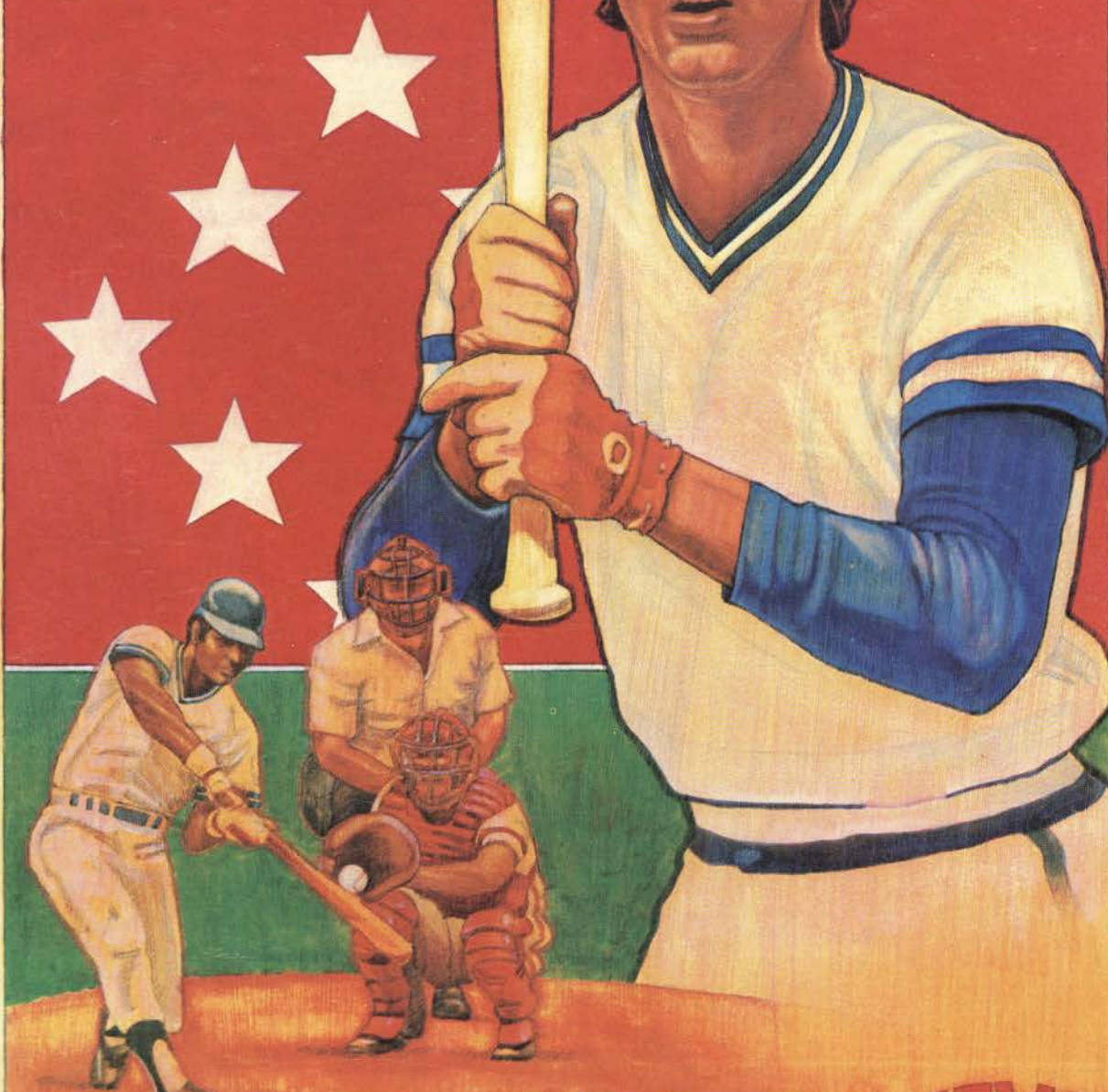

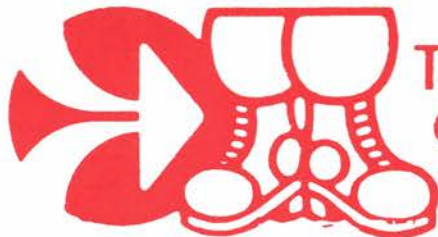

## A Welcome To Cougar Baseball Fans

This is a region rich in baseball tradition and lore. Our Cougars are proudly adding to this inheritance. We hope that you will enjoy the competition on the field of play, as well as the friendly companionship that the leisurely pace of the game permits.

Realizing that most individuals attending Cougar baseball games are seriously devoted to the sport, I believe you will enjoy an excerpt from Marvin Cohen's book, **Baseball the Beautiful:**

"Baseball is eminently fair. Performance tells. You can look it up. The home run wasn't hit because the hitter's father was the vice-president of the team or because the hitter married the manager's daughter. The no-hitter was pitched with no quarter given, by token of no favor, in getting all the breaks by being born and bred on the right side of the tracks and having the right table manners and college accent. The pitcher did it himself. He earned it. Baseball is purer than life; it's symmetrical, fair, and dignified. There's no debating what happened: it happened.

"It happened: concretely, empirically. So much so, that the intangibles, the spirit, are the presiding halos over baseball. Records make for legends. Baseball is our great national myth. The crowd roars in unison, or those of it that have in common the art of being the same team's rooting fans. They all pull together. Enthusiasm, hysteria: a common love. Baseball is bigger than us all. (But you have to love it, to look at it this way.)

"The diamond treats all men as equals. On one corner of that diamond stands a man. If he's fleet enough and gets a fast break, he might steal second. Or he might score, on a given hit down the right field line. In the latter case, the right fielder's arm might have a deciding effect.

