GAME STORIES

- The Hawks earned fifth place in the Old Spice Classic in Orlando with wins over Siena and Washington State.
- This marks the first time in 67 years that Saint Joseph's and Temple will meet in a non-conference game. It's the earliest date in the season that the teams have played since December 12, 1989. (more on page 4)
- This is the first Big 5 game of the season for Saint Joseph's.
- **Ronald Roberts, Jr.** was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week and selected to the Old Spice Classic All-Tournament Team after he averaged 20 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.7 blocks in SJU's three games in Orlando.
- **Ronald Roberts, Jr.** is the team's leading scorer (18.5) while **Halil Kanacevic** tops the Hawks in rebounding (7.5), assists (4.5) and blocks (1.5). **Ronald Roberts** tops the squad in field goal percentage (65.2) and **DeAndre' Bembry** leads SJU in three-point percentage (50.0).
- Saint Joseph's is in the midst of a stretch of three consecutive games against Philadelphia rivals. The Hawks will host #14/19 Villanova on Saturday and then after a break for final exams, will host Drexel on Dec. 18.

PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

Now in his 19th season as Saint Joseph's University head coach, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history. He has worked 29 years overall at SJU, including 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 342-239. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories seven times in the past 18 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks coach.

Martelli is the dean of Atlantic 10 coaches as the longest tenured coach currently in the league. He also ranks second all-time in the league in overall career victories, and with a 167-121 mark in Atlantic 10 play, owns the most conference wins for any active coach.

One of the more respected coaches in the game, he is currently the President of the NABC's Board of Directors and is a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career. Among the highlights of the season was a win over nationally-ranked Notre Dame in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, a victory over local rival Temple and two wins over conference foe Xavier.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Saint Joseph's boasted a young and exciting squad, and one of the most balanced in school history, as five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals. He reached two milestones with his 300th career victory (March 11) and his 150th conference win (March 5), while also coaching his 500th game and 250th A-10 contest.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins earning AP Honorable Mention All-America honors and becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-11) and has taken SJU to the postseason in nine of the last 13 years, and 11 times in his 18 seasons.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU was rewarded with its sixth consecutive postseason bid, but saw the season come to an end in the NIT Second Round.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, the 2004-05 Hawks struggled early on, but Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to finish 24-12. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most com-

elling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. In addition to the national awards, he was the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year.

He served as head coach of the 2005 USA Under-21 World Championship Team, which finished in fifth place finish at the FIBA U21 World Championships.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to follow in the storied tradition of SJU coaches.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have two young grandchildren, Philip Stephen, and Marra, who are the children of Phil, Jr., and wife Meghan.

LAST TIME OUT: Ronald Roberts had 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead Saint Joseph's to a 72-67 win over Washington State in the fifth-place game of the 2013 Old Spice Classic at ESPN's Wide World of Sports. DeAndre' Bembry and Langston Galloway each added 13 points. Roberts dominated inside, shooting 8-for-12 from the field, with five dunks on the day, en route to his second double-double of the year. Bembry sparked the Hawks in the second half with 11 points, including a pair of three-point plays. Trailing 56-55 with eight minutes to play, Saint Joseph's outscored the Cougars, 15-4, to take a 70-65 lead with just over a minute to play. WSU pulled to within 70-67 and after SJU missed two shots on its next possession, the Hawks forced a Washington State turnover. Galloway and Roberts each converted a free throw in the final 30 seconds and Bembry blocked a shot at :06 to preserve the win.

RON'S WEEKEND: Ronald Roberts, Jr., was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week for Dec. 2, sharing the award with VCU's Treveon Graham. It is the second time in his career that he has received the conference's weekly award and the first time this year. He was also selected to the 2013 Old Spice Classic All-Tournament Team as he helped the Hawks to a fifth-place finish with wins over Siena and Washington State by averaging 20 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.7 blocks in SJU's three games in Orlando. The senior had 21 points, 7 rebounds and two blocks in the loss to LSU, but then posted 19 points and four rebounds in a win over Siena. In both games, Roberts went 9-for-13 from the field. Roberts scored his 1,000th career point vs. LSU to become the 51st Hawk to achieve that. In the win over Washington State, Roberts had 21 points, 10 rebounds and two blocks for his second double-double of the year, converting 8-of-12 field goals in the second half. On the week, Roberts shot 26-for-38 (68.4 percent) from the field.

