GAME NOTES

GAME PREVIEW

- » Southern Illinois travels to Missouri State for a second meeting with the Bears. Tip is set for 7 p.m. on the MVC TV Network.
- » SIU has an active nine-game winning streak against Missouri State, the longest winning streak for either school in the series.
- » The last seven games in the series have been decided by six points or fewer. Two of the last five games have gone to overtime.
- » SIU leads the all-time series, 49-37. SIU is 16-23 in games played in Springfield, Mo.
- » Missouri State is 8-2 at home this season. The Bears are led by Tulio Da Silva (14.8 ppg), Keandre Cook (13.7) and Jarred Dixon (12.8).
- » SIU won the first meeting 75-70 in Carbondale in the MVC opener. Ryan Kreklow went 5-for-6 from the 3-point line in that game to lead MSU. Kavion Pippen scored 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting to lead SIU.
- » With a win, SIU would...
 - » Win a third-straight game, the longest winning streak for SIU since winning 5-straight from Nov. 23 - Dec. 8.
 - » Win a third-straight game against MSU at JQH Arena. The Salukis are 4-7 at JQH and have won each of the last three.

FLETCH'S NIGHT

- » SIU senior Armon Fletcher scored a career-high 34 points in the 88-73 win over Indiana State last Wednesday...
- » Most points by any Saluki since Carlton Fay scored 38 in 2010
- » Most points by a Saluki in an MVC game since Troy Hudson had 39 at Indiana State in 1996
- » Tied for fourth-most by a Saluki in SIU Arena in the past 30 seasons
- » Fletcher led SIU to 88 points and 22 assists, both the most points and most assists for SIU in a conference game since Feb. 2, 2005 at Bradley (89 points, 24 assists).
- » Fletcher was named MVC Player of the Week, his first career MVC POW honor.

Head Coach Barry Hinson

With 15 seasons as the head coach at two Missouri Valley Conference schools (Missouri State and Southern Illinois), Barry Hinson is the Dean of the MVC and ranks fourth all-time in overall wins (280) and MVC wins (150).

Hinson, the 2016 MVC Coach of the Year, has guided SIU to three-straight winning seasons. The 2017-18 Salukis finished second in the MVC, the highest finish for the program since 2007.

MILESTONE MOMENTS

- » SIU's veteran Salukis have hit milestones this year...
- » Armon Fletcher scored his 1,000th career point earlier this year at SIU Edwardsville. Edwardsville is Fletcher's hometown.
- » Fletcher, Aaron Cook, and Sean Lloyd Jr. have all reached 100 career steals this year.
- » Thik Bol became the sixth player in program history with 100 career blocked shots.
- » Two players who aren't on the milestone list yet are MVC leaders in those categories: Eric McGill in steals and Kavion Pippen in blocks
- » Head coach Barry Hinson became the fourth coach in Missouri Valley Conference history to win 150 league games as a head coach, joining Henry Iba, Eddie Hickey, and Dana Altman.

LOCK DOWN

- » SIU's current field goal percentage defense (.425) would be the lowest for the program since the 2007-08 (.424). The Salukis rank second in the MVC in field goal defense.
- » In MVC play, SIU has three of the top five in the league in steals. Eric McGill leads the league (1.8). Armon Fletcher (1.6) is 4th and Aaron Cook (1.6) is 5th.
- » SIU held Illinois State to 36.2 percent shooting and Bradley to 35.2 percent from the field--the only time in school history SIU has lost back-to-back games in which it held each opponent under 40 percent from the field.
- » SIU held UNI to 31.5 percent shooting on Jan. 5, marking SIU's best defensive effort against an MVC team since Feb. 25, 2009 at Drake.
- » SIU has held Buffalo (62) to its lowest point totals this season. SIU allowed just 71 points to Kentucky, which was the Wildcats lowest total in non-conference play.
- » SIU held No. 25 Buffalo to 62 points on

STUDENT-ATHLETE OF THE WEEK - BEIBEI JI -

Beibei Ji won both the 1- and 3-meter dives in a 143-100 win over Evansville. She had a career-best 335.25 in the 3-meter dive in the win and is the top-ranked diver in the Missouri Valley Conference.

