### GAME STORIES

- **Isaiah Miles** scored a career-high 20 points and **DeAndre' Bemby** blocked a potential game-tying shot as SJU held on to defeat Temple, 58-56, in Big 5 action on Wednesday night.
- This is the second consecutive Big 5 game for the Hawks. Saint Joseph's will play back-to-back Big 5 games again in January against Penn and La Salle.
- SJU has lost the last two in a row to Villanova and four straight at The Pavilion. The Hawks' last win at Villanova was on Feb. 2, 2004.
- In the past four games, **DeAndre' Bemby** is averaging 18.2 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.2 steals.
- The Hawks finished their stretch of six games in 13 days on Thanksgiving. After Tuesday's game against Loyola Maryland, the Hawks will get a 10-day break for final exams, returning to action on December 20 at Marist.
- **Phil Martelli** is in his 20th season as the head coach of the Hawks. He is the school's all-time leader in victories with 366.

## PHIL MARTELLI

### Head Coach

The 2014-15 season marks the 20th for **Phil Martelli** as head coach at Saint Joseph's. During his time with the Hawks he has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and becoming one of the more respected coaches in the game. The 2014-15 season will be his 30th year overall at SJU, which includes 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 366-250. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in the past 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 178-126 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games afterlos-

ing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. SJU boasted a young and exciting squad and five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 14 years, and 12 times in his 19 seasons at SJU.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid in the NIT. In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career.

SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Isaiah Miles scored a career-high 20 points and grabbed nine rebounds as Saint Joseph's held off Temple, 58-56, in Big 5 action at Hagan Arena. The game came down to the final play, with Temple inbound the ball with 11.7 seconds to go. The Owls' Will Cummings drove to the basket but SJU's **DeAndre' Bembry** made a game-saving block. Quenton DeCosey grabbed the rebound but his last-second attempt was off the mark. Miles shot 7-for-14 from the field and added four assists for Saint Joseph's, while Bembry finished with 11 points, going 5-for-6 from the line, and grabbing seven rebounds. The Hawks held a 51-42 lead with 8:44 remaining, but went cold from the floor. SJU would go without a field goal the rest of the way, but converted 7-for-8 from the foul line to preserve the win. During that stretch, Temple came within 57-56 with 30 seconds to play on a layup by Josh Brown. The Hawks turned the ball over on their next possession, but an offensive foul by Temple gave the ball back to SJU. Miles made 1-of-2 free throws with 11.7 seconds to go to provide the winning margin.

**KEY TO THE CITY:** The Hawks are 1-0 in Big 5 play after Wednesday's win over Temple. After today's game, SJU will play Penn at The Palestra on Jan. 24, and face La Salle on Jan. 27. Saint Joseph's has won 20 Big 5 titles (9 outright/11 shared), which is third all-time to Temple's 27 titles (6/21 shared). Last year, the Hawks went 1-3 in the Big 5, with the lone victory coming against Penn.

**FLYING START:** The Hawks trailed in the first two minutes against Temple, but would lead the rest of the way. SJU held a 34-22 advantage at intermission, which was its largest halftime lead of the season.

**BEMBRY'S BACK:** After two uncharacteristic games (FDU, Gonzaga), **DeAndre' Bembry** has looked more like himself as of late. He led the way in the win over Vermont, tying his career-highs in points with 22 and in rebounds with nine. He shot a season-best 6-for-14 from the field and 8-for-10 from the foul line, which included an 8-for-8 effort in the second half. The co-captain followed that with 17 points and a career-high 11 rebounds for the first double-double of his career in the overtime win over LIU Brooklyn. He then established a new career-high against Western Kentucky, scoring 23 points on 10-for-20 shooting. Bembry is now averaging team-highs of 14.1 points and 6.9 rebounds. He ranks 15th in the Atlantic 10 in scoring and is 11th in rebounding.

