### SAN JOSÉ STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (Game #10)

**Upcoming game:** San José State at #24/#24-Boise State  
Friday, October 29, 2016,  
Albertsons Stadium, Boise, Idaho, 8:15 p.m. (MT)/7:15 p.m. (PT)  
ESPN2

**San José State record:** 3-6, 2-3 Mountain West. The Spartans are winners in two of their last three games following a 30-24 victory over UNLV on October 29. Previously, San Jose State defeated Nevada, 14-10, on October 15 and lost at San Diego State, 42-3, on October 21.

**Boise State record:** 7-1, 3-1 Mountain West. The Broncos lost for the first time this season, 30-28 at Wyoming, on October 29.

**San José State head coach Ron Caragher:** In his fourth season as the San José State head coach. Has a record of 18-28 with the Spartans. Overall, he is in his 10th season as a college head coach and has a 62-50 record. Caragher's first six seasons as a head coach were at nearby University of San Diego. He is 0-1 as a head coach against Boise State.

**Boise State head coach Bryan Harsin:** In his third season at Boise State. Has a coaching record of 28-7 with the Broncos. Overall, he has a 35-12 record as a major college head coach. He is 1-0 as a head coach against San José State.

**Series history:** Boise State leads the series, 12-0. The series history between these teams began in 1978 with the Broncos posting a 30-15 victory.

Boise State is 6-0 in the games played in Albertsons Stadium and have scored no fewer than 38 points in any of the six wins. The closest outcome on the scoreboard was the 38-21 Bronco victory in Boise on October 15, 2005.

This year's game is the seventh time the Spartans are facing a nationally-ranked, top-25 Boise State team. The Broncos were ranked #3 in 2010, #6 in 2009, #13 in 2008 #21 in 2007, #14 in 2006 and #14 in 2004 in the Associated Press poll at the time of the game.

**Tying the San José State-Boise State knot:** Boise State strength and conditioning coach Jeff Pitman had the same role at San Jose State during the 1997 through 1999 football seasons. His son, Nicholai Pitman, a long snapper on the Boise State team, was born in San Jose while he was a member of the Spartans' coaching staff.

San Jose State assistant coaches **Al Borges** and **Barry Sacks** were Boise State assistants in the 1990's when Pokey Allen was the Broncos' head coach. Borges was the offensive coordinator during the 1993 and 1994 seasons. Sacks was the defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator during the 1993 through 1996 seasons.

San Jose State director of athletics **Gene Bleymaier** had the same position at Boise State from 1982 to 2012.

**Second Friday night game of the season:** For the second time this season, San Jose State is playing a Friday night road game after a Saturday home victory when it travels to Boise State for the November 4 contest. On Friday, October 21, the Spartans lost at San Diego State, 42-3, after they defeated Nevada in CEFCU Stadium on October 15.

Sirius and XM Radio also will broadcast the San Jose State-Boise State game. Sirius coverage is on Channel 83; XM coverage on Channel 201.

**Television:** ESPN2 will televise the San José State-Boise State game. Dave Lamont calls the play-by-play. Ray Bentley provides analysis. The ESPN2 telecast begins at 7:15 p.m. (PT).

**Playing a ranked opponent on November 4:** For the second time in San Jose State history, the Spartans are facing a nationally-ranked opponent on November 4 when they take on #24-ranked Boise State. On November 4, 2000, San Jose State defeated unbeaten and #9-ranked TCU featuring LaDainian Tomlinson, 27-24, in CEFCU Stadium.

**Last win over a ranked opponent:** San Jose State's win over undefeated and nationally-ranked #16-Fresno State, 62-52 on November 29, 2013, is the program's last victory over a nationally-ranked opponent. Since then, the Spartans faced one Associated Press nationally-ranked opponent, #5-ranked Auburn on September 6, 2014 and lost 59-13.

**Last road win over a ranked opponent:** San Jose State's last victory over an Associated Press nationally-ranked opponent as a visiting team was a 30-22 triumph over #10-Baylor on November 1, 1980. That Baylor team featured Pro and College Football Hall of Fame linebacker Mike Singletary. Since then, the Spartans were the road team against 33 Associated Press nationally-ranked opponents at the time of the game.