November 12, matching the best defensive performance against Buffalo in the last three seasons.

- » UB last scored fewer than 62 on March 1, 2016 (vs. Miami (OH) - 59 points). Buffalo averaged 85 points per game last season.
- » SIU's defense was remarkably impressive in two games against the high-powered and nationally ranked Buffalo Bulls, holding UB to 67 points per game, which is 20 points under their average against everyone else.
- » SIU held Buffalo, Arkansas Pine Bluff and Howard all under 40 percent shooting. The last time SIU held three-straight opponents under 40 percent shooting was Dec. 6-14, 2014. (Before that: Dec. 11-19, 2011).

REBOUNTING SALUKIS

- » SIU was -37 in rebounding margin after the first two games of the season. Since then, SIU is +53 in rebounding margin.
- » SIU leads the league in offensive rebounds and offensive rebound percentage in league games.

SALUKIS HONORED

- » Aaron Cook was named to the Las Vegas Holiday Invitational All-Tournament Team. In four games, Cook averaged 11 points and five assists, including a career-high 10 assists vs. Arkansas Pine Bluff.
- » Eric McGill was named MVC Newcomer of the Week (Nov. 25) after averaging 16.0 points in two games at the Las Vegas Holiday Invitational.
- » Sean Lloyd Jr. was named MVC Player of the Week (Dec. 10) after averaging 19 points and 6.5 rebounds in wins over Saint Louis and SEMO.
- » Armon Fletcher was named MVC Player of the Week (Feb. 4) after averaging 24 points on 70 percent shooting in a 2-0 week. His 34 points against Indiana State were the most by any MVC player in 2018-19.

TOUGH SLATE

- » The 2018-19 Southern Illinois non-conference schedule was one of the toughest in school history.
- » SIU's current non-conference strength of schedule is No. 89 nationally, according to the NCAA.
 - » The highest SIU non-conference strength of schedule on record is No. 15 nationally in 2007-08, according to KenPom.
 - » SIU's predicted non-conference strength of schedule is No. 66 nationally, according to Warren Nolan (as of Thursday, January 31).
- » SIU played three regular season non-conference games against ranked teams for just the third time in school history (1974-75, 2007-08, & 2018-19).
- » Southern Illinois scheduled four non-conference games against teams that played in the 2018 NCAA



Tournament, which tied for ninth-most in the nation.

- » Based on the final 2017-18 RPI, Southern Illinois scheduled three non-conference games against teams with top-30 RPIs, tying the 2001-02 team for most in school history. (Kentucky and Buffalo twice)

DAWG BITES

- » Saluki Athletics donated more than 3,500 hours of community service to Carbondale and the surrounding area during Fall 2018, which ranked second in the nation. Notably, the SIU swimming and diving program donated more than 1,100 hours of community service.
- » Three recent Salukis are playing professional basketball. Anthony Beane, Jr., is playing in Latvia. Sean O'Brien is playing in the Czech Republic; and Mike Rodriguez is playing in Iceland.
- » SIU overcame a 21-point deficit to beat Northern Iowa on January 23, the fifth-largest deficit overcome in MVC history. Notably, SIU head coach Barry Hinson has been the head coach for three of the top-seven comebacks in league history. When Hinson was head coach at Missouri State, his Bears overcame a 22-point deficit to beat Winthrop and a 23-point deficit to beat Southern Illinois.
- » Since the start of the 2015-16 season, SIU is 41-3 (.930) when scoring 75 points or more.
- » SIU has won 19 consecutive games when scoring 75+ points. SIU is 8-0 this year and was 9-0 last year. SIU's last loss when scoring 75+ was January 18, 2017 (L, 88-84 at Drake).
- » According to KenPom, Southern Illinois is the 12th-most experienced team in the nation. SIU has six seniors (including three fifth-year seniors) and two juniors (including one fourth-year junior).

» SIU has outscored opponents in the second half in 17 of the last 21 games. On the season, SIU has outscored opponents by 133 points in

the second half.

