alumnus named 18th head coach in program history on March 25th.

41-year-old native of nearby Clifton Park completed first season as an assistant coach in second stint on staff last season.

Helped guide Siena to a 17-16 overall record including an 11-7 mark in the MAAC last season.

Saints' 17 wins tied for the most of any MAAC team, and the squad's nine-win improvement was tied for the 11th best turnaround nationally. Siena finished in a tie for second place in the MAAC - placing nine spots higher than their preseason poll prediction - which tied UT Arlington for the largest improvement nationally.

Served as coordinator for Siena defense last season which ranked 42nd nationally allowing 66.0 points per game, the third best mark during the program's 43-year Division I era. Earlier last season, Maciariello's defense held the opposition to 70 points or fewer for 15 straight games, marking the program's longest such streak in 26 years.

First entered the collegiate ranks as Siena's director of basketball operations during the 2005-06 season under the direction of 2017 Siena Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Fran McCaffery.

Graduated cum laude from Siena in 2001, while helping guide the Saints to 20 wins and a share of the MAAC Regular Season Championship during his senior season, after having sat out the previous year per NCAA transfer regulations following his matriculation from the University of New Hampshire.

Recently completed 11th season as a Division I assistant coach, which has included stops at Siena (2018-19), George Washington (2014-18), Boston University (2011-14), and Fairfield (2008-11).

Teams have made seven national postseason tournament appearances while averaging 20.5 wins and a .624 winning percentage, and has also helped guide his programs to a 124-70 (.639) conference mark and, including his time as an undergraduate at Siena, has won a conference regular season or postseason title at each school.

QUICK HITS



Siena finally returns home to the Capital Region to begin its first of two season long four-game homestands

The Saints recently completed a season long four-game road trip

Siena dropped all four road games – albeit three by four points or less or in overtime – and is now 0-5 on the road this season

The trip marked the first time the Saints played four consecutive true road games since Feb. 12-26, 2010

The trip matched Siena's longest road trip since playing five straight away from home Dec. 22, 1994 – Jan. 7, 1995

The Saints are playing for the first time in 14 days, and recently completed a stretch where they played just four times in 36 days

Siena will now play its next five games in a 15-day span, the first four of which will be contested at the Times Union Center

The Saints have gone a total of 39 days between home games since beating St. Bonaventure on Nov. 12 at the Times Union Center

This is the longest in-season stretch between home games in the program's Division I history (1976-77)

Coppin State (42 days) is the only Division I team which will go a longer stretch between home games this season

Siena has won its first two games at home this season, shooting 50% from the field, 44% from three, and 79% from the line

The Saints are shooting just 39% from the field, 24% from three, and 64% from the free throw line in five road games

Siena holds a +12 rebound margin at home (+2 on the road)

The Saints currently lead all MAAC schools with a non-conference strength of schedule rank of 110

Siena ranks second amongst all MAAC teams with an NET ranking of 193

The Saints' nine-game non-conference schedule is highlighted by seven games against programs which posted winning records

Four opponents either won or shared their respective conference's regular season championships

Four of Siena's nine non-conference games will come against Patriot League foes, including matchups vs. three of the conference's top-four finishers from last season

Siena has faced both of the Ivy League's Co-Regular Season Champions from a year ago on the road in Harvard and Yale

Both Xavier (18) and Harvard (75) were ranked in the Top-100 in Ken Pomeroy's preseason rankings

The Saints possess four of the top-15 scorers in the MAAC

The quartet of **Jalen Pickett** (16.0 – fifth), **Elijah Burns** (14.3 – 13th), **Donald Carey** (14.1 – 14th), and **Manny Camper** (13.7 – 15th) have combined to average 58.1 points to account for 80% of the team's scoring

The "core four" combined to score only a season-low 33 points in the defeat at Cal Poly on Dec. 7

Camper ranks 11th nationally averaging 11.1 rebounds per game

The junior has registered his first three collegiate double-doubles spanning the team's first seven games this season

Camper is averaging a double-double overall through seven games with 13.7 points and 11.1 rebounds per contest

Camper pulled down a career-high 19 rebounds on Nov. 20 at Yale, the most by a Siena player in nearly seven years since **OD**

