Series Records - USF trails Augustana, 41-37

USF MBB WILL HOST CITY RIVAL AUGUSTANA

SIOUX FALLS – The University of Sioux Falls Men’s Basketball Team (11-12, 7-10 NSIC) wraps up the regular season with a home match up against No. 5 Augustana (21-2, 15-2 NSIC) on Senior Night on Thursday, Feb. 17 at 7:30 pm. USF will conclude the regular season at Wayne State (13-10, 10-7 NSIC) on Saturday, Feb. 19 at 5:30 pm.

USF is 7-10 in the NSIC which places them seventh in the South Division with the top six teams qualifying for the NSIC Tournament beginning on Feb. 23. To qualify, USF will have to win twice and receive help.

USF TO HONOR THREE SENIORS TONIGHT

Before the start of the game, USF Head Coach Chris Johnson and staff will recognize its three seniors including Marko Coudreau, Austin Slater and Matt Cartwright.

Coudreau, a senior business administration major from Marseille, France, has 143 career points, 65 rebounds and made 18 three-pointers. He has a career-high of 13 points at Minnesota State on Dec. 17, 2021. He is the son of Cyril and Ivanka Coudreau.

Austin Slater of Andover, Minn., who is enrolled in the Master of Business

Administration program, is a three-time Academic All-NSIC honoree who has played in 123 games at USF - the 5th most in program history. He has accumulated 602 points with 663 rebounds for 11th all-time. The son of Curt and Kim Slater, he has a career-high of 22 points and 17 rebounds. He has five double-doubles, 14 double-digit scoring games and 12 double-digit rebound games while leading USF in rebounding 21 times.

Matt Cartwright, the son of Jen and Bill Cartwright of Sioux Falls, S.D, is the leading scorer in the NSIC, All-NSIC honoree, and a guard who is averaging 19.4 ppg with 1,225 career points. He has 11 20-point games at USF and 22 in his career with 55 career-double-digit scoring games. Cartwright has four games of 30 points or more in his career and 15 times this season led the Cougars in scoring.

USF is directed by school career wins leader (251 overall, 235 at USF) Chris Johnson, who won his 100th career NSIC game against Concordia St. Paul, 80-69 on Dec. 18, 2021. He earned his 250th career win with a 73-47 decision over Minnesota Crookston.