- » Since the start of the 2017-18 season, Southern Illinois is 24-5 when holding an opponent under 70 points (9-4 in 2018-19).
- » The Salukis have made at least one 3-point field goal in 138 consecutive games.
- » SIU is one of 15 Division I programs with a coach-player family connection. Freshman guard Darius Beane is the son of assistant coach Anthony Beane, Sr.
- » Abby Myers, SIU's graduate assistant, is the only female graduate assistant in Division I men's basketball. She joins four other women serving in operations for Division I men's basketball. Myers is a Du Quoin, Ill., native and grew up with season tickets to Saluki Basketball games.
- » SIU has improved its final MVC standing in each of the last three years: 4th in 2015-16, 3rd in 2016-17, and 2nd in 2017-18).
- » Three all-time great Salukis went into the SIU Hall of Fame in the Class of 2018. Jermaine Dearman, Bruce Weber, and Bryan Mullins all were inducted in October 2018.
- » Armon Fletcher surpassed 1,000 career points in SIU's win at SIU Edwardsville. Fletcher, an Edwardsville native, became the 46th player in program history to surpass 1,000 career points.
- » SIU was receiving votes in Week 2 of the AP top-25, the first time SIU was getting votes in the poll since Nov. 16, 2009.
- » Against Howard (Nov. 19, 2018), SIU had three players with 10+ points, two players with 10+ rebounds, and one player with 10 assists without anyone having a double-double. This was the

only time in school history six different players hit double-figures in a statistical category without anyone recording a double-double.

- » SIU was 7-2 at home vs. MVC teams last season, the program's best mark since going 8-1 in 2007-08. (The Salukis are 3-2 at home in the MVC this year.)
- » SIU held UNI to 31.5 percent shooting on Jan 5., marking SIU's best defensive effort against an MVC team since Feb. 25, 2009 at Drake.
- » SIU scored 88 points and had 22 assists against Indiana State on January 30. Each was the most for SIU in an MVC game since Feb. 2, 2005 at Bradley (89 points and 24 assists).
- » Last season, the home team won 68.9 percent of Missouri Valley Conference games. That home winning percentage ranked third out of 32 conferences.
- » The SIU managers are 5-2 this season. They are 5-0 when playing without the team's SID and 0-2 with him. Follow them on Twitter @SIUManSquad.

SALUKIS IN CUBA

- » The Southern Illinois men's basketball program took a foreign trip to Cuba in August 2018, the program's first foreign trip in a decade.
- » The Salukis played three games against the Cuban National team, which included professional players.
- » SIU went 1-2 against Cuba, becoming the first NCAA men's team to beat the Cuban National Team. Marcus Bartley hit the game-winning 3-pointer with 7.6 seconds remaining to win the game for SIU. SIU nearly won twice, falling by a single point in the final game.
- » In addition to basketball, the Salukis took salsa dancing lessons, toured art galleries, and met the man who holds the world record for rolling the longest cigar. The players and staff also spent three days at a resort in Veradero and had the opportunity to swim in the ocean.

SMART SALUKIS

- » Seven Salukis are on pace to graduate before August of 2019. Southern Illinois and Alabama are the only two programs in the nation on pace to graduate seven players within the next year.
- » Marcus Bartley graduated in May 2018 with a perfect 4.0 GPA in sport administration. Bartley was a third-team Academic All-American in 2017-18.

FOREIGN BORN

- » Four of Southern's 14 players are from other countries: Rudy Stradnieks (Latvia), Thik Bol (Sudan), Sekou Dembele (Mali), and Amadou Fall (Senegal).
- » Head coach Barry Hinson has signed eight foreign-born players in his tenure at SIU.
- » Stradnieks is Saluki Men's Basketball's fifth-ever player from Europe.
- » There are nearly five foreign-born players. David Swedura is the only member of his family born in the US. His parents and older brother immigrated from Poland four years before Swedura was born.

