OPENING TIP

- » The SIU men's basketball team hosts Bradley at 1 p.m. on Saturday at Banterra Center in Carbondale. The game will be televised nationally on CBS Sports Network.
- » SIU has a 10-game home court winning streak, the longest for the program since a 15-game home winning streak spanned parts of three seasons (end of 2005-06 through beginning of 2007-08).
- » Bradley won the MVC Tournament last season and have battled injuries this year. Star forward Elijah Childs returned last week and has averaged 19 points and 9 rebounds in his two games back. Childs did not play in the first game between SIU and Bradley.
- » On Monday, Marcus Domask was named MVC Newcomer of the Week for the third time this season. Domask hit a buzzer-beating jumper to beat Missouri State, 68-66 on Saturday.
- » SIU ranks ninth nationally (of 353) in scoring defense, allowing just 60.8 points per game. SIU also ranks top-50 nationally in fewest fouls per game (14th) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (46th).
- » KenPom ranks SIU No. 2 in the MVC in adjusted defensive efficiency, behind Loyola. KenPom ranks Bradley No. 2 in the MVC in adjusted offensive efficiency, behind Northern Iowa.
- » First-year SIU head coach Bryan Mullins was a sophomore on the "Floorburn U" Salukis that advanced to the Sweet Sixteen in 2006-07. This year's Salukis, who were picked last in the preseason MVC poll, have achieved things not done since Mullins was a player at SIU...
 - » SIU is 9-4 in the MVC, the program's best MVC start through 13 games since 2006-07 (10-3).
 - » SIU's seven-game winning streak came to an end on Wednesday night with a 55-38 loss at Valparaiso. SIU's seven-game winning streak was the program's longest since the 2006-07 Sweet Sixteen team won 13-straight games.
- » Via Sports Reference -- Marcus Domask ranks fourth nationally among freshmen in Win Shares with 4.2. Domask also ranks third in the MVC among all players in Win Shares, behind only Loyola's Cameron Krutwig and UNI's Trae Berhow.

BRYAN MULLINS

Head Coach // First Season

Southern Illinois University welcomed home one of its all-time greats, naming Bryan Mullins as the school's 14th men's basketball head coach on March 20, 2019.

Mullins, 32, is a member of the Saluki Hall of Fame, in recognition of a four-year career (2006-09) in which he set the school record for assists and steals and was the point guard for two NCAA Tournament teams (2006, 2007) and an NIT squad (2008). Southern Illinois advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2007, won a school-record 29 games and finished the season at a school-best No. 11 national ranking.

"I visited with Bryan fairly early in the search process and he has everything you want in a coach," said then-SIU Director of Athletics Jerry Kill. "His interview blew me away. When I walked out of there, it was easy to go to the next round of people, because he set the standard of what they had to be, and I couldn't find anyone better, and I went all over the country."

After graduating from SIU in 2009, Mullins embarked upon a four-year professional career in France. He retired in 2013 and joined Porter Moser's staff at Loyola as the director of operations. Mullins ascended to assistant coach in 2015 and associate head coach in 2018, helping the Ramblers during their historic 2018 season in which the team won a school-record 32 games, advanced to the Final Four and finished the season with a No. 7 national ranking.

"I am so happy for Bryan to get this opportunity to lead his alma mater," Moser said. "I am so grateful for his friendship and loyalty working side-by-side with him for the last six years. He is a tireless worker in addition to being a first-class person and is a perfect fit to lead Southern Illinois University."

Loyola won back-to-back Missouri Valley Conference championships in 2018 and 2019, and Mullins was a key factor in the program's success, recruiting All-Conference players such as Cameron Krutwig and 2019 MVC Player of the Year Marques Townes.

Bryan Mullins is one of nine head coaches in Division I basketball who has played in a SWEET SIXTEEN and coached in a FINAL FOUR.

"Bryan's won at everything he's ever done," said Kill. "There's no doubt in my mind he's the right fit. Our teams will play hard and be tough."

Mullins was a two-time MVC Defensive Player of the Year at Southern Illinois and earned MVC All-Defensive Team recognition in each of his four seasons with the Salukis. As a freshman, the 6-foot-

2 guard led the MVC and ranked seventh in the nation in steals (2.85 spg) and was named to the MVC's All-Newcomer and All-Defensive teams.

"Bryan was one of the greatest players in Saluki history and created so many great memories for Saluki fans during his playing career," said two-time MVC Coach of the Year Chris Lowery, who coached Mullins all four seasons at SIU. "Now, I'm looking forward to him making those memories from the sideline."

Off the court, Mullins graduated from Southern with a degree in finance and a perfect 4.0 cumulative grade-point average. He was a three-time All-Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete Team pick and won the 2009 MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. A two-time Academic All-American, Mullins won the MVC's Dr. Charlotte West Scholar-Athlete award and President's Council Academic award.

"Bryan Mullins is the embodiment of every positive quality we need to lead Saluki Basketball," said former Saluki associate head coach Rodney Watson and current head coach at Southern Indiana. "This is a brilliant hire and great day for Saluki Nation. Congratulations Bryan, we are excited to watch your teams compete for championships."

- » improve to 16-11 overall and 10-4 in the MVC.
- » win its 11th consecutive home games and improve to 7-0 at Banterra Center vs. MVC teams.
- » improve to 12-4 in its last 16 games after starting the year 4-7.
- » improve to 8-1 in its last nine games and remain in second place in the MVC standings.
- » split the season series with Bradley for a fourth consecutive season.
- » improve to 6-1 in the last seven SIU-Bradley games played in Carbondale.
- » improve to 48-50 all-time vs. Bradley and 28-17 vs. the Braves in Carbondale.

WITH A LOSS, SIU WOULD...

- » fall to 15-12 overall and 9-5 in the MVC.
- » have its 10-game home court winning streak snapped, which dates back to a November 16 loss vs. San Francisco.
- » lose back-to-back games for the first time since Jan. 11 and 16 at Bradley and Loyola.
- » be swept in the season series. Bradley would sweep SIU for the first time since 2013.
- » lose to Bradley in Carbondale in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2010 and 2011.
- » fall to 47-51 all-time vs. Bradley and 27-18 vs. the Braves in Carbondale.

SERIES CHECK

- » Bradley leads the all-time series, 50-47. The Salukis own a 27-17 advantage in games played in Carbondale.
- » Bradley won the first matchup this season between the schools, 67-48, which remains SIU's biggest margin of defeat this season. SIU led 29-26 at halftime of the game, but Bradley outscored SIU 41-19 after halftime.
- » SIU redshirt freshman center Sekou Dembele broke his leg right before halftime in the first meeting between the schools this season. Dembele is out for the rest of the season.
- » The teams have split the season series in each of the last three years and 8 of the last 11 years.
- » Dating back to the 2008-09 season, the SIU-Bradley series is deadlocked, 12-12.

THE IMPROBABLE STORY OF THE STREAKING SALUKIS

- » SIU lost more than 70% of its scoring and rebounding from last year's team to graduation. The only two players returning with substantial playing time were Aaron Cook Jr. and Eric McGill.
- » SIU brought in 10 new players. Including redshirt freshman Sekou Dembele, SIU had the fifth-most newcomers in the nation this year.
- » As a result, SIU was picked last in the MVC preseason poll.
- » Then, Cook, who was averaging 15 points per game, broke his hand in the team's sixth game of the season, and he will miss the remainder of the season while obtaining a medical redshirt.
- » Since falling to 4-7, SIU is 11-4 in its last 15 games.
- » SIU had its seven-game winning streak end on Wednesday night at Valpo. That seven-game streak was SIU's longest winning streak since 2006-07 (13).
- » SIU has won 10-straight home games, dating back to a November 16 loss to San Francisco.
- » SIU's 10-game home court winning streak is its longest since winning 15-straight at home overlapping the 2005-06, 2006-07, and 2007-08 seasons.

