### PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

The 2014-15 season marks the 20th for **Phil Martelli** as head coach at Saint Joseph's. During his time with the Hawks he has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season partici-

pant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and becoming one of the more respected coaches in the game. The 2014-15 season will be his 30th year overall at SJU, which includes 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 372-259. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in the past 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 182-132 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after

losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. SJU boasted a young and exciting squad and five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in

the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 14 years, and 12 times in his 19 seasons at SJU.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching

in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid in the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career.

SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

LAST TIME OUT: DeAndre' Bembry had 14 points and 11 rebounds, and Aaron Brown added 11 points, as Saint Joseph's held off George Mason, 58-54, at Hagan Arena. The Hawks led from the start and owned a brief 10-point lead in the second half, but couldn't put George Mason away until the final minute. After Chris Wilson hit a pair of free throws to increase the Hawks' lead to 54-48 with 26 seconds to play, George Mason answered back with a three-pointer at 12.8 seconds to cut it to 54-51. Wilson then threw a length of the court pass to a streaking Bembry, who made the layup and converted the three-point play with 11.7 seconds left. GMU hit another three at :53 seconds, but Wilson hit one more free throw at 4.9 seconds to play to seal the win for the Hawks. Saint Joseph's led from the start in the first half, and after George Mason forced a 13-13 tie at 11;23, the Hawks went on an 11-3 run to take their biggest lead, 24-15, at 7:07. The Patriots closed to, 27-23, but Jai Williams and Bembry each hit a pair of free throws to build the 31-24 halftime lead. With 13 minutes to play in the second half, GMU trailed, 39-30, but went on a 9-2 run, to cut its deficit to 41-39. Saint Joseph's then scored the next eight points, with consecutive fast break layups by Bembry and Wilson and four straight points from Brown to take their biggest lead of the game, 49-39 at 6:16. George Mason ended the scoreless streak at 5:58 and the Patriots eventually closed to 50-48 and stayed within four points of the Hawks until Wilson's free throws at :26.

**LEADER OF THE PACK: DeAndre' Bembry** leads the Hawks in scoring (17.7), rebounding (7.5) and assists (3.1), as well as steals (2.0) and minutes played (38.1). He has scored double figures in 19 consecutive games with three straight double-doubles. Bembry reached a new career-high with 27 points at St. Bonaventure, which included a career-best six three-pointers. He followed that with 25 points, eight rebounds, seven assists, three blocks and a career-high five steals in the win over Massachusetts, scored 25 points vs. Penn and had 20 at La Salle. Bembry had one of his finest games in the win over Davidson with 20 points, 17 rebounds, and seven assists, with just one turnover in 39 minutes.

**SUPER SOPH: DeAndre' Bembry** averaged 20.5 points, 12.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 3.0 steals to earn Big 5 Player of the Week and National Jesuit Player of the Week honors for Feb. 2. It was his second straight Big 5 honor. The sophomore had 21 points, a career-high 17 rebounds and seven assists in the Hawks' 75-70 win over Davidson. He shot 53.6 percent from the field on the week and converted 54.5 percent from three-point range. He also had 20 points and seven rebounds and tied his career-high with five steals in a loss at La Salle. After his performance vs. Davidson, **Phil Martelli** said, "People say he's a horse and we're riding him. He's a pack of horses, or whatever they call it — a herd. He's the whole herd... The season he's turning in is really going to end up in the annals here, not just at Saint Joseph's, but in Philadelphia.

**LINEUP CHANGE: Phil Martelli** altered the starting lineup for the first time this year against Davidson and it produced results. **Aaron Brown** replaced **James Demery** in the starting lineup and responded with a career-high 20 points on 7-for-13 shooting. The junior also connected on a pair of free throws with 20 seconds left to help seal the win. Demery came off the bench to post 10 points and five rebounds. He hit two free throws in the last 43 seconds as Davidson was closing in and grabbed the rebound on the Wildcats' last chance. The Hawks used the same starters at Saint Louis and Brown bettered his career-high with 21 points in the overtime loss. **Phil Martelli** said that the matchup with the opponent will dictate whether Brown or Demery starts - he went back with Demery for the George Mason game.

MR. EVERYTHING: On DeAndre' Bembry leading the Hawks in practically every category, Phil Martelli said, "We were asked if he's doing too

much. He better do too much." After Bembry's effort in the UMass win, Martelli said, ""If DeAndre' was on a team that had 13 to 14 wins, you'd be talking about him as an All-America candidate. This is phenomenal . . . I told him that the best player in the league wins this game. And if you have to do it, you have to do it. He leads our team in scoring, rebounding, three-point percentage . . . We're walking out of a league game and he has 25 (points), 8 (rebounds), 7 (assists), and 5 (steals). There are not a lot of guys that have played in this uniform that have those kinds of numbers in a game, let alone in a league game."

