Siena makes its third appearance (2008, 2013, 2022) in what is now known as the ESPN Events Invitational

The Saints have lost their first seven matchups by an average of 11 points, although five games have come vs. high-major opponents including two against nationally ranked teams

Siena played Purdue twice in this event in 2013, including an un-bracketed game in Indiana

The Saints had been selected to participate in this event in 2020 before it was canceled due to COVID

Siena is 7–12 vs. this year's field, having played Seton Hall (10 times; 4–6) the most



Florida State Series: FSU 1-0 ACC: 7-24

#9 FSU beat Siena 89-80 in the Preseason NIT on Nov. 18, 1992 in Tallahassee in the only previous meeting between the programs. **Sam Cassell** meeting in 1953. The and **Bob Sura** scored 24 points apiece for the Seminoles. Siena is 7-24 vs. the 15 current ACC members, and has dropped three straight (last win: 62-57 vs. Georgia Tech on Dec. 22, 2010 in Albany)



Memphis Series: Memphis 3-1 AAC: 4-8

Memphis beat Siena three times between 2007-17 including once in this event (2013) - after Siena won the first-ever Tigers won the last matchup 70-66 on Dec. 20, 2017 in Memphis. Siena is 4-8 vs. the 11 current AAC members, and has lost five straight (last win: 89-79 vs. Tulane on Mar. 22, 1994 in NIT).



Nebraska Series: 0-0 Big Ten: 3-12

Siena and Nebraska have never met. The Saints are 3-12 vs. the 14 current Big Ten members, including a 2008 NCAA Tournament win over Ohio State. Siena last defeated a Big Ten team, winning 54-52 over Penn State in the College Basketball Invitational on Mar. 24, 2014 in Albany. The Saints also hold a Big Ten win at Northwestern in 1007



Oklahoma

Series: 0-0 Big 12: 0-5

Siena and Oklahoma have never met. Moreover, the Saints have only played three of the 10 current Big 12 members (Iowa State, Kansas, Oklahoma State), and are still in search of their first conference win (o-5). Siena last faced a Big 12 opponent, falling at #7 Kansas 86-65 on Nov. 18, 2016.



Ole Miss

Series: 0-0 SEC: 5-5

Siena and Ole Miss have never met. The Saints are a solid 5-5 all-time vs. the 14 current SEC members, ncluding three wins over Texas A&M between 1946o. Siena bested South . Carolina in the 1991 NIT in Albany, but its biggest win came over Vanderbilt in the 2008 NCAA Tournament in Tampa, when the Saints blasted the 10th ranked Commodores 83-62



Seton Hall

Series: Seton Hall 6-4 Big East: 20-38

The programs have met 10 times, albeit not since 1974, preceding Siena's move to the DI level 1976). Siena's 55-52 win over #9 Seton Hall on Jan. 12, 1952 remains the program's highest-ever win over an AP Top-25 opponent. The Saints have lost 11 straight vs. the 10 current Big East members (last win: 74-59 vs. Villanova on Mar 18 2003 in the NIT).



Stanford Series: Tied 2-2 Pac-12: 3-3

Two of Siena's biggest wins in program history have come vs. Stanford. The Saints upset No. 3 seed and 13th ranked Stanford 30-78 in the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament game on Mar. 16, 1989 in Greensboro, NC. Siena also beat 20th ranked Stanford 79-67 on Nov. 17, 2007 in Albany. Siena's only other win over a current Pac-12 program ame in 1951 vs. Arizona St

Fourth Season 49-31 (.613)



Siena Basketball alumnus has led his alma mater to three straight winning seasons, highlighted by at least a share of a pair of Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Regular Season Championships, and the awarding of an outright MAAC Tournament Championship in his first year

His 39 wins through his first 56 MAAC Regular Season games coached trail only Siena Athletics Hall of Famer Mike Deane (40) for the most in program history, and are tied with former Iona coach Jeff Ruland and Saint Peter's coach Ted Fiore for sixth best start in the league's 42-year history

Finalist for the 2020-21 Hugh Durham (top Division I mid-major coach) and Skip Prosser Man of the Year awards

The only one of the 61 new Division I head coaching hires during the 2019–20 season to lead his team to an outright conference regular season championship

Named one of the "Top-12 Most Immediately Successful Hires of the 2019-20 Season" by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander

Became the first rookie head coach in program history to lead Siena to an outright MAAC Regular Season Championship in his first season, while his 20 wins tied for the most of any first-year Siena head coach

Native of nearby Clifton Park, NY was promoted to be the 18th head coach in program history on Mar. 25, 2019

44-year-old signed a three-year contract extension on Mar. 26, 2021 which runs through the 2025-26

Maciariello and his wife, Laura, are the proud parents of a five-year-old daughter, Reese, a two-year-old son, Matteo, and a newborn son, Caden, who was born last Tuesday

