San José State record: 4-7, 1-6 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans lost at UNLV, 42-40, on November 23 in a Mountain West game. San Jose State seeks to end a threegame losing streak and finish a season with a victory for the fourth time in five seasons.

Fresno State record: 4-7, 2-5 Mountain West. The Bulldogs lost to Nevada, 35-28, on November 23, in a conference contest. UNLV is in the midst of a three-game losing streak.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: Completing his third season as the Spartans' head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 7-29, all at San José State. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. Brennan is 0-2 as a head coach against UNLV.

Fresno State head coach Jeff Tedford: Concluding his third season as the Bulldogs' head coach. Has a coaching record of 26-13 at Fresno State. Overall, he is finishing his 14th season as a major college head coach and has a record of 108-70. He is 2-0 as a head coach against San Jose State.

Series history: Fresno State leads the series, 42-37-3, in a series that began in 1921. The Spartans have faced the Bulldogs more times than any other opponent and vice versa.

Fresno State has won the last two meetings between these teams including a 31-13 victory last year in Fresno. San Jose State's last win in the series was a 16-14 triumph in Fresno to conclude the 2015 season.

Since 2013, the teams have played for the Valley Trophy signifying San Jose State's representation of the metropolitan, high-tech Silicon Valley and Fresno State representing the agricultural-rich San Joaquin Valley. Each team has kept the oversized Valley Trophy for three seasons.

The 2019 game marks the 21st time San Jose State is finishing a regular season against Fresno State. The Bulldogs are winners of 14 of these 20 games, but the Spartans have triumphs in three of the last four season finales for the two teams with wins in 2016 (16-14 at Fresno), 2013 (62-52 in San Jose) and 2011 (27-24 in Fresno).

The 2013 victory over then-#16-ranked and unbeaten Fresno State was San Jose State's last win over a top-20 ranked opponent. The Spartans are 3-4 against the Bulldogs with wins in 2013, 1990 and 1986 when Fresno State was a nationally-ranked opponent.

The 83rd meeting between these teams also is the first time since 2008 the teams are concluding a regular season on ESPN2.

Concluding a regular season: San Jose State is 5-5 in its last 10 regular season finales. The last time the Spartans finished the regular season with a win was a 20-17 victory over Wyoming in 2017 inside CEFCU Stadium.

Senior Night: For San Jose State, 18 seniors are expected to participate in Senior Night pregame activities. Eleven of the 18 can be considered starting players. Five of the 18, tight end Brett Foley, punter Alex Galland, defensive back Chandler Hawkins, and offensive linemen Deano Motes and Quinn Oseland are pursuing master's degrees. The 2019 senior class is the largest in Brent Brennan's three seasons as the Spartans' head coach.

The San Jose State-Fresno State broadcast with Justin Allegri and Kevin Richardson calling the action also will be carried on www.siriusxm. com Channel 976.

KSJS (90.5FM, San Jose) also will carry a play-by-play broadcast of the San Jose State-Fresno State football game. Air time is 7:15 p.m. (PT) with a pregame show.

Television: ESPN2 will provide broadcast coverage beginning at 7:30 p.m. (PT). Dave Lamont calls the play-by-play. Ray Bentley provides commentary. Taylor McGregor is the sideline reporter.

2019 season win total matches 2016: The last time the Spartans won five games in a regular season was in 2015 with a 5-7 record before capturing the inaugural AutoNation Cure Bowl over Georgia State. The four wins heading into the Fresno State contest matches the victory total of the 2016 season.

Points flashing on the scoreboard: San Jose State has scored 344 points in its first 11 games. The current point total is the most by the Spartans in a season since 2015 when the team won the AutoNation Cure Bowl in a 13-game season scoring 363 points.

The last season San Jose State scored at least 344 points in a 12-game regular season was in 2013 when the team scored 389 points.

30-point games in 2019: San Jose State has scored 30 or more points in eight of its 11 games this season compared to four a year ago. The last time San Jose State scored 30 or more points eight times in a season was in 2012 when the Spartans posted an 11-2 winloss record and a Military Bowl victory.

In its football history dating back to 1893, San Jose State has not scored 30 or more points nine times in one season.

Points allowed trending downward: For the first time in four seasons, San Jose State can finish a season yielding less than 400 points. The Spartans head into the Fresno State game allowing 367 points.