Through 23 games, USF ranks 12th in the NSIC with 71.7 ppg and allows 73.6

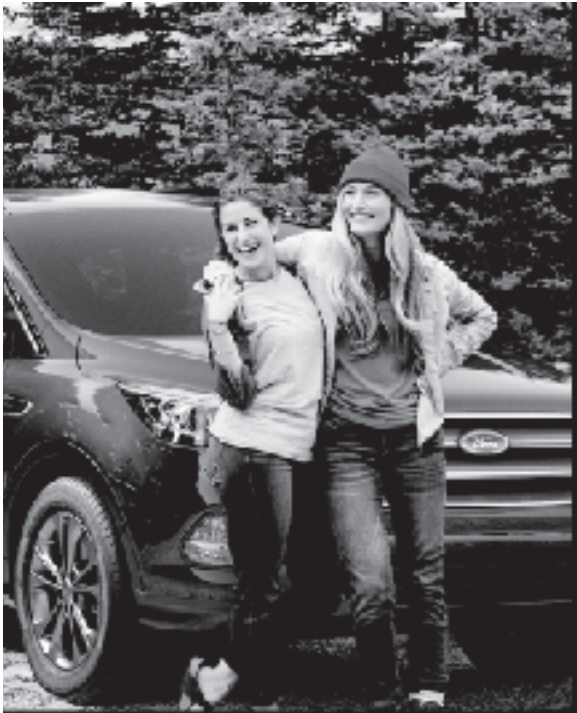

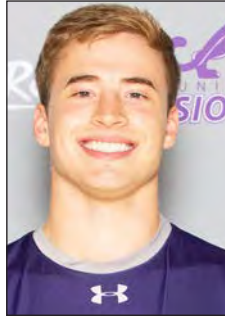

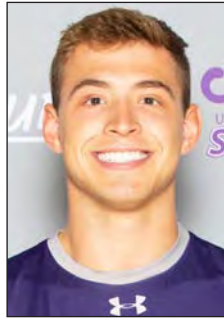

USF Men's Head Basketball Coach

Chris Johnson

Head Coach - 15th Season\14th at USF

Central College '98
Record At USF - 235-168 (.583)
Overall Record - 251-183 (.578)



USF Head Men's Basketball Coach Chris Johnson, who was named the NSIC Coach of the Year in the history-making 2019-20 season, is in his 14th season (15th overall) at the helm of the men's basketball program. Since taking over as the program's 22nd coach in 2008, Johnson has guided the Cougars to six 20-win seasons, three post-season appearances, two conference tournament championships and one regular season conference crown. In the Covid-impacted 2020-21 season, USF finished 7-5 overall and 5-5 in league. In 2019-20, USF had a program-best 22-8 overall record and captured its first-ever Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference South Division title. With a 17-5 mark, USF, which finished second overall and earned the No. 1 seed in the South in the NSIC Postseason Tourney, registered the program's top record in NSIC play. As a result, Johnson was named the NSIC Coach of the Year for the first time.

During Johnson's tenure at USF, he is 235-168 (.583), with a 73-69 win (Feb. 18, 2017) at Concordia St. Paul making him the program's career wins leader. He is 251-183 (.581) overall. He registered his 200th overall career win on Dec. 14, 2018 against Minnesota-Duluth on the road. Johnson registered his 200th win at USF against SMSU, 74-56, on Nov. 30, 2019 at the Stewart Center. The milestone came in his 376th career game. He has compiled a 135-53 (.720) mark at home and a 78-97 road record with an 22-18 mark on a neutral floor. In NSIC play, he has an 104-99 record, including a 61-41 mark in home league games and 43-60 mark in away games. Johnson is 5-8 in postseason. He is also 53-5 in home nonconference games. In 2021-22, the Cougars sit, 11-12, 7-10 in the NSIC.

Johnson has led the team to 15 wins 10 times and recorded six 20-win seasons with the 25-10 campaign in 2009-10 the best finish. Just twice in his 14-year coaching career has one of his teams finished below .500. At the NCAA DII level, USF's mark of 22-8 in 2019-20 is a program-best. With the 17-5 mark in the NSIC in 2019-20, USF had its best league mark. This past season of success followed a 20-10 in 2017-18 for the second 20-win season in three years. USF, which was 10-4 at home and 9-2 on the road with a 3-2 neutral court mark, had a 79-68 win over Minot State in the first round of the NSIC Tourney before falling to Minnesota State, 60-59, in the quarterfinals. Johnson is the only coach in the league to lead his team to five straight appearances in the NSIC Postseason Tournament. Sophomore guard Chase Grinde was an All-NSIC first team selection; junior forward Teathloach Pal, a second-team All-NSIC selection and freshman guard Jack Thompson was selected All-NSIC Honorable Mention during the record-setting 2019-20 campaign. The Cougars finished second overall in the NSIC for the first time, which earned them the top seed in the South and No. 2 overall for the NSIC Postseason Tourney.

USF finished the 2018-19 season at 19-11 overall with a 13-9 league mark for fourth in the South. USF defeated Minot State, 96-51, in the opening round of the 2019

conference tourney.

In 2017-18, the Cougars finished 20-10 for a program-best mark. They were 14-8 for fifth overall in the league. In the NSIC South, the Cougars finished 9-5 and a tie for third with Winona State. The 14 wins represents the most in school history as a member of the NSIC. Both junior guard Trevon Evans and junior forward Drew Guebert were named to the All-NSIC Team. Evans, who was the 2018-19 NSIC South Co-Preseason Player of the Year, was named NSIC Newcomer of the Year. Evans (21.1 ppg) and Guebert (19.9 ppg) finished second and fourth in the NSIC in scoring. USF advanced to the NSIC Tournament semifinals for a third straight time before falling to St. Cloud State.

