#### Series versus North Dakota State

The Salukis are 4-12 all-time versus the Bison, including a 4-5 mark at home. NDSU has won 11 of the last 12 meetings, with Southern's lone win coming in 2020. That Saluki victory was the first-career start for quarterback Nic Baker and the 38-14 win ended a 39-game winning streak for the Bison, which was ranked No. 1 at the time.

## True freshman Jake Curry to make first-career start at quarterback

True freshman quarterback Jake Curry will make his first-career start for Southern on Saturday. The Edwardsville, Ill. native came off the bench last week versus Illinois State, replacing injured starter Hunter Simmons in the third quarter. Curry completed 8-of-19 passes for 133 yards and two interceptions. At Edwardsville High School, he was a Class 8A First-Team All-State pick in 2023, and passed for 5,042 career yards and 62 TDs, plus 25 rushing TDs.

It has been 35 years since the Salukis started a true freshman at quarterback. The last player to do it was Brendon Prenger, a true freshman walk-on QB, who started at Northern Iowa on Nov. 11, 1989. He passed for 159 yards in a 38-14 loss.

#### **Five-straight ranked opponents**

The Salukis are in the midst of a five-game stretch against ranked, FCS opponents. That's only happened twice in school history — 1999 and 2005. In addition, SIU's FBS opponent this season, BYU, is currently 5-0 and ranked No. 19. To date, Southern has faced the third-toughest schedule in the FCS.

#### **WR Keontez Lewis leads MVFC**

After recording a career-high 153 receiving yards last week versus Illinois State, WR Keontez Lewis leads the MVFC and ranks third in the nation in receiving yards (575). The Wisconsin transfer also leads the league and ranks 10th in the nation in receiving yards per game (95.8)

#### LB Ben Bogle is 2nd in nation in TFL, 13th in sacks

Sophomore LB Ben Bogle ranks second in the the nation with 12.5 tackles for loss. He also ranks 13th in the nation in sacks with 5.5. Both marks lead the MVFC. Bogle had a school-record 3.5 sacks at Austin Peay in Week 2, in which he earned FCS national player-of-the-week honors. SIU's single-game season record for TFL is 18.0 (Bart Scott, 2001) and for sacks is 12.0 (James Phillips, 1978).

#### Illinois State recap

- The Salukis out-gained Illinois State, 487-407
- SIU had seven drives that ended inside the Illinois State 30. The drives resulted in 1 TD, 1 FG, 2 missed FG, 2 INTs and 1 turnover on downs.
- Keontez Lewis' 153 receiving yards were the most by a Saluki since Avante' Cox had 187 at SEMO in 2021.
- Jake Curry's 60-yard completion to Lewis was SIU's longest play from scrimmage this season.

#### Salukis in the national rankings

For the first time since the end of the 2022 season, the Salukis are not nationally ranked, breaking a streak of 19-consecutive

weeks. They were ranked in all 13 polls released in 2023 (as high as #5), and were ranked in the first six polls released in 2024 (as high as #7).

#### Salukis set attendance mark

The 13,421 fans in attendance on Family Weekend versus SEMO were the second-most in stadium history, behind only the standing-room crowd of 15,276 that attended the opening of the stadium in 2010 versus Division II Quincy. Saluki Stadium seats approximately 14,000 in its horseshoeshaped seating bowl, with an official stadium capacity of 15,774 that includes the standing-room area of the berm.

#### **Dawg bytes**

- The Salukis are one of only eight FCS team who have not lost a fumble through the first six games.
- The Salukis rank 17th in the nation in passing offense (259.3), 24th in total offense (401.2), 92nd in scoring offense (20.5) and 121st in red zone scoring (0.583).
- Three of SIU's four captains have missed the last four games due to injuries — TE Aidan Quinn, DE Dewey Greene and LB Colin Bohanek. The only captain to play was C Chase Evans.

#### Postseason success under Hill

Of SIU's 11 playoff appearances in school history, Hill was the quarterback of two teams (2006, 2007) and head coach of three (2020, 2021, 2023). The Salukis have won 11 playoff games in school history and Hill was a part of six of them (quarterbacked three wins and coached three more).

