PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

Now in his 19th season as Saint Joseph's University head coach, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while

earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history. He has worked 29 years overall at SJU, including 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 359-245. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in his 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks coach.

Martelli is the dean of Atlantic 10 coaches as the longest tenured coach currently in the league. He also ranks second all-time in the league in overall career victories, and with a 178-125 mark in Atlantic 10 play, owns the most conference wins for any active coach.

One of the more respected coaches in the game, he is currently the President of the NABC's Board of Directors and is a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career. Among the highlights of the season was a win over nationally-ranked Notre Dame in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, a victory over local rival Temple and two wins over conference foe Xavier.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Saint Joseph's boasted a young and exciting squad, and one of the most balanced in school history, as five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters.

The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals. He reached two milestones with his 300th career victory (March 11) and his 150th conference win (March 5), while also coaching his 500th game and 250th A-10 contest.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consec-

utive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins earning AP Honorable Mention All-America honors and becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-11) and has taken SJU to the postseason in nine of the last 13 years, and 11 times in his 18 seasons.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU was rewarded with its sixth consecutive postseason bid, but saw the season come to an end in the NIT Second Round.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, the

2004-05 Hawks struggled early on, but Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to finish 24-12. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-

ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. In addition to the national awards, he was the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year.

He served as head coach of the 2005 USA Under-21 World Championship Team, which finished in fifth place finish at the FIBA U21 World Championships.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to follow in the storied tradition of SJU coaches.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren, Philip Stephen, and Marra, who are the children of Phil, Jr., and wife Meghan; newborn twins Brynley and Avery, who are the daughters of Jimmy and wife Julie; and newborn Madalyn, who is the child of Elizabeth and husband, Patrick.

LAST TIME OUT: DeAndre' Bembry scored a career-high 22 points, but Saint Joseph's saw its six-game winning streak come to an end with a 76-71 setback to George Washington at the Smith Center. Ronald Roberts scored 16 points, Chris Wilson netted 14 and Langston Galloway had 10, while Bembry tied his career-high with eight assists. Saint Joseph's led by as many as nine in the second half, 54-45, with 11:00 to play. GW answered with a 9-0 spurt over the next 2:38, tying the game at 55-55 with 8:22 to go. The teams traded baskets before GW hit a three-point play at 6:55, go up, 61-58. It was the fifth foul called on Halil Kanacevic, and from that point, the Colonials held on to the lead for the duration. Bembry pulled the Hawks back within a basket at 62-60, but GW scored the next five points to take a 67-60 lead with 1:45 to play. Wilson answered with a three-pointer to cut the margin to 67-63 with 1:23 left, but SJU could not get closer than four points the rest of the way. In the first half, Saint Joseph's held the early lead, but only made two of their next 12 shots while the Colonials used a 9-0 run to take a 13-10 lead with 13:21 left. With Kanacevic whistled for his second foul early, GW took advantage of his absence, pushing the margin to 30-16 with 5:32 to go. From there, the Hawks clamped down defensively, keeping the Colonials off the scoreboard and scoring the final 16 points of the first half to take a 32-30 lead into the locker room. Roberts scored all six of his first-half points during the run, including a dunk with 1:09 to go to put the Hawks on top for the first time since early in the game.

LAST TIME VS. LA SALLE: Playing at Tom Gola Arena for the first time in nearly 13 years, Saint Joseph's defeated La Salle, 75-64, on February 15. All five SJU starters finished in double figures, led by Langston Galloway's 18 points. After going scoreless in the first half, DeAndre' Bembry made 5-of-7 from the floor in the second to finish with 16 points. Ronald Roberts added 15 points, while Halil Kanacevic and Chris Wilson chipped in with 10 points apiece. (Full recap on pg. 25)

LET'S GO AGAIN: This is the second meeting of the teams this year, with this game designated as the Big 5 contest. It marks the first time since 2002-03 that the teams will have played twice in one season. This is the fifth all-time meeting on SJU's campus, with the Hawks holding a 3-1 edge. The teams last played here on March 6, 2010, with SJU scoring a 74-59 victory.

KEY TO THE CITY: The Hawks are 1-2 in the Big 5 heading into this City Series game after losing to Temple and Villanova thus far. SJU has won 20 Big 5 titles (9 outright/11 shared), which is third all-time to Temple's 27 titles (6/21 shared). This year, the Big 5 title was clinched by Villanova. In all games against Philadelphia teams this season, SJU is 3-2, with one win over La Salle already, as well as wins over Penn and Drexel. The Hawks lost to Temple and Villanova in the same week in December.

ON A ROLL: Saint Joseph's has won 17 of its last 21 games, posting a 6-2 record in January and a 6-1 mark in February. SJU's six-game winning streak that just ended was the longest since a seven-game streak in 2008-09.

20-20: The Hawks are in the midst of their first 20-win season since 2007-08 when SJU went 21-13 and reached the NCAA Tournament. **Phil Martelli** has guided the Hawks to 20-plus wins eight times in his career.

BYE BYE: The Hawks are currently in a tie for second place in the Atlantic 10 and are seeking their first bye in the conference tournament since 2004-05. If SJU finishes in the top four, it will be the highest league finish for the Hawks since 2004-05 when they placed first in the East Division.

A WIN TONIGHT...:

- would give SJU its most victories (22) since 2003-04 (30)

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: SJU is 11-3 in Hagan Arena this season, the best record since the Hawks went 11-4 in 2011-12. If the Hawks win today, it would mark the first victories at home (on campus) since the 1951-52 season when coach Bill Ferguson's team went 15-1.

SENIOR SENDOFF: Prior to the game, the Hawks will be honoring five senior players - Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic, Colin Kelly, Daryus Quarles and Ronald Roberts, Jr. - along with managers Julianne Capron, Brigid Klarich, John O'Brien and Hawk mascot Ian Klinger. Kelly is a three-year member of the team as a walk-on and was SJU's "Unsung Hero" in 2012. Quarles has played in 113 career games as both a starter and a reserve. Galloway, Kanacevic and Roberts comprise one of the most productive trios in school history. Their combined numbers at SJU are: 4,008 points, 2,106 points, 727 assists and 321 blocks. Here are their individual numbers and where they rank in SJU history:

TWO-FOR-TWO: Ronald Roberts, Jr. was named both the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week and the Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Week for March 3. It is his second weekly honor of the year for both leagues, and the third of his career for both. Roberts averaged 18.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in the Hawks' 2-0 week which ran their winning streak to six games. The senior shot 78.9 percent (15-19) from the field and 58.3 percent (7-for-12) from the foul line. He scored a game-high 22 points in the Hawks' 79-53 win over Dayton, while hitting 8-for-11 from the field and 6-for-10 from the foul line. He then had 15 points in SJU's 83-74 win over St. Bonaventure, hitting 7-of-8 field goal attempts while grabbing six rebounds and blocking two shots.