In 2016-17, USF registered a 15-17 record with a 10-12 in league play (8th, overall). The Cougars lost to the tourney champ for second straight year. USF was 7-5 in home games. In the NSIC Tournament opening round, USF won in dramatic style as Drew Guebert knocked in a three-point field goal with 2.8 seconds to play for an 80-77 victory at the Minot Dome.

In 2015-16, USF finished 17-13, including 11-11 in league play. They finished tied for seventh in the NSIC with Minnesota-Duluth standings and defeated 80-74 in the first round of the NSIC playoffs at Duluth. USF dropped a heartbreaker to Augustana, 105-100 in the second round. USF, which won 7-of-12 to end the season, had its first-ever first team All-NSIC performer in Mack Johnson. In 2014-15, USF was 8-21, including 5-17 in NSIC play. Charles Ward was named second team All-NSIC. In 2013-14, he led the Cougars to a 15-12 record in the NSIC, finishing 12-10 in league play or tied for ninth. During the season, USF won the 1,000th game all-time in program history. In 2012-13, USF was 12-15 overall, 8-14 in conference play and competed in the program's first-ever NSIC Tournament. Johnson guided the Cougars to a huge 70-58 victory over Augustana, ending an 11-game losing streak to their cross-town rival which dated back to the 1994-95 season.

Coach Johnson's ability to make adjustments and motivate his players was once again on display during the 2011-12 season. After a 1-6 start, USF went 19-3 in their final 22 games.

Similar to several Cougar teams in 2011-12, the transitional year meant a travel-intensive schedule, typically featuring a road contest against an NCAA DI opponent Wyoming and was a close loss. In 2010-2011, Johnson led USF to another 20-win season (24-9, 13-5, 2nd, GPAC) and their second GPAC tournament championship in three years. He was named the Hauff Mid America/ GPAC Coach of the Year. Johnson mentored three GPAC all-conference selections, including a second team selection in junior forward David Maxwell. That season, USF recorded its ninth 20+ win season of the decade. The 2009-2010 squad rolled to a 25-10 record and 13-5 (2nd) in the GPAC. USF was a perfect 17-0 on their home court. Johnson coached four players to All-GPAC honors in 2009-2010; including first team GPAC and third team NAIA All-American guard Matt Malloy. Johnson coached the 2008-09 Cougars to a Sweet 16 appearance at the NAIA Men's Division II National Basketball Tournament in Point Lookout, Missouri.

The Cougars, which finished 20-16 overall (7-11, GPAC, 9th) advanced to the tournament's second round by upsetting third-seeded Cedarville University (Ohio), 66-63, in round one. USF's magic run in the tournament ended in a loss to eventual national runner-up College of the Ozarks. Sioux Falls won the 2008-09 Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) postseason tournament championship.

Before USF, Johnson was the top assistant coach for three seasons at the University of North Dakota. He spent the 2004-05 season as head coach at Culver-Stockton College. In his lone season as head coach, Johnson led the Wildcats to a 16-15 record. He was named 2004-05 Heart of America Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. Prior to arriving at Culver-Stockton, Johnson served as an assistant coach at Minot State from 2001-04. Before that he served as an assistant at Minnesota State, Mankato (1999-2001) and Central College (1998-99) in Pella, Iowa.

Johnson was a two-year starter as a guard, lettering four times, at Central College and graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor's degree in exercise science. He received a Master's degree in sports administration from Minnesota State, Mankato, in 2005.

Johnson and his wife, Amy, have four children including Bailey, TJ, Zeke and Lucy.

