Siena in the MAAC Tournament

Reigning Champion Siena is making the program's 32nd MAAC Tournament appearance since joining the league in 1989-90

The Saints rank second amongst all MAAC programs in both Tournament Championships (six) and wins (40)

Siena won MAAC Championships in 1999, 2002, 2008, 2009, 2010, and 2020

The Saints were awarded last season's MAAC Tournament Championship as the highest remaining seed following the cancellation of the conclusion of the MAAC Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic

Siena is the No. 1 seed in the MAAC Tournament for the seventh time (1991, 2000, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2020, 2021)

The Saints are 13-2 as the No. 1 seed, and have won 10 straight

Siena has captured its past four of six title as the No. 1 seed (2008, 2009, 2010, 2020)

The Saints are set to play in the MAAC Tournament outside of Albany for just the 12th time in 32 appearances

Siena is 11-9 in MAAC Tournament games played outside the Capital Region (29-16 in Albany)

The Saints have won two of their six MAAC Championships outside of Albany (Buffalo - 1999, Atlantic City - 2020)

Siena is in search of the program's first MAAC Tournament victory vs. archnemesis Iona

The Saints are 0-10 all-time in MAAC Tournament action against the Gaels (40-15, .727 vs. all others)

Iona has been the higher-seeded team in eight of 10 matchups, including the No. 1 seed four times

Siena is 21-8 (.724) all-time in the MAAC Quarterfinals

The Saints are 24-7 (.774) all-time in MAAC Tournament openers, and won 12 of their last 14

Siena is seeking to advance to the MAAC Semifinals for the 22nd time, including the fifth time in the past six seasons

The Saints are a perfect 6-0 all-time in the MAAC Tournament vs. #9 seeds

Siena has won its six games vs. #9 seeds by an average of 14.7 points

Siena Basketball alumnus is 18th head coach in program history

42-year-old native of nearby Clifton Park led Siena to program's first MAAC Championship in a decade in just his first season at the helm last winter

Only one of 61 new Division I coaching hires in 2019-20 to lead his team to an outright conference championship

Named one of the "Top-12 Most Immediately Successful Hires of the 2019-20 Season" by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander

Led Siena to season-ending 10-game winning streak to cap 2019-20, and a perfect 14-0 mark at the Times Union Center

Developed three All-MAAC selections in first season leading the program, including MAAC Player of the Year Jalen Pickett

Former Siena Basketball Director of Basketball Operations (2005-06), returned to program as an assistant coach in 2018-19 prior to promotion

Graduated cum laude from Siena in 2001, while helping guide the Saints to 20 wins and a share of the MAAC Regular Season Championship during his senior season, after having sat out the previous year per NCAA transfer regulations following his matriculation from the University of New Hampshire

Spent 11 seasons as a Division I assistant coach, which has included stops at Siena (2018-19), George Washington (2014-18), Boston University (2011-14), and Fairfield (2008-11)

As an assistant coach, teams made seven national postseason tournament appearances while averaging 20.5 wins and a .624 winning percentage, and has also helped guide his programs to a 124-70 (.639) conference mark and, including his time as an undergraduate at Siena, has won a conference regular season or postseason title at each school

Siena begins its quest for a seventh MAAC Tournament Championship and second straight

The Saints are second all-time in conference history with six MAAC Championships (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2020)

Siena earned a share of the program's ninth MAAC Regular Season Championship and second straight

The Saints have achieved a 27-9 (.750) record in MAAC Regular Season action the past two seasons

Siena enters the MAAC Tournament as the No. 1 seed for a second straight season after posting a 12-4 league mark

The Saints are the top overall seed for the seventh time, including the second year in a row

Carmen Maciariello is a finalist for both the 2020-21 Skip Prosser Man of the Year and Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year

Maciariello is tied for the best 46-game head coaching start (32-14) in program history (**Paul Hewitt**)

Maciariello is tied for the fourth-best head coaching start in the MAAC's 40 seasons

Siena boasted three All-MAAC selections - highlighted by a pair of First Team honorees - for the second straight season

This marks just the sixth time in 32 MAAC seasons in which the Saints have had multiple First Team honorees

Senior captain **Manny Camper** was named a First Team All-MAAC selection for the second straight season

Camper was a two-time MAAC Player of the Week during the regular season (Jan. 11, Mar. 1)

Camper leads the MAAC in double-doubles (six), rebounding (10.0 - 19th nationally), defensive rebounding (7.6 - 12th nationally), and minutes (37:41 - seventh nationally)

Camper is averaging a double-double for the second straight season as he also ranks fourth in the MAAC in both scoring (14.6) as well as assists (3.9)

Camper is also one of 10 national finalists for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award