**700 CLUB: DeAndre' Bembry** has already scored 802 points in his career. That's an average of 14.3 points per game.

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU: Aaron Brown scored 41 points in two games as a starter, recording career-highs in both. The junior made the first start of his career against Davidson and scored a personal best 20 points in a season-best 33 minutes of action. He then bettered that career-high in the next game, scoring 21 points in 39 minutes in the overtime loss at Saint Louis. He came off the bench in the George Mason win, scoring 11 points. Brown has posted double figures 12 times this year and is the team's third leading scorer with 10.4 ppg.

**CALLING ON CHRIS:** On the day before the Fordham game, **Phil Martelli** held a meeting with **Chris Wilson** and told the senior of his expectations and said, "If we're going to turn this around, it starts with you". Wilson responded with his best game of the season and one of the best of his career. He scored a career-high 23 points, while shooting 6-for-10 from the field and 5-of-9 from three-point range. Wilson scored 11 of the Hawks' 25 first-half points and also went 6-for-6 from the foul line. The senior, who is averaging 7.4 points and 4.3 rebounds in A-10 play, had a career-high 10 rebounds vs. Penn. Wilson handed out a season-high seven assists at La Salle.

**FEAR THE 'FRO: DeAndre' Bembry** has put up impressive all-around numbers as of late, particularly in the last seven games. Since his careerhigh 27-point effort at St. Bonaventure, Bembry is averaging 21.6 points, 9.0 rebounds. 3.4 assists and 2.2 steals per game.

**BALANCING ACT:** The Hawks turned in a balanced scoring effort vs. George Mason with eight of nine players reaching the scoring column.

**FREE THROW WOES:** Saint Joseph's has struggled at the foul line all season (62.0 percent), and they recorded one of the lowest totals of the season with the 16-of-31 effort in the win over George Mason. Fortunately for the Hawks, **Chris Wilson** made 3-of-4 in the final 29 seconds to help seal the win.

RACKING UP THE MILES: Isaiah Miles has put up double figures in 11 games this year, while bettering his career-high in points three times. After establishing a new personal best with 20 points against Temple, he eclipsed it with 23 points in the win over Marist. And in the next game at Denver, Miles scored 24 points on 8-for-11 shooting while making 4-of-6 three pointers. Against Marist, the junior made 7-of-9 shots in the first half to score 17 points by halftime. He finished the game going 9-for-14 from the field and a career-best 4-for-7 from three-point range. To go along with his 20 points against Temple, he also grabbed nine rebounds and handed out a career-high four assists. In the opener against FDU, Miles made the first start of his career and posted his first-ever double-double with 12 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. He is the team's third leading scorer with 10.2 points per game.

**BEST OF BEMBRY: DeAndre' Bembry** is leading the Hawks and putting up the numbers worthy of national recognition. The sophomore is now averaging team-highs of 17.7 points and 7.5 rebounds. He leads the Atlantic 10 in scoring in both overall and conference games (19.5); ranks seventh in rebounding overall (7.5) and seventh in A-10 games (8.6). He also ranks 62nd in the nation in scoring. Here's a glance of some of his top games this season:

**CONFERENCE CALL: DeAndre' Bembry** leads the A-10 with his scoring average of 19.5 points per game in conference contests. **Aaron Brown** is second on the team in A-10 scoring with 11.8 ppg.

A SELECT GROUP: DeAndre' Bembry is one of three players in the nation who lead their teams in points, rebounds, assists, and either steals or blocks. The list is as follows:

- DeAndre' Bembry, Saint Joseph's- 17.7 ppg; 7.5 rpg; 68 asts, 44 steals
- Karl Cochran, Wofford 14.8 ppg; 5.8 rpg; 22 blocks, 71 assists, 50 steals

**BAUMANN'S BLOCKS: Javon Baumann** recorded a career-high five blocked shots against Penn and then followed that with the same number at La Salle. He has totaled 16 blocks in the past five games and owns a team-high 29 on the season, as the Hawks rank third in the A-10 and 48th nationally with 4.7 blocks per game.

JAMES' GAME: Freshman James Demery recorded the first double-figure game of his career as he posted 12 points on 4-for-9 shooting at Drexel. He scored double figures in back-to-back games, with 10 points at Duquesne and 11 at VCU. Demery also grabbed a career-high seven rebounds at St. Bonaventure. After starting 19 games, the freshman came off the bench against Davidson and responded with 10 points and five rebounds. He was back in the starting lineup against George Mason.

**IN GOOD COMPANY: DeAndre' Bembry's** scoring average of 17.7 already ranks as one of the best season averages in the last 12 years of SJU basketball. Here's the list of the top seven:

win over George Mason. Early in the season, Williams had to sit out five games after losing two teeth in the Drexel game as he caught an elbow on a dunk. He had oral surgery the next day and has played in 10 games after returning to action at Villanova.

