Of Note

Siena has won eight straight, sweeping the regular season series each of the past four years. The Saints have held Fairfield to an average of just 56.3 points during the win streak. The Stags are in search of their first win in the series since Feb. 21, 2018 (70-69 in Albany). Siena has won five straight on Fairfield's campus dating back to 1999. Head coach **Carmen Maciariello** was an assistant at Fairfield under **Ed Cooley** from 2008-11. Maciariello is 6-0 vs. Fairfield. **Jay Young** is 0-6 vs. Siena.

Last Meeting

Siena held Fairfield to just 39% shooting (3-18 from three). The Saints led for 38 minutes, but never by double figures. **Anthony Gaines** led Siena with 15 points and eight rebounds. **Taj Benning** was the lone Stag in double figures with 10 points.

Now in their 34th season as a MAAC member, Siena has won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and six MAAC Tournament titles (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2020) 373-273 (.577) all-time overall in MAAC competition 333-247 (.574) all-time in MAAC Regular Season action 431-364 (.542) all-time vs. the 10 other programs which currently comprise the MAAC. League-best 52-24 (.684) in MAAC Regular Season since 2018-19. Maciariello is 42-19 (.688) overall vs. MAAC competition.

Siena Basketball alumnus has led his alma mater to three straight winning seasons, highlighted by at least a share of a pair of Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Regular Season Championships, and the awarding of an outright MAAC Tournament Championship in his first year.

His 39 wins through his first 56 MAAC Regular Season games coached trail only Siena Athletics Hall of Famer Mike Deane (40) for the most in program history, and are tied with former Iona coach Jeff Ruland and Saint Peter's coach Ted Fiore for sixth best start in the league's 42-year history.

Finalist for the 2020-21 Hugh Durham (top Division I mid-major coach) and Skip Prosser Man of the Year awards.

The only one of the 61 new Division I head coaching hires during the 2019-20 season to lead his team to an outright conference regular season championship.

Named one of the "Top-12 Most Immediately Successful Hires of the 2019-20 Season" by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander.

Became the first rookie head coach in program history to lead Siena to an outright MAAC Regular Season Championship in his first season, while his 20 wins tied for the most of any first-year Siena head coach.

Native of nearby Clifton Park, NY was promoted to be the 18th head coach in program history on Mar. 25, 2019.

44-year-old signed a three-year contract extension on Mar. 26, 2021 which runs through the 2025-26 season.

Maciariello and his wife, Laura, are the proud parents of a five-year-old daughter, Reese, a two-year-old son, Matteo, and a newborn son, Caden, who was born on Nov. 8.

Siena looks to ring in the New Year this afternoon

The Saints are playing in just the program's fifth New Year's Day game (82nd season), having posted an even 2-2 record

Siena is playing in its first New Year's Day game in five years (lost 71-70 vs. Quinnipiac on New Year's Day 2018 in Albany)

The Saints defeated Fairfield 87-81 on New Year's Day 2009 in Albany

Siena concluded the 2022 calendar year with a 19-13 record

The Saints enter the New Year riding a season long three-game win streak

A win would match the longest win streak since winning a program record-tying 16 in a row from Feb. 7, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021

Siena looks to complete the sweep of their season long three-game road trip this afternoon

The Saints had dropped their first three true road games this season before winning the past two

Siena also concludes a stretch today where they play nine of 11 away from home

The Saints have already clinched a winning record during their grueling 11-game stretch, posting a 6-4 mark

Siena's victory over Canisius on Dec. 2 marked the team's lone home game during a 33-day stretch

The Saints resumed conference action for good with Friday's victory at Quinnipiac

Siena had tipped off their 34th season of Metro Atlantic Athletic competition with a 74-70 victory over Canisius on Dec. 2

Dec. 2 marked the Saints' earliest calendar MAAC opener since the 2011-12 season (Dec. 1, 2011)

Following the win over the Golden Griffins, Siena wrapped up non-conference action with four straight games

The Saints won their third straight MAAC road-opener Friday night after having dropped their previous six straight

Siena finished non-conference play with their first winning record in seven years

At 6-5, the Saints secured their first winning non-conference record since going 7-4 during the 2015-16 non-conference season

Siena had posted just a 19-34 (.358) non-conference record between 2016-22

The Saints secured the program's third straight winning December (4-2) with Friday's win over the Bobcats

Siena has now posted a 9-4 record in the month of December under head coach **Carmen Maciariello**

The Saints also previously achieved their first winning November (4-3) in seven years since going 4-2 in November 2015

