Of Note

Monmouth has won 11 of 14 meetings since joining the MAAC in 2013-14. The Hawks have won all six MAAC matchups between the programs in West Long Branch. Siena is in search of its first regular season series sweep of the Hawks. Monmouth is one of only two current or former MAAC programs (Manhattan: 32-29) that holds a winning all-time regular season conference record (11-2) against the Saints. **Jalen Pickett** is averaging 13.0 points and 4.2 assists in three career games vs. Monmouth. **Carmen Maciariello** is 1-0 vs. Monmouth. **King Rice** is 11-3 vs. Siena.

Last Meeting

Siena rallied from a 10-point halftime deficit. **Elijah Burns** hit the go-ahead basket with 1:28 remaining. Six Saints scored between 9-15 points. **Deion Hammond** (23) and **Ray Salnave** (20) combined to score 43 points for Monmouth.

Siena Basketball alumnus named 18th head coach in program history on March 25th

41-year-old native of nearby Clifton Park completed first season as an assistant coach in second stint on staff last season

Helped guide Siena to a 17-16 overall record including an 11-7 mark in the MAAC last season

Saints' 17 wins tied for the most of any MAAC team, and the squad's nine-win improvement was tied for the 11th best turnaround nationally. Siena finished in a tie for second place in the MAAC - placing nine spots higher than their preseason poll prediction - which tied UT Arlington for the largest improvement nationally.

Served as coordinator for Siena defense last season which ranked 42nd nationally allowing 66.0 points per game, the third best mark during the program's 43-year Division I era. Earlier last season, Maciariello's defense held the opposition to 70 points or fewer for 15 straight games, marking the program's longest such streak in 26 years.

First entered the collegiate ranks as Siena's director of basketball operations during the 2005-06 season under the direction of 2017 Siena Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Fran McCaffery

Graduated cum laude from Siena in 2001, while helping guide the Saints to 20 wins and a share of the MAAC Regular Season Championship during his senior season, after having sat out the previous year per NCAA transfer regulations following his matriculation from the University of New Hampshire

Recently completed 11th season as a Division I assistant coach, which has included stops at Siena (2018-19), George Washington (2014-18), Boston University (2011-14), and Fairfield (2008-11)

Teams have made seven national postseason tournament appearances while averaging 20.5 wins and a .624 winning percentage, and has also helped guide his programs to a 124-70 (.639) conference mark and, including his time as an undergraduate at Siena, has won a conference regular season or postseason title at each school

1996 *Albany Times Union* Player of the Year at Shenendehowa High School

Married to wife, Laura, and has a two-year-old daughter, Reese (turns three Mar. 17)

Siena can secure the program's eighth MAAC Regular Season Championship outright tonight

The Saints would clinch the MAAC Regular Season Championship outright with a win OR a Saint Peter's loss vs. Iona

Siena has won three of its first seven MAAC Regular Season Championships outright

The Saints secured at least a share of the program's eighth MAAC Regular Season Championship with Wednesday's win over Niagara

Siena has won at least a share of eight MAAC Regular Season Championships since joining the league in 1989-90 (31 seasons):

1990-91 (share), 1998-99 (share), 1999-00, 2000-01 (share), 2007-08 (share), 2008-09, 2009-10, and 2019-20

The Saints enter the final night of the regular season in control of their own destiny for the No. 1 seed in the MAAC Tournament and the conference's automatic NIT bid

Siena will be the No. 1 seed in the MAAC Tournament with a win tonight OR a Saint Peter's loss vs. Iona

The Saints would face the winner of the No. 8/9 game in the MAAC Quarterfinals Wednesday at 7 p.m. in Atlantic City

Siena would be the No. 2 seed with a loss tonight AND a Saint Peter's win vs. Iona

The Saints would face the winner of the No. 7/10 game in the MAAC Quarterfinals Wednesday at 9:30 p.m. in this scenario

Siena enters tonight's regular season finale riding an eight-game winning streak, and has won 11 of their last 12 overall

The Saints' eight-game win streak is the longest since winning a program record 15 straight from Dec. 23, 2009 - Feb. 8, 2010

Siena is allowing just 58.8 points during its eight-game win streak on just 39% shooting including only 27% from three

The Saints had allowed an average of 72.0 points on 45% shooting including 34% from three over their first 20 games

Siena returns to the road tonight to close out its regular season slate

The Saints are finishing with four of their final five regular season games on the road

Siena had played six of its previous eight games prior to that at the Times Union Center

Siena swept its three-game road trip last week, and has won four of its last five road games following an 0-9 start on the road

The Saints' lone defeat during their hot stretch came by five points at current second-place team Saint Peter's

Siena snapped a nine-game road losing streak with an 87-64 rout of four-time defending MAAC Champion Iona Jan. 31

