## SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (GAME #12 - Louisiana Tech)

**Upcoming game:** San Jose State at Louisiana Tech,  
Saturday, December 5, Joe Aillet Stadium, Ruston, La.,  
1:00 p.m. (CST)/11:00 a.m. (PST)

**San Jose State record:** 2-9, 1-6 WAC. The Spartans won their first game in Western Athletic Conference action on November 28 over New Mexico State (13-10).

**Louisiana Tech record:** 3-8, 2-5 WAC. The Bulldogs have lost five in a row after losing at Fresno State (30-28) on November 21.

**San Jose State head coach Dick Tomey:** Completing his fifth season with the Spartans. Has a 25-34 win-loss record at San Jose State. His win total in his first four seasons as the Spartans head coach is the most by the team since the 1990 through 1993 seasons when those San Jose State teams combined to win 24 games.

Overall, Tomey is finishing his 29th and final season as a major college head coach and has a record of 183-144-7. He ranks in top-10 for coaching victories both in WAC and the Pacific-10 Conferences.

As a head coach, Tomey is 1-3 against Louisiana Tech.

**Louisiana Tech head coach Derek Dooley:** Finishing his third season as major college head coach. Has a record of 16-20, all with the Bulldogs. He is 2-0 as a head coach against San Jose State.

**Three nationally-ranked opponents in 2009:** For the first time since 2001, San Jose State played nationally-ranked teams in successive games. The Spartans opened the season against USC and Utah. Boise State, ranked sixth in the October 25 Associated Press poll became the third nationally-ranked opponent on this year's schedule.

**Multiple top-five foes in 2009:** With Boise State ranked fifth in the October 25 coaches' poll, San Jose State faced two top-five ranked teams in a season for the first time in school history.

In 2000, San Jose State played three top-10 teams at the time of the game (#1-Nebraska, #9-USC and #9-TCU).

**Tomey In Exclusive Coaching Group:** In 2007, Dick Tomey became the 25th coach in college football history to be a head coach in at least 300 major college football games. All of his games have been at the Division I-A/FBS level.

**2009 captains named:** In a players' vote, center **Ronnie Castillo**, linebackers **Justin Cole** and **Travis Jones**, defensive end **Carl Ihenacho** and running back **Patrick Perry** were elected team captains for the 2009 San Jose State University football team.

**Aiming for two in a row:** A San Jose State win at Louisiana Tech would give the Spartans their only two-game winning streak of the season. In addition, San Jose State would finish its third season in five under Dick Tomey with at least a two-game winning streak. In 2005, the Spartans won their final two contests. In 2006, San Jose State won its last two regular-season games and went on to capture the inaugural New Mexico Bowl.

**Winning the home finale:** For the fourth time in Dick Tomey's five seasons at San Jose State, the Spartans won their final home game of the season with a 13-10 decision over New Mexico State. The 2008 loss to Fresno State was the only year in the last five the Spartans did not win their final home game.

**Pointed performances:** The Hawai'i and New Mexico State games mark the first time this season San Jose State has yielded less than 20 points in back-to-back contests. The Spartans allowed 27 points in their last two games compared to an average of 36.9 points in their first nine contests this season. A year ago, San Jose State limited Hawai'i, Utah State and New Mexico State to less than 20 points in a three-game span.

**One penalty in New Mexico State win:** San Jose State was assessed just one penalty in the New Mexico State victory. The last time a Spartan team had no more than one penalty in a game was the 2007 loss at Boise State. San Jose State was not assessed a penalty in that Boise State contest.

**Season-high four quarterback sacks against New Mexico State:** San Jose State was credited with a season-high four quarterback sacks against New Mexico State. **Pablo Garcia** accounted for two; **Justin Cole** and **Travis Johnson**, one each. The Spartans have 18 sacks for the season and half of them have come in the last three games.

**Stingy defensive play:** The New Mexico State win marked the first time this season the San Jose State defense limited an opponent to less than 300 yards of total offense. The Spartans allowed the Aggies to gain 218 yards.

**Pass defense shows progress:** In the last three games, San Jose State's opponents have a combined 400 passing yards on 41-of-80 without a touchdown pass. Utah State gained 50 and New Mexico State, 51. The 50 passing yards by Utah State are the fewest allowed in a game since the 2001 Homecoming game when SMU passed for just 44 yards on 13 attempts.

**Three games and no passing touchdowns allowed:** Heading into the Louisiana Tech game, San Jose State has not yielded a passing touchdown in the last three contests. The last time the Spartans had three consecutive games without allowing a passing touchdown was in the final two games of the 1998 season and the 1999 opener at LSU.

**Fourth overtime game:** The 2009 Hawai'i game is the fourth overtime game San Jose State has played. The Spartans are 1-3 in overtimes with two of the losses to Hawai'i in 2007 and 2009 in San Jose. San Jose State's one overtime win came in the 1997 UNLV game. In all four San Jose State overtime games, the winning team was on offense first.

**Best rushing defense vs. Hawai'i:** For the first time this season, a San Jose State opponent averaged less than 4.0 yards per carry against the Spartans. Hawai'i averaged 3.5 yards per carry and gained just 106 yards against San Jose State.

**Recovering fumbles:** Currently, San Jose State has recovered a conference best 14 fumbles. San Jose State had recovered at least one fumble in 10 of its last 12 games dating back to the 2008 season.

**Freshmen presence:** With a team that started the season with 29 seniors, San Jose State's freshman class has a growing presence in recent game action.

The Boise State game marked the debut of two first-time freshmen in the starting lineup for San Jose State. Defensive end **Travis Johnson** and cornerback **Ronnie Yell** were starters for the Spartans. Yell was credited with four tackles and one pass break-up. Johnson was not in on any tackles.