STEPPING UP: The Hawks showed their balance again at St. Bonaventure, earning the win even though starter Halil Kanacevic was saddled with foul trouble and played just 19 minutes. Langston Galloway led the way again with 27 points, but the Hawks got a boost off the bench from sophomore Isaiah Miles, who scored 11 points. DeAndre' Bembry (18 pts) and Ronald Roberts (15 pts) also paced the Hawks, who shot an impressive 63.6 percent from the field in the game.

FOUL BALL: Despite having done a good job of limiting their fouls all season, the past two games have been tough for the Hawks with the whistle. SJU was called for 21 fouls at St. Bonaventure and 22 at George Washington, above the team's average of 15.7. At St. Bonaventure, **Halil Kanacevic** picked up his fourth early in the second half and played just five minutes in the second half. **Ronald Roberts** also fouled out late in the game, but not before hitting 7-of-8 field goals and finishing with 15 points. In the GW game, Kanacevic played a season-low 13 minutes and fouled out with 6:55 to play, finishing the game without an assist.

EASY POINTS: The Hawks have had their struggles from the foul line this year, shooting 64.7 percent. But SJU has gotten to the line 159 more times than its opponents. And despite the shooting percentage, the Hawks have still made 82 more free throws than their foes.

ROAD WARRIORS: Saint Joseph's owns an 8-4 record on the road this year, which is the most road wins since 2007-08, when that squad went 9-6.

STRAIGHT SHOOTERS: Ronald Roberts and **Halil Kanacevic** rank first and second, respectively in the A-10 for field goal percentage in league games. Roberts is converting 61.9 percent while Kanacevic is hitting 60.2 percent from the field.

FAB FROSH: DeAndre' Bembry has established himself as one of the top rookies in the Atlantic 10. The freshman set a new career-high with 22 points at George Washington, while tying his personal best with eight assists. He has scored in double figures in 20 games, and in the last seven consecutive. Bembry is averaging 11.7 points on the season and is shooting 46.0 percent from the field.

CAN'T MISS CHRIS: Chris Wilson converted all eight field goal attempts, including three three-pointers, in the Hawks' dominating win over Dayton. The junior point guard scored 11 points in the first half on 5-for-5 shooting, and then finished the game with a career-high 20 points. It ranked up there with some of the other "perfect" shooting games in Hawk history - the last one prior to Wilson's effort was Delonte West's 12-for-12 performance at Xavier on Jan. 17, 2004.

DOMINATING DUO: Ronald Roberts and Chris Wilson combined for 42 points on 16-for-19 shooting against Dayton. The duo had the same amount of points as Dayton did with over four minutes to play - but the Flyers were shooting 16-for-56 from the field as a team.

THE COMPLETE GAME: The Hawks put together one of their most complete games in the 79-53 win over Dayton, snapping the Flyers' six-game winning streak. SJU jumped out to an 8-0 lead and was up by double digits with less than seven minutes gone by. Among the key stats of the game were:

- SJU FG%- 58.3; Dayton FG%- 31.7
- SJU 3FG%- 60.0; Dayton 3FG%- 22.7
- 8 turnovers by SJU; 11 by Dayton
- 19 assists on 28 field goals by SJU; 8 assists on 20 field goals by Dayton
- 39 first-half pts by SJU; 20 first-half pts by Dayton

RAINING THREES: Langston Galloway put on another long-range shooting exhibition vs. Fordham as he set the school record with 10 three-pointers en route to scoring a career-high 33 points. The senior made 3-of-5 in the first half and 7-of-10 in the second half, to hit 66.7 percent (10-of-15) in the game. The previous SJU record was nine by Brian Leahy vs. Duquesne on Jan. 17, 1988. Galloway scored 24 points in the second half, which matched his career best set earlier this season against Duquesne. In that game, the senior connected on 9-of-11 shots in the half, including 6-of-7 three-pointers to score 24 points in 19 minutes.

TOP THREE: Langston Galloway now ranks third on the Hawks' all-time scoring list with 1,871 career points, an average of 14.6 per game.

ALL-AROUND GUY: Halil Kanacevic is the only player to wear the Saint Joseph's uniform and amass over 1,000 points, 900 rebounds, 300 assists and 200 blocks in his collegiate career. He currently has 1,087 points, 966 boards, 387 assists, and 209 blocks, totals which include his freshman year at Hofstra. In looking at where those totals rank among SJU's career leaders, Kanacevic ranks 39th in points, sixth in rebounds; 10th in assists and fifth in blocks.

BOUNCING BACK: After a six-point effort at Rhode Island, **Langston Galloway** bounced back in a big way with 33 points and a school-record 10 three-pointers. The longest stretch of his career in which the senior has scored less than 10 points is a three-game streak in January, 2013. **Phil Martelli** said, "He's done it through his whole career. It's very rare that he has two or three games in a row where he's playing poorly. You know, Lang gets it. He's a senior. He's got three left in this building. And he wanted to leave people with a memory on this one." Earlier this year, Galloway rebounded from two straight single-digit games to score 24 in the win over VCU. He has tallied double figures in 94 of the 128 games of his career and in all but five games this season.

DOING IT ALL: Halil Kanacevic fills the boxscore unlike any other player. In the recent win over Dayton, he had 10 points, eight rebounds, eight assists and four blocked shots. He had a double-double against Creighton with 10 rebounds and 10 assists, which was the first of his career in those categories. That came after a 12-point, 11-rebound, 8-assist effort in the win over Marist. Then there was the career game - 27 points, 14 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 blocks - in the win over Drexel. Against #19 UMass, the senior had 19 points, 13 rebounds and six assists. Phil Martelli has called the senior the team's "most indispensable player".

STREAK STATS: The Hawks put up some impressive numbers in the recent six-game winning streak. **Langston Galloway** averaged 19.2 ppg during the streak, while **Ronald Roberts** averaged 15.3 points and 7.3 rebounds and **DeAndre' Bembry** scored 14.8 ppg, while tallying double digits in all six. THE 600 CLUB: The win at Rhode Island was the 600th game of **Phil Martelli's** head coaching career. Martelli has posted a school-record 359 wins in 19 seasons at Saint Joseph's. The Fordham game was the 300th Atlantic 10 game of his career, and he owns 178 conference wins.

LONG-DISTANCE LEADER: Langston Galloway is Saint Joseph's all-time leader in career three-pointers with 321. Galloway hit three three-pointers at Richmond to break the record of 294 held by Big 5 Hall of Fame inductee Pat Carroll (2001-05). He also holds the school single-game record after he connected on 10 vs. Fordham while his total of 86 threes on the season is tied as the sixth best all-time.

LUCKY SEVENS: SJU outscored Fordham, 21-2, early in the second half. But what was more remarkable was that the Hawks scored three points on each of seven consecutive possessions. **Langston Galloway** knocked down five three-pointers in the four-minute stretch, while **Chris Wilson** also hit a three and **Halil Kanacevic** had a three-point play.