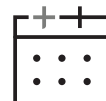

ppg, which is also 11th in the NSIC. USF is averaging 37.0 rebounds per game for fourth in the league with an NSIC-high 11.6 offensive boards (266 total). USF is shooting 31.9 percent from three-point range for 16th in the NSIC with 7.6 triples per outing ranking 10th in the league. The Cougars rank fifth in the league with a 1.87 turnover margin (9.5 to 11.4 for opponents) with a 1.32 assist-turnover ratio, its best mark in several years and third in the NSIC. With 12.7 assists, USF ranks 11th in the NSIC. USF 9.6 turnovers per game, USF ranks first in the NSIC and second in NCAA DII. The Cougars also rank 11th nationally with just 219 turnovers and 37th in assist turnover ratio at 1.32.

OPPONENT BREAKDOWN - AUGUSTANA

Augustana (21-2, 15-2 NSIC) is directed by veteran Head Coach Tom Billeter (18th year at AU, 23rd overall, 451 wins). The Vikings come into the game with 11 straight wins and stand 9-2 in the NSIC South. Earlier they defeated USF, 72-67 in December at the Sanford Pentagon. With 78.4 points per game, the Vikings rank fifth in the NSIC but are ranked first in defensive scoring as they allow 65.3 points per game. AU is fifth in field goal shooting at 47.4 percent while holding opponents to 42.7 percent. The Vikings also sit second in three-point shooting at 38.2 percent and knock in 7.8 per game. They also lead the NSIC in team rebounding at 37.6 and average 11.0 offensive boards per game which is fourth in the NSIC. Tyler Riemersma leads AU with 18.2 ppg (6th, NSIC) and leads the NSIC with 11.0 rebounds per game. Also for AU, Isaac Fink is scoring at 15.7 points per outing.

SERIES BREAKDOWN - VIKINGS LEAD COUGARS, 41-37

The USF-Augustana series dates back to 1922 when the Cougars recorded a 30-12 win. To this point, Augustana has a 41-37 series lead. USF, which has gone 5-6 in the last 11 games in the series, won the first seven games in the rivalry series by a 215-to-97 margin.

In fact, USF won 12-of-13 meetings to open the series with the first Augustana win coming on February 4, 1926 by a 24-20 score. USF, which once led the season series, 30-10, won nine of 11 games from 1926 to 1931. A 42-40 win by USF in 1940-41 was the last match up for the schools for 46 years until Augustana took a 96-74 decision on Nov. 20, 1987.

The Cougars ended a seven-game losing streak with a 69-62 come-from-behind victory on Dec. 31, 2016 at the Sioux Falls Arena. It was USF's first win at Augustana

since a 93-87 victory at the Elmen Center on Nov. 22, 1994. Augustana defeated USF, 80-78 on Feb. 10, 2017 at the Stewart Center. USF's last win against AU at the Stewart Center was a 77-73 decision on Jan. 5, 2019. Augustana has won three straight including 75-66 and 67-65 a year ago.

USF PLAYER PROFILES

Sophomore guard Jack Thompson is supplying 12.9 points per game, 3.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and 1.2 steals. He ranks second in the NSIC and 10th in DII with an assist/turnover ratio of 3.1 and is sixth in the NSIC with 4.0 assists per game. Thompson had a career-high 34 points in a 72-71 overtime win over SMSU on Jan. 2 and was named the NSIC South Division Player of the Week for the first time in his career. In the game, he scored 15 straight points and had 28 in the second half. It is the most points in a half by a player since Jordan Stotts had 32 (34 overall) against Upper Iowa in 2013. An honorable mention All-NSIC in 2019-20, he has started 54-of-62 games with 33 career double-digit scoring games with 20 starts in 21 games this season. He had a career-best five triples against Augustana on Jan. 4, 2020. He also had a high of nine assists against Dakota State on Nov. 16, 2021. He has scored 699 career points, including 271 this season.

