GAME STORIES

- Shavar Newkirk helped SJU end a four-game losing streak, by scoring 27 points and the game-winning three-point play in the 72-71 win at Drexel. Lamarr Kimble added 16 points.
- Shavar Newkirk has been named the Big 5 Co-Player of the Week for Dec. 12 after his 27-point performance at Drexel. He ranks third in the Atlantic 10 in scoring with 21.1 ppg.
- Tonight has been designated as a Coaches vs. Cancer game since both coaches are very involved in the organization.
- Saint Joseph's ranks eighth in the nation in fewest turnovers (89) and 18th in fewest fouls (137).
- SJU is in the midst of a four-game "road" swing, although two of the games were local (Villanova, Drexel). The Hawks close it out on Sunday at Illinois State, returning to Hagan Arena on Dec. 22 to face Lafayette.

PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach

In 22 seasons as head coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coaches in the

school's storied history and has become one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 407-277. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in the past 21 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 198-142 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

Seven of Martelli's players have reached the NBA, with three First Round draft picks - DeAndre' Bembry (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) - and a second-round selection Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. each had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2014-15. Nelson (Denver), Galloway (New Orleans) and Bembry (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history. He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last five years, and 13 times in his 21 seasons at SJU.

Saint Joseph's 2015-16 team made its mark as one of the best in school history, compiling a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team. SJU won its second A-10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004. Martelli, who recorded his 400th career win, earned Big 5 Coach of the Year honors as the Hawks were the third most improved team in the nation. He also had two of the best players in the league, as DeAndre' Bembry was the A-10 Player of the Year and Isaiah Miles was the Most

Improved Player, with both earning All-Conference honors.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors and as member of the NCAA Division I Men's Ethics Coalition. In 2016, he was honored with the Gene Bartow Award by CollegeInsider.com for outstanding achievement and contributions to the game.

The 2014-15 Hawks were challenged after losing three All-Conference players from the 2014 A-10 champion team, but saw the emergence of sophomore DeAndre' Bembry as he topped the A-10 in scor-

ing and earned All-Conference First Team honors. In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual champion Connecticut.

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

Martelli guided young squads in 2010-11 and 2009-10, after coming off a 2008-09 season that saw

the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years

to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third Martelli player drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid to the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus

National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling in the title game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. and and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have six grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, Madalyn and Nolan.

LAST TIME OUT: Shavar Newkirk converted the game-winning threepoint play with 10.7 seconds to go, and scored Saint Joseph's final 11 points, as the Hawks rallied to defeat Drexel, 72-71. Newkirk finished the game with 27 points, one shy of his career high as Saint Joseph's ended a four-game losing streak. Lamarr Kimble added 16 points, Brendan Casper scored a career-high 10 points and Javon Baumann grabbed a career-high nine rebounds. With the Hawks trailing, 71-69, Newkirk scored on a drive and then put in the ensuing free throw to give SJU a 72-71 lead at 10.7 seconds. On Drexel's possession, Baumann blocked an attempt, and the Dragons had one more chance, inbounding with two seconds to play, but Nick Robinson came up with a block to preserve the win. Trailing by 11 points early in the second half, SJU used a 16-3 run and scored eight straight with baskets from Newkirk, Baumann, Casper and Kimble, whose jumper at 9:51 gave Saint Joseph's its first lead of the game, 54-52 From there the teams would trade leads and force six ties, with Drexel's biggest lead being four points, 69-65, at 2:06. Newkirk took over from there, scoring the final 11 points and the defense held Drexel without a field goal, as SJU achieved its biggest come-from-behind win of the year. Drexel controlled the first half, running out to a 17-6 lead in the first five minutes. The Dragons connected on five three-pointers in the half while SJU managed just 2-of-9 from beyond the arc. Saint Joseph's got back in the game with an 8-0 run with six straight points from Casper.

STARRING SHAVAR: Shavar Newkirk scored the Hawks' final 11 points to lift SJU to the win over Drexel and earn Big 5 Co-Player of the Week honors. Newkirk's scoring streak started with 4:27 to play, as his jumper forced a 63-63 tie. The junior connected on 3-of-3 field goals and 5-of-6 from the foul line in the final four minutes. His three-point play with 10.7 seconds left proved to be the deciding points. It was the second gamewinning shot of his career as in 2015-16, he hit a short jumper with one second left to give SJU a 66-64 win over Old Dominion in the Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic.