CRYING FOUL: As one of the teams in the nation with the fewest personal fouls per game, the Hawks faced a different situation at Rhode Island on Feb. 19. **DeAndre' Bembry** picked up his second foul at 15:27 of the first half and sat the rest of the half. **Halil Kanacevic** was whistled for his second with over six minutes left in the first half and then he and Bembry picked up their third fouls in the first six minutes of the second half. Kanacevic got his fourth with over 10 minutes to play in the second half, but stayed in the rest of the game. **Ronald Roberts** had four fouls with over six minutes remaining, but finished the contest playing all 40 minutes. Bembry was whistled for his fourth at 5:32 of the second half, but finished out the game.

WINNING WITH WILSON: Chris Wilson's career-best game vs. Dayton was the 12th game in double figures this season for the junior. He had 18 points on 6-for-11 three-point shooting against Creighton and scored 17 points at Loyola, hitting 4-of-5 from the field and 3-of-4 from three-point range.

OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED: DeAndre' Bembry has often been called on to guard the opponents' top scorer. Bembry drew the assignment of Tyreek Duren at La Salle and although Duren scored the Explorers' first eight points of the game, the Hawks' freshman shut him down the rest of the way, allowing the La Salle star just seven more points.

BIG-TIME BEMBRY: DeAndre' Bembry had a big-time game in the win over VCU. The Hawks used the freshman to bring the ball upcourt against VCU's pressure and he scored 18 points on 8-for-13 shooting while grabbing six rebounds. Among the plays on his highlight reel were a three-pointer near the end of the first half that gave SJU a 10-point lead, and a lob pass to **Ronald Roberts** for an alley-oop dunk that pushed the lead to 13 points with 5:56 to play. He also had a solid game at La Salle, scoring 16 second-half points after going scoreless in the first half.

ONE OF A KIND: Halil Kanacevic is a unique player and he's one of a few in the country to lead his team in rebounds (8.1), assists (4.5) and blocks (1.6). Stephen Madison of Idaho leads his team in those three categories as well as points and steals, while Jerrelle Benimon of Towson is his team's leader in rebounds, assists and blocks.

SENIOR MOMENTS: Phil Martelli has repeatedly praised this group of players for their character on and off the court. And he's singled out the seniors for leading the way. After the win over La Salle, Martelli said, "Seniors, seniors. They have been special since the summer when we were preparing for Italy. They were great on that trip and they've been great every practice. When I looked at the stat sheet at halftime, I thought that the seniors are taking us here."

AT THE LINE: Saint Joseph's has struggled at the foul line practically all season, but has come through with some solid efforts. In the three games prior to GW, the Hawks were shooting 77.7 percent, compared to the current season percentage of 64.7. The best performance of the year was 81.8 percent at La Salle, with the worst in nine games (59.1) coming at George Washington.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER: Phil Martelli joked that in the UMass game, **Halil Kanacevic** served as player, coach and referee - referring to the senior's vocal nature and the "help" he provides during the game to the SJU coaching staff and the officials.

BALANCED ATTACK: A testament to the Hawks' balance came when SJU led #21 UMass by 16 points at halftime and leading scorer Langston Galloway didn't have a point. The senior played just 12 minutes in the first half as he was saddled with two fouls. That happened again at Rhode Island when Galloway went scoreless in the first half and finished the game with six points. Ronald Roberts picked up the slack, scoring 18 points, while DeAndre' Bembry and Halil Kanacevic scored 12 apiece. Four of five Saint Joseph's starters are now averaging double figures, led by Galloway at 16.6 ppg. The Hawks have had four players score in double figures in 16 of 29 games and all five starters score double figures once (at La Salle).

AVOIDING THE WHISTLE: The Hawks have done a good job limiting their fouls this season and actually rank fifth in the nation with the fewest fouls per game (15.7). SJU's total of 456 personal fouls also ranks as the fourth best. At La Salle, the Hawks went until 5:23 remained in the first

half without being whistled for a foul. **Phil Martelli** pointed out that **Halil Kanacevic** has been succesful in limiting his fouls this season and that's allowed the senior to stay on the court. Kanacevic, who is averaging 3.7 fouls per game, has played all 40 minutes in six games this year. He has only been disqualified six times, but the most costly one came in the loss at George Washington.

IRON MEN: The Hawks' starters have logged a lot of minutes during A-10 play, with all five averaging over 32 minutes per game. **Langston Galloway** leads the way with 37.2 minutes and ranks second in the league in A-10 games only. Galloway leads the squad in minutes in all games with 35.6, a number that ranks third in the Atlantic 10.

MOVING ON UP: Ronald Roberts, Jr. eclipsed the 1,300-point mark vs. Dayton (Feb. 25) and now ranks 25th on the all-time scoring list with 1,332 career points, an average of 10.6 per game.

LATE-GAME HEROICS: Langston Galloway banked in a three-pointer with 1.8 seconds to play to give the Hawks a 60-57 win at Dayton. It was the first game-winning shot of his SJU career.

SENSE OF BALANCE: The Hawks had their most balanced game of the year at La Salle as all five starters scored double figures for the first time this season. The Hawks also shot 49 percent from the field and went a season-best 81.8 percent from the foul line. SJU also committed just eight turnovers while forcing La Salle into 13 turnovers.

HEATING UP: Saint Joseph's shot 59.2 percent from the field vs. Fordham, tied as the second best number of the season, and made 15-of-29 from three-point range (51.7 percent). The Hawks also shot over 70 percent from the foul line (73.7 pct) for only the eighth time this year. Helping the team's field goal percentage were 4-for-4 efforts by both **Ronald Roberts** and **Halil Kanacevic**.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Hawks fought back from a 10-point deficit at Rhode Island to score the 57-54 win. **Ronald Roberts** helped pace the win with 11 of his 18 points in the second half. Trailing by 10 at 14:27, the Hawks went on a 9-0 run and tied the game on a three-point play by Roberts at 9:57. The Hawks went up by 53-48 on a three-pointer by **Papa Ndao** and eventually sealed the win on a layup by **Halil Kanacevic** with 34 seconds to go. After shooting just 35.7 percent from the field and making 1-of-10 from three-point range in the first half, the Hawks hit 12-of-21 shots and 3-of-6 three-point attempts in the second half. It was the second biggest deficit overcome for victory this season.

20-20: After just missing a triple-double at Penn, **Halil Kanacevic** was within one rebound of a 20-20 game at Richmond. The senior had 21 points and a career-high 19 rebounds in the loss. Classmate **Langston**

Galloway has scored 20-plus points 10 times this year, and in 33 games of his career, which is one of the best numbers in the A-10.

RIGHTING THE SHIP: After consecutive losses to city rivals Temple and Villanova (30-point loss) in early December, Saint Joseph's has gone 17-4 since then and **Phil Martelli** credits the players for the turnaround. "These guys looked at each other and decided that if they kept coming every day and kept themselves tight, then good things would happen. It was all of them. Not one guy wavered. I would say the strength of this group is the group and that's what they leaned on."

