PHIL MARTELLI
Head Coach

In 22 seasons as head coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and has become one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 405-273. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in the past 21 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 198-142 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

Seven of Martelli's players have reached the NBA, with three First Round draft picks - DeAndre' Bembry (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) - and a second-round selection Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. each had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2014-15. Nelson (Denver), Galloway (New Orleans) and Bembry (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history. He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last five years, and 13 times in his 21 seasons at SJU.

Saint Joseph's 2015-16 team made its mark as one of the best in school history, compiling a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team. SJU won its second A-10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004. Martelli, who recorded his 400th career win, earned Big 5 Coach of the Year honors as the Hawks were the third most improved team in the nation. He also had two of the best players in the league, as DeAndre' Bembry was the A-10 Player of the Year and Isaiah Miles was the Most

Improved Player, with both earning All-Conference honors.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors and as member of the NCAA Division I Men's Ethics Coalition. In 2016, he was honored with the Gene Bartow Award by Collegians.com for outstanding achievement and contributions to the game.

The 2014-15 Hawks were challenged after losing three All-Conference players from the 2014 A-10 champion team, but saw the emergence of sophomore DeAndre' Bembry as he topped the A-10 in scoring and earned All-Conference First Team honors.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

Martelli guided young squads in 2010-11 and 2009-10, after coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third Martelli player drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid to the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus

National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling in the title game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. and and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have six grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, Madalyn and Nolan.

LAST TIME OUT: **Lamarr Kimble** scored a career-high 19 points and backcourt mate **Shavar Newkirk** scored 17 to lead Saint Joseph's past Columbia, 85-65, at Hagan Arena. Freshman **Charlie Brown**, who scored 12 points in the first half, tallied 15 for the first double-figure game of his career, while sophomore **Chris Clover** tallied a career-high 11 points for Saint Joseph's. The Hawks were playing without starting forward **James Demery** who suffered a stress fracture in his foot in the season opener versus Toledo, and will be without him for a few weeks. Saint Joseph's never trailed in the game and after back-to-back threes by Brown and Robinson, took a 17-6 lead in the first seven minutes. Leading 17-8, Kimble and Brown combined to score nine straight, with a dunk from Brown pushing the SJU lead to 26-11. SJU, which shot 57.6 percent from the field in the half, increased the margin to 20, 38-18, on a layup from Newkirk at 6:54. The Hawks took their biggest lead of the half, 50-27, on a three-pointer at the buzzer by senior **Brendan Casper**, who added seven points in a career-high 23 minutes. The Hawks maintained the 20-plus point lead for most of the half, except for a 5-0 run by Columbia that cut the margin to 60-45 at 10:40. Saint Joseph's took its biggest lead of the contest, 78-52, on a three from Brown at 4:41.

LAST TIME IN PARADISE: The Hawks participated in the 2009 Paradise Jam and earned a fifth-place finish. SJU defeated Boston College in the opener and then lost to 7th-ranked Purdue and to DePaul in the consolation game.

A-10 ACCOLADES: Junior **Shavar Newkirk** was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week for Nov. 14, marking the first time in his career that he earned a conference honor. Newkirk scored a career-high 28 points and grabbed a personal best seven rebounds in the Hawks' season-opening 77-76 win over Toledo. He made a career-high 9-of-16 from the field while also hitting 7-of-9 from the foul line. It marked his first 20-plus point game as his previous career-high was 19 points. In a second half which saw the lead change 25 times, Newkirk connected on a short jumper with 46 seconds to play that gave the Hawks the lead for good. He also made two free throws with :25 left to help seal the win.

BIG LOSS: The Hawks suffered a huge loss when it was determined that junior **James Demery** had suffered a stress fracture in the Toledo game. Demery was diagnosed with a stress fracture in the fourth metatarsal of his left foot and will be sidelined for a few weeks. A 6-6 junior, Demery had 11 points and tied his career-high with eight rebounds in the Hawks' 77-76 season opening win over Toledo. He was the team's leading returning scorer after averaging 8.0 points per game last year.