HINSON QUOTES

- » *On the non-conference schedule...* "The whole goal of the non-conference schedule was to give us the best opportunity to prepare ourselves to win a conference championship, to play in postseason, and if you're not fortunate to win it outright, to get an at-large bid. I think we accomplished that."
- » *On having a veteran team with six seniors and two juniors...* "We're able to get into things quicker. Normally at this time of the year, you're teaching the freshmen, 'This is the spot you need to be. This is the spot you need to go.' But the thing I can tell a difference in is maturity. When you have six seniors on the floor, the things that normally would take time in practice to get from Point A to Point B, doesn't take quite as long. Instead of me teaching, you have six seniors, and quite frankly, (Brendon) Gooch, Aaron (Cook) and Eric (McGill) out there teaching as well. So we have nine guys back that are teaching."
- » *On the goals of the season...* "Our goal is to win a Missouri Valley Conference championship. Externally, it's not that great. They still picked us third. There were only four people that thought we would win it. How many votes are there? Forty votes? So 36 people didn't think we would be champions of the league; there were only four people, and one of those was me. The other three, I jokingly said my mom and dad were two of the other three." (Reporter: the Evansville writer said he voted for you). "So we have the Evansville writer, me, and my mom and dad were the four that voted us to win the championship. We talk about it every day. Let's go win a championship. We challenge our guys."

PRESEASON EXPECTATIONS

- » Southern Illinois was picked third in the Missouri Valley Conference, behind Loyola (first) and Illinois State (second). SIU is the only team in the MVC with all five starters returning from last season.
- » Armon Fletcher (First Team) and Kavion Pippen (Second Team) were named to the preseason All-MVC teams.
- » SIU considers itself to have six returning starters because Thik Bol, a preseason All-MVC center in 2017-18, missed the entire season with a knee injury and took a redshirt.
- » Southern's top-four scorers from last year return in 2018-19: Armon Fletcher (14.1 ppg), Sean Lloyd (12.1 ppg), Kavion Pippen (12.1 ppg) and Aaron Cook (9.8 ppg).
- » The Salukis finished second in the Missouri Valley Conference in 2017-18, the program's highest finish since winning the league in 2007.



Each game, we will highlight a different program within Saluki Athletics. This week: Saluki Softball..

- » The Salukis have made 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, most recently in 2017, and last season advanced to the MVC Tournament Championship game for the second-straight season.
- » Under the program's all-time wins leader Kerri Blaylock, SIU advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year from 2002-07, a conference record for longest streak of NCAA appearances.
- » Blaylock's .645 all-time win percentage is the best amongst active MVC coaches and the 34th-best among all active coaches.
- » Saluki softball continues to get it done in the classroom- they have finished in the top-15 nationally in GPA in 16 of the past 18 years-including a runner-up finish in 2007.
- » SIU softball has also had 26 Academic All-Americans in program history. It's the second-most of any program in NCAA softball history, trailing only Nebraska's 30 Academic All-Americans.

QUICK SEASON RECAP

- » **Non-conference:** The Salukis opened the season with back-to-back games against ranked opponents for the first time in school history. SIU led #2 Kentucky by 7 midway through the second half, and led #25 Buffalo for most of the first half, but lost both games.
- » SIU earned its first two wins of the season against Arkansas Pine Bluff and Howard before going to the Las Vegas Holiday Invitational. SIU rebounded from a blowout 84-62 loss to UMass with a 79-69 win over Tulsa.
- » The Tulsa win started a string of five-straight wins for SIU, improving SIU's record from 2-3 to 7-3. In addition to Tulsa, SIU had impressive wins against Saint Louis and at Colorado State during the winning streak, in addition to road wins at SIU Edwardsville and SEMO.
- » Southern closed non-conference play with a three-game losing streak, starting with a home loss to projected NBA lottery pick Ja Morant and Murray State. SIU fell at No. 14 Buffalo, and closed non-con play with a loss to Winthrop after the Eagles hit 15 3-pointers at SIU Arena.
- » **Conference Play:** SIU started MVC play 2-0 with wins over Missouri State and at Northern Iowa, but SIU followed with four-straight losses, the program's first four-game losing streak since 2016.
- » Swings of momentum -- SIU recorded a 21-point comeback win to snap the four-game losing streak, the fifth-largest comeback in MVC history. Loyola abruptly ended that momentum with a 75-50 win over SIU in Chicago, and then the Salukis followed that up with an emphatic 88-73 win over Indiana State, the program's most points in a conference game since 2005.
- » A 72-68 road win at Bradley gave SIU its third MVC win in its last four games following the four-game losing streak.