THEY'RE BACK: Ronald Roberts, Jr., made his return to the starting lineup at Penn after missing the George Mason and Duquesne games with back spasms suffered at UMass. They were the first games in his career that Roberts missed, ending a consecutive-game streak of 113. **Isaiah Miles** was also back in action at Penn after missing three games (UMass, George Mason, Duquesne) due to a concussion suffered in the Denver game on Jan. 4.

TOP ROOKIE: DeAndre' Bembry was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Week for Feb. 10, as he averaged 11.5 points and four rebounds per game in the Hawks' 1-1 week. Bembry scored 18 points and added six rebounds as the Hawks topped VCU, 69-62. He also added three assists and a game-high three steals in the win. It was the second weekly honor for Bembry as he was previously honored on Nov. 18.

REPEAT HONOREE: Halil Kanacevic was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Co-Player of the Week for February 3. It marked the third time this season that he's earned the Big 5 honor. The forward averaged 13.0 points, 8.5 rebounds and 4.0 assists and shot 55 percent from the field (11-for-20) from the field. Kanacevic had a team-high 18 points in the 73-68 upset of #21 Massachusetts, while adding six rebounds and five assists. He shot 7-for-11 from the field and went 3-for-3 from the foul line. In the Hawks' last-second 60-57 win at Dayton, Kanacevic had eight points along with a team-high 11 rebounds and two blocked shots, connecting on 4-of-9 field goal attempts. He also surpassed 1,000 points and 900 rebounds for his career in that game, a total which includes his freshman season at Hofstra.

TRIPLE PLAY: Halil Kanacevic just missed the rare triple-double against Penn, falling one point short. The senior had nine points, 15 rebounds and tied his career-high with 12 assists. The last time a Hawk achieved a triple-double was Dwayne Jones versus St. Bonaventure on Feb. 19, 2005, when he had 11 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks.

BACK IN FORM: Langston Galloway has returned to the long-range shooting form from his sophomore season, when he was the top three-point shooter in the A-10 and ranked fourth in the nation with 46.6 percent. The senior is currently fourth in the A-10 with 42.0 percent and first with 3.0 three-pointers made. He ranks 22nd in the nation in three-point percentage and 24th in threes made per game.

THE POINT FORWARD: Halil Kanacevic's unique passing ability for a forward allows the Hawk offense to often run through him. He has been SJU's leader in assists for the past two seasons and currently leads the team in rebounds (8.1) and assists (4.5), while ranking fifth in the A-10 in rebounds and fourth in assists.

FAB FROSH: DeAndre' Bembry is third on the team in scoring with 12.1 points per game. If he finishes the season averaging double figures, he will become the first freshman since Langston Galloway to do so. Galloway averaged 12.8 ppg in his rookie season (2010-11).

TAKING SHOTS: The Hawks scored 84 points on just 48 shots against Duquesne, with the point total obviously helped by a season-high 17 three-point field goals. But the amount of shots the Hawks have taken concerns **Phil Martelli** as he feels the team needs to take a least 60 shots per game. The Hawks got closer to Martelli's "magic number" at Penn, with 55 field goal attempts and then surpassed it in the loss at Richmond, with 70 attempts. Saint Joseph's averaged 50.6 field goal attempts and 18.5 three-point attempts in the eight games during the month of January.

GAME OF THREES: The Hawks have put on a few long-range shooting exhibitions this season, particularly a season-best 17-for-27 (63.0 percent) effort in the win over Duquesne. It marked the most three-pointers made since a school-record 20 by the Hawks against Temple in the 2003-04 season. SJU has also hit 14 three-pointers in a game twice this year, against Binghamton and Creighton, and then made 15 in wins over Penn and Fordham. **Langston Galloway** was responsible for a school-record 10 threes in the Fordham win. SJU averages 7.4 three-pointers made per game, a number which leads the A-10.

FACE THE NATION: Langston Galloway is fourth in the nation among Division I active career leaders for three-point field goals, with his career total of 321. He also ranks 28th in threes made per game (2.51) and 38th in three-point percentage (41.9). The top five players in career three-pointers made are:

AROUND THE A-10: Langston Galloway leads the Atlantic 10 in three-pointers made (3.0), ranks fourth in three-point percentage (42.8), and fifth in scoring (16.6). **Halil Kanacevic** is fifth in rebounding (8.1) and is fourth in assists (4.5), while **Ronald Roberts** is third in field goal percentage (59.5). As a team, Saint Joseph's leads in field goal percentage in both overall and conference games.

BIG MAN ON CAMPUS: Saint Joseph's senior **Langston Galloway** was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Week for Feb. 17. It was the second time this season that he has earned the honor and the sixth time in his career. The guard led a balanced effort by Saint Joseph's in the 75-64 win over Atlantic 10 and city rival La Salle. He scored a game-high 18 points, with 10 in the first half, while hitting 5-of-12 from the field and grabbing four rebounds. Galloway went 6-for-6 from the foul line, with 4-of-4 in the last minute of play to seal the win.

DEPTH PERCEPTION: The injuries to starter **Ronald Roberts** and sixth man **Isaiah Miles** in early January emphasized the Hawks' lack of depth. At #19 UMass, SJU was without Miles because of a concussion suffered in the Denver win. Then Roberts suffered back spasms early in the second half (17:05), which sidelined him for the rest of the game. **Phil Martelli** used only seven players in the rotation and seniors **Langston Galloway** and **Halil Kanacevic** played all 40 minutes. It marked the first time in his career that Kanacevic played all 40 minutes - although he did play 44 in an overtime win over Notre Dame last season. The Hawks were without Roberts and Miles at George Mason, but **Papa Ndao** made the start and contributed a career-high 13 points, and Galloway and Kanacevic logged 40 minutes again. SJU's starters all average over 31 minutes per game.

THE BIG THREE: Senior tri-captains Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., are the core of the Hawks' team and they cur-

rently account for 56 percent of SJU's scoring and 55 percent of the rebounding. There have only been four games in which the Hawks' leading scorer was not one of those three players.

PAPA'S PLAY: Papa Ndao has earned the role of sixth man with his play this year. In the three games prior to the Rhode Island win, the junior made his last 7-of-8 three-point attempts and 9-of-10 total shots. He hit two crucial free throws with 12 seconds to play in the win over Massachusetts but was unavailable for the VCU game because of the flu.

ON THE MARK: Ronald Roberts ranks second in SJU history in career field goal percentage, converting 56.8 percent from the field (517-910). Ahmad Nivins, who was the 2009 A-10 Player of the Year, is the all-time leader with 62.7 percent.

NOW'S THE TIME: Papa Ndao stepped up in a big way at George Mason, replacing **Ronald Roberts** in the starting lineup. The junior made the sixth start of his career and responded with a perfect shooting game to score a career-high 13 points. It marked his first time in double figures as he went 4-for-4 from the field, making three three-pointers, and hitting two free throws in the final minute. Ndao played a career-high 37 minutes - his previous high was 20 minutes. He also started the Duquesne game and grabbed a team-high seven rebounds.

