BROOKINGS, S.D. — The South Dakota State University football team will play its first Missouri Valley Football Conference road game of the season Saturday, traveling to Southern Illinois.

Kickoff is slated for 6 p.m. at Saluki Stadium in Carbondale, Illinois. The game can be viewed on ESPN3.com.

The Jackrabbits, ranked 12th in both the STATS and HERO Sports media polls and 14th by the Football Championship Subdivision coaches, enter the week with a 2-2 overall record and 1-0 mark in the MVFC following a 52-14 victory over Western Illinois on Oct. 1.

Southern Illinois, under the direction of first-year head coach Nick Hill, also is 2-2 overall. The Salukis dropped their conference opener, 42-21, at Northern Iowa last Saturday.

THE SERIES: Saturday's game will mark the seventh meeting on the gridiron between SDSU and Southern Illinois, but the first time the two programs have met since 2013.

The series, which began with a 38-35 Saluki victory in Carbondale during the 2008 season, is tied 3-3. The road team has won four of the previous six meetings, including a 16-12, last-minute Jackrabbit victory on Nov. 3, 2012, that gave SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier his 100th career victory.

In the last meeting, Oct. 5, 2013, at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, Southern Illinois spoiled Hobo Day by defeating the Jackrabbits, 27-24. SIU quarterback Kory Faulkner ran for two touchdowns and passed for another in leading the Salukis to victory.

ELITE COMPANY: South Dakota State is one of only five Football Championship Subdivision programs to reach the playoffs each of the last four seasons.

The four other programs to play in the postseason each year since 2012 include:

- North Dakota State
- New Hampshire
- Coastal Carolina (S.C.)
- Sam Houston State (Texas)

RABBITS RANKED: For the third time in four years, the South Dakota State University football team entered a season with a top-10 national ranking.

The Jackrabbits checked in at No. 8 in the preseason STATS FCS Poll. SDSU, which posted an 8-4 overall record in 2015 and made its fourth consecutive appearance in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs, returns 15 starters. SDSU also was recognized in the FCS Coaches' Preseason Poll with a 14th-place showing.

The Jackrabbits moved up in the polls after their convincing victory over Western Illinois last week, jumping on spot to 15th in the coaches' poll and three spots in the STATS rankings to 12th.

JACKS PICKED THIRD IN VALLEY: The South Dakota State University football team has been picked to finish third in the Missouri Valley Football Conference during the 2016 season, according to a preseason poll released on Aug. 2.

Five-time defending national champion North Dakota State again was tabbed as the conference favorite in the poll, which was conducted among the league's coaches, sports information directors and select media representatives. The Bison earned 37 of a possible 39 first-place votes and 388 total points.

Northern Iowa received the other two first-place votes to finish second in the preseason poll with 343 points.

Completing the upper half of the 10-team poll were South Dakota State, Illinois State and Youngstown State. North Dakota State, UNI, SDSU, Illinois State and Western Illinois all reached the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs last season.

Western Illinois checked in at a distant sixth spot in the preseason poll, followed by South Dakota and Southern Illinois. Indiana State and Missouri State filled out the poll.

In addition, five SDSU players were named to the MVFC Preseason Team. Leading the Jackrabbit contingent was junior wide receiver Jake Wieneke, who has been a two-time first-team all-league pick (2014, 2015). Wieneke set a single-season league record in 2015 with 1,472 receiving yards. He ended the year with 72 receptions and 11 touchdowns en route to earning All-America honors for the second year in a row.

Fellow 2015 first-team all-MVFC performer Dallas Goedert joined Wieneke on the preseason honor squad at the tight end spot. A junior from Britton, Goedert hauled in 26 receptions for 484 yards and three touchdowns last season to rank second on the team in all receiving categories.

Completing the Jackrabbit offense's preseason honorees was junior center Jacob Ohnesorge. The native of Waunakee, Wisconsin, has started all 26 games over the past two seasons and was a second-team all-MVFC selection a year ago.

On defense, senior defensive tackle Cole Langer received preseason accolades. The Dell Rapids native tallied 43 total tackles, including team bests of 10 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks to earn second-team all-league honors.