WELL-GUARDED: Saint Joseph's backcourt of Shavar Newkirk and Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble has combined to score 50 percent of the Hawks' 565 points and have each exceeded their career-highs already this year. Newkirk had a career-high 28 points in the opener vs. Toledo, with Kimble bettering his career-high by scoring 16 points. Kimble then increased his personal best vs. Columbia with 19 points, and then again with 26 points vs. Loyola Chicago. Newkirk has recorded 20-plus points in six of eight games. Last season, the duo split time at point guard so this is the first time they're seeing significant playing time together.

INJURY UPDATE: Freshman **Lorenzo Edwards** has been battling a shoulder injury and is out indefinitely. Junior **James Demery**, who has been sidelined since Nov. 14 with a stress fracture, will be re-evaluated this week to determine his progress towards returning to the court.

FINAL COUNTDOWN: The Hawks are under some extra stress as final exams started today and continue through December 20. Normally, the team has a break from games during this time, but the University made a late change to the academic calendar.

BY THE NUMBERS: The win over Drexel on Sunday ended a four-game losing skid for SJU, which was the longest since 2014-15.

TWO-BY-TWO: Phil Martelli has said that the Hawks need to make their two-point field goals for them to be successful. They are currently converting 45 percent (147-325) of their two-point field goals and 34.4 percent of their three-pointers. Saint Joseph's is averaging 19.2 three-point field goal attempts per game.

RALLY CAPS: The win over Drexel marked the largest deficit overcome by the Hawks for a victory this season. SJU trailed by 11 points in the first half and then again with 14:51 left in the second half.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Hawks are in the midst of a stretch of four straight games on the road and currently own a 1-1 road record on the year. Last season, Saint Joseph's had the nation's only undefeated road record until a loss at Davidson on Jan. 31, which ended a streak of nine consecutive wins.

CAN'T MISS: Shavar Newkirk is putting up career-best numbers thus far while shooting 49.6 percent from the field and 43.3 percent from three-point range. The junior has scored 20-plus points in all but two games this year.

FRESH APPROACH: Sophomore tri-captain **Lamarr Kimble** started the season bettering his career-high for the third time in three games with 26 points vs. Loyola Chicago. Kimble shot 10-for-17 from the field and made a personal best five three-pointers. It marked the first 20-plus point game of his career.

WORKING OVERTIME: Lamarr Kimble and Shavar Newkirk are seeing career-high numbers in minutes played, with Kimble averaging 36.2 and Newkirk at 35.5. Kimble is third in the A-10 and ranks 20th in the nation for minutes played, while Newkirk is fifth in the league and 37th in the national rankings. Kimble played a career-high 37 minutes against both Loyola Chicago and Temple, while Newkirk reached a new career-high with 38 minutes versus Temple. The duo actually played all 20 minutes together of the second half at Drexel, for the first time this season.

HANDS OFF: As they have in the past few years, the Hawks are limiting their personal fouls. They lead the A-10 in fewest fouls with 137 and rank 18th in the nation. At one point last year, SJU led the nation in fewest fouls and only had 10 disqualifications all year.

BOOST FROM BRENDAN: Senior **Brendan Casper** scored a career-high 10 points in the win at Drexel, including a stretch of six straight during an 8-0 run in the first half. The former walk-on is now in the rotation and saw a personal-best 23 mintues of action against both Drexel and Columbia. After the Columbia game, **Phil Martelli** said, "I thought the seniors really helped. Brendan's three charges and activity, energy, and confidence. He doesn't just 'have a scholarship.' He's a scholarship player now, and he approached it like that. He has approached every day in practice like that."

BAUMANN'S BOARDS: Graduate student **Javon Baumann** came up big for the Hawks in the win at Drexel. He was 3-for-3 from the field and recorded a new career-high of nine rebounds while playing a season-high 22 minutes. Baumann also had a block on one of Drexel's final attempts with two seconds to go.

EVEN MORE IMPROVED?: Last season, the Hawks' Isaiah Miles was one of the most improved players in the nation, earning that award from the A-10 and the Big 5. Miles had increased his scoring average by seven points up to 18.1 per game and became one of the Hawks' go-to players. Although it's still early in the season, **Shavar Newkirk** has shown an even bigger increase in his scoring average. Last season he scored 8.0 points per game - he's now averaging 21.1.

WORKING FOR A CAUSE: Tonight's game is designated as a Coaches vs. Cancer game. **Phil Martelli** and Princeton's Mitch Henderson are both involved in the Philadelphia Coaches vs. Cancer effort. Martelli is the co-

chair of the Philadelphia group, which is one of the highest fundraising groups in the country, and is also the chair of the National Coaches vs. Cancer Council.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: SJU currently ranks eighth in the nation in fewest turnovers with 89.

MARKELL'S MARK: Redshirt sophomore Markell Lodge had quite possibly his best game as a Hawk against Temple. He scored a career-high nine points and grabbed five rebounds, while playing a personal best 24 minutes. Lodge, who has a program-record 39-inch vertical leap, excited the sellout crowd with three dunks. He followed that with a career-high 10 rebounds at Villanova.

RAINING THREES: Against Temple, the Hawks connected on a season-best from behind the arc, going 12-for-23. **Shavar Newkirk** led the way with 4-of-6, while **Charlie Brown** and **Lamarr Kimble** each had three. It was the most three-pointers for the Hawks since they had 10 at Massachusetts on Feb. 24, 2016.

CHARGE IT: Senior **Brendan Casper** has a knack for taking charges and he has taken at least one in all but two games this year. Casper took three in the first half against Columbia and had two in the recent win over Drexel.

FOUL PLAY: Heading into the Ole Miss game, the Hawks were converting just 67.9 percent of their free throw attempts. They shot well below that against the Rebels, going 10-for-22 (45.5%) from the line, missing six free throws in both halves of the 81-68 loss. SJU rebounded to have a good effort from the line vs. NC State, hitting 83.3 percent (10-for-12).

GETTING IN THE SPIRIT: The Hawks will participate in their annual Christmas Charity Project - "Hawks Helping Others". It marks the 22nd year of the project, started by head coach **Phil Martelli**, and run in conjunction with SJU's Campus Ministry, to aid needy families in West Philadelphia. The Hawks will break into teams and shop for their assigned families on Dec. 16, wrap the gifts and then deliver food and presents prior to the holiday. A collection was taken at the Temple game and raised over \$2,400 to assist in the purchase of the gifts.

NICK OF TIME: Freshman **Nick Robinson** had his best game to date against Temple, scoring a season-high 11 points on 4-for-7 shooting. He also connected on 2-of-3 three-pointers. Robinson replaced **James Demery** in the starting lineup beginning with the second game, after Demery was diagnosed with a stress fracture.

TOURNEY TALES: Shavar Newkirk topped the Hawks in scoring at the Paradise Jam, averaging 21.3 points in the three games. **Lamarr Kimble** scored 13.0 points while **Charlie Brown** averaged 12.0 points per game as the Hawks finished fifth in the tournament.

A-10 ACCOLADES: Junior **Shavar Newkirk** was named the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Week for Nov. 14, marking the first time in his career that he earned a conference honor. Newkirk scored a career-high 28 points and grabbed a personal best seven rebounds in the Hawks' season-opening 77-76 win over Toledo. He made a career-high 9-of-16 from the field while also hitting 7-of-9 from the foul line. In a second half which saw the lead change 25 times, Newkirk connected on a short jumper at :46 that gave the Hawks the lead for good. He also made two free throws with :25 left to help seal the win.

