PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

In 21 seasons as head coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he

has earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and has become one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 378-265. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in 20 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 185-137 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a being a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

Martelli has seen six of his former Hawks play in the NBA, with three players chosen in the NBA Draft: guard Jameer Nelson (2004), guard Delonte West (2004) and forward Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones also played in the NBA while Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Langston Galloway are the most recent, with Galloway earning All-Rookie second-team honors with the New York Knicks in 2014-15.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 15 years, and 12 times in his 20 seasons at SJU.

Martelli's commitment to the University is equal to SJU's commitment to him, as he signed a multiyear contract extension prior to the 2015-16 season.

The 2014-15 Hawks were challenged after losing three All-Conference players from the 2014 A-10 champion team, but saw the emergence of sophomore DeAndre' Bembry as one of the league's top

players, as he topped the A-10 in scoring and earned All-Conference First Team honors.

In 2013-14. Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under

Martelli, falling to eventual champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run and reached the A-10 semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third Martelli player drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid to the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-

12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the title game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

LAST TIME OUT: Isaiah Miles tied his career-highs with 24 points and 14 rebounds and DeAndre' Bembry scored the 1,000th point of his career as Saint Joseph's defeated Buffalo, 89-67, in the Hall of Fame Tip-Off at Hagan Arena. Miles shot 7-for-11 from the field, and went 8-for-8 from the foul line, while keying a 21-0 run for the Hawks early in the first half. Sophomores Shavar Newkirk set a new career-high with 12 points as did James Demery with 13 points. Bembry scored his 1,000th point on a drive at 10:13 of the first half. The junior, who entered the game with 998 career points in 68 games, became the 52nd Hawk to reach the milestone and the 22nd to do so in his third season. Buffalo took a quick 5-2 lead at 17:18 but then the Hawks rattled off 21 consecutive points in a span of just over five minutes. Pierfrancesco Oliva started the run with a three-pointer and Miles chipped in with seven points and Demery added five as the Hawks took their biggest lead, 21-5, at 11:17. The Bulls ended their scoreless string at 11:06 on a three-pointer. The Hawks took their biggest lead of the half, 45-25, on a three-pointer by Miles with 1:35 remaining, as SJU owned a 46-28 edge at halftime. Buffalo chipped away at the Hawks lead and cut it to 56-44 at 14:02. Saint Joseph's then scored eight in a row, with four from Demery, to regain the 20-point margin. The Hawks shot 47 percent and committed just six turnovers.

JOIN THE CLUB: DeAndre' Bembry became the 52nd Hawk player to score over 1,000 points in his Saint Joseph's career. He entered the Buffalo game with 998 points and hit the milestone with a driving layup at the 10:13 mark of the first half. He is the 22nd Hawk to achieve the milestone as a junior and now has 1,008 points in 68 games. "He's going to be a Hall of Famer here and be a Big 5 Hall of Famer down the line, but it's not going to be because of his points. It's going to be because of his game. He's a basketball player," said coach Phil Martelli. "At halftime, he told me his man (Jarryn Skeete) didn't have any points. We've had other guys here get to that number (1,000) because they wanted to get to that number. With him, he wanted to get to 3-0."

RACKING UP THE MILES: Senior Isaiah Miles is the team's leader in scoring (17.0), rebounding (9.3) and blocks (2.3). He tied his career-highs with 24 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Buffalo, and now has two double-doubles in three games. Miles has credited his work with assistant coach David Duda and a weight loss of close to 20 pounds from last March for his impressive start. Phil Martelli called his effort against Buffalo a "monster game" and said, ""It's a credit to him (Miles) because he looks like a different player with the weight loss. He's a senior in practice and he's a senior in the locker room. He had 14 rebounds and we're undersized. I'm just delighted for him. It's what you want for a senior. He's a really good person and comes from a wonderful family."

JAM-PACKED START: The Hawks have wasted no time getting the season going as they have played three games in six days. And with the two games this weekend, it will be five contests in 10 days. SJU, which has played on the past two Thanksgiving days, gets a break for the holiday and will return to action on Dec. 1, hosting rival Villanova.