COOK, DEMBELE OUT FOR YEAR, INJURIES PLAGUE SALUKIS

- » SIU head coach Bryan Mullins announced that senior guard Aaron Cook Jr. would miss the remainder of the season and pursue a medical redshirt. Cook broke his hand in SIU's November 19 game at Murray State.
- » SIU redshirt freshman center Sekou Dembele suffered a fracture to the tibia in his left leg during SIU's loss at Bradley (Jan. 11). He is out for the remainder of the season.
- » With Cook and Dembele out for the season, SIU officially will not play any games during the 2019-20 season with a healthy roster.
- » Ronnis Suggs Jr., Karrington Davis, Aaron Cook, Stevan Jeremic, Will Keller and Dembele have all missed multiple games with injuries, and Eric McGill missed the MVC opener with the flu.

DOMASK AMONG NATION'S BEST FRESHMEN

- » SIU freshman forward Marcus Domask has been one of the top freshmen in the nation. He is averaging 14.5 points (on 49% shooting), 5.3 rebounds and 2.6 assists per game. He is on pace to become the second MVC freshman in the last 27 years to average at least 14 points, 5 rebounds, and 2.5 assists per game.
- » Domask is one of only five freshmen in the nation averaging at least 14 points, 5 rebounds and 2.5 assists.
- » Domask scored 28 points at Drake, the most by an MVC freshman since 2016 (Bradley's Darrell Brown scored 34 vs. Hofstra), and the most for an MVC freshman in a league game since 2014 (Loyola's Milton Doyle scored 28 twice in MVC play that year).

- » Domask went 8-for-8 from the field and 5-for-5 from the 3-point line during a 21-point first half in SIU's win over Valpo (Jan. 7).
- » Domask is a three-time MVC Newcomer of the Week. He is the first SIU true freshman to earn MVC Newcomer of the Week three times. (Now SIU head coach Bryan Mullins earned its twice in 2005-06.)
- » Domask hit the game-winning buzzer beater as time expired to beat Missouri State 68-66 on February 8. Domask took a full-court pass from Ronnie Suggs Jr., took one dribble and shot from 18 feet over a triple team for the win.
- » Via SIU Hall of Famer Mike Reis -- Domask's buzzer beater is believed to be the fifth game-winning shot with no time on the clock in Banterra Center history (56th season).
- » Via Sports Reference -- Marcus Domask ranks fourth nationally among freshmen in Win Shares with 4.2. Domask also ranks third in the MVC among all players in Win Shares, behind only Loyola's Cameron Krutwig and UNI's Trae Berhow.
- » Domask was named Wisconsin's Mr. Basketball in 2019.
- » Domask will become the seventh player in SIU history to average in double figures as a freshman. Kevin Dillard (2008-09) is the only SIU freshman to accomplish that since Kent Williams (1999-00).

SEASON OVERVIEW

- » SIU is in its 106th season of basketball. The 2019-20 Salukis have two returning starters and 11 newcomers (including redshirt freshman Sekou Dembele). SIU's 11 newcomers are tied for fifth most in the nation.

NEWCOMERS

SIU has 11 newcomers in 2019-20 (including redshirt freshman Sekou Dembele), which is tied for fifth-most in the nation.

- » **OUTSIDE EXPECTATIONS:** The Salukis, which lost six seniors to graduation, were picked last in the preseason Missouri Valley Conference poll of head coaches, sports information directors and media. SIU was picked last for the first time since 2012-13.

» **WHAT WAS LOST:** The Salukis lost three starters who earned All-MVC recognition last year: Armon Fletcher (All-MVC second team), Kavion Pippen (All-MVC third team and All-Defensive team) and Sean Lloyd, Jr. (MVC All-Defensive team).

» Fletcher and Lloyd were both career 1,000-point scorers at SIU.

» Pippen, the nephew of Scottie Pippen, averaged 12.4 points on 55.5% shooting over two seasons at SIU. He was briefly signed by the Golden State Warriors during the preseason.

» All three are playing professionally now: Pippen is in the G-League and both Fletcher and Lloyd are playing professionally in Europe.

» The Salukis graduated six seniors from last year's team. In addition to the three playing professionally, SIU lost Marcus Bartley (career 37.7% 3-point shooter), Thik Bol (107 career blocks in 62 games), and Rudy Stradnieks (247 career points).

