## 5 THINGS TO KNOW - COACH CHARIE PARTRIDGE

**1.** We are excited to be in game week. We started preparation Thursday, but to actually be here on a game week is a great feeling.

**2.** Our current mission is 100% Southern Illinois. I have a ton of respect for Nick Hill. Nick played quarterback there. You can feel them building buzz around his program. I saw a clip where he was driving students to class on his golf cart. I love that. I may steal that idea. Offensively, he was their offensive coordinator last year. They averaged 498 yards per game, which was a record-setting year for their conference. [He] hired defensive coordinator Kraig Paulson, who has a ton of experience. He was at Montana, UNLV and he clearly has a heck of a system with the defense.

**3.** To be honest and this is a unique way for it to happen, injuries are a part of football. Albeit, this is one that happened off the field and in an unfortunate traffic accident, but we will always have contingency plans and backups to those contingency plans. We always have a plan if something were to happen to Reggie or anyone on the football team. So,

when that happens your first priority is to make sure Reggie is ok from a big-picture standpoint. Then football is out the window. That is priority one. You are really on priority four, five and six and then you implement the plan that you already had in place. It is tough of course.

**4.** We are in a great place. As you know football is year-round but these guys were ready to get into game preparation last Thursday. They were tired of hitting after 20-some odd practices. The transition to game preparation is exciting and we had one of our better spiders, what we call non-padded practices, since I have been here.

**5.** We are looking at their offense from last year and we are really looking at UNLV's defense because that is where Coach Paulson is coming from. We go to Southern Illinois defense for personnel reasons. Number five [Chase Allen], their linebacker, is one of their top players and he is an all-league type of guy. That jumped off the defensive film. The have transfers at the corner positions and they moved their

corners into safeties so you have athletic guys moving into safeties. Schematically, what we see is a clear system. Sometimes you look at a film and you have no rhyme or reason. This guy has a system and that means that they are going to be well-coached. They are going to know what to do. Offensively, they are very fast-paced. There is a carry over to what we see daily to what Coach Hill is going to do with his staff on offense. They have named their starting quarterback. There is also a very athletic quarterback in No. 7 [Matt DeSomer] who will also play and we will have to defend him specifically when he is in there and they have a running back from Apopka, No. 5 [DaQuan Isom], who is extremely athletic...There is athleticism and there is confidence on their offense and their defense has a system.

## Watch Lists

### Rimington

Dillon DeBoer is a three-year starter for the Owls at both guard and center. The Tarpon Springs, Fla. native had nine 2015 games with no sacks allowed and seven with no penalties, mirroring his 2014 performance. He has a total of 19 games in the last two seasons with no sacks allowed and 15 without a penalty. Following his junior campaign, DeBoer was one of 11 named C-USA Academic All-Conference. The Rimington Trophy is presented annually to the Most Outstanding Center.

### Bednarik

Trey Hendrickson has been named to the Chuck Bednarik Award watch list. He will enter his final collegiate campaign after tallying a C-USA-high 13.5 sacks in 2015 to earn first team All-Conference USA honors and to finish No. 2 nationally in sacks. The Apopka, Fla. native was part of a defense that set the program's all-time single-season record in sacks at 35. The Bednarik Award is presented to the College Defensive Player of the Year.

### Ray Guy

Dalton Schomp, who led the nation in yards per punt a year ago, will represent FAU on the prestigious Preseason Ray Guy Award watch list. The Seminole, Fla. native averaged 48.0 yards per punt. He tallied 22 punts of 60 yards or more and saw opponents return just 16 of his 45 punts, for an average of 7.2 yards per return. His longest punt of the 2015 season was a program-record 76-yarder at UTEP.

### Wuerffel Trophy

Shalom Ogbonda has been named to the 2016 Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. Ogbonda began working on a master's degree during his junior season. The Sugarland, Texas native has been a key contributor to a record-breaking defensive line. Ogbonda has 53 career tackles, including 1.5 for a loss of five yards in 34 games. He contributed a half sack to the team's 2015 record-setting 35 single-season sacks.

