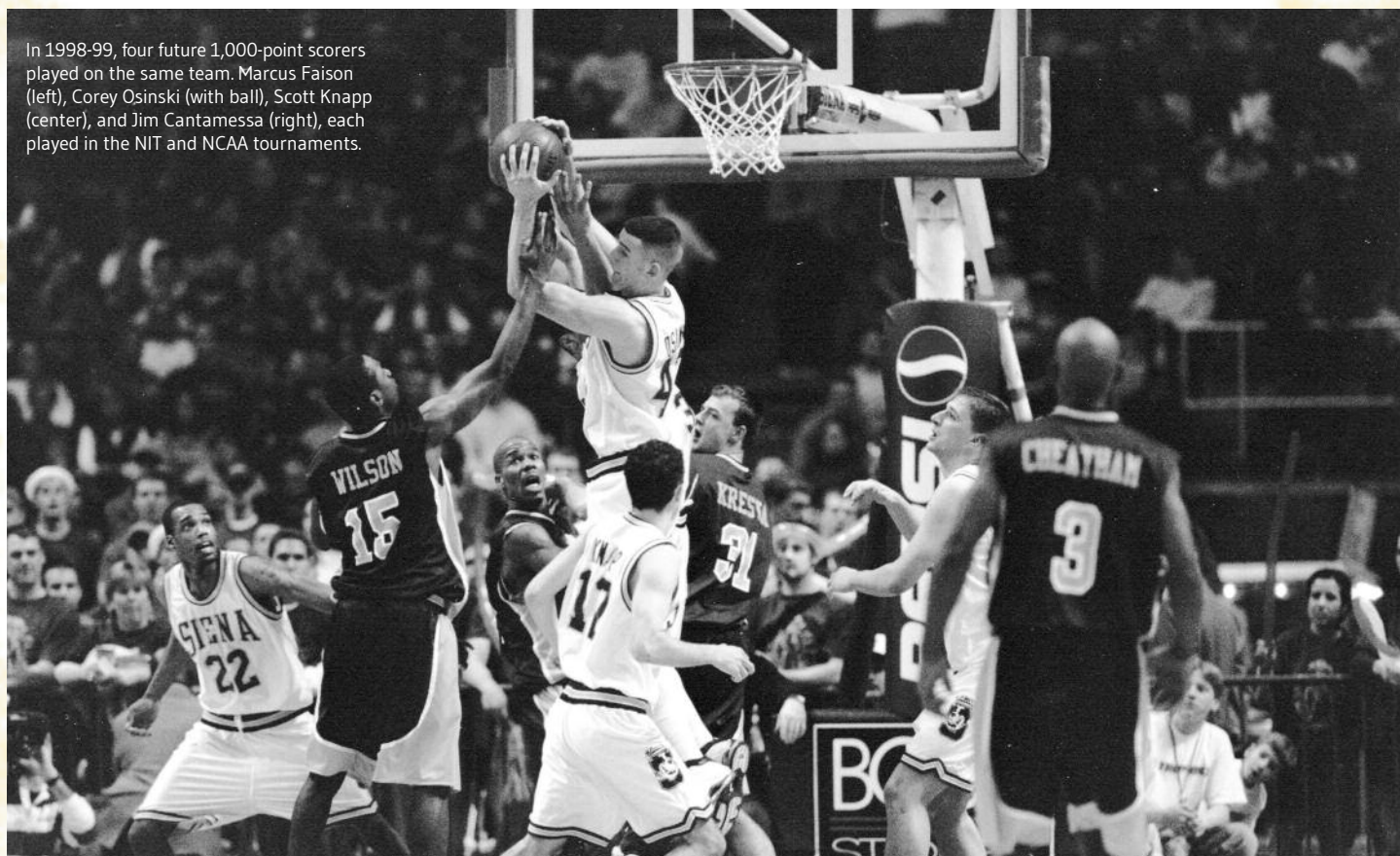

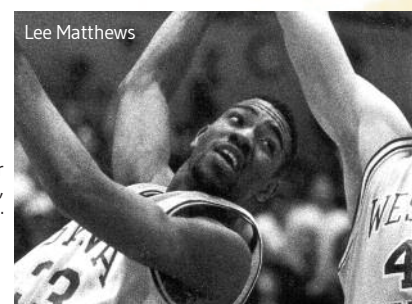
Lee Matthews led Siena in rebounding in each of his four seasons and graduated as the career leader in rebounds, with 1,037, an 8.5 per game average.

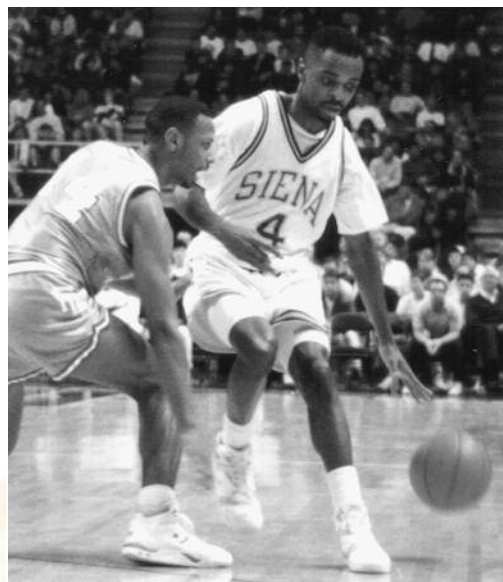