Friday's game marked Siena's first in eight days since ending American's eight-game win streak on Nov. 22 in Washington, DC

The Saints also went eight days - matching a season long - between Dec. 11 at Delaware and Dec. 19 vs. St. Bonaventure

Freshman guard **Michael Eley** was named the MAAC Rookie of the Week for the second time on Monday

The Fort Wayne, Indiana product averaged 13.0 points and 1.5 steals last week in wins over St. Bonaventure and American

Eley is the first Saint to earn multiple MAAC Rookie of the Week honors since **Jalen Pickett** won a league-record 11 in 2018-19

Siena ranks in the top-50 nationally in both free throw percentage (.759 - 32nd) and three-point field goal percentage (.376 - 46th)

The Saints are shooting a scintillating 80.4% (160-199) from the charity stripe over the past 11 games

Three players - **Javian McCollum** (.869 - 4th), **Jackson Stormo** (.787 - 8th), and **Jared Billups** (.761 - 9th) - rank in the top-eight in the MAAC in free throw percentage

Andrew Platek leads the MAAC in both three-point field goal percentage (.492) and made threes (31)

The Saints have made nine or more threes six times, shooting 40% or better in five of those six contests

Siena also ranks amongst the national leaders in blocks per game (4.5 - 55th)

Stormo ranks third in the MAAC in blocks (1.6)

The Saints have been paced so far by the breakout season from McCollum

The two-time MAAC Player of the Week (Nov. 14, Nov. 28) ranks second in the MAAC in scoring (17.9), fourth in both assists (4.1) and free throw percentage (.869), and eighth in made threes (24)

The sophomore point guard has already scored 20+ points seven times, highlighted by a career-high 27 vs. Canisius (Dec. 2)

McCollum averaged just 6.7 points in 18.2 minutes over 23 games played during an injury-plagued freshman season

McCollum scored 25 points Friday in his first game in 11 days following a one-game absence due to injury

The Saints are a perfect 7-0 when holding the opposition to 70 or fewer points

Siena is 6-1 when holding the opposition to under 50% shooting

The Saints are a stellar 52-18 (.743) under head coach Maciariello when holding teams under 50% from the field

Siena is 6-1 when committing 15 turnovers or fewer

The Saints are 6-2 in games decided by seven points or less

The Saints swept the MAAC Weekly Awards on Nov. 28 for the first time in two seasons

McCollum earned MAAC Player of the Week honors, while Eley was heralded as the MAAC Rookie of the Week

The Saints had last swept MAAC Weekly honors on Jan. 18, 2021 (**Jordan King** - Player, **Colin Golson, Jr.** - Rookie)

Maciariello secured his milestone 50th head coaching victory with a Thanksgiving Day win over Florida State

He became the fifth fastest (81 games) in program history to reach the feat

(**Mike Deane** - 71, **Paul Hewitt** - 72, **Bill Kirsch** - 76, **Dan Cunha** - 78)

Maciariello has gotten off to a fast start since taking of the reins of his alma mater

He has led Siena to at least a share of a pair of MAAC Regular Season

Championships and a Tournament title in his first season

He has three straight winning seasons overall, as well as a trio of top-three

MAAC finishes

His 41 wins through his first 58 MAAC Regular Season games coached marks

the best start in program history and fourth best start in the conference's 43-year history

Siena achieved an historic performance Thanksgiving Weekend at the prestigious ESPN Events Invitational

The only non-high major in the eight-team field, the Saints captured third place to match the best-ever MAAC finish in the event (Monmouth – 2015, Marist – 2006)

Siena secured high-major wins over both Florida State (ACC) and Seton Hall (BIG EAST)

The Saints have defeated multiple high-major programs in the same regular season for the first time since turning DI in 1976-77

Siena has multiple high-major wins in the same season for the first time since 2007-08 (Stanford, Vanderbilt – NCAA)

The Florida State win was the Saints' first over a high-major since a 54-52 win vs. Penn State (Big Ten) on Mar. 24, 2014

The FSU win was Siena's first vs. an ACC foe since a 62-57 triumph vs. Georgia Tech on Dec. 22, 2010 in Albany

The 17-point (80-63) win over FSU was the Saints' largest margin of victory over a high-major since a 21-point (83-62) win over Vanderbilt on Mar. 21, 2008 in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament

Siena snapped an 11-game losing streak vs. the 11 current BIG EAST members with their win over Seton Hall

The victory was the first over a current BIG EAST team since a 74-59 win vs. Villanova on Mar. 18, 2003 in the NIT
Siena was predicted to finish sixth according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

