- Saint Joseph's dropped its season opener vs. FDU on Friday, 58-57, on a three-pointer with 3.3 seconds to play. The Hawks are looking to avoid their first 0-2 start since 2010-11.
- Saint Joseph's is in the midst of a stretch of six games in 13 days, including a cross-country trip to #13 Gonzaga on November 19 for the NIT Season Tip-Off.
- The Hawks return two starters - **DeAndre' Bembry** and **Chris Wilson** - from last year's Atlantic 10 Champion team. Bembry, a Preseason A-10 All-Conference First Team selection, is the team's leading returning scorer after averaging 12.1 points last season.
- **Phil Martelli** is in his 20th season as the head coach of the Hawks. He is the school's all-time leader in victories with 362.

PHIL MARTELLI

Head Coach

The 2014-15 season marks the 20th for Phil Martelli as head coach at Saint Joseph's. During his time with the Hawks he has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and becoming one of the more respected coaches in the game. The 2014-15 season will be his 30th year overall at SJU, which includes 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 362-248. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in the past 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 178-126 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 362-247. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in the past 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 178-126 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Saint Joseph's boasted a young and exciting squad, and one of the most balanced in school history, as five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 14 years, and 12 times in his 19 seasons at SJU.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid in the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-

12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

LAST TIME OUT: The Hawks suffered just their second loss in 10 season openers as FDU hit a three-pointer with 3.3 seconds to play to gain the 58-57 win. The Hawks had taken a 57-53 lead with 1:13 remaining after back-to-back three-pointers from **DeAndre' Bemby** and **Chris Wilson**. FDU answered with a layup with 50 seconds to play and then rebounded a Hawks' miss on the next possession. FDU inbounded with :09 to play after a Saint Joseph's foul and **Mustaafa Jones**, a Philadelphia native, hit the gamewinner from the right side. **Isaiah Miles** made the first start of his career and had his first career double-double with 12 points and a personal best 14 rebounds. Wilson added 12 points as the only other Hawk in double figures. **Aaron Brown** scored nine points in his SJU debut while **Javon Baumann** grabbed a career-high eight rebounds. FDU held a 28-25 lead at halftime and by as much as 34-28 two minutes into the second half. A dunk by Bemby started a 9-3 run for the Hawks, with four points from Brown, as SJU opened its biggest lead of the second half, 44-39, with 6:47 remaining. FDU pulled within 46-45, but Miles countered with a three-point play to up the Hawks' lead to 49-45. Despite another layup by Brown, FDU would tie the score, 51-51, with 2:32 to play. The Hawks committed 16 turnovers in the game.

FAMILIAR FOE: Drexel and Saint Joseph's have a great familiarity with each other. Drexel head coach Bruiser Flint is a 1987 graduate of Saint Joseph's and was a teammate of Hawks' assistant coach **Geoff Arnold**. The duo helped SJU to the 1986 Atlantic 10 title.

RACKING UP THE MILES: The play of junior **Isaiah Miles** was one of the bright spots in the loss to FDU. The junior made the first start of his career and posted his first-ever double-double with 12 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. Miles also took a career-high 14 field goal attempts in 33 minutes of action.

ON BOARD: The Hawks outrebounded FDU by a 44-28 margin. **Isaiah Miles** led the way with a career-high 14 boards while **Javon Baumann** grabbed a personal best eight rebounds.

BACK IN THE FOLD: The Hawks return two starters from last year's A-10 Champion team - **DeAndre' Bemby** and **Chris Wilson**. Bemby was the A-10's Co-Rookie of the Year and the Big 5 Rookie of the Year after averaging 12.1 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. Wilson was the Hawks' starting point guard and averaged a career-best 9.1 points per game.