Rounding out the Jackrabbit preseason individual honorees was senior linebacker Jesse Bobbit, who was an honorable mention selection. Bobbit ranked second on the team last season with 97 tackles.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: The Jackrabbits' top two receivers from a season ago, wide receiver Jake Wieneke and tight end Dallas Goedert, were both been recognized on preseason All-America teams leading into the 2016 season.

Jake Wieneke, a junior wide receiver from Maple Grove, Minnesota, earned first-team preseason accolades from both STATS and HERO Sports after a 2015 season in which he caught 72 passes for a Missouri Valley Football Conference-record 1,472 yards with 11 touchdowns. He also is being considered for FCS Offensive Player of the Year awards by both STATS and College Football Performance Awards on preseason watch lists.

Wieneke has been selected to All-America teams each of his first two seasons with the Jackrabbits, including first-team recognition from STATS and the Associated Press last year.

A junior tight end from Britton, Goedert was a second-team selection to the STATS squad after earning all-MVFC honors in 2015. He ranked second on the squad with 26 receptions, 484 receiving yards and three touchdowns last season.

A junior from Britton, Goedert tied a school record with four touchdown receptions and also established new career highs with eight total receptions and 204 receiving yards as the Jackrabbits opened league play with a 52-14 home victory over Western Illinois on Oct. 1. He scored SDSU's first three touchdowns – all in the first half – on plays of 24, 25 and 24 yards. His fourth touchdown covered 70 yards midway through the third quarter and tied Don Bartlett's mark of four receiving touchdowns set in a 1949 game against North Dakota State.

Goedert's 204 receiving yards marked the sixth-highest single-game total in program history. He has now caught a touchdown pass in all four games this season and five in a row dating back to the 2015 campaign.

Rozeboom, a redshirt freshman from Sioux Center, Iowa, recorded a game-high 10 tackles, including a sack, and returned an interception 37 yards for a touchdown in SDSU's victory over Western Illinois. Rozeboom's interception return came on the first offensive series of the second half and extended the Jackrabbits' lead to 35-14. It was the first of two interception returns for touchdowns in the third quarter by SDSU, which held the Fighting Leathernecks scoreless over the final three quarters.

WIENEKE SETS TD MARK: Junior wide receiver Jake Wieneke etched his name into the Jackrabbit record book Sept. 17 as he became the school's career leader in touchdown receptions with 35. Wieneke caught three touchdown passes in the game against Cal Poly, breaking a tie with Jeff Tiefenthaler (32 touchdown receptions from 1983-86).

Wieneke currently is tied for the lead among all Football Championship Subdivision receivers with eight touchdown receptions, including back-to-back three-score performances against Drake and Cal Poly. He has now tallied 10 multi-touchdown games in 30 career contests, including four three-touchdown games.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS: Junior tight end Dallas Goedert tied a 67-year-old single-game school record with his four touchdown receptions Oct. 1 against Western Illinois. Don Bartlett had held the record all by himself since catching four touchdown passes against North Dakota State in 1949.

Goedert has caught at least one touchdown pass in all four games this season and has a streak of five consecutive games with a TD reception dating back to a 2015 FCS playoff game at Montana. He ranks third in the FCS with seven touchdown receptions so far this season.

CHRISTION'S STRING ENDS: South Dakota State quarterback Taryn Christion had his streak of consecutive passes thrown without an interception end on his final attempt of the Jackrabbits' game against Cal Poly on Sept. 17. Christion did not throw an interception in his first 90 attempts of the 2016 season and had his streak grow to 133 attempts dating back to the 2015 campaign.

For the season, Christion has completed 63-of-91 passes (69.2 percent) for 809 yards and 10 touchdowns against one interception.

The longest streak on record for consecutive attempts without an interception by a Jackrabbit quarterback is 155 by Brad Nelson between the 2003 (last 143 passes) and 2004 (first 12 passes) seasons.

MORE ON CHRISTION: Taryn Christion is on pace to shatter the school record for touchdown passes in a season. Through four games, Christion has thrown 15 TD passes, including a career-high five last week against Western Illinois. Christion's 15 touchdown passes have been against only one interception and his passing efficiency rating of 189.2 leads the Football Championship Subdivision.