## Head Coach Charlie Partridge (6-18, 5-11)

Charlie Partridge was named Florida Atlantic University's Head Football Coach on December 17, 2013 becoming just the fourth person to hold that title, since the program's inception in 2001. Partridge, a south Florida native, returned home to lead a program that completed its first season as a member of Conference USA and became eligible for a bowl game in 2013.

Upon his arrival, the touted recruiter began building a staff, a recruiting base and a culture by which the program would stand over time. Within weeks that staff was in place and assigned to every high school from the I-4 corridor south. By February, the Owls had added 24 players, 15 from their targeted area. That class included offensive lineman and future Freshman All-American Reggie Bain. The Owls posted a 3-9 record and saw six games decided by a touchdown or less within the last two minutes. Lucky Whitehead became the first FAU wide receiver to earn C-USA post-season honors and D'Joun Smith was taken in the third round of the NFL draft. 2015 followed the same blue print. The recruiting class, tabbed as the best class among C-USA schools, comprised of 27 players, including USA Today Freshman linebacker Azeez Al-Shaair and two others earned a spot on the C-USA All-Freshmen team as well as earned C-USA Honorable Mention recognition. Three players garnered First Team All C-USA honors in 2015. The Owls finished with 3-9 record and saw five games decided by seven points or less. As part of the cultural shift, the Owls posted the most 3.0+ G.P.A.s in program history (46) and the squad's

highest team G.P.A. FAU's defensive line set a new program record in sacks (35) and junior Trey Hendrickson led C-USA in total sacks with 13.5 and was No. 2 nationally in both forced fumbles and sacks. The Owls deep running back corps ended 2015 with the second most rushing yards in program history (1,977) surpassing the 2014 squad (1,963). The special teams unit continued to be a highlight of the program. Junior Dalton Schomp led the nation with a 48.0 yards per punt average. As a unit, FAU was No. 5 nationally in net punting (41.71 net yards per punt).

Partridge came to FAU after a one-year stint at the University of Arkansas where he coached three different defensive linemen to all-conference honors. Defensive ends Chris Smith and Trey Flowers were second-team All-SEC, and defensive tackle Darius Philon was voted to the SEC All-Freshman team. Smith ranked third in the SEC with 8.5 sacks, the eighth-highest single-season total in school history, and ranked seventh in the conference with 11.5 tackles for loss. Flowers ranked second in the SEC with 13.5 tackles for loss, and his three forced fumbles were fourth in the conference. Philon tied for fourth in the SEC with two forced fumbles in conference play and finished the year leading the UA defensive linemen with 46 tackles, including 9.0 for loss and 3.0 sacks.

Partridge also worked with the Razorback specialists, helping tutor kicker Zach Hocker and punter Sam Irwin-Hill. Hocker, who ended his career holding six school records, was a second-team All-SEC selection after he was 28-of-28 on PATs and 13-of-15 on field goals. Hocker made three field goals of more than 50 yards, including a 54 yarder that ranked as the eighth-longest field goal in school history. Irwin-Hill, in his first season at Arkansas, ranked fourth in the SEC and 15th in the NCAA with an average of 44.3 yards per punt. Irwin-Hill boomed a 79-yard punt that is seventh all-time at Arkansas and was tied for the second-longest punt in the NCAA during the 2013 season. Arkansas' net punting average of 39.02 yards ranked fifth in the SEC and 21st in the NCAA.

Prior to Arkansas, Partridge spent five seasons at Wisconsin where he helped the Badgers win three-straight Big

Ten championships and to become the first Big Ten team to play in three-straight Rose Bowls since Michigan following the 1976-78 seasons. Before the 2011 season, he was promoted to associate head coach, co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach after three seasons as the Badgers' defensive line and specialists coach.

In 2012, Wisconsin led the Big Ten and ranked third in the NCAA with a three-and-out percentage of 41.72, and the Badgers' 5.23 three and outs per game topped the Big Ten and was fourth in the country. The Badgers' defense was 13th in the NCAA in total defense and tied for 19th in the country in scoring defense. Wisconsin also ranked 21st in the nation in third-down conversion defense in addition to being third in the conference in sacks and 21st in the NCAA in rush defense and pass efficiency defense and 23rd in the country in pass defense.

