

Siena has won 21 of the past 26 meetings overall The Saints are 34-10 (.773) at home, and have won 11 of the past 12 matchups in Albany Siena's .679 win% vs. Marist is its best vs. any program that it has faced at least 40 times **John Dunne** is 11-15 vs. Siena (0-2 at Marist)

The five Siena seniors accounted for 50 points on Senior Day
The Saints shot 57% from the field in the second half
Siena held Marist to just 36% shooting including 2-17 from three **Kevin Degnan** scored a career-high 25 points for the Saints **Brian Parker** scored 15 points and added four steals for Marist

Siena Basketball alumnus named 18th head coach in Recently completed 11th season as a program history on March 25th

Division I assistant coach, which has included at the season as a Division I assistant coach, which has

41-year-old native of nearby Clifton Park completed first season as an assistant coach in second stint on staff last season

Helped guide Siena to a 17-16 overall record including an 11-7 mark in the MAAC last season

Saints' 17 wins tied for the most of any MAAC team, and the squad's nine-win improvement was tied for the 11th best turnaround nationally. Siena finished in a tie for second place in the MAAC – placing nine spots higher than their preseason poll prediction – which tied UT Arlington for the largest improvement nationally.

Served as coordinator for Siena defense last season which ranked 42nd nationally allowing 66.0 points per game, the third best mark during the program's 43-year Division I era. Earlier last season, Maciariello's defense held the opposition to 70 points or fewer for 15 straight games, marking the program's longest such streak in 26 years.

First entered the collegiate ranks as Siena's director of basketball operations during the 2005-06 season under the direction of 2017 Siena Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Fran McCaffery

Graduated cum laude from Siena in 2001, while helping guide the Saints to 20 wins and a share of the MAAC Regular Season Championship during his senior season, after having sat out the previous year per NCAA transfer regulations following his matriculation from the University of New Hampshire

Recently completed 11th season as a Division I assistant coach, which has included stops at Siena (2018–19), George Washington (2014–18), Boston University (2011–14), and Fairfield (2008–11)

Teams have made seven national postseason tournament appearances while averaging 20.5 wins and a .624 winning percentage, and has also helped guide his programs to a 124–70 (.639) conference mark and, including his time as an undergraduate at Siena, has won a conference regular season or postseason title at each school

1996 Albany Times Union Player of the Year at Shenendehowa High School

Married to wife, Laura, and has a two-year-old daughter, Reese









Siena returns to the Capital Region tonight to begin a stretch where they play six of their next eight at the Times Union Center The Saints are the only Division I team which is undefeated at home (7–0) and winless in true road games (0–9) this season Siena's seven-game home win streak is the program's longest since winning nine straight at home to open 2015–16 The Saints are averaging 76.9 points on 47% shooting, 38% from three, and 72% from the free throw line at home Siena has won its first three MAAC home games by a combined seven points

Junior guard/forward **Manny Camper** ranks 10th nationally averaging 10.8 rebounds per game

Camper also stands 18th nationally with nine double-doubles this season, the first of his career

Camper pulled down a career-high 19 rebounds on Nov. 20 at Yale, the most by a Siena player in nearly seven years since **OD**

Anosike grabbed 21 on Jan. 27, 2013 against Marist
Camper had averaged just 3.9 rebounds over his first two seasons in 19.3 minutes per game

The Saints currently possess four of the top-16 scorers in the MAAC

MAAC Preseason Player of the Year **Jalen Pickett** ranks third in the MAAC in scoring (15.7), while **Elijah Burns** is sixth (14.2), Camper is 12th (13.3), and **Donald Carey** is 16th (12.5)

The "core four" has combined to average 55.7 points to account for 77% of the team's scoring Pickett (37.6 - second), Camper (36.9 - third), and Carey (31.5 - eighth) also rank in the top-eight in the MAAC in minutes played, with Pickett and Camper ranked eighth and 19th in the nation, respectively

Siena ranks second in the MAAC in both scoring (72.1) and field goal percentage (.436), after averaging just 64.6 points last year Pickett was named to both the 2019-20 Lou Henson Award Preseason and Midseason Watch Lists - presented annually to the nation's top Division I mid-major play
Pickett was named the Lou Henson Award National Player of the Week and MAAC Player of the Week on Dec. 30

Pickett leads the MAAC and ranks 26th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.54), and stands second in the conference in

assists (4.4), third in scoring (15.7), fourth in blocks (1.3), fifth in steals (1.5), and tied for seventh in threes (33)