HIGH-SCORING HAWKS: The Hawks have scored more than 70 points in their first three games, with a high of 89 vs. Drexel. It's quite a change from last year when SJU struggled to score. The 2014-15 Hawks surpassed the 70-point mark only six times in 31 games and scored less than 60 points on 11 occasions.

BOOK ON BEMBRY: DeAndre' Bembry has picked up where he left off, leading the Hawks. The junior opened the year with a game-high 23 points in the win over Drexel, hitting 6-of-12 from the field and tying his career-high with 11 free throws made (in 15 attempts). Bembry followed that with 12 points, six rebounds and seven assists vs. Niagara and had

10 points and a team-high five assists against Buffalo. Although he is two points per game (15.0) behind **Isaiah Miles** in the scoring columns, he leads the team in assists (4.7), and steals (2.0).

BALANCED ATTACK: Saint Joseph's has had four players score double figures in each of the first three games. It was the same foursome - DeAndre' Bembry, Isaiah Miles, Aaron Brown and Pierfrancesco Oliva in the first two games, while Bembry, Miles, James Demery and Shavar Newkirk hit double digits against Buffalo.

VIVA ITALIA: Freshman Pierfrancesco Oliva gave a glimpse of things to come with his performance against Drexel - 12 points, four rebounds, four assists and three blocks. Oliva hit a three-pointer with 2:34 to play to give the Hawks a 12-point cushion that they would need. He followed that with 12 points, eight rebounds, and five assists in the Niagara win.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: Senior Aaron Brown posted back-to-back double-figure games in the first two contests and is averaging 12.7 ppg. Brown made the fourth start of his SJU career against Drexel and responded with 15 points on 5-for-10 shooting, and followed that with 14 vs. Niagara. Brown served primarily as the Hawks' "sixth man" last season and was the team's third leading scorer with 9.3 points per game.

ON THE LINE: SJU has converted over 70 percent from the line in all three games. Last year, the team struggled at the foul line, converting 61.5 percent of its free throw attempts. **Isaiah Miles** has made all 12 attempts while **Aaron Brown** has made all 11 of his free throws thus far.

FROM THE START: Pierfrancesco Oliva became the third freshman in three years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bembry** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks in 2014-15 while **James Demery** was in the starting lineup last season.

TO THE POINT: Sophomore point guard **Shavar Newkirk** made the first start of his career against Drexel and has started all three games. He achieved a new career-high with 12 points in the win over Buffalo, hiting 4-of-7 from the field. The sophomore has taken care of the ball, only averaging 1.3 turnovers per game in 23.3 minutes played per game.

FEAR THE 'FRO: All-Conference performer **DeAndre' Bembry** is on numerous preseason lists that recognize him as one of the top players in the nation. He was the leading scorer in the Atlantic 10 last season with his 17.7 average and led the Hawks in practically every statistical category, including rebounding (7.7), assists (3.6), steals (1.9) and an NCAAleading 38.6 minutes per game. The 6-6 junior also topped the league in scoring in A-10 games with his 19.0 average. Bembry became the first SJU player ever to win the conference's scoring title.

TOURNEY TIME: This is SJU's first time participating in the Hall of Fame Tip-Off. Last year, the Hawks were in the NIT Season Tip-Off and lost a game at Gonzaga, won a home game vs. LIU Brooklyn, and lost to Western Kentucky on Thanksgiving in Madison Square Garden. The Hawks will travel to the Paradise Jam in St. Thomas next season.

JAMES' GAME: James Demery hit a career-high 13 points and six rebounds in the win over Buffalo. Demery, who was a starter last year, has come off the bench this season. Phil Martelli credited Demery's mentor and AAU coach Jeff McInnis (former UNC player) with the sophomore's strong play after the two spent some time together this past weekend. Demery is now averaging 8.7 points per game and shooting 55.0 percent from the field.

IN FINE COMPANY: Phil Martelli is in an exclusive club of current coaches who have been at one school for 20 seasons. There are eight other Division I coaches in the group who have coached at least two decades: Jim Boeheim (Syracuse), Mike Krzyzewski (Duke), Tom Izzo (Michigan State), Greg Kampe (Oakland), Rick Byrd (Belmont), Bob McKillop (Davidson), Dave Loos (Austin Peay) and Fran O'Hanlon (Lafayette).