**RACKING UP THE MILES:** Junior **Isaiah Miles** had a career game against Temple, hitting for a personal best 20 points on 10-for-20 shooting. He also grabbed nine rebounds and handed out a career-high four assists. In the opener against FDU, Miles made the first start of his career and posted his first-ever double-double with 12 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. He scored 15 points in the win over Vermont, shooting 6-for-11 from the field and is now averaging 10.1 points, with three games in double figures.

**MAKING THEM COUNT:** The Hawks have struggled from the foul line this season, hitting just 62.6 percent, but they made the necessary shots in the win over Temple. SJU shot a season-best 76.2 percent (16-for-21), as **DeAndre' Bembry** went 5-for-6 and **Isaiah Miles** shot 5-for-7. Although the Hawks did not score a field goal in the final 8:44 of the game, they converted 7-of-8 from the foul line to preserve the 58-56 victory. Bembry was 4-for-4 during that stretch.

**HANDS OFF:** One thing the Hawks have done well over the past few years is to limit their number of personal fouls. They are doing the same this season, committing just 15.0 per game to rank 19th in the nation.

**FIGHTING BACK:** The Hawks rallied from an eight-point deficit in the second half against Western Kentucky to force three ties in the final six minutes, helped by a season-best 51.9 shooting percentage from the field in that half. The Hawks took a 54-53 lead with 2:31 to play, but saw WKU regain the lead. **DeAndre' Bembry** had the potential game-tying three-pointer attempt as time expired, but it was off the mark.

**NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** After having already made a cross-country trip to Spokane this season, the Hawks are now in a three-game stretch of Philadelphia-area contests. SJU hosted Temple on Wednesday, is making the 6.5 mile ride to Villanova today and will then host Loyola Maryland on Tuesday.

**PERFECT TIMING:** Freshman **James Demery** picked a great time to make his first collegiate three-pointer. Demery connected on the timely three with :03 seconds to play against LIU Brooklyn, forcing a 67-67 tie. It was only Demery's second attempt of the season. The freshman had a solid game, with 11 points on 4-for-7 shooting, to go along with five rebounds. He also hit a pair of free throws prior to that three-pointer, which gave the Hawks a 64-63 lead with 1:06 remaining.

**WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU:** Junior **Aaron Brown** has notched double figures off the bench in four of the last six games. He achieved new season-highs with 15 points and seven rebounds in the win over LIU Brooklyn. Brown shot a team-best 7-for-9 from the foul line, making two free throws at the end of the overtime to seal the win. He gave the team a big boost at Drexel, scoring 11 points for his first double-figure game in a Hawk uniform. He hit a driving layup with 1:30 to play to break a 47-47 tie and put SJU up for good. He followed that with a season-best 14-point effort at Gonzaga as the only Hawk in double figures in the lopsided loss. He also had a 13-point, five-rebound effort in the win over Vermont. Brown's four-game streak came to an end versus Western Kentucky, but his playing time was limited to 15 minutes after he picked up his fourth foul at the 12-minute mark of the second half. The junior, in his first year playing at Saint Joseph's after transferring from West Virginia, is the team's second leading scorer with 10.6 points per game.

**BOOK ON BAUMANN:** **Javon Baumann** has already seen more playing time this season than he did in all of 2013-14. The sophomore scored a career-high 11 points in the Western Kentucky game, converting 5-of-6 from the field. Baumann has started all seven games, and is averaging 23.0 minutes per contest.

**IRON MAN:** **DeAndre' Bembry** leads the Atlantic 10 and is ranked fourth in the nation in minutes played per game, with an average of 38.6. He's played 270 minutes out of a possible 285 this season.

