# PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

Now in his 19th season as Saint Joseph's University head coach, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the

top coaches in the school's storied history. He has worked 29 years overall at SJU, including 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 340-238. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories seven times in the past 18 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks coach.

Martelli is the dean of Atlantic 10 coaches as the longest tenured coach currently in the league. He also ranks second all-time in the league in overall career victories, and with a 167-121 mark in Atlantic 10 play, owns the most conference wins for any active coach.

One of the more respected coaches in the game, he is currently the President of the NABC's Board of Directors and is a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career. Among the highlights of the season was a win over nationally-ranked Notre Dame in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, a victory over local rival Temple and two wins over conference foe Xavier.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Saint Joseph's boasted a young and exciting squad, and one of the most balanced in school history, as five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals. He reached two milestones with his 300th career victory (March 11) and his 150th conference win (March 5), while also coaching his 500th game and 250th A-10 contest.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced

squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins earning AP Honorable Mention All-America honors and becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-11) and has taken SJU to the postseason in nine of the last 13 years, and 11 times in his 18 seasons.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU was rewarded with its sixth consecutive postseason bid, but saw the season come to an end in the NIT Second Round.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, the 2004-05 Hawks struggled early on, but Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to finish 24-12. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most com-

pelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. In addition to the national awards, he was the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year.

He served as head coach of the 2005 USA Under-21 World Championship Team, which finished in fifth place finish at the FIBA U21 World Championships.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to follow in the storied tradition of SJU coaches.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have two young grandchildren, Philip Stephen, and Marra, who are the children of Phil, Jr., and wife Meghan.

LAST TIME OUT: Saint Joseph's fell in the final seconds to Creighton, 83-79, as Doug McDermott converted a three-point play with 4.9 seconds to play in front of a sold-out crowd at Hagan Arena. Ronald Roberts. Jr. gave the Hawks a 79-78 lead with a pair of free throws with 27.5 seconds remaining. SJU had two fouls to give and committed both to force Creighton to inbound with 13.3 seconds remaining. McDermott, who scored 20 points in the game, got the ball on the baseline and hit a jumper inside the arc and was fouled on the play. The Hawks had one more chance but the inbounds pass at 4.9 seconds remaining was intercepted and two Creighton free throws provide the final margin. The loss ruined a team high 20-point effort by SJU freshman DeAndre' Bembry, who scored 14 in the second half. Bembry shot 8-for-14 from the field and connected on 4-of-8 three-pointers. Chris Wilson scored 18 points, making 6-of-11 three-pointers, while Langston Galloway scored 14 and Roberts had 13. Halil Kanacevic had a double-double with 10 rebounds and 10 assists. SJU led by as much as 13 in the game, and had a 45-40 lead at halftime before Creighton came back in the second half.

**CLOSING IN: Ronald Roberts, Jr.** needs 13 points to reach 1,000 for his career and become the 51st Hawk to do so. The senior also has 646 rebounds in his career, which ranks 23rd on SJU's all-time list.

FIRST HONOR: DeAndre' Bembry was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week for Nov. 17, earning the award for the first time. He averaged 14.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists as the Hawks went 1-1 on the week, while connecting on 54.5 percent from the field and 55.6 percent from three-point range. Bembry gained notice with his play in the Hawks' 82-79 loss to Creighton when he scored a team-high 20 points, including 14 in the second half. He shot 8-for-14 from the field and connected on 4-of-8 three-point field goals while adding four assists and one blocked shot. Earlier in the week, Bembry had nine points in the Hawks' 81-62 win over Marist in the home opener. He's averaging 13.4 ppg overall while converting 53.3 percent from the field and 53.8 percent from three-point range.

**20-20:** Langston Galloway scored 20-plus points in the first two games of his senior season and has tallied double figures in all three. The guard has notched double figures in seven straight games dating back to last year and has reached 20 or more points 24 times in his career.

LONG-DISTANCE SERVICE: Langston Galloway has 243 career three-pointers, to rank third on the Hawks' all-time list, and he needs two to move past Darrin Govens (2006-10) into second place (44). SJU's career leader is Pat Carroll (2001-05), who connected on 294. Galloway's in fine company, having surpassed Hawk greats Jameer Nelson and Marvin O'Connor.

