**Series versus Southeast Missouri**

The game versus the Redhawks is the 89th between the two schools and it is the 43rd game played between the two teams in in Cape Girardeau, Missouri. This is the 32nd game between the two teams played at Houck Field. SIU beat Southeast, 12-6, in the first ever game at Houck Field (then Houck Stadium) on Oct. 3, 1930. SIU is 38-42-8 lifetime vs. SEMO. Six of the eight tied games were scoreless, 0-0.

SEMO has won 2 of the last 3 meetings between the schools, including the last one in Cape Girardeau (44-26 in 2019). The teams have split their last six meetings.

Last year (10/30/20) SIU beat the Redhawks, 20-17, on a Nico Gualdoni 27-yard field goal as time expired. SEMO's Kendrick Tiller had tied the game at, 17-17, with a 32-yard field goal 4:16 earlier. RB Javon Williams Jr. rushed for 135 yards and one touchdown to lead the Salukis.

The rivalry is billed as the "War for the Wheel." A ship's wheel trophy is awarded to the winning team.

**Saluki season openers**

Since 2010, SIU is 6-5 in season openers. Since the opening game of the 2009 season at Marshall, the Salukis are 2-6 when they open the season on the road. The last time SIU opened a season with a road victory was August 30, 2018 when it won 49-10 at Murray St. The Salukis are 5-7 all time when they open the season at SEMO.

**Coach Nick Hill and season openers**

SIU is 3-2 in its 5 season openers under current head coach Nick Hill. Hill's

teams are 1-2 in road season openers and 1-1 versus SEMO on opening night.

**Rankings and winning**

The Salukis are ranked 7th in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and 10th in the FCS Coaches Poll. SIU has a 95-43 record when it is ranked. The Salukis are 63-19 lifetime when they are ranked in the Top Ten. Ranked throughout the 2020-21 season, the Salukis were ranked as high as #5 (Mar. 15, 2021) and as low as #24 (Pre-Season).

**Nic Baker is the Salukis' starting QB**

Coach Nick Hill chose Nic Baker (Rochester, Ill.) over Stone Labanowitz (Stuart, Fla.) and made the decision public on August 25. Baker and Labanowitz were two of the three starting quarterbacks the Salukis used in the 10-game 2020-21 season. Kare Lyles was the third 2020-21 starter. Lyles entered the transfer portal following the season and has yet to appear on a roster. Labanowitz left the Salukis following the decision.

Baker was 3-0 as a starter in 2020-21. He quarterbacked SIU's upset of #1 North Dakota State (Feb. 27) in his first career start. He was 17 of 23 passing for 254 yards and one touchdown in the game and was the MVFC's Player of the Week.

Baker came off the bench replacing the injured Lyles one week before that in the spring season opening loss at North Dakota (Feb. 20). One week later, Baker started and threw two TD passes in the Salukis' victory at Youngstown State (Mar. 6th). He started the March 13th home win over Northern Iowa. However, he suffered

a season-ending broken foot in the third quarter of that game.

**Season-opening Saluki QBs**

The 2021 season marks the third consecutive campaign Southern Illinois has opened the season with a different quarterback. Kare Lyles was SIU's opening game QB in 2020-21. Stone Labanowitz took the first snap in 2019. Sam Straub is the last Saluki to open consecutive seasons as SIU's starting quarterback (2017-2018). Chris Dieker (2008-2010) is the last player to begin three consecutive seasons as SIU's starting quarterback.

**Javon Williams, Jr.**

With an injured foot that hampered him throughout the 2020-21 season completely healed, Williams begins the 2021 season in 20th place in career rushing at SIU with 1,618 yards. Should he rush for 1,000 yards in 2021, Williams would move into 6th place in career rushing with 2 years of eligibility remaining.

In two career games vs. Southeast, Williams has rushed for 142 yards on 25 carries and scored two rushing TDs. All but seven of those yards came in the 2020 SIU-SEMO tilt.