The Badgers also produced two of the top nine sack artists in the conference, with defensive end Brendan Kelly tied for seventh with an average of 0.45 sacks per game and defensive end Tyler Dippel's 0.42 per-game average tied for ninth. Defensive backs Devin Smith and Marcus Cromartie both ranked in the top seven in the Big Ten in passes defended with Smith fifth and Cromartie tied for seventh. In addition, Smith also tied for third in the conference in interceptions. Linebacker Chris Borland tied for third in the Big Ten in forced fumbles and fourth in the conference in fumble recoveries, and linebacker Mike Taylor ranked fifth in the Big Ten with an average of 1.15 tackles for loss per game.

The 2011 Wisconsin defensive line typically rotated at least eight linemen every game, even after losing starting defensive end David Gilbert to a season-ending injury after the fourth game. They were a key component in Wisconsin finishing among the top 15 nationally in both scoring and total defense.

The 2010 season was highlighted by the play of J.J. Watt, who won the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Watt was the leader of Wisconsin's defense, finishing the season tied for seventh in the country in tackles for loss with 21.0. A consensus first-team All-Big Ten selection, Watt tied for second in the Big Ten in sacks with 7.0 and tied for third with three forced

fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He tied for second on the team in tackles with 62, led the team with 10 quarterback hurries and also broke up eight passes, blocked three kicks and grabbed one interception. A second-team All-American by Walter Camp, Rivals.com and CBSSports.com, Watt was named Lott IMPACT Defensive Player of the Week three times during the season. He was selected 11th overall by the Houston Texans in the 2011 NFL Draft, the highest for a Wisconsin defensive player since 1992.

In 2009, the UW defensive line exceeded all expectations after losing three senior starters from the prior year. The headliner of the group was senior defensive end O'Brien Schofield, who ranked second in the country with 24.5 tackles for loss, the second-highest total in school history. He also tied for seventh in the country and third in school history with 12.0 sacks, while Watt pitched in with 15.5 tackles for loss. The duo's 40.0 combined tackles for loss were the most by a pair of teammates in the country in 2009.

The defensive line also was instrumental in transforming Wisconsin's rush defense into one of the best in school history. The Badgers led the Big Ten and ranked fifth in the country in rushing defense, allowing just 88.2 yards per game on the ground, the second-best season average in school history. Wisconsin held each of its last 10 opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, the longest streak in the country and the longest streak in school history.

In his first year at Wisconsin, Partridge led a veteran line. The three senior starters, Matt Shaughnessy, Mike Newkirk and Jason Chapman, all earned All-Big Ten accolades while Schofield, in his first season as a starter at defensive end, tied for the team lead in sacks. Following the season, Shaughnessy was a third-round draft pick by the Oakland Raiders.

In his work with the specialists, Partridge led four-year starters placekicker Philip Welch and punter Brad Nortman to leave their mark on Wisconsin's record book. Welch, a first-team Freshman All-American in 2008, finished his career ranked second in school history in points with 384, field goals made with 59 and field goal percentage at .776. Nortman, a two-time honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, was third in school history with a 42.1 career average.

Before his time at Wisconsin, Partridge spent five years at Pitt. For his first four seasons, he coached the defensive line before

switching to tutor the Panthers' linebackers in 2007. He also had special teams coaching responsibilities for the last three seasons, including the last two as special teams coordinator.

Pitt ranked No. 5 nationally and led the Big East in total defense in 2007, allowing just 297.7 yards per game. In addition, the Panthers led the conference and were No. 3 in the country in pass defense, surrendering only 167.3 yards per game. Pitt was fourth in the Big East and 20th in the NCAA with 2.92 sacks per contest. The Panthers' signature defensive effort that year came when they shut down high-powered and No. 1-ranked West Virginia in a 13-9 win that eliminated the Mountaineers from national title contention. Defensive lineman Joe Clermond was a second-team All-Big East selection.