THE SJU-TU SERIES: This marks the 157th game in the Saint Joseph's-Temple series, which is the longest running for the Hawks and the most-played in Big 5 history. SJU won 12 of 13 games from 2003 to 2008, with separate winning streaks of seven games and five games. Temple started a 10-game winning streak on March 2, 2008 in the Atlantic 10 Championship game, but that came to an end on Feb. 25, 2012 when SJU scored an 82-72 win over the Owls in Hagan Arena. The Hawks have now won two in a row after last year's 70-69 win on Hawk Hill.

LAST TIME VS. TEMPLE: Carl Jones hit back-to-back three-pointers to key a 14-2 run in the final five minutes as Saint Joseph's rallied from nine points down to edge Temple, 70-69, before a sold-out crowd at Hagan Arena. Ronald Roberts led the Hawks with 18 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks, while Jones and C.J. Aiken had 16 points apiece. Halil Kanacevic posted 12 points, nine rebounds and eight assists. Aiken put the Hawks ahead for good, 68-66, with a layup off a lob pass from Kanacevic at :25. Roberts blocked a shot on Temple's next possession and Kanacevic grabbed the rebound and hit both ends of a one-and-one to give SJU a 70-66 lead with 16 seconds to go. Temple came right back down the court and Khalif Wyatt hit his seventh three-pointer of the game to pull the Owls within 70-69 with 10.4 seconds left. After Jones missed the front end of a one-and-one at :08, Wyatt, who had a career-high 34 points, drove the lane and the ball went out of bounds off the Hawks. Temple had one more chance with 0.7 seconds left and Wyatt's shot was off the mark.

LONG-RUNNING SHOW: Tonight's game marks the first time in 67 years that Saint Joseph's and Temple will meet in a non-conference game. Both schools were members of the Middle Athletic Conference from 1946-47 to 1973-74 and then joined the East Coast Conference. After the 1981-82 season, Saint Joseph's and Temple became members of the Atlantic 10, with TU moving to the American Athletic Conference this

past summer. There have only been 26 games played in the 156 of the series that were non-conference contests, with TU holding a 14-12 edge.

KEY TO THE CITY: This is the first Big 5 game of the year for the Hawks and their first of two this week. SJU will host Villanova on Dec. 7, play at Penn on Jan. 18 and face La Salle twice this season, with SJU's home game on March 9 counting in the Big 5 standings. Saint Joseph's has won 20 Big 5 titles (9 outright/11 shared), which is third all-time to Temple's 27 titles (6/21 shared).

FRIENDLY FOES: Phil Martelli and Fran Dunphy are very good friends and share a passion for their work in the community. The coaches are co-chairs of the Philadelphia Coaches vs. Cancer effort, which is one of the nation's highest fundraising groups for Coaches vs. Cancer. The group, which is comprised of the city's six Division I coaches and their wives, raised close to \$1 million last year. Martelli is also the chair of the National Coaches vs. Cancer Council.

THE BIG THREE: Senior tri-captains Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., are the core of the Hawks' team and they currently account for 61 percent of SJU's scoring and 55 percent of the rebounding. There has only been one game thus far - Creighton - in which the Hawks' leading scorer was not one of those three.

LOOK AT LANGSTON: After a disappointing effort (8 pts) against his hometown team LSU, Langston Galloway rebounded in a big way against Siena. The senior scored a season-high 27 points and connected on six three-pointers. He shot 4-of-7 from beyond the arc in the first half as the Hawks built up their double-digit lead. Galloway's career-high of three-pointers is seven, which he achieved against Fordham in 2011-12.

JOIN THE CLUB: Ronald Roberts, Jr. become the 51st Hawk to score 1,000 points in his career on a tip-in with 6:23 remaining in the first half vs. LSU. He now has 1,048 points to tie for 44th the Hawks' all-time list. The senior also has 667 rebounds in his career, which ranks 23rd on SJU's all-time list. Here's a look at the all-time scoring list and the names Roberts should surpass in future weeks:

LONG-DISTANCE SERVICE: With six three-pointers against Siena, Langston Galloway now ranks second on the Hawks' all-time list with 252. SJU's career leader is Pat Carroll (2001-05), who connected on 294. Galloway's in fine company, having surpassed Hawk greats Jameer Nelson and Marvin O'Connor.