Junior guard Chase Grinde, who has 50 double-digit scoring games and six 20-point games, is supplying 11.0 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. Grinde, who has 979 career points (242 in 2021-22) had a season-high 24 points against Chadron State. His career-high is 29 against MSU Moorhead on Feb. 8, 2020 and five times has registered nine rebounds in a game. With 14 points and a career-high 14 rebounds against Winona State on Dec. 11, 2021, he had his first-career double-double. He added a second double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds on Feb. 5 against Minnesota State. His career-best in assists is eight against Minot State. Grinde has 498 career rebounds, 77 made three-pointers (15 this year and a high of 32 in 2019-20), 214 assists, and 98 steals.

Noah Puetz is averaging 4.3 points per game and 2.8 rebounds per game this season with a career-high of 12 points vs Concordia St. Paul on Feb. 4. He has played 27 career games with nine starts and has three double-digit games.

USF SET TO HOST CITY RIVAL AUGUSTANA

With seeding for the NSIC Tournament at stake, the University of Sioux Falls Women's Basketball Team (14-11, 9-9 NSIC) will wrap up the regular season by hosting city rival Augustana (12-9, 8-9 NSIC) on Senior Night tonight (Thursday, Feb. 17) at 5:30 pm in the Stewart Center. After the game tonight, USF will head to Wayne, Nebraska to take on Wayne State (9-13, 6-12 NSIC) at 3:30 pm on Saturday, Feb. 19.

The Cougars have a 9-9 record in league play, which places them in third place in the NSIC South. USF will face Augustana for the 21st time, with the Cougars owning an 11-9 advantage in the all-time series. Earlier this season, USF defeated the Vikings, 73-60, in Sioux Falls, S.D. on December 2, 2021. USF and Wayne State will meet for the 23rd time, with USF owning a 12-10 advantage. In their last meeting, the Cougars took a 76-75 win in Sioux Falls, S.D. on December 4, 2021. Augustana sits right behind USF in the NSIC South at fourth place at 8-9, while Wayne State currently rests in seventh place at 6-12 in the league.

Prior to the start of the game, USF will recognize three seniors. Here is a bio sketch on each of the seniors.

Danielle Schaub, a graduate student enrolled in the Master of Business Administration program from Brooklyn Park, Minn., was named Academic All-NSIC in 2020-21 and was All-NSIC in 2019-20. A graduate transfer from Concordia St. Paul, she has made five starts and is averaging 5.4 points per game. The daughter of Charlie and Diane Schaub, she hit the game-winning shot against Winona State on Saturday. She has 27 double-digit scoring games including four at USF. In her career, Schaub, who once hit nine triples in a game (Feb. 15, 2020) against Augustana, has 613 career points.

Kiara James, the daughter of Diane James, is a senior criminal justice/Spanish/Media Studies major from Lakeville, Minn. A two-time Academic All-NSIC honoree, she averages 4.6 points and 3.4 rebounds. Tonight, she will play in the 98th game of her career which includes scoring 332 points and grabbing 196 rebounds. She has three-double digit scoring games with 24 career blocks and 35 assists. She scored a career high 14 points against Wayne State on Feb. 2, 2020.

Krystal Carlson, the daughter of Angie and Erik Carlson, is a senior exercise major from Hastings, Minn. She is averaging 9.8 points and 4.9 rebounds with nine double-digit scoring games this year and 22 in her career. Carlson has a career high of 28 points, as well as 609 career points with 245 this year. Also, Carlson has 310 rebounds, 98 steals and played in 102 games with 63 starts.

INSIDE USF WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The Cougars, directed by USF Head Coach Travis Traphagen (all-time wins leader at USF with 265), is outscoring opponents, 68.5-to-63.5 or a 5.0 margin. The Cougars rank sixth in the NSIC in scoring and third in points allowed. In shooting, USF is averaging 40.7 percent on 633-of-1554 from the field, which is 11th in the NSIC. They are also 11th in field percentage defense at 40.7 percent. In addition, USF is fifth in three-point shooting, making 145-of-344 from distance.

