Siena in the MAAC Tournament

Siena makes its milestone 30th MAAC Tournament appearance since joining the conference in 1989-90

The Saints have won five titles (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009, 2010), which is tied with Manhattan for second most (Iona - 11)

Siena has posted an impressive 38-24 (.613) MAAC Tournament record, which is second only to Iona (53-26, .671)

The Saints have won conference tournament championships in the final year of each of the past three decades - 1989 (North Atlantic Conference), 1999, 2009

Today is the 10th anniversary of Siena's 2009 MAAC Tournament Championship over Niagara here in Albany

Siena is hosting the MAAC Tournament for the 20th time in 30 seasons since joining the MAAC

This marks the fifth and final year during a five-year stretch that the MAAC Tournament will be held in Albany

The Saints are 28-15 (.651) in MAAC Tournament games played in Albany, including 19-6 (.760) since 2002

Siena has won the past four of its five MAAC Championships in Albany

Siena is a perfect 3-0 all-time in the MAAC Tournament vs. Rider

The Saints were the higher seed for each of the first three matchups, and outscored the Broncs by an average of 19.7 points

Siena has gone on to win a MAAC Championship every time it has faced Rider in the MAAC Tournament (1999, 2008, 2010)

The Saints are a stellar 19-8 (.704) all-time in the MAAC Quarterfinals

Siena is in search of its 20th MAAC Semifinals appearance over 30 seasons

The Saints are appearing in the program's 63rd MAAC Tournament game, albeit just their second game as a No. 5 seed

Siena dropped its only previous game as a No. 5 seed, losing to fourth seeded Canisius 71-65 in the 2014 MAAC Quarterfinals

The Saints are an even 2-2 all-time vs. No. 4 seeds

No. 5 seeds are 24-34 (.414) all-time in the MAAC Tournament, and have dropped eight of their last nine games

Loyola (1994) and Canisius (1996) are the only two No. 5 seeds ever to win the MAAC Tournament (both came in Albany)

Head coach **Jamion Christian** posted a 9-4 (.692) Northeast Conference Tournament record in six seasons at Mount St. Mary's

Christian led the Mount to NEC Tournament Championships in 2014 and 2017

Christian is 4-2 in conference tournament quarterfinal games, 3-1 in the semifinals, and 2-1 in championship tilts

Was introduced as the 17th head coach in Siena Basketball history on May 2

Named one of 30 up-and-coming coaches to keep an eye on by The Athletic

36-year-old piloted Mount St. Mary's to 101 wins and a 67-39 (.632) record in the Northeast Conference in six seasons leading his alma mater

Guided the Mount to a pair of NEC Tournament Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2014 and 2017, highlighted by a First Four victory over New Orleans in 2017

Tabbed both the 2016-17 Jim Phelan Coach of the Year - named after his legendary predecessor whom he played for at the Mount - and CollegeInsider.com's Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year, presented annually to the top Division I minority coach

The Mount achieved a stellar 60-19 (.759) overall home record at Knott Arena during his tenure, and was the only NEC program to post a winning conference record in each of Christian's six seasons in Emmitsburg

Previously served as an assistant coach at VCU (2011-12), William & Mary (2008-11), and Division III Emory & Henry (2004-06), and as director of basketball operations at Bucknell (2006-08)

Three-time team captain at Mount St. Mary's under Phelan and Milan Brown amassed 581 points in 90 career games, including 56 starts

Quinton, Virginia native was married to his wife, Allie, who played softball at Mount St. Mary's, just three days after his hiring at Siena, and is the proud father of a six-year-old son, Jacoy

Siena finished in a four-way tie for second place in the MAAC Standings

The Saints were picked to finish last according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll after finishing tied for last place last season

Siena is tied for the 11th greatest turnaround nationally (+8.5) as of Monday

The Saints have doubled their win total from last year and won seven more MAAC games

Siena posted an 8-24 overall record last season, including a 4-14 mark in the MAAC

The Saints enter the MAAC Tournament winners of 10 of their last 14

Siena won four straight to open February to match the program's longest winning streak

since winning five straight from Feb. 26 - Mar. 8, 2010

The Saints went 6-2 in February to match their best record in the month since going 7-1

in Feb. 2007

Freshman phenom **Jalen Pickett** was named the unanimous MAAC Rookie of the Year Friday

Siena is in its 29th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 22nd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 21 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,968 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools such as Boston College, Oregon State, Pittsburgh, Rutgers, Stanford, USC, and Washington State, and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,807 by more than 1,100 fans

Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,457,035 fans (an average of 6,500) over 378 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions
