SPARTANS POUR IN FIVE GOALS ON PORTLAND STATE

Scoring was at a premium for the Spartans throughout the nonconference season, but that changed Sunday when SJSU poured in five goals by as many players in a victory over Portland State. It was the most goals in a match since 2008 and the most in a match at home since 2006.

DEFENSE RANKED TOP-20 NATIONALLY

San José State's fifth shutout of the year last week against Montana boosted the team's goals-against average to 0.442, which ranks 14th in the nation. Only California's 0.436 goals-against average is better than SJSU's in the Pacific Region. Five shutouts in eight matches are good for a 0.625 shutout percentage which ranks 18th in the country and fourth in the Pacific Region.

TWO 300-MINUTE SPANS WITHOUT ALLOWING A GOAL

When Portland State broke through for a goal in the 47th minute of Sunday's match, it ended a 354-minute scoreless streak for Spartans' opponents. It was the second streak of over 300 minutes this season without allowing a goal. SJSU began the year with consecutive shutouts in double-overtime, and didn't allow its first goal of the season until the 88th minute of the third match.

SPARTANS NONCONFERENCE SNAPSHOT

Defense, defense and more defense was the overall theme for the Spartans during the nonconference portion of 2016. Outside of the five goals SJSU scored last Sunday, the team managed just three scores in the previous seven matches. But they also only gave up four goals, which helped to maintain a 3-2-3 overall record. If there is one positive thing to draw from the offensive side of things, it's that seven different Spartans have put one in the back of the net. Last year at this time, the Spartans entered MW play with a 2-4-2 record, and then went 8-3-0 during conference play.

TOP OFFENSE MEETS TOP DEFENSE IN MW OPENER

As stingy as San José State's defense has been this year, that's how potent UNLV's offense has been. The meeting between the two teams Friday will feature the Mountain West's best defense going against the best offense. UNLV's 23 assists, 7.44 points per game and 2.44 goals per game are all ranked first in the conference and in the West Region. Tune into the Mountain West Network Friday night to see if the Rebels' offense can continue its pace against the Spartans who allow just 0.442 goals per game.

THE WORD ON UNLV

The Rebels ended their nonconference season with a 1-0 win on a penalty kick in double-overtime against Cal State Fullerton. They come into the MW opener with a 7-2-0 record and the afore mentioned best offense in the league. UNLV is a perfect 4-0-0 at home with wins over Northern Arizona, Eastern Washington, CSU Bakersfield and Cal State Fullerton. Seven players have scored multiple times in 2016, led by Lily Sender, Susie Bernal and Michaela Morris with four goals a piece. So far, the Rebels are exceeding the expectations set by the Preseason Mountain West Coaches' Poll, which predicted them to finish in eighth place.

THE WORD ON NEVADA

The Wolf Pack begin conference play with a 3-4-0 record after a 2-0 win over New Mexico State in the nonconference finale. Nevada is 1-1-0 so far in home matches, and will take on Fresno State inside Mackay Stadium before San José State comes to town on Sunday. Rylee Peterson and Angel Meriwether with two goals a piece lead the team in scoring. The Wolf Pack and Spartans had two common opponents during nonconference play — UC Irvine, which beat SJSU and lost to Nevada and Portland State, which beat Nevada and lost to SJSU.

OVERTIME MAGNET

Although the Spartans have technically played eight matches, the amount of minutes played adds up to over nine full-time matches. Five San José State matches have reached double-overtime, adding up to 95 minutes of extra time. The Spartans are 1-1-3 in those matches. Last year SJSU set the single-season record with eight overtime matches.

SIMONEAU IS A TOP-30 KEEPER IN THE COUNTRY

In her first season taking over as the starting keeper, **Paige Simoneau (So., GK, Corona, Calif.)** ranks 22nd in the nation with four individual shutouts and 30th in the nation for her 0.500 goals-against average. She ranks first in the conference in both categories.

HOPPIUS REMAINS MW'S MOST AGGRESSIVE FORWARD

Dorthe Hoppius (Jr., F, Dorsten, Germany) scored her second goal of the season on Sunday in the eighth minute of the win over Portland State. Through matches as of September 19, Hoppius ranks first in the conference in shots per game at 3.63. Hoppius has put 10 of 29 shots on goal so far in 2016.

LAUREN HANSON

Head Coach Third Season Portland, 2003

Heading into her third season as the San José State University head women's soccer coach, Lauren Hanson has the program on the steepest ascent in its 20-year history.

Hanson, the 2015 Mountain West (MW) Coach of the Year, will lead San José State on its MW title defense in fall of 2016. The title, won against San Diego State at the SDSU Sports Deck, was the first MW championship for any sport at SJSU since aligning with the conference in 2013

Hanson, the winner of NCAA Women's College Cup championships as a coach and player, was made the sixth head women's soccer coach at San José State University on December 18, 2013. She has already given the Spartans a taste of the NCAA tournament, which happened for just the second time in program history in 2015.

The Spartans exceeded the seventh-place MW preseason prediction by far, finishing 8-3-0 in conference play and going all the way to the NCAA Tournament. Eight wins in conference play are the most in program history, one of many records broken during the team's run in 2015.

Hanson coached five players in 2015 to All-MW honors including senior keeper Zoe Makrigiannis, who was named the defensive player of the year.

The Spartans finished 3-14-1 overall the year prior to Hanson and her staff's arrival. In the first year under Hanson's direction, the team had a marked improvement in a number of statistical categories that led to an 8-8-3 overall record. That year, the Spartans doubled their offensive output, scoring 22 goals after just 10 went into the net in 2013. The defense also saw a huge lift, allowing 18 goals when the year before it gave up 33.

In 2015, the Spartans had the number one defense in the MW, with a 0.56 goals against average and a league-best seven shutouts.

Hanson won both of her NCAA Women's Cup championships with the University of Portland. In 2005, she was an assistant coach with the Pilots and in 2002, was the team captain of Portland's championship team. Her college coaching career began at her alma mater in 2004.

In 2005, Portland completed an undefeated season (23-0-2) en route to its second NCAA Women's College Cup championship. In 2006, Hanson was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) West Region Assistant Coach of the Year. Portland earned a berth to the NCAA Women's College Cup in four of her five seasons on the Pilots' staff.

As the University of Oregon's Associate Head Coach during the 2009 through 2011 seasons, she coached the Ducks' backline and was the program's recruiting coordinator.

As Lauren Orlandos, Hanson enjoyed an illustrious playing career as a four-year centerback for Portland. She was a member of three Pilot teams to play in the NCAA Women's College Cup. The 2000 and 2001 clubs reached the semifinals, and she captained the 2002 Pilots to the program's first NCAA Women's College Cup championship.

Hanson also has national team playing experience. She was a member of the United States Women's National Team in 2001 and competed on the U-18 and U-21 U.S. women's national teams. Hanson played one season professionally after she was the ninth-overall selection in the 2003 Women's United Soccer Association (WUSA) draft by the New York Power.

A native of Lake Forest, Calif., Hanson graduated from Portland in 2003 with her Bachelor of Arts degree. She and her husband, Travis, have two children, Cole and Taylor.
