#### **PIVOTAL WEEK ACROSS THE MOUNTAIN WEST**

San José State begins the week in fifth place and with 10 points on the Mountain West table. SJSU has already played the four teams (Utah State, UNLV, Boise State, San Diego State) which stand ahead, going 2-1-1. While there are still three weeks of regular season MW play remaining, every match is crucial for climbing the latter as the Mountain West Tournament approaches in the first week of November.

#### **SPARTANS START FAST**

San José State has scored within the first 25 minutes in six of the last seven matches, totaling nine goals. The 0-0 tie at Boise State last Friday was the first time SJSU has been shutout in conference play. **Yaritza Arista (Jr., MF, Livingston, Calif.)** and **Alexis Venegas (Sr., MF, Van Nuys, Calif.)** have been a big part of the Spartans' quick starts, each scoring twice in the first 25 minutes of a conference match.

#### **DEFENSE STAYS ON TOP**

Despite a pair of goals given up in the 2-1 loss at Utah State on Sunday, San José State still has the top-ranked defense in the Mountain West through all games. Eleven (11) goals in 14 matches are the fewest in the league and the team's 0.72 goals against average is also first. Colorado College and San José State share the league lead with seven shutouts.

#### **OFFENSE NOT FAR BEHIND**

In Mountain West play, San José State's offense is third among the 12 teams with 11 goals. Utah State and UNLV are tied at the top with 13 each. The Spartans' 10 assists are tied for the league lead. SJSU's scoring statistics are among the league's best despite being seventh in shots per game (13.0). **Alexis Venegas** leads the team with four goals and 10 points.

#### STAUNCH BACK LINE HEADLINES DEFENSIVE PROWESS

There aren't any stats for it in the box score, but San José State's back line is the toughest to crack in the Mountain West. The Spartans faced two of the league's leading shot takers last weekend in Boise State's Sherle Raimee and Utah State's Jessica Brooksby. While Brooksby scored twice, one was on a penalty kick and the other was in a last-gasp attempt during a busted play in the 87th minute. Raimee was shutdown to the tune of three total shots with none going on goal. Kristen Amarikwa (Fr., D, Bakersfield, Calif.), Myia Wilkes (Jr., D, Calgary, Alberta), Hayden Kelley (Sr., D, Murrieta, Calif.) and Claire Berkley (Jr., D, Pleasanton, Calif.) are responsible for holding down the opponents' final third.

# **LAUREN HANSON**

Head Coach Third Season Portland, 2003

Heading into her third season as the San José State University head women's soccer coach, Lauren Hanson has the program on the steepest ascent in its 20-year history.

Hanson, the 2015 Mountain West (MW) Coach of the Year, will lead San José State on its MW title defense in fall of 2016. The title, won against San Diego State at the SDSU Sports Deck, was the first MW championship for any sport at SJSU since aligning with the conference in 2013

Hanson, the winner of NCAA Women's College Cup championships as a coach and player, was made the sixth head women's soccer coach at San José State University on December 18, 2013. She has already given the Spartans a taste of the NCAA tournament, which happened for just the second time in program history in 2015.

The Spartans exceeded the seventh-place MW preseason prediction by far, finishing 8-3-0 in conference play and going all the way to the NCAA Tournament. Eight wins in conference play are the most in program history, one of many records broken during the team's run in 2015.

Hanson coached five players in 2015 to All-MW honors including senior keeper Zoe Makrigiannis, who was named the defensive player of the year.

The Spartans finished 3-14-1 overall the year prior to Hanson and her staff's arrival. In the first year under Hanson's direction, the team had a marked improvement in a number of statistical categories that led to an 8-8-3 overall record. That year, the Spartans doubled their offensive output, scoring 22 goals after just 10 went into the net in 2013. The defense also saw a huge lift, allowing 18 goals when the year before it gave up 33.

In 2015, the Spartans had the number one defense in the MW, with a 0.56 goals against average and a league-best seven shutouts.

Hanson won both of her NCAA Women's Cup championships with the University of Portland. In 2005, she was an assistant coach with the Pilots and in 2002, was the team captain of Portland's championship team. Her college coaching career began at her alma mater in 2004.

In 2005, Portland completed an undefeated season (23-0-2) en route to its second NCAA Women's College Cup championship. In 2006, Hanson was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) West Region Assistant Coach of the Year. Portland earned a berth to the NCAA Women's College Cup in four of her five seasons on the Pilots' staff.

As the University of Oregon's Associate Head Coach during the 2009 through 2011 seasons, she coached the Ducks' backline and was the program's recruiting coordinator.

As Lauren Orlandos, Hanson enjoyed an illustrious playing career as a four-year centerback for Portland. She was a member of three Pilot teams to play in the NCAA Women's College Cup. The 2000 and 2001 clubs reached the semifinals, and she captained the 2002 Pilots to the program's first NCAA Women's College Cup championship.

Hanson also has national team playing experience. She was a member of the United States Women's National Team in 2001 and competed on the U-18 and U-21 U.S. women's national teams. Hanson played one season professionally after she was the ninth-overall selection in the 2003 Women's United Soccer Association (WUSA) draft by the New York Power.

A native of Lake Forest, Calif., Hanson graduated from Portland in 2003 with her Bachelor of Arts degree. She and her husband, Travis, have two children, Cole and Taylor.