**ON BOARD:** The Hawks have been one of the better teams in the A-10 on the glass in league games this year, but that number took a hit against George Mason when they were outrebounded, 36-28. It was the lowest number of rebounds for SJU since the Nov. 19 loss at Gonzaga (26).

**CLOSE CALLS:** Sixteen of the Hawks' 22 games have been decided by 10 points or less while Saint Joseph's is 5-6 in games that have winning margins of five points or less.

**RALLY CAPS:** Saint Joseph's rallied from a 13-point deficit at halftime against Davidson to earn the 75-70 win. It marked the largest deficit overcome this season. The Hawks scored the first 11 points of the second half, which was the first part of a 20-3 run that allowed them to take a 48-44 lead with over 12 minutes to play.

**DEE-FENSE:** Davidson came into Hagan Arena averaging 81.9 points per game and the Hawk defense held them to just 70 points. It was the Wildcats' third lowest point total of the season.

**GOING 70:** The 75 points scored against Davidson was just the fifth time this year that the Hawks eclipsed the 70-point mark.

**LOSING IT:** The Saint Louis game marked the fourth time that Saint Joseph's lost a game in which it held leads in the first half and at half-time, with all four losses coming on the road. Here's the rundown:

**LONG TIME COMING:** The win over Fordham snapped a four-game losing streak for the Hawks. SJU went 26 days in between wins - the previous one was December 20 against Marist.

**50-50:** The loss to La Salle was the third time this year that SJU did not reach the 50-point mark.

**FOUR TO SCORE:** The Hawks had four players score double figures vs. Davidson, marking just the fourth time this season that's happened.

**ON TARGET:** The Hawks had their best shooting half of the season against UMass, when they converted 12-for-20 from the field (60 percent). SJU made 11-for-14 two-point attempts in the half, something which should have pleased **Phil Martelli**. With a poor overall three-point shooting percentage (28.7), Martelli has stressed that the Hawks need to improve their two-point percentage.

**DOUBLE VISION: DeAndre' Bembry** has scored double figures in 19 consecutive games, which is the longest streak of his career. He has only been held to single digits in two games - the FDU and Gonzaga losses.

**FILLING THE BOXSCORE: DeAndre' Bembry** has had a number of games with very complete stat lines this season. One line that stood out was from the win over UMass when he had 25 points, eight rebounds, seven assists, three blocks and five steals.

MAKING THEM COUNT: The Hawks have struggled from the foul line for most of the year (62.0), but have shot somewhat better later in the game, hitting 67.5 percent from the line in the final five minutes (regulation only). That late-game percentage took a hit versus George Mason, however, as the Hawks were only 6-for-13 in the final five minutes; they were 16-for-31 in the game. Isaiah Miles is the top Hawk from the line, converting 76.2 percent overall, followed by Aaron Brown at 73.9 percent.

**IRON MAN:** DeAndre' Bembry leads the Atlantic 10 and is ranked sixth in the nation in minutes played per game, with an average of 38.1. He's played 839 minutes out of a possible 895 this season. Bembry has played all 40 minutes in five games, and seen 133 minutes of a possible 135 in the three overtime games.

**HANDOUTS:** Shavar Newkirk is third on the team in assists with 2.7 per game. The freshman has come off the bench in all 21 contests, and had a high of six assists in the loss at Duquesne.

"I think he's good at everything. I think he's a really high-major player and a definite NBA player. The way he goes about how he plays is tremendous. I think he's great. He might be the best player in our conference as a sophomore." - Richmond Head Coach Chris Mooney

**OUT ON THE PERIMETER:** Saint Joseph's took a season-high 29 three-point attempts at Duquesne, but only connected on seven of them (24.1 percent). At St. Bonaventure, SJU made a season-high nine three-pointers (in 21 attempts). SJU is shooting just 28.7 percent from beyond the arc this season, and 32.1 percent in A-10 games. The Hawks are averaging 16.7 attempts per game and 5.0 three-point field goals made.

ACHIEVING A DREAM: Former Hawk standout Langston Galloway has become the 18th player in SJU history to play in the NBA. The 2014 SJU graduate was given a 10-day contract by the New York Knicks on Jan. 7 and made his debut that night against the Washington Wizards. Galloway played 17 minutes at point guard and posted seven points and three assists without a turnover. In the first start of his career on Jan. 19, he scored 21 points to help the Knicks end their 16-game losing streak. He recently signed a contract with the Knicks for the rest of this season, and will have a partial guarantee for next year. Galloway had been the leading scorer (16.5) for the West Chester Knicks of the NBA D-League before being called up by the Knicks.