HAIL HALIL: Halil Kanacevic fills the boxscore unlike any other player. He had a double-double against Creighton with 10 rebounds and 10 assists, which was the first of his career with those categories. That came after a 12-point, 11-rebound, 8-assist effort in the win over Marist. Phil Martelli said of the senior, "He may not be our best player but he's our most indispensable player. I tried to get some different guys in tonight, but then you realize you just have to put him back in." The 6-8 forward tied for the team lead in assists last season and has reached double figures in assists twice in his career thus far.

**LONG-RANGE THREAT: Chris Wilson** was one point shy of his career-high against Creighton when tallied 18 points by converting 6-of-11 from three-point range. It marked the second time in his career that Wilson connected on six three-pointers in a game - the first was when he achieved a career-high 19 points against Notre Dame in 2012-13.

**THREE'S COMPANY: Langston Galloway** is looking to regain his longrange shooting touch from his sophomore year, when he led the A-10 in three-point percentage and ranked fourth in the nation with 46.6 percent. The senior has gotten off to a good start, hitting 8-of-17 for 47.1 percent, while ranking third in the A-10 with 2.7 threes made per game.

**FROM THE START:** Freshman **DeAndre' Bembry** made his collegiate debut in the starting lineup and scored 11 points at Vermont, including the first six points of the Hawks' season. Originally from Charlotte, N.C., Bembry averaged 21 points as a senior at The Patrick School (N.J.) and earned All-State honors. He was the first freshman in the starting lineup on opening day since 2010-11 when the trio of **Langston Galloway**, **Daryus Quarles** and C.J. Aiken each started their first collegiate game.

**AT THE LINE: Halil Kanacevic** and **Ronald Roberts, Jr.**, both worked on their free-throw shooting in the off-season and it's showing. Kanacevic is 8-for-8 on the season after converting 64.5 percent last year. Roberts, who owned a 59.1 career free throw percentage entering this season, is now hitting 70.6 percent. He made a pair of free throws with 27 seconds remaining in the Creighton game to give the Hawks a 79-78 lead, which they would eventually lose in the final seconds.

**HOMETOWN TEAM:** Tonight's game gives senior **Langston Galloway** the chance to play against the team from his hometown of Baton Rouge. Galloway, who is the nephew of Hawks' assistant coach **Geoff Arnold**, was also recruited by LSU.

ABOUT BEMBRY: Phil Martelli likes what he has seen so far from freshman DeAndre' Bembry: "DeAndre' is a player beyond his age. He's got a really nice way about him and really takes in what you give him. After Bembry's 20-point performance against Creighton, Martelli said, "I think he is what we thought he would be. That's not a game for an 18-year-old, and he doesn't think or play like an 18-year-old. His shooting has been better than I would have anticipated and it's because he believes the ball is going in the basket. It's not great form but he has great confidence that the ball is going in the basket. I liked his drive in the first half (for a dunk). I thought that was his best play of the game."

**PLEASE PASS THE TURKEY:** This marks the first time under **Phil Martelli** that the Hawks will play a game on Thanksgiving. The last time Saint Joseph's played in a tournament around the holiday was in the 2008 EA Sports Maui Invitational, which ended on the day before Thanksgiving.

**TOURNEY TIME:** The Old Spice Classic continues a run of the Hawks' participation in high-profile early-season tournaments for eight of the last nine years. Here's a rundown of the tournaments and Saint Joseph's record in each:

LONG TIME COMING: This is actually Saint Joseph's first trip to the state of Florida in the regular season since Feb. 6, 1991, when it lost to Miami, 87-64. The Hawks did make a trip to Tampa for the 2003 NCAA Tournament First Round, where they lost a heartbreaking 65-63 overtime decision to Auburn.

**SEEING DOUBLE: Ronald Roberts** led the Hawks last season with 13 double-doubles on the year and he has one so far this year, with 16 points and 10 rebounds vs. Marist. **Halil Kanacevic** might give Roberts some competition in that category as the senior already has two double-doubles - 12 points, 11 rebounds against Marist and 10 points and 10 assists vs. Creighton.

**ON THE REBOUND:** Saint Joseph's leads the A-10 in defensive rebounds with 27.7 per game and a big reason is the tandem of **Halil Kanacevic** and **Ronald Roberts**. Kanacevic is averaging a team-high 9.3 rebounds per game, with 8.0 defensive rebounds, while Roberts averages 7.7 boards and 4.7 defensive rebounds per game.

**OFF THE BENCH:** Sophomore **Isaiah Miles** gave the Hawks solid play off the bench at Vermont, seeing a career-best 19 minutes of action and posting six points and a team-high two blocks. Redshirt freshman **Javon Baumann** grabbed six rebounds in nine minutes vs. Marist.

**DOING IT ALL: Halil Kanacevic** ranks among the top five in the Atlantic 10 in four main categories. He's tied for the lead in free throw percentage (1.000), second in assists (7.0), tied for fourth in rebounding (9.3) and fifth in blocked shots (1.7).

**HOT AND COLD:** Saint Joseph's got its season off to a good start shooting a blistering 65.4 percent from the field in the first half at Vermont. The Hawks cooled off considerably in second half, converting just 26.9 percent (7-of-26) as Vermont came close to erasing a 17-point deficit. But SJU held on, helped by a 17-for-24 effort from the foul line in the second half. Against Marist, SJU shot just 1-for-6 from 3-point range in the first half, but converted 6-of-10 in the second half.

**EVERYBODY INTO THE ACT:** The Hawks' comfortable lead against Marist allowed **Phil Martelli** to get all 14 players into the game. The most notable entrance into the contest was that of redshirt freshman **Kyle Molock**, who had ACL surgery (right knee) in August 2012. Molock saw five minutes of action in his Saint Joseph's debut.

**ENJOYING THE RIDE:** On a number of occasions, **Phil Martelli** has said that he enjoys coaching this group. After the Creighton game, he elaborated, "I have a really great team. Now there are basketball pieces missing. But these guys, you can't wait to get to work with them in every aspect. The way they're perceived on campus and in recruiting is great." Regarding the Creighton game he said, "We led for 78 of 80 minutes and there was a lot of 'I got it', 'I hear you', 'my fault'. They're apologizing in the timeout huddles to each other. Practices have been crisp and there hasn't been down time worrying about other agendas. The timeouts were good, they were productive. They were saying all the right things. Now we have to carry that over to the next practice. But I really, really enjoy this team."

**VIVA ITALIA:** Saint Joseph's got a jump on the season when it traveled to Italy in August for a 10-day, four-game tour. The Hawks visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Lake Como and posted a 4-0 record on the trip. It marked the second time that **Phil Martelli** took SJU to Italy, with the last trip coming in 1999.

**DEAN OF COACHES:** This is **Phil Martelli's** 19th season at the helm of the Hawks, and he is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 340-238 record. He is the longest tenured coach in the Atlantic 10 (19 years) and is now second on the conference's list for all-time career victories (340), behind John Chaney of Temple (516). Martelli is currently serving as the president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

**SIGN THEM UP:** SJU had four high school standouts - James Demery, Markell Lodge, Shavar Newkirk, and Obi Romeo - sign National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. Demery is a 6-6 wing player from Northside Christian Academy in Charlotte, N.C. He averaged 16.8 points and 4.2 steals last season as his team won its second straight

Independent School 2A state title. Lodge, originally from Virginia, is a 6-7 wing at Pace Academy in Carrboro, N.C., who is known for his tremendous athleticism and leaping ability. Newkirk is a 6-0 point guard from Cardinal Hayes High School in Bronx, N.Y. Considered one of the top point guards in New York City, he helped Cardinal Hayes to the CHSAA Semifinals in 2012. Romeo, a 6-foot-10 forward with a 94-inch wingspan, is originally from Nigeria and has been in the United States for the past three years, attending Greenbrier East High School in West Virginia. He averaged 10 points and 13 rebounds last season for the team that went 20-5.

IN MEMORY: Halil Kanacevic changed his uniform number this year to 45 (from 21) in memory of his uncle, Rizo Popovic, who passed away during the 2012-13 season at the age of 45. Kanacevic explained, "It's one of the most selfish things you think of, as a player, when you're growing up. You get a certain number, you get infatuated with it...I've seen kids get into fights over a jersey number. My thing was, let me be unselfish about that and actually give meaning to it. I know what that number means, I know what it represents, I chose it for personal reasons, not a selfish reason. I felt like I needed to do it."

MEMBERS ONLY: The Hawks could have a trio of 1,000-point scorers on the team in Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr. and Halil Kanacevic. Galloway already reached the plateau as a junior and currently has 1,444 points. Roberts entered this season needing 63 points to reach 1,000 in his career while Kanacevic started the year with 785 career points, counting his one season at Hofstra. The last time SJU had three 1,000point scorers on the same squad was in 2007-08, with Pat Calathes, Rob Ferguson and Ahmad Nivins.

CALLING ON CHRIS: Chris Wilson opened last season as the starting point guard and has done that again this year. The junior topped SJU in assists with 112, while tying for the lead with his 3.5 average. Wilson started 23 contests and scored double figures nine times.

TEN YEARS AFTER: It's hard to believe but this season marks the 10th anniversary of Saint Joseph's memorable 2003-04 season, in which the Hawks went 27-0 during the regular season, and 30-2 overall, earned a number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament and reached the Elite Eight, while coming within two points of a Final Four berth. Jameer Nelson and Phil Martelli were the consensus National Player of the Year and National Coach of the Year, respectively, while creating a season on Hawk Hill for the record books. Ironically, the 2013-14 Hawks could face Oklahoma State, the team which defeated SJU in the 2004 Regional Final, as the Cowboys are a participant in the Old Spice Classic.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the fifth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 34-21 record in the five seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 353-103 overall record in 63 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse.

COMEBACK KID: Redshirt freshman Kyle Molock made his debut against Marist after recovering from surgery to repair the ACL of his right knee suffered in August 2012. It was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career. He was averaging 19.0 points through eight games as a senior at Dublin Coffman when he tore the ACL of his right knee in January 2012; in July of 2010, he suffered a severe injury to all of the major ligaments in his left knee, causing him to miss his junior year.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: Newcomers this season are freshmen DeAndre' Bembry, Jai Williams and Brendan Casper. Bembry is an All-State selection from The Patrick School; Williams earned All-Public

League honors in Philadelphia; and Casper was the Pottstown Area Player of the Year at Methacton High School. He joins the Hawks as a walk-on.

GETTING IN THE GAME: Javon Baumann made his Hawk debut at Vermont after redshirting last season to further his development. The 6-8 forward from Germany has shown some positive signs in the preseason which could lead to consistent playing time.

DOUBLE DUTY: Ronald Roberts, Jr., who was an All-Atlantic 10 Third Team selection and the team's MVP in 2012-13, led the Hawks in double-doubles last season with 13, to give him 17 in his career. He has 646 career rebounds to rank 23rd on Saint Joseph's all-time list.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: Saint Joseph's non-conference schedule is ranked as the second toughest in the A-10, behind VCU's. Other nonconference foes of note on the Hawks' schedule are Creighton, Villanova, Temple and Vermont.

**CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic** and **Ronald Roberts, Jr.,** were voted as tri-captains by their teammates. Galloway served as the Hawks' lone captain last year.

**HIGH-FLYING HAWK:** Senior **Ronald Roberts, Jr.**, is one of the most exciting players in recent Hawk history, with his tremendous athletic ability. The team's leading rebounder with 8.3 per game, he earned Atlantic 10 All-Conference Third Team honors last season.

THE POINT FORWARD: Halil Kanacevic's unique passing ability for a forward allows the Hawk offense to often run through him. He has been SJU's leader in assists for the past two seasons, tying with Chris Wilson last year with a 3.5 average. In 2012-13, he ranked second on the team with 7.2 rebounds while scoring 8.5 points per game. Kanacevic leads the Hawks already this year with 5.5 assists per game.