ACCESS DENIED: Against LSU, the Hawks couldn't put the ball in the basket from either the three-point arc or the foul line. Saint Joseph's shot a dismal 18.8 percent from three-point range, including an 0-for-7 effort in the first half. At the foul line, the Hawks went just 12-for-26 (46.2 percent), for the worst effort since they shot 45.5 (5-for-11) percent against Harvard last season (11/20/12).

THE DUNK CONNECTION: Halil Kanacevic, the team's leader in assists, has a knack for finding Ronald Roberts around the rim. Kanacevic assisted on three of Roberts' five dunks in the Washington State game and has a total of eight assists on dunks this season, mostly to Roberts.

GAME OF TWO HALVES: After dominating the first half vs. Siena, the Hawks cooled off and saw their 20-point lead shrink. SJU shot 60 percent from the field and 55.6 percent from three-point range in the first half - in the second, the Hawks managed just 38.9 percent from the field but hit 50 percent (3-of-6) from behind the arc.

FIRST HONOR: DeAndre' Bembry was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week for Nov. 17. He averaged 14.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists as the Hawks went 1-1 on the week, while connecting on 54.5 percent from the field and 55.6 percent from three-point range. Bembry gained notice with his play in the Hawks' 82-79 loss to Creighton when he scored a team-high 20 points, including 14 in the second half. He shot 8-for-14 from the field and connected on 4-of-8 three-point field goals while adding four assists.

HAIL HALIL: Halil Kanacevic fills the boxscore unlike any other player. He had a double-double against Creighton with 10 rebounds and 10 assists, which was the first of his career with those categories. That came after a 12-point, 11-rebound, 8-assist effort in the win over Marist. Phil Martelli said of the senior, "He may not be our best player but he's our most indispensable player. I tried to get some different guys in, but then you realize you just have to put him back in." The 6-8 forward tied for the team lead in assists last season and has reached double figures in assists twice in his career thus far.

RAVING ABOUT RON: Phil Martelli had this to say about Ronald Roberts after the LSU game: "Ron has worked at his game. He's been the Most Improved Player as voted by the coaching staff for three years in a row.... And he'd be a candidate even for this year. But what Ron will probably tell you after tonight is that he had three turnovers. I'm happy for him, he's the product of a really great family. He and (asst. coach) Dave Duda have worked on his game every day to try to get better."

CAUSE FOR CONCERN: The Hawks' free-throw shooting in the Old Spice Classic is a concern. SJU went 43-for-75 (57.3 percent) with a low of 46.3 percent (12-for-26) against LSU. Entering the tournament, Saint Joseph's had connected on 70.1 percent from the line - the season percentage has now dipped to 63.4 percent.

LONG-RANGE THREAT: Chris Wilson was one point shy of his career-high against Creighton when tallied 18 points by converting 6-of-11 from three-point range. It marked the second time in his career that Wilson connected on six three-pointers in a game - the first was when he achieved a career-high 19 points against Notre Dame in 2012-13.

AT THE LINE: Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., both worked on their free-throw shooting in the off-season and it's showing. Kanacevic is shooting 80 percent after converting 64.5 percent last year. Roberts, who owned a 59.1 career free throw percentage entering this season, is now hitting 63.6 percent.

ABOUT BEMBRY: Phil Martelli likes what he has seen so far from freshman DeAndre' Bembry: "DeAndre' is a player beyond his age. He's got a really nice way about him and really takes in what you give him. After Bembry's 20-point performance against Creighton, Martelli said, "I think he is what we thought he would be. That's not a game for an 18-

year-old, and he doesn't think or play like an 18-year-old. His shooting has been better than I would have anticipated and it's because he believes the ball is going in the basket. It's not great form but he has great confidence that the ball is going in the basket. I liked his drive in the first half (for a dunk). I thought that was his best play of the game."

SEEING DOUBLE: Ronald Roberts led the Hawks last season with 13 double-doubles on the year and he has two so far this year, against Marist and Washington State. Halil Kanacevic might give Roberts some competition in that category as the senior also has two double-doubles - 12 points, 11 rebounds against Marist and 10 points and 10 assists vs. Creighton.

ON THE REBOUND: Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts provide the Hawks with a solid rebounding tandem. Kanacevic is averaging a team-high 7.5 rebounds per game, with 6.0 defensive rebounds, while Roberts averages 7.3 boards and 4.7 defensive rebounds per game.