JAM-PACKED WEEK: The Hawks are wasting no time getting the season going as they will be playing six games in 13 days. After tonight's game, the Hawks will board a charter flight on Tuesday morning for the 2,100-mile trip to Spokane, Washington. SJU will take on Jesuit rival, 13th-ranked Gonzaga in the NIT Season Tip-Off on Wednesday and then return home to host Vermont on Saturday (Nov. 22) The Hawks play another NIT game hosting LIU Brooklyn on Nov. 25 before going to Madison Square Garden for a Thanksgiving date with Western Kentucky.

THAT CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON: Saint Joseph's enters the year as the defending Atlantic 10 champion, having won the program's third title in 2014, which was its first since 1997. The Hawks went 24-10 and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, where they lost in overtime to eventual national champion Connecticut.

PLATINUM PHIL: This is **Phil Martelli's** 20th season as Saint Joseph's head coach, and his 30th overall at the University after 10 years as an assistant. He is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 362-248 record and is the longest tenured current coach in the Atlantic 10. Martelli owns a 178-126 record in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

TOURNAMENT TIME: SJU is participating in the redesigned NIT Season Tip-Off. The Hawks will travel to Gonzaga on November 19, and then host LIU Brooklyn on November 25. SJU will conclude play in the tournament on Thanksgiving night when it faces Western Kentucky at Madison Square Garden. It marks the second year in a row that the Hawks will have a game on Thanksgiving - last season, the team took on LSU in the Old Spice Classic in Orlando.

HONORING A LEGEND: Saint Joseph's is wearing a "JR" patch on its uniforms this season to honor Hall of Fame coach Dr. Jack Ramsay, who passed away in April. "Dr. Jack" compiled a 234-72 record and guided the Hawks to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and nine consecutive postseason bids from 1955-66. He went on to amass 864 wins in the NBA and helped the Philadelphia 76ers to the 1967 championship as general manager and coached the Portland Trailblazers to the 1977 NBA title. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992.

FROM THE START: **James Demery** becomes the second freshman in two years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bemby** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks last season and went on to earn Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year honors. Demery, a 6-6 wing, averaged 18.0 points last season at Northside Christian Academy in North Carolina.

WINNING WITH WILSON: **Chris Wilson** will be the Hawks' starting point guard for the second year in a row. Last season, the 6-3 guard averaged a career-best 9.1 points per game and handed out 2.7 assists while scoring double figures in 14 games.

FEAR THE 'FRO: **DeAndre' Bemby** made a tremendous impact in his freshman year and the expectations are high for a successful sophomore season. Bemby was voted onto the Preseason Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team and is the only sophomore to earn that distinction. The 6-6 wing player averaged 12.1 points last season and shot 45.8 percent from the field en route to being named the Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year.

RARING TO GO: Junior **Aaron Brown** will make his debut after sitting out last season due to the transfer rule. The 6-5 guard transferred to SJU from West Virginia, where he played two years for the Mountaineers. Brown, from Darby, Pa., starred locally at Penn Wood High School, where he was an All-State selection and the Player of the Year by the *Delaware County Daily Times*. He averaged 20 points per game as a senior and helped his team to the state title.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Junior **Isaiah Miles** and redshirt sophomore **Javon Baumann** will be in the starting lineup for the first time in their careers. Miles has played 40 career games, and hit for a career-high 17 points last season against Loyola. Baumann, who redshirted the 2012-13 season, appeared in 15 games last year and was a co-recipient of the team's Most Improved Player Award.

WILLIAMS' WAIT: Also making his Hawk debut will be redshirt freshman **Jai Williams**, who sat out last year to develop his game. Williams, a 6-9 forward from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, has lost close to 45 pounds since arriving at SJU in the fall of 2013, and is now down to 257.

SIDELINED SENIOR: **Papa Ndao** will sit out this season due to undisclosed medical reasons. Ndao, originally from Dakar, Senegal, is one of three seniors on SJU's squad this year. He played in 31 games in 2013-14 for the A-10 champion Hawks, while making two starts and scored a

career-high 13 points in SJU's win over George Mason last year. He has played in a total of 85 career games for the Hawks, starting eight contests. Ndao, who has played three years, is on track to graduate from Saint Joseph's in May with his degree in interdisciplinary health studies.