Partridge's special teams units flourished at Pitt. In 2006, his first season as special teams coordinator, Pitt led the Big East in net punting with a 37.54 average and kickoff returns at an average of 24.14 yards per return. Punter Adam Graessle was an All-Big East selection, and kick returner Lowell Robinson led the conference and finished ninth nationally with a 27.9-yard average. ESPN's 2006 college football "play of the year" selection was a 73-yard punt return for a touchdown by Pitt's Darrelle Revis against West Virginia. Revis was drafted 14th overall in the first round by the New York Jets in the 2007 NFL Draft.

Prior to his years at Pitt, Partridge served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach at Eastern Illinois in 2002 and helped lead the team to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs after sharing the Ohio Valley Conference title.

Partridge worked for head coach Dan McCarney at Iowa State from 1998-2001. He was a defensive graduate assistant in 1998-99 and worked with outside linebackers. He became the program's director of football operations in 2000.

Partridge was an NSCA All-American at Drake, where he played defensive line. He was a three-year starter and team captain for the Bulldogs before starting his coaching career at his alma mater as a graduate assistant in 1996-97. He coached running backs, including a pair of 1,000-yard rushers, and served as a strength and conditioning coach.

Partridge, a Plantation, Fla., native, earned a bachelor's degree in secondary education from Drake in 1995 and a master's degree in education from Iowa State in 2002. Partridge and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Alexa and Kylee.

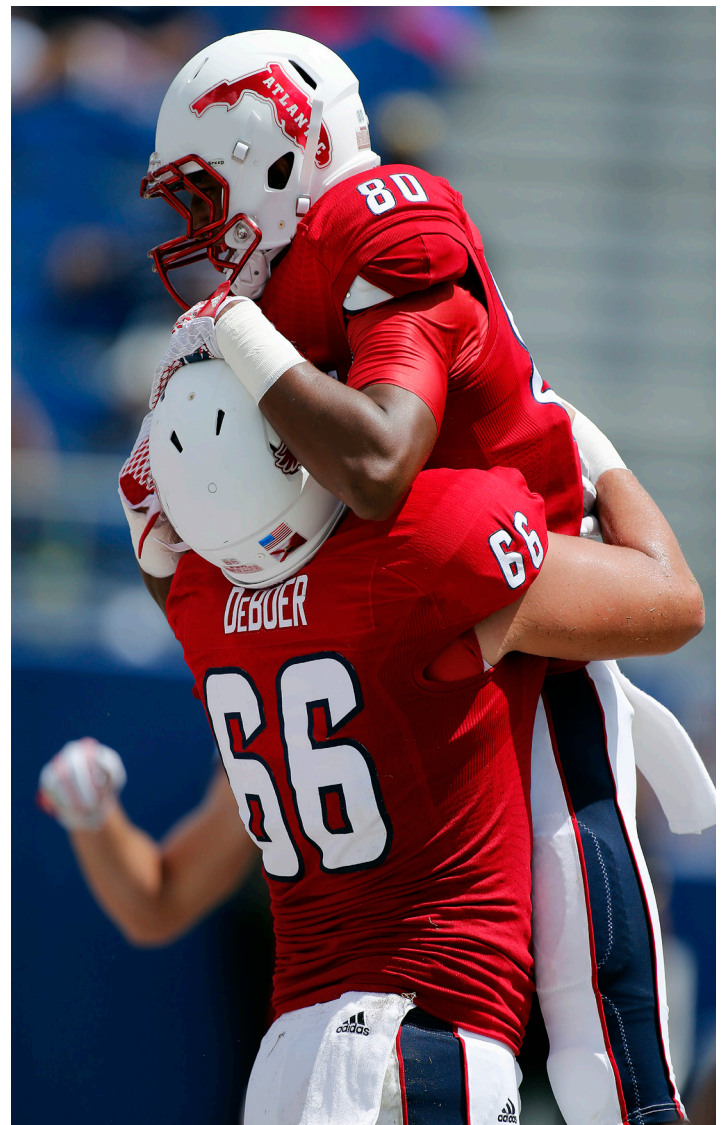

For his career Howell is No. 2 nationally for fewest career yards lost with just 15 yards lost in 183 carries tallying 851 yards. (He is listed with an \* in the career totals. The minimum was 200 carries).