**DOWN TO THE WIRE:** All but two games this year have been decided in the final minutes, while the winning margin in six of the seven games (except for Gonzaga) is a combined total of 21 points, an average of 3.5 points per game. Here's the recap:

- FDU (L): FDU three-pointer with :04 left
- Drexel (W): Aaron Brown scores with 1:30 left to break a tie; Shavar Newkirk and Isaiah Miles hit late free throws
- Vermont (W): Held a five-point lead with 3 minutes to play and increased it with 4-of-4 free throws from **DeAndre' Bembry**
- LIU (W ot): James Demery hits a 3-pointer at :03 to send the game into overtime; Hawks score the first four points of the OT to earn the win
- Western Kentucky (L): SJU fought back from an 8-point deficit and took a brief lead with 2 minutes to play; Trailing 62-59, SJU had the ball with :04 to go but **DeAndre' Bembry** missed a 3-point attempt as time expired
- Temple (W): Leading 58-56, **DeAndre' Bembry** blocks Temple's layup attempt in the final seconds; Temple rebounds and misses the last shot

**TOOTH AND NAIL:** Redshirt freshman **Jai Williams** is probable for today's game after sitting out the past five. Williams suffered a bad break in his first two minutes of collegiate action vs. Drexel as he caught an elbow on a dunk and it knocked out two teeth. Williams, who had oral surgery the following day, has not played since. He began contact practice this week and could make his return.

**OFF TARGET:** Saint Joseph's is shooting 37.7 percent from the floor on the season, and the best shooting effort of the year was 44.4 percent in the loss to Western Kentucky. The Hawks have struggled from three-point range and are connecting on only 22.9 percent on the year, but they hit a season-best 40 percent (6-for-15) from behind the arc against Vermont.

**PERFECT TIMING:** Freshman **James Demery** picked a great time to make his first collegiate three-pointer. Demery connected on the timely three with :03 seconds to play against LIU Brooklyn, forcing a 67-67 tie. It was only Demery's second attempt of the season. The freshman had a solid game, with 11 points on 4-for-7 shooting, to go along with five rebounds. He also hit a pair of free throws prior to that three-pointer, which gave the Hawks a 64-63 lead with 1:06 remaining.

**DEANDRE'S DEFENSE:** **DeAndre' Bemby** and **James Demery** are considered the Hawks' best perimeter defenders. Bemby had the assignment of guarding Western Kentucky's Tony Price, who entered the game averaging 14.8 points. Bemby held Price to just one field goal and a total of six points.

**DEJA VU'?:** The Hawks are playing the same opponents this week - Temple and Villanova - as they did at this time last year. Last season, the Hawks lost at Temple, 77-69, and were routed by Villanova, 98-68, on their home court. After those losses, the Hawks owned a 4-4 record, but would go on to win 20 of the final 26 games, capture the A-10 Championship and earn an NCAA bid. **Phil Martelli** credited the players for that turnaround, saying, "These guys looked at each other and decided that if they kept coming every day and kept themselves tight, then good things would happen. It was all of them. Not one guy wavered. I would say the strength of this group is the group and that's what they leaned on."

**HAWKS VS. THE TOP 25:** Saint Joseph's is 5-8 versus ranked teams in the past four years (counting this season). Last year the Hawks defeated #21 UMass in February and beat #23 VCU in the Atlantic 10 Championship game. SJU's last win over a Top 10 team was a 71-66 win over #8 Xavier on March 6, 2008. That game served as the finale for Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was renovated and renamed as Hagan Arena.

**50-50:** After the Gonzaga game, **Phil Martelli** called the Hawks' lack of scoring a "grave concern". SJU scored more than 60 points for the first time all year in the 68-60 win over Vermont and followed that with 74 points in the LIU Brooklyn win. The Hawks were limited to under 60 points again vs. Western Kentucky and Temple and are now averaging 58.6 points per game.

**DUE FOR SOME DOWN TIME:** The Hawks started the year with a stretch of six games in 13 days, and had their longest break thus far last weekend. After today, SJU hosts Loyola on Tuesday, before taking a 10-day break for final exams.

**JAMES' GAME:** Highly-touted freshman **James Demery** recorded the first double-figure game of his career as he posted 12 points on 4-for-9 shooting at Drexel.

**ON BOARD:** The Hawks outrebounded FDU by a 44-28 margin. **Isaiah Miles** led the way with a career-high 14 boards while **Javon Baumann** grabbed a personal-best eight rebounds.

