PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

In 21 seasons as head coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among

the top coaches in the school's storied history and has become one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 380-267. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in 20 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 185-137 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a being a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

Martelli has seen six of his former Hawks play in the NBA, with three players chosen in the NBA Draft: guard Jameer Nelson (2004), guard Delonte West (2004) and forward Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones also played in the NBA while Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Langston Galloway are the most recent, with Galloway earning All-Rookie second-team honors with the New York Knicks in 2014-15.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 15 years, and 12 times in his 20 seasons at SJU.

Martelli's commitment to the University is equal to SJU's commitment to him, as he signed a multiyear contract extension prior to the 2015-16 season.

The 2014-15 Hawks were challenged after losing three All-Conference players from the 2014 A-10 champion team, but saw the emergence of sopho-

more DeAndre' Bembry as one of the league's topplayers, as he topped the A-10 in scoring and earned All-Conference First Team honors.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for

the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run and reached the A-10 semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was

also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third Martelli player drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid to the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli

guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the title game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

LAST TIME OUT: Aaron Brown scored a career-high 26 points as Saint Joseph's weathered a furious late charge to come away with an 80-78 win at Columbia. DeAndre' Bembry tallied 12 points, all in the second half, to go with nine rebounds, eight assists, and three blocks. Isaiah Miles added 15 points as the Hawks shot a blistering 59.4 percent from the field in the second halftime to overcome a 30-28 halftime deficit. With Saint Joseph's leading 76-73 in the final minute, Bembry misfired on a three-pointer, but James Demery came down with the rebound. He was fouled, and after deadball contact between he and a Columbia player, a double technical foul was called. Miles made two free throws while Columbia hit one to give the Hawks a 78-74 lead with 42.6 seconds to play. A turnover from each side led to a layup that got Columbia within 78-76 at :25. Lamarr Kimble then sunk a pair of free throws, but a layup with :08 left put the Lions back within a possession. A Hawk turnover, one of just eight in the game, gave Columbia one more chance at :05 but the Lions' Maodo Lo missed the potential game-tying layup. The fastpaced first half saw numerous lead changes which included a stretch of 12 consecutive points by Miles but Columbia scored the last five points of the half. CU took its largest lead of the game early in the second half, 34-28. An 8-2 spurt, capped off by a three-pointer by Papa Ndao, brought the Hawks even at 36-36. Ndao, making his first appearance since March of 2014, hit three second-half three-pointers to finish with nine points. After SJU held a 48-44 edge, seven consecutive points by the Lions gave Columbia a 51-48 lead with 11 minutes to go. The Hawks responded with an 11-0 run, taking their largest lead of the game at 59-51 with 8:04 left. Columbia clawed back within 63-59 at 6:37, but a Bembry three at 3:14 restored the eight-point margin at 72-64. The teams traded baskets until the final 1:30 when a 7-2 Columbia run made it a 76-73 game with 74 seconds left, setting up the frenetic finish.

EYE ON ISAIAH: Senior **Isaiah Miles** is off to a strong start to the season, posting career-best numbers. He already tied his career-high in points (24) and rebounds (14) and has posted two double-doubles in seven games. Miles earned All-Tournament honors at the Hall of Fame Tip-Off, as he averaged 17.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in the two games while connecting on 51.7 percent (15-for-29) from the field.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: Senior Aaron Brown had a career game at Columbia, scoring 26 points on 11-for-16 shooting, while hitting 3-of-4 three-pointers. Brown, who is averaging 12.0 ppg, made the fourth start of his SJU career against Drexel and responded with 15 points on 5-for-10 shooting, and followed that with 14 vs. Niagara. Brown served primarily as the Hawks' "sixth man" last season and was the team's third leading scorer with 9.3 points per game.

TO THE POINT: Sophomore point guard **Shavar Newkirk** earned a starting role this year and has responded with career-best numbers. Against 8th-ranked Villanova Newkirk bettered his career-high with 13 points and handed out a personal-best nine assists. More impressively, he went without a turnover in 31 minutes of action. Newkirk was the hero in the win over Old Dominion as he hit the game-winning jumper with one second left. The sophomore is averaging 3.4 assists and only 1.3 turnover per game while playing 24.1 minutes per game.

THE TIME IS NDAO: Papa Ndao saw his first game action at Columbia since March 20, 2014, when the Hawks faced Connecticut in the NCAA Tournament. The senior sat out the entire 2014-15 season with a medical condition and then suffered a fractured finger during the preseason which caused him to miss the Hawks' first six games. Ndao made an impact as he connected on three three-pointers in nine minutes of action in the second half as SJU held onto the 80-78 win.

