PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

In 20 seasons as head coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he

has earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and has become one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 375-265. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in 20 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 185-137 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a being a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

Martelli has seen six of his former Hawks play in the NBA, with three players chosen in the NBA Draft: guard Jameer Nelson (2004), guard Delonte West (2004) and forward Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones also played in the NBA while Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Langston Galloway are the most recent, with Galloway earning All-Rookie second-team honors with the New York Knicks in 2014-15.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 15 years, and 12 times in his 20 seasons at SJU.

Martelli's commitment to the University is equal to SJU's commitment to him, as he signed a multiyear contract extension prior to the 2015-16 season.

The 2014-15 Hawks were challenged after losing three All-Conference players from the 2014 A-10 champion team, but saw the emergence of sopho-

more DeAndre' Bembry as one of the league's top players, as he topped the A-10 in scoring and earned All-Conference First Team honors.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached

the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run and reached the A-10 semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was

also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third Martelli player drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid to the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks. Martelli

guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the title game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

LAST TIME VS. DREXEL: The Hawks scored a 52-49 win at the Daskalaskis Center in the second game of the 2014-15 season (Nov. 17). Aaron Brown hit a driving layup to break a 47-47 tie and Isaiah Miles and Shavar Newkirk hit late free throws to help SJU earn the victory. DeAndre' Bembry had 13 points, James Demery scored 12 and Brown added 11 in the win. Both teams shot under 40 percent in the game with the Hawks hitting 35 percent and Drexel converting 34 percent.

FOR OPENERS: Saint Joseph's is 8-2 in season openers in the past 10 years, with the losses coming in 2010-11 to Western Kentucky and last season to Fairleigh Dickinson in overtime.

DEAN OF COACHES: Phil Martelli is the dean of A-10 coaches as he enters his 21st season as the head coach of the Hawks with a 375-265 career record. He owns a 185-137 record in Atlantic 10 play for the most conference wins of any active coach, and the second most all-time.

FEAR THE 'FRO: All-Conference performer **DeAndre' Bembry** is on numerous preseason lists that recognize him as one of the top players in the nation. He was the leading scorer in the Atlantic 10 last season with his 17.7 average and led the Hawks in practically every statistical category, including rebounding (7.7), assists (3.6), steals (1.9) and an NCAAleading 38.6 minutes per game. The 6-6 junior also topped the league in scoring in A-10 games with his 19.0 average. Bembry became the first SJU player ever to win the conference's scoring title.

FAMILIAR FOE: Drexel and Saint Joseph's have a great familiarity with each other. Drexel head coach Bruiser Flint is a 1987 graduate of Saint Joseph's and was a teammate of Hawks' assistant coach **Geoff Arnold. Phil Martelli** was an assistant coach for that SJU team which won the 1986 Atlantic 10 title.

IRON MAN: DeAndre' Bembry led the nation in minutes played with 38.6 per game, while seeing 40 minutes or more of action in 14 games last season.

RACKING UP THE MILES: Senior **Isaiah Miles** was the team's second leading scorer last year with 10.7 points per game. He was also the Hawks' leader in long-range shots with 53 three-pointers made and a shooting percentage of 35.3 percent.

FROM THE START: Pierfrancesco Oliva becomes the third freshman in three years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bembry** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks in 2014-15 while **James Demery** was in the starting lineup last season. Oliva, from Italy, starred for Bergen Catholic (N.J.) last year, averaging 15.9 points and earning All-State honors.

RARING TO GO: Redshirt freshman **Markell Lodge** will be making his debut after sitting out last year to concentrate on academics. A 6-8 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.), Lodge has a vertical leap of 39 inches, which is the highest in the program's history.