If Williams leads SIU in rushing this season, he will be the first Saluki to lead his team in rushing three-consecutive seasons since Tom Koutsos led SIU in rushing from 1999-2001 and Williams will be the second since Burnell Quinn did it 1976-78.

He begins the season in 7th place in career rushing touchdowns with 25. Williams scored 19 of those touchdowns in the 2019 season. He is 16th in career points with 162 and is 8th in career touchdowns with 27.

**Saluki history**

This is Saluki Football's 108th year and its 106th season. Tonight's game is its 1,032nd of all time. Southern's all-time W-L record is 462-538-32. Eight of the 32 ties have come against tonight's opponent, Southeast Missouri.

**Avante Cox on Payton Award Watch List**

Avante Cox, SIU's leading receiver in each of the last two seasons, returns with All-MVFC and All-American laurels for both 2020-21 and pre-season 2021. He starts the 2021 season as one of the finalists for the Walter Payton Award given to the top offensive player in the FCS. He begins this season 12th in career receptions at SIU and 15th in career receiving TDs. Cox had 9 receptions for 74 yards and one TD versus SEMO in 2020 and has 10 receptions for 77 yards and one TD vs. the Redhawks in 2 games in his career. Cox is bidding to become the first Saluki to lead his team in receptions in three consecutive seasons since Brent Little (2003-05). He and QB Nic Baker were teammates at Rochester (Ill.) High School.

**Landon Lenoir begins season fourth in receptions**

Landon Lenoir starts 2021 in fourth place in career receptions at SIU. He is six receptions shy of #3 LaSteven McKinney (2011-14). Lenoir is 6th in career receiving yardage. He is 26 yards shy of #5 Darrell James (2015-18). Lenoir has 11 receptions for 142 yards and no touchdowns in three games vs. SEMO in his career.

**Veteran Salukis**

Of the 110 players on SIU's roster, 19 are seniors. 17 are 6th year seniors and 2 are 5th year seniors.

**Veteran Saluki offensive line**

SIU returns all five of the offensive linemen who started the final three games of the 2020-21 season. This includes RG Chase Evans, who replaced the injured Matt Chimielewski as the starting RG in the regular season finale vs. Southeastern Louisiana.

**Captain Z**

For the second consecutive season LG ZeVeyon Furcron will serve as the team's lone captain. The 6th year senior has started every game the last three seasons and has started all but three games in his 44-game career. He is pre-season All MVFC and was All-MVFC first team in 2020-21. Furcron graduated in 2020 and is currently pursuing a masters degree in Kinesiology.

**Cornerback James Ceasar and Buchanan Award Watch List safety Qua Brown lead a talented defensive backfield**

CB James Ceasar (5-10, 185, Sr.) defended 15 passes in 2020-21 and broke up 14 of them. He was eight in the nation in the FCS in passes defended and led the FCS in passes broken up. His 14 pass breakups were five more than his closest challenger. His 14 pass breakups are the school record for breakups in one season. He is 5th at SIU all-time in that category.

Ceasar is pre-season All-MVFC and was named All-American and All-MVFC First Team in 2020-21. S Qua Brown, who missed several games due to injury last season, yet was a 2nd team All-American and first team All-MVFC in 2020-21, also returns in 2021. He is on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List for the top defensive player in the FCS

**Knighton one shy of tying sack record**

DE Anthony Knighton (6-4, 251, Sr.) is second all-time in sacks at SIU with 22.5 and is one sack shy of tying the school record held by James Phillips (1977-80). He was held without a sack and a tackle for loss in 2020-21. Knighton has 40.5 tackles for loss (TFL) in his career, which places him fifth in program history one-half of a TFL behind Tavita Tovio (1997-00) for fourth.

**Defensive tackles**

SIU's four-man defensive tackle rotation could include two first year transfers. San Diego transfer Kevin Glajchen, an FCS All-American last season, and UT Martin transfer Kameron Bowdry, who started for the Skyhawks, are the



newcomers. Keenan Agnew returns as a starting member of the DT rotation, and redshirt freshman Gianini Belizaire also returns.

