## 1978 SIUE Soccer Prospects

If the "sophomore jinz" doesn't overtake them the Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville soccer kickers could have a very good chance at winning the big prize in American collegiate soccer: the NCAA division I (big school) national tournament championship this coming December at Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

Playing last year as largely a freshman squad, the SIUE kickers came within inches of winning the NCCA crown at Berkeley, Calif., as they fought the defending champion, the Dons of the University of San Francisco to a 1-1 draw in regulation time and lost the decision in the sudden-death overtime period. Hartwick College, an annual powerhouse in the East, went on to win the championship by beating the Dons in the title game. The Cougars will play Hartwick College in the first annual University of Indiana Soccer Classic slated for Bloomington, Ind. Sept. 16 and 17th. Penn State U., along with the host Hoosiers, complete the field of four and will play SIUE.

Although the Hoosiers and Cougars won't meet in the Indiana U. Classic, however, they could very well repeat their thrilling, four-overtime regional tournament confrontation won by SIUE, 3-2; again in post-season competition this campaign.

Coach Bob Guelker, who initiated soccer at SIUE in 1967, dubbed his '77 team "my Cinderella club". With six freshmen in starters' berths, the young SIUE soccer eleven didn't figure to even come close to winning the regional alone making a real run for the whole bundle.

Those six, now sophomores and battle-tested, are: Don Ebert, leading '77 scorer (20 points on 16 goals and four assists); two other strikers, Tim Guelker and Matt Malloy; Bob Bozada, midfielder, and backs Tim Clark and Terry Trushel. Guelker plans to move his son, Tim, to the midfield.

The Cougars, of course, will sorely miss the defensive standout play of their three-time, first-team All-American, Greg (Face) Makwoski, who was pro soccer's first round draft choice. He was chosen by the Denver, Colo., Caribous, and has been a starter most of the past season.

A trio of seniors, elected as tri-captains, heads the list of returning SIUE veterans: goalie Bob Robson, Mike Kelley, an all-around performer who can play either defense or offense, and forward-winger Brian Higgins.

Guelker is also counting on a quartet of juniors to repeat this year their brilliant seasons of last year: Dave Hundelt, a starting right fullback; Dave Hummert, an outstanding midfielder who is also a better-than-average "striker", and diminutive (five feet, two inches tall) Jeff Cacciatore, a fleet and persistently pesky—and very exciting — winger who can score.

Incoming freshmen who are expected to see a lot of action are George Mishalow of Chicago, who will play at the midfield and at centerback, and Pat Malloy, a backfield defender from Hazelwood High of St. Louis. Mishalow is the younger brother of

Gene Mishalow, who was a mainstay for the Cougars for three seasons.

Six new foes have been added to the SIUE '78 schedule; five are national powerhouses — Southern Methodist U., North Texas State U., Hartwick College, Penn State U., and Bowling Green U. of Ohio. The sixth school, Covenant College of Tennessee, is largely an unknown quantity.

This year, too, it is the Cougars' turn to "host" the annual Governor's Cup Tournament with SIUE entered against Western, Eastern and Northern Illinois Universities. SIUE is the defending champ.

## SIUE Coaching Staff

Bob Guelker, head coach at SIUE, will again be assisted by Rick Benben. In Guelker's 19 years coaching college soccer his teams have never failed to qualify for post-season tournament competition. From 1959 through 1966, while at St. Louis U., Guelker teams compiled an amazing 95-9-5 record while winning five NCAA national championships. At SIUE, his 1972 Cougars won the first NCAA division II crown and thus Guelker is the only U.S. coach to have won titles in both divisions.

The Cougars, now of course, are regularly contenders for the division I title. NCAA regulations now permit a school to upgrade one division in one sport. Since 1973, SIUE is NCAA division II in seven sports (basketball, baseball, wrestling, track, golf, tennis and cross country), but division I (big schools) in soccer.

At SIUE, Guelker's record from '67 through '77 at SIUE is a sensational 114-26-6; thus his overall collegiate record is 209-35-11.