The Jackrabbits' single-season record for touchdown passes is 30 by Ryan Berry, a mark established in SDSU's first season in the Missouri Valley Football Conference, 2008.

TWO HIT CENTURY MARK — TWICE: Two South Dakota State receivers went over the 100-yard mark for the first time in the same in nearly two seasons when Jake Wieneke and Dallas Goedert accomplished the feat Sept. 17 against Cal Poly.

Wieneke tallied nine catches for 114 yards and three touchdowns, while Goedert added five receptions for a 101 yards and a score.

The tandem struck again in the Jackrabbits' next game, Oct. 1 versus Western Illinois, as Goedert recorded career highs of eight catches for 204 yards and four touchdowns, while Wieneke contributed receptions for 102 yards. Goedert's 204 receiving yards were the sixth-highest single-game total in program history.

Prior to this season, the last time SDSU had two receivers tally 100-plus yards in the same game was against Western Illinois on Nov. 15, 2014, when Wieneke tallied 10 catches for 159 yards and three touchdowns, and Jason Schneider added seven receptions for 114 yards and a pair of scores.

BOBBIT SETS CAREER MARK: Senior linebacker Jesse Bobbit set a new career high with 16 tackles in a losing effort against Cal Poly on Sept. 17. Bobbit, who tallied 90 or more tackles each of the past two seasons, had recorded 13 tackles in a game on two previous occasions. His 16 tackles were the most by a Jackrabbit in a non-overtime game since T.J. Lally made 20 stops against North Dakota State on Nov. 1, 2014.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS: South Dakota State scored in all three phases of the game in its 56-28 victory over Drake on Sept. 10. The Jackrabbit defense posted a touchdown late in the third quarter as defensive end Jared Blum intercepted a screen pass at the Drake 3-yard line and scored.

In the fourth quarter, reserve linebacker Cody Hazelett blocked a punt, which Jake Harms picked up at the Drake 2-yard line and ran in for a touchdown. It was the first time SDSU scored on a blocked punt in any game since 2009, and in a home game for the first time since 1993.

The Jackrabbits' three interceptions marked their most in a game since picking off three passes in a 31-28 win at Northern Iowa on Oct. 18, 2014.

PICK-SIX TIMES THREE: South Dakota State defenders have returned three interceptions for touchdowns through the first four games of the 2016 season. Two of those pick-six returns came in a 52-14 victory over Western Illinois on Oct. 1, marking the first time the Jackrabbits returned two interceptions for scores in the same game since a Nov. 10, 2007, contest against Southern Utah. Both of the interception returns this past week came in the third quarter — 37 yards by Christian Rozeboom and 19 yards by Dallas Brown.

The Jackrabbits' seven interceptions as a team so far this season have come from seven different players.

FAMILY TRADITION: Redshirt freshman kicker Chase Vinatieri turned in an impressive collegiate debut against TCU on Sept. 3 to lead the Jackrabbits' special teams unit.

The nephew of former Jackrabbit and current Indianapolis Colts kicker Adam Vinatieri, Chase Vinatieri connected on field goals of 25 and 37 yards, and made all five of his extra-point tries, for 11 points.

For the season, Chase Vinatieri has made 4-of-5 field goal tries and all 24 extra-point attempts to rank third on the team with 36 points.

During his career at SDSU from 1991-94, Adam Vinatieri made a then-school-record 27 field goals and was a NCAA Division II All-American as a punter his senior season.

OFF TO THE RACES: Sophomore running back Isaac Wallace scored on an 87-yard touchdown run in the second quarter of the Jackrabbits' Sept. 3 season opener at TCU.

It marked the first time since Nov. 8, 2014, when Jake Wieneke scored on a 91-yard pass and Zach Zenner posted a 94-yard touchdown run that the Jackrabbits had a scoring play from scrimmage longer than 80 yards.

JACKRABBIT BLOODLINES: Senior defensive tackle Cole Langer leads a group of South Dakota State football players with Jackrabbit bloodlines.

Langer, a native of Dell Rapids, South Dakota, is a third-generation Jackrabbit student-athlete. His grandfather, Jim Langer, is a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame after a standout career with the Miami Dolphins and Minnesota Vikings. The starting center for the undefeated Dolphins team in 1972, Jim Langer earned all-conference honors in football at South Dakota State as a linebacker in 1969 and was an All-America selection in baseball as an outfielder that same year.