**PROGRAMMING CHANGE:** The December 20th game at Marist will be heard on WPHT 1210 AM radio instead of 610 AM.

**NERVES OF STEEL:** Freshman **Shavar Newkirk** gave SJU a boost off the bench at Drexel. He went 5-for-6 from the foul line and hit a pair with :11 to play as SJU was clinging to a 51-49 lead. He had seven points, three rebounds and two assists in 25 minutes of action.

**BAND OF THIEVES:** Saint Joseph's had 13 steals against Vermont, which was the highest number of steals since it posted 15 steals in a loss at Minnesota on Dec. 12, 2009. **Javon Baumann** led the way against Vermont with a career-high four steals. **Isaiah Miles**, **DeAndre' Bemby** and **Shavar Newkirk** recorded three apiece as SJU forced Vermont into committing 18 turnovers.

**NEW LOW:** The Hawks ran into a highly-efficient Gonzaga team in the first game of the NIT Season Tip-Off. Gonzaga reeled off the first eight points of the game and never looked back, while shooting 61.3 percent in the half. The Hawks managed just 10 points in the first half, trailing 48-10 at halftime. SJU scored 32 in the second half but still suffered the largest losing margin in school history with the 94-42 loss. Junior **Aaron Brown** was the only Hawk in double figures with 14 points, while sophomore **DeAndre' Bemby** didn't register his first point until 16:15 remaining in the second half. It was the fewest points scored by the Hawks since a 56-39 loss at Villanova on Feb. 6, 2007.

**BACK IN THE FOLD:** The Hawks return two starters from last year's A-10 Champion team - **DeAndre' Bemby** and **Chris Wilson**. Bemby was the A-10's Co-Rookie of the Year and the Big 5 Rookie of the Year after averaging 12.1 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. Wilson was the Hawks' starting point guard and averaged a career-best 9.1 points per game.

**THAT CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON:** Saint Joseph's is the defending Atlantic 10 champion, having won the program's third title in 2014, which was its first since 1997. The Hawks went 24-10 and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, where they lost in overtime to eventual national champion Connecticut.

**PLATINUM PHIL:** This is **Phil Martelli's** 20th season as Saint Joseph's head coach, and his 30th overall at the University after 10 years as an assistant. He is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 366-250 record and is the longest tenured current coach in the Atlantic 10. Martelli owns a 178-126 record in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

**CROSS-COUNTRY HAWKS:** After winning at Drexel on Nov. 17, the Hawks boarded a charter flight at 10 a.m. on Tuesday for the 2,100-mile trip to Spokane. The team made a quick stop in Fargo, North Dakota, to refuel and arrived in Spokane at 2 p.m. Pacific time. The Hawks got on their return flight immediately after the loss to #13 Gonzaga and were back in Philadelphia at 7 a.m. on Thursday, November 20.

**HONORING A LEGEND:** Saint Joseph's is wearing a "JR" patch on its uniforms this season to honor Hall of Fame coach Dr. Jack Ramsay, who passed away in April. "Dr. Jack" compiled a 234-72 record and guided the Hawks to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and nine consecutive postseason bids from 1955-66. He went on to amass 864 wins in the NBA and helped the Philadelphia 76ers to the 1967 championship as general manager and coached the Portland Trailblazers to the 1977 NBA title. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992.

**FROM THE START:** **James Demery** became the second freshman in two years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bemby** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks last season and went on to earn Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year honors. Demery, a 6-6 wing, averaged 18.0 points last season at Northside Christian Academy in North Carolina.

**FEAR THE 'FRO:** **DeAndre' Bemby** made a tremendous impact in his freshman year and the expectations are high for a successful sophomore season. Bemby was voted onto the Preseason Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team and is the only sophomore to earn that distinction. The 6-6 wing player averaged 12.1 points last season and shot 45.8 percent from the field en route to being named the Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year.

**RARING TO GO:** Junior **Aaron Brown** made his Saint Joseph's debut after sitting out last season due to the transfer rule. The 6-5 guard transferred to SJU from West Virginia, where he played two years for the Mountaineers. Brown, from Darby, Pa., starred locally at Penn Wood High School, where he was an All-State selection and the Player of the Year by the *Delaware County Daily Times*. He averaged 20 points per game as a senior and helped his team to the state title.