"Baseball is a game of inches. Fair or foul, safe or out—what happens, happens. It goes down into the record book. And records don't lie.

"The structure of baseball is its art. It's a structure that admits of infinitely complicated possibilities and combinations, within the rigid framework of rules in common, of distances to fences, of worked-out angles, of human proportions. Man is the measure of all things. The Major League ballplayer is the measure of the distances on his field of trade. Given these, he must do or die, win or lose. It's the majesty that dignity imparts.

"Proportions and measurements are the poet's tool, the sculptor's trade. And they rule in baseball."

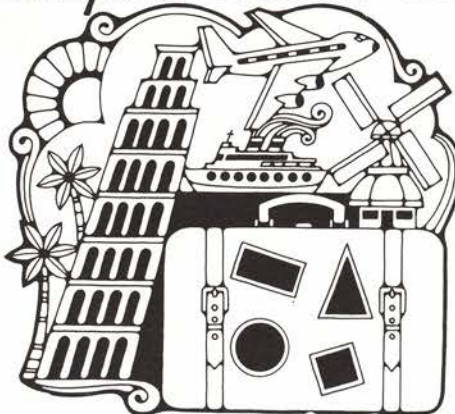

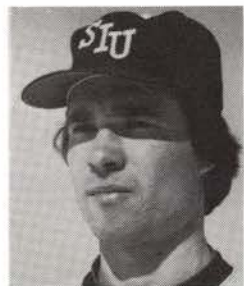
### Gary [Bo] Collins Head Coach

Gary was the Cougars "Most Outstanding Athlete" in 1969, for his outstanding performances in baseball and basketball. He signed with the St. Louis Cardinals in 1969 and played in their organization until 1971 when he joined the Washington Senator organization. Bo was an assistant coach at SIUE in 1972 and 1973 and at Lewis-Clark Junior College from 1976-78. This is Gary's second year at the helm of the Cougars.



### Rick Benben Assistant Coach

Rick begins his second year as assistant baseball coach with the Cougars. Rick played baseball at C.B.C. High School in St. Louis, and with the Ballwin American Legion Team. He then came to SIUE where he was a three-year starter for the Cougar soccer team, including the 1972 Division II National Champions. He then played professional soccer with the Dallas Tornados before returning to SIUE as assistant soccer coach.