In addition, Cole Langer's father, Tracy, was an all-conference catcher in baseball for the Jackrabbits from 1989-92. Tracy's brothers, Craig and Russ, also played baseball at South Dakota State.

Several other Jackrabbits have extensive Jackrabbit bloodlines, including senior offensive lineman Seth Lansman, whose parents are both former SDSU student-athletes. Lansman's father, Howard, lettered in football from 1984-85, while his mother, Tara (Tessier) was a standout women's basketball player from 1985-88. Tara Lansman was inducted into the Jackrabbit Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2014.

Another returning Jackrabbit with family ties to Jackrabbit Athletics are brothers Mason and Tristan Leiseth, whose father, David, lettered in football for SDSU from 1989-91 and also was a three-time All-American in the shot put.

Two other sets of brothers are on the 2016 Jackrabbit roster: Jake and Clark Wieneke, along with Jacob and Jordan Brown.

Three other members of the Jackrabbit freshman class also have family ties to South Dakota State Athletics. Quarterback Taryn Christian's mother, Heather, played volleyball at SDSU and fullback Turner Blasius' father, Justin, was an NCAA Division II national wrestling champion.

Finally, freshman kicker Chase Vinatieri is the nephew of former Jackrabbit and current Indianapolis Colts standout kicker Adam Vinatieri.

WORKING OVERTIME: South Dakota State ended the 2015 regular season on a sour note as the Jackrabbits dropped a 30-24, double-overtime decision at Western Illinois. It marked the Jackrabbits' first overtime loss in a Missouri Valley Football Conference game after previously winning double-overtime decisions at Missouri State in 2011 and versus Northern Iowa in 2013.

Overall, SDSU is 3-5 in games decided in overtime since the format was adopted in the mid-1990s. The Jackrabbits won their inaugural overtime game, 30-27 in two overtimes against Nebraska-Omaha in the 1998 Hobo Day game.

ACADEMIC HONORS: For the eighth season in a row, South Dakota State claimed the Missouri Valley Football Conference Team Academic Award, compiling a 3.084 team grade-point average during the 2015 season. The Jackrabbits have received the award every year they have been a member of the MVFC.

Also during the 2015 season, three Jackrabbit football student-athletes were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Team. Nick Mears was a first-team selection, while Shayne Gottlob and Jake Wieneke were second-team honorees.

The Jacks were presented the Team Academic Award by MVFC Commissioner Patty Viverito during the Sept. 17 game against Cal Poly.

FAREWELL TO COUGHLIN: The 2015 campaign marked the 54th — and final — season of Jackrabbit football at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium. Since opening on Sept. 22, 1962, SDSU compiled a 181-108 record (.626 winning percentage) on its home field.

Since moving to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision in 2004, the Jackrabbits posted a 50-16 mark at CAS.

NEW FACILITIES: The South Dakota State University football program is expected to benefit greatly from the addition of two new facilities.

The Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex, which opened in the fall of 2014, serves as the indoor practice facility for the Jackrabbit football team and a number of other Jackrabbit squads. The complex, which features 100 yards of soy-based AstroTurf, also houses a 300-meter competition indoor track and expanded areas for strength and conditioning, sports medicine and coaches' offices.

In October 2013, SDSU officials announced lead gifts totaling \$12.5 million from Sioux Falls banker Dana Dykhouse and philanthropist T. Denny Sanford toward the construction of a new football stadium. The announcement was made in conjunction with the 100th Hobo Day game at SDSU.

Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium, which has a seating capacity of 19,340 replaces Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, which served as the home of Jackrabbit football since 1962. The new stadium was built in phases on the current Coughlin-Alumni Stadium site, with completion scheduled in time for the Sept. 10 season opener against Drake.

The first phase of the stadium project, which included new seating on the east side and south end zone, along with installation of the largest scoreboard in the Football Championship Subdivision, was completed in September 2015.

The \$65 million project was approved by the South Dakota Legislature in March 2014 and signed into law by Gov. Dennis Daugaard. The new west tower includes premium seating — club seats, loge boxes and suites — as well as a spacious press box and other amenities.

