San José State record: 4-0, 4-0 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans defeated UNLV, 34-17, in a Mountain West game on November 14. San José State has wins in its last five games dating back to the 17-16 victory over Fresno State to conclude the 2019 season.

Fresno State record: 3-1, 3-1 Mountain West. Most recently, the Bulldogs Defeated Utah State, 35-16, on November 14.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his fourth season as the Spartans' head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 12-29, all at San José State. Received a three-year contract extension through the 2024 season in December 2019. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. Brennan is 1-2 as a head coach against Fresno State.

Fresno State head coach Kaelin DeBoer: In his first season as the Bulldogs' head coach. Has a major college head coaching record of 3-1, all at Fresno State. He is 0-0 as a head coach against San José State.

Series history: Fresno State leads the series, 42-38-3. The Spartans have won four of the seven games played since San Jose State joined the Mountain West in 2013 and five of the last eight contests in this series since 2011. A year ago, San Jose State posted a 17-16 win over Fresno State in CEFCU Stadium to conclude the 2019 season. Fresno State's last win in the series was a 31-13 decision in 2018.

The San Jose State-Fresno State series is the Spartans' longest running one with 83 games played dating back to 1921. For San Jose State, it has played only two other schools as many as 60 times. The Spartans' series with Stanford started in 1900 with 67 games played through 2013. San Jose State's original traditional rival in many sports, the University of the Pacific discontinued football in 1995 after the two teams had faced each other 68 times starting in 1921.

Playing for the Valley Trophy: Since 2013, San Jose State and Fresno State have played to possess the Valley Trophy signifying San Jose State's location in the high tech based Silicon Valley and Fresno State's location in California's fertile San Joaquin Valley. The two California State University system schools are separated by 145 driving miles.

Since the inception of the Valley Trophy with its large "V" attached to a base, San Jose State has wins in four of the seven contests. The home team has wins in five of the seven Valley Trophy games including each of the last two.

Winning at Fresno's Bulldog Stadium: Since 1987, San Jose State has a 3-13 record against Fresno State in Fresno. In their three wins, the Spartans' margin of victory was by less than a touchdown in each game.

1986 San Jose State-Fresno State game still in the NCAA record book: While long-time San Jose State fans remember the 1986 San Jose State-Fresno State game in Spartan (now CEFCU) Stadium with the Spartans scoring two touchdowns in the final 1:10 for a 45-41 comeback win, the game remains in the NCAA football record book for penalties assessed in the game and to one team.

San Jose State and Fresno State combined for 36 penalties - a NCAA single-game record for most penalties in a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) contest by two teams. The Spartans were penalized a NCAA single-game, single-team record 24 times for 199 yards while the Bulldogs were assessed 12 penalties for 118 yards.

Both sides now: Defensive backs coach **J. D. Williams** is the one current coach to coach at San Jose State and at Fresno State. Williams was at San Jose State during the 1999 season. He stints at Fresno State include serving as a graduate assistant in 1997, and as an assistant coach during the 2000 and 2001 seasons and from 2017 to the present.

The late **Darryl Rogers** (1934-2018) was a successful head coach at both schools and continues as a finalist for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame as a head coach. Rogers coached the Bulldogs from the 1966 through 1972 seasons posting a 43-32-1 win-loss record. He was San Jose State's head coach from 1973 through 1975 leading the Spartans to a 22-9-3 record and a 1975 Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship.

Others to coach at both schools include former Seattle Seahawks and San Francisco 49ers head coach **Dennis Erickson** and former St. Louis Rams head coach **Mike Martz**.

Erickson was the offensive coordinator at Fresno State from 1976 to 1978 and at San Jose State from 1979 through 1981 before taking his first college head coaching job at Idaho in 1982.

Martz coached the receivers his one season at San Jose State in 1975 with Rogers. Martz eventually spent the 1979 season as a Fresno State assistant coach before his opportunity to coach in the NFL first with the Los Angeles Rams in 1992 and later as head coach of the St. Louis Rams from 2000 through 2005.

Aiming for a 5-0 start to the season: The last time a San José State team began a season with a 5-0 record was in 1939 when the Spartans completed a perfect 13-0 season. One of San Jose State's wins was a 42-7 victory at Fresno State to improve its record to 12-0.

That year, San Jose State reached 5-0 win a 28-0 win over Nevada on October 7 for its fourth shutout in its first five games.

A 5-0 conference start is possible: The 2020 San Jose State football team can become the university's first to post a 5-0 record in conference play since joining the Mountain West.

The last time the Spartans had a 5-0 conference record was in 1991 as a Big West Conference member after wins at Long Beach State, Utah State, and New Mexico State before returning home for victories over the University of the Pacific and UNLV.

The Spartans' last six-game winning streak: San José State University's last six game-winning streak covered the 2012 and 2013 seasons when the Spartans won their last seven games in 2012 and season-opener in 2013.

A Mountain West first: San José State University's current five-game winning streak, which includes the 2019 season-ending win over Fresno State, is the longest in the Mountain West for games played through November 14 - a first for the Spartans since joining the conference in 2013.

It's November & Spartans are undefeated: In one of the most unpredictable college football seasons, the 2020 San Jose State football team is the school's first squad since 1939 to play football in November as an undefeated team at 4-0. The last Spartan team to play in November as unbeaten is the 1939 squad that had a perfect 13-0 record.

National poll votes: For the first time since 2012, a San José State team received votes in a national poll. The Spartans head into the Fresno State game receiving votes the Associated Press and/or Amway coaches' poll powered by USA Today.

In the final polls for the 2012 season, San Jose State was ranked 21st in the Associated Press and in the USA Today/ESPN coaches poll after finishing with an 11-2 win-loss record and defeating Bowling Green in the Military Bowl.

A comeback road win: The win over San Diego State marked the first time in five years San Jose State overcame a 10-point deficit as a road team and won the game. The Spartans trailed the Aztecs, 10-0, until 0:33 remained in the second quarter before pulling out a 28-17 victory.

Prior to the November 6 road win, the last time San Jose State overcame a 10-point deficit on the road was a 33-27 overtime triumph at UNLV in 2015. The Spartans trailed 10-0 early in the second quarter before scoring 17 consecutive points before halftime in a game that had three lead changes in regulation play.

Back-to-back comebacks: San Jose State's recent 34-17 win over UNLV marked the second consecutive game in which the Spartans overcame a deficit and emerged victorious. The Spartans trailed 3-0 after UNLV's first possession of the game. San Jose trailed San Diego State, 10-0, before rallying for a 28-17 conference road victory.

A positive turnover margin in 2020: Tied for tenth in the country last year in turnover margin with a +10, San Jose State continues its success in turnover and points off of turnovers.

In the Spartans' last 16 games, San Jose State has scored 103 points off of turnovers and yielded 28.

Pass protection plays its part: San José State opened its 2020 season yielding only three quarterback sacks while attempting 135 passes in its first four games. The Spartans' ratio of pass attempts to sacks allowed (45 to 1) is among the best by a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team that has played at least four games, has attempted at least 100 passes, and yielded five or fewer.

Season rushing high in UNLV win: San Jose State's 176 rushing yards on 29 carries in the UNLV victory were the most by a Spartan team since gaining 196 yards on 61 carries in a 34-13 win over Cal Poly on September 2, 2017.

Against the Rebels, **Nick Nash** had his personal single-game best gaining 94 yards on eight carries and a season-long 28-yard run. Running backs **Tyler Nevens** with 45 yards and a touchdown and **Kairee Robinson** with 40 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries also had season-long runs of 35 and 12 yards, respectively.

Sack total picking up: In San Jose State's last three games, the Spartans accumulated 14 quarterback sacks including a season-high seven sacks in the UNLV victory. The seven sacks are the most by a San Jose State team in a game in the 21st century and is tied for the second most with 12 other schools for most by a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in 2020. A year ago, San Jose State was credited with only 17 sacks in 12 games.

The Spartans enter the Fresno State game tied for 11th nationally in team sacks at 3.5 per game.

Starting defensive linemen **Cade Hall** and **Viliami Fehoko** each have at least 1.0 quarterback sacks in each of the last three games. Individually, Hall is fifth nationally with 5.5 sacks for the season; Fehoko, tied for 13th with 4.0 sacks.

Defending the run: In its San Diego State victory, San Jose State yielded 102 rushing yards on 45 carries. The Spartans yielded their fewest rushing yards in a game since defeating Fresno State at the end of 2016. The Bulldogs gained 96 yards on 41 carries.

This season, the Spartans faced two teams averaging more than 300 rushing yards a game and limited them to at least 100 fewer yards than their average.

3rd down defense improving: Presently, San Jose State's third-down defense is allowing opponents a 44 percent conversion rate, a slight improvement over the 2019 figure of 47.2 percent. Just as meaningful, the Spartans created 11 3-and-out punting situations in four games compared to six after four games in 2019.

Spartan defense stacking up on 4th down: In 2020, San Jose State's three opponents are a combined 3-of-8 in fourth down situations. The 37.5 percent figure is the first time the percentage is under 50 percent since the 2012 season when opponents were converting fourth downs into first downs at a 42.9 percent rate.

Kickoff returns coming around: Freshman **Shamar Garrett** had his best game of his early college football career returning kickoffs in the UNLV win. Garrett averaged 32.7 yards on three kickoff returns with a season-long 42 yard run.

First-time starters: Seven players made their first major college start in San Jose State's first four games of the season.

"Tres bien" in the secondary: San Jose State heads into the Fresno game with a trio of "Tre's" starting in its defensive secondary. Two-year starting safety **Tre Webb**, second on the team in tackles with 23, is joined by cornerback **Tre White** and safety **Tre Jenkins**, who has the team's two interceptions this season.