WELL-GUARDED: Saint Joseph's backcourt of **Shavar Newkirk** and **Lamarr Kimble** has combined to score 80 of the Hawks' 162 points in the first two games. Newkirk had a career-high 28 in the opener, with Kimble bettering his career-high by scoring 16 points. Kimble then increased his personal best again in the Columbia game, tallying 19 points. Last season, the duo split time at point guard so this is the first time they're seeing significant playing time together. More impressively, Newkirk and Kimble have only six turnovers between them.

CHARLIE IN CHARGE: Freshman **Charlie Brown** went 1-for-6 from the field in his first collegiate game, but bounced back in a big way against Columbia. He scored 12 points on 5-for-8 shooting in the first half as the Hawks built up a 20-point margin, and finished with 15 points for his first double-figure game.

BOOST FROM BRENDAN: Senior **Brendan Casper** saw a career-high 23 minutes of action against Columbia. The former walk-on made his presence felt, taking three charges in the first half. He also hit a three-point-

er at the halftime buzzer to give SJU a 50-27 lead. **Phil Martelli** said, "I thought the seniors really helped. Brendan's three charges and activity, energy, and confidence. He doesn't just 'have a scholarship.' He's a scholarship player now, and he approached it like that. He has approached every day in practice like that."

AN OLDER PRESENCE: **Phil Martelli** also cited the play of graduate student **Javon Baumann** in the Columbia win. Baumann played 16 minutes and topped the team with six rebounds. "I thought Javon (Baumann) was very good with six rebounds in 16 minutes. He guards like an older guy," said Martelli.

CALLING ON CHRIS: Sophomore **Chris Clover** is expected to make an impact this year after seeing limited action in 2015-16. After a scoreless first game, Clover rebounded with a career-high 11 points against Columbia, shooting 5-for-8 from the field.

YOUNG GUNS: With freshmen **Charlie Brown** and **Nick Robinson** in the starting lineup, it's the youngest group of starters under **Phil Martelli** since 2010-11 when Langston Galloway, C.J. Aiken and Daryus Quarles started as freshmen. Because of the injury to **James Demery**, the Hawks started two freshmen, two sophomores and a junior against Columbia. The average age of SJU's starting lineup is 19.6 years.

SJU'S STRUGGLES: Despite averaging 81 points in the first two games and shooting 50 percent from the field, the Hawks have struggled from the foul line (63 percent) and three-point range (35 percent).

BANNER YEAR: The Hawks are coming off of one of the best seasons in school history, which saw them go 28-8 and win their third Atlantic 10 Championship in two seasons. SJU was led by A-10 and Big 5 Player of the Year DeAndre' Bembry, and Isaiah Miles, the Most Improved Player in the A-10 and Big 5. Saint Joseph's was the third most improved team in the nation and the 28 victories were the second best in school history, behind only the 2003-04 NCAA Elite Eight squad, which went 30-2. SJU raised its newest championship banner in Hagan Arena in a pre-game ceremony at the season opener vs. Toledo.

DEAN OF COACHES: Now in his 22nd season as Saint Joseph's head coach, **Phil Martelli** is the dean of A-10 coaches. He's the Hawks' leader in wins with a 405-273 record, and has a 198-142 record in Atlantic 10 play for the most conference wins of any active coach, and the second most all-time.

THEY'RE BACK: Although Saint Joseph's returns 12 players from last year's A-10 champion team, only four of them averaged double-figure minutes during that season. **Shavar Newkirk** is the lone starter returning since **Pierfrancesco Oliva** will be sidelined for the year with a knee injury. **James Demery** and **Lamarr Kimble** were the other two players seeing significant playing time, making key contributions off the bench last season.

DOUBLE DOWN: This marks the first time in **Phil Martelli's** career that he did not have a returning double figure scorer. The Hawks lost Isaiah Miles (18.1), DeAndre' Bembry (17.4) and Aaron Brown (10.4) from last year's 28-8 team. SJU's leading returning scorers are **James Demery** (8.1) and **Shavar Newkirk** (8.0).

RARING TO GO: Redshirt sophomore **Markell Lodge** made his first career start vs. Toledo and had four points and two blocks. Lodge saw limited action last season in his first year after sitting out 2014-15 to concentrate on academics. A 6-8 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.), Lodge

owns a vertical leap of 39 inches, which is the highest in the program's history.