**HANDS OFF:** The Hawks have done a good job limiting their personal fouls in the past few years, and last season, ranked among the nation's leaders with 16.0 per game. They are doing the same this season, committing just 16.6 per game to rank 41st in the nation. SJU has had only 12 disqualifications this year.

**DEE-FENSE:** Saint Joseph's is allowing 61.7 points per game, which ranks sixth in the Atlantic 10. If you take out the three losses to ranked teams - Gonzaga, Villanova, VCU - the Hawks' scoring defense average would be 57.8 points per game.

**THREE'S A CROWD: DeAndre' Bembry** leads the Hawks in three-point field goals with 40 on the season, followed by **Isaiah Miles** with 32 and **Chris Wilson** with 22. Despite struggling from three-point range for most of the year, the Hawks had their best effort of the year at VCU when they converted 45.5 percent (5-for-11), while at Denver, SJU went 6-for-17. The Hawks have shot 40 percent or better from three-point range in just four games, with the most recent being a 40 percent effort at Saint Louis.

**BOOST FROM BRENDAN:** Sophomore walk-on **Brendan Casper** has earned a spot in the rotation, bringing an energy to the Hawks. He made his mark with his play in the loss to #10 Villanova as he registered new career-highs with nine points and nine rebounds in a personal best 20 minutes. His previous high for minutes played was seven. He followed that with six points and six rebounds against Loyola Maryland and has seen action in six of the last seven games. He has played 96 minutes in 17 games - last year he played just 15 minutes all season.

**BOOK ON BAUMANN: Javon Baumann** has started every game this year. The sophomore scored a career-high 11 points in the Western Kentucky game, converting 5-of-6 from the field. He currently leads the team in blocked shots with 29, while recording a career-high five each in games with Penn and La Salle.

**WEEKLY HONORS: DeAndre' Bembry** was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week and the Big 5 Player of the Week for Jan. 26. The sophomore averaged 25.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists, 3.0 blocks and 2.0 steals in the Hawks' 1-1 week. He filled up the boxscore in the win over UMass, posting 25 points, eight rebounds, seven assists, three blocks and a career-high five steals, and followed that with 25 points against Penn. It was the first A-10 Player of the Week honor of Bembry's career, but last year he was chosen the Rookie of the Week twice.

**DOWN TO THE WIRE:** All but six games have been decided in the final minutes, while the winning margin in 15 of the 21 games (except for Gonzaga, Villanova, Loyola, Marist, VCU, Fordham) is a combined total of 66 points, an average of 4.4 points per game. Here's the recap:

- Denver (L ot): Hawks lose late lead and Denver sends game into overtime with :42 to play. DU leads the entire extra period to earn the win
- GW (L): Hawks rally from 20 points down to close to within four at :12
- Duquesne (L): Hawks score 12 of the game's final 14 points and have an attempt at the tying shot as time expires
- Fordham (W): Leading by only two points with three minutes to play, the Hawks close out the game with a 15-6 run
- St. Bonaventure (L): Hawks trail by three with over three minutes to play, but SBU closes out the game going 10-for-10 from the foul line
- Massachusetts (W): Leading 50-49 with 4:45 to go, Hawks score nine consecutive points to build the lead and earn the win
- Penn (L): Trailing the entire second half, SJU cuts its deficit to 51-49 with 34 seconds left but Penn hits 5-of-6 free throws to seal the win
- La Salle (L): Hawks lead by one with three minutes to go but La Salle takes the lead with 1:12 to play. SJU cuts it to two with 28 seconds, but can't convert and the Explorers ice the game from the foul line
- Davidson (W): Davidson cuts SJU lead to two with :21 to play, but Hawks make 3-of-5 free throws and grab two rebounds on Davidson misses
- Saint Louis (L ot): DeAndre' Bembry scores with 5.4 seconds left and takes a charge to force overtime; SLU outscores the Hawks, 11-4 in the extra period
- George Mason (W): DeAndre' Bembry converts a three-point play at 11.9 seconds and Chris Wilson hits a free throw at 4.7 to seal the win.

**SHAVAR'S SEASON-HIGH:** Freshman **Shavar Newkirk** scored a season-high nine points in the win at Marist and then handed out a personal best six assists at Duquesne.

**BREATHING ROOM:** The Hawks posted their largest winning margin of the season (26 points) against Loyola Maryland. They followed that with a 17-point win over Marist. In both games, SJU held a 26-point lead during the game, which is the largest lead of the season.

TOO LATE: The Hawks put together late-game rallies in two consecutive contests (GW, Duquesne), but both fell short. Trailing by 20 points with 6:54 to play against George Washington, the Hawks closed to within four points with 12 seconds to play. The Hawks held GW without a field goal for the final 6:54, while scoring 24 points in the last 5:44 of the game. GW went 11-for-19 from the foul line to help seal the win. At Duquesne, SJU trailed by 12 points in the second half and eventually scored 12 of the game's final 14 points to pull within three. The Hawks had the ball for the game's last possession, but their last shot was partially blocked.