It marked the Saints' first road victory in 11 months, dating back to a 72-65 overtime triumph last Mar. 3 at Niagara

The 23-point victory marked Siena's biggest road win in a decade, since an 80-54 triumph at Rider on Feb. 26, 2010

The 23-point loss was Iona's largest home defeat in 13 years, dating back to a 79-53 loss vs. Marist on Feb. 11, 2007

With the win, Siena shedded the mantle of being the only DI team who was undefeated at home and winless on the road

The Saints completed a perfect 14-0 season at the Times Union Center Wednesday night

Siena achieved its third undefeated home season in 23 years since making the full-time move downtown in 1997-98

The Saints previously posted perfect 17-0 marks in Albany during both the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons

Siena is one of just 14 remaining Division I teams who are unbeaten at home this season

The Saints averaged an 11.1-point margin of victory at home

Siena trailed for a total of just 14:09 over their final seven games at the Times Union Center

Elijah Burns averaged 18.2 points on 67% shooting, 50% from three, and 88% from the free throw line

The Saints' average home attendance of 6,228 marked the program's highest in four years (6,269 in 2015-16)

Siena's 14-game home win streak is the longest since winning a program record 38 straight from 2008-10

The Saints have won 15 straight regular season home games at the Times Union Center dating back to last season

Siena is amongst teams also receiving votes in the latest CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top-25 Poll for the first time this season

The Saints lead all MAAC schools and rank tied for 41st overall with four votes

MAAC Preseason Player of the Year **Jalen Pickett** is making a strong bid to earn the prestigious award

The sophomore standout has won a league-high three MAAC Player of the Week Awards (Dec. 30, Jan. 27, Feb. 24)

Pickett is the first Siena player to win three MAAC Player of the Week awards since **Brett Bisping** also won three in 2015-16

Pickett was named to both the Lou Henson Award Preseason and Midseason Watch Lists (top Division I mid-major player)

Pickett ranks seventh nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.14), 25th in minutes (36.9), and 28th in assists (5.8)

Pickett also stands fourth in the MAAC in scoring (15.3), seventh in blocks (1.1), ninth in threes (56), and 10th in 3FG% (.389)

Pickett needs only 65 more points to become the 45th member of the Siena Basketball 1,000 Point Club

Should Pickett accomplish the feat this year, he would be the first Siena player to eclipse 1,000 points in his first two seasons

Only **Marc Brown** (979) and **Edwin Ubiles** (954) have scored more points in their first two seasons at Siena than Pickett (925)

The sophomore already ranks ninth all-time in program history in assists (378)

Pickett was the first Saint to be voted MAAC Preseason Player of the Year in nine years dating back to **Ryan Rossiter** in 2010-11

Pickett was the first true sophomore to be selected Preseason First Team All-MAAC since Iona's **Schadrac Casimir** in 2015-16

Pickett was ranked the 25th best player in nation entering the 2019-20 season by ESPN's **John Gasaway**, 68th by NBC Sports'

Rob Dauster, and 69th by CBS Sports' **Matt Norlander**

Siena possesses the most potent offense in the MAAC

The Saints lead the conference in scoring (72.1), scoring margin (+3.9), and field goal percentage (.455)

Siena is averaging 7.5 more points per game this year than they did last season

The Saints also rank 67th nationally shooting 35.5% from three

Siena boasts three of the top-11 and four of the top-18 scorers in the MAAC

Pickett ranks fourth in scoring (15.3), Burns is sixth (14.7), **Manny Camper** is 11th (13.6), and **Donald Carey** 18th (11.2)

The quartet has combined to average 54.8 points per game, accounting for 76% of Siena's scoring output

Pickett is averaging 7.5 assists over his last 13 games while posting a 3.73 assist-to-turnover ratio (97-26)

Burns leads the MAAC in field goal percentage (.619) and is third in free throw percentage (.854)

Burns was one of 10 MAAC seniors named to the Dos Equis 3X3U National Championship

Burns and Camper were appointed team co-captains on Feb. 21

Camper has enjoyed a breakout junior season, ranking 27th nationally in rebounding (10.1) and 20th in defensive rebounding (7.39)

He also ranks among the national leaders in minutes played (35.8 - 54th), and has recorded his first 13 career double-doubles

Camper is averaging a double-double on the season as he also stands 11th in the MAAC in scoring (13.6)

Camper pulled down a career-high 19 rebounds on Nov. 20 at Yale, the most by a Siena player in nearly seven years since **OD**

Anosike grabbed 21 on Jan. 27, 2013 against Marist

The "power guard" had averaged just 3.9 rebounds over his first two seasons in 19.3 minutes per game