**ROOKIE STARTERS:** Junior **Isaiah Miles** and redshirt sophomore **Javon Baumann** are in the starting lineup for the first time in their careers. Miles has played 40 career games, and hit for a career-high 17 points last season against Loyola. Baumann, who redshirted the 2012-13 season,

appeared in 15 games last year and was a co-recipient of the team's Most Improved Player Award.

**WILLIAMS' WAIT:** Also making his Hawk debut this season is redshirt freshman **Jai Williams**, who sat out last year to develop his game. Williams, a 6-9 forward from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, has lost close to 45 pounds since arriving at SJU in the fall of 2013, and is now down to 257 pounds.

**SIDELINED SENIOR:** **Papa Ndao** will sit out this season due to undisclosed medical reasons. Ndao, originally from Dakar, Senegal, is one of three seniors on SJU's squad this year. He played in 31 games in 2013-14 for the A-10 champion Hawks, while making two starts and scored a career-high 13 points in SJU's win over George Mason last year. He has played in a total of 85 career games for the Hawks, starting eight contests. Ndao, who has played three years, is on track to graduate from Saint Joseph's in May with his degree in interdisciplinary health studies.

**HOLES TO FILL:** Graduation hit the Hawks hard as Saint Joseph's lost three senior starters from last year's 24-10 team. The trio of Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Halil Kanacevic combined for 1,429 points, 681 rebounds, and 243 assists in last season alone. Those three were also 1,000-point scorers in their college careers and were Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers.

**CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP:** Senior **Chris Wilson** and sophomore **DeAndre' Bemby** were voted co-captains by their teammates. Bemby becomes the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in **Phil Martelli's** 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

**WELCOME TO HAWK HILL:** Newcomers on the squad this year are **James Demery**, **Shavar Newkirk** and **Obi Romeo**. Demery is a 6-6 wing from Northside Christian Academy (N.C.); Newkirk is a 5-11 point guard from Cardinal Hayes (N.Y.); and Romeo is a 6-10 forward from Greenbrier East (W. Va.). **Markell Lodge**, a 6-7 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.), will be sitting out this season to concentrate on academics. Also new to the program are walk-ons **Mike Booth** and **Kyle Thompson**. Booth, the grandson of former SJU head and assistant coach Harry Booth, averaged 18.0 points at Bishop Shanahan High School. Thompson was an All-Catholic League selection at St. Joseph's Prep.

**CAROLINA ON MY MIND:** The Hawks' roster features three players in the starting lineup from the state of North Carolina - **Chris Wilson** (Fayetteville), **DeAndre' Bemby** (Charlotte) and **James Demery** (Williamston). **Markell Lodge** (Washington) is the fourth player but he is sitting out this season to concentrate on academics.

**WAITING IN THE WINGS:** Newcomer **Skylar Scrivano** is sitting out this season due to the transfer rule. A 6-10 forward from Doylestown, Pa., Scrivano transferred to Saint Joseph's from Rider University. He started his career at Columbia University, where he played the 2012-13 season.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** This marks the sixth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 48-24 record in the six seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 367-106 overall record in 63 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 11-4 on its home court during the 2013-14 season.

**NEW LOOK:** Hagan Arena has a new look this season with the addition of a new LED centerhung video display system, which was supported by alumnus Mike Hagan '85. These displays will light up the arena with their ability to highlight live video and instant replays. They can show one large image or can be divided into separate windows to show a variety of vivid graphics, colorful animations, up-to-the-minute statistics, scoring information and sponsor advertisements.

**HAWKS IN THE PROS:** Three key members of last year's championship team - Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr. - are playing professionally. Galloway and Roberts are in the NBA D League playing for the New York and Philadelphia teams, respectively. Kanacevic is currently playing in Slovenia.

**CRADLE OF COACHES:** The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. Below is the list of former Hawks who have held positions as NBA head coaches:

**PRESEASON PICK:** Saint Joseph's was picked to finish eighth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks went 11-5 in the conference last season to finish in a tie for third place, but captured the Atlantic 10 Championship, the third in school history.