HIGH-SCORING HAWKS: SJU has scored 70-plus points in five of seven games to average 75.0 per game, and hit a high of 52 points in the second half at Columbia. That's quite a change from last year when SJU struggled to score (61.7 ppg). The 2014-15 Hawks surpassed the 70-point mark only six times in 31 games and scored less than 60 points on 11 occasions.

RACKING UP THE MILES: Senior Isaiah Miles is the team's leader in scoring (16.3), rebounding (7.0) and blocks (2.0). He tied his career-highs with 24 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Buffalo, and now has two double-doubles in seven games. Miles has credited his work with assistant coach David Duda and a weight loss of close to 20 pounds from last March for his impressive start. Phil Martelli called his effort against Buffalo a "monster game" and said, ""It's a credit to him (Miles) because he looks like a different player with the weight loss. He's a senior in practice and he's a senior in the locker room...I'm just delighted for him. It's what you want for a senior. He's a really good person and comes from a wonderful family."

BOOK ON BEMBRY: DeAndre' Bembry continues to reaffirm his status as one of the best players in the A-10. The junior opened the year with a game-high 23 points in the win over Drexel, hitting 6-of-12 from the field and tying his career-high with 11 free throws made (in 15 attempts). Bembry followed that with 12 points, six rebounds and seven assists vs. Niagara and had 10 points and a team-high five assists against Buffalo. He notched his first double-double of the year, and sixth of his career, with 15 points and 10 rebounds vs. Old Dominion. Although he is two points per game (14.1) behind Isaiah Miles in the scoring columns, he leads the team in assists (4.6), and steals (1.3) and ranks second in rebounding (6.7). Bembry came close to a double-double when he recorded 12 points, nine rebounds and eight assists at Columbia.

VIVA ITALIA: Freshman Pierfrancesco Oliva gave a glimpse of things to come with his performance against Drexel - 12 points, four rebounds, four assists and three blocks. Oliva hit a three-pointer with 2:34 to play to give the Hawks a 12-point cushion that they would need. He followed that with 12 points, eight rebounds, and five assists in the Niagara win. Oliva led the Hawks with seven rebounds against Villanova and is now averaging 5.1 boards on the season.

ON THE LINE: SJU has converted over 70 percent from the line in five of seven games, with a high of 91.7 percent in the win at Columbia. Last year, the team struggled at the foul line, converting 61.5 percent of its free throw attempts. **Isaiah Miles** and **Aaron Brown** are leading the way this year, with both hitting 85 percent to rank ninth in the A-10, while **Shavar Newkirk** is converting 80 percent.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: SJU has done a fairly good job of limiting its turnovers this year, with just seven against Villanova's defense. The Hawks followed that with only eight at Columbia. The Hawks had a season-low six vs. Buffalo and nine in the Old Dominion win. Point guard Shavar Newkirk didn't commit a turnover in 31 minutes against Villanova while handing out a career-high nine assists. SJU ranks 17th in the nation and third in the A-10 in assist/turnover ratio with 1.39.

JAMES' GAME: James Demery has certainly stepped up his play this season. He reached a new career-high with 13 points and six rebounds in the win over Buffalo and then bettered that with 17 points against Florida. Demery, who was a starter last year, has come off the bench this season in all but one game (ODU). Phil Martelli credited Demery's mentor and AAU coach Jeff McInnis (former UNC player) with the sophomore's strong play after the two spent some time together on the week-

end of Nov. 14. Demery is now averaging 10.0 points per game and shooting 51.7 percent from the field, while scoring double figures in three of seven games.

DOING IT ALL: Although **DeAndre' Bembry** is not leading the Hawks in scoring, he is still filling up the boxscore every game and ranking among the A-10's leaders. Bembry ranks 23rd in the Atlantic 10 in scoring and 11th in rebounding, but is tied for fifth in assists, tied for sixth in blocks and is fourth in minutes played.

CHARGE IT: Isaiah Miles is doing many things for the Hawks and he has taken at least one charge in five of seven games this year. The senior took two charges against Florida.

JOIN THE CLUB: DeAndre' Bembry became the 52nd Hawk player to score over 1,000 points in his Saint Joseph's career. He entered the Buffalo game with 998 points and hit the plateau with a driving layup at the 10:13 mark of the first half. He is the 22nd Hawk to achieve the milestone as a junior and now has 1,062 points in 72 games, ranking him 42nd on the list of all-time scorers. "He's going to be a Hall of Famer here and be a Big 5 Hall of Famer down the line, but it's not going to be because of his points. It's going to be because of his game. He's a basketball player," said coach Phil Martelli. "At halftime, he told me his man (Jarryn Skeete) didn't have any points. We've had other guys here get to that number (1,000) because they wanted to get to that number. With him, he wanted to get to 3-0."

