Siena's 59 wins over Niagara are the program's second most vs. any opponent (Marist - 60) The Saints are 11-3 over the past 14 meetings

Sunday's matchup marks the 68th anniversary of the epic 1953 six-overtime battle between the programs, which was the longest college basketball game played until 2003 Siena's first-ever game was against Niagara in the Winter of 1938, a 52-47 Siena win **Jalen Pickett** is averaging 16.5 points and 8.5 assists in four career games vs. Niagara

Carmen Maciariello is 1–1 vs. Niagara **Greg Paulus** is 1–1 vs. Siena

Last Meeting

Siena pulled away with a 25-4 run to open the second half The Saints shot an even 50%, while limiting Niagara to just 33% **Elijah Burns** (24 points, 10 rebounds) and Pickett (10 points, 12 assists) each recorded double-doubles for Siena **James Towns** led the Purple Eagles with 13 points

Siena Basketball alumnus is 18th head coach in program history

42-year-old native of nearby Clifton Park led Siena to program's first MAAC Championship in a decade in just his first season at the helm last winter

Only one of 61 new Division I coaching hires in 2019-20 to lead his team to an outright conference championship

Named one of the "Top-12 Most Immediately Successful Hires of the 2019-20 Season" by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander

Led Siena to season-ending 10-game winning streak to cap 2019-20, and a perfect 14-0 mark at the Times Union Center

Developed three All-MAAC selections in first season 12) leading the program, including MAAC Player of the Year Jalen Pickett

Former Siena Basketball Director of Basketball Operations (2005-06), returned to program as an assistant coach in 2018-19 prior to promotion

Graduated cum laude from Siena in 2001, while helping guide the Saints to 20 wins and a share of the MAAC Regular Season Championship during his senior season, after having sat out the previous year per NCAA transfer regulations following his matriculation from the University of New Hampshire

Spent 11 seasons as a Division I assistant coach, which has included stops at Siena (2018–19), George Washington (2014–18), Boston University (2011–14), and Fairfield (2008–11)

As an assistant coach, teams made seven national postseason tournament appearances while averaging 20.5 wins and a .624 winning percentage, and has also helped guide his programs to a 124-70 (.639) conference mark and, including his time as an undergraduate at Siena, has won a conference regular season or postseason title at each school

1996 **Albany Times Union** Player of the Year at Shenendehowa High School

Married to wife, Laura, and has a threeyear-old daughter, Reese (turns four Mar. 17), and a newborn son, Matteo (born May









Siena returns to the court for the first time in 20 days to make its February debut this weekend

The Saints last played on Jan. 31, securing a 63-50 victory at Marist

Siena returns to action this weekend following the team's fourth COVID-19 related pause this season on Feb. 7

The Saints previously paused team activities Nov. 13, Dec. 8, and Dec. 18, prior to opening their delayed season on Jan. 3

This latest pause was the first the team had suffered since officially beginning their season

Siena enters the final days of February ranked in second place in the MAAC Standings (through Thursday)

At 8-2, the Saints boast the best win percentage in conference action

Siena stands two wins behind MAAC frontrunner Monmouth (10-4)

MAAC Tournament seedings will be decided by most conference wins due to the uneven amount of games played this season. The Saints have posted a 21–3 record since last season's Jan. 19 defeat here at Monteagle Ridge

The loss that day dropped Siena to 7-9 overall and 3-4 in the MAAC

The Saints went on to win 13 of their final 14 games – including 10 straight to end the season – to capture the MAAC Title Siena posted a program record-tying 16-game win streak from Feb. 7, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021 The Saints have been ranked three times in the College Insider Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Siena was ranked in the Top-25 in the preseason poll (21st) and in each of the final two polls of January (22nd on Jan. 19, 23rd on

The Saints had previously last cracked the Top-25 in the 2016-17 preseason poll (22nd) Siena was amongst teams also receiving votes in each of last year's final two polls

The Saints have won nine of their last 10 true road games dating back to last season

Siena won a program record eight straight road games from Feb. 23, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021 The Saints boast the MAAC's top scoring defense, and rank 14th nationally allowing 61.9 points

Siena also ranks in the top-50 nationally in field goal percentage defense (.406 - 48th)

