The Outlook for 1979

The toughest and the longest soccer schedule ever played by Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville has been announced by the Cougars' coach, veteran Bob Guelker, who introduced the sport to the campus just three years after the university opened its doors in 1965.

This year's 19-game slate is almost twice as long as the Cougars played annually during their first 10 seasons.

A first for the team this year will be home games played at Cougar Field under floodlights. Ed Bigham, acting athletic director, announced, "We plan to install floodlights at Cougar Field in time for the upcoming season."

The combination of a talent-laden Cougar squad and one of the toughest schedules ever must obviously have the soccer community buzzing with excitement. Here are the players Guelker has returning:

At the wings, it'll be Jeff Cacciatore and Matt Malloy, both extremely good at feeding the ball to the Cougars' top scorer these past two years, Don Ebert, at the center forward slot. The trailing striker working in unison with All-American Ebert is Guelker's slim and wiry son, Tim Guelker. While Ebert led the Cougars in 1978 with 22 points (16 goals and 6 assists), young Guelker posted 16 points (8 goals and 8 assists).

At midfield, there are the hard-nosed veterans Bob Bozada and Dave Hummert, both of whom are capable of scoring when the defense concentrates on either Ebert or Guelker. Bozada has finally recovered from a knee injury he suffered in his freshman (he's now a junior) season and re-injured in a game early in the 1978 season.

One of the two biggest losses from last campaign's squad was that of Mike Kelley, defenseman and field general. The other was "cold-as-ice" Bob Robson, goal tender. Kelley's replacement, Joey Howe, a Florissant Valley transfer, is credited with being one of the best collegiate players on defense in the United States. His three older brothers—Tom, Kevin and Gerry—all played for SIUE. Alongside Howe will be Terry Trushel, battle-scarred veteran of three seasons.

Directly in front of the goalie are a pair of veteran backs, Dave Hundelt and Tim Clark, generally acknowledged as two of the best defensemen in U.S. collegiate soccer. Pushing Hundelt and Clark, though, will be young and husky Pat Malloy, a sophomore who saw much crucial game action in 1978.

Alternating in the goal will be Mark Downar, who last year turned in a brilliant game against Quincy College when Robson was sidelined, and Ed Gettemeier, both of St. Louis.