In 2016, San Jose State allowed 416 points; 542 in 2017, and 439 in 2018.

Tied for #10th nationally in turnover margin: For the eighth consecutive week, San Jose State is in the top-10 nationally in turnover margin. The Spartans were the national leader in turnover margin in games played through October 5 and October 12.

The Spartans have 15 interceptions, tied for second nationally, and seven fumble recoveries. San Jose State has lost the ball on five fumbles and eight pass interceptions.

The last time San Jose State finished a season with a turnover margin of +10 or more was the 2007 team with a +13 when head coach **Brent Brennan** was a Spartan assistant.

Points off of turnovers: After 11 games, San Jose State has scored 75 points off of opponent turnovers compared to the opponent's 28.

The first opponent points off a Spartan turnover came in the October 12 Nevada victory on an interception return for a touchdown. On November 23, UNLV scored 21 of its 38 points off of turnovers in its win over the Spartans.

Protecting the quarterback: San Jose State is tied for fourth nationally in protecting the passer this season allowing 0.91 sacks per game. In games played through November 23, the Spartans are one of eight teams to allow 10 or fewer sacks.

Burlsworth Trophy national semifinalist Josh Love: Josh Love was one of 10 national semifinalists for the 2019 Burlsworth Trophy honoring the outstanding player that began his career as a walk-on prospect. The award is named after the late Brandon Burlsworth, who was a University of Arkansas walk-on, went on to be an All-America offensive lineman, was a 1999 Indianapolis Colts' third-round draft choice, and died in a car accident 11 days after the NFL Draft. Love was the only quarterback among the semifinalists.

More Honors for Josh Love: Josh Love is the first San Jose State quarterback since David Fales in 2013 to be recognized by the Davey O'Brien Award for Quarterback of the Week, the Manning Award "Star of the Week," and the Mountain West as the conference's "Offensive Player of the Week."

The Spartan signal caller was named to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 for his 405 passing yards and two touchdowns in the October 4 New Mexico win.

He was named to the Manning Award "Star of the Week" list after the Arkansas triumph on September 21. Love was honored as the Mountain West "Offensive Player of the Week" after both wins.

A passing fancy: For the first time since 2013, San Jose State has more than one game in a season with more than 400 passing yards. Five times this season, team passing yardage exceeded 400 yards with 402 yards in the Arkansas win (9/21), a season-high 412 yards in the New Mexico victory (10/4), 405 in the loss at Nevada (10/12), 438 yards vs. #21-Boise State (11/2) and a season-high 465 yards at UNLV (11/23).

In 2013, San Jose State had five games of 400 or more passing yards and went five years without one until the 2018 season. There are 29 games in which a Spartan passed for 400 or more yards.

Gunderson Nominated for Broyles Award: San Jose State quarterbacks coach and passing game coordinator **Ryan Gunderson** is one of 41 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) coaches nominated for the 2019 Broyles Award honoring college football's top assistant coach. Gunderson is in his third year with the Spartans. San Jose State ranks sixth in passing offense nationally at 330.1 yards per game in games played through November 16.

Three-game streak with two 100-yard receivers: The November 2 Boise State game, the November 9 contest at Hawai'i and the November 23 encounter at UNLV each had two Spartans with 100-yard receiving games.

Gaither sets school TD reception record: Wide receiver Bailey Gaither became the first San Jose State player in school history to catch a touchdown pass in six consecutive games with his 40-yard scoring reception in the Hawai'i game (11/9).

The previous record was five consecutive games with a touchdown catch. Current San Jose State graduate assistant and former wide receiver **Chandler Jones** was the first to do it in 2013.

11 Spartans with a TD reception in 2019: In the November 23 UNLV game, tight end Brett Foley became the 11th Spartan this season to have a touchdown reception. The Spartans have the most players of any Mountain West school with a touchdown reception this season.

Adding the two-point play to the scoring column: For the first time since the 2016 season, San Jose State successfully converted a two-point PAT and has done it 3-out-of-4 this season. The Spartans have two-point PATs in the Army West Point, Boise State and UNLV. The 2013 season was the last time a Spartan team converted at least three two-point PATs going 4-out-of-5.