### **Experienced "O" Line**

- Florida Atlantic's offensive line entered the 2016 campaign ranked No. 31 nationally in starts among returning offensive linemen. While the No. 31 national rank is certainly impressive, there were six C-USA schools whose offensive lines entered the year with more experience. The Owls also are working with a new offensive coordinator and a new offensive line coach.

Jason Driskel named starting QB vs Southern Illinois

### **Coach's Quote Head**

"I am proud of both quarterbacks and the entire football team for how they have handled the quarterback competition. The entire body of work from January until now has been taken into account to make the decision. As we approach game week, the recent performances were weighted more heavily. We anticipate and expect both to continue to prepare and compete as if they were starting. Jason Driskel will be the starting

quarterback versus Southern Illinois."

### **Schomp Tops Nation**

Dalton Schomp will return for his senior campaign as the Nation's leader in yards per punt. The Seminole, Fla. native averaged 48.0 yards per punt on the year. His long was set in 2015 at UTEP where his boot was 76 yards. Schomp tallied 45 punts, 22 for more than 50 yards and 18 were inside the 20. He had just two touchbacks on the year.

### **Hendrickson No. 2 Nationally in Sacks**

Trey Hendrickson, the Conference USA sacks leader, finished his junior campaign ranked No. 2 nationally in sacks. Hendrickson was instrumental in FAU setting a new program record for sacks in a season and the junior from Apopka became the program's career sacks leader with one season to play. He was No. 33 nationally in tackles for a loss.

### **Back-to-Back Freshman All-Americans**

FAU is coming off back-to-back seasons with a freshman All-American. Reggie Bain, an offensive lineman from Miami, earned the honor in 2014 from 247/Sports.com and Azeez Al-Shaair, a linebacker from Tampa, was named to the USA Today All-Freshman Team.

### **What's in a Line**

Line strength. Heading into the 2015 season it was known that the strength of the team would be the

experienced defensive line. While the Owls will be much more experienced in 2016, one of the youngest units a year ago, the offensive line, returns depth and talent, however they will need to adjust to a new offensive coordinator and a new line coach. Reggie Bain, a two-year starter and freshman All-American was lost for the season following a traffic accident with less than 10 days before the opener. Dillion DeBoer, a two-year starter that has played both right guard and center moved to left tackle and Tarrick Thomas, a red-shirt freshman who had an outstanding spring stepped in at left guard. Roman Fernandez, who was expected to start at center a year ago before being sidelined with injury will handle center. Antonyo Woods and Kelly Parfitt will anchor the right side at guard and tackle, respectively. Both Woods and Parfitt were instrumental in the program's running game, which ended the season third all-time in rushing yards, as did Jakobi Smith, who has seen time at both guard spots.

### **One of the Country's Youngest**

The Owls were one of the youngest programs in the country in 2015 with 27 freshmen (16 true, 11 redshirt) seeing action. By the numbers, the Owls are projected to have 32 freshmen (19 true) in 2016, 36 sophomores, 18 juniors and 17 seniors. Just two of the team's incoming class hail from a state other than Florida. FAU's 103-man

roster has just nine players who played high school football in a state other than Florida. Head Coach Charlie Partridge is just one of two FBS head coaches who played high school football in Florida.

### **Azeez Al-Shaair Freshman All-American**

Azeez Al-Shaair moved into the lineup as an everyday starter in game four and earned USA Today Freshman All-American honors. The Tampa native saw action in every game in 2015 and drew a total of 10 starts. He led the Owls with 94 tackles. Fellow freshmen Ocie Rose and Jalen Young, both C-USA all-freshmen team members, were instrumental in the team's defensive improvement by more than 40 spots in the national rankings. Rose and Young combined for six (three each) interceptions and tallied four TDs.

### **Owls Named 2016 Captains**

"I'm proud of the team for electing five very capable captains. These men display the desire and passion that it takes to be elite leaders for our team," said Partridge. "They put the team mission first and their personal goals second."