HOLES TO FILL: Graduation hit the Hawks hard as Saint Joseph's lost three senior starters from last year's 24-10 team. The trio of Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Halil Kanacevic combined for 1,429 points, 681 rebounds, and 243 assists in last season alone. Those three were also 1,000-point scorers in their college careers and were Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers.

CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: Senior **Chris Wilson** and sophomore **DeAndre' Bemby** were voted co-captains by their teammates. Bemby becomes the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in **Phil Martelli's** 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: Newcomers on the squad this year are **James Demery**, **Shavar Newkirk** and **Obi Romeo**. Demery is a 6-6 wing from Northside Christian Academy (N.C.); Lodge is a 6-7 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.); Newkirk is a 5-11 point guard from Cardinal Hayes (N.Y.); and Romeo is a 6-10 forward from Greenbrier East (W. Va.). **Markell Lodge**, a 6-7 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.), will be sitting out this season to concentrate on academics. Also new to the program are walk-ons **Mike Booth** and **Kyle Thompson**. Booth, the grandson of former SJU head and assistant coach Harry Booth, averaged 18.0 points at Bishop Shanahan High School. Thompson was an All-Catholic League selection at St. Joseph's Prep.

CAROLINA ON MY MIND: The Hawks' roster features three players in the starting lineup from the state of North Carolina - **Chris Wilson** (Fayetteville), **DeAndre' Bemby** (Charlotte) and **James Demery** (Williamston). **Markell Lodge** (Washington) is the fourth player but he is sitting out this season to concentrate on academics.

WAITING IN THE WINGS: Newcomer **Skylar Scrivano** is sitting out this season due to the transfer rule. A 6-10 forward from Doylestown, Pa., Scrivano transferred to Saint Joseph's from Rider University. He started his career at Columbia University, where he played the 2012-13 season.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the sixth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 44-24 record in the five seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 363-106 overall record in 63 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 11-4 on its home court during the 2013-14 season.

NEW LOOK: Hagan Arena has a new look this season with the addition of a new LED centerhung video display system, which was supported by alumnus Mike Hagan '85. The display system is comprised of four individual video displays, each measuring approximately 7 feet high by 12.5 feet wide, and featuring 6 millimeter line spacing. These displays will light up the arena with their ability to highlight live video and instant replays. They can show one large image or can be divided into separate windows to show a variety of vivid graphics, colorful animations, up-to-the-minute statistics, scoring information and sponsor advertisements.

HAWKS IN THE PROS: Three key members of last year's championship team - Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr. - are playing professionally. Galloway and Roberts will be in the NBA D League for the New York and Philadelphia teams, respectively. Kanacevic is currently playing in Slovenia.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish eighth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks went 11-5 in the conference last season to finish in a tie for third place, but captured the Atlantic 10 Championship, the third in school history.

HELPING OUT: **Kyle Molock** had career-ending knee surgery in February, 2014, and will serve as a student assistant this year. Molock came to SJU in August 2012, but injured the ACL of his right knee in preseason workouts. That was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career at Dublin Coffman High School in Ohio. Molock is a junior accounting major at Saint Joseph's.

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: **Phil Martelli's** staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 16th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks will board a charter on Tuesday morning to fly to 13th-ranked Gonzaga for an NIT Season Tip-Off game on Wednesday. SJU returns home to host Vermont on Nov. 22 and then also hosts LIU Brooklyn in the NIT on Nov. 25.

THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 58 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.



In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Brian Lafferty becomes the 36th student to wear the wings in 2014-15. He is a senior criminal justice major from Springfield, Pa.

Sports Radio 610 will also be the home of **Phil Martelli's** "HawkTalk" radio show, which will air on Monday evenings beginning on January 5.

VIDEO STREAMING: This season, live video broadcasts of many SJU games will be broadcast through the Atlantic 10 Digital Network. (See schedule on pg. 2)