**WORKING OVERTIME:** Saint Joseph's is 2-1 in overtime games this season, with the most recent being the loss at Saint Louis on Feb. 3. The Hawks lost to Denver and defeated LIU Brooklyn in the NIT.

**BAND OF THIEVES:** Saint Joseph's had 13 steals against Vermont, which was the highest number of steals since it posted 15 steals in a loss at Minnesota on Dec. 12, 2009. **Javon Baumann** led the way against Vermont with a career-high four steals. **Isaiah Miles, DeAndre' Bembry** and **Shavar Newkirk** recorded three apiece as SJU forced Vermont into committing 18 turnovers.

**THAT CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON:** Saint Joseph's is the defending Atlantic 10 champion, having won the program's third title in 2014, which was its first since 1997. The Hawks went 24-10 and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, where they lost in overtime to eventual national champion Connecticut.

**A-10 LEGEND:** SJU great Rodney Blake '88 has been named to the Atlantic 10 Legends Class of 2015, and will be honored on March 14 prior to the league semifinals in Brooklyn. He is the school's all-time leader with 419 career blocks, a number which still ranks among the top 20 totals in NCAA history. A three-time selection to the All-Atlantic 10 First Team, Blake was an Honorable Mention All-America by *The Sporting News*. He averaged double figures for three seasons and scored 1,679 career points to rank 13th on SJU's all-time list, while ranking 17th with 818 rebounds. Blake recorded a school-record 121 blocks as a sophomore while helping the Hawks capture the 1986 Atlantic 10 Championship.

**PLATINUM PHIL:** This is **Phil Martelli's** 20th season as Saint Joseph's head coach, and his 30th overall at the University after 10 years as an assistant. He is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 372-259 record and is the longest tenured current coach in the Atlantic 10. Martelli owns a 182-132 record in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

**HONORING A LEGEND:** Saint Joseph's is wearing a "JR" patch on its uniforms this season to honor Hall of Fame coach Dr. Jack Ramsay, who passed away in April. "Dr. Jack" compiled a 234-72 record and guided the Hawks to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and nine consecutive postseason bids from 1955-66. He went on to amass 864 wins in the NBA and helped the Philadelphia 76ers to the 1967 championship as general manager and coached the Portland Trailblazers to the 1977 NBA title. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992.

**FROM THE START: James Demery** became the second freshman in two years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bembry** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks last season.

**NO SOPHOMORE JINX: DeAndre' Bembry** made a tremendous impact in his freshman year and he has fulfilled the expectations for this season. Bembry was voted onto the Preseason Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team and is the only sophomore to earn that distinction. The 6-6 wing player averaged 12.1 points last season and shot 45.8 percent from the field en route to being named the Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year.

**RARING TO GO:** Junior **Aaron Brown** made his Saint Joseph's debut this year after sitting out last season due to the transfer rule. The 6-5 guard transferred to SJU from West Virginia, where he played two years for the Mountaineers. Brown, from Darby, Pa., starred locally at Penn Wood High School, where he was an All-State selection and the Player of the Year by the *Delaware County Daily Times*. He averaged 20 points per game as a senior and helped his team to the state title.

**WILLIAMS' WAIT:** Redshirt freshman **Jai Williams** made his debut this year after sitting out last year to develop his game. Williams, a 6-9 forward from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, has lost close to 45 pounds since arriving at SJU in the fall of 2013, and is now down to 257 pounds.

**SIDELINED SENIOR: Papa Ndao** is sitting out this season due to undisclosed medical reasons. Ndao, originally from Dakar, Senegal, is one of three seniors on SJU's squad this year. He played in 31 games in 2013-14 for the A-10 champion Hawks, while making two starts. He has played in a total of 85 career game in three years for the Hawks, and is on track to graduate from Saint Joseph's in May with his degree in interdisciplinary health studies.

**CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP:** Senior **Chris Wilson** and sophomore **DeAndre' Bembry** were voted co-captains by their teammates. Bembry becomes the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in **Phil Martelli's** 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

**SIGN THEM UP:** Saint Joseph's signed two Philadelphia standouts in the early signing period in November - Chris Clover and Lamarr Kimble. Clover, a 6-4 guard from St. Joseph's Prep, scored 21.9 points per game as a junior and was an All-City First Team selection. Kimble is a 6-0 guard from Neumann-Goretti, who averaged 13.0 points last season while helping his team to its sixth consecutive Catholic League title.