Siena is set to compete in the program's first regular season tournament in four years

The Saints went 2-2 in the Air Force Reserve Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off to open the 2018-19 season

Siena is also playing in its first Thanksgiving Tournament since last appearing in this event in 2013

The Saints are making their first appearance in the State of Florida in six years

Siena fell 73-69 at Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 9, 2016

The Saints have dropped four straight in the Sunshine State, dating back to a 67-60 win at Florida Atlantic on Dec. 28, 2011 Siena enters the ESPN Events Invitational off to a hot start in several key offensive categories

The Saints rank 20th nationally in three-point field goal percentage (.415), 71st in both effective field goal percentage (.553) and rebound margin (+6.5), and 75th in field goal percentage (.478)

Carmen Maciariello takes another crack at securing his miletone 50th head coaching win

Should he achieve the milestone this week, he would be the fifth fastest in program history to reach 50 wins (83 or fewer games) **Mike Deane** (71 games), **Paul Hewitt** (72), **Bill Kirsch** (76), and **Dan Cunha** (78) are the only coaches who reached 50 wins faster Sophomore point guard **Javian McCollum** earned the first MAAC Player of the Week honor of the season

McCollum topped 20 points in each of his first three games this season, highlighted by a career-high 21 vs. Army West Point The Fort Myers, Florida native is averaging 15.8 points and 4.5 assists while shooting an even 50% including 41% from three Siena was predicted to finish sixth according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

The Saints will look to prove the naysayers wrong again, as they have consistently done under head coach Maciariello Siena has finished first, tied for first, and third in the MAAC spanning Maciariello's first three seasons at the helm

The Saints were projected to finish sixth, first, and eighth in those three seasons, respectively

Graduate student Jackson Stormo was named a Preseason Second Team All-MAAC selection

Stormo is Siena's leading returning scorer, rebounder, blocks, and field goal percentage leader from last season Stormo averaged 11.1 points last winter, and ranked fourth in the MAAC in blocks (1.3), sixth in field goal percentage (.536) and eighth in rebounding (6.8)

Stormo scored in double figures 16 times, and recorded his first three collegiate double-doubles Stormo did not play in Monday night's season-opener (back)

Siena posted a 15–14 overall record, and finished third in the MAAC with a 12–8 league mark last season

The Saints went 15-7 in their middle 22 games, losing their first four to open the season as well as their final three contests Siena swept the regular season series from MAAC Tournament Champion and Elite Eight participant Saint Peter's

Siena endured a 29-day gap between games from Dec. 11 - Jan. 9 due to a scheduled 17-day break coupled with a COVID pause.

The 29-day gap between games ended up matching James Madison for the longest nationally

The Saints as a result also went 37 days between home games, tied for the sixth longest streak nationally

Notably, Siena posted identical 8-2 records both on one day's rest as well as in afternoon contests

The Saints were 10-2 when scoring 70 or more points, and 7-1 when out-rebounding the opposition

Siena returns two starters (Stormo and Jared Billups) and 10 letterwinners from last year's team

The Saints welcome back just 50% of their total minutes and only 45% of their scoring from a year ago

Siena lost four of its top-six scorers, headlined by the transfer of leading scorer **Colby Rogers** to Wichita State

Rogers ranked eighth nationally in three-point shooting (.429) and ninth in the MAAC in scoring (14.1)

The Saints welcome seven newcomers to this year's roster, highlighted by the addition of six true freshmen

Twelve of Siena's 17 players are either true freshmen or entering at least their fourth full seasons

Siena's 2022-23 roster also features an international flair, with six foreign-born players representing six different countries

The Saints also boast four Capital Region products, and five total players hailing from the Empire State

Maciariello hasn't named traditional captains for this year's team, however has appointed a pair of leadership groups

Stormo and classmates **Michael Baer** and **Andrew Platek**, and fifth-year **Jayce Johnson**, have been named to the Leadership Council

Sophomores Billups and McCollum have been also been appointed "Next Up" Leaders

Siena posted a 2-1 record on its 10-day, three-game Italian Tour August 18-28 The Saints visited numerous historical landmarks and six cities in the "Bel Paese," in addition to touring The Vatican

Freshman **Michael Eley** burst onto the scene, averaging a team-high 12.0 points (54% shooting) while adding 5.3 rebounds

Maciariello has gotten off to a fast start since taking of the reins of his alma mater

He has led Siena to at least a share of a pair of MAAC Regular Season Championships and a Tournament title in his first season

He has three straight winning seasons overall, as well as a trio of top-three MAAC finishes
His 39 wins through his first 56 MAAC Regular Season games coached trail only Deane (40) for
the most in program history, and are tied with former Iona coach Jeff Ruland and Saint Peter's coach

Ted Fiore for the sixth best start in the league's 42-year history Siena has achieved four straight top-three league finishes