Siena is 13-1 overall this season when allowing less than 70 points, and 17-3 when holding the opponent under 50% FG
The Saints are a stellar 6-2 in games decided by three points or less
Siena ranks 61st nationally in rebound margin (+4.1) and also averages 35.9 rebounds per game
The Saints ranked fifth worst nationally last season in rebounding (29.5) and 322nd out of 351 teams in rebound margin (-4.1)
Siena completed the program's first 7-1 February in 13 years since also going 7-1 in February 2007
The Saints' 7-1 February marked the program's best record in the month in 29 years, since going 8-1 in February 1991
Siena scored first in 13 straight games from Jan. 17 - Feb. 28
The Saints scored on their first possession 11 times during that stretch, and made their first field goal attempt seven times
Siena has posted at least one win on every day of the week this season
The Saints have been most prolific on Fridays with six victories, posting a 6-2 record
Elijah Burns won the opening tip in 20 straight games in which he played, prior to losing the jump last Friday at Marist
Burns has won the opening tip in 22 of the 27 games in which he has taken it this season
The Saints were victorious in the program's 600th all-time MAAC contest on Feb. 16 vs. Manhattan (regular season and postseason)
Siena has now posted a 345-260 (.570) all-time MAAC record overall
The Saints secured the program's milestone 300th all-time MAAC Regular Season win on Feb. 14 vs. Rider
Now in their 31st season of MAAC competition, Siena has now posted a 306-235 (.566) all-time MAAC Regular Season record
The Saints rank third all-time in MAAC history in conference regular season wins, trailing only Iona (397) and Manhattan (310)
Siena joined the conference eight years after both the Gaels and Jaspers, and have played 102 fewer games than each
The Saints won at least a share of seven MAAC Regular Season Championships and captured five MAAC Tournament titles
The Saints posted consecutive 23-point wins in victories over Quinnipiac and Iona to close out January
The wins matched the program's largest margin of victory since an 89-54 win over Manhattan on Dec. 4, 2015 in Albany
Siena started 2-0 MAAC play for the first time in a decade, dating back to a program-best 14-0 start during the 2009-10 season
The Saints posted a 17-13 overall record during the 2019 calendar year, the program's best mark since going 22-11 in 2010
The Saints finished with a 4-5 record in non-conference action
Siena went 4-0 at home to record the program's first undefeated record in non-conference play since also going 4-0 in 2015-16
The Saints went 3-1 against the Patriot League while playing three of the conference's top-four teams in the preseason poll
The Saints faced both of the Ivy League's Co-Regular Season Champions from a year ago on the road in Harvard and Yale
Both Xavier (18) and Harvard (75) were ranked in the Top-100 in Ken Pomeroy's preseason rankings
Siena has a pair of four-game homestands and also a four-game road trip this season
The four-game road trip was the program's first since Feb. 12-26, 2010
The four-game road trip matches the program's longest since playing five straight away from home Dec. 22, 1994 - Jan. 7, 1995
The Saints went a season long 14 days between their games Dec. 7 at Cal Poly and Dec. 21 vs. Bucknell
Siena played just four games in a 36-day span
Siena went a total of 39 days between its second and third home games of the season, Nov. 12 to Dec. 21
This was the longest in-season stretch between home games in the program's Division I history (1976-77)
Coppin State (42 days) is the only Division I team which has a longer stretch between home games this season
Siena routed American 96-80 in the season opener
The 96 points scored was the program's most in a season-opener in 35 years, dating back to a 110-64 thrashing of East Stroudsburg to tip off the 1984-85 campaign
The 16-point margin of victory was the largest in a season-opener since an 82-52 triumph over Boise State in Albany to start the 2008-09 MAAC Championship season, and the largest margin by a coach in his Siena debut since **Dan Cunha** in 1941-42
Siena was projected to finish sixth (11 teams) according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll
Only eight points separated the third through sixth spots in tight polling
Siena finished in a four-way tie for second place in the MAAC last season, after being predicted to finish last
Saints' nine-spot improvement from their preseason prediction was tied with UT Arlington for the best nationally
Siena returns two starters and 10 letterwinners from last year's team
The Saints welcomed back 41% of their scoring and 40% of their rebounding from a year ago
Three of the team's top-four scorers from last season either graduated or transferred
Siena welcomes five newcomers to the program this season, including four true freshmen
Illinois State transfer **Matt Hein** becomes the program's third-ever graduate transfer, dating back to last season
Highly touted transfers Burns (Notre Dame) and **Donald Carey** (Mount St. Mary's) are also set to don the Green and Gold for the first time after sitting out the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer regulations
A total of seven players and coaches from the 2019-20 roster hail from the Greater Capital Region
The Saints are under the direction of alumnus **Carmen Maciariello '01** who was named the program's 18th head coach Mar. 25
Maciariello is Siena's third different head coach in three seasons
Maciariello is the first alumnus to lead the program since **Bill Kirsch** (1972-82)
The Saints are looking to build off last season's 17-16 overall record which included an 11-7 mark in the MAAC
Siena's nine-win improvement from the previous year was tied for the 11th best turnaround nationally
The Saints' 17 wins were tied for the most of any MAAC team
Siena set program single-season records for both three-point makes (288) and attempts (849)
The Saints ranked amongst the national leaders in fewest fouls (14.0 - fourth), turnovers (9.8 - eighth), scoring defense (66.0 - 42nd), and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.28 - 50th)
Siena held the opposition to 70 points or fewer for 15 straight games from Dec. 22 - Feb. 13, marking the program's longest stretch since a 17-game streak from Dec. 8, 1992 - Feb. 10, 1993
The Saints committed 15 turnovers or fewer in all 33 games