CITY SLICKERS: With **Halil Kanacevic** and **Ronald Roberts** having already earned Big 5 Player of the Week honors this season, it was **Langston Galloway's** turn. The senior earned the honor for Jan. 20 which was his first city honor of the season and fifth of his career. Galloway averaged 23.0 pts, 4.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists as SJU defeated Duquesne and Penn. He had one of the best shooting weeks of his career as he hit 68 percent (17-for-25) from the field and a blistering 70.5 percent (12-for-17) from three-point range.

HOLDING ON: Against UMass on Feb. 1, Saint Joseph's shot 44.8 percent from the field and 62.5 percent from three-point range in the first half and held a 17-point lead with a minute to play. Up 41-25 at halftime, the Hawks cooled off and made just 1-of-5 from behind the arc and 36.4 percent from the field, allowing UMass to climb back into the game and tie it with 1:23 to play. Struggling from the foul line all year, the Hawks ironically won the game by making 6-of-8 free throws down the stretch, led by two from **Chris Wilson** and two from **Papa Ndao**.

FROZEN: Either the ice storm or the Saint Louis defense froze the Hawks' offense in the 65-49 loss to the Billikens. Saint Joseph's shot just 27.3 percent in the first half, and just 31.9 percent in the game. The Hawks had their worst effort of the season from the three-point line, going just 1-for-15.

ON THE SIDELINE: Kyle Molock is sidelined for the rest of the year. The redshirt freshman reinjured his right knee in practice earlier this month and had successful surgery on February 7 to again repair the ACL of that knee, of which he previously had surgery in August 2012. The injury to his right knee that took place in August 2012, was the second on that knee for Molock, and the third knee injury overall. He was averaging 19.0 points through eight games as a senior at Dublin Coffman when he tore the ACL of his right knee in January 2012; in July of 2010, he suffered a severe injury to all of the major ligaments in his left knee, causing him to miss his junior year.

THE HAWK WILL NEVER DIE: The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been named the best college basketball tradition by NCAA.com in its rankings of the top five traditions. Ranking behind the Hawk are: 2- Kansas' "Rock

Chalk, Jayhawk" chant; 3- the "Frisbee Cheer" at UCLA; 4- Duke's "Krzyzewski-Ville" when students camp out for the game with North Carolina; and 5- Wake Forest's "Rolling the Quad" with streamers of white tissue.

TEN YEARS AFTER: It's hard to believe but this season marks the 10th anniversary of Saint Joseph's memorable 2003-04 season, in which the Hawks went 27-0 during the regular season, and 30-2 overall, earned a number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament and reached the Elite Eight, while coming within two points of a Final Four berth. Jameer Nelson and **Phil Martelli** were the consensus National Player of the Year and National Coach of the Year, respectively, while creating a season on Hawk Hill for the record books.

EVERYBODY INTO THE ACT: All 12 players who were dressed for the game saw action vs. Duquesne. Redshirt freshman **Javon Baumann** notched career-highs of eight points and five rebounds; **Daryus Quarles** had a season-high nine points; and senior walk-on **Colin Kelly** scored his first career points.

COMING BACK: The Denver win marked the second time in three games in which the Hawks fought back from an 11-point deficit to earn the victory. SJU trailed BU by 11 with 18:52 to play in the second half and earned a 73-67 win. Against Denver, the Hawks trailed by 11 points midway through the first half and picked up the 53-52 win.

WINNING WITH WILSON: Point guard **Chris Wilson** scored in double figures four times during the five-game winning streak December. Wilson had 11 points against Drexel, 17 at Loyola and tied his career-high with 19 in the win over BU. He shot a career-best 7-for-14 from the field vs. BU, while making 3-of-6 three pointers. He then added 13 points vs. Binghamton.

ODD OCCURRENCE: Halil Kanacevic went without an assist against Denver. It was the first time since the Butler game on Jan. 9, 2013 that the Hawks' leader in assists did not register one. In the Denver game, however, the Hawks missed 21 shots in the first half. He also did not have an assist at GW, but the senior was limited to 13 minutes of action with foul trouble.

FOUR FOR FOUR: Langston Galloway could become the first Hawk to lead the team for all four years in each of two categories - minutes played and three-point percentage. The senior is currently averaging a team-high 35.6 minutes played per game, and leads the squad in three-point percentage (42.0). No Hawk has led either of those categories for all four years.

HAWKS VS. THE TOP 25: The win over #21 UMass was Saint Joseph's first win over a ranked opponent this season and the first since an overtime win over #20 Notre Dame on Nov. 16, 2012. It was the first Top 25 win at Hagan Arena since an 82-72 win over #22 Temple on Feb. 25, 2012. SJU now owns a 4-7 record against ranked teams in the last three years, counting this season.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE: Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Eric Kindler became Saint Joseph's graduates on December 17, which was the end of the first semester. All three players finished the coursework for their degrees. Kanacevic earned his bachelor's in communications, Galloway received his in sports marketing and Kindler earned a degree in theology. Coach Phil Martelli said it was the first time in his career that he had that many players graduate in December. Both Galloway and Kanacevic will both exhaust their eligibility at the end of

this season. Kindler will have one year remaining as he transferred to Saint Joseph's in his sophomore year but did not play basketball.

HAPPY HOMECOMING: Isaiah Miles put together a career-best game vs. Loyola in his hometown of Baltimore. The sophomore scored 11 points in the first half en route to a career-high 17, in just 12 minutes of action. He hit on 4-of-5 shots from the field and made all eight free throw attempts. He then had his second double-figure effort in three games when he scored 11 points in the win over Binghamton.

DYNAMIC DUO: Halil Kanacevic and **DeAndre'** Bembry combined for 45 of the Hawks' 75 points in the win over Drexel, and had nearly as many as the Dragons scored in the game (55). The duo combined to shoot 19-for-24 from the field.

HAIL HALIL: Halil Kanacevic was named the Big 5 Co-Player of the Week for Dec. 23 after he had a career game to lead the Hawks to the win over Drexel. The senior had a career-high 27 points and added 14 rebounds for the 12th double-double of his career. He also led the team with four assists and two blocks while shooting a personal best 12-for-13 from the field. Phil Martelli said, "Halil was the way he had practiced and the way he had talked. He was really emphatic with his teammates about getting their heads up and moving on to the next challenge." It was the first Big 5 honor of his career and he earned it again on Jan. 13 and Feb. 3.

THE DUNK CONNECTION: Halil Kanacevic, the team's leader in assists, has a knack for finding **Ronald Roberts** around the rim. Kanacevic assisted on three of Roberts' five dunks in the Washington State game and has a total of 24 assists on dunks this season, mostly to Roberts.