Redshirt freshmen **Ryan Otten**, a tight end, and two-way player **Ray Rodriguez** also have started games for San Jose State this season. Rodriguez made his first major college in the Nevada game as a defensive tackle.

**Lineup turnover:** After 11 games, four players have started in every contest this season. Offensive tackle **Fred Koloto**, linebacker **Travis Jones**, and defensive backs **Tanner Burns** and **Duke Ihenacho** have started in every game. Forty-four players have started at least once this season. Last season, 37 different players started at least one game.

**New School Record:** Wide receiver **Kevin Jurovich** became the new San Jose State career pass receiving leader in the Utah State game. His two receptions ended a six-day tie with the late **Guy Liggins**, a wide receiver in 1986 and 1987 who caught 149 passes. Jurovich now has 158 career receptions heading into the Louisiana Tech game.

**Exclusive company:** Wide receiver **Kevin Jurovich** can become just the second San Jose State player with two seasons of at least 60 receptions and 800 receiving yards. He needs two catches and 38 receiving yards to reach these thresholds for the 2009 season. In 2007, he caught 85 passes for 1,183 yards.

Guy Liggins is the only Spartan to date with multiple seasons of 60 or more receptions and 800 or more yards. Liggins caught 72 passes for 983 yards in 1986 and 77 balls for 1,208 yards in 1987.

**Season-high passing yardage:** San Jose State racked up its first 300-yard passing game of the season with 302 yards against Idaho.

**A rare 2-point conversion:** San Jose State attempted and converted its first two-point PAT in 33 games when **Jordan La Secla** and **Jalal Beauchman** connected on a scoring play to tie the score at 22-22 in the Idaho game. Prior to the October 10 attempt, the last Spartan 2-point PAT try was in the 2006 Boise State contest. The last time a San Jose State team converted a 2-point PAT attempt was in the 2006 New Mexico State win the week before playing Boise State.

The Spartans go into the New Mexico State game 1-for-2 in two-point PAT attempts after missing a try at Utah State.

**Blocked kick-scoring successes:** After not blocking an opponent's extra-point attempt since 2004 nor a field goal try since 2003, San Jose State has blocked two PAT's and one field goal attempt this season. The Spartans blocked both a Cal Poly PAT (by defensive tackle **Adonis Davis**) and a field goal attempt (by linebacker **Travis Jones**) on September 26. Against Idaho, San Jose State (by **Adonis Davis**) deflected a PAT conversion attempt for the Vandals' first miss of the season.

**Jordan La Secla**, 302 yards (31-43-2) vs. Idaho (10/10)

**Four takeaways again:** The October 10 Idaho game marked the second time this season the San Jose State defense has come up with four takeaways in a game. Against Idaho, the Spartans had a season-high three interceptions and a fumble recovery. The last time San Jose State intercepted three passes in a game was in the October 18, 2008 win at New Mexico State.

**Ground game alive in Cal Poly win:** San Jose State rushed for a season-high 242 yards in its win over Cal Poly on September 26. The Spartans came into the game with just 55 yards in three games. The last time San Jose State rushed for at least 250 yards in a game was the 2008 win over San Diego State when the Spartans ran for 293 yards on 55 carries.

**Lamon Muldrow** was San Jose State's leading rusher against Cal Poly with 184 yards on 20 carries. Muldrow's total is the most by a Spartan since **Yonus Davis** gained 184 yards on 23 carries in the 2006 win over Stanford.

**Another second-half comeback:** The Cal Poly game marked the ninth time since 2005 when Dick Tomey took over as head coach that San Jose State has overcome a halftime deficit. The Spartans trailed 9-6 at halftime and kept Cal Poly scoreless in the second half for the win. Prior to Tomey's arrival, the Spartans needed nine seasons (1996 through 2004) to stage nine second-half comeback victories.

**Tanner Burns - Sept. 28 WAC Defensive Player of the Week:** Safety **Tanner Burns** was named the Western Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week for games ending the week of September 26. Burns was credited with 11 tackles, a fumble recovery, a pass interception and downed a punt on the Cal Poly 1-yard line in the Spartans' 19-9 come-from-behind win.

**Travis Jones earns national honor:** Linebacker **Travis Jones** is one of 11 Football Bowl Subdivision players named to the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team. The award recognizes the true spirit of teamwork and charity to society through commendable acts of kindness and community service. Jones is the first San Jose State honoree in the 18-year history of the award and the first player from a Western Athletic Conference school in eight years.

**Two-way Spartan:** Freshman **Ray Rodriguez** became the first San Jose State player this season to play on offense and defense in the same game. Rodriguez was a tight end and a defensive tackle in the Stanford game (9/19). Rodriguez did the same the next week against Cal Poly (9/26). **Ailao Eliapo** and **Dominique Hunsucker** are two other current Spartans who have played on both sides of the ball in the same game.

**#2 in 2009:** According to the third annual survey by the University of Houston, San Jose State is second among Football Subdivision Schools for most in-state players in 2009. The Spartans have 98 of 105 players (93.3 percent) on its roster from California. Only Florida Atlantic at 94.7 percent had more in-state players. South Florida (92.5 percent), Fresno State (92.3 percent) and Texas A&M (91.6 percent) are the other three schools this season with at least 90 percent of its squad from its home state.

**Family bonds on the Spartans:** There are two sets of brothers and one father-son combination on the 2009 San Jose State team. The best-known brother combination is defensive end Carl and safety **Duke Ihenacho**. Both were All-Western Athletic Conference selections last season and became the first known set of brothers during a week in a season to be a national leader in a major defensive statistical category among Football Bowl Subdivision players. For the week ending October 18, 2008, Carl was the national co-leader in tackles for loss and Duke shared the national lead in interceptions.
