### SAN JOSÉ STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (Game #12)

**Upcoming game:** San José State at #RV/#23-Fresno State  
Saturday, November 24, 2018,

**San José State record:** 1-10, 1-6 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans lost to Nevada, 21-12,, on November 17.

**Fresno State record:** 9-2, 6-1 Mountain West. The Bulldogs won for the eighth time in their last nine contests defeating San Diego State, 23-14, on November 17.

**San José State head coach Brent Brennan:** In his second season as a major college head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 3-21, all with the Spartans. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. He is 0-1 as a head coach against Fresno State.

**Fresno State head coach Jeff Tedford:** In his second season as the Bulldogs' head coach. Has a coaching record of 2-2 with the Bulldogs. Overall, he is in his 13th season as a major college head coach and has a record of 84-59. He is 1-0 as a head coach against San José State, and is a combined 7-2 as a former player (1-1) and assistant coach for Oregon (1-0) and Fresno State (4-1) against the Spartans.

As a quarterback in the 1981 and 1982 games against San Jose State, Tedford led Fresno State to 72 total points rushing for two touchdowns and passing for four. The Spartans, who intercepted five Tedford passes in two seasons, won in Fresno in 1981, 65-33, and lost in San Jose the next year, 39-27.

**Series history:** Fresno State leads the series, 41-37-3. The two teams first played in 1921 and San José State went home with a 14-2 victory. The Spartans' have played more games against the Bulldogs (81) than any other opponent.

Fresno State won last year's game, 27-10, ending San José State's two-game win streak in the series. The last Spartan win in the series was a 16-13 decision at Bulldog Stadium to close out the 2016 season.

San José State and Fresno State still hold the NCAA record for most penalties in a game by two teams, 36 (24 by the Spartans and 12 by the Bulldogs), during the 1986 contest won by San Jose State, 45-41. The Spartans' 24 penalties for 199 yards also remains a Football Bowl Subdivision record for most penalties in a game by one team.

**Valley Trophy:** Since 2013, San José State and Fresno State play for the Valley Trophy. San José State is the metropolitan capital of the high-tech Silicon Valley. Fresno State is the largest city in the agriculturally-rich San Joaquin Valley. The two schools are separated by approximately 150 driving miles.

**Will be missed:** Former San Jose State and Fresno State head coach Darryl Rogers (1934-2018) passed away over the summer at age 84. Rogers was the San Jose State head coach during the 1973 through 1975 seasons and had the same position at Fresno State from 1966 through 1972.

**Television:** ESPNU will provide play-by-play coverage of the San José State-Fresno State game. Jay Alter calls the play-by-play. Ray Bentley offers analysis. The live telecast is scheduled for 4:00 p.m. (PT).

**Returning to Fresno:** San José State offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** played for Fresno State during the 2006 through 2010 seasons and was the Bulldogs' tight ends coach in 2016.

**Final game for Spartan seniors:** San Jose State has 12 seniors in their final game.

**Closing out a season:** San José State is 5-2 in its last seven regular-season finales. Three of those wins are against Fresno State - 2011, 27-24, at Fresno State; 2013, 62-52, in San José; and 2016, 16-13, in Fresno.

**2018 schedule rated as one of the toughest:** According to the NCAA Statistics Service for games played through November 17, San Jose State's first 11 opponents compiled a .604 winning percentage, tied for 21th best among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools and tops among the 12 Mountain West members.

Incorporating Fresno State's 9-2 record, San Jose State's schedule is 12th most challenging based on opponent winning percentage (.623). Boise State, at .562, is the only other Mountain West school is in the top-50 at #43.

**Marked improvement in turnover margin:** With a game remaining in the season, the turnover margin category is one area of significant improvement by San Jose State. The Spartans are among the teams with the most improvement among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams.

**Top-20 in pass interceptions:** San Jose State has 13 interceptions for the season and is tied for 17th nationally in the category. The last time the Spartans had more than 13 interceptions in a season was in 2012 with 15 in a 13-game season. San José State has a season-high three interceptions in its Washington State and UNLV games.

**Tops at his position:** Since the beginning of the season, **Josh Oliver** is the leading pass receiver among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) tight ends.

36 of Oliver's 54 receptions this season resulted in a San José State first down.