The stadium is being funded through private gifts and long-term revenue streams, including concessions and suite, loge box and ticket sales. Bonds are being secured to finance nearly half of the project's construction, with the remaining amount coming from private support.

JACKRABBIT INSIDER: Throughout the 2016 football season, head coach John Stiegelmeier will be a guest on the "Jackrabbit Insider," a weekly behind-the-scenes look at South Dakota State University athletics.

The half-hour television show, which features interviews with Jackrabbit coaches and student-athletes, airs Sundays at 10 p.m. on Sioux Falls-based MyUTV. The show is also broadcast on KELO-TV at 11 p.m. Central Sunday and at 10 p.m. Mountain Time Sunday on KDLO-TV. Online, the show can be viewed on demand at GoJacks.com.

STIG SHOW: The John Stiegelmeier Radio Show airs each Monday throughout the 2016 football season.

The show is scheduled to air at 6 p.m. on the Jackrabbit Sports Network, originating with WNAX 570 AM in Yankton. In addition, the weekly show also will be streamed online free of charge at GoJacks.com.

Hosted by Tyler Merriam, the John Stiegelmeier Radio Show will also feature interviews with Jackrabbit student-athletes and assistant coaches. Jackrabbit fans are encouraged to attend the show in person at Cubby's Sports Bar and Grill, 307 Main Ave., in downtown Brookings.

A LOOK AHEAD: The Jackrabbits wrap up a two-game road swing with an Oct. 15 game at North Dakota State. The Battle for the Dakota Marker is slated for a 2:30 p.m. kickoff at the Fargodome in Fargo, N.D..

The game will be televised through ESPN3.com.

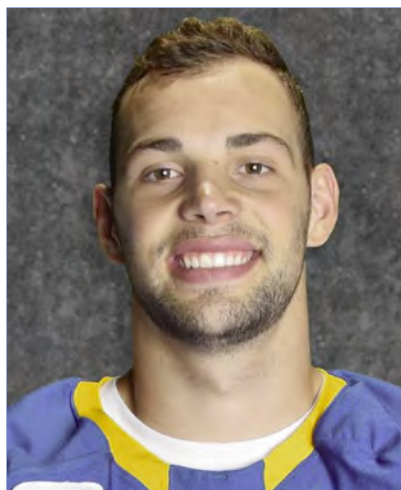

FORT WORTH, Texas — TCU scored touchdowns on its first three possessions of the second half, breaking a halftime tie and going on to hold off South Dakota State, 59-41, in the season opener for both teams on Sept. 3 at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

The two teams combined for more than 1,100 yards of total offense in the contest, starting with a 10-play, 80-yard scoring drive by the Horned Frogs on their first possession of the game.

SDSU reeled off the next 17 points to take a 10-point lead early in the second quarter. Redshirt freshman kicker Chase Vinatieri opened the Jackrabbit scoring with a 25-yard field goal. After TCU committed a penalty with the ball on the Jackrabbit 1 on the ensuing possession, Makiah Slade intercepted a pass in front of the goal line and Isaac Wallace broke through the Horned Frog defense four plays later for an 87-yard touchdown run.

Jordan Brown jumped a route and recorded the Jackrabbits' second interception of the game moments later and SDSU again turned a miscue into points as Taryn Christian weaved his way through the TCU defense for a 12-yard touchdown run.

The momentum shifted back in TCU's favor on an 81-yard punt return for touchdown by KaVontae Turpin. Horned Frog quarterback Kenny Hill then scored on the first of his three rushing touchdowns in the game with 1 minute, 37 seconds to play in the first half, finding paydirt from 4 yards out after the Jackrabbits committed their only turnover of the game.

The Jackrabbit offense responded with a quick four-play, 63-yard scoring drive that ended with a 31-yard touchdown pass from Christian to Jake Wieneke down the middle of the field.

However, TCU's quick-strike offense came through with a drive in the waning seconds of the first half to tie the game at 24 heading into intermission as Ryan Graf banked his 32-yard field goal attempt off the left upright but through.

The Horned Frogs' offense continued its prowess as TCU took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards on five plays, culminating in a 60-yard catch and run by Jaelan Austin.