**A Silver State sweep:** San José State win completed its first Silver State sweep in one season with its 30-24 victory over UNLV. Two weeks earlier, the Spartans defeated Nevada, 14-10 on October 15.

Previously, the best San José State accomplished in one season against the two Nevada-based universities was splits in 1992, 1995, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

**No turnovers lately:** San José State enters the Boise State game playing 12 consecutive quarters, 216 offensive plays and three complete games without committing a turnover. The last time the Spartans gave away the football was on a pass interception in the fourth quarter of the October 8 loss to Hawai'i.

In 2015, San José State played 13 consecutive quarters over portions of the last four regular-season games without a turnover.

The last San José State team to play three consecutive games without a turnover was the 1998 Spartans. That squad beat New Mexico, lost to Virginia and defeated Rice in games three through five with no turnovers on 174 offensive plays.

**Turnover info nationally:** San José State's streak of three consecutive games without a turnover heading into the Boise State game is the longest active streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) for games played through October 29.

Western Michigan, the national leader in fewest turnovers this season with three, played its first six games of the season without a turnover. The Broncos committed its first turnover of their season in game #7 on October 15 with a fumble.

**Two common threads:** San José State's three wins this season shared these traits.

- 1.) The offense did not lose the football via fumble or interception.
- 2.) The Spartans led at halftime.

**San José State stays in top-25 for turnovers gained:** With Trevon Bierria's interception in the October 29 UNLV win, San José State remains in the top-25 for turnovers gained. The Spartans' are tied for 23rd among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools with 16 turnovers gained.

San José State now is in its ninth week of being in the top-25 for turnovers gained. The Spartans were as high as sixth nationally following games played through September 10 and September 17.

**A +6 turnover margin vs. Portland State:** The Portland State win marked the first time since September 27, 2008 at Hawai'i that San José State completed a game with a +6 turnover margin. In the 20-17 win at Hawai'i, the Spartans came away with four interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

**Opponents convert turnovers into more points:** San José State's opponents are taking better advantage of a Spartan giveaway this season. San José State's 14 turnovers (11 interceptions and three fumbles) resulted in 75 opponent points this season.

The Spartans' 16 turnovers gained produced 41 points in the first nine games.

**Crawley & Hartley go for 100 receiving yards:** The October 29 UNLV win marked the first time since the 2013 season-ending triumph over then-undefeated and national-ranked #16 Fresno State that at least two Spartans had 100 or more receiving yards in a game. Senior **Tim Crawley** had a career-high 114 receiving yards on eight receptions. Sophomore **Tre Hartley** had his first 100-yard receiving game at the major college level with 104 yards and two touchdowns on five catches.

**Long-gaining pair:** San José State wide receivers **Justin Holmes** and **Tre Hartley** are ranked among the top-50 players in the Football Bowl Subdivision for yards per reception in games played through October 29. While there are six pairs of players from the same school in the top-50, Holmes and Hartley are one of two duos with at least 20 receptions each for a yard per catch average of 17.3 or more.

**Spartans match 2015 sack total:** San José State has 17 quarterback sacks after nine games equal to the number of quarterback sacks it had in its 13-game 2015 season.

**Few penalties:** San José State is 13th in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and tops in the Mountain West for fewest penalty yards per game (38.0).

**Hanging in the balance:** After nine games, San José State has 12 rushing and 13 passing touchdowns. A year ago, the Spartans had a similar balance of 24 rushing and 21 passing touchdowns.

**Ginda with two Spartan firsts since 2012:** Linebacker **Frank Ginda** became the first San José State player since cornerback Bene Benwikere in the 2012 win at New Mexico State on November 10 to recover a fumble and return it for a touchdown with his 19-yard return against Hawai'i on October 8.