The Saints have allowed an average of just 48.3 points over their past three games

Siena opened the season with six straight wins to mark the program's best start in 35 years (9o to begin the 1985-86 season)

The Saints didn't suffer their first loss of the season until Jan. 22, marking the latest calendar loss to start a season in program history

Head coach Carmen Maciariello has raced out to a 28-12 (.700) start to his Siena career Maciariello is off to the best 40-game head coaching start in program history

Maciariello is off to the tied for fourth best 40-game head coaching start in MAAC history

Maciariello's 28 wins are second most of any MAAC coach in their first 40 games, trailing only **Tim Welch** (Iona), **Fran Fraschilla** (Manhattan), and **Ted Fiore** (Saint Peter's) by only one win

Maciariello won 16 straight home games to begin his tenure with the Saints

Siena's 16-game home win streak from Nov. 5, 2019 - Jan. 4, 2021 was the fifth longest in program history, and the longest in 11 years

Senior captain **Manny Camper** is one of 30 candidates nationally for the Senior CLASS Award

Camper is just the third student athlete in program history to receive recognition, joining 1, 2020-21

Brett Bisping (2017) and O.D. Anosike (2012)

To be eligible for the honor, a student athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence:

community, classroom, character, and competition

Camper is averaging a double-double for the second straight season Camper ranks 11th nationally in rebounding (10.7) and ninth in the MAAC in so (13.2), while also ranking third in the league in assists (3.7)

Siena swept the MAAC Weekly Awards in consecutive weeks (Jan. 11, Jan. 18)

Impressively, four different Saints each earned their first collegiate honors Camper and **Aidan Carpenter** swept honors for the Week of Jan. 11 Jordan King and Colin Golson, Jr. completed the consecutive sweeps Jan. 18

A former preferred walk-on, the sophomore King leads the Saints and ranks sixth in the MAAC in scoring (13.3)

Junior standout Jalen Pickett became the 45th player in program history to score 1,000 career points in a Jan. 9 win at Fairfield

The reigning MAAC Player of the Year and unanimous MAAC Preseason Player of the Year became the eighth fastest player in program history to score 1,000 points (65 games)

The defending MAAC Champion Saints opened their milestone 80th season Jan. 3 The season-opener marked Siena's first game played in 298 days, since

defeating Manhattan in the MAAC Quarterfinals on Mar. 11

The 298-day span between games marked the program's longest since pausing play from 1943-46 due to World War II

The Saints endured three separate pauses following multiple positive COVID-19 test results stemming from the program's Tier 1 personnel (Nov. 13, Dec. 8, Dec. 18)

From Nov. 12 to their season opener Jan. 3 (52 days), Siena had a total of just 11 days of full team activities

Prior to Nov. 12, the Saints had gone unscathed since the start of

the coronavirus pandemic When Siena debuted Jan. 3, they were the second-to-last Division I team which had planned to start their season on-time that had yet to play (Merrimack) Jan. 3 marked the latest start to a season-opener in the program's history

The program's previous latest start was Dec. 11, 1954 vs. Buffalo The Saints opened last season on Nov. 5, marking their earliest-ever start Siena's back-to-back games vs. Monmouth to open the season marked the first time they had ever played the same team on consecutive days

The last time the Saints had faced the same opponent in consecutive games was when they beat Fresno State three straight in the best-of-three CBI Championship Series in 2014

Siena is the unanimous selection to repeat as MAAC Champions The Saints received all 11 first-place votes and the maximum 121 points Siena is the MAAC preseason favorite for the first time in 11 years

The Saints won their third straight MAAC Championshiip the last time they were picked to win the league in 2009-10

Siena is the unanimous MAAC preseason favorite for the first time in 12 years (2008-09) Pickett is the unanimous MAAC Preseason Player of the Year

Siena welcomes back six letterwinners and two starters from last year's team
The Saints return 51% of their scoring output from last year's team

Pickett and Manny Camper account for 78% of the team's returning scoring Siena welcomes eight newcomers including four true freshmen to this year's squad

The Saints added four total transfers, including a pair of graduate transfers

Siena's diverse 2020-21 roster features a total of 14 players halling from nine different states and two foreign countries