Pickett is the first Saint to be voted the MAAC Preseason Player of the Year in nine years dating back to **Ryan Rossiter** in 2010–11 Pickett is the first true sophomore to be selected Preseason First Team All–MAAC since Iona's **Schadrac Casimir** in 2015–16
Pickett was ranked the 25th best player in nation entering the 2019–20 season by ESPN's John Gasaway, 68th by NBC Sports' Rob
Dauster, and 69th by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander
Siena ranks 73rd nationally in rebound margin (+4.3) and also averages 37.3 rebounds per game
The Saints ranked fifth worst nationally last season in rebounding (29.5) and 322nd out of 351 teams in rebound margin (-4.1)

Siena started 2-0 MAAC play for the first time in a decade, dating back to a program-best 14-0 start during the 2009-10 season Siena saw their season long four-game winning streak snapped Jan. 5 at Rider, which matched the program's longest in 10 years The Saints posted a 17-13 overall record during the 2019 calendar year, the program's best mark since going 22-11 in 2010 Siena was projected to finish start and according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

Only eight points separated the third through sixth spots in tight polling
Siena finished in a four-way tie for second place in the MAAC last season, after being predicted to finish last
Saints' nine-spot improvement from their preseason prediction was tied with UT Arlington for the best nationally

The Saints finished with a 4-5 record in non-conference action

Siena went 4-0 at home to record the program's first undefeated record in non-conference play since also going 4-0 in 2015-16 The Saints went 3-1 against the Patriot League while playing three of the conference's top-four teams in the preseason poll The Saints faced both of the Ivy League's Co-Regular Season Champions from a year ago on the road in Harvard and Yale Both Xavier (18) and Harvard (75) were ranked in the Top-100 in Ken Pomeroy's preseason rankings

Siena has a pair of four-game homestands and also had a four-game road trip earlier this season

The four-game road trip was the program's first since Feb. 12-26, 2010

The four-game road trip matches the program's longest since playing five straight away from home Dec. 22, 1994 - Jan. 7, 1995 The Saints went a season long 14 days between their games Dec. 7 at Cal Poly and Dec. 21 vs. Bucknell

Siena played just four games in a 36-day span

Siena went a total of 39 days between its second and third home games of the season, Nov. 12 to Dec. 21

This was the longest in-season stretch between home games in the program's Division I history (1976-77) Coppin State (42 days) is the only Division I team which has a longer stretch between home games this season Siena routed American 96-80 in the season opener

The 96 points scored was the program's most in a season-opener in 35 years, dating back to a 110-64 thrashing of East

Stroudsburg to tip off the 1984-85 campaign

The 16-point margin of victory was the largest in a season-opener since an 82–52 triumph over Boise State in Albany to start the 2008-09 MAAC Championship season, and the largest margin by a coach in his Siena debut since **Dan Cunha** in 1941-42 The Saints' streak of 39 consecutive games committing 15 turnovers or fewer was snapped Nov. 14 at Harvard (17)

It was the first time Siena committed more than 15 turnovers since a triple overtime loss vs. Monmouth on Feb. 21, 2018

The Saints ranked eighth nationally last season averaging just 9.8 turnovers per game
Siena returns two starters and 10 letterwinners from last year's team
The Saints welcomed back 41% of their scoring and 40% of their rebounding from a year ago

Three of the team's top-four scorers from last season either graduated or transferred

Siena welcomes five newcomers to the program this season, including four true freshmen
Illinois State transfer **Matt Hein** becomes the program's third-ever graduate transfer, dating back to last season
Highly touted transfers Burns (Notre Dame) and Carey (Mount St. Mary's) are also set to don the Green and Gold for the first time after sitting out the 2018–19 season due to NCAA transfer regulations

A total of seven players and coaches from the 2019–20 roster hail from the Greater Capital Region

The Saints are under the direction of alumnus Carmen Maciariello '01 who was named the program's 18th head coach Mar. 25 Maciariello is Siena's third different head coach in three seasons

Maciariello is the first alumnus to lead the program since **Bill Kirsch** (1972-82)

The Saints are looking to build off last season's 17-16 overall record which included an 11-7 mark in the MAAC

Siena's nine-win improvement from the previous year was tied for the 11th best turnaround nationally The Saints' 17 wins were tied for the most of any MAAC team
Siena set program single-season records for both three-point makes (288) and attempts (849)

The Saints ranked amongst the national leaders in fewest fouls (14.0 - fourth), turnovers (9.8 - eighth), scoring defense (66.0 -42nd), and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.28 - 50th)