The Saints are a league-best 50-23 (.685) in MAAC Regular Season action since the start of the 2018-19 season

Siena's 331 all-time MAAC Regular Season wins are second only to Iona (419), who entered the conference eight years prior

The Saints have more MAAC wins than Fairfield, Manhattan, and Saint Peter's, despite joining the league eight years after each of those three rivals

Siena and MVP Arena

Officially renamed on Jan. 1, 2022, MVP Arena in downtown Albany has served as the exclusive home court for Siena Men's Basketball since 1997. Over that time, Siena's attendance has soared to new heights, bringing national acclaim to the mid-major program that competes in a major basketball setting. The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance for 24 consecutive seasons, and boasted the nation's top average attendance amongst all 56 Northeast mid-major programs twice in a row.

For the second time in a row, Siena Men's Basketball boasted the nation's top average home attendance among the 56 Northeast midmajor programs, according to the 2021–22 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Attendance Report. Overall, the Saints were 85th in the country out of 358 Division I programs in average home attendance last winter, ranking in the top–100 nationally for the 24th consecutive season.

Siena's average home attendance of 5,519 over 13 dates during the 2021-22 season was an average of 705 fans per game more – and seven spots higher in the overall national rankings – than their closest Northeast mid-major competitor Rhode Island (4,814, 92nd). The Northeast comprises nine states according to the United States Census Bureau: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. Mid-major teams are defined as programs from the 25 conferences which do not comprise "high majors," which are the Power 5 (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and SEC), AAC, and Big East.

Siena finished in the top-90 nationally in average home attendance for the second straight time, after ranking 83rd during the 2019-20 season. The Saints' now 24-season streak of ranking in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance has coincided with the program's full-time move downtown to what is now known as MVP Arena beginning in 1997-98.

The 24-season run does not include the 2020-21 COVID impacted season in which fans were not permitted to attend most if not all games nationwide due to the pandemic. Despite some restrictions still being in place for a large chunk of the 2021-22 campaign which had a modest effect on attendance early in the season, Siena closed out its home slate with four consecutive crowds in excess of 6,000 spectators for an average of 6,291 fans following a relaxation of measures in mid-February.

Siena's average home attendance once again out-ranked the NCAA average, as the Saints bested the national mark of 4,313 by 28%. Siena ranked ahead of 17 high-major programs in average home attendance, including nine Power Five schools in Boston College (ACC), California (Pac-12), Georgia Tech (ACC), Miami (ACC), Northwestern (Big Ten), Oregon State (Pac-12), Stanford (Pac-12), USC (Pac-12), and Washington State (Pac-12).

Overall, Siena ranked 14th nationally in average home attendance out of 285 mid-major programs. The Saints once again ranked third overall in the State of New York, trailing only national leader Syracuse and Big East program St. John's amongst the 22 Division I teams which comprise the Empire State.

The Saints have now drawn 2,641,092 fans over 409 all-time games at MVP Arena – an average of 6,457 spectators per contest – dating back to the program's first home game in the facility during the 1990–91 season. Siena welcomed their two-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 vs. Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions. Siena Men's Basketball Head Coach Carmen Maciariello has officially announced the program's first two signings for the Class of 2027. Virginia forward Michael Ojo and Kansas guard Bralyn Smith have both signed and returned their National Letters of Intent, and will enroll at Siena College next fall.

A 6–8 forward from Virginia Beach, Virginia, Ojo starred at Princess Anne High School before transferring to Moravian Prep in Atlanta to play for head coach Jeremy Ellis this winter. He earned All–Beach District Boys All–Class 4A Region Second Team honors while playing for coach Corey Coffer and the Cavaliers last season. Ojo plays his AAU basketball for the prestigious Boo Williams program under the direction of coaches Ted Miller and Boo Williams.

"Michael is a 6–8 athletic combo forward with a 6–9 wingspan who competes at the highest level," said Maciariello. "He can score both inside and out, and thrives attacking the rim. Michael hails from Virginia, and played for the prestigious Nike EYBL program Boo Williams, and Moravian Prep out of Atlanta."

Originally from Topeka, Kansas, Smith is a 6–5 guard who competes for St. Benedict's Prep in Newark, New Jersey for coaches Mark Taylor, Reef Atanda, and Dave Ulak, which finished last season ranked 22nd nationally by USA Today. Rated a three-star prospect and ranked as the 52nd best shooting guard in his class nationally by 247 Sports, he currently resides in Grand Prairie, Texas – a suburb of Dallas – where he starred for the Texas Alliance of Christian Athletes (T.A.C.A) the past two seasons under the direction of coach Ani Umana. Smith plays on the Under Armour circuit for Texas Impact and coach TJ Thomas, where he shot 40% from three this past season.

"Bralyn is a big scoring guard and a three-level scorer who is driven both athletically and academically," said Maciariello. 


