I am happy to present our 2022-23 Siena College Athletics Annual Report to Siena alumni, supporters, fans, and Saints across the Capital Region and beyond!

Siena Athletics not only continued to "Build Better Saints" during the 2022-23 year, but continued to instill a winning culture by taking home two team and seven individual MAAC Championships. Men's Tennis and Men's Golf won each program's first and fifth conference titles, respectively, and had the distinction of claiming both championships on the same day. Individually, our cross country and track program won six MAAC titles across all three seasons, and we



took home an individual title in diving during the MAAC Swimming & Diving Championships. This year's annual report theme of "Together We Win" reinforces that a winning culture and winning in the classroom equates to winning on the field of play.

Thanks to valuable resources such as The Bob Guido '68 Athletic Academic Center, our more than 360 student athletes achieved yet

another record-setting year in the classroom, generating a record 3.4 cumulative GPA, once again higher than Siena's non-student athlete GPA of 3.26. A record 242 student athletes made the MAAC Academic Honor Roll to set a department high for the sixth straight year, while a record 69 Saints achieved a perfect 4.0 GPA during either the fall or spring semester. Our department boasted a MAAC-high six programs with a perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR), and matched our highest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in nine years at 94 percent.

Your generous support of Siena Athletics through giving to the Saints Alive! Athletic Fund and attending important fundraisers such as the Saints Alive! Golf Shootout and the Siena Basketball Program Enhancement Reception reinforces our student athletes' success in all facets of their lives, and ensures that **Together We Win** at Siena College.

Saints March On (SMO) launched in January 2023 as the exclusive Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) collective for Siena College student athletes. Founded by Siena supporters **Frank Ambrose '85**, **Sheila Ambrose**, and **Matt Moberg '09**, the collective allows Siena's student athletes to embrace the changing collegiate NIL landscape by earning compensation for their NIL through donations and business partnerships. SMO also works closely with Siena Athletics on educational programs related to NIL and associated regulations, including compliance and disclosure requirements.



Siena's UHY Center received much-needed technology upgrades in December 2022 with the addition of NEVCO video boards, LED sideline tables, a new scoreboard, and new game clocks, as well as video replay system upgrades. The additions were made possible thanks to a generous donation from Siena Volleyball alumni **Lisa (Copeland) Moser '97** and her husband, **Robert Moser**, and provide an enhanced gameday experience for Siena's Women's Basketball and Volleyball programs.



Siena Athletics partnered with Hannoush Jewelers as the department's "official sponsor of Siena Women's Athletics" for the 2022-23 season, marking the first sponsorship of its kind in department history. The partnership provided resources toward the marketing and promotion of Siena's 12 female NCAA Division I programs.



MEN'S TENNIS CLAIMS FIRST MAAC TITLE

13-11, 4-2 MAAC - MAAC Tri-Regular-Season Champions - MAAC Tournament Champions

- Claimed the program's first MAAC title as the No. 3 seed in the MAAC Tournament with a 4-3 win over #2 Quinnipiac and a 4-0 win over #1 Fairfield
- Junior **Dante Russo** named the MAAC Player of the Year and freshman **Edward Vo** named the MAAC Rookie of the Year during the regular season, while head coach **Jeff Osborn** was voted the MAAC Coach of the Year. Junior **Juan Pablo Davila** was named the 2023 MAAC Tournament MVP
- Advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history, facing off against nationally-ranked Harvard