Against the three-point shot, USF is 10th in the NSIC, holding opponents to 30.8 percent on 147-of-478 shooting. The Cougars, which have out-rebounded opponents in 14 of 25 games, rank ninth in the NSIC with 36.6 rpg and is fourth in offensive boards at 11.2 per game. USF is second in turnover margin at 3.04 (15.0-to-18.1). In forcing 18.1 turnovers, USF averages 9.56 steals per game, which is second in the league. In 25 games, USF has 239 steals with 13 games of at least 10 or more. USF has twice had 19 or more with a season-high 21 vs Waldorf University.

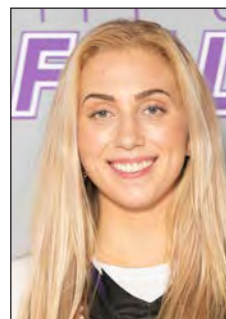

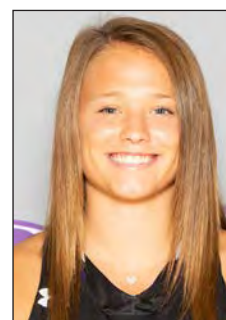

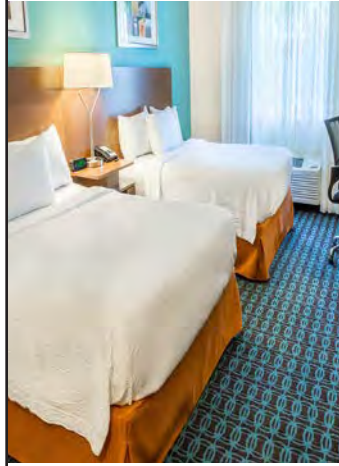

Travis Traphagen

Head Coach - 14th Season at USF

Travis Traphagen has made a significant impact with the University of Sioux Falls Women's Basketball Team. In his 14th season at USF, he has established the career wins mark of 262 with six 20-win seasons, NSIC Tournament title, two tournament final appearances, and a pair of NCAA DII Tournament berths.

In his 14th season, Traphagen owns a 265-134 (.665) overall record, with six 20-win seasons, two NCAA DII Central Regional berths (2015-16, No. 7 seed; 2019-20, No. 3 seed) and a NSIC South Division title. He had back-to-back 20-win seasons twice at the DII level, including the 2019-20 (26-6) and 2018-19 (23-8) seasons. He also had back-to-back 20-win campaigns in 2015-16 and 2016-17 with the first NCAA Tournament berth in USF Women's Basketball history in 2015-16. He also directed USF to the NCAA DII berth in 2019-20. At the DII level, he has had four 20-win seasons with at least 22 wins each year. The 27 wins in the 2015-16 season is the most by USF at the DII level.

Traphagen is 142-46 at home, 102-75 in away games and 21-13 on a neutral floor. The Cougars have a 123-84 NSIC record, including 67-37 at home and 56-47 on the road. Traphagen, who has directed USF to seven straight winning seasons, has twice guided the Cougars to the NSIC Tournament title game, winning in 2015-16 to earn USF's first trip to the NCAA Tournament in their Division II history. USF is 15-8 in the NSIC Postseason Tourney with Traphagen at the helm.

During the 2020-21 season, which was limited to league-only games, USF was 8-6 with an 8-5 league mark. USF was 5-2 at home and 3-3 on the road. The Cougars earned the No. 4 seed in the NSIC Postseason Tourney. Anna Brecht was named first team All-NSIC. USF had five student-athletes named Academic All-NSIC and three named to the NSIC Academic Team of Excellence.