Ginda and Benwikere are the last two Spartans to force a fumble that resulted in a turnover and recover a fumble on separate plays in the same game. Benwikere did it in the October 20, 2012 win at UTSA. Ginda's game vs. Hawai'i included a forced fumble that resulted in a turnover gained after his fumble return for a touchdown.

**Season-best 257:** San José State yielded 257 yards of total offense to Nevada, its best total defensive yardage in a game this season by 174 yards.

**One-TD allowed wins:** The 10 points San José State allowed in its 14-10 win over Nevada are the fewest points scored by a Spartan opponent since the 33-10 victory over UNLV on October 4, 2014.

**Just enough scoring:** San José State's 14 points in the Nevada game marks the fourth time since the 2009 season the Spartans won a game scoring two or fewer touchdowns.

**Three leading rushers: Malik Roberson** became the third San José State running back to lead the team in rushing in a game this season when he rushed for 91 yards on a career-high 19 carries against Hawai'i on October 8. He kept the title of team's leading rusher with 139 yards on 35 carries in the Nevada triumph.

**Deontae Cooper** was the team's leading rusher in the Tulsa (19 for 43 yards), Portland State (18 for 126 yards, 1 TD) and Utah (12 for 45 yards).

**Zamore Zigler** led the Spartans in rushing in the Iowa State (24 for 104 yards), New Mexico (9 for 91 yards, 1 TD) and UNLV ((18 carries for 77 yards) games.

**Long runs leave marks:** Two of San José State's nine touchdowns in the Portland State game came on runs of 87 yards by **Malik Roberson** and 74 yards by **Zamore Zigler**. Roberson's touchdown burst matches UCF's Adrian Killins for the sixth longest run in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2016 and ties the sixth longest rushing play in school history.

The two long touchdown runs for Roberson and Zigler mark the first time San José State rushed for two touchdowns in one game of 70 or more yards.

**A rushing first since 2001:** For the first time since 2001, three San José State players had a 100-plus yard rushing game in the same season. **Deontae Cooper** and **Zamore Zigler** did it in the Portland State game and **Malik Roberson** hit the mark against Nevada.

In 2001 running backs **Jamar Julien**, **Deoncé Whitaker** and **Lamar Ferguson** each had at least one 100-plus yard rushing game.

**Crawley named William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist:** Wide receiver **Tim Crawley** is one of 156 national semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and awarded by the National Football Foundation and the College Football Hall of Fame.

Twelve to 14 finalists for college football's best scholar-athlete will be named on November 1. These finalists will receive an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship and be presented at the 59th annual National Football Foundation's awards dinner in December in New York city. One finalist will be named the winner and receive a \$25,000 scholarship instead of the \$18,000 award.

Crawley, a 2016 team captain, graduated magna cum laude majoring in business management information systems. He is pursuing a master's degree program in interdisciplinary studies. With 122 receptions, Crawley ranks 18th on the San José State career list for pass receptions.

**Stay awake with ZZ's: Zamore Zigler** became the first San José State freshman since Jarrod Lawson to record two 100-plus yard rushing games in a season when he led all rushers with 104 yards on 24 carries at Iowa State on September 24. His first 100-plus yard rushing game was in the Portland State game on September 10 when he ran for 111 yards on 15 carries.

San José State career rushing leader **Deoncé Whitaker** is the last Spartan freshman to record three 100-plus yard rushing games as a freshman.

Zigler is leading on the team in rushing with 402 yards and his a 5.4 yards per carry average.

**Opponents generating long plays, too:** San José State's opponents also produced 28 plays of 30 or more yards on 13 runs, 12 pass plays, two punt returns and an interception return for a touchdown this season. There were four each in the Tulsa, Utah, Iowa State, New Mexico and Hawai'i losses; three in the Portland State win; two by San Diego State and UNLV; and one in the Nevada victory.

**100-catch Spartans:** In 2016, wide receiver **Tim Crawley** and tight end **Billy Freeman** became the 27th and 28th players, respectively to catch at least 100 passes for San José State. Crawley now is in 10th place on the Spartans' career list with 130 receptions; Freeman, tied for 21st at 106.