**Linebackers**

ILB Bryce Notree is SIU's second leading returning tackler. The SEMO game will be his 34th career game and his 22nd start. He had 62 tackles in 10 games in 2020-21.

SIU will be without it's leading returning tackler in LB Bryson Strong at the start of the season following off-season labrum surgery. He had 72 tackles in 10 games in 2020-21.

**April 24, 2021: SIU's first playoff game since 2009**

The Salukis' 34-31 road victory over No. 3 Weber State in the first round of the 2020-21 FCS playoffs was one of the most dramatic wins in school history.

QB Stone Labanowitz (5-10, 195, Jr.) led the Salukis on a 10 play, 68-yard drive in the game's final moments before connecting on the game-winning, eight-yard score to WR Branson Combs with 52 seconds remaining.

"They went out and got, maybe, one of the biggest wins in Saluki football history," said Saluki head coach Nick Hill following the win. It was just SIU's second-ever playoff road victory in 5 tries.

**Scouting Southeast Missouri**

The Redhawks begin the season unranked after being ranked a season-high 11th in the Stats Perform Poll Mar. 1, 2021. They were #24 when they lost at SIU in October 2020.

SEMO returns nine starters on offense as well as the PK, Kenny Doak. The Redhawks return eight starters on defense including punter Zach Haynes.

Their top two QBs are newcomers: starter CJ Ogbonna (Hutchinson CC) and backup Christian Perez (Louisville and Navy). Head Coach Tom Matukewicz was SIU's linebackers coach from 2001-07 under then-head coach Jerry Kill. He is in his 8th season as SEMO's head coach and is 3-4 versus SIU.

Redhawks assistant head coach and tight ends coach Justin Kramer was a reserve Saluki center from 2002-05. This is Kramer's second stint as a SEMO assistant coach.

**Eight Salukis earn 2020-21 All-MVFC recognition**

Saluki football landed eight players on the 2021 MVFC All-Conference teams – including three honorable mentions. It's the second-straight season the Salukis have had eight All-Conference selections.

The Salukis had four first-team selections – G ZeVeyon Furcron, WRr Avante Cox and DBs Qua Brown and James Ceasar - the program's most first-team selections since 2009.

Southern Illinois also had four players named second-team all-conference – running back Javon Williams Jr., tight end Jacob Garrett, defensive lineman Jordan Berner and linebacker Bryson Strong. The program's honorable mention picks were long snapper Dan Heilbron, punter Jack Colquhoun and linebacker Bryce Notree. All eight players return in 2021, however Garrett is injured and out for the season and Strong is out until mid-season after undergoing labrum surgery.

**Two Salukis earned 2020-21 MVFC All-Academic Honors**

Offensive lineman and team captain ZeVeyon Furcron (4.00 GPA/ Sport Studies) and tight end Jacob Garrett (3.986 GPA/Marketing) were named to the first team, while quarterbacks Nic Baker (3.723 GPA/Finance) and Stone Labanowitz (3.397 GPA/RadioTV Digital) were honorable mentions.

**The Leg from Down Under**

A native of Melbourne, Australia, P Jack Colquhoun (6-2, 190, Sr.) is the first Australian to play for the Salukis since Wayne Cowley

punted in 1973. Colquhoun had seven kicks of 50+ yards in 2020-21, including a 68-yard boot against Missouri State on Mar. 27. Having also sent a punt 64 yards against South Dakota State on Mar. 20, Colquhoun recorded 60-yard-plus punts in back-to-back games for the first time in his three-year career.

Colquhoun averaged 44.2 yards per boot in 2020-21, which stands as the fourth-highest average in an individual season in program history. His career average is 42.1 yards-per-attempt, which is second all-time at SIU.