In 2019-20, he led USF to its first-ever NSIC South Division title and a top-10 ranking nationally. USF finished the season at 26-6 and 17-5 in the NSIC to win the NSIC South Division title. The Cougars earned the top South seed in the NSIC Tourney. USF was ranked in the WBCA for the first time at the DII level in 2019-20. The Cougars were ranked as high as No. 7 and ranked 10 weeks overall during the season, including a span of nine straight polls. USF finished No. 24 in the D2SIDA Poll and also was ranked in that service 10 weeks. USF advanced to the NSIC Tournament semifinals for an unprecedented fifth straight year. USF also secured its second NCAA DII Central Region Tourney berth as No. 3 seed.

In 2019-20, Traphagen had two-all league first-team guards with the announcement of Kaelly Hummel and Mariah Szymanski, who are also USF's first-ever three-time All-NSIC honoree. Hummel is the first player since Laura Johnson to earn first team All-NSIC honors two straight years. She has also been named D2CCA All-Region first team and eligible for the All-American Team. Hummel, a three-time All-NSIC performer, earned her third straight Academic All-NSIC honor and was a CoSIDA All-District first team selection. Jacey Huinker also had her second nod to the NSIC All-Defensive Team, fourth Academic All-NSIC honoree and a CoSIDA All-District first team selection. USF had 10 team members named to the Academic All-NSIC Team (3.2 GPA).

In 2018-19, Traphagen directed USF to a 23-8 with a 16-6 record (third overall) in the NSIC. USF was tied for first in the NSIC South with Concordia St. Paul with a 11-3 record. USF, which had a pair of All-NSIC performers in first-team selection Kaelly Hummel and second teamer Mariah Szymanski, was the No. 2 seed from the South. Head Coach Travis Traphagen won his 200th game during the season. Seven members of the team were named Academic All-NSIC.

In 2017-18, Traphagen directed USF to a 16-13 record, including 11-11 in the NSIC, and a berth in the NSIC Tournament Semifinals for the third straight year. USF had a pair of all-league players in Kaelly Hummel and Mariah Szymanski while Jacey Huinker was selected to the NSIC All-Defensive Team. Six team members were selected Academic All-NSIC.

Traphagen revamped his 2016-17 squad and made another run to the NSIC Tournament championship game, posting a second straight 20-win season. Led by the program's first NCAA Division II All-American in Sam Knecht, the Cougars finished with a 22-8 record and placed fifth in the NSIC at 15-7, four spots above where they were picked in the NSIC preseason coaches' poll. USF knocked off NSIC regular season champion MSU Moorhead in the regular season then did it again in the NSIC Tournament quarterfinals, en route to another run to the title game, which unfortunately ended in a loss to in-state rival Northern State in the title game. Traphagen reshaped the offense around Knecht, who averaged a double-double and was named first-team All-NSIC, and senior point guard Madi Robson, who averaged more than six assists a game.

Traphagen led his squad to a program-best 27-6 record and earned the first NCAA Tournament berth in program history. After a runner-up finish in the NSIC regular season

with a 17-5 record, USF rolled to four straight double-digit wins in the NSIC Tournament, capturing the tournament title and clinching the NCAA automatic berth. Another program first, Traphagen molded guard Taylor Varsho into the NSIC Player of the Year after she averaged 17.7 points, 4.1 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game. Varsho also earned all-region honors from several publications and was named the NSIC Tournament team MVP with Alison Klostergaard and Sam Knecht earning All-Tournament team honors.

Leading the veteran squad in 2014-15 was guard Taylor Varsho (13.2 points per game, 6.3 rebounds per game, 3.9 assists per game in 2014-15). Varsho, who was named the 2015-16 NSIC South Preseason Player of the Year and Sam Knecht (11.1 ppg, 7.8 rpg) were named to the All-NSIC second team.

The 2013-14 season saw improvement for Traphagen and USF in the second year in the NSIC, including an upset win over top-seeded and No. 13-ranked Wayne State in the quarterfinals of the NSIC tournament. The Cougars, who ended the season 14-15 overall, lost in the semifinal to eventual Central Region champion Concordia-St. Paul. Sam Knecht was NSIC Freshman of the Year honors and senior forward Laura Johnson collected first-team All-NSIC accolades.