FROM THE START: **Charlie Brown** became the fourth freshman in four years to be in the starting lineup on opening day. **Pierfrancesco Oliva** was a starter in 30 games last year. Previous freshman starters were **DeAndre' Bembry** with all 34 games in 2013-14 and **James Demery** with 29 games in 2014-15.

HARD WORK PAYS OFF: Senior tri-captain **Brendan Casper** was awarded a scholarship for the 2016-17 academic year. Casper joined the Hawks as a walk-on as a freshman in 2013-14 and previously earned a scholarship for the Spring 2016 semester. Entering this year he played in 42 career games, including a personal best 23 as a sophomore, and has been a member of the Hawks' two Atlantic 10 champion teams. Casper was selected to the 2016 NABC Honors Court, which recognizes academic excellence.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: The Hawks welcome five newcomers this season - **Charlie Brown** (Philadelphia), **Gerald Blount** (Suwanee, Ga.), **Lorenzo Edwards** (Lake Forest, Ill.), **Nick Robinson** (Chicago, Ill.) and walk-on **Toliver Freeman** (Baton Rouge, La.)

ON THE SIDELINES: The Hawks suffered a blow over the summer when **Pierfrancesco Oliva** had surgery in late June to repair an osteochondral defect in his right knee, a chronic condition that was aggravated in post-season workouts. After post-surgery evaluation throughout the summer, it was determined that he will need close to a year of rehabilitation. The 6-8 forward from Taranto, Italy, was a starter in 30 games for the 2016 Atlantic 10 Champion Hawks. He averaged 4.0 points and 3.7 rebounds while scoring double figures twice.

MY KIND OF TOWN: Chicago-area natives **Lorenzo Edwards** and **Nick Robinson** are members of the Hawks' freshman class. Edwards played at Lake Forest High School with Robinson attending Kenwood Academy.

HAWK CAPTAINS: Graduate student **Javon Baumann**, senior **Brendan Casper** and sophomore **Lamarr Kimble** were voted as tri-captains by their teammates. Kimble is the second sophomore in the past three seasons to earn the distinction, and is the third sophomore in school history to serve as a captain. The first sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

CAROLINA ON MY MIND: The Hawks' roster features two players from the state of North Carolina - **James Demery** (Williamston) and **Markell Lodge** (Washington).

A NEW MAN: **Jai Williams** has lost close to 60 pounds since coming to campus in 2013-14. He redshirted that season to further his development and has seen limited action in the past two years. Williams is down to 240 pounds entering his junior year.

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish ninth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. Last year the Hawks were picked seventh and finished fourth in the league standings before winning the A-10 Championship.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the eighth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 68-32 record in the seven seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 387-114 overall record in 66

years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 12-4 on its home court last season.

NBA HAWKS: Saint Joseph's is well-represented in the NBA with three current players. Last season's A-10 Player of the Year DeAndre' Bembry is in his first year in the league, having been drafted 21st overall by the Atlanta Hawks. Langston Galloway is in his second year in the NBA and is now with the New Orleans Pelicans after starting his career in 2014-15 with the New York Knicks. Jameer Nelson marks his 13th year in the NBA this season as a member of the Denver Nuggets.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. He has since returned to the NBA as an assistant coach with the Philadelphia 76ers. Below is the list of former Hawks who have held positions as NBA head coaches:

Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 18th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks will face either Ole Miss or Oral Roberts in the next round on Nov. 19 or Nov. 20. Following the Paradise Jam, Saint Joseph's will return to action after the holiday, playing two consecutive Philadelphia Big 5 games. SJU hosts Temple on Nov. 30 and visits rival Villanova on Dec. 3.

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2015-16.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Timmy Parks becomes the 37th student to wear the wings in 2015-16. He is a junior accounting major from Wilmington, Del.

Lamar Kimble scored a career-high 19 points and backcourt mate **Shavar Newkirk** scored 17 to lead Saint Joseph's past Columbia, 85-65, at Hagan Arena. Freshman **Charlie Brown**, who scored 12 points in the first half, tallied 15 for the first double-figure game of his career, while sophomore **Chris Clover** tallied a career-high 11 points for Saint Joseph's. The Hawks were playing without starting forward James Demery who suffered a stress fracture in his foot in the season opener versus Toledo, and will be without him for a few weeks.
