PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

In 18 seasons as Saint Joseph's University head coach, Phil Martelli has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the

top coaches in the school's storied history. He has worked 28 years overall at SJU, including 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 338-237. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories seven times in the past 18 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks coach.

Martelli is the dean of Atlantic 10 coaches as the longest tenured coach currently in the league. He also ranks second all-time in the league in overall career victories, and with a 167-121 mark in Atlantic 10 play, owns the most conference wins for any active coach.

One of the more respected coaches in the game, he is currently the President of the NABC's Board of Directors and is a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career. Among the highlights of the season was a win over nationallyranked Notre Dame in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, a victory over local rival Temple and two wins over conference foe Xavier.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Saint Joseph's boasted a young and exciting squad, and one of the most balanced in school history, as five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals. He reached two milestones with his 300th career victory (March 11) and his 150th conference win (March 5), while also coaching his 500th game and 250th A-10 contest.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced

squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins earning AP Honorable Mention All-America honors and becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-11) and has taken SJU to the postseason in nine of the last 13 years, and 11 times in his 18 seasons.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU was rewarded with its sixth consecutive postseason bid, but saw the season come to an end in the NIT Second Round.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, the 2004-05 Hawks struggled early on, but Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to finish 24-12. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most com-

> pelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight, Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

> Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. In addition to the national awards, he was the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year.

> He served as head coach of the 2005 USA Under-21 World Championship Team, which finished in fifth place finish at the FIBA U21 World Championships.

> A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to follow in the storied tradition of SJU coaches.

> Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

> Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

> As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

> Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children -Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have two young grandchildren, Philip Stephen, and Marra, who are the children of Phil, Jr., and wife Meghan.

FOR OPENERS: Saint Joseph's is 7-1 in season openers in the past eight years, with the only loss coming in 2010-11 against Western Kentucky.

VETERAN GROUP: Hawks return four players who held starting roles last season - Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr., Chris Wilson and Halil Kanacevic - along with another senior - Daryus Quarles - who has started 67 games in his career. Galloway and Roberts are the only two players to have started all 32 games for the team. Galloway is the team's leading returning scorer after notching 13.8 ppg last season while Roberts topped the team in rebounding with 8.3 per game. Wilson made 23 starts and led the team in assists with 112 and 3.5 per game while averaging 6.5 points. Kanacevic, who played in 26 games with 14 starts, averaged 8.5 points and 7.2 rebounds and also handed out 3.5 assists. Quarles was a starter his first two seasons aw action in 29 games last year, mostly in a reserve role.

A LOOK BACK: Last year's squad went 18-14 and earned an NIT bid, which was the second consecutive and the 11th postseason berth under Phil Martelli in his 18 years. From that team, the Hawks are without Carl Jones, who ended his career as the third leading scorer in school history with 1,845 points, and C.J. Aiken, who left SJU after his junior year to pursue a professional basketball career. He finished his career as the second all-time leading shot blocker in SJU history with 319.

VIVA ITALIA: Saint Joseph's got a jump on the season when it traveled to Italy in August for a 10-day, four-game tour. The Hawks visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Lake Como and posted a 4-0 record on the trip. It marked the second time that **Phil Martelli** took SJU to Italy, with the last trip coming in 1999.

DEAN OF COACHES: This is **Phil Martelli's** 19th season at the helm of the Hawks, and he is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 338-237 record. He is the longest tenured coach in the Atlantic 10 (18 years) and is now second on the conference's list for all-time career victories (338), behind John Chaney of Temple (516). Martelli is currently serving as the president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

GOING TO DISNEY WORLD: The Hawks will participate in the 2013 Old Spice Classic in Orlando, Fla. (Nov. 28, 29 & Dec. 1). Saint Joseph's will open play in the tournament against LSU on Thanksgiving night at 8:30 p.m. The Hawks will meet either Memphis or Siena in the second game on Nov. 29, with the tournament wrapping up on December 1. Butler, Oklahoma State, Purdue, and Washington State round out the field.

IN MEMORY: Halil Kanacevic has changed his uniform number this year to 45 (from 21) in memory of his uncle, Rizo Popovic, who passed away during the 2012-13 season at the age of 45. Kanacevic explained, "It's one of the most selfish things you think of, as a player, when you're growing up. You get a certain number, you get infatuated with it...I've seen kids get into fights over a jersey number. My thing was, let me be unselfish about that and actually give meaning to it. I know what that number means, I know what it represents, I chose it for personal reasons, not a selfish reason. I felt like I needed to do it."

MEMBERS ONLY: The Hawks could have a trio of 1,000-point scorers on the team in Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr. and Halil Kanacevic. Galloway already reached the plateau as a junior and currently has 1,389 points. Roberts enters the season needing 63 points to reach 1,000 in his career while Kanacevic has 785 career points, counting his one season at Hofstra. The last time SJU had three 1,000-point scorers on the same squad was in 2007-08, with Pat Calathes, Rob Ferguson and Ahmad Nivins.