**WELCOME TO HAWK HILL:** Newcomers on the squad this year are **James Demery, Shavar Newkirk** and **Obi Romeo**. Demery is a 6-6 wing from Northside Christian Academy (N.C.); Newkirk is a 5-11 point guard from Cardinal Hayes (N.Y.); and Romeo is a 6-10 forward from Greenbrier East (W. Va.). **Markell Lodge**, a 6-7 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.)., will be sitting out this season to concentrate on academics. Also new to the program are walk-ons **Mike Booth** and **Kyle Thompson**. Booth, the grandson of former SJU head and assistant coach Harry Booth, averaged 18.0 points at Bishop Shanahan High School. Thompson was an All-Catholic League selection at St. Joseph's Prep.

CAROLINA ON MY MIND: The Hawks' roster features three players in the starting lineup from the state of North Carolina - Chris Wilson (Fayetteville), DeAndre' Bembry (Charlotte) and James Demery (Williamston). Markell Lodge (Washington) is the fourth player but he is sitting out this season to concentrate on academics.

**WAITING IN THE WINGS:** Newcomer **Skylar Scrivano** is sitting out this season due to the transfer rule. A 6-10 forward from Doylestown, Pa., Scrivano transferred to Saint Joseph's from Rider University. He started his career at Columbia University, where he played the 2012-13 season.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** This marks the sixth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 50-25 record in the six seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 369-107 overall record in 64 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU owns a 7-2 home record this year, counting one "home" game at The Palestra.

**NEW LOOK:** Hagan Arena has a new look this season with the addition of a new LED centerhung video display system, which was supported by alumnus Mike Hagan '85. These displays will light up the arena with their ability to highlight live video and instant replays. They can show one large image or can be divided into separate windows to show a variety of vivid graphics, colorful animations, up-to-the-minute statistics, scoring information and sponsor advertisements.

HAWKS IN THE PROS: Three key members of last year's championship team - Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr. - are playing professionally. Galloway started out in the NBA D League and has now earned a contract with the New York Knicks. Roberts played for the Delaware 87ers and had a brief two-day call-up by the Philadelphia 76ers on Dec. 12, but then returned to Delaware. He was traded to the Santa Cruz Warriors, but has since signed to play with San Miguel Beermen of the Phillipines Basketball Association. Kanacevic is currently playing in Slovenia.

**CRADLE OF COACHES:** The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his final year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. **PRESEASON PICK:** Saint Joseph's was picked to finish eighth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks went 11-5 in the conference last season to finish in a tie for third place, but captured the Atlantic 10 Championship, the third in school history.

**HOLES TO FILL:** Graduation hit the Hawks hard as Saint Joseph's lost three senior starters from last year's 24-10 team. The trio of Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Halil Kanacevic combined for 1,429 points, 681 rebounds, and 243 assists in last season alone. Those three were also 1,000-point scorers in their college careers and were Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers.

**HELPING OUT: Kyle Molock** had career-ending knee surgery in February, 2014, and will serve as a student assistant this year. Molock came to SJU in August 2012, but injured the ACL of his right knee in preseason workouts. That was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career at Dublin Coffman High School in Ohio. Molock is a junior accounting major.

**KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: Phil Martelli's** staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 16th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** Saint Joseph's goes on the road for two consecutive contests, meeting Fordham for the second time this season on February 15, and heading to Dayton on February 18. The Hawks' next home game is the second meeting of the year with St. Bonaventure on February 21.

### THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 58 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

**Brian Lafferty** becomes the 36th student to wear the wings in 2014-15. He is a senior criminal justice major from Springfield, Pa.

### ON THE AIR

**TV:** Saint Joseph's will again have a strong presence on television in 2014-15, with a total of 28 games scheduled for coverage either on television or digital networks. The Hawks will appear on national tv 13 times. (Complete schedule on page 2)

RADIO: The audio broadcasts of Hawks' games will be carried by either WNTP 990 AM or WFIL 560 AM for the remainder of the season with the Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of Matt Martucci and Joe Lunardi providing the play-by-play and color commentary. Martucci, a 2006 Syracuse University graduate, is in his sixth year as full-time play-by-play announcer. Lunardi, in his 25th year on the Hawks' radio broadcasts, is the associate vice president for marketing at Saint Joseph's, and is a college basketball analyst for ESPN.com with his popular "Bracketology" column. Games can also be heard via audio streaming free of charge on www.SJUHawks.com. WNTP 990 AM will also be the home of Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" radio show, which will air on Monday evenings at 7 p.m. from Landmark Americana on 54th St. from January 5 through March 9. The show will run for 10 consecutive weeks. (Radio schedule on pg. 2)

**VIDEO STREAMING:** This season, live video broadcasts of many SJU games will be broadcast through the Atlantic 10 Digital Network. (See schedule on pg. 2)

**INTERNET:** Information for Saint Joseph's basketball is found at SJU's athletics website, **www.SJUHawks.com** with statistics, updated game notes, and live ingame statistics for all Hawk home games, and selected road games. Through Hawks All-Access, fans can follow every home game through audio streaming as well as video streaming for non-televised games. All road games are covered with audio streaming while video streaming also available for selected ones. Video features on the team will also be available on the site.