Oliver also is third in receiving yards by a listed tight end at 642 yards in games played through November 10.

**Still in the top-5:** Defensive back **Dakari Monroe** is tied for fifth among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players in passes defended with his 1.67 average. For the season, Monroe has four pass interceptions and 14 pass break-ups.

**Tre Walker turns in 2018 Mountain West best:** Wide receiver **Tre Walker** produced the Mountain West's first 200-plus yard receiving game of the 2018 season with his seven receptions for 209 yards and two touchdowns at Utah State on November 10.

Walker's 209 receiving yards are tied for 18th best nationally this season in games played through November 17. Prior to his breakout game, the Mountain West best was 188 yards by Colorado State's Preston Williams in the August 25 game at Hawai'i.

Walker also became the first San Jose State player in 11 years to gain at least 200 yards in pass receiving in a game. The last time it was done was Kevin Jurovich's 233 receiving yards in a 2007 game vs. New Mexico State.

**Walker can join select Spartan group:** Wide receiver **Tre Walker** can become the fifth San José State player in school history to average 20.0 yards per catch in a season based on the NCAA Statistics Service standards of 2.0 receptions per team game played and playing in 75 percent of the team's games in a season.

Walker would miss out on averaging 20.0 yards per catch this season if he was to gain less than 22 yards on three receptions and less than 20 additional yards for every catch starting with his fourth reception in the Fresno State game.

**Sharing a 2018 Mountain West best:** Linebacker **Ethan Aguayo** became the first Mountain West player this season to be credited with 20 tackles in a game with his November 17 afternoon performance against Nevada. Aguayo also added a 27-yard pass interception return that set up San Jose State's first touchdown of the game. His 20 tackles match the 12th best single-game total by a Football Bowl Subdivision player this season.

**Defense contains Nevada:** San Jose State kept Nevada scoreless longer than any 2018 opponent from the opening kickoff to the Wolf Pack's first score of the game. Nevada's first score was a 2-yard run by quarterback Ty Gangi with 1:48 to go in the second quarter. Earlier in the season, Nevada did not register its first points in its loss at Vanderbilt until the 5:41 mark of the second quarter.

**One of just three in 2018:** San Jose State, Air Force and Michigan State are the three teams that were tied or ahead of nationally-ranked Utah State in the second quarter of its game. San Jose State and the Aggies were tied, 10-10, after a Bryce Crawford 28-yard field goal with 13:53 to go before halftime. Air Force had a second-quarter lead and Michigan State led Utah State, 20-14, at halftime.

**Defense turns in strong performance at San Diego State:** San Diego State scored only one touchdown in its 16-13 victory over San Jose State. The previous time the Spartans limited an opponent to one touchdown in a game was a 13-0 loss to Hawai'i on November 15, 2014 at CEFCU Stadium.

San Jose State kept the San Diego State offense in check yielding a season-low 293 yards - the first time since the November 26, 2016 win at Fresno State that the defense kept an opponent under 300 yards of total offense.

**Wuerffel Trophy national semifinalist:** Kicker Bryce Crawford is named one of 12 national semifinalists for the 2018 Wuerffel Trophy. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winner Danny Wuerffel, the award is presented to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player who best combines exemplary community service with academic and athletics achievement.

Crawford is the first Spartan to be named a semifinalist for this award.

**Crawford - one of a kind in 2018:** Four times this season, senior **Bryce Crawford** was the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) kicker nationally-ranked in the top-25 in field goals per game and punting average. He heads into the Fresno State game 23rd in punting average and tied for 33rd in field goals made per game.

**Crawford on track again:** Placekicker **Bryce Crawford** has made his last eight field goal tries since October 13. He is 14-of-19 in 2018 with a season-long 50-yarder against UNLV.

**A punt return for a TD:** Freshman **Tre Jenkins** 41-yard punt return for a touchdown at Utah State (11/10) was the first by a Spartan since Tyler Ervin's 85-yard punt return for a touchdown in the 2015 AutoNation Cure Bowl.

**50-point Spartans:** San Jose State's 50 points versus UNLV are its most points in a game against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent since its 62-52 win over #16-Fresno State in 2013. The Spartans did have a 66-35 triumph over Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) member Portland State on September 10, 2016.

