SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (Game #6)

Upcoming game: San José State vs. Hawai'i (Homecoming)
Saturday, October 8, 2016,
CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans, San José, Calif., 1:30 p.m. (PT)
Time-Warner Oceanic Pay Per View

San José State record: 1-4, 0-1 Mountain West. The Spartans open Mountain West play with a 48-41 loss at New Mexico on October 1.

Hawai'i record: 2-3, 1-0 Mountain West. The Rainbow Warriors defeated Nevada, 38-17, on October 1 to begin conference play.

San José State head coach Ron Caragher: In his fourth season as the San José State head coach. Has a record of 16-26 with the Spartans. Overall, he is in his 10th season as a college head coach and has a 60-48 record. Caragher's first six seasons as a head coach were at the University of San Diego. He is 2-1 as a head coach against Hawai'i.

Hawai'i head coach Nick Rolovich: In his first season at Hawai'i. Has a major college coaching record of 2-3, all with the Rainbow Warriors. He is 0-0 as a head coach against San José State.

As a player, he had a 1-1 record against San Jose State. Rolovich was the starting quarterback in Hawai'i's 34-10 win over the San Jose State on November 3, 2001. He completed 18-of-35 passes with an interception for 307 yards and two touchdowns.

His San Jose ties also include the 2004 and 2005 seasons with the San Jose Saber-Cats of the Arena Football League. The SaberCats won the Arena Bowl XVIII championship in 2004.

Rolovich is a native of Novato, Calif., approximately a two-hour drive north of San Jose across the Golden Gate Bridge when driving conditions are favorable.

Series history: San José State leads the series, 19-18-1 with one cancellation. The Spartans have wins in two of the last three games since San Jose State joined the Mountain West. The last was a 42-23 triumph at Aloha Stadium on November 21, 2015. The road team has been the winning team in the three Mountain West games. Hawai'i won the last time these teams met in San Jose, 13-0, on November 15, 2014.

San Jose State's last win over Hawai'i at home was a nationally-televised 28-27 decision on October 14, 2011.

The one cancellation in the series was the December 16, 1941 game in Honolulu. The game was canceled following the December 7 attack on Pearl Harbor. The Spartans traveling party arrived in Hawai'i on December 3.

Homecoming record: The upcoming game with Hawai'i will be the 80th annual Homecoming for San Jose State. The Spartans have a 47-30-2 record in Homecoming games. The first Homecoming game was in 1933 against San Francisco State. There were no San Jose State football Homecoming games in 1943, 1944, 1945 and 1999.

San Jose State has wins in two of its last three Homecoming games. The Spartans lost last year's Homecoming game to San Diego State, 30-7.

This year's Homecoming contest marks the third time Hawai'i is the opponent. The Rainbow Warriors won San Jose State's 2005 Homecoming game 45-38 in overtime. San Jose State outlasted Hawai'i, 28-27, in the Spartans' 2011 Homecoming.

Play-by-Play Radio Coverage: KLIV (1590 AM, San José) originates San José State football broadcasts. Justin Allegri calls the play-by-play. Kevin Richardson provides commentary. Air time for the KLIV broadcast is 1:00 p.m. (PT).

Homecoming for Chaudhari: Hawai'i's special teams and tight ends coach Mayur Chaudhari was a San Jose State graduate assistant during the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

San José State aims for 1-1 in Mountain West: In each of its first three Mountain West seasons, San Jose State was 1-1 in the West Division standings after two games. In 2013, the Spartans won at Hawai'i to even their conference win-loss record. In 2014 and 2015, San Jose State won home games against UNLV and Fresno State, respectively.

The first TD in a 2016 Spartan game: In its first five games this season, San Jose State won its only game by scoring a touchdown first for a 7-0 lead against Portland State. In three of their four losses, the Spartans' opponent scored first on a touchdown in the first five minutes of the game.

Against Utah, San Jose State scored the first touchdown of the game after the Utes took a 6-3 lead on a pair of field goals.

Ground game lately is productive: In its last two games, San Jose State is averaging 153 yards a game rushing. The Spartans scored on the ground in the New Mexico game three times. The Portland State win was the only other game this season San Jose State had a rushing touchdown with a season-high six.

Crawley named William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist: Wide receiver **Tim Crawley** is one of 156 national semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and awarded by the National Football Foundation and the College Football Hall of Fame.

Twelve to 14 finalists for college football's best scholar-athlete will be named on November 1. These finalists will receive an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship and be presented at the 59th annual National Football Foundation's awards dinner in December in New York city. One finalist will be named the winner and receive a \$25,000 scholarship instead of the \$18,000 award.

Crawley, a 2016 team captain, graduated magna cum laude majoring in business management information systems. He is pursuing a master's degree program in interdisciplinary studies. With 112 receptions, Crawley ranks 19th on the San Jose State career list for pass receptions.

San José State stays in top-20 for turnovers gained: For the fourth week in a row, San Jose State ranks in the top-20 for turnovers gained. The Spartans' 10 turnovers gained is tied for 19th among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools. Despite not gaining any turnovers at Tulsa, San José State gained six turnovers in the Portland State win, two in the loss to Utah and one each at Iowa State and New Mexico.

A +6 turnover margin vs. Portland State: The Portland State win marked the first time since September 27, 2008 at Hawai'i that San Jose State completed a game with a +6 turnover margin. In the 20-17 win at Hawai'i, the Spartans came away with four interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

Opponents converting turnovers into more points: San José State's opponents are making the most of a Spartan giveaway this season. San Jose State's 11 turnovers (eight interceptions and three fumbles) resulted in 64 opponent points this season.

The Spartans' 10 turnovers gained produced 24 points in the first five games.

Improved kick return coverage: San José State is ranked third in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in defending kickoff returns at 14.2 yards per return.

In his first season as the Spartans' kickoff specialist, **Michael Carrizosa** has 19 touchbacks credited in 27 kickoffs (70.4 percent). A year ago, the Spartans finished 118th in kickoff yards per return allowing 25.3 per return and had 27 touchbacks on 69 attempts (39.1 percent).

Few penalties: San José State is ranked fifth in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and tops in the Mountain West for fewest penalty yards and fewest penalty yards per game (31.0). The Spartans' 18 penalties are the seventh fewest among the 128 FBS teams.

Stay awake with ZZ's: Zamore Zigler became the first San Jose State freshman since Jarrod Lawson to record two 100-plus yard rushing games in a season when he led all rushers with 104 yards on 24 carries at Iowa State on September 24. His first 100-plus yard rushing game was in the Portland State game on September 10 when he ran for 111 yards on 15 carries.

San Jose State career rushing leader **Deoncé Whitaker** is the last Spartan freshman to record three 100-plus yard rushing games as a freshman.

Zigler is the team's rushing leader with 311 yards and three touchdowns.

The San Jose State freshman QB phenomenon: Josh Love became the fifth San Jose State freshman of any kind to start a game at quarterback since 1972 NCAA legislation for the reinstatement of freshmen eligibility. Prior to Love, **Adam Tafralis** in 2004 was the most recent freshman to begin a game at quarterback.

Love's appearance was the 12th time a San Jose State freshman started a game at quarterback since 1972. **Doug Allen** (1984, one); **Greg Centilli** (1988, two), **Marcus Arroyo** (1998, five) and Tafralis (2004, three) were the other occasions a freshman started at quarterback for the Spartans.

Promising pass rush: San José State has nine quarterback sacks after five games. The Spartans began the season with four quarterback sacks in the Tulsa game. A year ago, the Spartans did not get their ninth sack until the ninth game of the season.

100-catch Spartans: Billy Freeman, listed on the John Mackey Award preseason watch list, became the 28th San Jose State player and second this season to reach the 100-reception threshold in a career. He is just the third San Jose State tight end with 100 or more career receptions.

In the season opener at Tulsa, wide receiver **Tim Crawley** caught his 100th pass as a San Jose State player.

66 points for the Spartans: San José State's 66 points in the Portland State win rank as the fifth highest scoring game in school history since 1946. The two highest are the back-to-back games against the University of Mexico to end the 1948 and begin the 1949 seasons.

A 400-plus yard ground game: San Jose State's 409 yards rushing in the Portland State win are the most by a Spartan team since a 476-yard performance on October 28, 2006 when San Jose State rushed for 476 yards in a win over Louisiana Tech. The 409 figure is the eighth time a San Jose State team rushed for at least 400 yards in a game and ranks eighth on the school's single game rushing list.

The 409 rushing yards rank as the 16th best single-game total in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in games played through October 1.

Two 100-yard rushers: For the first time in 15 years, two Spartans rushed for at least 100 yards in the same game in the Portland State victory. Graduate student **Deontae Cooper** with 126 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries and redshirt freshman **Zamore Zigler** with 15 carries for 111 yards and two scores reached the 100-yard plateau.

Long runs leave marks: Two of San Jose State's nine touchdowns in the Portland State game came on runs of 87 yards by **Malik Roberson** and 74 yards by **Zamore Zigler**. Roberson's touchdown burst matches UCF's Adrian Killins for the fourth longest run in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2016 and ties the sixth longest rushing play in school history.

The two long touchdown runs for Roberson and Zigler mark the first time San Jose State rushed for two touchdowns in one game of 70 or more yards.

Brothers on the field at the same time: In two of the first four games (Tulsa and Iowa State), brothers **Jeremy Kelly** and **Jermaine Kelly** played as defensive backs together. Though San José State has had other brother combinations on the same team in the last seven years, the last time two brothers played on the field at the same time was in the 2009 season when defensive end **Carl Ihenacho** and his younger brother, defensive back **Duke Ihenacho**, were starters for the Spartans.

Crawford 10-for-10: **Bryce Crawford** joined an exclusive group of San Jose State kick scorers with 10 successful kick-scoring attempts in a game. He was 9-for-9 on PAT attempts and converted a 22-yard field goal against Portland State. The single-game school record for PATs in a modern-era San Jose State game since 1950 is 10 by **Jeff Carr** against Rice on October 2, 2004. Another Spartan with at least 10 successful kick-scoring attempts in a game is former San Francisco 49ers kicker **Joe Nedney** who was 7-for-8 in PATs and kicked three field goals in a 64-45 win over Pacific in 1991.

Season captains named: Wide receiver **Tim Crawley**, linebacker **Christian Tago**, quarterback **Kenny Potter** and safety **Maurice McKnight** were named team captains for the 2016 season. McKnight is the only non-senior among the four. Tago, yet to play a game this season while recovering from an injury, was one of four team captains last season.

Seven get the scholarship word: On August 20, seven players were placed on scholarship. Tight end **LeVander Brown**, wide receiver **Tre Hartley**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, quarterback **Josh Love** and linebackers **Mark Amann**, **Alex Manigo** and **Epie Sona** were informed after the team's scrimmage. Love is a redshirt freshman; Hartley and Hawkins, sophomores; and Brown, Amann, Manigo and Sona, seniors.

The graduate transfer: Running back **Deontae Cooper** from the University of Washington and wide receiver **Dontonio Jordan** from Stanford University are two graduate transfers on the 2016 San José State football team.

San José State's 99th season: The 2016 season marks San José State's 99th playing college football. According to available records, the Spartans began playing football in 1893, but did not have games in 1894, 1897, 1901-20 and 1943-45.

New home stadium name: Recently, San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) agreed to a 15-year naming rights agreement for Spartan Stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.