**Season best punt return average:** San José State had its best day of the 2016 season returning punts in the Hawai'i game on October 8. Punt returner **Thai Cottrell** was credited with returns of 22 and 20 yards.

The last time the Spartans had two punt returns in a game of 20 or more yards was against North Dakota in the 2014 season opener. Current Houston Texans running back Tyler Ervin had returns of 40 yards for a touchdown and a second one of 33 yards.

**The San José State freshman QB phenomenon:** Josh Love became the fifth San José State freshman of any kind to start a game at quarterback since 1972 NCAA legislation for the reinstatement of freshmen eligibility. Prior to Love, **Adam Tafralis** in 2004 was the most recent freshman to begin a game at quarterback.

Love's appearance was the 12th time a San José State freshman started a game at quarterback since 1972. **Doug Allen** (1984, one); **Greg Centilli** (1988, two), **Marcus Arroyo** (1998, five) and Tafralis (2004, three) were the other occasions a freshman started at quarterback for the Spartans.

**66 points for the Spartans:** San José State's 66 points in the Portland State win rank as the fifth highest scoring game in school history since 1946. The two highest are the back-to-back games against the University of Mexico to end the 1948 and begin the 1949 seasons.

**A 400-plus yard ground game:** San José State's 409 yards rushing in the Portland State win are the most by a Spartan team since a 476-yard performance on October 28, 2006 when San José State rushed for 476 yards in a win over Louisiana

Tech. The 409 figure is the eighth time a San José State team rushed for at least 400 yards in a game and ranks eighth on the school's single game rushing list.

**Two 100-yard rushers:** For the first time in 15 years, two Spartans rushed for at least 100 yards in the same game in the Portland State victory. Graduate student **Deontae Cooper** with 126 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries and redshirt freshman **Zamore Zigler** with 15 carries for 111 yards and two scores reached the 100-yard plateau.

**Brothers on the field at the same time:** At least four games this season, brothers **Jeremy Kelly** and **Jermaine Kelly** played on the field at the same time as defensive backs or special teams players. Though San José State has had other brother combinations on the same team in the last seven years, the last time two brothers played on the field at the same time was in the 2009 season when defensive end **Carl Ihenacho** and his younger brother, defensive back **Duke Ihenacho**, were Spartan starters.

**Crawford 10-for-10:** Bryce Crawford joined an exclusive group of San José State kick scorers with 10 successful kick-scoring attempts in a game. He was 9-for-9 on PAT attempts and converted a 22-yard field goal against Portland State. The single-game school record for PATs in a modern-era San José State game since 1950 is 10 by **Jeff Carr** against Rice on October 2, 2004. Another Spartan with at least 10 successful kick-scoring attempts in a game is former San Francisco 49ers kicker **Joe Nedney** who was 7-for-8 in PATs and kicked three field goals in a 64-45 win over Pacific in 1991.

**Season captains named:** Wide receiver **Tim Crawley**, line-backer **Christian Tago**, quarterback **Kenny Potter** and safety **Maurice McKnight** were named team captains for the 2016 season. McKnight is the only non-senior among the four. Tago, yet to play a game this season while recovering from an injury, was one of four team captains last season.

**Seven get the scholarship word:** On August 20, seven players were placed on scholarship. Tight end **LeVander Brown**, wide receiver **Tre Hartley**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, quarterback **Josh Love** and linebackers **Mark Amann**, **Alex Manigo** and **Epie Sona** were informed after the team's scrimmage. Love is a redshirt freshman; Hartley and Hawkins, sophomores; and Brown, Amann, Manigo and Sona, seniors.

**The graduate transfer:** Running back **Deontae Cooper** from the University of Washington and wide receiver **Dontonio Jordan** from Stanford University are two graduate transfers on the 2016 San José State football team.

**San José State's 99th season:** The 2016 season marks San José State's 99th playing college football. According to available records, the Spartans began playing football in 1893, but did not have games in 1894, 1897, 1901-20 and 1943-45.

**New home stadium name:** Recently, San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) agreed to a 15-year naming rights agreement for Spartan

Stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.