**The Agnew family legacy**

DT Keenan Agnew (6-0, 275, Jr.) is the third Agnew brother to play at SIU. Fullback Ray Agnew (2010-13) played one season in the NFL for the Cleveland Browns and now serves as a pro scout for the New York Jets. Running back Malcolm Agnew (2013-14) rushed for 1,708 yards and scored 19 touchdowns in two seasons. He is currently the running backs coach for Sacramento State. The Agnews' father is Ray Agnew, who was the 10th overall pick in the 1990 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots and played 11 NFL seasons for three teams. Ray Agnew is now the Assistant General Manager for the Detroit Lions.

**Two new Saluki assistant coaches**

Jami DeBerry is SIU's new special teams coordinator. He has MVFC coaching experience at Indiana St. Tony Carter is SIU's first year cornerbacks coach. He assisted with the NFL's Detroit Lions in 2020 on the heels of an 8-year NFL playing career.

**True Scholar-Athletes**

Saluki Athletics leads the Missouri Valley Conference with 101 Academic All-Americans all-time. Former Saluki center Jacob Marnin was the most recent Saluki Football Academic All-American in 2018 and 2019.

**Quick Facts**

Carbondale is located in the southern tip of the state — about a five-hour drive south of Chicago and two hours southeast of St. Louis...Many of SIU's alums are concentrated in those two cities...The Southern Illinois region is informally known as "Little Egypt," hence the adoption of the Saluki (an Egyptian hunting dog) as the school mascot.

**Salukis' NFL Tradition**

Saluki Football has produced 42 players who have gone on to play in the NFL. Currently active are MyCole Pruitt (Tennessee Titans), Craig James (Philadelphia Eagles), Jeremy Chinn (Carolina Panthers), Ryan Neal (Seattle Seahawks) and Madre Harper (New York Giants). Twenty-eight players have been selected in the NFL Draft all-time from SIU.

\* S Jeremy Chinn, a second-round selection in the 2020 NFL draft by the Carolina Panthers is in his second NFL season. In 2020, Chinn finished second in the Defensive Rookie of the Year voting after becoming just the fifth NFL player and first rookie with at least 100 tackles, two defensive touchdowns, one sack, one interception, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one tackle for loss in a season since 2000

\* RB Brandon Jacobs, two-time Super Bowl Champion with New York Giants

\* QB Jim Hart, four-time Pro Bowl selection who threw for 34,665 career yards with the then-St. Louis Cardinals. Later served as SIU's director of athletics

\* LB Bart Scott, 11-year NFL pro with Baltimore Ravens and New York Jets

\* OL Carl Mauck, 13-year NFL pro and 21-year NFL assistant coach (OL)

**Why the Saluki?**

Southern Illinois had been known as the Maroons since intercollegiate athletics began in 1913. The name "Salukis" became official on March 19, 1951, when the student body overwhelmingly approved the dog as the new symbol of SIU athletics, easily besting "Rebels," "Knights," "Flyers," "Marauders," and "Maroons."

The oldest purebred dogs in the world with records dating back to 3600 B.C., the Saluki is an ancient Egyptian hunting dog known for its speed and hunting prowess.

So why is the name Salukis relevant to Southern Illinois? Natives of southern Illinois know that the region is frequently referred to as "Egypt." Historian Baker Brownell, in his book "The Other Illinois," explained how the region came to be known as Egypt.

He wrote, "There was a drought in the northern counties (of Illinois) in the early 1800s... the wheat fields dried up, the streams died in their beds. But in Southern Illinois, rain fell and there were good crops, and from the north came people seeking corn and wheat as to Egypt of old. Thus, the name, Egypt."

The 19th century drought in Illinois parallels the Biblical account of the country of Egypt.

"There was famine in all lands; but in all the land of Egypt there was bread. All the earth came to Egypt to Joseph to buy grain, because the famine was so severe. And (Jacob) said, 'Behold, I have heard that there is grain in Egypt; go down and buy grain for us there, that we may live, and not die.' So, 10 of Joseph's brothers went down to buy grain in Egypt." (Genesis 41:54b, 57, 42:2-3).