ROCK OF AGES: This year's squad is one of SJU's most experienced teams in recent years. The average age of the starting five is 21.2 years old. Three Hawks - Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts and Halil Kanacevic - have each played over 120 games in their college careers.

BIG IN THE BIG 5: Ronald Roberts was named the Big 5 Player of the Week for Dec. 30 after his 19-point performance in the Hawks' win over BU. It was his first Big 5 honor of the season.

RAVING ABOUT RON: Phil Martelli had this to say about Ronald Roberts after the LSU game: "Ron has worked at his game. He's been the Most Improved Player as voted by the coaching staff for three years in a row.... And he'd even be a candidate for this year. But what Ron will probably tell you after tonight is that he had three turnovers. I'm happy for him, he's the product of a really great family. He and (asst. coach) Dave Duda have worked on his game every day to try to get better."

FIRST HONOR: DeAndre' Bembry was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week for Nov. 17. He averaged 14.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists as the Hawks went 1-1 on the week, while connecting on 54.5 percent from the field and 55.6 percent from three-point range.

ABOUT BEMBRY: Phil Martelli likes what he has seen this season from freshman **DeAndre' Bembry**: "DeAndre' is a player beyond his age. He's got a really nice way about him and really takes in what you give him."

SEEING DOUBLE: Halil Kanacevic now has a team-high four double-doubles - including one in rebounds (10) and assists (10) vs. Creighton. **Ronald Roberts** led the Hawks last season with 13 double-doubles on the year and he has two so far, against Marist and Washington State.

ON THE REBOUND: Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts provide the Hawks with a top-notch rebounding tandem. Kanacevic is averaging 8.1 boards and 6.2 defensive rebounds per game while Roberts is grabbing 7.2 boards and 4.6 defensive rebounds. Kanacevic has notched double figures in rebounds eight times this season. SJU's team rebounding margin stands at +2.8, which is the fifth best number in the A-10.

SERVING THE COMMUNITY: Chris Wilson was one of 70 NCAA Men's Division I nominees for the Allstate NABC Good Works Team. The award, now in its second year, recognizes a select group of college basketball student-athletes who have made significant contributions to the greater good of their communities through volunteerism and civic service. Wilson has participated in numerous Saint Joseph's community service projects, has volunteered at his church in Philadelphia and at home in Fayetteville, N.C. Teammate **Langston Galloway** was named to the inaugural team last year and made a trip to the 2013 NCAA Final Four.

FROM THE START: Freshman **DeAndre' Bembry** was the first freshman in SJU's starting lineup on opening day since 2010-11 when the trio of **Langston Galloway**, **Daryus Quarles** and C.J. Aiken each started their first collegiate game.

RON'S WEEKEND: Ronald Roberts, Jr., was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week for Dec. 2. It was the second time in his career that he received the conference's weekly award. He was also selected to the 2013 Old Spice Classic All-Tournament Team as he helped the Hawks to wins over Siena and Washington State by averaging 20 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.7 blocks in SJU's three games in Orlando.

ENJOYING THE RIDE: On a number of occasions, **Phil Martelli** has said that he enjoys coaching this group. After the Creighton game, he elaborated, "I have a really great team. Now there are basketball pieces missing. But these guys, you can't wait to get to work with them in every aspect. The way they're perceived on campus and in recruiting is great."

VIVA ITALIA: Saint Joseph's got a jump on the season when it traveled to Italy in August for a 10-day, four-game tour. The Hawks visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Lake Como and posted a 4-0 record on the trip. It marked the second time that **Phil Martelli** took SJU to Italy, with the last trip coming in 1999.

DEAN OF COACHES: This is **Phil Martelli's** 19th season at the helm of the Hawks, and he is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 359-244 record. He notched his 350th win on Jan. 18 vs. Penn. He is the longest tenured coach in the Atlantic 10 (19 years) and is now second on the conference's list for all-time career victories, behind John Chaney of Temple (516). Martelli is currently serving as the president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

SIGN THEM UP: Saint Joseph's had four high school standouts - James Demery, Markell Lodge, Shavar Newkirk, and Obi Romeo - sign National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. Demery is a 6-6 wing player from Northside Christian Academy in Charlotte, N.C. He averaged 16.8 points and 4.2 steals last season as his team won its second straight Independent School 2A state title. Lodge, originally from Virginia, is a 6-7 wing at Pace Academy in Carrboro, N.C., who is known for his tremendous athleticism and leaping ability. Newkirk is a 6-0 point guard from Cardinal Hayes High School in Bronx, N.Y. Considered one of the top point guards in New York City, he helped Cardinal Hayes to the CHSAA Semifinals in 2012. Romeo, a 6-foot-10 forward with a 94-inch wingspan, is originally from Nigeria and has been in the United States for the past three years, attending Greenbrier East High School in West

Virginia. He averaged 10 points and 13 rebounds last season for the team that went 20-5.

IN MEMORY: Halil Kanacevic changed his uniform number this year to 45 (from 21) in memory of his uncle, Rizo Popovic, who passed away during the 2012-13 season at the age of 45. Kanacevic explained, "It's one of the most selfish things you think of, as a player, when you're growing up. You get a certain number, you get infatuated with it...I've seen kids get into fights over a jersey number. My thing was, let me be unselfish about that and actually give meaning to it. I know what that number means, I know what it represents, I chose it for personal reasons, not a selfish reason. I felt like I needed to do it."

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the fifth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 44-23 record in the five seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 363-105 overall record in 63 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU is 11-3 on its home court this season, the best record since the Hawks went 11-4 in 2011-12.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: Saint Joseph's non-conference schedule is ranked as the second toughest in the A-10, behind VCU's. Other non-conference foes of note on the Hawks' schedule are Creighton, Villanova, Temple and Vermont.

CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., are serving as tri-captains this season.

WATCHING THE HAWKS: Saint Joseph's will have 21 games televised this season, including 13 national televison appearances, which is the most ever for the Hawks. (full schedule on page 2)

WAITING IN THE WINGS: Freshman forward Jai Williams, from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, earned All-Public League Fourth Team honors is redshirting the season. Aaron Brown, a 6-5 guard, transferred to SJU from West Virginia this summer and will sit out the year due to NCAA transfer rules. He was the Delaware County Player of the Year in 2010 for nearby Penn Wood High School and will have two years with the Hawks beginning in 2014-15.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was voted to finish fifth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks finished in a tie for eighth place last year with an 8-8 record.

A LOOK BACK: Last year's squad went 18-14 and earned its second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth under Phil Martelli.

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: Phil Martelli's staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach Mark Bass was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and then was a senior on the squad that reached the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach Geoff Arnold played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations Rob Sullivan was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: The Atlantic 10 Championship will be held at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn from March 12 to 16. The championship game is set for March 16 at 1 p.m. with the telecast on CBS.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks await their seeding and next opponent in the 2014 Atlantic 10 Championship, which takes place from March 12 to 16 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.

THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 57 years. One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never

The Hawk mascot was named the "Best College Basketball Tradition" by NCAA.com in 2014.

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched



to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

lan Klinger, the 35th student to wear the wings, is the Hawk mascot for the second consecutive season. He is a senior finance and accounting major from Millersburg, Pa.

Langston Galloway scored 20 points and Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., each posted a double-double as Saint Joseph's defeated Marist, 81-62, in the Hawks' home opener. Kanacevic just missed a triple-double with 12 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists, while Roberts had 16 points and 10 rebounds. Galloway shot 6-for-8 from the field, and 3-for-5 from three-point range, while also grabbing eight rebounds. SJU scored the first 12 points of the game in the first four minutes and never trailed in the contest. LSU defeated Saint Joseph's, 82-65, in the first round of the 2013 Old Spice Classic, held at ESPN's Wide World of Sports. Ronald Roberts led SJU with 21 points and in the first half, became the 51st Hawk to surpass 1,000 points in his career when he scored on a tip-in at 6:23. The senior connected on 9-of-13 from the field while grabbing a team-high seven rebounds. The Hawks suffered from a poor shooting night, from both the three-point arc (18.8 %) and the foul line (46.2%), as they made just 12-of-26 free throws. Game 10: December 21, 2013 - Reitz Arena - Baltimore, Md. SJU 88 - Loyola 77

It was a tale of two halves, but Saint Joseph's held on for an 88-77 win over Loyola Maryland. Four Hawks scored in double figures during a 60-point first half as Ronald Roberts led Saint Joseph's with 20 points. SJU was led early by Langston Galloway, who hit on his first four three-point attempts and first five field goal attempts. After a 10-3 Hawk spurt, Loyola scored five straight to close within 13-12, which would be as close as the Greyhounds would get for the rest of the game. With SJU holding a 24-19 lead, a three-pointer from Isaiah Miles kicked off a 36-5 run to close out the half. Miles' three began a 17-0 spurt for the Hawks and was highlighted by a 9-of-10 shooting stretch for Saint Joseph's. SJU held a 60-24 lead at intermission. During the first half, the Hawks shot a blistering 64.5% (20-31) from the field, including 8-of-12 from three-point range, and hit on all 12 free throw attempts. In the middle of the second half, things turned around as Loyola outscored SJU 53-28 and held the Hawks to just four field goals. With SJU leading 72-42 with 9:30 left, Loyola raced to a 20-5 run, closing to 77-62 with 3:19 to play. Loyola then used an 8-1 spurt over a 40-second span to close to within 79-70 with 1:35 to go. Over the final 1:30, the Hawks hit 9-of-11 free throws to ice the game. Miles finished with a career-high 17 points in his hometown, Chris Wilson had 17 and Galloway scored 14 points.

Saint Joseph's fought back from an 11-point second-half deficit to defeat Boston University, 73-67. Chris Wilson tied his career high with 19 points to lead four Hawks in double figures while Ronald Roberts, Jr. had 19 as well, Langston Galloway scored 16 and freshman DeAndre' Bembry added 11. Trailing by three points with 7:25 remaining in the game, seniors Halil Kanacevic and Langston Galloway put Saint Joseph's on their backs and led the Hawks to a gritty 84-80 win at George Mason in the first A-10 meeting of the teams. Kanacevic scored 23 points, Galloway had 20 and DeAndre' Bembry added 17, while Papa Ndao posted a career-high 13 points on 4-of-4 shooting in his first start of the season. The Hawks were without second-leading scorer Ronald Roberts, Jr., who missed his first career game due to back spasms, and Isaiah Miles who missed his second consecutive game due to a concussion. Trailing 45-40 at halftime, SJU opened the second half on a 10-2 run, culminating in a dunk and a layup by Kanacevic to put the Hawks on top, 53-47, with 16:26 remaining. The Patriots closed back to within 54-53 but a layup by Bembry restored a three-point lead a minute later. The Hawks took a 60-55 lead at the 12:28 mark, but GMU would answer with an 11-3 run to take a 66-63 lead with 7:25 left. Kanacevic answered with a layup and Ndao hit his third three-pointer of the game to put SJU ahead for good, 68-67, with 6:12 to go. That bucket kicked off a 9-0 run that featured four points from Galloway and left the Hawks with a 74-67 advantage with 3:16 to play. A pair of GMU free throws broke up the run, but the Hawks then scored six of the next seven points, punctuated by a fast break dunk from Bembry, to take an 80-70 lead at :45. Galloway and Kanacevic would each drain a pair of free throws to help seal the victory before GMU hit a desperation three-pointer at the buzzer to provide the final margin.

Langston Galloway scored 24 of his 26 points in the first half as Saint Joseph's staked a 30point lead and cruised to an 84-75 win over Duquesne. The Hawks put on an offensive display in the first half, shooting 71.4 percent from the field (20-of-28), and making 12-of-18 threepointers en route to a 52-20 halftime lead. Halil Kanacevic led all players with 21 points and a career-high 19 rebounds, but Saint Joseph's struggled from the floor in a 77-62 loss at Richmond. During the game, Langston Galloway broke the school's career record for three-point field goals (294) set by SJU Basketball Hall of Famer Pat Carroll from 2001-05. Galloway sank the 295th three-pointer of his career in the second half. Leading 35-28 at halftime, Richmond opened the second half with an 11-2 run to take a 46-30 lead with 15:41 to go. SJU would cut the deficit to 52-43 after five points each from Galloway and Chris Wilson during a 13-6 stretch. The Spiders responded with a 12-2 run, taking their biggest lead of the game when a dunk made it a 64-45 advantage with 4:34 to go. After a dunk by Ronald Roberts, Galloway hit his record-breaking three to cut the deficit to 64-50. A three-pointer from Kanacevic with 3:20 to play preceded a pair of UR free throws that left the score at 66-53, but a jumper from DeAndre' Bembry and another three from Galloway capped off a 13-2 run that got the Hawks back within 66-58 with 2:22 to go. The Hawks could not get closer, however, as the Spiders converted 9-of-10 free throws over the final 1:25 to seal the victory. Saint Joseph's enjoyed a 44-35 advantage on the boards and pulled down 21 offensive rebounds, but shot just 37.1% (26-of-70) from the floor. Richmond hit on 47.9% (23-of-48) of its shots; that mark included 10-of-22 (45.5%) from three-point range, well over their average of 31.6%. Galloway scored 11 of his 13 points in the second half, while Bembry (11) and Wilson (10) also reached double-digits for SJU.