The Saints boast the seventh tallest team nationally, with an average height of 78.36 inches

Siena began its home slate on campus at the newly-named UHY Center

The Saints' season-opener Jan. 3 vs. Monmouth marked the program's first regular season game at the facility in 24 years, spanning a total of 8,720 days since hosting Loyola (MD) on Feb. 18, 1997

Siena's last postseason game on campus was a victory over Fresno State to win the CBI Championship on Apr. 5, 2014

The former Alumni Recreation Center served as the program's exclusive home from 1974-90, and part-time home from 1990-97

The Saints hold a stellar 213-61 (.777) all-time record at the UHY Center

Signa posted a perfect 14-0 home record last season at the Times Union Center, the program's exclusive home since 1007

Siena posted a perfect 14-0 home record last season at the Times Union Center, the program's exclusive home since 1997
The Saints averaged 6,228 fans last season at the Times Union Center
Siena ranked 83rd nationally in average home attendance, cracking the top-100 for the 23rd straight season
The Saints ranked #1 amongst all Northeast mid-major programs in average attendance, and 12th overall nationally amongst
mid-majors, and were third overall amongst all of New York's Division I programs
Siena captured the program's eighth MAAC Regular Season Championship (and fourth outright) last season
The Saints were also later awarded the program's sixth MAAC Tournament Championship and seventh NCAA automatic qualifier
on Mar. 24, by virtue of being the highest remaining seed following the cancellation of the MAAC Tournament on Mar. 12
The championship was Siena's first in a decade, since completing their MAAC three-peat in 2010
The Saints achieved the program's 21st 20-win season and first in four years

Siena boasted three All-MAAC selections for just the fifth time in 31 years
Jalen Pickett was named the MAAC Player of the Year and was joined on the First Team by Manny Camper
Elijah Burns was named a Second Team All-MAAC selection

Pickett was named to the Lou Henson All-America Team, and was an NABC District 1 honoree and USBWA All-District II
Pickett became the first Siena player in 55 years to be named an All-ECAC First Team honoree (**Jack Mulvey** - 1965)
Pickett became the only player in the last quarter century to average at least 15 points (15.1), six assists (6.0), one block (1.1) and one steal (1.0) per game (according to Heat Check CBB)
Pickett ranked seventh nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.30), 20th in assists, and 21st in minutes (36.9)
Pickett also ranked fourth in the MAAC in scoring, sixth in blocks, and seventh in threes (58)
Over his final 15 games, Pickett averaged 7.7 assists while achieving a 3.97 assist-to-turnover ratio (115/29)
Camper eclipsed his scoring, rebounding, assist, and block totals from his first two seasons combined
Camper was one of just 29 Division I players nationally to average a double-double with 13.7 points and 10.4 rebounds
Camper ranked in the top-50 nationally in defensive rebounding (16th - 7.53), rebounding (22nd), double-doubles (26th - 14),

and minutes (47th - 36.1)

Camper also ranked second in the MAAC in rebounding, offensive rebounding (2.83), and defensive rebounding, and 10th in field

goal percentage (.480) Siena led the MAAC in field goal percentage (.459 - 64th nationally), scoring margin (+4.5), scoring offense (72.2), and three-point field goal percentage defense (.318) last season

The Saints ranked in the top-100 nationally in rebound margin (+4.6 - 46th nationally) and three-point field goal percentage

The Saints were 14-1 last season when allowing less than 70 points, and 19-3 when holding the opponent under 50% shooting Siena was 6-2 in games decided by three points or less last season

The Saints completed the program's first 7-1 February in 13 years, since also going 7-1 in February 2007

Tied for Siena's best Month of February in 29 years, since going 8-1 in 1991

The Saints scored first in 13 straight games from Jan. 17 - Feb. 28

Siena scored on its first possession 11 times during that stretch, and made their first field goal attempt seven times

The Saints posted at least one win on every day of the week last season Siena was most prolific on Friday's with seven victories, posting a 7–2 record

Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena Basketball achieved the highest average home attendance amongst all 56 Northeast mid-major programs during the 2019–20 season, according to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Attendance Report. Moreover, the Saints broke the top-100 nationally overall in attendance for the 23rd straight season, ranking 83rd overall out of 350 Division I programs with an average of 6,228 fans per game.