FROM THE START: Pierfrancesco Oliva became the third freshman in three years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bembry** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks in 2014-15 while **James Demery** was in the starting lineup last season.

FEAR THE 'FRO: All-Conference performer **DeAndre' Bembry** is on numerous preseason lists that recognize him as one of the top players in the nation. He was the leading scorer in the Atlantic 10 last season with his 17.7 average and led the Hawks in practically every statistical category, including rebounding (7.7), assists (3.6), steals (1.9) and an NCAAleading 38.6 minutes per game. The 6-6 junior also topped the league in scoring in A-10 games with his 19.0 average. Bembry became the first SJU player ever to win the conference's scoring title.

BALANCED ATTACK: Saint Joseph's had four players score double figures in each of the first three games. It was the same foursome - DeAndre' Bembry, Isaiah Miles, Aaron Brown and Pierfrancesco Oliva - in the first two games, while Bembry, Miles, James Demery and Shavar Newkirk hit double digits against Buffalo. The Hawks saw five players reach double figures vs. Villanova - Bembry, Miles, Demery, Newkirk and Brown - which was the first time that happened since the NCAA Tournament against Connecticut in March, 2014.

BLOCK PARTY: Saint Joseph's leads he A-10 in blocked shots with 5.6 per game. **Isaiah Miles** tops the team with 14 while **DeAndre' Bembry** and **Pierfrancesco Oliva** each have 11 blocks.

IN FINE COMPANY: Phil Martelli is in an exclusive club of current coaches who have been at one school for 20 seasons. There are eight other Division I coaches in the group who have coached at least two decades: Jim Boeheim (Syracuse), Mike Krzyzewski (Duke), Tom Izzo (Michigan State), Greg Kampe (Oakland), Rick Byrd (Belmont), Bob McKillop (Davidson), Dave Loos (Austin Peay) and Fran O'Hanlon (Lafayette).

BEMBRY AND THE BIG 5: DeAndre' Bembry was named the Big 5 Co-Player of the Week for Nov. 15. He averaged 17.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists in the Hawks' first two wins.

THE POINT FORWARD: Phil Martelli has compared freshman **Pierfrancesco Oliva's** passing ability to that of 2014 All-A-10 honoree Halil Kanacevic. The 6-8 Oliva is averaging 2.4 assists per game. Kanacevic, also a 6-8 forward, averaged a team-high 4.4 assists for the 2014 A-10 Champions.

IRON MAN: DeAndre' Bembry led the nation in minutes played with 38.6 per game, while seeing 40 minutes or more of action in 14 games last season. The Hawks have more depth this season so Bembry is averaging just 36.6 minutes with one game in which he played all 40 minutes.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: First-year players joining the Hawks this season are: Chris Clover (St. Joseph's Prep) and Lamarr Kimble (Neumann-Goretti) - as well as Italian import Pierfrancesco Oliva (Bergen Catholic). Clover, a 6-3 guard, was the Most Valuable Player of the Philadelphia Catholic League, averaging 20.7 points to rank fifth in the city in scoring. Kimble, a 6-0 point guard, was an All-Catholic League First Team honoree after averaging 14.5 points and helping Neumann-Goretti to its second straight PIAA Class AAA championship. Oliva, a 6-8 forward from Taranto, Italy, earned All-State Third Team honors at Bergen Catholic in New Jersey while scoring 15.9 ppg. Christian Vega, a 6-0 sophomore guard, made the team as a walk-on and will dress only for home games.

LOTS OF FLAPPING: The Hawk mascot celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2015-16. Originated by Jim Brennan, the Hawk made its debut on Jan. 4, 1956 at the Saint Joseph's-La Salle game at the Palestra. Junior Timmy Parks is the 37th student to serve as the mascot this year.

ON THE SIDELINES: Senior **Skylar Scrivano** has yet to get on the court for the Hawks. The 6-10 forward came to SJU last year from Rider and sat out 2014-15 due to the transfer rule, but suffered an achilles injury in the summer which has caused him to be sidelined indefinitely.

GAINING NOTICE: DeAndre' Bembry has certainly gained the attention of the NBA with his play the past two years and his performance at the Nike Basketball Academy during the summer. A total of 25 NBA teams attended SJU practices during the preseason while numerous scouts are expected at Hawk games this year. He's also received a number of preseason accolades and is on the "watch lists" for the John R. Wooden Award, the Naismith Trophy, the Julius Erving Small Forward Award and the Lute Olson National Player of the Year Award.