Langston Galloway banked home a three-pointer with 1.8 seconds remaining to lead Saint Joseph's past Dayton, 60-57. Chris Wilson led the Hawks with 15 points on 5-of-9 shooting, while Halil Kanacevic scored the 1,000th point of his collegiate career and grabbed 11 rebounds. Ronald Roberts, Jr. added 12 points and DeAndre' Bembry had 11. With the Hawks leading 57-55, Dayton's Dyshawn Pierre tied the game with a layup with 11 seconds left. After a timeout, Galloway

took the inbounds pass in the backcourt and dribbled around a pair of screens on his right. His shot hit the backboard and went through the net with 1.8 seconds on the clock. The Flyers missed a desperation attempt from halfcourt to give the Hawks the victory, their first in Dayton since Feb. 21, 2001, snapping an eightgame losing streak at UD Arena. The Hawks owned a 15-point lead in the second half, but almost let it slip away. With SJU leading 47-32 at the midway point of the half, Dayton made its comeback, outscoring the Hawks, 19-7, over the next eight minutes. After Dayton's Vee Sanford picked off an SJU pass, Bembry was whistled for a flagrant foul in trying to stop the break. Sanford hit both free throws to pull UD within 54-51 at 2:23, but Wilson intercepted a pass on Dayton's ensuing possession. Bembry then hit a pair of free throws to increase SJU's lead to 56-51. The Flyers came within 56-55, at :27, but Bembry connected on the front end of the one-and-one to give SJU a 57-55 cushion. The Flyers answered with a layup at :11 to tie the game at 57-57 and set the stage for Galloway's game-winner. SJU scored a season-low 20 points in the first half, and trailed 25-20 at halftime. The Hawks came out like a different team after intermission and opened the second with a 27-7 run, including 12 straight points to take a 47-32 lead.

Playing at Tom Gola Arena for the first time in nearly 13 years, Saint Joseph's defeated La Salle, 75-64. All five SJU starters finished in double figures, led by Langston Galloway's 18 points. After going scoreless in the first half, DeAndre' Bembry made 5-of-7 from the floor in the second to finish with 16 points. Ronald Roberts added 15 points, while Halil Kanacevic and Chris Wilson chipped in with 10 points apiece. SJU led from the 15:08 mark of the first half, but La Salle pulled within 68-62 with 2:10 to play. Galloway then made a pair of free throws to give SJU a 70-62 lead with over a minute to go before Kanacevic added another at :55. La Salle answered right back to come within 71-64 with 49.2 to go but Galloway and Roberts sank a pair of free throws apiece to salt away the win. Kanacevic was whistled for his third foul early in the second half, but the Hawks built up their lead without their top assist man. A pair of three-point plays by Bembry, followed by a layup by Galloway, gave the Hawks their biggest lead, 46-30, at 15:33. After LSU cut it to 56-48 with 10:53 remaining, a drive by Bembry gave the Hawks' another 10-point cushion, 58-48, followed by a pair of Galloway free throws and a three from Bembry put SJU's lead back up to 63-48. The Explorers then went on a 14-5 run to get within two possessions late. Saint Joseph's shot 53.6 percent from the field in the first half and led for most of the period. La Salle came within three at 27-24 with 3:28 to go, but the Hawks ended the half with a 9-2 run. A three by Galloway at :14 put the Hawks ahead by double digits for the first time, 36-26, at intermission. Ronald Roberts, Jr., tallied 11 of his game-high 18 points in the second half to lead Saint Joseph's back from a 10-point deficit to defeat Rhode Island, 57-54, at the Ryan Center. Halil Kanacevic and DeAndre' Bembry chipped in with 12 points apiece, while Roberts and Kanacevic each corralled nine rebounds. Trailing 38-28 with 14:27 to go in the game, Saint Joseph's went on a 9-0 run that featured five points from Bembry. Langston Galloway hit a school-record 10 three-pointers and scored a career-high 33 points to lead Saint Joseph's to an 87-72 win over Fordham at Hagan Arena. Galloway made 10-of-15 from behind the arc to eclipse the record of nine threepointers previously set by Brian Leahy vs. Duquesne on Jan. 17, 1988. The senior finished the game shooting 11-for-18 overall from the field. Ronald Roberts, Jr. had 13 points and a team-high 13 rebounds for the Hawks, while DeAndre' Bembry scored 13 and Halil Kanacevic added 10 points and five assists. The Hawks used their three-point shooting to go on a 21-2 run early in the second half, scoring three points on each of seven straight possessions. Galloway knocked down five three-pointers in the four-minute stretch, while Chris Wilson also hit a three and Kanacevic had a three-point play. At the end of the run, SJU held a 65-36 lead, its largest of the game. Galloway connected on the record-tying three-pointer with 10:40 to play and then hit the record-setting field goal just 31 seconds later at 10:09 to give SJU a 71-42 lead. The Hawks scored the first seven points of the game and built up a quick 18-7 lead, helped by two three-pointers from Galloway. Another three by Galloway and five points from Bembry pushed SJU's advantage to 37-15, their biggest of the half. Fordham would close out the half with a 13-3 run to cut the deficit to 42-30 at halftime. Although SJU shot 60 percent from the field in the first half, the Hawks committed nine turnovers, and followed that with 10 in the second half.

Ronald Roberts, Jr. scored 22 points and Chris Wilson had a career-high 20 points as Saint Joseph's scored a convincing 79-53 win over Dayton at Hagan Arena. The win was the fifth in a row for Saint Joseph's while snapping Dayton's six-game winning streak, and handing the Flyers their worst loss of the season. It was the 20th win for SJU, marking the first 20-win season since 2007-08. Wilson shot a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, while Roberts hit 8-of-11 field goals. DeAndre' Bembry scored 12 points while Halil Kanacevic added 10 points, eight rebounds, eight assists and four blocked shots. Wilson and Roberts each scored 11 points in the first half as the Hawks quickly built up a double-digit lead. SJU scored the first eight points of the game and never looked back, taking a 10-1 lead in the first four minutes, and expanding it to 17-6 with seven straight points from Roberts. Backto-back three-pointers from Papa Ndao built SJU's lead to its biggest of the half, 37-18, and the Hawks went into intermission holding a 39-20 lead. The Hawks kept rolling in the second half and maintained a 20-plus point lead most of the way. The Hawks took their largest margin of the game, 77-47, on a three-pointer by Bembry with 2:10 to play. Saint Joseph's made 58.3 percent from the field in the game and connected on 60 percent (9-of-15) from three-point range. Dayton hit just 31.7 percent and 22.7 percent from behind the arc.

Langston Galloway scored 27 points to lead Saint Joseph's to an 83-74 victory over St. Bonaventure at the Reilly Center, for the Hawks' sixth straight win. DeAndre' Bembry added 18, Ronald Roberts, Jr., had 15, and Isaiah Miles chipped in with 11 off the bench. Galloway also pulled in a game-high eight rebounds. Saint Joseph's held a 40-35 lead at halftime, but the Bonnies went ahead for the first time since early in the game, 45-44, with 16:54 to play. The teams then traded baskets, and with the score at 47-46, the Hawks embarked on an 8-0 to take the lead for good, punctuated by a three-point play from Galloway at 12:48 that made it 54-47. Roberts scored all six of his first-half points during the run, including a dunk with 1:09 to go to put the Hawks on top for the first time since early in the game.