In Egypt at that time, Salukis were accepted as the finest animal a family could possess. Adopting such a well-respected dog as its mascot fit perfectly for a school in a region known as "Little Egypt."

**King Tut's Tomb**

King Tut was the school's first live Saluki mascot after the nickname change from Maroons to Salukis in 1951. King Tut died in 1954 after being struck by a car, and a concrete pyramid was placed at McAndrew Stadium in his honor. The marker was moved to its current spot outside Saluki Stadium in 2010. Before each home game, the Salukis walk from their locker room and pat Tut's Tomb for good luck. Live pure-bred Saluki mascots continue to lead the team onto the field prior to each home game.

## Nick Hill has revitalized Saluki Football, posting back-to-back winning seasons and delivering the program's first FCS Playoff appearance since 2009.

A native son of Southern Illinois and one of Saluki Football's all-time great quarterbacks, Nick Hill made it his mission to restore the program to its place among the nation's best. Ranked No. 8 in the nation at the end of last season, Hill has succeeded, doing so within the environment of the toughest conference in the Football Championship Subdivision.

SIU's historic 2020-21 season, which stretched from August into May due a worldwide pandemic, was filled with starts, stops and re-starts. COVID wiped out all but one game in the fall, but the season resumed in early January and became a four-month roller coaster.

There was a blizzard that froze the stadium turf a week before the spring-season opener. There were injuries to the top two quarterbacks. There were opponents who threw in the towel, rather than play out the season.

Hill led a relentless charge to reverse the fortunes of a program that hadn't been to the playoffs since 2009. He molded a group of young warriors into a team that simply wouldn't give in or give up, a worldwide pandemic notwithstanding.

- Ranked in the Top 25 for 8-straight weeks, longest streak since 2009
- First nationally televised game (ESPN2) since 2007 and the third in school history
- Led the conference this season in Total Offense, Passing %, First Downs, 3rd Down %
- Program produced its fifth active NFL player with the addition of Jeremy Chinn, runner-up for Rookie of the Year in 2020

Hill's journey to the top job at SIU started 17 years ago and just 20 miles north of campus, where he was a football and basketball icon at DuQuoin High School. During his senior year of high school in 2002-03, Hill was the area's Player of the Year in both sports and guided the Indians to the Illinois High School Association 3A state championship football game.

averaged 23 points as a senior at DuQuoin and chose Western Kentucky from a host of Division I offers. A broken hand prematurely ended his freshman season at Western but ultimately led him home.

In the spring of 2004, Hill transferred to SIU to switch sports and play football under head coach Jerry Kill, just as the program was beginning its rapid rise to the top of the league standings.

Hill initially sat behind league Player of the Year Joel Sambursky, before taking over the starting job in 2006. In two seasons as the starter, he went 21-6 and set the school record for passing yards in 2007. He still holds the best completion percentage (68.3) in school history.

Highlights of Hill's playing career include guiding Southern to a win at Indiana in 2006, in which he passed for four touchdowns as SIU became the league's first team to defeat a Big Ten opponent. Hill capped off his career in 2007 by leading the team to the Final Four of the playoffs, where the Salukis ultimately lost a 20-17 heartbreaker to Joe Flacco and Delaware. He was also a finalist for the Peyton Award in '07.

Hill played six seasons of professional football, mostly in the Arena Football League, where he played for head coach Jay Gruden, now the head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins. Hill also had brief free-agent stints with the Chicago Bears in 2008 and Green Bay Packers in 2012.

Playing for Gruden, one of the game's top offensive minds, helped shape Hill's offensive philosophy. First as Southern's offensive coordinator and now as head coach, Hill has refined his own unique style of offense that combines elements of Air Raid, spread and up-tempo.

Hill and wife, Alicia, a former volleyball player at SIU, reside in Carbondale and have two daughters, Skylar and Charley. His brother, former Saluki quarterback A.J. Hill, coaches football at Rochester (Ill.) High School.