During the first season as a full-fledged member of the NCAA Division II and the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference, Traphagen guided the Cougars to a 12-15 overall record and a 9-14 conference record. The Cougars qualified for the NSIC/Sanford Health Tournament where they fell in the first round to MSU Moorhead. Traphagen guided USF to a 23-3 record in 2011-12. The Cougars beat three NSIC teams and had their first win over Sioux Falls rival Augustana College since 1988. During the 2010-2011 season, Traphagen coached the Cougars to a school record 27 wins en route to a NAIA quarterfinal appearance. Their historic season marked the program's first NAIA tournament berth since 2003. USF was second (14-4) in the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Traphagen mentored two first team, two second team and three honorable mention conference selections including, GPAC freshman of the year, Laura Johnson. In the 2009-2010 season, Traphagen led USF to an 18-14 overall record, advancing to the second round of the GPAC tournament.

Sioux Falls' 18 wins in the 2008-2009 were the most since the 2002-03 season, when the Cougars reached the NAIA final four. From 2007-08, Traphagen served as the Cougars' top assistant coach. Before that he was the head assistant women's basketball coach at Augustana College (S.D.) since 2001. Traphagen served as a graduate assistant at Wayne State College in Wayne, Neb., where he earned a master's degree in sports administration. Traphagen earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Black Hills State in 1999. Traphagen played college basketball for three years at BHSU, where he was a two-time all-conference selection, including team Co-Captain and Co-MVP during the 1999 season. During Traphagen's time, the Yellow Jackets won three consecutive South Dakota Intercollegiate conference championships. He holds the Yellow Jackets single season record for made 3-pointers (97) in 1997-98 season.

Traphagen and his wife, Ann, reside in Sioux Falls with their three children, Grayson, Riley and Luke.

OPPONENT BREAKDOWN - AUGUSTANA

The Vikings, directed by 33rd-year Head Coach Dave Krauth, are coming off of back-to-back losses over the weekend to Concordia St. Paul and Minnesota State Mankato. AU, which is fourth in the NSIC South, averages 72.2 points per game on a 42.1 field goal percentage. The Vikings are grabbing 41.0 rebounds per game, as well as 9.0 steals and dishing out 14.7 assists. Individually, AU is led by Lauren Sees, who is averaging 15.6 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. Aislinn Duffy is also supplying 11.1 rebounds and adding 14.7 points per game for the Vikings.

SERIES NOTES - USF LEADS AUGIE, 11-9 IN DII ERA

The Cougars own an 11-9 advantage over the Vikings in the overall series in the DII era. Earlier this season, USF defeated the Vikings, 73-60, in Sioux Falls, S.D. on December 2, 2021. Before that win for USF, the Vikings had been on a three-game winning streak, including a 80-74 win over USF on Feb. 13, 2021 at Augustana. The last time the Cougars hosted the Vikings in the Stewart Center, AU took a 79-56 win over USF on Feb. 21,

2020. In the last 10 matchups, the Cougars and Vikings have each won five games a piece. USF holds a 2-5 home record against the Vikings and a 7-3 away record.

PLAYER PROFILES ON USF

Individually, freshman guard Megan Fannin leads USF with 13.5 points per game, which ranks 14th in the league. USF is also receiving 9.8 points and 4.9 rebounds from senior forward Krystal Carlson. Junior guard Dallie Hoskinson, who has eight games of double-digit rebounds in 2021-22, averages 8.9 points, 7.7 rebounds (5th, NSIC) per game, 3.8 assists (10th NSIC), and 2.2 steals (5th, NSIC). She was recently named the NSIC Player of the Week after nearly securing a triple double (14 points, nine rebounds and eight assists) after a home win over U-Mary on Jan. 7.
