San José State record: 1-6, 0-3 Mountain West. The Spartans lost their Homecoming game to Fresno State, 27-10, on October 7. San Jose State is winless in its last five games.

Hawai'i record: 2-4, 0-3 Mountain West. The Rainbow Warriors lost at Nevada, 35-21, on October 7. Hawai'i is winless in its last four contests.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his first season as a major college head coach. Has a major college head coaching record of 1-6, all at San José State. Brennan returned to San José State after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. Brennan is 0-0 as a head coach against Hawai'i. His first college football coaching position was as a University of Hawai'i graduate assistant in 1998.

Hawai'i head coach Nick Rolovich: In his second season as Hawai'i's head coach. Has a coaching record of 9-11, all with the Rainbow Warriors. He is 1-0 as a head coach against San José State.

The Novato, Calif., native was an All-America quarterback for City College of San Francisco (CCSF) and played two seasons for the San Jose SaberCats of the Arena Football League. Rolovich also was an assistant coach at CCSF during the 2006 and 2007 seasons.

Series history: The series is tied, 19-19-1 with one cancellation. The teams have split four games with the visiting team winning each time since the Spartans joined the Mountain West in 2013. Hawai'i won last year's meeting in San Jose, 34-17.

The last time the home team won in this series was on October 14, 2011 when San Jose State edged Hawai'i, 28-27.

The Rainbow Warriors' last home win in the series was a 41-7 triumph during the 2010 series.

The one cancellation in the series was the December 16, 1941 game in Honolulu. The game was canceled following the December 7 attack on Pearl Harbor. The Spartans traveling party arrived in Hawai'i on December 3.

Homecoming for Joe Seumalo: San Jose State defensive line coach **Joe Seumalo** was a defensive lineman on the 1985 through 1988 University of Hawai'i football teams and was a second-team All-Western Athletic Conference selection his senior season.

Seumalo began his coaching career in 1994 and Honolulu's Kaiser High and was a graduate assistant at the University of Hawai'i for the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

Only team with seven games played: Through October 7, San Jose State is the only team among the 129 Football Bowl Subdivision teams to play seven games.

Sixty-one (61) teams have played six games; fifty-nine (59), five games played; and eight (8), four games played this season.

Television: Spectrum Sports Pay-Per-View will provide coverage of the San José State-Hawai'i game. Robert Kekaula calls the play-by-play. Rich Miano provides analysis. Scott Robbs is the sideline reporter. The Spectrum Sports Pay-Per-View coverage begins at 9:00 p.m. (PT).

A 13-game regular-season schedule: For the first time since the 2010 season and fifth time in school history, San José State has a 13-game regular-season schedule. The Spartans also played 13 regular season games in 2002, 1939 and 1937.

The 2017 San José State football team is the first in school history to play six games in a season through September 30.

Busiest defense in FBS football: Seven games has a lot to do with it, but San José State's defense has faced more snaps to date than any other Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in games played through October 7. Spartan opponents have combined for 586 snaps. Cal is next closest at 479.

Spartans in top-15 for defensive touchdowns: Heading into the Hawai'i game, San José State is tied for 13th nationally with two touchdowns scored by its defense.

In the Cal Poly win, linebacker **Jamal Scott** picked up a fumble and ran 22 yards for a touchdown. More recently against Utah State, cornerback **Jermaine Kelly** scored a touchdown on a 68-yard interception return.

Texas, Duke and Utah State share the national lead with four defensive touchdowns.

First to 40, 50, 60, 70, 80 and now 100: Linebacker **Frank Ginda** is the first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player this season to be credited with 50 tackles and now 100 tackles. Ginda has 106 tackles in seven games after a personal single-game high 19 vs. Fresno State on October 7. He heads into the Hawai'i game the national leader in number of tackles and total tackles per game at 15.1.

Looking for better first halves: In San Jose State's last two games, the Spartans yielded one touchdown to UNLV and two field goals to Fresno State in the second half. However, in the first half of the same two games, the opponents combined to outscore, 56-13.

In the second half of the October 7 game vs. Fresno State, San Jose State's defense limited the Bulldogs to 63 yards of total offense and three first downs.

Turnovers still plaguing Spartans: San Jose State passers threw two interceptions and the Spartans fumbled twice leading to 10 points in the 27-10 loss to Fresno State.

This season, Spartan opponents have turned 24 turnovers (11 interceptions, 13 fumbles) into 103 points.

Crawford ties San Jose State career mark and sets school single-season record:

Junior **Bryce Crawford** became the second San Jose State kicker to kick three field goals of 50 or more yards in a career with his second 51-yard field goal of the season in the Fresno State game.

Austin Lopez, the Spartans' primary placekicker during the 2012 through 2015 seasons, kicked three 50 yards field goals in his San Jose State career including a 50-yarder in the 2015 win over Hawai'i at Aloha Stadium.

Crawford is the first Spartan to kick three field goals of 50 or more yards in a season with his three-pointers of 51 yards at Utah (9/16), career-long 53 yards vs. Utah State (9/23) and 51 yards vs. Fresno State (10/7).

Based on available records, Crawford is the first San Jose State player to attempt field goals of 50 or more yards in four consecutive games. He missed a 52-yard try at UNLV (9/30).

50-yard field goals at San José State: Junior **Bryce Crawford** became the tenth San José State kicker to convert a field goal of 50 or more yards when he kicked a 51-yard field goal at Utah on September 16. Crawford's 51-yarder was the first field goal of 50 or more yards by a Spartan since Austin Lopez's 50-yard field goal at Wyoming in 2014.

As an encore, Crawford kicked a career-best 53-yard field goal, the second longest in school history, at home against Utah State on September 23.

His three 50-plus yard field goals this season are the 13th, 14th and 15th times in school history a San José State kicker made a field goal of 50 or more yards.

Crawford (51, 53, 51) and Daniel Carlson of Auburn (54, 52, 50) are two Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) kickers with three or more field goals of 50 or more yards in games played through October 7.

Streak ends: Bryce Crawford made 17 consecutive field goals over two seasons before missing from 52 yards at UNLV on September 30. The 52-yard field goal try was his second of the game after making a 28-yard try in the first quarter.

His streak is the second longest in school history trailing Austin Lopez (2012-15) who made his first 23 field goal tries covering his entire freshman and the first half of his sophomore season.

Crawford's last two misses are 52 yards at UNLV on September 30, 2017 and 50 vs. Hawai'i on October 21, 2016.

Protecting the quarterback: The September 30 UNLV game marked the first time this season San Jose State's quarterbacks were not sacked in a game. This season, the Spartans have allowed 12 sacks in six games.

Protection leads to production: With protection in and around the pocket and no quarterback sacks, San Jose State had its first 300-plus passing yardage game of the season at UNLV with a season-best 315 yards on 49 pass attempts.

30 pass completions: The San Jose State-UNLV game marked the first time since the 2015 season opener at home vs. New Hampshire on September 3 that the Spartans had at least 30 pass completions in a game. San Jose State was 30-of-49 with two interceptions for 315 yards and a touchdown against UNLV.

Seven games, four quarterbacks: In San José State's first seven games, four quarterbacks were used. The last two games are the only ones in which San Jose State played one quarterback.

Based on available records dating back to the 1970's, Allen is the first known San José State player to play as a special teams defender and at quarterback in the same game. Allen did it in the Cal Poly game as a member of the Spartans' punt coverage unit.

Freshman QB starters at San José State: Montel Aaron became the sixth San José State freshman of any kind to start a game at quarterback since freshman eligibility was reinstated in 1972 when he started the September 9 Texas game.

Other Spartan freshmen to start at quarterback since 1972 include current sophomore **Josh Love** in 2016 at Iowa State and **Adam Tafralis**.

Aaron's start at Utah was the 14th time a San José State freshman started a game at quarterback since 1972. **Doug Allen** (1984, one); **Greg Centilli** (1988, two), **Marcus Arroyo** (1998, five), Tafralis (2004, three) and Love (2016, one) were the other occasions a freshman started at quarterback for the Spartans.

Paso Robles pair each with 21 receptions: Wide receiver **Bailey Gaither** and tight end **Josh Oliver**, teammates since their Paso Robles (Calif.) High School days, are two of the team's top-three pass catchers with 21 receptions each.

Oliver had seven career receptions in his first two seasons and has eight receptions including his first touchdown of the season in the last two games against UNLV and Fresno State.

Gaither came into the season with four career receptions as a redshirt freshman. He leads the 2017 Spartans with four touchdown receptions.

Young Spartans: The current San José State football roster consists of 48 freshmen. In the last eight seasons, the 2017 squad is the third one to begin a season with at least 40 freshmen. The 2012 (41) and 2013 (45) teams had more than 40 freshmen on the opening-game roster.

The fewest freshmen on a San José State opening-game roster since 2010 was 35 in 2013 and 2014.

Nate Velichko One of 181 national semifinalists: Offensive tackle **Nate Velichko** is one of 181 semifinalists named by the National Football Foundation for the 2017 Campbell Trophy honoring college football's top scholar-athlete.

On November 1, 12 finalists will be named. Each finalist will be awarded an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship and will be honored in New York city. The winner will have his postgraduate scholarship award increased to \$25,000. Velichko is a senior from Foster City, Calif., majoring in kinesiology.

San Jose State football partners with TEAM Impact: On October 6, the San Jose State University football program and TEAM Impact, a nationally-recognized non-profit organization that seeks to improve the quality of life for children through the power of teamwork, announced that 16-year old Keeanu Linnell from nearby Lathrop, Calif., will be a Spartan for the next two seasons. Linnell was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2015 and is undergoing extensive physical therapy to regain strength and mobility.