Anosike grabbed 21 on Jan. 27, 2013 against Marist

Gary Harris, Jr. was named the MAAC Rookie of the Week on Dec. 9

The Los Angeles native posted season-highs of 16 points and six rebounds off the bench at Cal Poly (Dec. 7)

Siena ranks 53rd nationally in rebounding (39.7) and 73rd in rebound margin (+4.9)

The Saints ranked fifth worst nationally last season in rebounding (29.5) and 322nd out of 351 teams in rebound margin (-4.1)

Siena routed American 96-80 in the season opener

The 96 points scored was the program's most in a season-opener in 35 years, dating back to a 110-64 thrashing of East

Stroudsburg to tip off the 1984-85 campaign

The 16-point margin of victory was the largest in a season-opener since an 82-52 triumph over Boise State in Albany to start the 2008-09 MAAC Championship season, and the largest margin by a coach in his Siena debut since **Dan Cunha** in 1941-42

The Saints' streak of 39 consecutive games committing 15 turnovers or fewer was snapped Nov. 14 at Harvard (17)

It was the first time Siena committed more than 15 turnovers since a triple overtime loss vs. Monmouth on Feb. 21, 2018

The Saints ranked eighth nationally last season averaging just 9.8 turnovers per game

Siena was projected to finish sixth (11 teams) according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

Only eight points separated the third through sixth spots in tight polling

The Saints finished in a four-way tie for second place in the MAAC last season, after being predicted to finish last

Siena's nine-spot improvement from their preseason prediction was tied with UT Arlington for the best nationally

Pickett is the 2019-20 MAAC Preseason Player of the Year

The sophomore sensation was named to the Lou Henson Award Preseason Watch List (top Division I mid-major player)

Pickett is the first Saint to be voted the MAAC Preseason Player of the Year in nine years dating back to **Ryan Rossiter** in 2010-11

Pickett is the first true sophomore to be selected Preseason First Team All-MAAC since Iona's **Schadrac Casimir** in 2015-16

Pickett was ranked the 25th best player in nation entering the 2019-20 season by ESPN's John Gasaway, 68th by NBC Sports' Rob

Dauster, and 69th by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander

Pickett was the unanimous 2018-19 MAAC Rookie of the Year, a MAAC All-Rookie Team, and MAAC All-Tournament Team pick

Pickett became the second freshman in league history to be First Team All-MAAC (**Lionel Simmons** – La Salle, 1986-87)

Pickett won a league-record 11 MAAC Rookie of the Week honors which was tied for second most in NCAA Division I history

Pickett was also tabbed a Kyle Macy Freshman All-American, NABC District I First Team selection, and was the ECAC Rookie of the Year and a Second Team All-ECAC pick

Pickett established new Siena freshman records for both scoring (521) and steals (66), while also achieving the fourth-highest single-season assist total overall (221) in school history

Pickett ranked in the top-four nationally amongst all Division I freshmen in assists (6.7), assist-to-turnover ratio (2.76), and steals (2.0)

Pickett declared as an early entrant for the 2019 NBA Draft and was invited to and participated in the inaugural NBA G League Elite Camp as well as pre-draft workouts with several NBA teams before deciding to withdraw and return to Siena

Siena returns two starters and 10 letterwinners from last year's team

The Saints welcomed back 41% of their scoring and 40% of their rebounding from a year ago

Three of the team's top-four scorers from last season either graduated or transferred

Siena welcomes five newcomers to the program this season, including four true freshmen

Illinois State transfer **Matt Hein** becomes the program's third-ever graduate transfer, dating back to last season

Highly touted transfers Burns (Notre Dame) and Carey (Mount St. Mary's) are also set to don the Green and Gold for the first time after sitting out the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer regulations

A total of seven players and coaches from the 2019-20 roster hail from the Greater Capital Region

The Saints are under the direction of alumnus **Carmen Maciariello '01** who was named the program's 18th head coach Mar. 25

Maciariello is Siena's third different head coach in three seasons

Maciariello is the first alumnus to lead the program since **Bill Kirsch** (1972-82)

The Saints are looking to build off last season's 17-16 overall record which included an 11-7 mark in the MAAC

Siena's nine-win improvement from the previous year was tied for the 11th best turnaround nationally

The Saints' 17 wins were tied for the most of any MAAC team

Siena set program single-season records for both three-point makes (288) and attempts (849)