READY, SET, GO: The Hawks will get a handful of games under their belts rather quickly, with three games in six days, and a total of five games in 10 days. After the Nov. 22 game in the Hall of Fame Tip-Off, SJU gets a rest before returning to action against rival Villanova on Dec. 1.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: First-year players joining the Hawks this season are: Chris Clover (St. Joseph's Prep) and Lamarr Kimble (Neumann-Goretti) - as well as Italian import Pierfrancesco Oliva (Bergen Catholic). Clover, a 6-3 guard, was the Most Valuable Player of the Philadelphia

Catholic League, averaging 20.7 points to rank fifth in the city in scoring. Kimble, a 6-0 point guard, was an All-Catholic League First Team honoree after averaging 14.5 points and helping Neumann-Goretti to its second straight PIAA Class AAA championship. Oliva, a 6-8 forward from Taranto, Italy, earned All-State Third Team honors at Bergen Catholic in New Jersey while scoring 15.9 ppg. **Christian Vega**, a 6-0 sophomore guard, is a new addition to the team as a walk-on. He will dress only for home games.

ON THE SIDELINES: Papa Ndao's return to the court has been delayed with a fractured finger that he suffered last week in practice. Ndao sat out the entire 2014-15 season due to medical reasons, but had been cleared to play this year. Ndao, who has played in 85 career games with seven starts, is currently attending graduate school after receiving his degree in May 2015. Also on the sidelines is senior **Skylar Scrivano**, who has been battling an achilles injury since the summer. The 6-10 forward came to SJU last year from Rider and sat out due to the transfer rule.

STARTING SHAVAR: Sophomore point guard **Shavar Newkirk** will be making the first start of his career tonight. He saw action in all 31 games last season, averaging 20 minutes per game.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: Senior Aaron Brown served primarily as the Hawks' "sixth man" last season, but will open this year in the starting lineup. He was the team's third leading scorer with 9.3 points per game.

GAINING NOTICE: DeAndre' Bembry has certainly gained the attention of the NBA with his play the past two years and his performance at the Nike Basketball Academy during the summer. A total of 25 NBA teams have already attended SJU practices during the preseason while numerous scouts are expected at Hawk games this year.

THEY'RE BACK: The Hawks feature 10 players returning from last year's team along with four starters. Point guard Chris Wilson is the only starter not returning.

HAWK CAPTAIN: Junior DeAndre' Bembry was voted team captain by his teammates. Bembry will serve as captain for the second year in a row. Last season, he was the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in Phil Martelli's 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

TOURNAMENT TIME: SJU is participating in the Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off this year and will start off by hosting two games - vs. Niagara on Sunday and Buffalo on Nov. 18. The Hawks then travel to Mohegan Sun Arena where they will face Florida on Nov. 21 and either Old Dominion or Purdue in the consolation/championship on Nov. 22 to close out the tournament.

SIGN HIM UP: It was announced on October 29, 2015 that head coach **Phil Martelli** and Saint Joseph's had agreed to a multi-year contract extension.

CAROLINA ON MY MIND: The Hawks' roster features three players from the state of North Carolina - **DeAndre' Bembry** (Charlotte), **James Demery** (Williamston) and **Markell Lodge** (Washington).

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: Saint Joseph's will have first-time meetings with two teams this season - Columbia (Dec. 4) and Illinois State (Dec. 19).

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish seventh in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. Last season the Hawks went 7-11 and finished 10th in the A-10.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the seventh season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 54-28 record in the six seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 373-110 overall record in 65 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 10-4 on its home court during the 2014-15 season.

NBA HAWK: Langston Galloway, who was on SJU's 2014 A-10 Championship team, is currently starring for the New York Knicks. Galloway, who was undrafted, worked his way through the NBA D League and earned a spot on the Knicks in January 2015. His play gained him recognition on the 2014-15 All-Rookie Second Team.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: Phil Martelli's staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 17th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks have a quick turnaround and host Niagara on Sunday in the first game of the Hall of Fame Tip-Off. SJU continues play in the tournament by hosting Buffalo on Wednesday before traveling to Mohegan Sun Arena for a pair of games on the weekend of November 21-22.

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2015-16.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Timmy Parks becomes the 37th student to wear the wings in 2015-16. He is a junior accounting major from Wilmington, Del.