The collaboration between the Spartans and TEAM Impact is another element of the team's Beyond Football initiative.

The Ellen Show honors San Jose State football: On the September 26 nationally-syndicated Ellen Show starring Ellen Degeneres, the San Jose State University football team was featured for community support, participation and involvement through its Beyond Football Program. Through the Ellen Foundation and Cheerios cereal One Million Acts of Good, Ms. Degeneres presented San Jose State University football \$25,000 to continue its work in its Beyond Football Program.

San José State participated in Extra Yards For Teachers Program: San José State is one of the eight Mountain West schools participating in the College Football Playoff (CFP) Foundation's Extra Yard for Teachers Week honoring the contributions teachers make in the lives of children of all ages.

Teachers from 19 Bay Area schools were honored at the October 7 Homecoming game and one teacher received a \$1,000 grant from San José State and the Mountain West to help support the teacher's classroom project listed in DonorsChoose.org.

It was hot: The game time temperature for the September 2 San José State-Cal Poly game at CFECU Stadium in San José was recorded as 108 degrees. Previously, the last time San José State played in a game with 100-plus degree weather was on September 1, 2007 in a 45-3 loss at Arizona State. The evening temperature was 101 degrees at kickoff.

Four hours, three minutes of football: For the first time since defeating #16-ranked Fresno State, 62-52, on November 29, 2013, San José State played a football game that lasted at least four hours in its season-opener against USF. The game had 189 plays, 39 possessions, 23 punting situations, and four replay reviews leading to a 4-hour, 3-minute contest. The 2013 San José State-Fresno State game lasted 4-hours and 9-minutes.

Lots of pass plays: San José State's 50 pass plays against #19-USF are the most attempts by the Spartans in a game since 51 passes in a 38-31 loss to Colorado State on November 1, 2014. USF tied a San José State opponent record becoming the third school to run 101 plays against the Spartans in a game.

Lots of punts: The San José State-USF game included 23 punts, 11 by San José State's **Michael Carrizosa** and 12 by USF. The last time the Spartans punted 10 times in a game was in a 48-0 loss to Boise State on October 16, 2010.

USF became the first San José State opponent to punt at least 10 times in a game since Utah State punted 10 times in a 30-7 Spartan victory on October 11, 2008.

The San José State-USF contest marked the first time since a 21-0 home loss to Louisiana Tech on November 8, 2008 that there were at least 20 punts in a Spartan game. That day, there were 11 by San José State and nine by Louisiana Tech.

New coordinators: Offensive coordinator **Andrew Sowder** and defensive coordinator **Derrick Odum** are in coordinator roles for the first time in their respective coaching careers. Sowder is in his ninth season of college coaching; Odum, his 22nd.

Two generations of Bernardis: First-year offensive line **Joe Bernardi** is a second-generation San José State offensive line coach. His dad, **Gary Bernardi**, now at the University of Colorado was the Spartans' offensive line coach during the 2010 through 2012 seasons.

The Bernardis are the second multi-generational football family to serve as San José State assistant coaches. **Tom Quinn**, current New York Giants special teams coordinator, had the same role with the Spartans during the 1999 through 2001 seasons. His dad, **Mike Quinn**, was San José State's special teams coordinator from 1976 through 1978.

Youth movement in the coaching box: Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** (30), offensive coordinator **Andrew Sowder** (29), linebackers coach **Bojay Filimoeatu** (27) and wide receivers coach **Kevin Cummings** (26) begin the season aged 30 and under. Filimoeatu and Cummings will be a year older in December.

Experienced offensive line: San José State's projected starting offensive line of tackles **Troy Kowalski** and **Nate Velichko**, guards **Jeremiah Kolone** and **Chris Gonzalez**, and center **Keoni Taylor** have 155 combined starts after seven games of the 2017 season. That number is tops among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools.

Families that stay together: The 2017 San José State team has two sets of brothers and one second-generation Spartan. Cornerback **Jermaine Kelly** is the older brother of wide receiver **Jeremy Kelly**.

Linebacker **William Ossai**, a senior, is the older brother of freshman **Isaiah Ossai**. Isaiah is the third Ossai in the family to join the San José State football program. Their older brother, **Onyeka Ossai**, was a linebacker during the 2001 through 2003 seasons.

Defensive lineman **Nico Aimonetti** is the son of former San José State team captain and 1986 honorable mention All-America offensive lineman **John Aimonetti**.

New CEFCU Stadium playing surface: In 2017, San José State replaced its FieldTurf playing surface with its second artificial playing surface, AstroTurf, since CEFCU Stadium opened in 1933. For the first time, the Spartans' home field has a two-toned look with light and dark greens alternating every five yards from goal line to goal line.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year two of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

New uniforms: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas.