Elijah Burns posted a double-double with 24 points and 10 rebounds

Jalen Pickett added a double-double with 10 points and a season-high 12 assists

Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena is in its 30th season of competition at the Times Union Center, and 23rd since making the full-time move to downtown Albany in 1997-98

The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance in each of the past 22 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move to the TUC

Siena ranked 94th nationally out of 351 Division I programs in attendance last season, drawing an average of 5,767 fans over 16 home dates at the Times Union Center

Siena ranked 12th overall in the Northeast – and second amongst all Northeast mid-major teams – in average attendance last season, and stood 19th nationally amongst all mid-major programs in attendance

The Saints' average attendance last season out-drew power five conference schools Boston College, California, Oregon State, Stanford, USC, and Washington State, and exceeded the overall Division I national average of 4,659 by more than 1,000 fans

Siena has drawn a grand total of 2,554,577 fans (an average of 6,484) over 394 dates at the Times Union Center

The Saints welcomed their 2-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 against Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions

Siena boasts a 262-132 (.665) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a 247-110 (.692) mark since making the full-time move to the facility in 1997-98. The Saints won a program record 38 straight games at the Times Union Center from 2008-10.

In 2009-10, Siena established a new program record with 133,505 fans (an average of 7,853) for 17 home games, which ranked 66th nationally in tying for its highest national ranking ever (2002-03)

The Saints have hosted the MAAC Basketball Championships at the Times Union Center 20 times in their 30 years in the conference

Siena Basketball Head Coach **Carmen Maciariello** has announced his first official signings for the Saints' Class of 2024. **Aidan Carpenter, Colin Golson, and Bennett Kwiecinski** have all committed to Siena during the early signing period, and will enroll at the College next fall.

"In this class we looked to add versatility, and our three incoming Saints will be able to thrive in both our offensive and defensive systems," said Maciariello. "They all embody what we look for in a Siena Saint."

A 6-5, 185-pound guard, Carpenter is ranked the No. 1 recruit in Maine and No. 22 overall in the New England Class of 2020 according to the New England Recruiting Report. The Hamden, Connecticut native, who is playing for Dan Haynes at Lee Academy in Maine this year, was named the NEPSAC Player of the Year after averaging 24 points and five assists while leading Hyde School in Bath, Maine to the NEPSAC Class C Title last season. Carpenter plays his AAU basketball for Rhode Island Elite under the direction of coach Nick Light.

"Aidan is a big guard who can play either on or off the ball," explained Maciariello. "He has tremendous quickness, and thrives running the wing or pushing the ball. Defensively, he can guard multiple positions."

A 6-7, 235-pound forward from Detroit, Golson is set to suit up for Ferndale High and coach Juan Rickman this season after transferring from East English Village. He plays AAU for coach DeJon Curd of the REACH Legends.

"Colin is a big, athletic forward with a seven-foot wingspan," described Maciariello. "He can defend all positions on the court, and will add grit and power to our frontcourt."

A 6-8, 205-pound forward out of Wilmette, Illinois, Kwiecinski was named a Top-15 prospect in the Class of 2020 by the City/Suburban Hoops Report in Chicago. He attends Loyola Academy, where he averaged 13.7 points, 6.7 rebounds, and 1.8 blocks last season under the direction of Tim Livatino. Kwiecinski, who plays AAU for the Illinois Wolves and coach Mike Mullins, has a twin brother, Jordan, who also recently committed to playing Division I basketball at Drake University.

"Bennett will be able to play the three or four for us, and has a tremendous basketball IQ," noted Maciariello. "We love big wings, and he will provide us with a workmanlike approach to the game. He has the ability to stretch the defense with his shot, as well as put it on the floor."

"We welcome these young men and their families to our program," added Maciariello. "They are all special people who commit to being the best they can be daily."