DEAN OF COACHES: Phil Martelli is the dean of A-10 coaches in his 21st season as the head coach of the Hawks with a 380-266 career record. He owns a 185-137 record in Atlantic 10 play for the most conference wins of any active coach, and the second most all-time.

HAWK CAPTAIN: Junior DeAndre' Bembry was voted team captain by his teammates. Bembry is serving as captain for the second year in a row. Last season, he was the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in Phil Martelli's 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

SIGN HIM UP: It was announced on October 29, 2015 that head coach **Phil Martelli** and Saint Joseph's had agreed to a multi-year contract extension. Martelli has guided the Hawks to 12 posteason appearances and two Atlantic 10 titles.

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish seventh in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. Last season the Hawks went 7-11 and finished 10th in the A-10.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the seventh season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 56-29 record in the six seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 375-111 overall record in 65 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 10-4 on its home court during the 2014-15 season and is 3-0 this year.

HAWKS IN WAITING: Phil Martelli announced that Charles Brown and Gerald Blount had signed National Letters of Intent during the early sig-

Blount is a 6-foot-7 forward from the Pomfret School in Connecticut, who averaged 11.3 points, 9.2 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 blocks per game last season. He earned All-New England Class B Honorable Mention recognition in 2015 in his first season there and also played football for Pomfret. Brown, a 6-6 wing from Philadelphia, is currently attending St. Thomas More in Connecticut. He previously played at George Washington High School in Philadelphia and in 2014-15, was named the MVP of the Public League's B Division as he scored a division-leading 18.4 points per game.

NBA HAWKS: Langston Galloway, a member of SJU's 2014 A-10 Championship team, is currently starring for the New York Knicks. Galloway, who was undrafted, worked his way through the NBA D League and earned a spot on the Knicks in January 2015. His play gained him recognition on the 2014-15 All-Rookie Second Team. Jameer Nelson, the 2004 Consensus National Player of the Year, is in his 12th season in the NBA playing for the Denver Nuggets.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2015-16.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Timmy Parks becomes the 37th student to wear the wings in 2015-16. He is a junior accounting major from Wilmington, Del.

GAME RECAPS

Niagara 0-2

Game 1: November 13, 2015 - Hagan Arena SJU 82 - Drexel 81

DeAndre' Bembry scored 23 points and Aaron Brown added 15 points as Saint Joseph's defeated Drexel, 82-81, in the season opener for both teams before a sold-out crowd at Hagan Arena. Isaiah Miles had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds while freshman Pierfrancesco Oliva scored 12 points in his collegiate debut. The Hawks held a 77-65 lead on a three-pointer by Oliva with 2:34 to play, but Drexel outscored SJU, 13-6, to pull within 82-78 with 18 seconds remaining. Aaron Brown scored a career-high 26 points as Saint Joseph's weathered a furious late charge to come away with an 80-78 win at Columbia. DeAndre' Bembry tallied 12 points, all in the second half, to go with nine rebounds, eight assists, and three blocks. Isaiah Miles added 15 points as the Hawks shot a blistering 59.4 percent from the field in the second halftime to overcome a 30-28 halftime deficit. With Saint Joseph's leading 76-73 in the final minute, Bembry misfired on a threepointer, but James Demery came down with the rebound. He was fouled, and after deadball contact between he and a Columbia player, a double technical foul was called. Miles made two free throws while Columbia hit one to give the Hawks a 78-74 lead with 42.6 seconds to play. A turnover from each side led to a layup that got Columbia within 78-76 at :25. Lamarr Kimble then sunk a pair of free throws, but a layup with :08 left put the Lions back within a possession. A Hawk turnover, one of just eight in the game, gave Columbia one more chance at :05 but the Lions' Maodo Lo missed the potential game-tying layup. The fast-paced first half saw numerous lead changes which included a stretch of 12 consecutive points by Miles but Columbia scored the last five points of the half. CU took its largest lead of the game early in the second half, 34-28. An 8-2 spurt, capped off by a three-pointer by Papa Ndao, brought the Hawks even at 36-36. Ndao, making his first appearance since March of 2014, hit three second-half three-pointers to finish with nine points. After SJU held a 48-44 edge, seven consecutive points by the Lions gave Columbia a 51-48 lead with 11 minutes to go. The Hawks responded with an 11-0 run, taking their largest lead of the game at 59-51 with 8:04 left. Columbia clawed back within 63-59 at 6:37, but a Bembry three at 3:14 restored the eight-point margin at 72-64. The teams traded baskets until the final 1:30 when a 7-2 Columbia run made it a 76-73 game with 74 seconds left, setting up the frenetic finish.