» **QUICK SEASON RECAP:** After starting the season 2-0, SIU lost 7 of its next nine games to fall to 4-7. The Salukis are 11-4 since.

» Injuries have played a major factor in the season. Aaron Cook, a three-year starter, broke his hand against Murray State (Nov. 19) and is out for the rest of the season. Sekou Dembele (broken leg) is also out for the season. Ronnie Suggs, Stevan Jeremic, Will Keller, and Karrington Davis have all missed multiple games with injuries. At times, SIU has played with as few as eight scholarship players.

» SIU has thrived at home, going 11-1, but SIU started the year 0-7 in true road games before winning three-straight road games during its seven-game winning streak (at Illinois State, Drake and Evansville).

» Only two of SIU's first 19 games were decided by 7 points or fewer, and SIU lost both games. Then, SIU won seven-straight MVC games, and the Salukis went 6-0 in games decided by 7 points or fewer during the winning streak.

WINNERS

» One theme across the players that Mullins has brought into the program: winners.

» Trent Brown (back-to-back), Marcus Domask, Karrington Davis, and Ben Harvey all won state championships in high school.

» Ronnie Suggs, Lance Jones, and Harwin Francois all led their high school teams to state Final Fours or state championship games.

» Barret Benson, as a freshman, helped Northwestern make the NCAA Tournament for the first and only time in that program's history.

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

» **SB | HW** - SIU is wearing a patch on its jerseys this year that is two sets of initials, honoring Harvey Welch and Seymour Bryson, who passed away within days of each other in 2019.

» **Bryson** earned three degrees from SIU, set a school record with 1,244 career rebounds from 1955-59 (a record that still stands), and went on to become the first African-American associate dean of a college and the second African-American dean. **Welch** was the first black athlete to letter in basketball at SIU, playing from 1951 to 1954. After serving 20 years as a colonel in the Air Force he returned to SIU as the first African-American dean of student life and as vice chancellor of student affairs.

» **LEAVE A LEGACY:** Head coach Bryan Mullins honored every member of every SIU team that has made an NCAA Tournament, and NIT, or won a conference championship on a graphic that players walk past on their way from the locker room to the court.

» **TOUGHER TOGETHER:** The official hashtag of the 2019-20 season is #TougherTogether, representing the team's emphasis on toughness and togetherness.

» **HELLENY:** The Salukis have "HELLENY" on the backs of their white warm-up shooting shirts this season, in memory of "Mr. Southern Illinois" Charles Helleny, the long-time SIU fan and supporter who passed away in August. Charles (a 1957 SIU alum) donated the fourth-largest gift in Saluki Athletics history, and SIU's first Division I home game every year is denoted as the Charles Helleny Tip-Off Classic.

» **SALUKI STRIP:** About 2-3 times per season, the SIU swimming and diving team will lead the Dawg Pound (SIU's student section) by showing up to home games in their competition Speedos and swimsuits. Ronnie Suggs played at Bradley for his first two years: "I'm not going to lie; they got me. I missed the free throw."

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

» SIU's team GPA in summer 2019 was 3.385, which is the program's best summer GPA on record.

» The team followed that up with a 3.158 GPA in the Fall 2019 semester, the highest men's basketball program GPA in a semester on record (at least 15 years). Barret Benson, Trent Brown, and Marcus Domask all earned 4.0 GPAs in Fall 2019.

» Senior guard Aaron Cook is a two-time member of the MVC Scholar-Athlete Team. Cook holds a 3.2 GPA in exercise science.

» Three SIU seniors have already earned their degrees. Graduate transfers Barret Benson (Northwestern) and Ronnie Suggs (Mizzou) earned theirs at other institutions. Benson graduated from Northwestern in only three years.

» Eric McGill graduated from SIU in May with a degree in university studies and a minor in marketing. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in recreation.

» SIU has produced 100 Academic All-Americans across all its sports, which is the most of any MVC school and among the national leaders.

DOMINATING DEFENSE

» SIU has held 23 of its 26 opponents under 50% shooting.

» SIU has held nine opponents under 40% shooting.