Offensive tackle Jackson Snyder scores: In the November 23 UNLV game, offensive left tackle **Jackson Snyder** became the sixth San Jose State offensive lineman in the modern era of football to score a touchdown when he was credited with a 4-yard run after catching a Josh Love pass ruled as a lateral.

Five possessions lead to five first-half scores: In the October 26 Army West Point win and the November 9 game at Hawai'i, San Jose State scored every time it was on offense in the first half of a game. Against Army West Point, the Spartans scored two touchdowns and kicked three field goals to build a 23-10 halftime lead.

At Hawai'i, San Jose State also scored two touchdowns and kicked three field goals for a 23-21 halftime advantage. The Spartans would go on to score in all eight their possessions against the Rainbow Warriors.

School field goal record tied again: Three times this season and twice in the last three games, San Jose State freshman **Matt Mercurio** tied a single-game school record with four field goals. Most recently, he converted attempts of 28, 43, 43 and 25 yards at Hawai'i. Mercurio also kicked four field goal in the 34-29 win at Army and the 32-21 victory against New Mexico.

Mercurio has made 16 consecutive field goals since missing his first attempt in the New Mexico game and is 19-for-22 on the season.

San Jose State & Hawai'i enter NCAA record book: For the first time since a November 15, 1986 game between Georgia Southern and James Madison, a college football game was played without a punt when Hawai'i defeated San Jose State, 42-40, on November 9.

San Jose State scored on all eight of its possessions with four touchdowns and four field goals. Hawai'i had nine possessions scoring six touchdowns, losing a fumble and had the ball at the end of each half.

According to the 2019 NCAA Football Record Books for the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III, there were no games on record for games in which neither team punted in the same game.

More on San Jose State games with no punts: Since 2002, there is one more game in which San Jose State did not punt and six contests in which the opponent did not punt in a game against San Jose State.

The latest was freshman **Kairee Robinson** against San Diego State, at Army and Boise State.

Prior to Robinson receiving the starting call for the first time, senior **DeJon Packer** started four games; junior **Tyler Nevens**, one; and freshman **Isaiah Holiness**, one.

Packer does it three times: Running back **DeJon Packer** is the team's only player to score more than one touchdown in a game this season. He rushed for two touchdowns in the Nevada, Boise State and Hawai'i games. Packer's 10 rushing touchdowns in a season are the most since running back Tyler Ervin, now with the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars, ran for 13 touchdowns in 2015.

Back-to-back weeks blocking a kick: If it's a Friday, it must mean the San Jose State University will execute a blocked kick. In the Friday, September 27 game at Air Force, linebacker **Hadari Darden** was credited with deflecting an Air Force extra-point attempt after a Falcons' third-quarter touchdown.

On Friday, October 4 against New Mexico, wide receiver **Bailey Gaither** blocked a first-quarter punt for the second time in his career.

Spartans break onside trend: For the first time since the November 1, 2014 Colorado State game, San Jose State recovered an onside kick when **Christian Webb** came up with the football in a successful attempt in the Tulsa game (9/7).

The Spartans had gone 0-for-10 in onside kick attempts during the 2015 through 2018 seasons.

A 99-yard scoring drive: For the first time since 2011, San José State had a 99-yard touchdown drive in the recent San Diego State game with an 11-play, 99-yard touchdown drive capped by a **Bailey Gaither** 8-yard touchdown reception.

In the October 29, 2011 game at Louisiana Tech, San José State scored its final touchdown in a 38-28 loss on an 11-play, 99-yard drive that consumed 2:37 of game time. Quarterback **Matt Faulkner** connected on a 20-yard touchdown pass play to tight end **Ryan Otten** for the Spartan touchdown...

Most Mountain West Football Player of the Week honors since 2013: This season, San Jose State players have earned five Mountain West football "Player of the Week" honors.

Quarterback **Josh Love**, twice; defensive back **Bobby Brown**, **II**, once after the Arkansas win; and placekicker **Matt Mercurio**, following the New Mexico victory are the recipients. This is the first season since joining the Mountain West that three Spartans received a conference "Player of the Week" honor.

The five Mountain West Football "Player of the Week" honors San Jose State earned this season matches the program's high of five in 2013 when quarterback **David Fales** was a three-time winner and placekicker **Austin Lopez** was honored twice.