OFF THE BENCH: Sophomore Isaiah Miles gave the Hawks solid play off the bench vs. Washington State, tying his career-high with eight points.

DOING IT ALL: Halil Kanacevic ranks among the Atlantic 10's leaders in four main categories. He's second in assists (7.5), tied for seventh in rebounding (9.3) and seventh in blocked shots (1.4) and 12th in free throw percentage (.800).

FROM THE START: Freshman DeAndre' Bembry made his collegiate debut in the starting lineup and scored 11 points at Vermont. Originally from Charlotte, N.C., Bembry averaged 21 points as a senior at The Patrick School (N.J.) and earned All-State honors. He was the first freshman in SJU's starting lineup on opening day since 2010-11 when the trio of Langston Galloway, Daryus Quarles and C.J. Aiken each started their first collegiate game.

EVERYBODY INTO THE ACT: The Hawks' comfortable lead against Marist allowed Phil Martelli to get all 14 players into the game. The most notable entrance into the contest was that of redshirt freshman Kyle Molock, who had ACL surgery (right knee) in August 2012. Molock saw five minutes of action in his Saint Joseph's debut.

ENJOYING THE RIDE: On a number of occasions, Phil Martelli has said that he enjoys coaching this group. After the Creighton game, he elaborated, "I have a really great team. Now there are basketball pieces missing. But these guys, you can't wait to get to work with them in every aspect. The way they're perceived on campus and in recruiting is great." Regarding the Creighton game he said, "We led for 78 of 80 minutes and there was a lot of 'I got it', 'I hear you', 'my fault'. They're apologizing in the timeout huddles to each other. Practices have been crisp and there hasn't been down time worrying about other agendas. The timeouts were good, they were productive. They were saying all the right things. Now we have to carry that over to the next practice. But I really, really enjoy this team."

VIVA ITALIA: Saint Joseph's got a jump on the season when it traveled to Italy in August for a 10-day, four-game tour. The Hawks visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Lake Como and posted a 4-0 record on the trip. It marked the second time that Phil Martelli took SJU to Italy, with the last trip coming in 1999.

DEAN OF COACHES: This is Phil Martelli's 19th season at the helm of the Hawks, and he is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 342-239 record. He is the longest tenured coach in the Atlantic 10 (19 years) and is now second on the conference's list for all-time career victories (340), behind John Chaney of Temple (516). Martelli is currently serving as the president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

SIGN THEM UP: Saint Joseph's had four high school standouts - James Demery, Markell Lodge, Shavar Newkirk, and Obi Romeo - sign National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. Demery is a 6-6 wing player from Northside Christian Academy in Charlotte, N.C. He averaged 16.8 points and 4.2 steals last season as his team won its second straight Independent School 2A state title. Lodge, originally from Virginia, is a 6-7 wing at Pace Academy in Carrboro, N.C., who is known for his tremendous athleticism and leaping ability. Newkirk is a 6-0 point guard from Cardinal Hayes High School in Bronx, N.Y. Considered one of the top point guards in New York City, he helped Cardinal Hayes to the CHSAA Semifinals in 2012. Romeo, a 6-foot-10 forward with a 94-inch

wingspan, is originally from Nigeria and has been in the United States for the past three years, attending Greenbrier East High School in West Virginia. He averaged 10 points and 13 rebounds last season for the team that went 20-5.

IN MEMORY: Halil Kanacevic changed his uniform number this year to 45 (from 21) in memory of his uncle, Rizo Popovic, who passed away during the 2012-13 season at the age of 45. Kanacevic explained, "It's one of the most selfish things you think of, as a player, when you're growing up. You get a certain number, you get infatuated with it...I've seen kids get into fights over a jersey number. My thing was, let me be unselfish about that and actually give meaning to it. I know what that number means, I know what it represents, I chose it for personal reasons, not a selfish reason. I felt like I needed to do it."

MEMBERS ONLY: The Hawks could have a trio of 1,000-point scorers on the team in Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr. and Halil Kanacevic. Galloway already reached the plateau as a junior and currently has 1,492 points to rank 18th on the all-time scoring list. Roberts achieved it against LSU and now has 1,048 points while Kanacevic has 834 points counting his one season at Hofstra. The last time SJU had three 1,000-point scorers on the same squad was in 2007-08, with Pat Calathes, Rob Ferguson and Ahmad Nivins.