**HELPING OUT:** Kyle Molock had career-ending knee surgery in February, 2014, and will serve as a student assistant this year. Molock came to SJU in August 2012, but injured the ACL of his right knee in preseason workouts. That was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career at Dublin Coffman High School in Ohio. Molock is a junior accounting major at Saint Joseph's.

**KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY:** Phil Martelli's staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 16th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** Saint Joseph's will host Loyola Maryland on Tuesday before taking a 10-day break for final exams. The Hawks return to action on December 20 at Marist and then head to Denver on December 29.

## THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 58 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.



In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

**Brian Lafferty** becomes the 36th student to wear the wings in 2014-15. He is a senior criminal justice major from Springfield, Pa.

## ON THE AIR

**TV:** Saint Joseph's will again have a strong presence on television in 2014-15, with a total of 28 games scheduled for coverage either on television or digital networks. The Hawks will appear on national tv 13 times. (Complete schedule on page 2)

**RADIO:** Saint Joseph's University and WTEL 610 AM, formerly CBS Sports Radio 610 AM (WIP), are in the fourth year of the partnership to broadcast the Hawks for all but two games. The Nov. 27 game with Western Kentucky will be heard on audio streaming only, while the Dec. 20 game at Marist will be carried by 1210 AM (WPHT). The Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of **Matt Martucci** and **Joe Lunardi** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary. Martucci, a 2006 Syracuse University graduate, is in his sixth year as full-time play-by-play announcer. Lunardi, in his 25th year on the Hawks' radio broadcasts, is the associate vice president for marketing at Saint Joseph's, and is a college basketball analyst for ESPN.com with his popular "Bracketology" column. Games can also be heard via audio streaming free of charge on [www.SJUHawks.com](http://www.SJUHawks.com). Sports Radio 610 will also be the home of **Phil Martelli's** "HawkTalk" radio show, which will air on Monday evenings beginning on January 5.

**VIDEO STREAMING:** This season, live video broadcasts of many SJU games will be broadcast through the Atlantic 10 Digital Network. (See schedule on pg. 2)

**INTERNET:** Information for Saint Joseph's basketball is found at SJU's athletics website, [www.SJUHawks.com](http://www.SJUHawks.com) with statistics, updated game notes, and live in-game statistics for all Hawk home games, and selected road games. ## GAME RECAPS

The Hawks suffered just their second loss in 10 season openers as FDU hit a three-pointer with 3.3 seconds to play to gain the 58-57 win. FDU answered with a layup with 50 seconds to play and then rebounded a Hawks' miss on the next possession. FDU inbounded with :09 to play after a Saint Joseph's foul and **Mustaafa Jones**, a Philadelphia native, hit the gamewinner from the right side. **Isaiah Miles** made the first start of his career and had his first career double-double with 12 points and a personal best 14 rebounds. Wilson added 12 points as the only other Hawk in double figures. **Aaron Brown** scored nine points in his SJU debut while **Javon Baumann** grabbed a career-high eight rebounds. FDU held a 28-25 lead at halftime and by as much as 34-28 two minutes into the second half. A dunk by Bembry started a 9-3 run for the Hawks, with four points from Brown, as SJU opened its biggest lead of the second half, 44-39, with 6:47 remaining. FDU pulled within 46-45, but Miles countered with a three-point play to up the Hawks' lead to 49-45. Despite another layup by Brown, FDU would tie the score, 51-51, with 2:32 to play. The Hawks committed 16 turnovers in the game.