FROM THE START: Freshman **DeAndre**' **Bembry**, a 6-6 wing, will make his collegiate debut in the starting lineup. Originally from Charlotte, N.C., Bembry averaged 21 points as a senior at The Patrick School (N.J.) and earned All-State honors. He becomes the first freshman in the starting lineup on opening day since 2010-11 when the trio of **Langston Galloway**, **Daryus Quarles** and C.J. Aiken each started their first collegiate game.

CALLING ON CHRIS: Chris Wilson opened last season as the starting point guard and will do that again this year. The junior topped SJU in assists with 112, while tying for the lead with his 3.5 average. Wilson started 23 contests and scored double figures nine times.

COMEBACK KID: Redshirt freshman **Kyle Molock** will make his debut this year after recovering from surgery to repair the ACL of his right knee suffered in August 2012. It was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career. He was averaging 19.0 points through eight games as a senior at Dublin Coffman when he tore the ACL of his right knee in January 2012; in July of 2010, he suffered a severe injury to all of the major ligaments in his left knee, causing him to miss his junior year.

GETTING IN THE GAME: Javon Baumann will also be making his Hawk debut after redshirting last season to further his development. The 6-8 forward from Germany has shown some positive signs in the preseason which could lead to consistent playing time.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: Newcomers this season are freshmen DeAndre' Bembry, Jai Williams and Brendan Casper. Bembry is an All-State selection from The Patrick School; Williams earned All-Public League honors in Philadelphia; and Casper was the Pottstown Area Player of the Year at Methacton High School. He joins the Hawks as a walk-on.

DOUBLE DUTY: Ronald Roberts, Jr., who was an All-Atlantic 10 Third Team selection and the team's MVP in 2012-13, led the Hawks in double-doubles last season with 13, to give him 17 in his career. He has 623 career rebounds to rank 26th on Saint Joseph's all-time list.

CLIMBING THE LADDER: Langston Galloway has 235 career three-pointers, which ranks third on the Hawks' all-time list, and he needs 10 to surpass Darrin Govens (2006-10) for second place. SJU's career leader is Pat Carroll (2001-05), who connected on 294.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: Saint Joseph's non-conference schedule is ranked as the second toughest in the A-10, behind VCU's. Other non-conference foes of note on the Hawks' schedule are Creighton, Villanova, Temple and Vermont.

CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and **Ronald Roberts, Jr.**, were voted as tri-captains by their teammates. Galloway served as the Hawks' lone captain last year.

HIGH-FLYING HAWK: Senior **Ronald Roberts, Jr.**, is one of the most exciting players in recent Hawk history, with his tremendous athletic ability. The team's leading rebounder with 8.3 per game, he earned Atlantic 10 All-Conference Third Team honors last season.

THE POINT FORWARD: Halil Kanacevic's unique passing ability for a forward allows the Hawk offense to often run through him. He has been SJU's leader in assists for the past two seasons, tying with **Chris Wilson** last year with a 3.5 average. In 2012-13, he ranked second on the team with 7.2 rebounds while scoring 8.5 points per game.

GETTER BETTER ALL THE TIME: Ronald Roberts, Jr. has been named the Hawks' Most Improved Player for all three seasons. As a freshman, Roberts averaged 6.4 points and 4.7 rebounds and then as a sophomore, averaged 10.9 points and 5.9 rebounds off the bench and was named the Atlantic 10's Sixth Man of the Year. Last season, Roberts posted 11.2 points and 8.3 rebounds to also be named the Hawks' MVP.

WATCHING THE HAWKS: Saint Joseph's will have 21 games televised this season, including 13 national televison appearances, which is the most ever for the Hawks. SJU's first appearance will be against LSU in the Old Spice Classic on Thanksgiving, which will be shown on ESPN2. The remainder of the three-game tournament will air on the ESPN Networks. The Hawks will have five in a row in the early part of the season. After the Old Spice Classic, SJU will visit Big 5 rival Temple for a game on ESPNews, and then host rival Villanova in a Big 5 game on CBS Sports Network. (full schedule on page 2)

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was voted to finish fifth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks finished in a tie for eighth place last year with an 8-8 record.

WAITING IN THE WINGS: Freshman forward Jai Williams, from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, earned All-Public League Fourth Team honors is expected to redshirt the season to further his development. Aaron Brown, a 6-5 guard, transferred to SJU from West Virginia this summer and will sit out the year due to NCAA transfer rules. He was the Delaware County Player of the Year in 2010 for nearby Penn Wood High School and will have two years with the Hawks beginning in 2014-15.

CITY'S FINEST: Ronald Roberts, Jr. was named to the All-Big 5 First Team in 2012-13 while **Langston Galloway** was a Second Team selection.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: Phil Martelli's staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach Mark Bass was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and then was a senior on the squad that reached the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach Geoff Arnold played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations Rob Sullivan was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks open the home schedule on November 13 when they host Marist, followed by a visit from Jesuit rival Creighton on November 16.

THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 57 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

lan Klinger, the 35th student to wear the wings, is the Hawk mascot for the second consecutive season. He is a junior finance and accounting major from Millersburg, Pa.