RESPECT THE MVC

- » The Missouri Valley Conference finished the 2017-18 season ranked No. 8 nationally in conference RPI.
- » Despite that, only Loyola was given a bid to the NCAA Tournament, and nobody else was even given a bid to the NIT.
- » Loyola was considered a bubble team by bracketologists before clinching a bid with the MVC Tournament title. The Ramblers advanced to the Final Four.
- » The MVC has won a first-round NCAA Tournament game in seven-straight seasons.
- » The MVC is 9-0 in first-round NCAA Tournament games since 2012.
- » Last year, only the MVC, Big East, Big 12, and SEC had every member among the top-190 RPI teams.
- » Only nine MVC teams have received bids to the NCAA Tournament since 2013, and two of those nine have reached the Final Four, the best success rate (22%) in the nation.
- » The MVC is 29-36 (.446) in the NCAA Tournament against the Power Six conferences since 1994.

SALUKI SIGNEES

Southern Illinois signed Lance Jones, Chris Payton and Evan Taylor to National Letters of Intent. All three will be freshman in 2018-19.

“These three young men will represent this program, university and region in a first-class manner,” SIU head coach Barry Hinson said. “They are outstanding players on the court and outstanding people off the court. We’re excited to add them to our program.”

SIU assistant Justin Walker was the lead recruiter on Jones and Taylor:

“Lance is a dynamic combo guard,” Walker said. “He’s versatile; he’s already strong enough to play college basketball and can create his own shot. He gets after it on the defensive end and can pick up 94 feet. He has been listed as a top-10 player in the state of Illinois. We’re excited to see what he can do here.”

“ET can play positions 1 through 4,” Walker said. “He can get the rebound and start the fast break. He’s a big-time defender on the ball and can also defend point guards through stretch forwards. Any time you can add a top player in the state of Illinois, who is also a potential future Academic All-American, you’re excited about that. We can’t wait to get Evan here and have him as part of our program.”

Anthony Beane, Sr. was the lead recruiter on Chris Payton:

“Chris will bring tremendous athleticism to our front line,” Beane, Sr., said. “He has the ability to step out and shoot the ball like Armon Fletcher, and he has that athletic explosion like Thik Bol. He’s a great kid and will be a great teammate.”

“Needless to say, we’re excited about adding another quality young man to our program,” SIU head coach Barry Hinson said. “Coach Beane did an outstanding job. He’s been a part of the Bloomington community as a coach and resident, and his relationships really helped us in this situation. We thought all along that Chris is a player that can make immediate contributions, and we’re excited about him and his family joining the Saluki family.”

Walt Frazier — The Rest of the Story

Most people know that Southern’s most famous basketball alum is Walt Frazier (1964-67). What they don’t know is the story of how the Atlanta native ended up in Carbondale.

Basketball was Frazier’s second-best sport in high school. He was offered a scholarship to play quarterback at Georgia Tech, but he didn’t want to play football. Frazier went on a recruiting visit to SIU in 1963 and met with AD Donald Boydston, who was progressive about recruiting minorities during a time when southern schools rarely recruited them. According to Boydston, Frazier didn’t say one word the whole trip, but called shortly after he took the train back to Atlanta to say he was enrolling at SIU.

Frazier was dismissed from the team for academic issues after his sophomore year. He went back to Atlanta and got a job doing manual labor. Frazier called in August of 1965 and asked if he could come back. He was not eligible for a scholarship, so he paid his own way and sat out his junior year, making the Dean’s List. He played on the practice team, and sometimes they would beat the varsity. The 1966-67 storybook season saw Frazier lead the team to the NIT National Championship, beating Marquette in the finals. He turned pro after the season and was named one of the 50 greatest basketball players of all-time by the NBA in 1996.

About Southern Illinois University

Carbondale is located in the southern tip of the state — about a five-hour drive south of Chicago and two hours southeast of St. Louis...Many of SIU’s alums are concentrated in those two cities... Since moving to Division I in 1968, SIU has been to the NCAA Tournament 10 times, including Sweet 16 appearances in 1977, 2002 and 2007. The Salukis have made nine NIT appearances.

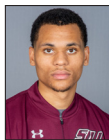