The Saints ranked amongst the national leaders in fewest fouls (14.0 – fourth), turnovers (9.8 – eighth), scoring defense (66.0 – 42nd), and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.28 – 50th)

Siena held the opposition to 70 points or fewer for 15 straight games from Dec. 22 – Feb. 13, marking the program's longest stretch since a 17-game streak from Dec. 8, 1992 – Feb. 10, 1993

Last Time Out: Cal Poly 70, Siena 66 (Dec. 7 - San Luis Obispo, CA)

Siena whittled a 12-point deficit with just 69 seconds remaining down to only two with 3.5 seconds to play

The Saints led by as many as 11 points with 17:41 remaining

Cal Poly shot an even 50% from the field and received 36 bench points

Freshman **Gary Harris, Jr.** scored a season-high 16 points in his return home

Jalen Pickett scored 14 of his 16 points in the second half

Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena is in its 30th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 23rd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 22 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,767 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

Siena ranked 12th overall in the Northeast - and second amongst all Northeast mid-major teams - in average attendance last season, and stood 19th nationally amongst all mid-major programs in attendance

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools Boston College, California, Oregon State, Stanford, USC, and Washington State, and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,659 by more than 1,000 fans

Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,478,440 fans (an average of 6,488) over 382 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions

Siena boasts a 250-132 (.654) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a 235-110 (.681) mark since making the full-time move to the facility in 1997-98

In 2009-10, Siena established a new program record with 133,505 fans (an average of 7,853) for 17 home games, which ranked 66th nationally in tying for its highest national ranking ever (2002-03)

The Saints have hosted the MAAC Basketball Championships at the Times Union Center 20 times in their 30 years in the conference

Siena Basketball Head Coach **Carmen Maciariello** has announced his first official signings for the Saints' Class of 2024. **Aidan Carpenter, Colin Golson, and Bennett Kwiecinski** have all committed to Siena during the early signing period, and will enroll at the College next fall.

"In this class we looked to add versatility, and our three incoming Saints will be able to thrive in both our offensive and defensive systems," said Maciariello. "They all embody what we look for in a Siena Saint."

A 6-5, 185-pound guard, Carpenter is ranked the No. 1 recruit in Maine and No. 22 overall in the New England Class of 2020 according to the New England Recruiting Report. The Hamden, Connecticut native, who is playing for Dan Haynes at Lee Academy in Maine this year, was named the NEPSAC Player of the Year after averaging 24 points and five assists while leading Hyde School in Bath, Maine to the NEPSAC Class C Title last season. Carpenter plays his AAU basketball for Rhode Island Elite under the direction of coach Nick Light.

"Aidan is a big guard who can play either on or off the ball," explained Maciariello. "He has tremendous quickness, and thrives running the wing or pushing the ball. Defensively, he can guard multiple positions."

A 6-7, 235-pound forward from Detroit, Golson is set to suit up for Ferndale High and coach Juan Rickman this season after transferring from East English Village. He plays AAU for coach DeJon Curd of the REACH Legends.

"Colin is a big, athletic forward with a seven-foot wingspan," described Maciariello. "He can defend all positions on the court, and will add grit and power to our frontcourt."

A 6-8, 205-pound forward out of Wilmette, Illinois, Kwiecinski was named a Top-15 prospect in the Class of 2020 by the City/Suburban Hoops Report in Chicago. He attends Loyola Academy, where he averaged 13.7 points, 6.7 rebounds, and 1.8 blocks last season under the direction of Tim Livatino. Kwiecinski, who plays AAU for the Illinois Wolves and coach Mike Mullins, has a twin brother, Jordan, who also recently committed to playing Division I basketball at Drake University.

"Bennett will be able to play the three or four for us, and has a tremendous basketball IQ," noted Maciariello. "We love big wings, and he will provide us with a workmanlike approach to the game. He has the ability to stretch the defense with his shot, as well as put it on the floor."

"We welcome these young men and their families to our program," added Maciariello. "They are all special people who commit to being the best they can be daily."

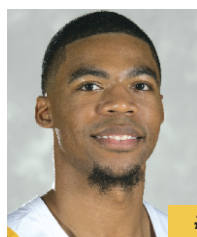