**Four passing TDs:** For the first time since the 2013 win over Fresno State, San Jose State passed for four touchdowns in a game in the UNLV triumph. The Spartans passed for six touchdowns in the Fresno State game.

**Two-way Spartans:** Defensive linemen **Boogie Roberts** and **E.J. Ane** have played offense and defense in the same game this season. Roberts did it first in Hawai'i game as a defensive lineman and running back and again against Nevada. Ane did the same against UNLV and Nevada.

**More ways than one:** For the first time in 10 years, a San José State defensive player played offense and had a rushing attempt when **Boogie Roberts** scored on a 2-yard run in the Hawai'i game on September 29.

Before Roberts, cornerback **Coye Francies**, who played 23 NFL games between 2009 and 2012 with the Cleveland Browns and Oakland Raiders, was the last San José State defensive player with a rushing attempt when he lost five yards on a carry in the 2008 game at Nevada.

**Best rushing effort in 2018:** San Jose State produced a season-high 157 net rushing yards in its win over UNLV. It was the second time this season the Spartans rushed for more than 100 yards in a game.

The last time San Jose State rushed for more than 157 yards in a game was a 173-yard effort at Nevada on November 11, 2017.

**Best of a previous week:** Quarterback **Josh Love's** 451 passing yards in the five-over-time loss to Hawai'i was the best by a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player in games played the week ending September 29, 2018. The 451 yards ranks 16th best through 11 weeks of regular-season action.

**Five overtimes:** San José State's recent 44-41 five overtime loss to Hawai'i on September 29 is the longest game in Spartan football history, the longest by a Mountain West member since the overtime rule was enacted prior to the 1997 season and the most periods played by two teams this season.

San José State now has played 18 overtime periods in its history.

**Oregon game features special teams highlights:** In the Oregon game, San José State blocked its first opponent kick-scoring try in three years when defensive lineman **Bryson Bridges** blocked a Zach Emerson second quarter 42-yard field goal try. The last time a Spartan blocked a kick-scoring attempt was in the 2015 win over New Mexico when Christian Tago was credited with blocking a field goal try.

**A master's degree in their future:** Quarterback **Michael Carrillo** and defensive lineman **Boogie Roberts** are two San José State players playing as graduate students.

Carrillo graduated with cum laude honors majoring in business administration with an emphasis in marketing in May 2018. He is pursuing a M.B.A.

Roberts majored in communication studies. He is enrolled in the master's program in interdisciplinary studies and tailored his curriculum towards classes that focus on sports broadcasting.

**200-plus for Montel Aaron:** Quarterback **Montel Aaron** posted a personal single-game best 215.5 quarterback efficiency rating in the UC Davis game. Aaron completed 13-of-19 passes for 254 yards and touchdown passes of 79 and 17 yards to wide receiver **Bailey Gaither**, all in the second half of the UC Davis encounter.

**Playing in a Super Bowl home:** Levi's Stadium is the ninth former Super Bowl site in which San José State played a football game.

**Families that stay together:** The 2018 San José State team has a set of twin brothers, a third sibling from one family and the remaining brother from a previous Spartan brothers duo.

Redshirt freshman **Isaiah Ossai** is the third Ossai in the family to join the Spartan football program. Brother, **Onyeka Ossai**, was a linebacker during the 2001 through 2003 seasons. Older brother **William Ossai** was a San José State linebacker from 2015.

Defensive back **Andrew Jenkins** is the twin brother of **Tre Jenkins**. Their dad, Aaron Jenkins, played at the University of Washington and ran for a 6-yard touchdown in a 35-31 comeback win over the Spartans in 1988.

**Two generations of Bernardis:** Second-year offensive line **Joe Bernardi** is a second-generation San José State offensive line coach. His dad, **Gary Bernardi**, now at the University of Colorado was the Spartans' offensive line coach during the 2010 through 2012 seasons.

The Bernardis are the second multi-generational football family to serve as San José State assistant coaches. **Tom Quinn**, former New York Giants special teams coordinator, had the same role with the Spartans during the 1999 through 2001 seasons. His dad, **Mike Quinn**, was San José State's special teams coordinator from 1976 through 1978.

**Beyond Football:** The San José State University “Beyond Football” program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2017 through July 31, 2018, the Spartans logged more than 5,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

**Home stadium name history:** San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university’s football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

**Apparel:** In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas.
