Head Coach Dann Nelson 1st Season at SIU 5th Season Overall

This season will mark a new beginning for the Salukis as Dann Nelson takes over for Missy Jeffrey as head coach. Nelson, who served as head coach at Western Illinois since 2003, becomes the 13th head coach in the 81-year history

of Saluki men's tennis.

For the past nine years, Nelson has coached at the collegiate ranks, most recently with the Leathernecks, where he guided the men's team to a second-place regular-season Mid-Continent Conference finish in 2004. His team posted a 5-1 conference record and a 9-4 overall record, which was Western's best finish in eight years.

From 2001 to 2003, Nelson served as head coach at Westminster College, an NCAA Division III school in Fulton, Mo. In Nelson's first season at Westminster, the team went undefeated in conference posting a 6-0 record. 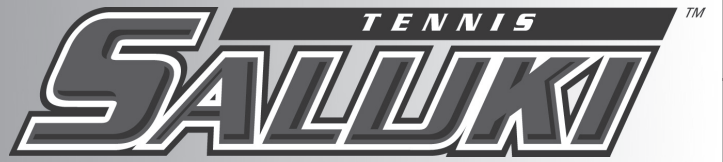
"I really feel like I came to SIU at the right time," said Nelson. "There is a lot of talent already here that was recruited by coach Missy Jeffrey, and this team has such great potential. This was the perfect time to come here."

Nelson's overall coaching record is 36-22, and in conference play his teams have gone 18-6.

Nelson graduated from Oklahoma Christian in 1997, with a bachelor's degree in social studies. He earned a master's degree in education from Central Oklahoma in 2001. Nelson along with his wife Casey and two-year-old daughter Khana reside in Carbondale.

The men's tennis team is full of potential this season. The challenge will be for first-year coach Dann Nelson to bring out the best in the Salukis. Nelson knows a coaching change can be a difficult adjustment, but the players have adapted to Nelson's style and are determined to reach their potential.

"It's not an easy transition for the players to come in under a new coach, but they have made the transition so well," said Nelson. "They are working extremely hard in the weight room and conditioning."

Nelson's strategies have already made an impact on a team that has experienced one of the most successful fall seasons in recent history.

The Salukis were led by senior Bojan Ilievski with a total of nine wins, which ranks fourth at SIU for the most fall season singles wins. Nelson thinks Ilievski has the potential to perform even better.

"He could have won every match he played in the fall season," said Nelson "We desperately need him, for the team to do what we want to do this year."

Senior Tomas Gonzalez is captain of the team and went 6-4 through the fall. Nelson thinks Gonzalez motivates the team in a positive way.

"I can't say enough good things about Tomas and his work ethic," said Nelson. "He really gets the team going. The team would not be where they are now, as far as positive attitude, if it were not for Tomas."

Sergio Sanchez (Jr.) played well in the fall season with a record of 7-2. Sanchez was able to beat players from Valparaiso, Saint Louis, Belmont and Aus-

tin Peay. He also made up half of the #2 doubles team, along with Feilpe Villasenor (Jr.). Together, they combined for a 4-2 fall record, and made it to the quarterfinals of the ITA Regional tournament. It was there they defeated the pre-season sixth-ranked team of Rohan Gajjar and Adrians Zguns from Arkansas. Nelson believes

Sanchez is capable of an incredible season.

"This is his break-out year," said Nelson. "Sergio is working really hard. He is the type of player, if he wants to beat you, he will beat you. He could have one of those years that is record setting."

Along with being a part of the doubles team with Sanchez, Villasenor also excelled in singles play. At the ITA Regional, Villasenor was the only Saluki to win a main draw singles match, defeating John Kellert of Missouri State, 7-6, 7-5. He also made it to the semifinals of the Middle Tennessee State Invitational.

"Villasenor has the type of game where, if he is on, he can beat anybody," said Nelson. "He's got a huge serve and really good volleys."

Junior Rodrigo Lama will play a key role in the success of the team. He will be in the top three of the line-up. This fall, he finished 4-3, but all three losses came against top opponents. Nelson is expecting Lama to anchor the team.

"He has an all-court game, where he can do just about anything," Nelson said.

Nick Bauer (So.) has been working hard to improve his game and recover from a shoulder injury. Nelson said Bauer played well in the fall with a 3-2 record.

"The best jump for a player is freshman to sophomore year, so I am hoping to work Nick in the line up as much as

possible," said Nelson.

Freshman Andrei Bubnov, from Russia, had an outstanding fall season, considering he is the youngest player on the team and was getting used to the American collegiate rules. Bubnov finished the fall season 8-5. Three of his losses were to ranked opponents. Nelson expects big things from this freshman in the future.

"Andrei needs to have just a little bit more patience and finesse," said Nelson. "He's got the power and all the strokes. He just needs to play points a little bit smarter, and he will be one of the top players in our conference."

Freshman walk-on Steve Kellman only played two matches this fall and came up short in both. Nelson sees the improvement in Kellman's skills.

"He improves daily," Nelson said. "He is not the same player that walked on at the start of the season. He just needs to keep improving."