Pickett also stands third in the MAAC in minutes (35:57), eighth in blocks (1.2), and 10th in scoring (12.9)

Pickett was named the MAAC Player of the Week for the fifth time in his career Monday

Pickett became the 45th player in program history to score 1,000 points Jan. 9 at Fairfield

Pickett was the eighth fastest in school history to reach 1,000 points (65 games)

Pickett is second in program history in assists per game (6.1) and sixth in assists (458)

Former preferred walk-on, sophomore guard **Jordan King** was named to the Third Team

Named MAAC Player of the Week Jan. 18, King is averaging 12.5 points

King is sixth in the MAAC in free throw percentage (.821) and seventh in minutes (33:48)

Siena has achieved a 25-5 (.833) record over the team's past 30 games

Siena and the Times Union Center

Siena Basketball achieved the highest average home attendance amongst all 56 Northeast mid-major programs during the 2019-20 season, according to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Attendance Report. Moreover, the Saints broke the top-100 nationally overall in attendance for the 23rd straight season, ranking 83rd overall out of 350 Division I programs with an average of 6,228 fans per game.

Siena leapfrogged Atlantic 10 foe Rhode Island for top billing in Division I Men's Basketball attendance amongst all Northeast mid-major programs during the 2019-20 season. The Northeast is comprised of nine states according to the United States Census Bureau: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. Mid-major teams are defined as programs from the 25 conferences which do not comprise "high majors," which are the Power 5 (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and SEC), AAC, and Big East.

Siena improved 11 spots in the national average attendance rankings this past winter to finish 83rd overall, marking the program's highest mark in five years dating back to a ranking of 82nd for the 2014-15 season. The Saints have now ranked in the top-100 nationally in attendance for each of the past 23 seasons, coinciding with the program's full-time move downtown beginning in 1997-98. Siena also stood 12th overall nationally in average home attendance amongst all 263 mid-major programs, an improvement of seven spots from the previous season.

The Saints' average attendance of 6,228 during the 2019-20 season at the Times Union Center was the program's highest mark in four years since averaging 6,269 fans in 2015-16, and outranked the NCAA average of 4,601 by more than 26%. Siena saw an increase in average home attendance of 461 spectators from the 2018-19 campaign, as the 7% improvement was the program's highest in 11 years since achieving a 14% increase in 2008-09 from the 2007-08 season. Additionally, the Saints boasted a pair of capacity crowds of 7,146 fans last season against Manhattan (Feb. 16) and in the home finale vs. Niagara (Mar. 4).

Siena ranked third in average home attendance amongst the 22 Division I programs from the state of New York, trailing only national leader Syracuse and other high-major competitor St. John's. However, the Saints outranked 16 high-major programs nationally, including nine Power 5 teams in Boston College, California, Georgia Tech, Miami, Northwestern, Oregon State, Stanford, USC, and Washington State.

The stellar fan support helped propel Siena to a perfect 14-0 record at the Times Union Center last season, as the Saints were one of just 13 Division I teams nationally to go undefeated at home in 2019-20. Siena achieved an unblemished home mark for the third time in 23 seasons since making the full-time move downtown (17-0 in both 2008-09 and 2009-10), and the 14-game win streak in Albany marks the second longest in program history (38 straight between 2008-10). The Saints won by an average of 11.1 points per game at home this past winter, and trailed for a total of just 14:09 over their final seven games at the Times Union Center.

Siena has now drawn more than 2.5 million fans over 394 all-time games at the Times Union Center, dating back to the program's first home contest in the facility during the 1990-91 season. The Saints welcomed their two-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 vs. Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions. Siena holds a 262-132 (.665) all-time record at the Times Union Center, including a stellar 247-110 (.692) mark since permanently making the facility its home beginning with the 1997-98 season.

Waldorf, Maryland guard Jared Billups and Fort Myers, Florida guard Javian McCollum have both signed and returned their National Letters of Intent during the early signing period, and will enroll at Siena College next fall.

"We are excited to welcome such great young men to our Siena College community who will thrive academically, athletically, and socially," said Maciariello. "We can't wait for Jared and Javian to arrive in Loudonville and don the Green and Gold."

The 6-5, 200-pound Billups stars at the McDonough School, which also produced recent Siena star Evan Fisher '19, and is coached by TJ Jordan who worked alongside current Siena assistant Antoni Wyche when the duo were on staff together at Lehigh. A cousin of five-time NBA All-Star and 2004 NBA Finals MVP Chauncey Billups, he averaged 15.5 points and eight rebounds per game last season. Billups plays his AAU basketball for Team Thrill, under the direction of Donnell "Mookie" Dobbins.

"Jared is a physically ready to play guard who is a triple threat with the basketball," noted Maciariello. "He comes from a fine academic institution, and will be ready to thrive academically in our campus community."