BEMBRY AND THE BIG 5: DeAndre' Bembry was named the Big 5 Co-Player of the Week for the first week of the season. He averaged 17.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists in the Hawks' first two wins.

THE POINT FORWARD: Phil Martelli is already comparing freshman **Pierfrancesco Oliva's** passing ability to that of 2014 All-A-10 honoree Halil Kanacevic. The 6-8 Oliva is tied for the team lead in in assists with DeAndre' Bembry at 4.5 per game. Kanacevic, also a 6-8 forward, averaged a team-high 4.4 assists for the 2014 A-10 Champions.

IRON MAN: DeAndre' Bembry led the nation in minutes played with 38.6 per game, while seeing 40 minutes or more of action in 14 games last season.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: First-year players joining the Hawks this season are: Chris Clover (St. Joseph's Prep) and Lamarr Kimble (Neumann-Goretti) - as well as Italian import Pierfrancesco Oliva (Bergen Catholic). Clover, a 6-3 guard, was the Most Valuable Player of the Philadelphia Catholic League, averaging 20.7 points to rank fifth in the city in scoring. Kimble, a 6-0 point guard, was an All-Catholic League First Team honoree after averaging 14.5 points and helping Neumann-Goretti to its second straight PIAA Class AAA championship. Oliva, a 6-8 forward from Taranto, Italy, earned All-State Third Team honors at Bergen Catholic in New Jersey while scoring 15.9 ppg. Christian Vega, a 6-0 sophomore guard, made the team as a walk-on and will dress only for home games.

ON THE SIDELINES: Papa Ndao's return to the court has been delayed with a fractured finger and he will be sidelined indefinitely. He sat out the entire 2014-15 season due to medical reasons, Ndao, who has played in 85 career games with seven starts, is currently attending graduate school after receiving his degree in May 2015. Also on the sidelines is senior **Skylar Scrivano**, who has been battling an achilles injury since the summer. The 6-10 forward came to SJU last year from Rider and sat out due to the transfer rule.

GAINING NOTICE: DeAndre' Bembry has certainly gained the attention of the NBA with his play the past two years and his performance at the Nike Basketball Academy during the summer. A total of 25 NBA teams have already attended SJU practices during the preseason while numerous scouts are expected at Hawk games this year. He's also received a number of preseason accolades and is on the "watch lists" for the John R. Wooden Award, the Julius Erving Small Forward Award and the Lute Olson National Player of the Year Award.

DEAN OF COACHES: Phil Martelli is the dean of A-10 coaches in his 21st season as the head coach of the Hawks with a 378-265 career record. He owns a 185-137 record in Atlantic 10 play for the most conference wins of any active coach, and the second most all-time.

HAWK CAPTAIN: Junior DeAndre' Bembry was voted team captain by his teammates. Bembry is serving as captain for the second year in a row. Last season, he was the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in Phil Martelli's 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

SIGN HIM UP: It was announced on October 29, 2015 that head coach **Phil Martelli** and Saint Joseph's had agreed to a multi-year contract extension. Martelli has guided the Hawks to 12 posteason appearances and two Atlantic 10 titles.

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish seventh in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. Last season the Hawks went 7-11 and finished 10th in the A-10.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the seventh season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 56-28 record in the six seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 375-110 overall record in 65 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 10-4 on its home court during the 2014-15 season and is 3-0 this year.

FT Made

HAWKS IN WAITING: Phil Martelli announced that Charles Brown and Gerald Blount had signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period and will join the program in the Fall of 2016. Blount is a 6-foot-7 forward from the Pomfret School in Connecticut, who averaged 11.3 points, 9.2 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 blocks per game last season. He earned All-New England Class B Honorable Mention recognition in 2015 in his first season there and also played football for Pomfret. Brown, a 6-6 wing from Philadelphia, is currently attending St. Thomas More in Connecticut. He previously played at George Washington High School in Philadelphia and in 2014-15, was named the MVP of the Public League's B Division as he scored a division-leading 18.4 points per game.