BIG LOSS: The Hawks suffered a huge loss when it was determined that junior **James Demery** had suffered a stress fracture in the Toledo game (Nov. 12). Demery was diagnosed with a stress fracture in the fourth metatarsal of his left foot and will be sidelined for a few weeks. A 6-6 junior, Demery had 11 points and tied his career-high with eight rebounds in the Hawks' 77-76 season opening win over Toledo. He was the team's leading returning scorer after averaging 8.0 points per game last year.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: Freshman Charlie Brown went 1-for-6 from the field in his first collegiate game, but bounced back in a big way against Columbia. He scored 12 points on 5-for-8 shooting in the first half as the Hawks built up a 20-point margin, and finished with 15 points for his first double-figure game. Brown had 14 points, five rebounds and a team-high five steals against NC State.

AN OLDER PRESENCE: Phil Martelli also cited the play of graduate student **Javon Baumann** in the Columbia win. Baumann played 16 minutes and topped the team with six rebounds. "I thought Javon (Baumann) was very good with six rebounds in 16 minutes. He guards like an older guy," said Martelli.

CALLING ON CHRIS: Sophomore **Chris Clover** is expected to make an impact this year after seeing limited action in 2015-16. After a scoreless first game, Clover rebounded with a career-high 11 points against Columbia, shooting 5-for-8 from the field.

YOUNG GUNS: With freshmen **Charlie Brown** and **Nick Robinson** in the starting lineup, it's the youngest group of starters under **Phil Martelli** since 2010-11 when Langston Galloway, C.J. Aiken and Daryus Quarles started as freshmen. Because of the injury to **James Demery**, the Hawks have started two freshmen, two sophomores and a junior, beginning with the Columbia game. The average age of SJU's starting lineup is 19.6 years old.

BANNER YEAR: The Hawks are coming off of one of the best seasons in school history, which saw them go 28-8 and win their third Atlantic 10 Championship in two seasons. SJU was led by A-10 and Big 5 Player of the Year DeAndre' Bembry, and Isaiah Miles, the Most Improved Player in the A-10 and Big 5. Saint Joseph's was the third most improved team in the nation and the 28 victories were the second best in school history, behind only the 2003-04 NCAA Elite Eight squad, which went 30-2. SJU raised its newest championship banner in Hagan Arena in a pregame ceremony at the season opener vs. Toledo.

DEAN OF COACHES: Now in his 22nd season as Saint Joseph's head coach, **Phil Martelli** is the dean of A-10 coaches. He's the Hawks' leader in wins with a 407-277 record, and has a 198-142 record in Atlantic 10 play for the most conference wins of any active coach, and the second most all-time.

THEY'RE BACK: Although Saint Joseph's returns 12 players from last year's A-10 champion team, only four of them averaged double-figure minutes during that season. **Shavar Newkirk** is the lone starter returning since **Pierfrancesco Oliva** will be sidelined for the year with a knee injury. **James Demery** and **Lamarr Kimble** were the other two players seeing significant playing time, making key contributions off the bench last season.

DOUBLE DOWN: This marks the first time in **Phil Martelli's** career that he entered the season without a returning double figure scorer. The Hawks lost Isaiah Miles (18.1), DeAndre' Bembry (17.4) and Aaron Brown (10.4) from last year's 28-8 team. SJU's leading returning scorers are**James Demery** (8.1) and **Shavar Newkirk** (8.0).

RARING TO GO: Redshirt sophomore **Markell Lodge** made his first career start vs. Toledo and had four points and two blocks. Lodge saw limited action last season in his first year after sitting out 2014-15 to concentrate on academics. A 6-8 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.), Lodge owns a vertical leap of 39 inches, which is the highest in the program's history.

FROM THE START: Charlie Brown became the fourth freshman in four years to be in the starting lineup on opening day. **Pierfrancesco Oliva** was a starter in 30 games last year. Previous freshman starters were **DeAndre' Bembry** with all 34 games in 2013-14 and **James Demery** with 29 games in 2014-15.

HARD WORK PAYS OFF: Senior tri-captain Brendan Casper was awarded a scholarship for the 2016-17 academic year. Casper joined the Hawks as a walk-on as a freshman in 2013-14 and previously earned a scholarship for the Spring 2016 semester. Entering this year he played in 42 career games, including a personal best 23 as a sophomore, and has been a member of the Hawks' two A-10 champion teams. Casper was selected to the 2016 NABC Honors Court, which recognizes academic excellence.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: The Hawks have welcomed five newcomers this season - **Charlie Brown** (Philadelphia), **Gerald Blount** (Suwanee,

Ga.), Lorenzo Edwards (Lake Forest, III.), Nick Robinson (Chicago, III.) and walk-on Toliver Freeman (Baton Rouge, La.).