CALLING ON CHRIS: Chris Wilson opened last season as the starting point guard and has done that again this year. Last season, the junior topped SJU in assists with 112, while tying for the lead with his 3.5 average. Wilson started 23 contests and scored double figures nine times.

TEN YEARS AFTER: It's hard to believe but this season marks the 10th anniversary of Saint Joseph's memorable 2003-04 season, in which the Hawks went 27-0 during the regular season, and 30-2 overall, earned a number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament and reached the Elite Eight, while coming within two points of a Final Four berth. Jameer Nelson and Phil Martelli were the consensus National Player of the Year and National Coach of the Year, respectively, while creating a season on Hawk Hill for the record books.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the fifth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 34-21 record in the five seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 353-103 overall record in 63 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse.

COMEBACK KID: Redshirt freshman **Kyle Molock** made his debut against Marist after recovering from surgery to repair the ACL of his right knee suffered in August 2012. It was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career. He was averaging 19.0 points through eight games as a senior at Dublin Coffman when he tore the ACL of his right knee in January 2012; in July of 2010, he suffered a severe injury to all of the major ligaments in his left knee, causing him to miss his junior year.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: Newcomers this season are freshmen **DeAndre' Bemby**, **Jai Williams** and **Brendan Casper**. Bemby is an All-State selection from The Patrick School; Williams earned All-Public League honors in Philadelphia; and Casper was the Pottstown Area Player of the Year at Methacton High School. He joins the Hawks as a walk-on.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: Saint Joseph's non-conference schedule is ranked as the second toughest in the A-10, behind VCU's. Other non-conference foes of note on the Hawks' schedule are Creighton, Villanova, Temple and Vermont.

CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: **Langston Galloway**, **Halil Kanacevic** and **Ronald Roberts, Jr.**, were voted as tri-captains by their teammates. Galloway served as the Hawks' lone captain last year.

THE POINT FORWARD: **Halil Kanacevic's** unique passing ability for a forward allows the Hawk offense to often run through him. He has been SJU's leader in assists for the past two seasons, tying with **Chris Wilson** last year with a 3.5 average. In 2012-13, he ranked second on the team with 7.2 rebounds while scoring 8.5 points per game. Kanacevic leads the Hawks already this year with 5.5 assists per game.

WATCHING THE HAWKS: Saint Joseph's will have 21 games televised this season, including 13 national television appearances, which is the most ever for the Hawks. SJU's first appearance was against LSU in the Old Spice Classic on Thanksgiving on ESPN2, starting a stretch of five national telecasts in a row, including tonight's game vs. Temple on ESPNNews. SJU hosts rival Villanova in a Big 5 game on CBS Sports Network on Saturday. (full schedule on page 2)

VETERAN GROUP: The Hawks have a core group with four players who held starting roles last season - **Langston Galloway**, **Ronald Roberts, Jr.**, **Chris Wilson** and **Halil Kanacevic** - along with another senior - **Daryus Quarles** - who has started 67 games in his career. Galloway and Roberts were the only two players to start all 32 games for the team in 2013. Wilson made 23 starts and led the team in assists with 112 and 3.5 per game while averaging 6.5 points. Kanacevic, who played in 26 games with 14 starts, averaged 8.5 points and 7.2 rebounds and also handed out 3.5 assists. Quarles was a starter his first two seasons in saw action in 29 games last year, mostly in a reserve role.

A LOOK BACK: Last year's squad went 18-14 and earned its second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth under **Phil Martelli**.

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was voted to finish fifth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks finished in a tie for eighth place last year with an 8-8 record.

WAITING IN THE WINGS: Freshman forward **Jai Williams**, from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, earned All-Public League Fourth Team honors is expected to redshirt the season to further his development. **Aaron Brown**, a 6-5 guard, transferred to SJU from West Virginia this summer and will sit out the year due to NCAA transfer rules. He was the Delaware County Player of the Year in 2010 for nearby Penn Wood High School and will have two years with the Hawks beginning in 2014-15.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. Assistant coach **Mark Bass** was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and then was a senior on the squad that reached the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks host traditional rival Villanova on Dec. 7. After a break for final exams, SJU will play its third consecutive Philadelphia team when it hosts Drexel on Dec. 18.

THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 57 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Ian Klinger, the 35th student to wear the wings, is the Hawk mascot for the second consecutive season. He is a junior finance and accounting major from Millersburg, Pa.

Games can also be heard via audio streaming free of charge on www.SJUHawks.com. CBS Sports Radio 610 will also be the home of Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" radio show, which will air once a week beginning in January.

LSU 82 - SJU 65

LSU defeated Saint Joseph's, 82-65, in the first round of the 2013 Old Spice Classic, held at ESPN's Wide World of Sports. **Ronald Roberts** led SJU with 21 points and in the first half, became the 51st Hawk to surpass 1,000 points in his career when he scored on a tip-in at 6:23. Ronald Roberts had 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead Saint Joseph's to a 72-67 win over Washington State in the fifth-place game of the 2013 Old Spice Classic at ESPN's Wide World of Sports. **DeAndre Bembry** and **Langston Galloway** each added 13 points. Roberts dominated inside, shooting 8-for-12 from the field, with five dunks on the day, en route to his second double-double of the year. Bembry sparked the Hawks in the second half with 11 points, including a pair of three-point plays. Trailing 56-55 with eight minutes to play, Saint Joseph's outscored the Cougars, 15-4, to take a 70-65 lead with just over a minute to play. WSU pulled to within 70-67 and after SJU missed two shots on its next possession, the Hawks forced a Washington State turnover. Galloway and Roberts each converted a free throw in the final 30 seconds and Bembry blocked a shot with six seconds left to preserve the win.

THE RIVALRY

The Saint Joseph's- Temple rivalry is the most played in Philadelphia Big 5 history

Here's a look at some of the most memorable games:

• **Feb. 22, 1956: SJU 77 - TU 68**

Under Hall of Fame coach Dr. Jack Ramsay, the Hawks win their first Philadelphia Big 5 title, defeating Final Four-bound Temple at the Palestra, 77-68.

• **March 3, 1979: TU 61 - SJU 60**

No. 13 Temple nips the Hawks, 61-60, for the East Coast Conference championship and the automatic NCAA Tournament bid.

• **Feb. 9, 1980: SJU 53 - TU 52**

In a celebration of the Big 5's 25th anniversary, the teams meet at Philadelphia Convention Hall. The Hawks win a nail-biter in the closing seconds, 53-52.

• **Feb. 4, 1991: SJU 66 - TU 60**

New SJU coach John Griffin starts an all-freshman backcourt (Rap Curry and Bernard Blunt) against Mark Macon and the Elite Eight-bound Owls, winning 66-60 at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse.

• **Feb. 29, 2000: SJU 62 - TU 59:** After 10 straight losses to John Chaney, SJU coach Phil Martelli notches his first victory over Temple as the Hawks upset the No. 5 ranked Owls, 62-59, at the Palestra.

• **March 3, 2002: TU 87 - SJU 84 (2 OT):** A sold-out Palestra witnesses a double-overtime thriller, with the Owls' Lynn Greer hitting the game-winner in an 87-84 Temple victory.

• **Jan. 26, 2008: SJU 68 - TU 67:**

Pat Calathes' three-pointer with 3.9 seconds left lifts the Hawks over the Owls at the Liacouras Center. Temple would return the favor in March by defeating SJU in the Atlantic 10 championship game, 57-56, launching their current 10-game winning streak in the series.

• **Feb. 25, 2012: SJU 82 - #22 TU 72**

Langston Galloway scored 22 points to lead four Hawks in double figures as the Hawks upset #22 Temple, 82-72, at Hagan Arena. It marked the first time since 2001 that Temple played on SJU's campus. The win also gave the Hawks a share of the Big 5 title with Temple.

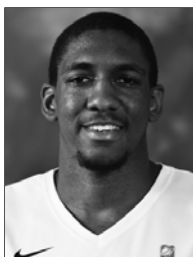
• **Feb. 2, 2013: SJU 70 - TU 69**

Saint Joseph's rallied from nine points down to edge Temple, 70-69, at Hagan Arena. Khalif Wyatt (34 points) hit his seventh three-pointer of the game to pull the Owls within 70-69 with 10.4 seconds left. After Carl Jones missed the front end of a one-and-one at :08, Wyatt drove the lane and the ball went out of bounds off the Hawks. Temple had one more chance with 0.7 seconds left and Wyatt's shot was off the mark.