SDSU knotted the game for the last time, at 31, countering with an eight-play, 75-yard drive finished off by a 16-yard scoring strike from Christian to tight end Dallas Goedert. Goedert ended the night by tying his career-high with five catches for 96 yards.

Kyle Hicks and Hill scored on respective runs of 3 and 6 yards to push the TCU lead to 45-31 with under three minutes to play in the third quarter, but the Jackrabbits again found the answer by scoring the next 10 points. A 34-yard Christian-to-Wieneke connection on the next-to-last play of the third quarter was followed by a 37-yard Vinatieri field goal three minutes into the fourth quarter.

TCU had the final answer thanks to a fortunate bounce as Taj Williams corralled a batted ball down the left sideline and scored from 46 yards out. Hill, who completed 33-of-49 passes for 439 yards and ran for 45 more, capped the scoring with an 8-yard TD run with four minutes to play.

The Horned Frogs ended with a 662 to 461 advantage in total offense. Christian ended the night with a career-high 333 yards on 19-of-30 passing, while Wieneke collected eight receptions for 196 yards. Wallace led the ground game with 112 yards on only seven carries.

Williams gathered in a game-high 11 receptions for 158 yards for TCU.



Jake Wieneke hauled in eight receptions for 196 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the Jackrabbits' season opener Sept. 3 at TCU. Wieneke has topped the 100-yard mark for receiving in all three career games against FBS opponents.

Junior Anthony Washington, who was making his Jackrabbit debut, led the defensive effort with 11 tackles. Jesse Bobbit added eight. Travin Howard made 10 stops to lead TCU, and Aaron Curry recorded 1.5 sacks.

#9/12 SDSU 56, DRAKE 28

South Dakota State scored touchdowns in all three phases of the game to go on to defeat Drake, 56-28, in the inaugural game at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium on Sept. 10.

Playing before a crowd of 15,171, the Jackrabbits, ranked ninth in the STATS FCS media poll and 12th by the FCS coaches, evened its record at 1-1. Drake, a member of the Pioneer Football League, dropped to 0-2.

SDSU took the opening kickoff and marched 63 yards on five plays. All-America wide receiver Jake Wieneke scored the first points in the new stadium on a 3-yard pass from Taryn Christian 2 minutes and 10 seconds into the contest.

Christian put the Jackrabbits out front 14-0 four minutes later as he scrambled 36 yards for a touchdown, then connected with Wieneke from 15 yards out later in the first quarter to push the SDSU lead to 21-0. Christian completed all 11 of his pass attempts in the first quarter for 123 yards, hooking up with seven different receivers.

Drake put together two long scoring drives in the second quarter to climb back into the contest. The first Bulldog touchdown came on a 3-yard pass from Cody Thibault to Eric Saubert to cap an 11-play, 74-yard drive. In the final minute of the first half, Conley Wilkins scored on a 3-yard run that finished off an 11-play, 83-yard drive that pulled Drake to within 28-14 heading into halftime.

In between the two Bulldog touchdowns, the Christian-to-Wieneke connection was again on display as the tandem teamed up for a 1-yard touchdown with 5:04 to play in the first half. With his third score of the night – and fifth this season – Wieneke tied Jeff Tiefenthaler's school record for career touchdown receptions with 32.

Late in the third quarter, the Jackrabbit defense got into the scoring act as defensive end Jared Blum picked off a screen pass and scored from 3 yards out. Jesse Bobbit and reserve defensive end Austin Smenda also intercepted passes in the second half.

Christian tallied his career-best fourth touchdown pass of the game on the first play of the fourth quarter as Dallas Goedert leaped up and over a defender and made a highlight-reel one-handed catch in the right corner of the end zone that pushed the SDSU lead to 42-14.

SDSU further salted away the game less than two minutes later on a blocked punt for touchdown. Cody Hazelett blocked the Drake punt attempt and Jake Harms scooped up the loose ball at the 2-yard line before finding paydirt.

Drake's Drew Lauer returned the ensuing kickoff 87 yards for a touchdown, but the Jacks tacked on a final touchdown later in the fourth quarter on a 7-yard pass from backup quarterback Zach Lujan to Alex Wilde.