The Saints will look to prove the naysayers wrong again, as they have consistently done under head coach **Carmen Maciariello**

Siena has finished first, tied for first, and third in the MAAC spanning Maciariello's first three seasons at the helm

The Saints were projected to finish sixth, first, and eighth in those three seasons, respectively

Graduate student **Jackson Stormo** was named a Preseason Second Team All-MAAC selection

Stormo is Siena's leading returning scorer, rebounder, blocks, and field goal percentage leader from last season

Stormo averaged 11.1 points last winter, and ranked fourth in the MAAC in blocks (1.3), sixth in field goal percentage (.536) and eighth in rebounding (6.8)

Stormo scored in double figures 16 times, and recorded his first three collegiate double-doubles

Siena has won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and claimed six MAAC Tournament titles

The Saints are 373-273 (.577) all-time overall in MAAC competition, including 333-247 (.574) in regular season action

Siena's 333 all-time MAAC Regular Season wins are second only to Iona (422), who entered the conference eight years prior

The Saints have more wins than Manhattan, Saint Peter's, and Fairfield, despite joining the MAAC eight years after each of those three league rivals

Siena has achieved four straight top-three league finishes

The Saints are a league-best 52-24 (.684) in MAAC Regular Season action since 2018-19

Siena returns two starters (Stormo and **Jared Billups**) and 10 letterwinners from last year's team

The Saints welcome back just 50% of their minutes and only 45% of their scoring from last year

Siena lost four of its top-six scorers, headlined by the transfer of leading scorer **Colby Rogers** to Wichita State

Rogers ranked eighth nationally in three-point shooting (.429) and ninth in the MAAC in scoring (14.1)

The Saints welcome seven newcomers to this year's roster, highlighted by the addition of six true freshmen

Twelve of Siena's 17 players are either true freshmen or entering at least their fourth full seasons

Siena's 2022-23 roster also features an international flair, with six foreign-born players representing six different countries

The Saints also boast four Capital Region products, and five total players hailing from the Empire State

Maciariello hasn't named traditional captains for this year's team, however has appointed a pair of leadership groups

Stormo and classmates **Michael Baer** and **Andrew Platek**, and fifth-year **Jayce Johnson**, have been named to the Leadership Council

Sophomores Billups and McCollum have been also been appointed "Next Up" Leaders

Siena posted a 2-1 record on its 10-day, three-game Italian Tour August 18-28

The Saints visited numerous historical landmarks and six cities in the "Bel Paese," in addition to touring The Vatican

Freshman **Michael Eley** burst onto the scene, averaging a team-high 12.0 points (54% shooting) while adding 5.3 rebounds

Siena posted a 15-14 overall record, and finished third in the MAAC with a 12-8 league mark last season

The Saints went 15-7 in their middle 22 games, losing their first four to open the season as well as their final three contests

Siena swept the regular season series from MAAC Tournament Champion and Elite Eight participant Saint Peter's

Siena endured a 29-day gap between games from Dec. 11 – Jan. 9 due to a scheduled 17-day break coupled with a COVID pause

The 29-day gap between games ended up matching James Madison for the longest nationally

The Saints as a result also went 37 days between home games, tied for the sixth longest streak nationally

Notably, Siena posted identical 8-2 records both on one day's rest as well as in afternoon contests

The Saints were 10-2 when scoring 70 or more points, and 7-1 when out-rebounding the opposition

Last Time Out: Siena 83, Quinnipiac 76 (Dec. 30 - Hamden, CT)

Siena exploded for 52 second half points on 58% shooting

The game featured 12 ties and 11 lead changes

The Saints broke a 67-all tie with a late 10-2 run starting with 3:33 to go

Javian McCollum scored a game-high 25 points - just two off his career-high - on 9-15 shooting in his return from injury

Andrew Platek scored all 19 of his points in the second on 7-12 shooting (3-4 from three) and was a game-high +19

Siena shot 49% vs. the MAAC's top field goal percentage defense (.403) and committed a season-low seven turnovers (came in averaging 14.9)

The Saints posted season-highs in both fastbreak points with 16 (came in averaging 4.3 - fifth fewest nationally) and points in the paint with 48 (came in averaging 28.7)

Officially renamed on Jan. 1, 2022, MVP Arena in downtown Albany has served as the exclusive home court for Siena Men's Basketball since 1997. Over that time, Siena's attendance has soared to new heights, bringing national acclaim to the mid-major program that competes in a major basketball setting. The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance for 24 consecutive seasons, and boasted the nation's top average attendance amongst all 56 Northeast mid-major programs twice in a row.