Spartans and individual national statistical leaders: Five times this season, a San Jose State player was a national leader or shared the national lead in a FBS statistical category.

A San Jose State first since 2007: In the Air Force game, freshman **Nick Nash** became the first San Jose State quarterback since **Adam Tafralis** in 2007 to have rushing and passing attempts and catch a pass thrown by a teammate in the same game.

Nash was San Jose State's leading rusher against Air Force with 62 yards on 11 carries and had the Spartans' longest run of the game at 19 yards. He completed 5-of-7 passes without an interception for 82 yards and two touchdowns. In the first quarter, he caught a Josh Love pass for 4 yards.

Nash joins former San Jose State quarterbacks Tafralis, **Scott Rislov** in a 2002 win over UTEP and current University of Oregon offensive coordinator **Marcus Arroyo** in a 2001 NCAA record-setting victory against Nevada as Spartan signal callers to display their offensive versatility rushing, passing and receiving in the same game since the 1976 season.

Since 1976, the feat now has been accomplished 16 times. Former San Jose State running back and current Arizona Cardinals running backs coach **James Saxon** did it four times, three times in 1987 and once in 1986.

Joining a select group: With the 34-29 win over Army, San Jose State became the 20th school to record a victory over each of the three Football Bowl Subdivision United States service academies - Air Force, Army West Point, and Navy. The Spartans have one win over each service academy winning on the road at Navy (2012) and Army West Point (2019) and at home versus Air Force (1997).

Historic win at Arkansas: San Jose State's 31-24 victory at Arkansas on September 21 was its first against a member of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and more.

- San Jose State was named the Reveal Suits National Team of the Week presented but he Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). The recognition was the first time the Spartans as a team were honored by the FWAA since the program began in 2002.
- San Jose State now has a 1-6 win-loss record against teams from the SEC. The Spartans are 0-2 vs. Auburn and Florida, each, and 0-1 vs. Alabama and LSU, each.
- San Jose State's 31 points vs. Arkansas are the most points the Spartans scored in a game against a SEC opponent. The team's previous high was 21 points once each against Florida, LSU and Auburn.
- San Jose State picked up its first win over an opponent affiliated with the Pac-12, Big Ten, SEC, ACC and Big 12 since a 35-34 triumph over Stanford on September 9, 2006. Between victories, the Spartans were winless 26 times against teams affiliated with those five conferences.
- San Jose State earned its first road win since defeating Fresno State, 16-14, on November 26, 2016. The Spartans stopped a 13-game road losing streak.
- San Jose State's first non-conference road win since defeating Navy, 12-0, on September 29, 2012.
- San Jose State's first FBS non-conference road against a school affiliated with the Pac-12, Big Ten, SEC, ACC, and Big 12 win since defeating Illinois, 38-35, on September 21, 2002, the same day on the calendar as San Jose State's win over Arkansas.

Spartans close out Arkansas win with fourth-quarter game-winning drive: For the first time since defeating Nevada, 14-10, in 2016, San Jose State's offense executed a late fourth-quarter, game-winning touchdown drive in the Arkansas victory. With 2:56 remaining in the game and the score tied, 24-24, the Spartans drove 75 yards in five plays in 1:43 and scored on a 19-yard touchdown run by **DeJon Packer** with 1:13 to go.

The Spartans also began the year with special teams newcomers freshman **Andrew Gonneville**, long snapper; redshirt freshman placekicker **Matt Mercurio**, and sophomore **Chris Wood** as a kickoff specialist. Punter and kick-scoring holder **Alex Galland** is a graduate transfer from Yale University.

Ground game moves ahead in opener: San Jose State's 158 rushing yards against Northern Colorado were its most rushing yards since gaining 173 yards at Nevada on November 17, 2017.

Nash on a dash: San Jose State freshman **Nick Nash** is the first Spartan quarterback to rush for as many as 50 yards since Kenny Potter gained 52 yards and scored three touchdowns on 22 carries in a 41-38 loss to Air Force on November 19, 2016 in CEFCU Stadium.

Nash's 67 rushing yards are the most by a San Jose State quarterback since Potter gained 69 yards and scored a touchdown on 15 carries in the 2015 Cure Bowl victory over Georgia State. Nash's 49-yard run against Northern Colorado was the first time a San Jose State quarterback ran for more than 40 yards in one play since Potter ran for 42 yards against Georgia State.