### **GAME RECAPS**

The Hawks suffered just their second loss in 10 season openers as FDU hit a three-pointer with 3.3 seconds to play to gain the 58-57 win. The Hawks had taken a 57-53 lead with 1:13 remaining after back-to-back three-pointers from **DeAndre' Bembry** and **Chris Wilson**. FDU answered with a layup with 50 seconds to play and then rebounded a Hawks' miss on the next possession. FDU inbounded with :09 to play after a Saint Joseph's foul and Mustaafa Jones, a Philadelphia native, hit the gamewinner from the right side. Isaiah Miles made the first start of his career and had his first career double-double with 12 points and a personal best 14 rebounds. Wilson added 12 points as the only other Hawk in double figures. Aaron Brown scored nine points in his SJU debut while Javon Baumann grabbed a career-high eight rebounds. FDU held a 28-25 lead at halftime and by as much as 34-28 two minutes into the second half. The opened play in the 2014 NIT Season Tip-Off with a 94-42 defeat at 13th-ranked Gonzaga at the McCarthey Athletic Center. Junior Aaron Brown led the Hawks with a season-high 14 points. Gonzaga scored the first eight points of the game and made its first eight field goal attempts and held the Hawks to 2-of-10 from the floor en route to a 16-2 advantage at the 15:02 mark. After a three-pointer by Chris Wilson made it 16-5, the Bulldogs reeled off 12 straight, keeping the Hawks off the scoreboard for a six-and-a-half-minute stretch. Saint Joseph's cut the deficit to 31-10 on a free throw by Javon Baumann with 6:23 to go in the half, but Gonzaga scored the final 17 points of the period to take a 48-10 margin into halftime. The Bulldogs extended the run to 29-1 to start the second half, leading 60-11 with 17:46 to go. The 52-point margin of defeat was the largest in school history, and the Hawks' 42 points scored was their lowest total since a 56-39 loss at Villanova on February 6, 2007.

DeAndre' Bembry scored 22 points to lead Saint Joseph's over Vermont, 68-60, at Hagan Arena. Bembry tied his career-high in both points and rebounds with nine, while Isaiah Miles had 15 points. Aaron Brown added 13 points for his third straight game in double figures. Vermont took the early lead, 11-1, on the Hawks in the first three minutes of the game. The Hawks fought back, going on a 16-5 run as Bembry and Wilson combined to score 11 points. Bembry had a dunk and a layup and then threaded a fast break pass to Chris Wilson, who converted the layup to give SJU its first lead of the game, 17-16, with 9:28 remaining. The Hawks maintained the lead the rest of the way, holding a 32-26 margin at halftime as they forced 10 Vermont turnovers in the half, while outrebounding the visitors, 25-16. The Hawks came out firing in the second half, and a Bembry three-pointer started a7 -0 run, as SJU forced four straight Vermont turnovers. But another Bembry three-pointer pushed the Hawks' lead to 42-29. A pair of free throws by Bembry gave SJU its biggest lead of the game, 46-32. Vermont scored six straight to cut SJU's lead to 51-45 at 8:48, but Saint Joseph's answered with five points from Miles to increase its margin back to 10, 56-46. The Catamounts made one more push, coming to within 61-56 with 3:23 left, but Bembry went 4-for-4 from the foul line to go up by 66-56 with 2:08 remaining.