For the second time in a row, Siena Men's Basketball boasted the nation's top average home attendance among the 56 Northeast mid-major programs, according to the 2021-22 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Attendance Report. Overall, the Saints were 85th in the country out of 358 Division I programs in average home attendance last winter, ranking in the top-100 nationally for the 24th consecutive season.

Siena's average home attendance of 5,519 over 13 dates during the 2021-22 season was an average of 705 fans per game more – and seven spots higher in the overall national rankings – than their closest Northeast mid-major competitor Rhode Island (4,814, 92nd). The Northeast comprises nine states according to the United States Census Bureau: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. Mid-major teams are defined as programs from the 25 conferences which do not comprise "high majors," which are the Power 5 (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and SEC), AAC, and Big East.

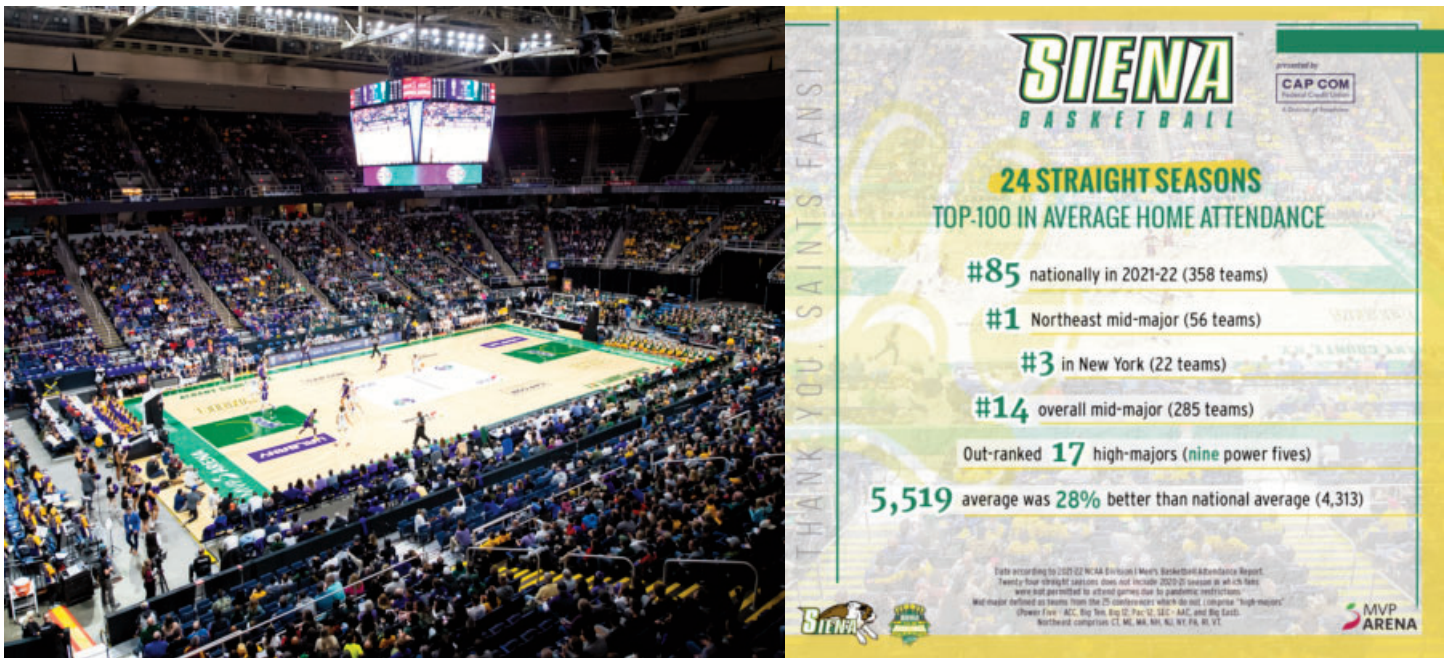
Siena finished in the top-90 nationally in average home attendance for the second straight time, after ranking 83rd during the 2019-20 season. The Saints' now 24-season streak of ranking in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance has coincided with the program's full-time move downtown to what is now known as MVP Arena beginning in 1997-98.

The 24-season run does not include the 2020-21 COVID impacted season in which fans were not permitted to attend most if not all games nationwide due to the pandemic. Despite some restrictions still being in place for a large chunk of the 2021-22 campaign which had a modest effect on attendance early in the season, Siena closed out its home slate with four consecutive crowds in excess of 6,000 spectators for an average of 6,291 fans following a relaxation of measures in mid-February.