#### Safeties Ubayd Steed and Iverson Brown headline secondary

S Iverson Brown (44 tackles) and S Ubayd Steed (35 tackles), rank second and third on the team in tackles this season. Brown has one interception and four pass breakups, while Steed has two forced fumbles.

The veteran duo combined to start 24 games for SIU last season. Steed started every game in 2023, ranked third on the team in tackles (83) and was named to the MVFC Newcomer Team. He had the game-clinching interception in the win at Northern Illinois. Brown made 11 starts and recorded 33 tackles with a pair of forced fumbles.

#### Top-10 Defense in 2023

Under the direction of first-year defensive coordinator Antonio James, the Salukis had one of the best defensive units in school history, ranking in the Top 10 of the FCS in numerous categories.

## One of two FCS teams to beat FBS opponents in both 2022 and 2023

Southern Illinois was one of two FCS teams that beat FBS opponents in both 2022 and 2023. The Salukis defeated Northwestern in 2022 and beat Northern Illinois in 2023. Sacramento State beat Colorado State (2022) and Stanford (2023).

#### MVFC player-of-the-week honors in Week 3 vs. Incarnate Word

Quarterback DJ Williams, WR Keontez Lewis and C Chase Evans earned Missouri Valley Football Conference player-of-the-week honors, following their performances in the team's 35–28 win over No. 12 Incarnate Word.

A transfer from Murray State, Williams completed 19-of-27 passes for 301 yards and two touchdowns to earn Offensive Player of the Week honors. He also led the team in rushing with 12 carries for 79 yards including a 28-yard TD run.

A Wisconsin transfer, Lewis caught eight passes for 148 yards and one touchdown to earn Newcomer of the Week honors. He also added another touchdown on a 57-yard end-around.

Evans graded out at 91 percent on blocking assignments with five knockdowns and no sacks allowed. A senior, Evans leads SIU with 41 career starts.

## QB Hunter Simmons debuts with back-to-back 300+ passing games

QB Hunter Simmons became the second quarterback in school history to pass for 300+ yards in his first-two career starts (joining Scott Gabbert, 1989). He had 341 versus SEMO on Sept. 21 and 304 at South Dakota on Sept. 28. The school-record for consecutive 300+ passing games is three — Sherard Poteete (1999), Sam Straub (2016) and Sam Straub (2018). Simmons did not throw an interception in 128 pass attempts before suffering a season-ending broken left tibia versus Illinois State on Oct. 5.

#### Salukis vs. the FBS

Since becoming a I-AA/FCS member in 1982, SIU is 6-37 versus FBS teams. Nick Hill was involved in five of the wins as either a player (Indiana-2006, Northern Illinois-2007) or head coach (UMass-2019, Northwestern-2022, Northern Illinois-2023).

SIU is 2-20 all-time against Power Five opponents, and head coach Nick Hill was a key factor in both wins. In 2006, Hill threw four touchdown passes and orchestrated a 35-28 win at Indiana.

The Salukis were the only FCS program to beat a Power Five opponent in 2022, topping Northwestern, 31-24. After trailing, 14-7, in the second quarter, Southern roared back to take a 31-17 lead in the fourth.

#### Why the Saluki?

Southern Illinois had been known as the Maroons since intercollegiate athletics began in 1913. The name "Salukis" became official on March 19, 1951, when the student body overwhelmingly approved the dog as the new symbol of SIU athletics, easily besting "Rebels," "Knights," "Flyers," "Marauders," and "Maroons."

The oldest purebred dogs in the world with records dating back to 3600 B.C., the Saluki is an ancient Egyptian hunting dog known for its speed and hunting prowess.

So why is the name Salukis relevant to Southern Illinois? Natives of southern Illinois know that the region is frequently referred to as "Egypt." Historian Baker Brownell, in his book "The Other Illinois," explained how the region came to be known as Egypt.

He wrote, "There was a drought in the northern counties (of Illinois) in the early 1800s... the wheat fields dried up, the streams died in their beds. But in Southern Illinois, rain fell and there were good crops, and from the north came people seeking corn and wheat as to Egypt of old. Thus, the name, Egypt."