Starkel a winner in his first San Jose State start: Quarterback **Nick Starkel** can claim wins as a starter at Texas A&M, Arkansas and San Jose State following the 17-6 win over Air Force. Starkel completed 22-of-29 passes with one interception for 226 yards and two touchdowns, both to tight end **Derrick Deese, Jr.** Starkel is the first San Jose State quarterback to win in his first start since **Blake Jurich** in a 42-10 win over North Dakota in 2014.

12 days at Humboldt State: In preparation for the 2020 season, the San Jose State University football program practiced at Humboldt State University from Saturday, October 3 through Wednesday, October 14. The six-bus caravan traveled roughly 650 miles round trip to Arcata, Calif., and back. The state of California's classification of COVID-19 protocols and guidelines in Humboldt County were less restrictive than in Santa Clara County where San Jose State is located.

In recognition of Humboldt State, a member of the California State University like San José State, the Spartans have a green "H" decal on the back of their helmets.

Spare The Air impact: During San Jose State's workouts prior to contact practices, the Spartans restarted their schedule twice in August and September due to the unprecedented number of Spare the Air days in Santa Clara County. The campus was closed August 19 through August 25, September 11 through September 15, and October 2 through October 4. During the third campus closure, the Spartans had relocated to Humboldt County and the Humboldt State University campus.

Coordinator continuity: For the first time since the 1987 through 1989 seasons, San Jose State has the same head coach, offensive coordinator, defensive coordinator in three consecutive seasons. **Brent Brennan** and **Derrick Odum** enter their fourth season as head coach and defensive coordinator, respectively. **Kevin McGiven** joined the staff in 2018 as the offensive coordinator.

- San Jose State entered the NCAA record book in its game at Hawai'i when neither team punted in the Spartans' 42-40 loss. The Spartans had eight possessions in the game scoring four touchdowns and four field goals.

- San Jose State recovered its first onside kick in five years when **Christian Webb** came up with the football in a successful attempt in second game of the season against Tulsa. The Spartans had gone 0-for-10 in onside kick attempts during the 2015 through 2018 seasons.

CEFCU Stadium evolving: CEFCU Stadium's new scoreboard and videoboard made its debut at the north end of the stadium for the Air Force game.

During the summer of 2019, nearly 9,000 spectator seats were removed from the east grandstand to complete Phase #1 of the Spartan Athletics Center project at CEFCU Stadium. Scheduled to open in 2023, the Center will be the new home for San Jose State football, women's soccer and men's soccer and be available for use by the entire Spartan student-athlete population.

Phase #2, demolition of the east side of CEFCU Stadium, occurred in 2020. In 2023, the east side of CEFCU Stadium will be rebuilt with bleacher seating, concession stands and other amenities.

Versatile Spartans: Center **Kyle Hoppe** and defensive linemen **E.J. Ane** are San Jose State players to play both offense and defense for the Spartans.

Ane played on both sides of the ball in the 2018 UNLV and Nevada games.

Hoppe, a two-year starter at center, played a reserve defensive lineman in 2017.

Running back **Brendan Manigo** and wide receiver **Jamar Simpson** were members of the San Jose State University 2019 outdoor and 2020 indoor track and field teams, respectively.

Family ties: This year's San Jose State team has a range of internal family ties.

- Head coach **Brent Brennan**, is the son of former SJSU wide receiver the late Steve Brennan.

- Running backs coach **Alonzo Carter** is the stepfather of freshman wide receiver **Malikhi Miller**.

- Safeties **Tre Jenkins** and **Andrew Jenkins** are twin brothers. Their dad, Aaron Jenkins, scored a touchdown on a 6-yard run for the University of Washington in a 35-31 comeback win over the Spartans in 1988.

* Quarterback **Nick Nash** is a second-generation Spartan. His dad, Kenny Nash, was a wide receiver on the 1985 and 1986 San Jose State football teams.

A master's degree in their future: Wide receiver **Bailey Gaither**, offensive lineman **Jack Snyder**, quarterback **Nick Starkel**, and linebacker **Christian Webb** are four San José State players playing as graduate students.

Gaither and Webb are pursuing a master's degree in interdisciplinary studies; Starkel, justice studies; and Snyder, urban planning.

Beyond Football: The San José State University "Beyond Football" program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2020, the Spartans logged more than 10,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

Carter wins a Zoomtopia, Zoom's Oscar equivalent: San Jose State University running backs coach Alonzo Carter earned a 2020 Zoomtopia Award from Zoom Communications for Innovation in the category of "Emphasis on Diversity: Bridging the Divide" during the company's annual two-day online webinar October 14 and 15. Zoom, based in San Jose, also honored a winner in the categories of Extraordinary Connections and Experiences, Exemplary Educators, Exceptional Healthcare, and Evolution of Business.

This year, Carter was the ringleader and master of ceremonies for the West Coast Zoom Coaches Clinics that attracted more than 8,000 total participants, mainly minority football coaches at all levels, focusing on listening, learning, mentoring and networking during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Carter is the only known college football coach with a platinum record and a Grammy Award for his work as a lead dancer and choreographer for hip-hop icon MC Hammer and a Zoomtopia Award.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

Apparel: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas. The 2020 season is the Spartans' fourth with adidas.