» SIU held its first three opponents of the season under 40% shooting, the first time SIU opened a season by holding its first three opponents under 40% shooting since 1989-90.

» This year's SIU team has already posted two of the top-10 defensive games of the decade, in terms of field goal percentage defense:

SALUKIS HONORED

» Eric McGill was named MVC Player of the Week on Feb. 3 after averaging 23 points on 67% shooting in wins over Loyola and Drake.

» Marcus Domask was named MVC Newcomer of the Week on December 2. Domask averaged 19.5 points on 59% shooting in two games, including a game-high 21-point performance at Saint Louis.

» Domask earned his second MVC Newcomer of the Week award on January 27. Domask and Bryan Mullins are the only two SIU players to earn MVC Newcomer of the Week three times as freshmen.

» Domask earned his third MVC Newcomer of the Week after averaging 20 points and 7.5 rebounds in wins over Evansville and Missouri State. Domask hit the game-winning buzzer-beater in SIU's 68-66 win over Missouri State.

» Aaron Cook was named to the Sunshine Slam All-Tournament team earlier this year. Cook averaged 17.0 points on 61% shooting to go with 4.3 steals, 3.7 assists, and 2.7 rebounds per game.

» Last year, Cook was named to the Las Vegas Holiday Invitational All-Tournament Team. In four games, Cook averaged 11 points and five assists, including a career-high 10 assists vs. Arkansas Pine Bluff.

» Eric McGill was named MVC Newcomer of the Week (Nov. 25, 2018) after averaging 16.0 points in two games at the Las Vegas Holiday Invitational.

» Cook is a two-time MVC Scholar-Athlete Second Team honoree. He holds a 3.22 GPA.

» Cook was a member of the MVC Most Improved Team in 2017-18 as a sophomore. He averaged 9.8 points and 2.7 assists in 33 games (32 starts) and led the team in 3-point shooting percentage (.384). Cook averaged 3.0 points, 0.9 assists and 10.6 minutes as a freshman the previous season.

DAWG BITES

- » Trent Brown is wearing #24 because his dad, his two brothers, and his granddad all wore #24.
- » Lance Jones never played point guard before this year. He took over as SIU's starting point guard when Aaron Cook Jr. broke his hand at Murray State.
- » Harwin Francois' parents and older brother were born in Saint-Marc (Haiti), and Harwin's first language was Creole.
- » Eric McGill played at Southeast Missouri as a freshman, and his teammate and roommate was now-SIU graduate assistant Robby Dosier.
- » Will Keller grew up in nearby Marion, Ill. (17 miles from Carbondale) and played junior college basketball at John A. Logan in even closer Carterville, Ill. (9 miles from Carbondale). He grew up coming to SIU games.
- » SIU has started the game with a 6-0 run or better six times. (10-0 vs. Illinois Wesleyan, 11-0 vs. UTSA, 6-0 at Murray State, 10-0 at Saint Louis, 8-0 at Southern Miss, and 7-0 at Illinois State.)
- » Saluki Athletics donated more than 5,300 hours of community service to Carbondale and the surrounding area during 2018-19, which ranked fourth in the nation.
- » The Salukis have made at least one 3-point field goal in 172 consecutive games.
- » Head coach Bryan Mullins and assistant coach Brendan Mullins are brothers. They are the only brothers coaching together in Division I basketball.
- » SIU senior guard Aaron Cook Jr. was coached by former SIU great Tony Young in AAU. Young was a defensive bulldog on the mid-2000s 'Floorburn U' Salukis.
- » The hometowns of Aaron Cook Jr. (St. Louis) and Brendon Gooch (Belleville, Ill.) are separated by just 18 miles. They played against each other as early as fifth grade, and played together in eighth grade. "We got that bond right away," Gooch said.
- » SIU men's basketball redshirt freshman Sekou Dembele and SIU women's basketball true freshman Awa Keita are both from Mali and knew each other from playing for the Mali National Teams. The fact they were both recruited by and committed to SIU was coincidental.
- » Head coach Bryan Mullins improved to 11-0 in season openers (4-0 as a player at SIU, 6-0 on staff at Loyola, and 1-0 as head coach at SIU).
- » SIU has won 25-straight games when scoring 75+ points. SIU's last loss when scoring 75+ was January 18, 2017 (L, 88-84 at Drake).
- » Since the start of the 2015-16 season, SIU is 47-3 (.940) when scoring 75 points or more.
- » SIU is 7-0 when both Barret Benson and Eric McGill score in double figures.
- » Four all-time great Salukis went into the SIU Hall of Fame in the last two years. In the Class of 2018. Jermaine Dearman, Bruce Weber, and Bryan Mullins all were inducted. In the class of 2019, Chris Lowery was inducted.
- » Aaron Cook had 7 steals against Oakland (11/10/19), the most in the nation in 2019-20. Cook became the 4th player in SIU history with 7+ steals in a game, and first since Mullins did it in 2006.
- » The SIU manager basketball team is 8-0. GA Tony Wills is averaging nearly 40 points per game, and the Salukis are ranked in the top-5 nationally. Follow the managers on Twitter @SIUManSquad.