**GETTER BETTER ALL THE TIME: Ronald Roberts, Jr.** has been named the Hawks' Most Improved Player for all three seasons. As a freshman, Roberts averaged 6.4 points and 4.7 rebounds and then as a sophomore, averaged 10.9 points and 5.9 rebounds off the bench and was named the Atlantic 10's Sixth Man of the Year. Last season, Roberts posted 11.2 points and 8.3 rebounds to also be named the Hawks' MVP.

WATCHING THE HAWKS: Saint Joseph's will have 21 games televised this season, including 13 national televison appearances, which is the most ever for the Hawks. SJU's first appearance will be against LSU in the Old Spice Classic on Thanksgiving, which will be shown on ESPN2. The remainder of the three-game tournament will air on the ESPN Networks. The Hawks will have five in a row in the early part of the season. After the Old Spice Classic, SJU will visit Big 5 rival Temple for a game on ESPNews, and then host rival Villanova in a Big 5 game on CBS Sports Network. (full schedule on page 2)

VETERAN GROUP: The Hawks have a core group with four players who held starting roles last season - Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr., Chris Wilson and Halil Kanacevic - along with another senior - Daryus Quarles - who has started 67 games in his career. Galloway and Roberts were the only two players to start all 32 games for the team in 2013. Galloway is the team's leading returning scorer after notching 13.8 ppg last season while Roberts topped the team in rebounding with 8.3 per game. Wilson made 23 starts and led the team in assists with 112 and 3.5 per game while averaging 6.5 points. Kanacevic, who played in 26 games with 14 starts, averaged 8.5 points and 7.2 rebounds and also handed out 3.5 assists. Quarles was a starter his first two seasons in saw action in 29 games last year, mostly in a reserve role.

A LOOK BACK: Last year's squad went 18-14 and earned an NIT bid, which was the second consecutive and the 11th postseason berth under Phil Martelli in his 18 years. From that team, the Hawks are without Carl Jones, who ended his career as the third leading scorer in school history with 1,845 points, and C.J. Aiken, who left SJU after his junior year to pursue a professional basketball career. He finished his career as the second all-time leading shot blocker in SJU history with 319.

**PRESEASON PICK:** Saint Joseph's was voted to finish fifth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks finished in a tie for eighth place last year with an 8-8 record.

WAITING IN THE WINGS: Freshman forward Jai Williams, from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, earned All-Public League Fourth Team honors is expected to redshirt the season to further his development. Aaron Brown, a 6-5 guard, transferred to SJU from West Virginia this summer and will sit out the year due to NCAA transfer rules. He was the Delaware County Player of the Year in 2010 for nearby

Penn Wood High School and will have two years with the Hawks beginning in 2014-15.

**CRADLE OF COACHES:** The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: Phil Martelli's staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach Mark Bass was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and then was a senior on the squad that reached the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach Geoff Arnold played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations Rob Sullivan was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** When Saint Joseph's returns to Philadelphia it will have a pair of games against city rivals. The Hawks are set to visit former A-10 foe Temple on Dec. 4 and will then host traditional rival Villanova on Dec. 7. After a break for final exams, SJU will play its third consecutive Philadelphia team when it hosts Drexel on Dec. 18.

# THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 57 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

lan Klinger, the 35th student to wear the wings, is the Hawk mascot for the second consecutive season. He is a junior finance and accounting major from Millersburg, Pa.

# **GAME RECAPS**

# Game 1: November 13, 2013 - Patrick Gym - Burlington, Vt. SJU 74 -Vermont 64

Langston Galloway and Ronald Roberts, Jr., scored 21 points apiece to lead Saint Joseph's to a 74-64 win at Vermont in the season opener for both teams, while freshman DeAndre' Bembry scored 11 points in his collegiate debut. The Hawks shot a blistering 65 percent from the field in the first half, but cooled off in the second as Vermont cut a 17-point deficit to just three points at the 10-minute mark of the second. But SJU's seniors — Galloway, Roberts, Daryus Quarles and Halil Kanacevic - pulled the Hawks through as the classmates scored all of the points in a 10-1 run to give them a more comfortable 64-53 lead with 4:21 to play.