The 19th century drought in Illinois parallels the Biblical account of the country of Egypt in the Book of Genesis. "There was famine in all lands; but in all the land of Egypt there was bread. All the earth came to Egypt to Joseph to buy grain, because the famine was so severe. And (Jacob) said, 'Behold, I have heard that there is grain in Egypt; go down and buy grain for us there, that we may live, and not

# Entering his ninth season as head coach in 2024, Nick Hill has elevated his alma mater into one of the elite programs in FCS Football.

A native son of Southern Illinois and one of Saluki Football's all-time great quarterbacks, Hill made it his mission to restore the program to its place among the nation's best. By any standard, he has achieved that goal.

Playing in the toughest conference at the FCS level, the Salukis have advanced to the playoffs three times in the last four seasons. Southern is one of of only four FCS programs to accomplish this feat, joining North Dakota State, South Dakota State and Montana.

SIU was one of only two FCS teams in the nation to beat FBS opponents in both 2022 (Northwestern) and 2023 (Northern Illinois), joining Sacramento State, which beat Colorado State (2022) and Stanford (2023).

In its history, Saluki Football has won six games against FBS-level teams, and Hill has been a part of five of those wins (two as starting quarterback, three as head coach).

The Salukis have dominated in-state competition under Hill, winning their last eight games against in-state schools (Northern Illinois, Northwestern, Illinois State twice, Western Illinois four times).

Southern has beaten 11 ranked FCS teams in the last four seasons, including wins over the No. 1, No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4-ranked opponents.

Since 2020, the Salukis have been nationally ranked for 43 weeks, including 18 weeks in the top 10 and as high as No. 3. They enter the 2024 season having been ranked every week since Week 1 of 2023.

SIU has won three playoff games in the last four seasons, winning at Weber State (2020), at South Dakota (2021) and versus Nicholls State (2023), in the first home playoff game in Saluki Stadium history.

The program has produced multiple NFL players during Hill's tenure, including safeties Jeremy Chinn and Ryan Neal, cornerbacks Craig James and Madre Harper, plus tight end MyCole Pruitt. Chinn was a second-round draft pick of the Carolina Panthers and the 64th player chosen overall in 2020.

A leader on and off the field, Hill won the 2023 Fellowship of Christian Athletes Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award, sponsored by the AFCA.

Hill's journey to the top job at SIU started just 20 miles north of campus, where he was a football and basketball icon at DuQuoin High School. During his senior year of high school in 2002-03, Hill was the area's Player of the Year in both sports and guided the Indians to the Illinois High School Association 3A state championship football game.

The legend continued on the hardwood where Hill averaged 23 points as a senior at Du Quoin and chose Western Kentucky from a host of Division I offers. A broken hand prematurely ended his freshman season at Western but ultimately led him home.

In the spring of 2004, Hill transferred to SIU to switch sports and play football under head coach Jerry Kill, just as the program was beginning its rapid rise to the top of the

league standings.

Hill initially sat behind league Player of the Year Joel Sambursky, before taking over the starting job in 2006. In two seasons as the starter, he went 21-6 and set the school record for passing yards in 2007. He still holds the best completion percentage (68.3) in school history.

Highlights of Hill's playing career include guiding Southern to a win at Indiana in 2006, in which he passed for four touchdowns as SIU became the league's first team to defeat a Big Ten opponent. Hill capped off his career in 2007 by leading the team to the Final Four of the playoffs, where the Salukis ultimately lost a 20-17 heartbreaker to Joe Flacco and Delaware. He was also a finalist for the Peyton Award in '07.

Hill played six seasons of professional football, mostly in the Arena Football League, where he played for head coach Jay Gruden, who went on to coach NFL's Washington Redskins from 2014-2019. Hill also had brief free-agent stints with the Chicago Bears in 2008 and Green Bay Packers in 2012.

Playing for Gruden, one of the game's top offensive minds, helped shape Hill's offensive philosophy. First as Southern's offensive coordinator and now as head coach, Hill has refined his own unique style of offense that combines elements of Air Raid, spread and up-tempo.

"Coaching my alma mater is a dream come true," Hill said. "I love everything about this region and what it stands for, that blue-collar mentality. This is not my team. This is our team. Our program is going to invest in the community and make us proud on and off the field."

Hill and wife, Alicia, a former volleyball player at SIU, reside in Carbondale and have three daughters. His brother, former Saluki quarterback A.J. Hill, coaches football at Rochester (III.) High School.