The Jackrabbits ended the night with a 460-310 advantage in total offense. Christian completed 24-of-28 passes for 224 yards, while Lujan went 3-for-3 for 49 yards. Adam Anderson tallied five receptions for 66 yards and Connor Landberg tied a career high with five catches for 43 yards.

Brady Mengarelli led the Jackrabbit rushing attack with 69 yards on seven carries.

For Drake, Wilkins gained 67 yards on 18 carries, while Saubert and Keegan Gallery each finished with six receptions and respective yardage totals of 53 and 42 yards. Thibault started at quarterback and completed 12-of-17 passes for 91 yards, while Grant Kraemer came on in relief to complete 12-of-18 passes for 133 yards.



Taryn Christian accounted for five touchdowns — four passing and one rushing — to lead the Jackrabbit offense in a 56-28 win over Drake in the inaugural game played at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium on Sept. 10.

Redshirt freshman linebacker Christian Rozeboom led the Jackrabbits with 12 tackles, followed by eight-tackle performance by Dallas Brown. Of Brown's eight tackles, 3.5 were for loss, including 1.5 sacks.

GAME 3 — SEPT. 17, 2016

CAL POLY 38, #9/10 SDSU 31

Jake Wieneke set the South Dakota State career receiving touchdowns record, but it was the running game of Cal Poly that stole the show and sent the Mustangs to a 38-31 victory over the ninth-ranked Jackrabbits at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium in the 50th Annual Beef Bowl.

Cal Poly, which racked up 601 yards of total offense, including 440 on the ground, improved to 2-1 overall. SDSU fell to 1-2 overall in losing for the first time at its new stadium.

A junior from Maple Grove, Minnesota, Wieneke wasted little time in etching his name into the Jackrabbit record book. The two-time All-American made a leaping catch over a Mustang defender in the left back corner of the end zone for a 13-yard touchdown pass from backup quarterback Zach Lujan on the game's opening drive. It was Wieneke's 33rd career touchdown reception, breaking the previous mark of 32 by Jeff Tiefenthaler from 1983-86.

Cal Poly knotted the game at 7-all late in the first quarter on a 35-yard touchdown run by Kyle Lewis.

A 30-yard field goal by Chase Vinatieri in the opening minute of the second quarter gave SDSU a 10-7 lead, but Cal Poly would come back to score the final 10 points of the first half with two long drives. The Mustangs' Kori Garcia capped a seven-play, 87-yard drive with a 21-yard touchdown run, which was followed by a 16-play, 75-yard march that chewed up the final 8 minutes and 3 seconds of the half before ending on a 22-yard field goal by Casey Sublette that gave Cal Poly a 17-10 halftime advantage.

SDSU turned a Cal Poly fumble on the opening drive of the second half into the tying score as Taryn Christion returned to the Jackrabbit lineup and hit Wieneke for a 4-yard touchdown pass that tied the game at 17, where it remained until the fourth quarter.

The final stanza was full of long drives and big plays. Cal Poly regained the lead 75 seconds into the quarter on a 33-yard touchdown pass from Dano Graves to Lewis that finished off a seven-play, 90 yards drive.

Brady Mengarelli put the Jackrabbits across midfield with a 48-yard return on the ensuing kickoff and SDSU needed only one play to tie the game for a third time as tight end Dallas Goedert slipped through a tackle and rumbled down the left sideline for a 48-yard touchdown.

Cal Poly answered back less than a minute later on a 76-yard touchdown run up the middle by Joe Protheroe.

Wieneke and the Jackrabbits responded with an eight-play, 75-yard drive capped by his third touchdown of the night, a 15-yard pass play from Christion with 9:14 to play.

The Mustangs then churned out a methodical 12-play, 84-yard game-winning drive that ended on a 13-yard touchdown run by Protheroe with 2:28 to play. Protheroe tallied 217 yards on 31 carries, with 140 of his yards coming in the fourth quarter.

SDSU's final attempt to tie the game ended when Christion was intercepted Aaryn Bouzos on third down. The Mustangs picked up one first down to seal the victory.

Cal Poly finished with a 601-336 advantage in total offense. Lewis, who scored both rushing and receiving, accumulated 66 yards on the ground and 122 through the air on five catches. Mustang quarterback Dano Graves completed 9-of-11 passes for 161 yards.