Coordinator continuity: For the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons, San Jose State has the same offensive coordinator, defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator in consecutive seasons with **Kevin McGiven** in the offensive coordinator role, **Derrick Odum** as defensive coordinator and **Fred Guidici** as special teams coordinator.

In 2008 and 2009, the Spartans' offensive coordinator was **Steve Morton**. **Keith Burns**, the current defensive secondary coach at UTEP, was the defensive coordinator, and current San Jose State head coach **Brent Brennan** was coordinated special teams while coaching the wide receivers.

Coast to coast & over the Pacific in five time zones: San Jose State is the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) school with games in five different time zones this season. The Spartans will exceed 16,000 travel miles in 2019 with short trips to Nevada and UNLV in the Pacific Time Zone, Air Force in the Mountain Time Zone, Arkansas in the Central Time Zone, Army West Point in the Eastern Time Zone and Hawai'i in the Hawaiian Time Zone.

The only other year San Jose State played in five time zones was in 2015 with road games at Oregon State, Nevada and UNLV (PT), Air Force (MT), Auburn (CT), Hawaii (HT), and Georgia State in the inaugural Orlando, Fla., Cure Bowl (ET).

National Football Foundation honors five Spartans with bachelor's degrees: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Deano Motes** and **Quinn Oseland** were five San Jose State football players among more than 1,400 honored by the National Football Foundation on August 27 as college graduates playing a final season for their respective schools at the NCAA Divisions I, II and III levels and in the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics).

Foley and Motes are enrolled in a San Jose State M.B.A. program; Galland and Oseland, in a master's in public administration curriculum; and Hawkins, in educational counseling.

New CEFCU Stadium look: During the summer, nearly 9,000 spectator seats were removed from the east grandstand to complete Phase #1 of the Spartan Athletics Center project at CEFCU Stadium. Scheduled to open in 2023, the Center will be the new home for San Jose State football, women's soccer and men's soccer and be available for use by the entire Spartan student-athlete population.

Phase #2, demolition of the east side of CEFCU Stadium, begins after the 2019 season is over. The Spartan Athletics Center will be under construction from 2020 to 2022. In 2023, the east side of CEFCU Stadium will be rebuilt with bleacher seating, concession stands and other amenities.

Versatile Spartans: Center **Kyle Hoppe**, defensive linemen **E.J. Ane** and **Deano Motes**, and defensive back **Zamore Zigler** are four San Jose State players to play both offense and defense for the Spartans.

Ane played on both sides of the ball in the 2018 UNLV and Nevada games.

Zigler was a running back his first two seasons before moving to a cornerback role in 2018.

Motes was a defensive lineman in his first two seasons before moving to the offensive side last season and started eight games.

Hoppe, last year's starting center, played a reserve defensive lineman in 2017.

Family ties: This year's San Jose State team has a range of internal family ties.

- Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** is the son of former SJSU offensive line coach Gary Bernardi.
- Head coach **Brent Brennan**, is the son of former SJSU wide receiver the late Steve Brennan.
- Running backs coach **Alonzo Carter** is the stepfather of freshman wide receiver **Malikhi Miller.**
- Safeties **Tre Jenkins** and **Andrew Jenkins** are twin brothers. They line up side-byside on the kickoff cover team. The November 2 Boise State game marked the first time both brothers were credited with a tackle in the same contest.
- Running back **Brendan Manigo** is the second Manigo brother to play football for SJSU. His brother, Alex Manigo, was a linebacker on the 2015 and 2016 Spartan teams.

A master's degree in their future: Tight end Brett Foley, punter Alex Galland, defensive back Chandler Hawkins, and offensive linemen Quinn Oseland and Deano Motes are five San José State players playing as graduate students.

Foley, Hawkins and Motes are San Jose State University graduates. Foley and Motes are in their first semester as M.B.A. candidates. Hawkins is pursuing his master's degree in educational counseling.

Galland, a mechanical engineering major at Yale University, and Oseland, a business marketing major at the University of Minnesota, are enrolled in San Jose State's public administration master's program.

Beyond Football: The San José State University "Beyond Football" program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019, the Spartans logged more than 5,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

Apparel: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas. The 2019 season is the Spartans' third with adidas.