### Nyls Nyman Assistant Coach

Nyls joins the Cougar baseball coaching staff this year following an eight year professional baseball career. Nyls signed in 1972 with the Chicago White Sox and played with them in '75 and parts of '74, '76 and '77. He was then selected to All-Star teams in the Midwest, Southern, and American Association Leagues. Nyls was the Southern league MVP in 1974 and the American Association Silver Glove Award winner in 1976.

## 1980 Baseball Prospectus

The 1980 baseball team will be faced with the longest and possibly hardest schedule in the programs history. Of the 58 games scheduled, 20 will be against Division I opponents and 23 against Division II. Adding to this is the fact that 18 of the 23 teams to be played in 1980 finished with winning records in 1979.

The baseballers start the spring with another trip to Albuquerque for 10 games, including the Tourquoise Tournament. Then it's back to Edwardsville for the home opener on March 26 with arch rival St. Louis University. Some of the more attractive home dates include week-end series with Eastern and Western Illinois and of course another strong rival, the University of Missouri at St. Louis. Newcomers to the schedule this year include Wyoming, Louisville, Missouri, Missouri Southern and Lewis College. With this in mind, let's look at who's going to be playing these games.

This year's squad will rely heavily on newcomers. There are only a handful (8) of players back from last year's team. Of the people returning, the majority are pitchers. Tom Ritzheimer, John Mueller and Doug Gremand will be called upon to shoulder the bulk of the mound work. John Lakin will move from first base to the bullpen and freshman Ted Smith and Kent Taylor will also see plenty of action, as both had fine fall seasons. Two fine junior college transfers from an outstanding Lake County (Chicago) team will start on the Cougar infield. Roger Thomas, an All-State third-baseman, will handle that position, and Jay Kruckman, a very solid 350 hitter will handle first-base. Thomas drove in 56 runs last year and will be heavily counted on to do the same this year. At second-base will be Ed Kopff, from Meremac (St. Louis) Junior College. Ed is very fundamentally sound in all areas of the game. Backing up Ed at second will be freshman Tom Greco from Granite North. Larry Maden will move from second-base to shortstop. Larry was one of our most consistent hitters last year ending up

over 300. Larry's biggest asset though, is a great pair of hands. Backing up Larry will be Fernando Aguirre a senior from Civic Memorial. With these two we feel secure at short. Behind the plate will be Tom Burg and Mike Stewart. Burgie, a Collinsville product, was an All-State Junior College centerfielder in 1978. Tom is a very good athlete and a leader. When not catching Tom will also play left-field. Mike Stewart is a sophomore from Ritenour (St. Louis). Mike has good power and should develop into a good receiver. Centerfield will be patrolled by George Vogel, a freshman from Pattonville. George has all the tools to be a great player. While it's a big jump from high school to college, we think George will make the transition quickly. Left-field will be handled by Rich Kantner (Highland St. Paul) and Tony Catlett (Roxana freshman). Both have exceptional running speed and should contribute as designated runners when not playing the field. Right-field will be divided between Cary Hajduk and Tom Ritzheimer. Cary will also be used as the designated hitter. Cary is a senior, who the coaching staff feels is ready to come into his own as a hitter. He is a switch hitter who has tremendous power from both sides. Cary had a fine fall season and is expected to hold down the fourth spot in the batting order. Another player that needs to be mentioned is Dan Ritzheimer. Dan is a freshman from Wesclin where he was a catcher. Dan will be used at several positions which is indicative of his athletic ability.

One thing this year's team has is depth and flexibility. We have some good athletes and the competition for playing time will be intense. While Vogel may be the only freshmen in the line-up on opening day, by the end of the year there may be as many as 6. Even though the coaching staff considers this to be a rebuilding year, we expect to re-establish the Cougar baseball team as one of the best in the Midwest.