Wieneke ended the night with nine catches for 114 yards and the three touchdowns, while Goedert collected five catches for a career-high 101 yards. Isaac Wallace and Brady Mengarelli each gained 40 yards rushing. Christion completed 20-of-33 passes for 252 yards.



Dallas Goedert caught a touchdown pass for the third consecutive game in 2016 and fourth in a row dating back to last season, scoring from 48 yards out early in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 24-all.

The Jackrabbits were led defensively by Jesse Bobbit, who registered a career-high 16 tackles. Chris Balster added a career-best 10 stops. Josh Letuligasenoa and Jerek Rosales each made a team-best six tackles for Cal Poly.

GAME 4 — OCT. 1, 2016

#15/16 SDSU 52, #8/8 WESTERN ILLINOIS 14

Dallas Goedert tied a school record with four touchdown receptions and the South Dakota State defense returned two second-half interceptions for scores to rout eighth-ranked Western Illinois, 52-14, in the Missouri Valley Football Conference opener for both teams Oct. 1 at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The 15th-ranked Jackrabbits, who scored the final 45 points of the game, improved to 2-2 overall. Western Illinois suffered its first loss of the season, falling to 3-1.

A junior tight end from Britton, Goedert tallied each of the Jackrabbits' first three touchdowns on the evening and tied Don Bartlett's record of four touchdown receptions set in 1949 midway through the third quarter.

All 14 of the Fighting Leathernecks' points came in the first quarter. Western took advantage of a partially blocked punt on the Jackrabbits' opening drive of the game to put together a quick five-play, 41-yard drive capped by a 6-yard touchdown pass from Sean McGuire.

WIU regained a momentary 14-7 lead late in the opening quarter with a seven-play, 92-yard drive highlighted by a 71-yard run by Stacey Smith on a jet sweep that moved the ball to the SDSU 5. Joey Borsellino finished off the drive with a 3-yard touchdown reception from McGuire.

From there it was all Jackrabbits.

Goedert put the Jackrabbits on the board with a 24-yard touchdown reception from Taryn Christian on SDSU's second possession of the game and later dragged a pair of Western Illinois defenders over the goal line for the tying score early in the second quarter. His third score of the game was another 24-yard reception from Christian midway through the second stanza.

The Jackrabbits' Connor Landberg added another clip to the highlight reel in the closing seconds of the first half after he made an acrobatic one-handed catch in the back corner of the end zone on a 17-yard pass from Christian. The play was originally ruled an incomplete pass, but was later overturned by replay, giving SDSU a 28-14 lead heading into intermission.

SDSU carried the momentum into the second half on defense as red-shirt freshman linebacker Christian Rozeboom intercepted a McGuire pass and rambled 37 yards for a touchdown.

Chase Vinatieri booted a 38-yard field goal to extend the Jackrabbit lead to 38-14 before Goedert moved into the record books with a leaping and juggling catch and run over and through two defenders on the right sideline that resulted in a 70-yard touchdown. Goedert finished the night with career highs of eight catches for 204 yards.

Dallas Brown capped the scoring with the Jackrabbits' second defensive touchdown of the game as he picked off a pass and weaved his way into the end zone from 19 yards out.

The Jackrabbits finished with a 478-342 advantage in total offense. Christian ended the Military Appreciation Night aerial assault 22-of-31 passing for career highs of 361 yards and five touchdowns. Jake Wieneke added seven catches for 102 yards, marking the second game in a row that both he and Goedert topped the 100-yard mark for receiving.

Brady Mengarelli led the SDSU ground game with 41 yards on 11 carries.

The Jackrabbit defense limited the conference's leading rusher, Steve McShane, to 56 yards on 14 carries. Lenoir led the Fighting Leathernecks with 10 receptions for 84 yards, while McGuire was 15-of-27 passing for 113 yards. Trenton Norvell finished at quarterback, completing 5-of-10 passes for 46 yards.

Rozeboom paced the SDSU defense with 10 tackles, including a sack.



Dallas Brown returned the second of two third-quarter interceptions by the Jackrabbits for a 19-yard touchdown. It marked the senior linebacker's third career interception return for touchdown.