Siena held the opposition to 70 points or fewer for 15 straight games from Dec. 22 - Feb. 13, marking the program's longest stretch since a 17-game streak from Dec. 8, 1992 - Feb. 10, 1993







Last Time Out: Niagara 72, Siena 71 (Jan. 19 - Niagara University, NY)

Niagara took its first lead of the game with just 44.9 seconds remaining Siena had led throughout and by as many as 11 points midway through the first The Purple Eagles shot 67% from the field in the second half

Manny Camper scored a game-high 21 points for the Saints who shot 50%

Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena is in its 30th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 23rd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 22 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,767 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

Siena ranked 12th overall in the Northeast – and second amongst all Northeast midmajor teams – in average attendance last season, and stood 19th nationally amongst all mid-major programs in attendance

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools Boston College, California, Oregon State, Stanford, USC, and Washington State, and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,659 by more than 1,000 fans

Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,507,762 fans (an average of 6,480) over 387 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions

Siena boasts a 255–132 (.659) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a 240–110 (.686) mark since making the full-time move to the facility in 1997–98

In 2009–10, Siena established a new program record with 133,505 fans (an average of 7,853) for 17 home games, which ranked 66th nationally in tying for its highest national ranking ever (2002–03)

The Saints have hosted the MAAC Basketball Championships at the Times Union Center 20 times in their 30 years in the conference

Named both the MAAC Player of the Week and College Sports Madness MAAC Player of the Week on Dec. 23
Leads the MAAC and ranks 27th nationally with a .600 field goal percentage
Also ranks sixth in the MAAC in both scoring (14.2) and free throw percentage (.809), and seventh in rebounding (6.1)
Scored a career-high 28 points on 10-13 shooting in just 24 minutes in victory over Bucknell (Dec. 21)
Scored 19 points or more in a game five times
Graduate transfer set to suit up for lone season in the Green and Gold in 2019-20
Enrolled in in Siena College's new MBA program, and is pursuing his graduate degree in strategic management
Notre Dame transfer officially joined Siena on Dec. 17, 2018, and sat out remainder of season due to NCAA transfer rules
Appeared in 44 games over three-plus seasons with the Irish, averaging 2.2 points and 2.1 rebounds spanning 9.0 minutes

Siena Basketball Head Coach **Carmen Maciariello** has announced his first official signings for the Saints' Class of 2024. **Aidan Carpenter, Colin Golson, and Bennett Kwiecinski** have all committed to Siena during the early signing period, and will enroll at the College next fall.

"In this class we looked to add versatility, and our three incoming Saints will be able to thrive in both our offensive and defensive systems," said Maciariello. "They all embody what we look for in a Siena Saint."

A 6-5, 185-pound guard, Carpenter is ranked the No. 1 recruit in Maine and No. 22 overall in the New England Class of 2020 according to the New England Recruiting Report. The Hamden, Connecticut native, who is playing for Dan Haynes at Lee Academy in Maine this year, was named the NEPSAC Player of the Year after averaging 24 points and five assists while leading Hyde School in Bath, Maine to the NEPSAC Class C Title last season. Carpenter plays his AAU basketball for Rhode Island Elite under the direction of coach Nick Light.

"Aidan is a big guard who can play either on or off the ball," explained Maciariello. "He has tremendous quickness, and thrives running the wing or pushing the ball. Defensively, he can guard multiple positions."

A 6-7, 235-pound forward from Detroit, Golson is set to suit up for Ferndale High and coach Juan Rickman this season after transferring from East English Village. He plays AAU for coach DeJon Curd of the REACH Legends.

"Colin is a big, athletic forward with a seven-foot wingspan," described Maciariello. "He can defend all positions on the court, and will add grit and power to our frontcourt."

A 6-8, 205-pound forward out of Wilmette, Illinois, Kwiecinski was named a Top-15 prospect in the Class of 2020 by the City/Suburban Hoops Report in Chicago. He attends Loyola Academy, where he averaged 13.7 points, 6.7 rebounds, and 1.8 blocks last season under the direction of Tim Livatino. Kwiecinski, who plays AAU for the Illinois Wolves and coach Mike Mullins, has a twin brother, Jordan, who also recently committed to playing Division I basketball at Drake University.

"Bennett will be able to play the three or four for us, and has a tremendous basketball IQ," noted Maciariello. "We love big wings, and he will provide us with a workmanlike approach to the game. He has the ability to stretch the defense with his shot, as well as put it on the floor."

"We welcome these young men and their families to our program," added Maciariello. "They are all special people who commit to being the best they can be daily."
