Of Note

Siena and New Hampshire are set to renew a regional rivalry for the first time in five years, with the pair taking the court in Durham for the first time since December 9, 2015.

Despite falling in the most recent matchup, the Saints have won three of the year four matchups, including the last two at New Hampshire. Siena overcame a 21-point deficit as part of the largest comeback in program history in a 78-65 win at UNH on December 1, 2001.

Coach Jabir vs. New Hampshire

Coach Jabir's only prior matchup with the Wildcats came as the head coach of Providence, with the Friars taking a 79-70 overtime win on December 8, 2001.

Siena in the Granite State

Siena will be making its 12th appearance in New Hampshire, with the Saints holding a 6-5 mark when playing in the New England union. Siena has faced four different schools in New Hampshire: the Wildcats, Dartmouth, Franklin Pierce, and Keene State, which handed the former Indians their first loss in program history in Keene in 1974.

HEAD COACH JIM JABIR



Nazareth College '85
(Fourth Season at Siena)
Overall Record: 514-448
At Siena: 50-32

Jim Jabir is returning to Loudonville to once again lead the Siena Women's Basketball program. A finalist for the 2013 Naismith National Coach of the Year Award, the Brooklyn, New York native has led his programs to eight NCAA Tournament berths highlighted by a 2015 Elite Eight appearance, while amassing 514 wins.

"I would like to thank Dr. Gibson and John D'Argenio for the opportunity to come home and do what I love," said Jabir. "Siena is a special place for me, and our goal from day one is to win championships and represent Siena in a first class manner. This is not my program. This program belongs to our students and all the fans who have supported the Saints for so long, and we will continue to represent you all well. We will build a family that you will be proud of. We will need you all at our games to help us achieve this lofty goal."

The 58-year-old Jabir has achieved a 514-446 (.535) overall record over 33 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including 32 at the Division I level. Currently standing 31st amongst all active DI head coaches in wins, he previously led the Siena Women's Basketball program for three seasons (1987-90), while also having served as the head coach at Florida Atlantic University (2017-21), University of Dayton (2003-16), Providence College (1996-02), Marquette University (1990-96), and Division III Buffalo State College (1986-87).

"We are delighted to welcome Coach Jabir back to Siena College, and couldn't be more excited to have someone with his tremendous coaching pedigree and acumen leading our women's basketball program," said Siena College President Christopher P. Gibson '86, Ph.D. "Jim has a proven track record of building championship caliber programs in a way that strongly aligns with our Franciscan values, and we can't wait to see him lead our Saints to new heights."

Jabir returns to the Capital Region following a four-year stint at Florida Atlantic where he took the Owls to unprecedented success in Conference USA. This past season, Jabir piloted FAU to an 11-11 overall record including an 8-8 mark in C-USA. The Owls capped the season by securing the program's first-ever C-USA Tournament win, which marked Jabir's milestone 500th Division I head coaching victory. During his first season at the helm in 2017-18, he guided FAU to a nine-win improvement which marked the fourth best turnaround nationally.

"Siena and our women's basketball team are fortunate to be able to have Jim return and lead our program," said Siena College Vice President and Director of Athletics John D'Argenio. "His record of basketball achievements is evident. His ability to engage the student athletes he leads, understand them as young women, and build a program that supports them as people has been the foundation upon which his on-the-court success has been built."

Jabir arrived in Boca Raton after a transformative 13-year run at Dayton, where he departed as the winningest coach in program history at 252-155 (.619). He built the Flyers from a 3-25 team in his first season, to a program which achieved a peak national ranking of No. 11 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls in 2013. A two-time Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year (2008, 2013), Jabir led UD to six straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2010-15, in addition to three WNIT berths (2008, 2009, 2016).

Jabir guided Dayton to eight straight 20-win seasons while compiling a stellar 194-68 (.740) record from 2007-15. The Flyers captured the program's first A-10 Tournament Championship in 2012, and their initial two A-10 Regular Season Championships in both 2013 and 2014 under his leadership.

Jabir mentored the sixth youngest team in the country to a program Division I best 28-3 record in 2013, which culminated with Dayton's second trip to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament in four seasons. The historic 2014-15 UD squad also won 28 games, highlighted by NCAA Tournament victories over Iowa State, No. 11 Kentucky, and No. 8 Louisville to advance to the Regional Final in nearby Albany at the Times Union Center in Jabir's triumphant return to the Capital Region. The Flyers finished the 2014-15 season ranked 17th nationally in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.

Player recruitment and development was key for Jabir at Dayton, where he signed a pair of top-20 recruiting classes (13th in 2015-16, 20th in 2013-14). During his tenure in the Gem City, Jabir recruited 22 A-10 All-Conference and 11 All-Rookie Team selections, including four A-10 Rookies of the Year. He mentored and developed the first three WNBA Draft picks in program history in Saicha Grant-Allen (2017), Andrea Hoover (2015), and Ally Malott (2015). Moreover, Jabir's program achieved unparalleled success in the classroom where they boasted a perfect 100% graduation rate for 11 consecutive seasons as well as 10 A-10 All-Academic Team selections.