PROGRAM HISTORY

- » SIU has a rich basketball tradition. SIU has won more MVC championships and been to more NCAA Tournaments than any other member of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- » Walt Frazier, named one of the NBA's 50 Greatest Players, played at SIU. With Frazier leading the way, SIU won the NIT in 1967. Frazier and his teammates came back to Carbondale in 2017 for a 50-year celebration of the achievement.
- » Most recently, SIU is known for advancing to six-straight NCAA Tournaments from 2002-07 (Five at-large bids). In that stretch, the Salukis made the Sweet Sixteen twice (2002, 07).
- » Bruce Weber started the run and was SIU's head coach for the first two of those NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2002 Sweet Sixteen team. Weber went on to coach at Illinois and is the current head coach at Kansas State.
- » Matt Painter coached SIU in 2004 before leaving for Purdue, where he is still the head coach. Chris Lowery took over for Painter and guided SIU to three more NCAA Tournaments, including the 2007 Sweet Sixteen. Lowery was inducted into the SIU Hall of Fame in 2019.
- » SIU's current head coach, Bryan Mullins, was a point guard on the 2006 and 2007 NCAA Tournament teams.
- » Prior to the run in the 2000s, Rich Herrin led the Salukis to three-straight NCAA Tournaments in the mid-1990s (1993-95). The Salukis won the MVC Tournament ("Arch Madness") in all three seasons, which remains the MVC's only three-peat at Arch Madness. Lowery was the point guard on the 1993 and 94 NCAA Tournament teams.

WALT FRAZIER – THE REST OF THE STORY

Most people know that Southern's most famous basketball alum is Walt Frazier (1964-67). What they don't know is the story of how the Atlanta native ended up in Carbondale.

Basketball was Frazier's second-best sport in high school. He was offered a scholarship to play quarterback at Georgia Tech, but he didn't want to play football. Frazier went on a recruiting visit to SIU in 1963 and met with AD Donald Boydston, who was progressive about recruiting minorities during a time when southern schools rarely recruited them. According to Boydston, Frazier didn't say one word the whole trip, but called shortly after he took the train back to Atlanta to say he was enrolling at SIU.

Frazier was dismissed from the team for academic issues after his sophomore year. He went back to Atlanta and got a job doing manual labor. Frazier called in August of 1965 and asked if he could come back. He was not eligible for a scholarship, so he paid his own way and sat out his junior year, making the Dean's List. He played on the practice team, and sometimes they would beat the varsity. The 1966-67 storybook season saw Frazier lead the team to the NIT National Championship, beating Marquette in the finals. He turned pro after the season and was named one of the 50 greatest basketball players of all-time by the NBA in 1996.

ABOUT SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY

Carbondale is located in the southern tip of the state — about a five-hour drive south of Chicago and two hours southeast of St. Louis...Many of SIU's alums are concentrated in those two cities... Since moving to Division I in 1968, SIU has been to the NCAA Tournament 10 times, including Sweet 16 appearances in 1977, 2002 and 2007. The Salukis have made nine NIT appearances.