**SJU 52 - Drexel 49**

**Aaron Brown** hit a driving layup with 1:30 to play to break a 47-47 tie, and **Isaiah Miles** and **Shavar Newkirk** hit late free throws to help Saint Joseph's defeat Drexel, 52-49, at the Daskalakis Center. **DeAndre' Bembry** had 13 points and eight rebounds for the Hawks, while freshman **James Demery** scored 12 for the first double-figure game of his career and Brown scored 11 points off the bench. The Hawks trailed at halftime, 25-24, and by as much as 36-29 with over 12 minutes to play in the second half. But SJU used its fullcourt press to up the tempo and force a few Drexel turnovers and limit the Dragons without a point for four minutes. A jumper by Newkirk started a 12-0 run by the Hawks, which included four points from Demery, to give SJU a 41-36 lead with 8:48 remaining. **Game 3: November 19, 2014 - McCarthy Center - Spokane, Wash.**  
**#13/11 Gonzaga 94 - SJU 42**

The opened play in the 2014 NIT Season Tip-Off with a 94-42 defeat at 13th-ranked Gonzaga at the McCarthy Athletic Center. Junior **Aaron Brown** led the Hawks with a season-high 14 points. Gonzaga scored the first eight points of the game and made its first eight field goal attempts and held the Hawks to 2-of-10 from the floor en route to a 16-2 advantage at the 15:02 mark. After a three-pointer by **Chris Wilson** made it 16-5, the Bulldogs reeled off 12 straight, keeping the Hawks off the scoreboard for a six-and-a-half-minute stretch. Saint Joseph's cut the deficit to 31-10 on a free throw by **Javon Baumann** with 6:23 to go in the half, but Gonzaga scored the final 17 points of the period to take a 48-10 margin into halftime. The Bulldogs extended the run to 29-1 to start the second half, leading 60-11 with 17:46 to go. The 52-point margin of defeat was the largest in school history, and the Hawks' 42 points scored was their lowest total since a 56-39 loss at Villanova on February 6, 2007.

### Game 7: December 3, 2014 - Hagan Arena SJU 58 - Temple 56

Isaiah Miles scored a career-high 20 points and grabbed nine rebounds as Saint Joseph's held off Temple, 58-56, in Big 5 action at Hagan Arena. The game came down to the final play, with Temple inbounding the ball with 11.7 seconds to go. The Owls' Will Cummings drove to the basket but SJU's **DeAndre' Bembry** made a game-saving block. Quenton DeCosey grabbed the rebound but his last-second attempt was off the mark. Miles shot 7-for-14 from the field and added four assists for Saint Joseph's, while Bembry finished with 11 points, going 5-for-6 from the line, and grabbing seven rebounds. The Hawks held a 51-42 lead with 8:44 remaining, but went cold from the floor. SJU would go without a field goal the rest of the way, but converted 7-for-8 from the foul line to preserve the win. During that stretch, Temple came within 57-56 with 30 seconds to play on a layup by Josh Brown. The Hawks turned the ball over on their next possession, but an offensive foul by Temple gave the ball back to SJU. Miles made 1-of-2 free throws with 11.7 seconds to go to provide the winning margin.

## THE RIVALRY

The Saint Joseph's- Villanova rivalry is one of the most intense in college basketball as just 6.7 miles separates the two Big 5 schools that are rich in basketball tradition.

Here's a look at some of the most memorable games in the series history:

- **Dec. 17, '11: SJU 74- VU 58:** SJU students postpone their semester break to provide a high-energy atmosphere at Hagan Arena, in the first time the rivals played on SJU's campus. Langston Galloway led the Hawks with 20 points.
- **Dec. 9, '09: #3 VU 97- SJU 89:** #3 Villanova held off Saint Joseph's in front of a sold-out crowd at the Palestra. The Hawks' Idris Hilliard had a near-perfect shooting night, going 5-for-5 and making 12-of-13 free throws for a career-high 22 points while Scottie Reynolds scored 20 for Villanova.
- **Dec. 11, '08: #15 VU 59- SJU 56:** The Hawks keep the Pavilion crowd quiet for most of the game but two Scottie Reynolds free throws at :05 and two Hawk turnovers end SJU's upset bid.
- **Feb. 8, '08: SJU 77- VU 55:** The Hawks snap their three-game losing streak against Villanova before a capacity and pro-SJU crowd at The Palestra.
- **Feb. 7, '06; #4 VU 71- SJU 58:** For only the fourth time in Big 5 history, two 3-0 teams play for the city title.