According to Nelson the top six players will all be fighting for the No. 1 spot.

The Salukis lost three players off last year's squad, Julian Angel Botero, Alexandru Nomicos and Lukasz Soswa.

The Salukis open up the season against Dayton, Xavier, Louisville and Eastern Kentucky in January.

Nelson is looking forward to the six home matches the Salukis will host in the spring.

"It will make a difference to be able to host some conference matches, and make our opponents play on our territory," Nelson said.

The Salukis have home matches against conference foes Indiana State, Missouri State, Wichita State, Bradley and Illinois State.

"Every conference match is going to be a dog-fight," said Nelson. "Every team is improving, and every team is good, so each conference match is going to be incredibly tough."

The last three seasons the Salukis have finished seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference, but are looking to make a dramatic turnaround this season. The potential for a conference championship team is all there. The team has the heart, determination, drive and talent to bring home the championship. The difficult part will be putting the pieces together at the right time.

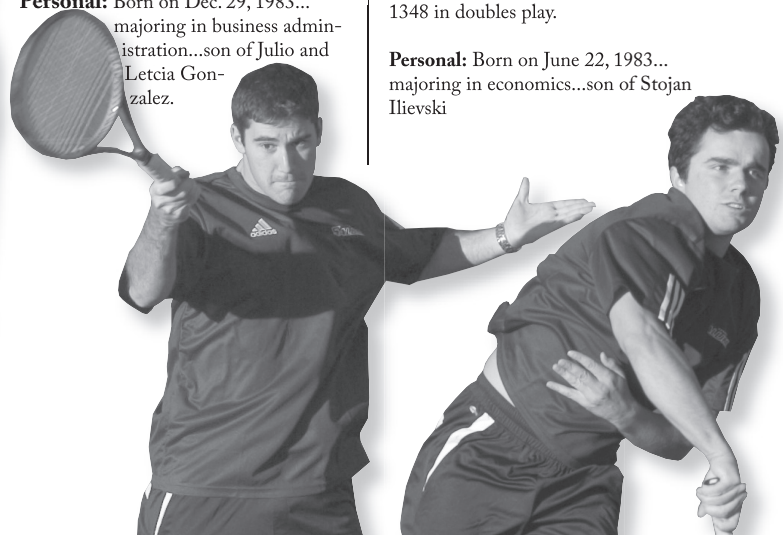

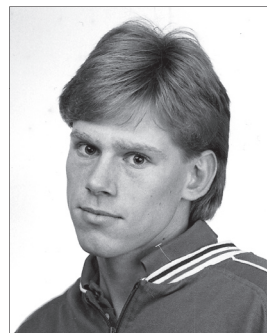

Troutt-Wittmann Facts

The academic portion of the building has \$45,000 in computer equipment, including 30 Dell computers with wall-mounted flat screens. Study tables and chairs can accommodate an additional 60 student-athletes. Three tutorial rooms with study tables and internet access allow privacy. Wireless internet access is available throughout the facility.

The training portion of the building is five times larger than the Salukis' previous weight room. It is equipped with 12,000 pounds of new weights and \$150,000 of the best weight equipment money can buy, including 10 Power Lift multi-station lifting racks and eight Olympic lift platforms. All equipment is custom made.

Student Services

The student services staff in Intercollegiate Athletics, under the leadership of assistant athletics director Kristina Therriault, seeks to provide the best possible academic, athletic, career and personal support services to Saluki student-athletes. Members of the support staff seek to help student-athletes with their overall adjustment and development.



Study Table

Study table provides a quiet, monitored study opportunity for student-athletes. It is held in the Troutt-Wittmann Academic and Training Center, Sunday through Friday. This service is available to all student-athletes, though those with a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 and below are required to attend. All incoming freshmen and transfer student-athletes are also required to attend for a minimum of at least four hours per week.

Tutoring

The primary goal of the tutoring program is to facilitate the learning process of our student-athletes in a comfortable and well-ordered environment. This program is a support mechanism that has been created to help student-athletes keep pace with rigorous classes while trying to maintain busy and challenging academic and athletic schedules. Tutoring services are free of charge to all Saluki student-athletes.

Academic Advisement

Saluki student-athletes receive priority advisement and registration within their SIU academic unit or major. Student-athletes can meet with their academic advisors earlier than the general student body. The student services staff in athletics notifies student-athletes of the dates for which early advisement appointments may be made.

Academic Monitoring

Academic performance is monitored both formally and informally by the student services staff. During the 6th and 12th week of each semester, progress reports are sent to all instructors of each student-athlete. Instructors return the slips to the student services staff with information about attendance, participation, grades and general comments. The reports are copied and forwarded to coaches who then share the reports with their student-athletes. Monitoring of course progress allows the student services staff to become aware of problems and provide the assistance needed as quickly as possible.

Computer Resources

The 30 computer workstations at Troutt-Wittmann are loaded with the latest educational software including Microsoft Word, Powerpoint, Excel, Access and Publisher. The computers also have internet access which can be used to search Morris Library or the World Wide Web. Laptop computers are also available for student-athletes to check out.