Siena leapfrogged Atlantic 10 foe Rhode Island for top billing in Division I Men's Basketball attendance amongst all Northeast midmajor programs during the 2019–20 season. The Northeast is comprised of nine states according to the United States Census Bureau: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. Mid-major teams are defined as programs from the 25 conferences which do not comprise "high majors," which are the Power 5 (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and SEC), AAC, and Big East.

Siena improved 11 spots in the national average attendance rankings this past winter to finish 83rd overall, marking the program's highest mark in five years dating back to a ranking of 82nd for the 2014-15 season. The Saints have now ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance for each of the past 23 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move downtown beginning in 1997-98. Siena also stood 12th overall nationally in average home attendance amongst all 263 mid-major programs, an improvement of seven spots from the previous season.

The Saints' average attendance of 6,228 during the 2019–20 season at the Times Union Center was the program's highest mark in four years since averaging 6,269 fans in 2015–16, and outranked the NCAA average of 4,601 by more than 26%. Siena saw an increase in average home attendance of 461 spectators from the 2018–19 campaign, as the 7% improvement was the program's highest in 11 years since achieving a 14% increase in 2008–09 from the 2007–08 season. Additionally, the Saints boasted a pair of capacity crowds of 7,146 fans last season against Manhattan (Feb. 16) and in the home finale vs. Niagara (Mar. 4).

Siena ranked third in average home attendance amongst the 22 Division I programs from the state of New York, trailing only national leader Syracuse and other high-major competitor St. John's. However, the Saints outranked 16 high-major programs nationally, including nine Power 5 teams in Boston College, California, Georgia Tech, Miami, Northwestern, Oregon State, Stanford, USC, and Washington State.

The stellar fan support helped propel Siena to a perfect 14-0 record at the Times Union Center last season, as the Saints were one of just 13 Division I teams nationally to go undefeated at home in 2019–20. Siena achieved an unblemished home mark for the third time in 23 seasons since making the full-time move downtown (17-0 in both 2008–09 and 2009–10), and the 14-game win streak in Albany marks the second longest in program history (38 straight between 2008–10). The Saints won by an average of 11.1 points per game at home this past winter, and trailed for a total of just 14:09 over their final seven games at the Times Union Center.

Siena has now drawn more than 2.5 million fans over 394 all-time games at the Times Union Center, dating back to the program's first home contest in the facility during the 1990-91 season. The Saints welcomed their two-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 vs. Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions. Siena holds a 262-132 (.665) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a stellar 247-110 (.692) mark since permanently making the facility its home beginning with the 1997-98 season.

Waldorf, Maryland guard Jared Billups and Fort Myers, Florida guard Javian McCollum have both signed and returned their National Letters of Intent during the early signing period, and will enroll at Siena College next fall.

"We are excited to welcome such great young men to our Siena College community who will thrive academically, athletically, and socially," said Maciariello. "We can't wait for Jared and Javian to arrive in Loudonville and don the Green and Gold."

The 6-5, 200-pound Billups stars at the McDonough School, which also produced recent Siena star Evan Fisher '19, and is coached by TJ Jordan who worked alongside current Siena assistant Antoni Wyche when the duo were on staff together at Lehigh. A cousin of five-time NBA All-Star and 2004 NBA Finals MVP Chauncey Billups, he averaged 15.5 points and eight rebounds per game last season. Billups plays his AAU basketball for Team Thrill, under the direction of Donnell "Mookie" Dobbins.

"Jared is a physically ready to play guard who is a triple threat with the basketball," noted Maciariello. "He comes from a fine academic institution, and will be ready to thrive academically in our campus community."

The 6-1, 170-pound McCollum is a two-time The News-Press Player of the Year. Last season, he averaged 20.7 points while leading Fort Myers to the Class 6A Regional Final under head coach Keeth Jones. McCollum, who is averaging 18.5 points, 3.4 rebounds, 3.1 assists, and 2.2 steals for his high school career, plays on the AAU circuit for CP25 coached by Darrin Wallace.