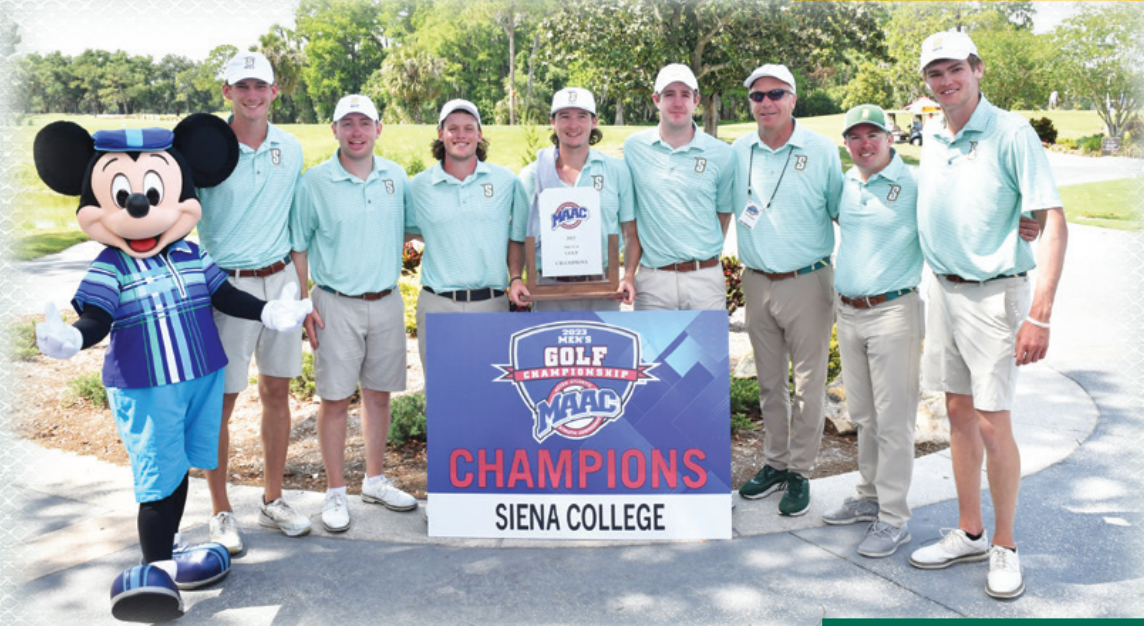
MEN'S GOLF BACK ON TOP

- Advanced to the program's fourth NCAA Regional, competing in Auburn, Alabama

- Senior **Brandon Olden '23** completed a three-peat in the MAAC men's outdoor 10k

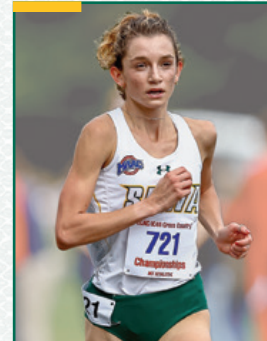

MARCHING THROUGH 2022-23



Men's Lacrosse (9-7, 5-4 MAAC)

- 2023 MAAC Runner-Up after advancing to the MAAC Championship Game for the first time in nine years
- Boasted a 6-1 home record and hosted the first-ever MAAC postseason men's lacrosse match at Hickey Field, defeating Sacred Heart in the MAAC Quarterfinals
- Defenseman **Trevor Marsala '24** named First Team All-MAAC and All-ECAC, while defenseman **Brian Mack '24**, midfielder **Christian Watts '22, G '23**, and goalkeeper **Chris Yanchoris '22, G '23** earned Second Team honors



Men's Basketball (17-15, 11-9 MAAC)

- Secured the program's fourth consecutive top-three MAAC finish (t-third) and finished ahead of its selection in the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll for the fourth time in as many years under head coach **Carmen Maciariello '01**
- Defeated crosstown rival UAlbany in the return of the Albany Cup and regained the Franciscan Cup over sister school St. Bonaventure
- Collected wins over high-majors Florida State and Seton Hall at the ESPN Events Invitational
- **Jackson Stormo '22, G'23** earned Second Team All-MAAC honors, while **Javian McCollum** took home Third Team honors, and MAAC Rookie of the Year **Michael Eley '26** was named to the MAAC All-Rookie Team
- Went 8-5 at home while welcoming an average 6,415 fans to MVP Arena for the highest yearly attendance average since 2011-12



Women's Lacrosse (12-7, 6-2 MAAC)

- Advanced to the MAAC Championship Game for the third time in the last four seasons while securing a top-three regular-season finish for the fourth straight year
- Siena all-time leading goal scorer **Mary Soures '23** and senior defender **Jenna Colabufio '23** named First Team All-MAAC, while attacker **Jordan Bentley '24** named Second Team All-MAAC

Women's Basketball (19-13, 12-8 MAAC)

- Finished fourth in the MAAC despite being selected ninth in the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll, advancing to the MAAC Semifinals for the first time in five years
- Boasted the MAAC Rookie of the Year in **Elisa Mevius '26**, who also earned Third Team All-MAAC and MAAC All-Rookie Team honors, while **Anajah Brown '25** earned Third Team All-MAAC honors and **Teresa Seppala '26** was named to the MAAC All-Rookie Team
- Compiled the program's most wins in eight years while matching the most home victories (11) in 21 seasons
- Boasted the top scoring offense in the MAAC with an average of 67.9 points per game