Prior to his time at Dayton, Jabir served a pair of six-year stints at both Marquette (1990-96) and Providence (1996-02). He rebuilt Marquette into a program which secured its first three postseason tournament berths, earning a spot in the WNIT in 1993 before winning the Great Midwest Conference and advancing to the NCAA Tournament in both 1994 and 1995. A two-time Reebok/Great Midwest Coach of the Year, Jabir led the Golden Eagles to back-to-back 22-win seasons in 1992-93 and 1993-94. During his tenure at Providence, he recruited and coached a pair of BIG EAST All-Conference and All-Rookie Team selections.

Jabir broke into the Division I head coaching ranks when the late legendary Siena College Athletic Director and Men's Basketball Coach Bill Kirsch '56, HOF '76 appointed the then 24-year-old to take over the reins of the women's basketball program on Apr. 13, 1987. Jabir led Siena to a 50-29 (.633) record over three years (1987-90), including the program's inaugural season in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in 1989-90. He recruited and coached Siena's first three All-MAAC selections in Val Higgins '91, HOF '98, Michelle Collins '92, and Peg Taylor '92, as well as six 1,000-point scorers.

Jabir began his collegiate head coaching career at Division III Buffalo State, which he led to a SUNYAC Championship and NCAA Regional appearance during his lone season at helm in 1986-87. He previously served as an assistant coach the year prior with the Bengals, following one season as an assistant at his alma mater Nazareth College in 1984-85. Jabir has also previously served as an assistant coach at the Division I level, where he helped guide Colorado to a Sweet 16 appearance in his lone season with the Buffaloes in 2002-03.

A 1984 graduate of Nazareth with his degree in English, Jabir earned his Master's in Student Personnel Administration from Buffalo State in 1986. The father of Lauren, Shane, and Jackson, Jabir and his wife, Angie, are the proud parents of son Jude.

QUICK HITS



- Siena returns home to the friendly confines of the UHY Center for the first time this season in search of its first win of the year Saturday afternoon, following a four-game road trip to open the 2021-22 campaign,
- The Saints recently concluded a four-game trip to start the season, their longest stretch away from home to kick off a campaign since 2004-05, and the most calendar days away from home to start a campaign (19 days) prior to a home opener in the program's 48-year history.
- Saturday's contest will mark the latest home opener for the Green and Gold since...last year, when the season began at home on December 11, 2020. During the 2004-05 campaign, the team started the year away from home for the first four contests of the year only to face none other than Duquesne in their home opener on November 30, 2004.
- Siena suffered its most lopsided result of the year thus far prior to the holiday, falling, 59-45, at New Hampshire on November 23. Fifth year guard Rayshel Brown was back in double figures for the third time this season, pacing the team with 15 points and eight rebounds.
- Sophomore point guard Ahniysha Jackson returned to the court after missing the previous two games due to injury, contributing eight points in 18 minutes off the bench.
- Tuesday's loss also featured the season debut of graduate student DeAnna Winston, who took the court for her first action since February 2020. Freshman Anajah Brown also made her Siena debut with six points and seven boards in 17 minutes. Transfer junior Cheyenne Talbot and freshman Emina Selimovic scored the first points of their Siena careers, with Talbot going for five in 17 minutes and Selimovic scoring a bucket in 11 minutes off the bench.
- The Saints saw all 15 active players check in for at least two minutes Tuesday, setting a program record for the most players to appear in a regular season game.
- Siena gained a 16th active player Friday, with the announcement that transfer senior Selena Philoxy, who joined the program last winter from Seton Hall and Stetson, has been granted immediate eligibility from the NCAA.
- Siena continues to rank near the top of the nation (third) in three-point field goal defense, and have held opponents to only 14.8 percent from beyond-the-arc through four games.
- The Saints held St. Bonaventure to 0-13 from three on November 11, marking the first time since 2011 that they eliminated the three ball in a game.
- Despite falling in its season-opener at Binghamton on November 9, Siena out-rebounded the Bearcats, 48-43, recording its most boards in a game since having 50 in a MAAC Tournament First Round win over Canisius on March 10, 2020.
- Known for her scoring, senior Margo Peterson set new career-highs in rebounds (nine) and steals (three) in the Saints' season opener at Binghamton on Nov. 9. It was the second time in her career she would grab three steals.
- The Saints enter their 48th overall season as a program, 40th in Division I program, and their 33rd in the MAAC.
- Siena has spent their entire home life at the UHY Center, formerly known as the Alumni Recreation Center (ARC). Longtime Siena corporate partner UHY Advisors secured the naming rights to the facility in February 2021, and a ribbon cutting was held on November 14, 2021.
- Siena holds a 281-178 (.612) record at home during the team's Division I era, and is 22-24 in home openers dating back to 1974. The Saints will look to snap a three-game losing skid in home openers and pick up their first win on the occasion since 2017.
- Siena Head Coach Jim Jabir ranks 31st all-time among active NCAA Division 1 women's basketball head coaches in victories (514).
- Fifth year Rayshel Brown was named to the Preseason All-MAAC Third Team. Brown is Siena's top returning scorer, averaging 10.8 points per-contest during the 2020-21 season.
- Former program standout Heather Stec returns to Siena on the sidelines as an assistant coach for the 2021-22 season. Stec played at Siena from 2004 through 2009, and earned a Second Team All-MAAC selection her senior year.
- Despite boasting nine returners entering the season, Siena brought in eight players who had not taken the court in the Green and Gold, including seven who joined the team over the summer.
- Last season, senior Lala Watts became the seventh member of the 100 blocks club in program history. With 105 career blocks to her name, she now trails Laura Lord (112) for sixth all-time.
- Jabir stands fourth all-time in wins in Siena history by a head coach. He currently trails Joe Hogan (115) for third all-time.
- The Saints were picked ninth in the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll. Siena earned 44 total points, finishing ahead of Monmouth (33) and Canisius (15).
- Siena features two local products for the first time since 2014-15. Then, the Saints featured Emia Willingham (Albany) and Tehresa Coles (Loudonville). This season, the Saints field sophomore Ahniysha Jackson (Albany) and Valencia Fontenelle-Posson (Altamont).
- Both Amari Anthony and Margo Peterson sit in the Top 10 all-time for three-point percentage. Anthony sits 9th with a .339 average, while Peterson sits 10th with a .313 average