NBA HAWK: Langston Galloway, who was on SJU's 2014 A-10 Championship team, is currently starring for the New York Knicks. Galloway, who was undrafted, worked his way through the NBA D League and earned a spot on the Knicks in January 2015. His play gained him recognition on the 2014-15 All-Rookie Second Team.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: After the Hall of Fame Tip-Off, the Hawks get a break for the holiday before returning to action against nationally-ranked Villanova on Tuesday, December 1. The annual Big 5 rivalry game will be played at Hagan Arena.

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2015-16.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Timmy Parks becomes the 37th student to wear the wings in 2015-16. He is a junior accounting major from Wilmington, Del.

SAINT JOSEPH'S

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the public title of the institution for all aspects of its operations.

Niagara 0-2

Game 1: November 13, 2015 - Hagan Arena SJU 82 - Drexel 81

DeAndre' Bembry scored 23 points and Aaron Brown added 15 points as Saint Joseph's defeated Drexel, 82-81, in the season opener for both teams before a sold-out crowd at Hagan Arena. Isaiah Miles had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds while freshman Pierfrancesco Oliva scored 12 points in his collegiate debut. The Hawks held a 77-65 lead on a three-pointer by Oliva with 2:34 to play, but Drexel outscored SJU, 13-6, to pull within 82-78 with 18 seconds remaining. The Hawks missed four free throws in the final 18 seconds and Drexel's Rashann London hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to provide the final margin. Although Saint Joseph's led, 61-51 with under nine minutes to play in the second half, Drexel cut it to 62-56. Layups by Bembry, Oliva and four straight points from James Demery maintained the Hawks' cushion and built the lead to 70-51. The teams traded baskets with Bembry scoring another and Miles dunking in an offensive rebounds, to give SJU a 74-65 edge. After a Drexel miss, Oliva connected on the three-pointer to push the Hawks' lead to 77-65. Bembry shot 11-for-15 from the foul line and 8-for-12 from the field. Miles was 5-for-9 as the Hawks connected on 53.8 percent from the field in the second half. Oliva added four rebounds, four assists and three blocked shots in his debut. The teams combined to shoot 67 free throws in the game, with Saint Joseph's going 28-39 from the line.

Game 2: November 15, 2015 - Hagan Arena Hall of Fame Tip-Off SJU 73 - Niagara 62

Saint Joseph's scored the first 14 points of the second half en route to a 73-62 win over Niagara in the first game of the Hall of Fame Tip-Off at Hagan Arena. Isaiah Miles and Aaron Brown scored 14 points apiece while DeAndre' Bembry and freshman Pierfrancesco Oliva each scored 12. Bembry, who was scoreless in the first half, netted eight straight points in the first 75 seconds of the second half to give the Hawks a 42-31 lead. Isaiah Miles tied his career-highs with 24 points and 14 rebounds and DeAndre' Bembry scored the 1,000th point of his career as Saint Joseph's defeated Buffalo, 89-67, in the Hall of Fame Tip-Off at Hagan Arena, Miles shot 7-for-11 from the field, and went 8-for-8 from the foul line, while keying a 21-0 run for the Hawks early in the first half. Sophomores Shavar Newkirk set a new career-high with 12 points as did James Demery with 13 points. Bembry scored his 1,000th point on a drive at 10:13 of the first half. The junior, who entered the game with 998 career points in 68 games, became the 52nd Hawk to reach the milestone and the 22nd to do so in his third season. Buffalo took a quick 5-2 lead at 17:18 but then the Hawks rattled off 21 consecutive points in a span of just over five minutes. Pierfrancesco Oliva started the run with a three-pointer and Miles chipped in with seven points and Demery added five as the Hawks took their biggest lead, 21-5, at 11:17. The Bulls ended their scoreless string at 11:06 on a three-pointer. The Hawks took their biggest lead of the half, 45-25, on a threepointer by Miles with 1:35 remaining, as SJU owned a 46-28 edge at halftime. Buffalo chipped away at the Hawks lead and cut it to 56-44 at 14:02. Saint Joseph's then scored eight in a row. with four from Demery, to regain the 20-point margin. The Hawks shot 47 percent in the game and committed just six turnovers.