Men's Soccer (8-5-6, 4-2-4 MAAC)

- Earned postseason berth for the third time in as many seasons under head coach **Graciano Brito**
- Boasted the MAAC Goalkeeper of the Year for the second time in program history in **Greg Monroe '22, G'23**, who also took home First Team All-MAAC honors to headline a league-leading six All-MAAC selections



Softball (32-21, 11-9 MAAC)

- Matched the program win record with 32 victories for the second straight season, earning a postseason berth for the third straight season under head coach **Casey Bump**
- **Ava Fitzmaurice G'23** became the program's first-ever NFCA First Team All-Region selection and took home All-MAAC honors (Second Team) along with outfielder **Isabella Pardo '24** and All-Rookie Team selection **Alissa Eimont '26**



Swimming & Diving (9-5, Sixth MAAC)

- Matched the program's most dual-meet wins in 13 years while going a perfect 2-0 against MAAC dual-meet opponents
- Highlighted by the program's first MAAC individual champion since 2011 in one-meter diving champion **Talia Spenziro '24**, took home seven All-MAAC finishes, including **Rory Kalac '23, G'24** in the 50 free (pictured)



Volleyball (13-17, 10-8 MAAC)

- Advanced to the MAAC Semifinals under first-year head coach **Simone Asque-Favia** despite being selected seventh in the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll
- Turned in a six-win improvement from the previous season, highlighted by Second Team All-MAAC selections for outside hitter **Sara Wagner '25** and right-side hitter **Emily Wunder G'23**





June 6, 2022 | Baseball head coach Tony Rossi accepts a special award from Siena President Dr. Chris Gibson '86 for 55 years of service to the Athletic Department. Rossi – who began at Siena as an assistant lacrosse coach in 1967 –retired in March 2023 after 54 seasons at the helm of the program as the winningest coach in MAAC history in any sport and tied for the second-longest tenured baseball head coach in NCAA history

Franz's battle with brain cancer would unfortunately come to an end on January 23, 2023 at the age of 18.



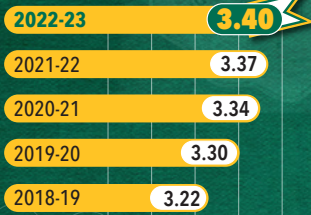

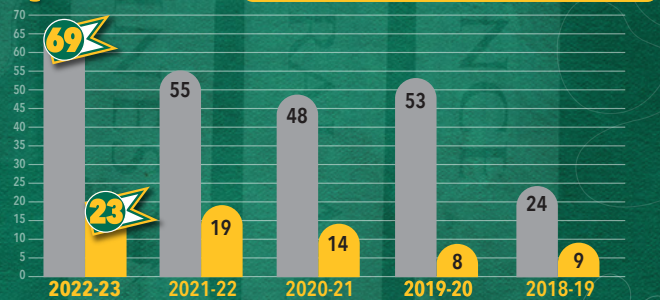


STUDENT ATHLETE OVERALL CUMULATIVE GPA

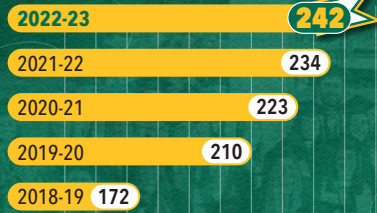

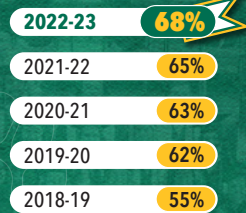

Accounting for over half of the department's operating budget, the Saints Alive! Annual Fund has continued to trend upward following the return of in-person programming over the last two years. This year's success came as a result of the generosity of the Siena community and support of several impactful fundraising events. Saints Alive! has raised more than \$9 million toward the enhancement of Siena Athletics since its inception in 1995.



The milestone 25th Anniversary Saints Alive! Shootout at the Edison Club in nearby Rexford drew roughly 150 golfers and, once again, raised a record amount toward the Saints Alive! Annual Fund on September 12. The event featured a round of golf, reception, raffle prizes, and interaction with Siena Athletics student athletes and coaches.



Siena Athletics saw a record \$55,000 raised for the Siena Men's and Women's Basketball programs at the annual Saints Alive! Athletic Fund Program Enhancement Reception held at 677 Prime in downtown Albany on January 20.