Siena scored 100 points in a game: Siena defeated Rider 103-69 on Jan. 13, 2003.

Siena allowed 100 points in a game: No. 14/13 Syracuse defeated the Saints, 102-65, on Nov. 9, 2016 in Syracuse, NY.

Siena scored between 90-99: Siena scored between 90-99: Siena defeated Monmouth, 91-86, in double overtime on Jan. 28, 2017 in West Long Branch, NJ.

Siena won an overtime game: Siena defeated Canisius on the road on Feb. 22, 2019 by a final score of 78-66. The Saints used a 26 point day from Sabrina Piper. It would be the Saints third OT win during the season.

Siena lost an overtime game: The Saints fell, 68-61 in overtime to Niagara on the road on Jan. 9, 2020.

Siena held an opponent to 40 points or fewer: The Saints held Monmouth to shooting just 23.9 percent from the floor in a 51-39 win on Jan. 23, 2020 at the ARC. In that game, Lala Watts would set the single game record for blocks with eight total.

Siena was held to 40 points or fewer: Siena was stifled in a 69-38 loss against Rider back on Feb. 13, 2020. The Saints turned the ball over 28 times, in was their third loss of being held under 40 points on the season.

Siena won by more than 30 points: The Saints defeated Saint Peter's, 70-36, on Feb 25, 2018 in Loudonville.

Siena lost by more than 30 points: Siena fell to Manhattan by a final score of 80-50 on Jan. 16, 2020.

Five Siena players scored in double figures: Five of Siena's nine active players reached double figures in the Saints' 81-65 win at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 30, 2015 in Hackensack, N.J. It marked the second time in 15 games that five Saints had reached double figures, after Siena had gone the previous 251 games without doing so (Jan. 29, 2007).

Siena grabbed more than 50 rebounds in a game: Siena out-rebounded Canisius in the First Round of the 2020 MAAC Championships on Mar. 10, 2020 in Atlantic City, NJ. The Saints grabbed exactly 50 rebounds, collecting a rebounding margin of only +4.

A Siena player scored 30 or more points in a game: Junior Sabrina Piper had a career night when she dropped 30 points on the Colgate Raiders in a Siena 55-53 win at the ARC on Nov. 29, 2018. Piper was 10-for-15 from the field, including a 4-for-6 clip from three-point range.

A Siena player recorded 20 or more rebounds in a game: Heather Stec pulled down 23 rebounds on Jan. 21, 2007 at Saint Peter's. She came up one rebound shy of the program record (24) set by Melanie Halker '97 on Feb. 23, 1997.

A Siena player had 10 or more assists in a game: Ida Krogh became the first Saint since Liga Alpe-Luka on Nov. 10, 2007 to post a double-digit assist game with a 10-assist performance in a 62-55 win over Manhattan Jan. 13, 2013 at the Times Union Center.

Siena failed to convert a free-throw: On Dec. 4, 2006 Siena went 0-3 from the line at #1 Maryland.

Siena failed to convert a 3-pointer: Siena failed to hit a three-point-er in a 58-47 loss at Iona on Feb. 20, 2020. The Saints went 0-8 in the contest, as it became the first time in 146 games they would not convert from distance. Prior to that, the fifth seeded Saints fell 64-47 to top seed Quinnipiac in the MAAC Semifinals on Mar. 8, 2015 at the Times Union Center.

A Siena opponent failed to convert a 3-pointer: St. Bonaventure went 0-13 from beyond the arc in a 50-42 Bonnies win at the Reilly Center on November 11, 2021. It marked the first time in 10 years that Siena held its opponent without a three since Saint Peter's went 0-for-8 from distance on Feb. 19, 2011.