ON THE SIDELINES: The Hawks suffered a blow over the summer when **Pierfrancesco Oliva** had surgery in late June to repair an osteochondral defect in his right knee, a chronic condition that was aggravated in post-season workouts. After post-surgery evaluation throughout the summer, it was determined that he will need close to a year of rehabilitation. The 6-8 forward from Taranto, Italy, was a starter in 30 games for the 2016 Atlantic 10 Champion Hawks. He averaged 4.0 points and 3.7 rebounds while scoring double figures twice.

HAWK CAPTAINS: Graduate student **Javon Baumann**, senior **Brendan Casper** and sophomore **Lamarr Kimble** were voted as tri-captains by their teammates. Kimble is the second sophomore in the past three seasons to earn the distinction, and is the third sophomore in school history to serve as a captain. The first sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

CAROLINA ON MY MIND: The Hawks' roster features two players from the state of North Carolina - **James Demery** (Williamston) and **Markell Lodge** (Washington).

A NEW MAN: Jai Williams has lost close to 60 pounds since coming to campus in 2013-14. He redshirted that season to further his development and has seen limited action in the past two years. Wiliams was down to 240 pounds entering this season. He's seen playing time in four games thus far, and had six points against NC State.

MY KIND OF TOWN: Chicago-area natives Lorenzo Edwards and Nick Robinson are members of the Hawks' freshman class. Edwards played at Lake Forest High School with Robinson attending Kenwood Academy.

PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish ninth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. Last year the Hawks were picked seventh and finished fourth in the league standings before winning the A-10 Championship.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the eighth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 68-33 record in the seven seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 387-115 overall record in 66 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 12-4 on its home court last season and is currently 2-1.

SIGN THEM UP: Phil Martelli announced that Taylor Funk and Anthony Longpre signed National Letters of Intent during the early-signing period, and will attend SJU beginning next Fall. Funk is a 6-8 forward from Manheim Central High School (Pa.), who averaged 21.3 points per game as a junior. Longpre, a 6-10 forward, is originally from Canada but attends Glenelg Country School (Md.), where he averaged 12.7 points and 10.0 rebounds last year.

NBA HAWKS: Saint Joseph's is well-represented in the NBA with three current players. Last season's A-10 Player of the Year DeAndre' Bembry is in his first year in the league, having been drafted 21st overall by the Atlanta Hawks. Langston Galloway is in his second year in the NBA and is now with the New Orleans Pelicans after starting his career in 2014-15 with the New York Knicks. Jameer Nelson marks his 13th year in the NBA this season as a member of the Denver Nuggets.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. He has since returned to the NBA as an assistant coach with the Philadelphia 76ers. Below is the list of former Hawks who have held positions as NBA head coaches:

Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 18th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: Saint Joseph's makes a first-time trip to Illinois State on Sunday to end the four-game road trip. SJU is home only twice in December - against Lafayette on the 22nd and GW on the 30th.

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2015-16.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial cos-



tume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-ometer" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Timmy Parks becomes the 37th student to wear the wings in 2015-16. He is a junior accounting major from Wilmington, Del.

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the public title of the institution for all aspects of its operations.

Shavar Newkirk converted the game-winning three-point play with 10.7 seconds to go, and scored Saint Joseph's final 11 points, as the Hawks rallied to defeat Drexel, 72-71. Newkirk finished the game with 27 points, one shy of his career high as Saint Joseph's ended a four-game losing streak. Lamarr Kimble added 16 points, Brendan Casper scored a career-high 10 points and Javon Baumann grabbed a career-high nine rebounds. With the Hawks trailing, 71-69, Newkirk scored on a drive and then put in the ensuing free throw to give SJU a 72-71 lead at 10.7 seconds. On Drexel's possession, Baumann blocked an attempt, and the Dragons had one more chance, inbounding with two seconds to play, but Nick Robinson came up with a block to preserve the win.