### Game 5: November 25, 2014 - Hagan Arena SJU 74 - LIU Brooklyn 70 (OT)

Freshman James Demery hit a three-pointer to send the game into overtime and Saint Joseph's scored the first four points of the extra period as the Hawks defeated LIU Brooklyn, 74-70, in the NIT Season Tip-Off at Hagan Arena. DeAndre' Bembry led Saint Joseph's with 17 points and a career-high 11 rebounds for his first-ever double-double. Demery took a pass from Bembry on the left wing and connected on the first three-pointer of his career with :03 remaining to knot the score at 67-67. LIU had taken the 67-64 lead with 10 seconds to play on a pair of free throws. Aaron Brown and Isaiah Miles scored the first four points for SJU in the overtime, and LIU answered back with a three-pointer at 1:30, to cut the lead to 71-70. But Bembry made one free throw and Brown connected on a pair to seal the win for the Hawks. Brown scored a career-high 15 points for SJU while Chris Wilson tallied 13 points and Demery finished with 11. **DeAndre' Bembry** notched a career-high 23 points, but Saint Joseph's fell to Western Kentucky, 62-59, at Madison Square Garden on Thanksgiving night in the NIT Season Tip-Off. Bembry shot 10-for-20 from the field, and scored 16 in the second half for Saint Joseph's, while **Javon Baumann** added a career-high 11 points. With SJU trailing 46-40 at the 11:48 mark, Bembry would score 10 of the Hawks' next 12 points. His steal and dunk with over six minutes to play gave SJU their first tie of the half, 50-50, and he gave the Hawks their first lead since the early part of the first half, 54-52, with 2:46 remaining. Western Kentucky regained the lead and went up 58-54 on a tip-in at :51. WKU then took a 60-56 lead with a pair of free throws with 14.5 seconds to play. **Aaron Brown** hit a three-pointer with 6.3 seconds left to pull the Hawks within 60-59 before two free throws put the Hilltoppers up three with 5.4 seconds left. Bembry had a chance to send the game to overtime, but his three-point attempt at the buzzer was off the mark. In the first half, WKU held an 18-17 lead and then used an 8-2 run to go up 26-19. The Hilltoppers took their biggest lead of the half, 31-22, with 1:25 to play. A layup by Baumann cut the Hawk deficit to 31-24 at halftime.

**DeAndre' Bembry** scored a game-high 21 points on 8-for-11 shooting to lead Saint Joseph's to a 68-42 win over Loyola Maryland at Hagan Arena. Bembry also grabbed a team-high seven rebounds and had two blocks for Saint Joseph's while **Chris Wilson** scored 13 points and handed out four assists. The Hawks struggled offensively and trailed for most of the first half, but outscored Loyola, 17-6, in the final six minutes to take a 28-24 lead at halftime. They took their first lead, 21-20, on a layup by Bembry with 1:48 to go. The sophomore scored nine points in a three-minute span, closing it out with a three-pointer as time expired. SJU stayed on track after halftime and opened the half with a 16-2 run to take a 44-26 lead with 14:44 remaining. #### Game 10: December 20, 2014 - McCann Arena SJU 75 - Marist 58

Junior Isaiah Miles scored a career-high 23 points and DeAndre' Bembry added 16 points, nine rebounds and seven assists as Saint Joseph's cruised to a 75-58 win over Marist at McCann Arena. Miles scored 17 of his game-high total in the first half, hitting seven of his nine attempts from the field, including 3-of-5 from three-point range, Aaron Brown also added 10 points off the bench on 4-of-6 from the field. Saint Joseph's never trailed and ran out to a 13-4 lead on a jumper by Miles at the 15:02 mark of the first half. ### Game 11: December 29, 2014 - Magness Arena Denver 77 - SJU 73 (OT)

Saint Joseph's lost a 10-point lead and Denver made shots down the stretch to defeat the Hawks, 77-73, in overtime at Magness Arena. Isaiah Miles had a career-high 24 points on 9for-12 shooting, including 4-of-6 from three-point range. **DeAndre' Bembry** added 20 points and eight rebounds, while Aaron Brown scored 12 points. #### Game 13: January 7, 2015 - Palumbo Center Duquesne 71 - Saint Joseph's 68

For the second straight game, a late rally fell short for Saint Joseph's as the Hawks scored 12 of the game's final 14 points but fell to Duquesne, 71-68, at the Palumbo Center. DeAndre' Bembry led four SJU double-digit scorers with 18 points. Aaron Brown scored 15 points and Isaiah Miles added 11 points and eight rebounds while James Demery chipped in with 10 points and Shavar Newkirk had a career-high six assists. Saint Joseph's opened up a 16-9 lead and after the Dukes got within four, SJU used an 11-3 run to take its biggest lead of the game, 27-15, with 9:45 left in the half. DeAndre' Bembry scored a team-high 16 points to lead four Hawks in double figures, but Saint Joseph's fell to 20th-ranked VCU, 89-74, at the Siegel Center. Chris Wilson scored a career-high 23 points to lead Saint Joseph's to a 66-55 win over Fordham at Hagan Arena. The win was the first conference victory of the year for the Hawks, and snapped a four-game losing streak. Wilson shot 6-of-10 from the field and hit 5-of-9 three point attempts. Aaron Brown scored a career-high 21 points and DeAndre' Bembry added 19 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, but a 10-3 run in the final four minutes gave Saint Louis a 68-61 overtime victory over Saint Joseph's. Trailing by two in the final 30 seconds, Bembry drove the baseline for a game-tying layup with 5.4 seconds left and then drew a charge on the Billikens' attempt at the game-winner. The teams traded free throws and then a Saint Louis layup with 30.2 seconds left gave SLU at 57-55 lead, setting the stage for Bembry's tying shot. It was the second road game in a week where the Hawks lost a double-digit lead from the first half, as they did at La Salle. 