Siena's average home attendance once again out-ranked the NCAA average, as the Saints bested the national mark of 4,313 by 28%. Siena ranked ahead of 17 high-major programs in average home attendance, including nine Power Five schools in Boston College (ACC), California (Pac-12), Georgia Tech (ACC), Miami (ACC), Northwestern (Big Ten), Oregon State (Pac-12), Stanford (Pac-12), USC (Pac-12), and Washington State (Pac-12).

Overall, Siena ranked 14th nationally in average home attendance out of 285 mid-major programs. The Saints once again ranked third overall in the State of New York, trailing only national leader Syracuse and Big East program St. John's amongst the 22 Division I teams which comprise the Empire State.

The Saints have now drawn 2,652,117 fans over 411 all-time games at MVP Arena – an average of 6,453 spectators per contest – dating back to the program's first home game in the facility during the 1990-91 season. Siena welcomed their two-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 vs. Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions. The Saints hold a 273-138 (.664) all-time record at MVP Arena, including a stellar 258-116 (.690) mark since permanently making the facility its home beginning with the 1997-98 season.

Siena Men's Basketball Head Coach Carmen Maciariello has officially announced the program's first two signings for the Class of 2027. Virginia forward Michael Ojo and Kansas guard Bralyn Smith have both signed and returned their National Letters of Intent, and will enroll at Siena College next fall.

A 6-8 forward from Virginia Beach, Virginia, Ojo starred at Princess Anne High School before transferring to Moravian Prep in Atlanta to play for head coach Jeremy Ellis this winter. He earned All-Beach District Boys All-Class 4A Region Second Team honors while playing for coach Corey Coffey and the Cavaliers last season. Ojo plays his AAU basketball for the prestigious Boo Williams program under the direction of coaches Ted Miller and Boo Williams.

"Michael is a 6-8 athletic combo forward with a 6-9 wingspan who competes at the highest level," said Maciariello. "He can score both inside and out, and thrives attacking the rim. Michael hails from Virginia, and played for the prestigious Nike EYBL program Boo Williams, and Moravian Prep out of Atlanta."

Originally from Topeka, Kansas, Smith is a 6-5 guard who competes for St. Benedict's Prep in Newark, New Jersey for coaches Mark Taylor, Reef Atanda, and Dave Ulak, which finished last season ranked 22nd nationally by USA Today. Rated a three-star prospect and ranked as the 52nd best shooting guard in his class nationally by 247 Sports, he currently resides in Grand Prairie, Texas – a suburb of Dallas – where he starred for the Texas Alliance of Christian Athletes (T.A.C.A) the past two seasons under the direction of coach Ani Umana. Smith plays on the Under Armour circuit for Texas Impact and coach TJ Thomas, where he shot 40% from three this past season.

"Bralyn is a big scoring guard and a three-level scorer who is driven both athletically and academically," said Maciariello. "He plays for prep power St. Benedict's coached by Mark Taylor and his tremendous staff, and ran with Texas Impact on the Under Armour circuit. We can't wait to build with Bralyn."

Neither team made a free throw in the game, while combining for just three attempts. It marked the first time in 18 years – Dec. 10, 2000 at Marist (0-5) – that Siena failed to make a free throw

Siena failed to convert a 3-pointer: Siena missed all eight of its three-point attempts in an 80-73 loss vs. Canisius on Feb. 4, 2017 at MVP Arena. It marked the second time in 20 games in which the Saints were held without a three, after having gone the previous 221 games without a miss.

Siena did not miss a free-throw: Siena went a perfect 4-4 from the free throw line in an 83-65 loss at Georgetown on Nov. 19, 2021. It marked the first time in 14 years in which Siena was perfect from the charity stripe (11-11 vs. Saint Peter's on Feb. 4, 2007)

Siena player had a triple-double: Kojo Mensah had 20 points, 14 rebounds and 11 assists in Siena's 82-74 OT win over UAlbany on Dec. 3, 2005

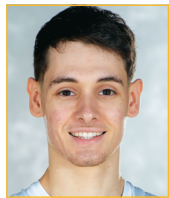

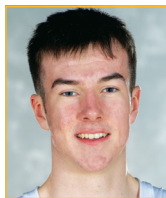

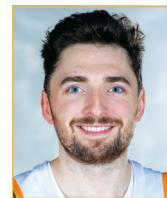
